WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council,

by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway, within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; and whereas the City of Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain land, named and described in the Schedule hereunder, which has been acquired for a street or way within the Municipality of the City of Perth be declared a public highway: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall from the date of this Proclamation be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

The Land Act, 1898.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 16266/10.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of leasing for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 13322, at Goomalling, should vest in and be held by the Goomalling Road Board in trust for Recreation: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Goomalling Road Board, with power to the said Goomalling Road Board with the approval of His Excellency the Governor first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease.

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 20431 (Avon Location 25442) should vest in and be held by the Goomalling Road Board in trust for the purpose of a Quarry (Gravel): Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Goomalling Road Board in trust for the purpose aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by Section 41 of the said Act.

Geraldton Harbour Works Railway—Additions and Improvements.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 693/23; Ex. Co. No. 1728.

WHEREAS by Section 11 of the "Public Works Act, 1902," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to authorise the Minister to undertake, construct, or provide any public work (subject as to Railways to Section 96), and such authorisation shall be deemed an authority to such Minister by and under that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the recited section of the "Public Works Act, 1902," doth hereby authorise the Honourable Minister for Works to provide Additions and Improvements to the Geraldton Harbour Works Railway on the land shown coloured green on Plan, P.W.D., W.A. 26515 (L.T.O. Diagram 8793), which may be inspected at the office of the Minister for Works, Perth.

The Road Districts Act, 1919.

South Perth Road District—Redivision into Wards.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1454/29.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council redivide a Road District into Wards, and increase the number of members: And whereas it is desired to redivide the South Perth Road District into Four Wards and increase the number of members from nine to twelve and allot them to the various Wards: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby—

- (a) redivide the South Perth Road District into four Wards, with the names and boundaries as described in the Schedule hereto;
- (b) increase the number of members from nine to twelve and allot them to represent the various Wards, as set out against each Ward in the Schedule.

SOUTH PERTH ROAD BOARD.

Description of Ward Boundaries.

West Ward.

Bounded on the Westward and Northward by part of the district boundary (shores of Melville and Perth Waters) from their intersection with the production South-Westward of the Northern side of Amherst Street to their intersection with the production Northward of the Eastern boundary of that portion of Perth Sub. Lots 3 and 49 as shown on Deposited Diagram 1906; on the Eastward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned intersection, and extending Southward along part of the Eastern boundary of the said portion of Sub. Lots 3 and 49 and the Eastern boundary of Lot 50 of Perth Sub. Lots 49 and 3 (L.T.O. Plan 3384), and continuing to the North-East corner of Lot 427; thence South along the Western side of Onslow Road to intersect the North side of Angelo Street; on the Southward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned intersection and extending Westward along the North side of Onslow Street to the Eastern corner of Lot 84; thence along the Northern side of Amherst Street and its prolongation to the starting point. (3 members.)

Central Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by part of the district boundary from the North-East corner of the West Ward to the centre line of River Street; on the Eastward by lines commencing at the intersection of the district boundary with the centre line of River Street, and extending Southward along the said centre line to the production Northward by the centre line of Tate Street; thence along the centre line of Tate Street to the centre line of Hordern Street, and Westward along the centre line of Hordern Street to the centre line of Sandgate Street; thence South along the centre line of Sandgate Street to intersect the centre line of South Terrace; on the Southward by the centre line of South Terrace to the district boundary; on the Westward by part of the district boundary and by the boundaries of the West Ward to the starting point. (3 members.)

East Ward.

Bounded on the Northward and Eastward by part of the district boundaries from their intersection with the centre line of River Street to the junction of the South-Eastern side of George Street with the South-West boundary of Lot 45 of Location 38A; on the Southward by lines commencing at said junction and extending along the South-East side of George Street; the North boundary of Location 40 and the centre line of South Terrace to the centre line of Sandgate Street; on the Westward by the East boundary of the Central Ward to the starting point. (3 members.)

South Ward.

Bounded on the Northward by the South boundaries of the Central and East Wards; on the Eastward, Southward, and Westward by the district boundaries. (3 members.)

Carnamah Road District—Alteration of Boundaries
with Dandarragan Road District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 90/30.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council sever any portion of a Road District and annex it to an existing Road District: And whereas it is desirable to sever portion of the Carnamah Road District and annex it to the Dandarragan Road District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby sever that portion of the Carnamah Road District, as described in the Schedule hereto, and annex it to the Dandarragan Road District.

