WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: And whereas the City of Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain lands, named and described in the Schedule hereunder, which have been used for streets or ways within the Municipality of the City of Perth, be declared public highways: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said lands to be public highways, and such lands shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as highways within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 139/30.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works; and whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act:—

Description and Location of Reticulation Works Approved and Exempted.—Metropolitan Reticulation Main Improvement—Greenmount Road District:—Proposed four-inch diameter water main commencing at the end of the existing four-inch diameter main at the junction of York Road and Innamineka Road and proceeding thence in a North-Westerly direction along Innamineka Road to connect with the existing two-inch main at the junction of Innamineka Road and Woolloomooloo Road (length about twenty-one and a half chains).

The above main to be laid complete, with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus, and the existing two-inch main to be lifted, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 5681.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 28th day of November, 1930.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this Twenty-eighth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirty, between the City of Perth Municipal Council and the Fremantle Gas and Coke Company, Limited (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the one part, and the Metropolitan Gas Works Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part: Whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto that the several stipulations, conditions, and provisions set out in this schedule hereto shall in all cases be binding upon and shall be faithfully carried out and observed, performed, and complied with by all parties concerned.

Men engaged inside the gas, tar, or water space of any boiler or inside the boiler flue in cleaning or scraping work shall, whilst so employed, be paid 6d. per hour in addition to his ordinary or overtime rate of pay.		
Any employee working in wet ground shall be paid 1s. per day in addition to his ordinary or overtime rate of pay. "Wet ground" means ground in which, in the opinion of the engineer, it is impracticable for workers to work without getting wet feet. Provided that, where watertight boots are supplied by the management, there shall be no allowance for wet ground.		

Clause 2.—Travelling Allowance for Main Gangs and Outside Workers.

Where an employee commencing work at starting time on the job incurs extra tram or railway fares over and above one tramfare each way, or over and above the amount he would incur if starting work at Wellington Street Works, Perth, or Gas Works, Fremantle, this extra amount of fares shall be refunded to him each week, providing that this clause does not apply to any worker who has been allotted a special district whilst working in such district.

Clause 3.—Time Allowance outside the Two Mile Radius.

Employees working temporarily outside the two-mile radius of the Wellington Street Works, Perth, or Gas Works, Fremantle, and not within two miles of their place of residence, shall be allowed one half-hour per day travelling time without loss of pay, in addition to above travelling allowance, when required to report for work on the job.

Clause 4.—Hours.

The hours of duty shall not, without payment for overtime, exceed 44 hours per week, and the hours of duty for any day shall not, without payment for overtime, exceed eight hours: Provided also, that if it is found necessary, arrangements may be made for employees to commence work earlier or later and finish earlier or later than the ordinary hours. Each shift to consist of eight hours.

Clause 5.—Overtime.

Payment shall be made for overtime at the rate of time and one half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.

When a worker is recalled to work after leaving job he shall be paid for at least two hours at overtime rates.

When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one hour he shall be provided with any meal required, or shall be paid two shillings (2s.) in lieu thereof. This provision shall not apply in case of emergency breakdown repairs nor to men unloading coal.

Clause 6.—Shift Work.

The hours of duty without payment for overtime shall not, for shiftmen (except watchmen), exceed an average of 44 hours per week, to be worked in shifts not exceeding eight hours each. Such shifts to be distributed as the employers choose, but so as to make an aggregate shift time on duty not exceeding 176 hours in each period of four weeks.

For all duty performed on his day off in the week, not being a Sunday or a holiday, the minimum ordinary rate prescribed for a shiftman shall be increased by one-half, but in the case of a Sunday it shall be doubled.

For all time worked on a Sunday (not being his day off) the minimum ordinary rate for a shiftman shall be increased by one-half.

For all duty on holidays the minimum ordinary rate prescribed for a shiftman shall be paid in addition to the holiday pay.

In the case of a shiftman working on his day off at the request of another employee, the rate to be paid shall be the ordinary rate payable for the day or shift.

In the case of a man, after his usual day's work, being called on for retort house work between 5.0 p.m. and 7.30 a.m., he will be paid at the rate of time and one-half, unless notified before 5 p.m. that he will be required for the night shift.

