WHEREAS by "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation temporarily suspend the operations of the said Act, in so far as it applies to the closing time fixed or appointed for any shop or shops: And whereas it is expedient to exercise such power in manner hereafter appearing: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby by this Proclamation suspend the operations of the said Act between the hours of six o'clock and nine o'clock in the evening of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in every week during the period commencing on the First day of January, 1931, and ending on the Thirty-first day of December, 1931, in so far as it applies to the closing

time of shops conducted in open markets, which are kept open for the conduct of business therein between the times aforesaid and on the days aforesaid, and in which shops home-made jams and preserves, honey, butter (other than factory butter) and eggs, hams and bacon, not being factory hams or bacon, are sold or offered for sale; provided that only the said goods shall be sold or offered for sale between the said times by virtue of this Proclamation, and the said shops shall not be kept open for the sale or offering for sale of any other goods which cannot otherwise be lawfully sold or offered for sale between the times aforesaid.

A By-law of the Municipality of the City of Perth, made under Section 179 of “The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906,” and numbered 29, for the regulating of the standing of motor cars in streets.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Lord Mayor and Councillors of the City of Perth order that By-law No. 29 be repealed and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

1. In the interpretation of this By-law—

“Alignment” means the building alignment or other extreme boundary of the highway referred to;

“Omnibus” means a motor omnibus licensed to carry more than seven passengers;

“Taxi-bus” means a motor omnibus licensed to carry not more than seven passengers.

2. The following stands are hereby appointed as stands for motor vehicles licensed under “The Traffic Act, 1919-1926,” or any amendment thereof:—

(1) For private motor cars only—

(a) A stand on the Western side of Pier Street, beginning at a point 132 feet South of the Southern alignment of Hay Street and extending Southwards 132 feet;

(b) A stand on the Northern side of Murray Street beginning at a point 30 feet East of the Eastern alignment of Pier Street and extending Eastwards 132 feet;

(c) A stand on the Southern side of Esplanade beginning at a point 352 feet West of the Western alignment of Barrack Street and extending Westwards 540 feet;

(d) A stand East of the Eastern side of William Street beginning at a point 20 feet South of the North-Western corner of Reserve 423 and extending Southwards along William Street to a point 33 feet from the Southern boundary of Reserve 423, the said stand to be 17 feet in width from the fence on the Western side of Reserve 423;

THE WATER BOARDS ACT, 1904, AND AMENDMENTS

All Water Areas constituted under Section 2
of No. 26 of 1928.

BY-LAWS.

Division I.

Interpretations.

1. (a.) The words "Authorised," "By-laws," "District," "Fittings," "Local Authority," "Minister," "Occupier," "Owner," "Pipe," "Prescribed," "Ratepayer," "Rateable Land," "Road," "Reservoir," "Stream," "Water Area," "Waterworks," "Watercourse," and "Works" shall have meanings severally attached to them in "The Water Boards Act, 1904," hereinafter referred to as the principal Act, or any amending Act, and the By-laws made thereunder.

(b.) "Reservoir" shall mean any reservoir, dam, tank, cistern, or well.

(c.) "High water mark" shall mean the level of full supply of any reservoir or feeder thereto.

(d.) "Feeder" shall mean any watercourse, creek, stream, or other channel, with either permanent or intermittent flow, whereby water can be conveyed to any reservoir.

(e.) "Catchment Area" shall mean all land over, through, or under which any water flows, runs, or percolates directly or indirectly into any reservoir erected or used by the Minister in connection with any water supply, prescribed in or proclaimed under any Act.

(f) "Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply, acting in pursuance of "The Water Boards Act, 1904," and "The Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912."

(g) "Inspector" and "Local Officer" respectively shall mean a person appointed by the Minister for the purpose of these By-laws or to administer the said By-laws.

Division II.

By-laws for Protecting the Water, Grounds, Works, etc.,
from Trespass and Injury.

Trespassing Prohibited.

2. Trespassing within the fenced-off ground adjacent to or reserved for Water Supply Works, or the entering without proper authority of any waterwork not open to the public, shall not be permitted.

Camping and lighting Fires.

3. Camping or lighting of fires within the vicinity of any reservoir, except on land set apart for such purposes, shall not be permitted. The lighting of fires on any other reserves or fenced-off land is absolutely prohibited.

Protection of Flora, Shrubs, etc.

4. The removal, plucking, or damaging of any wild flower, shrub, bush, tree, or other plant, growing on any land or reserve vested in the Minister, within half a mile of any reservoir, shall not be permitted.

Dogs Prohibited.

5. Dogs shall not be permitted on any portion of the grounds in the vicinity of any waterworks.

Disposal of Refuse, etc.

6. Loose paper or other refuse shall not be left on any portion of the grounds in the vicinity of any reservoir or works, except in the receptacles provided therefor.

Posting or distribution of Bills, etc.

7. Bills, advertisements, or other notices shall not be posted or distributed on any portion of any reservoir or works, or on any portion of the works or grounds in the vicinity thereof.

Nuisances.

8. Nuisances shall not be committed on any portion of the grounds in the vicinity of any reservoir or works.

Protection of Pipes.

9. Vehicles, conveyances, or animals shall not be driven, taken, or ridden in such a manner as to endanger the main conduit or any branch thereof, or be permitted to cross the same except where crossing places have been provided as indicated by sign-boards.

Division III.

By-laws for General Purposes.

Reward—Reporting Leakage.

10. The Minister may in his discretion adequately reward any person (not being the person in fault) who shall communicate timely information to the Minister of any leakages or waste of water, whether the same be accidental, negligently or wilfully occasioned or suffered, or who shall give such information as shall lead to the conviction of any person or persons who shall steal or cause to be stolen or improperly appropriated the water of the Minister.

Waste of Water.

11. Any person supplied with water by the Minister, shall not allow the same to run to waste.

Division IV.

Rates and Charges.

12. Within water areas constituted under the provisions of section 2 of Act Number 26 of 1928, the Water Rates shall be as follows:—

Land within two miles of the source of supply—1d. per acre per annum.

Land beyond two miles but within four miles of the source of supply— $\frac{3}{4}$ d. per acre per annum, and

Land beyond four miles but within six miles of the source of supply— $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per acre per annum.

13. Rates shall become due and payable yearly in advance on the 1st day of January, provided that in all cases where the rate is made after 1st day of January in any year the notice shall specify the minimum sum payable as rate aforesaid, and the date or dates when the rate shall be due and payable, and such rate shall become due and payable in accordance with the terms of such notice.

Division V.
Penalties.

Penalty for Breaches.

14. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws to which no specific penalty is attached, or who shall refuse or neglect to obey any injunction in any such By-law, or to comply with any requirements therein contained, shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, and, in case of continuing offence, a further penalty not exceeding £5 for each day after notice of such offence shall have been given by the Minister to such offender.