Swan Road Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 742/30.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919-1926," the Governor may by Order of Council empower a Local Authority to exercise within its District any power of making Regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4 of Part IV. of the said Act: And whereas it is desirable to empower the Swan Road Board to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over specified roads within its District and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for such purpose: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act, and of every other authority enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby empower the Swan Road Board, by the By-laws in the Schedule hereto, to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over specified roads within its District and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for such purpose, and to impose a penalty not exceeding £20 for the breach thereof.

THE TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-1926.

Swan Road District.

The Swan Road Board, pursuant to an Order in Council under Section 43 of "The Traffic Act, 1919-1926," and in exercise of the power thereby conferred, doth hereby make the following By-law, to have effect in the Swan Road District.

The passage of heavy traffic over the Bishop Road, Viveash Road, Padbury Avenue, Hyem Road, Francis Road, James Road, Campersie Road, Guger Road, Lenard Road, within the Swan Road District, during the months of June, July, August, and September in every year, is hereby prohibited.

For the purpose of this By-law, "Heavy traffic" means the traffic of all vehicles engaged in the carriage or conveyance of sleepers, sawn or hewn, split and other timber, firewood, brick, stone, gravel, salt, lime, cement, farm produce, or other material in bulk, and the traffic of any vehicle the weight thereof including any load exceeds 12 cwt. per wheel, both inclusive.

Any person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not exceeding £20.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 248/26.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a Local Authority to exercise within its District any power of making Regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4 of Part IV. of the said Act: And whereas it is desired to empower the Williams Road Board to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over specified roads within its District and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for such purpose: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby empower the Williams Road Board, by the By-law in the Schedule hereto, to prohibit the passage of heavy traffic over specified roads within its District, and to define what shall be deemed heavy traffic for such purpose, and to impose a penalty of not exceeding £20 for the breach thereof.

Williams Road Board.

The Williams Road Board, pursuant to an Order in Council under Section 43 of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," and in exercise of the power thereby conferred, doth hereby make the following By-law, to have effect within the Williams Road District:—

The passage of heavy traffic over the Dardadine Road East, Dardadine Road West, Tarwonga-Culbin Road, Darkan-Coolikan Road, Collie Road, Quaindering Road, Westmere Road, Darkan-Williams Road, and York Road within the Williams Road District from 14th day of June, 1930, to the 14th day of September, 1930, is prohibited.

For the purposes of this By-law "heavy traffic" shall be as defined in Regulation No. 3 published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st day of June, 1928.

Any person who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not exceeding £20.

THE TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-26.

Preston Road Board.

The Preston Road Board, pursuant to an Order in Council under Section 43 of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," and in exercise of the power thereby conferred, doth hereby make the following By-law, to have effect within the Preston Road District:—

The passage of all vehicles engaged in heavy traffic over Road No. 3606, known as Travena's Road, from the North-West corner of Wellington Location 1567 to its junction with the main Preston Road, is hereby prohibited during the months of July, August, September, and October in the year 1930.

For the purpose of this By-law "heavy traffic" means the traffic of all vehicles the load of which exceeds one ton, excluding the weight of the vehicle.

Any person who commits a Breach of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not exceeding £20.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 549/29.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain Sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted—Metropolitan Reticulation Main Improvement—City of Perth.—Proposed six-inch diameter cast-iron water main commencing at the existing eight-inch diameter main at the junction of Thomas Street and Richardson Street, and proceeding thence in a South-Easterly direction along Richardson Street to connect with the existing four-inch diameter main at the intersection of Outram Street and Richardson Street (length about fifteen chains).

The above main to be complete with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus, and the existing three-inch main to be lifted, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 5070.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 18th day of July, 1930.

Constitution of Health District at Norseman under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-19."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.H.D. 726/30; Ex. Co. No. 1781.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 19 of "The Health Act, 1911-19," that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any portion of the State, not being a Municipal District, to be a Health District, with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the order: And whereas it is desired to constitute a Health District, with the boundaries and under the name hereinafter specified: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby constitute the area of land embraced in the undermentioned boundaries a Health District under the provisions of the said Act, such District to be styled the Norseman Health District.