Clause 7.—Holidays.

The following days shall be recognised as holidays and the usual rates of pay shall be paid for same:—Good Friday, Easter Monday, Eight Hours' Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and New Year's Day.

Any days which are prescribed by the laws of the State to be observed in lieu of the holidays above-mentioned will be treated as the days to which this clause applies.

All employees other than shiftmen shall be free from duty on holidays without loss of pay for the day, but any employee may be required for duty on any Sunday or holiday, and, if so required, shall be entitled to the ordinary rate for the time worked on Sunday, and on holidays the ordinary day's pay plus the holiday pay for the day. The rates for shiftmen shall be time and one-half for Sundays and double rates for holidays.

Annual Leave.

A working week of forty-four hours leave of absence will be granted annually on full pay after twelve months' service, in addition to the six days holiday al-

ready specified herein. Leave not to be cumulative and to be taken at the discretion of the management so as to interfere with the routine of the works as little as possible.

In the case of a retort operator being compelled to work on a holiday as defined in this clause, one day shall be added to his annual leave for each scheduled holiday so worked.

Employees not completing twelve months' service shall receive holidays or pay in lieu thereof, after six months' service, in proportion to the length of service, that is, one day's holiday for every two months' service, calculated at the rate of one-sixth of the 44 hour week's pay for each day's holiday, unless summarily dismissed for misconduct, dereliction of duty, etc., in which case no holiday pay shall be granted.

Clause 8.—Casual Workers.

A casual worker shall be paid ten per cent. increase on the prescribed rate for the particular class of work he is required to perform.

"Casual worker" means a worker (other than men picked up for unloading coal) employed for less than fourteen consecutive days.

Clause 9.—Junior Workers.

Junior workers shall be paid in accordance with the following scale:—

Clause 10.—Weekly Hiring.

(a) Except as to casual workers, the employment is terminable on either side by one week's notice given on any day. But for the first fourteen days of employment the hiring shall be from hour to hour, and during this period an hour's notice or an hour's pay shall be sufficient.

(b) If a weekly worker absents himself from duty, a sum proportionate to his time of absence may be deducted from his pay.

(c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

(d) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed, because of any strike by the applicant or the Unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through any breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work, or by any such strike or breakdown which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

(e) Sick Pay.—The employers will, in the case of personal accident or personal sickness, necessitating absence from work, pay for a total period of six days in the year for such absence from work.

Providing also, that the employee will lose his pay for the time of such absence from work unless he produces or forwards within forty-eight hours of the commencement of such absence a medical certificate or other evidence satisfactory to the management that his absence was due to personal accident arising out of and in the course of his employment, or to personal ill health necessitating such absence.

Provisions.

Clause 11.—Service Layers.

Service layers' work to terminate within six feet of inside of building or street line.

Clause 12.—Maintenance Work.

Maintenance work shall not constitute gas fitters' work, unless it is found necessary to remove the fittings and replace them to repair a fault.

Clause 13.—Tools.

All tools required by the abovenamed employees (service and maintenance men) in connection with any work performed by them on behalf of the employers to be provided by the employers, with the following exception:—

All tools (small) generally known as "Pocket Tools" to be found by the employees.

Clause 14.

Plumbers, carpenters, blacksmiths, fitters, and turners and other trades provided for under the various Federal and State Awards are not included in this Agreement.

Clause 15.—Forty-four Hour Week.

The 44-hour week in this Agreement having been agreed to in consequence of the State Arbitration Court having awarded a 44-hour week to the Amalgamated Society of Engineers, it is hereby agreed that, should the Court increase the hours to 48 hours or any other number of hours per week, this Agreement shall be amended to include such provision.

Clause 16.—Settlement of Disputes.

Should any question or dispute arise regarding this Agreement or any matter not provided for herein, it shall be referred to a representative of the employers and of the Union, who shall meet and endeavour to effect a settlement.

This clause shall not be taken to interfere with any rights of either of the parties to proceed for a penalty for a breach of this Agreement.

Clause 17.—Locality of Agreement.

This Agreement shall apply in Perth to an area comprised within a circle of five miles from the Perth Town Hall as centre, and in Fremantle to an area comprised within a circle of five miles from the Fremantle Town Hall as centre.