Boundaries.—All that land contained within the circumference of a circle, the radius of which is 1½ miles from the Post Office at Norseman.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 19 of "The Health Act, 1911-19," that the Governor may alter the boundaries of any Health District constituted by the Governor under the said Act: And whereas it is desired to alter the boundaries of the Narembeen Health District which was so constituted: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby alter the boundaries of the said Health District in manner following, that is to say:—So as to include (1) Townsite or Emma Hill; (2) Townsite of South Kuminin, and (3) All that land bounded by lines commencing at the North-Western corner of Lot 110 (L.T.O. Diagram 8000) of Avon Location 21205, and extending Eastward along the North boundary of the said lot, and continuing to the West boundary of Lot 109; thence along part of the West and North boundaries of said Lot 109 to the North boundary of Lot 113 (L.T.O. Diagram 8366), and continuing to the Eastern side of Thomas Street, and thence North along said side of Thomas Street, passing along the West boundary of Lot 103 (L.T.O. 8006) and East along the North boundary of said Lot 103; thence North to and along the West boundaries of Lots 97 (L.T.O. Plan 4826) and Lot 98 and of Lot 100 (L.T.O. Diagram 8006), and East along the North boundary of the last-mentioned lot, and continuing East to the East side of Road No. 5116; thence South along said side of Road No. 5116 to the North-Western corner of portion of Avon Location 18164 (Certificate of Title, Volume 1014, Folio 990); thence East along the Northern boundary of said portion of Location 18164 to its North-Eastern corner, and continuing to the Eastern side of the surveyed road, passing along the Western side of the Narembeen Station Yard Reserve; thence South-Westward along said side of said road to the production North-Eastward of the South-Eastern boundary of Lot 1 (L.T.O. Plan 5209) of Location 16227; thence Southward to and along said South-Eastern boundary of Lot 1 and West along its South boundary and North along its West boundary to the Southern side of a surveyed road, passing along the South boundaries of Lots 10 to 14 inclusive; thence West along said side of the surveyed road and North along the West side of Savage Street to the South side of Road No. 5872; thence West along said side of Road No. 5872 to the production South of the West side of Scott Road; thence North along the production and West side of Scott Road to the South boundary of Lot 21 of Lot 41 (L.T.O. Plan 5147) of Location 21205 and West along part of the South and North along the West boundary of said Lot 21, and continuing North along the West boundaries of Lots 22 and 99 to the South side of a surveyed road, passing along the South boundary of Lot 112 (L.T.O. Diagram 8000); thence West along the said side of the surveyed road to the production South of the West boundary of Lot 112 aforesaid, and North to and along the West boundary of the last-mentioned lot to its North-West corner; thence North-Eastward along the North-Western boundary of Lot 111 and North along the West boundary of Lot 110 to the North-West corner of the last-mentioned lot (the starting point).

The Stock Diseases Act, 1895.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 6 of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," that the Governor may from time to time make, vary, alter, or revoke such Regulations under this Act as may be deemed expedient for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said section: And whereas it is deemed expedient to amend the Regulations under the said Act published in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th day of August, 1927, by revoking Regulation 34 thereof, and by inserting in lieu thereof a new Regulation 34 as hereinafter contained: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby revoke Regulation 34 of the Regulations under "The Stock

Diseases Act, 1895," and doth hereby make in lieu thereof a new Regulation as follows:—

34. 56. When any person has been convicted before
Justices of a breach of the Proclamation made by the
Governor under Section 106 of the said Act and pub-
lished in the *Government Gazette* on the Thirtieth day
of May, 1930, or of a breach of Subsection (2) of the

said Section 106, an Inspector may then and there apply
in Court to the Justices for an order declaring that any
pearlshell of dimensions below the prescribed minimum
in respect of which the offence has been committed and
which has been found in the possession of the person so
convicted, shall be forfeited to His Majesty under the
said Section 106, and the Justices may thereupon make
an order to that effect accordingly.

57. In other cases application for forfeiture shall be

WAGIN ROAD BOARD—NORRING LAKE RESERVE.

By-laws for the control of Reserve No. 17253 (Recreation and Watering Place) Lake Norring.

The term "Board" in these By-laws shall mean the Board appointed under the provisions of "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," to control the Reserve.

"Permission" shall mean the permission of the Board first obtained and expressed in writing.

By-laws.

Reserve to be open.

1. The Reserve and Lake will be open to the public on all days, except on special occasions, when sports are held in the enclosed area, when an entrance fee will be charged.

Persons not to drive over the Reserve.

2. No person shall drive upon or over the said Reserve, or any part thereof (other than a carriage way), without permission from the Board first obtained, nor shall any person ride upon or over any cultivated ground or any pathway in the said Reserve.

Boats on the Lake.

3. All boats used on the Lake must be registered with and licensed by the Board and subject to inspection.

Injuring or destroying Trees.

4. No person shall injure, cut, break, deface, pull up, pick, remove, or destroy any tree, shrub, plant, or flower growing on the said Reserve, or cut or remove any dead wood or timber lying in the Reserve, unless with the permission in writing of the Board first obtained.

Injuring the Soil or Surface or Fences, etc.

5. No person shall cut up or damage or disfigure, or interfere with the soil or turf or surface on any part of the said Reserve, on the roads or footways across, around, or over the same, or with any part of the fences, buildings, rockwork, watercocks, or seats around or upon the same, or pollute or interfere with any orna-

mental water therein, or interfere with or destroy any birds or animals therein in any manner whatsoever.

Persons Misconducting themselves.

6. No person shall misconduct himself or herself in any way by indulging in any riotous, disorderly, or indecent conduct, or make use of any indecent or improper language, or commit any nuisance on the said Reserve; neither shall any person obstruct or interfere with any officer in the employ of the Board in the performance of his duty in the said Reserve.

Lodging on the Reserve in the open Air.

7. No person shall camp, lodge, or tarry overnight, or frequent for the purpose of camping, lodging, or tarrying overnight, or shall sleep during the day on the said Reserve.

Posting Bills.

8. No person shall post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint, or otherwise affix or cause to be posted, stuck, stamped, stencilled, painted, or otherwise affixed any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, or any document whatsoever upon any tree, fence, post, gate, wall, bathing shed, jetty, boat, flagging, road, path, or any place whatever on the said Reserve.

Shooting, etc., on the Reserve and Lake.

9. No person shall shoot or discharge any firearms within half ($\frac{1}{2}$) a mile North or South of bathing sheds, or throw or discharge any stone or other missile, or set off any fire balloon, or throw or set fire to any fireworks, or kindle or make any fire, or use any explosive substance whatever on any portion of the Reserve, unless the consent in writing of the Board shall be previously obtained.

Selling Goods on the Reserve.

10. No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, merchandise, or things on any portion of the said Reserve, unless the consent in writing of the Board shall be previously obtained.

Races, etc., forbidden.

11. No racing matches with horses, dogs, or otherwise, nor any game of polo, nor any game which may be considered dangerous to the Board, or may be calculated to interfere with the safety or comfort of the general public, or likely to injure the surface of the ground, shall be allowed on the said Reserve, except on such portions as may be specially set apart for such purposes, and shown thereon by boundary posts, such boundary posts to be fixed and renewed from time to time as the Board may deem necessary; nor shall any person be permitted to use any portion of the said Reserve for the purpose of training any horse or other animal thereon.

Waste Litter of Picnics to be removed.

12. When any person, party, company, society, club, or organisation of any kind shall play any game, or picnic on the Reserve, he or they (as the case may be) shall, immediately prior to leaving the ground, collect and remove, or cause to be collected and removed, all waste material, bottles, broken glass, scraps, paper, litter, or rubbish of any kind brought or made upon the ground by them.

Cricket and other Games.

13. No person or organised club shall play cricket, football, baseball, racket, golf, or any game of like nature on any portion of the Reserve, except on such portion as shall have been or hereafter may be set apart for that peculiar purpose by the Board, neither shall any such games as aforesaid be played on those portions of the Reserve as are or may be set apart for these peculiar purposes, unless and until the person or club shall have first obtained from the Board a permit in writing to do so.

14. The Board may, if it thinks fit, fix the day or days upon which, and the bounds or limits within which any games or gymnastics may be permitted to take place upon the Reserve; or they may prohibit any games or gymnastics from taking place upon the said Reserve.

Cattle not to be Depastured.

15. No person shall cause, allow, or suffer any horse, cattle, sheep, dog, goat, camel, donkey, mule, or pig to stray or to depasture upon the Reserve lands without the special approval of the Board in writing.

Lamps for Vehicles.

16. Every person driving or riding in any carriage, motor car, bicycle, tricycle, or other vehicle during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall have attached to such vehicle a lighted lamp, so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which such person is proceeding, and afford adequate means of indicating the approach and position of such vehicle; and shall also have attached to any such motor car or other vehicle a lighted lamp, so fixed as to exhibit a light from the rear of such motor car or other vehicle.

Bells for Motor Cars and Cycles.

17. No person shall drive or ride any motor car, bicycle, or tricycle unless such machine shall have a bell or other sufficient means of warning affixed thereto.

Warning Bell, etc.

18. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a motor car, bicycle, or tricycle which shall be overtaking any other vehicle or any animal or foot passenger shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing or attempting to pass such other vehicle, animal, or foot passenger, sound the bell or other sufficient means of warning.

Reckless Driving.

19. No person shall at any time drive, ride, or impel any carriage, motor car, bicycle, tricycle, or other vehicle recklessly or negligently, or at a speed, or in a manner dangerous to the public, or in any circumstances at a speed exceeding 12 miles an hour; nor shall any person ride on any roadway or over any portion of the said Reserve at a rate or speed or in a manner dangerous to the public.

Bicycles, etc., not to be used on Footways.

20. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any motor car, bicycle or tricycle on or over any footway in the said Reserve.

21. (a) No person shall use any roadway within the said Reserve for the purpose of instructing any other person how to drive any motor vehicle.

(b) No person shall drive any motor vehicle within the limits of the said Reserve unless he is the holder of the requisite Driver's License under "The Traffic Act, 1919."

(c) No person shall make use of any roadway within the said Reserve for the purpose of testing or trying any motor vehicle.

(d) Motor vehicle has the same meaning as in "The Traffic Act, 1919"; all motor cars, motor trucks, bicycles, and horse-drawn vehicles must park on areas prescribed for that purpose.

Penalty.

22. Every person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall forfeit and pay on conviction such sum as may be awarded, not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Busselton Cemetery By-laws.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve, under the provisions of the above Act, of the following By-laws for the control and management of the Busselton Public Cemetery (Reserve No. 9298).

BUSSELTON CEMETERY BOARD.—BY-LAWS.

1. In the construction of these By-laws, subject to the context, "Board" means the Trustees of the Busselton Cemetery.

"Secretary" means the Secretary for the time being of the Busselton Cemetery Board.

"Cemetery" means the Busselton Public Cemetery situated on Reserve No. 9298, Nannup Road.

"Act" means "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and all amendments thereto.

2. All fees and charges payable to the Board, as set forth in Schedule A, are to be paid at the time when the applications are made or orders given.

3. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make application in the Form No. 1 in Schedule B to the Secretary.

Upon such application being approved by the Secretary for and on behalf of the Board, and upon payment of the prescribed fees and charges, the Secretary shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an "Order for Burial," in the Form No. 2 in Schedule B.

4. All applications for interment shall be made at least six working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed, unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least six working hours as above.

5. The Board shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct same in accordance with Section 24 of the Act, and under the supervision of the Secretary, and after submitting a plan of same, and obtaining a written approval of the Board thereto, and on payment of the necessary fees.

6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid a metal plate, not less in dimensions than eight inches by four inches, bearing the name of the deceased person stamped in legible characters thereon. No coffin not complying with this By-law shall be permitted to be interred in the Cemetery.

7. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with less depth than four feet six inches from the top of coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground after such interment.

8. The shape and height of all graves shall be subject to the approval and supervision of the Secretary.

9. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery unless a medical certificate of death or a Coroner's order for burial is produced prior to interment. The certificate will be retained, but the Coroner's order shall be returned to the person delivering the same.

10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

11. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—1st September to 30th April—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. 1st May to 31st August—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.; and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour, except by written permission of the Board.

12. At funerals no vehicles other than hearses shall be allowed to enter the Cemetery gates.

13. All hearses shall proceed by such roads as directed, and the drivers shall at all times observe such directions as may be issued to the Secretary by the Board from time to time for the regulation of traffic.

14. Children under the age of ten years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

15. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.

16. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the Cemetery, or to discharge any fireworks therein.

17. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower border or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

18. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery or its approaches, any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever.

19. Any person having obtained permission to erect any structure as provided by the Act shall, as far as possible have all materials required in the erection and completion of any work prepared before being taken to the Cemetery, and all materials required by the tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Secretary

shall direct; and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels having tyres less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

20. The materials used in every such work shall be subject to the approval of the Secretary, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the Contractor for the work.

21. All refuse and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by person causing the same.

22. In the event of the refuse, rubbish, or material referred to in the previous By-law not being so removed, the Board shall have the power to cause the same to be removed, and to recover the cost of such removal from the person or persons responsible therefor.

23. No rubbish, sand, soil, or any other material removed in dressing a grave, or carrying out any of the work referred to in the preceding By-laws, shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on adjoining ground, shall be removed as soon as the work is completed. No soil, sand, or any other material shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery to any other portion, unless by permission of the Board in writing.

24. All work within the Cemetery shall be carried on with due despatch and only during regulation hours.

25. All workmen, whether employed by the Board or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Secretary, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find necessary to give, and any workman committing any breach of these By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Secretary, shall be removed from the Cemetery.

26. No trees or shrubs shall be planted in any enclosure, except such as are approved by the Secretary.

27. No person employed by or under the Board shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Board, and such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

28. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Board, in writing, specifying the location of the grave or vault, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such applications shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

29. Subject to the directions of the Board, the Secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals within the Cemetery.

30. Every person who does, suffers or permits any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, may be expelled from the Cemetery, and shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such conviction, and, in the case of a continuing breach, not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues.

31. Foundations for headstones, etc., shall be not less than four feet in depth and constructed of brick, stone, or concrete.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve under the provisions of the above Act, of the following By-laws for the control and management of the Geraldton Public Cemetery (Reserve No. 19984.)

BY-LAWS GERALDTON PUBLIC CEMETERY.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Geraldton Public Cemetery, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in Schedule A, shall be paid at the time and manner therein mentioned, unless otherwise ordered.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application to the Secretary of the Trustees in the Form contained in Schedule B. and the order for burial shall, if granted, be in Form C.

3. All applications for interment shall be made to the Secretary of the Trustees, in such time as to allow at least six working hours' notice to be given to the Sexton of the Cemetery and the officiating minister prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra charge will be made.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

5. Any person desiring to construct a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under the direction of the Sexton, on payment of the required fees, and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and kept air tight.

6. Every grave shall be at least seven feet deep at the first interment, except those used for the burial of infants, but no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the surface of the ground.

7. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate, bearing the name of the deceased and date of burial indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. No coffin not complying with the By-laws shall be admitted to, or interred in the Cemetery.

8. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—Week days from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 4.30 p.m., and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour, except by written permission of the Trustees and upon payments of the fee for burials "not in the usual hours," as per Schedule A.

9. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and, if not punctually observed, the undertaker responsible shall be liable to an extra charge of 10s. 6d.

10. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle, excepting the hearse and mourning vehicles, shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery or stand opposite the entrance gates. Horses, hearses, and vehicles shall not proceed faster than a walking pace within the Cemetery, and shall proceed by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. No horse or bicycle shall be ridden within the Cemetery.

11. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery, nor shall any coffin be allowed to enter the Cemetery, unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's Order for Burial is handed to the Secretary, at the latest, upon the funeral entering the Cemetery. Should the undertaker or his representative be unable to produce the said certificate or order, he shall give a written guarantee to produce same within three days, and satisfactory reasons must be given for the non-production of such certificate or order in the first instance. In default of the production of the said certificate or order within three days, the undertaker's license may be suspended until such certificate or order is produced. The certificate will be retained, but the Coroner's order shall be returned to the person delivering the same.

12. No interment shall be allowed on a Sunday except, when it is certified in writing by a Medical Officer of Health, or by a Police Magistrate, or by two Justices of the Peace, that for sanitary or special reasons it is necessary or advisable that the burial take place on that day.

13. Unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance to the Cemetery shall be open daily between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m., from 1st September to 30th April, and between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. during the remaining months of the year.

14. Any person or group of persons of any religious denomination requiring ground in the Cemetery for an "Exclusive Right of Burial" for a private grave, vault, tomb, monument, railing, wall, or any other purpose, shall apply to the Trustees in writing therefor. If approved, the Trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a "Grant of Exclusive Right of Burial." In each case plans and specifications of any work proposed, if any, shall be submitted for approval to the Trustees. Such application shall also state the name of any deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

15. That in the case of application for interment in any private grave or vault, for which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given with the application, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, and the "Grant of Exclusive Right of Burial" shall be produced, and an assignment in the form of Schedule F shall be completed, if required.

16. Should the grantee be unable to produce "The Grant of Exclusive Right of Burial" on making application for a grave to be re-opened for the purpose of interment, through having lost same, the said grantee shall make a sworn declaration to this effect, and shall pay the fee for a copy of such "Grant of Exclusive Right of Burial," as prescribed in Schedule E, before the interment takes place.

17. That every person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery shall before obtaining permission to do so, submit a plan of such monument, tombstone, or enclosure and specify the material of which it is to be composed, with a copy of inscription thereon, to the Trustees, and, after paying the required fees, shall obtain such permission in writing before proceeding with the work, thus complying with Section 23 of the Principal Act, 61 Vict., No. 23.

18. Any person who shall place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure upon any grave, whether an exclusive right for burial has or has not been obtained, shall keep the same in repair, and, if after receiving one month's notice in writing from the Trustees such repairs are not executed, then the Trustee may cause to be done the act or thing required, and by such person omitted to be done, and may recover the expense thereof from such person in a summary way before two Justices of the Peace in Petty Sessions.

19. No catacombs shall be allowed.

20. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees or their officers, shall extend to the bottom of the grave. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Sexton or other officer appointed by the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

21. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by and at the expense of the person causing same.

22. Should any work by masons or others be not completed before a Sunday, they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition, to the satisfaction of the Sexton.

23. All material required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery, and all vehicles conveying any such materials shall have wheels not less than 4 inches broad, and proceed along such road as the Sexton shall direct. All work shall be done during the hours the Cemetery is open on week days. No work to be done from noon on Saturday to the opening of the gates on the Monday morning, without written permission.

24. No wooden fence, railing, cross, or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault.

25. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave, except such as shall be approved by the Trustees.

26. Subject to the approval of the Trustees, each applicant for an "Order for Burial," shall, within six months of the date of the application, enclose the grave mentioned in such application with a kerbing of tiles, slate, or stone, and place thereon the number plate bearing the number of the grave, as provided by the Trustees at the time of the funeral. Every grave, vault, monument, etc., shall be kept and maintained in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the grantee. Failing this the Trustees may do the work and charge the cost to the grantee. No mounds shall be allowed.

27. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees, or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as their officer may find it necessary to give, and shall be removable from the Cemetery upon any breach of the By-laws, or any refusal or neglect to comply with any directions of the said officer.

28. All persons taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:—

- (a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed;
- (b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees;
- (c) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees;
- (d) Work in all cases to be carried on with despatch, and only during regulation hours.

29. Every driver of a hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle, and every pedestrian, shall keep strictly to the roads and footpaths, as laid out for vehicles and pedestrians respectively, and vehicles shall only turn at points where provision for so doing is made.

30. If application be made to the Trustees to exhume any corpse for the purpose of examination or identification, or for the purpose of its being removed elsewhere, in accordance with the wishes of the deceased or his family, an order from the Governor in Council, authorising the Trustees to permit of the exhumation, must be attached to the application form. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in an airtight wooden or leaden coffin prior to removal.

31. Any person in the Cemetery who shall violate the rules of propriety and decorum, or commit any nuisance, or trespass or injure any tree, shrub, flower, border, grave, or any erection, or in any way infringe these By-laws, shall be removed from the Cemetery, and any person or persons so offending may be proceeded against in accordance with the Act and By-laws.

32. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery or its approaches, any trade or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards, or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever, without the consent of the Trustees, and any person infringing this By-law shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

33. Children under the age of ten years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

34. Smoking shall not be allowed within the Cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

35. No dogs shall be allowed in the Cemetery, and any found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.

36. No person shall pluck any tree, plant, shrub, or flower growing in any portion of the Cemetery, nor remove any plant, tree, shrub, flower, or any article from any grave—with the exception of withered flowers—without first obtaining the consent of the Trustees or their representative, and any person so interfering with or removing in any way anything laid, built, or placed on or in any grave or burying place, may be proceeded against in accordance with the Act.

37. Prior to conducting any interment within the Cemetery, or making use of the Cemetery for any pur-

pose connected with the interment, every undertaker shall pay to the Trustees an annual fee of £2 2s., and shall, at the time of making such payment, give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "Permit," to hold good during good behaviour and until the expiration of twelve months, and, unless by the permission of such a "permit," no undertaker shall be allowed to carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

38. Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Trustees, such licenses to be renewed annually in the month of July. The Trustees may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantee to do so, or the grantees may do it themselves, or employ any person licensed by the Trustees for that purpose, and no other person, except the relatives of the deceased, the Trustees, or those licensed by the Trustees, shall be permitted to decorate any grave.

39. If for the purpose of re-opening a grave the Trustees find it necessary to remove edging, tiles, plants, grass, shrubs, etc., from off the grave, the person so ordering the re-opening shall pay to the Trustees the charges laid down in Schedule A.

40. Notwithstanding anything contained in the existing By-laws to the contrary, permission may be granted to the Defence Department of the Commonwealth to erect headstones on the graves of deceased returned soldiers, without payment of any fee.

41. Free ground may be granted if it is proved to the satisfaction of the Trustees—

- (a) that the deceased was a returned soldier, and that he died as the result of injuries received in the late war.
- (b) that the relations of the deceased are in necessitous circumstances. Provided that such grant shall be made subject to the condition that only the remains of deceased soldiers shall be interred in the grave. The Trustees may maintain the graves of deceased soldiers free of cost for a term of seven years.

42. The "Secretary" or "Sexton," as referred to in these By-laws, means the person for the time being employed by the Trustees as the Secretary and Sexton of the Cemetery, and such person or persons shall, subject to Trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery and to carrying out and enforcement of these By-laws, and the direction of such person or persons shall, in all cases and for all purposes, be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the Trustees.

43. Any person committing any breach of any of these By-laws and Regulations, or of any other Rules, Regulations, or By-laws lawfully made under the authority of any Act relating to Cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and, in case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall be forthwith removable from the Cemetery by the Trustees, the Sexton, or other officer of the Trustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser and may be proceeded against accordingly.

44. All fees may be recovered and all proceedings under these By-laws taken before two Justices of the Peace in Petty Sessions, except where otherwise provided for.

45. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the distribution of the land compartments, sections, situations and number of graves; a Register of Burials with all details, and a "Register of Right of Burial," shall be kept at the office of the Trustees.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying Schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees held at their office on Saturday, 21st June, 1930, and adopted.

Narrogin Municipal Council—Amendment of By-laws.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-19," a Local Health Authority may make By-laws, and may amend, repeal, or alter any By-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Narrogin Municipal Council, being a Local Health Authority, doth hereby make the following By-laws:—

Morgues.

1. No person shall erect, maintain, or use any place for the temporary reception of the bodies of the dead, and for keeping such bodies for the purpose of view, examination, identification, or other lawful purposes before burial or cremation, within the Municipality, without a written license from the Council, and except in accordance with and upon the following terms and conditions of such license.

2. No such license shall be granted in respect of any premises unless—

- (a.) the walls are constructed of stone, brickwork, or other approved material;
- (b) the interior surface of the walls is covered and rendered impervious with some non-absorbent and washable material approved by the Council;
- (c) all floors are constructed of some impervious material, approved by the Council, such as granolithic, laid upon a bed of 4 inch concrete, having a fall to an outlet drain discharging over a trapped gully;
- (d) the premises are adequately ventilated by direct communication with the outside air.

3. No such license shall be granted in respect of any room the dimensions of which are less than ten feet by nine feet and twelve feet in height.

4. No such license shall be granted in respect of any private premises unless the site thereof is approved by the Council, or if same is within twenty feet of any dwelling-house.

5. The annual fee for such license shall be One pound.

6. Every license shall expire on the 31st day of December next after the day of its issue.

DRIVERS, MOTOR CAR (GOVERNMENT)—INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

(Amendment of Industrial Agreement No. 26 of 1925.)

No. 2 of 1930.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," made this tenth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirty, between the Premier for the State of Western Australia, of the one part, and the Amalgamated Road Transport Union of Workers, Perth, of the other part; Whereas an Industrial Agreement, numbered 26 of 1925, was made on the sixth day of April,

1925, between the above-mentioned parties and registered at the Court on the 18th April, 1925 :

Now it is hereby agreed by and between the parties hereto—

1. That Industrial Agreement numbered 26 of 1925 be and the same is hereby varied by the addition of the following new clause :—

13. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the following special provisions shall apply to the period commencing 10th July, 1930, and ending 9th October, 1930—

- (a) A system of part-time employment may be applied, so that workers may be employed on alternate weeks, provided that workers shall not be stood down for less than a week at a time ;
- (b) Notice of the employer's intention to stand down a worker shall be given to the worker on the last day preceding the idle period ;
- (c) Workers recalled for duty during the stand-down period shall be paid casual rates, as set out in Clause 2 of the original Agreement No. 26 of 1925 ;
- (d) The part-time principle shall, where possible, be applied in rotation to all workers covered by this Agreement ;