Clause 18.—Basic Wage.

The basic wage, as declared by the State Arbitration Court being adopted as the standard in this Agreement, any variation of the basic wage declared by the Court will become the standard in this Agreement, and all other rates will be altered so as to preserve the margins shown in this Agreement.

Clause 19.—Duration of Agreement.

This Agreement shall operate from the 24th day of September, 1930, to the 23rd day of September, 1933, inclusive, and thereafter until superseded or varied, subject to the right of either party to apply to the Court of Arbitration (State) at any time after the expiration of the first twelve months from the 24th day of September, 1930, and after the expiration of any subsequent period of twelve months to vary or amend this Agreement.

HOTEL EMPLOYEES (STATE).

(Registered 10-11-1930.)

No. 29 of 1930.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this 20th day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirty, between the Honourable John Lindsay, M.L.A., Minister for Works and Labour, on behalf of the Government of Western Australia, of the one part, and The Hotel, Club Caterers, Tea Room, and Restaurant Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:—

1. All full time wages workers in the Department who have served continuously for ten or more years after attaining the age of eighteen years will be entitled, subject to the following regulations, to three months' long service leave, to be granted at the convenience of the Department.

2. They will be similarly entitled to a further period of three months' long service leave for ten years' continuous service, in accordance with paragraph 3 hereof; and to a further period of three months for seven years' subsequent continuous service; and thereafter to a further period of three months' long service leave in respect of each seven years' subsequent continuous service. The words "continuous service" do not include the period during which a worker is on long service leave or any period exceeding two weeks a worker is absent without pay.

3. The qualifying period for the second grant of long service leave to wages workers having more than ten years' continuous service on the first January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, will, without regard to the grant of the first period of such leave, commence as follows:—

To workers of twenty-eight years' service or over on 1st January, 1927—1st January, 1927;

To workers of twenty-two years' service and of less than twenty-eight years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st July, 1927;

To workers of sixteen years' service and of less than twenty-two years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st July, 1928;

To workers of thirteen years' service and of less than sixteen years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st July, 1929;

To workers of ten years' service and of less than thirteen years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st January, 1930;

To workers of less than ten years' service on 1st January, 1927, but who have completed ten years' service by 1st July, 1930—1st July, 1930.

4. Any public holidays occurring during the period in which a worker is on long service leave will be calculated as portion of the long service leave, and extra days in lieu thereof shall not be granted.

5. Long service leave is granted solely for recuperative purposes. No worker in the Department is to undertake during long service leave, without the consent of the Under Secretary for Works and Labour, any form of employment for hire or reward. Contravention of this regulation will be followed by dismissal.

6. A worker dismissed from the service shall not be entitled to payment in respect of long service leave other than for leave that had accrued due to him prior to the date of the offence for which he was dismissed.

7. Workers may be paid their wages in advance, at their permanent classified rate of pay, for a period equivalent to the leave taken.

8. Any employee who is eligible for three months' long service leave and who resigns or is retired from the service shall be paid for such long service leave due.

9. A worker who retires at or over the age of 65, or who is retired on account of incapacity due to old age, or through ill-health, and who has served continuously for at least twelve months next before such retirement, shall be paid for long service leave pro rata to date of retirement.

10. If a deceased worker who had served continuously for at least twelve months next before his death leave a widow, or children, mother or invalid sister, who were dependent upon him, payment pro rata of long service leave up to date of such worker's death shall be granted to such widow or dependants.

11. During the period of long service leave district allowances will not be paid except when the family or dependants of the worker remain in the district.

12. A worker whose service is broken, owing to the exigencies of his particular work for a period not exceeding two weeks, shall in respect of such period be deemed on "leave without pay."

13. Wherever possible not less than one month's notice will be given each worker prior to the date on which his long service leave is to commence.

14. A worker with less than ten years' service who is retired after the 11th October, 1930, shall be paid for long service leave pro rata up to the 11th October, 1930, provided he would have been entitled to such payment under the provisions of the Agreement dated 30th September, 1927.

15. This Agreement shall apply to full time workers employed by the Government and shall operate over all State-owned hotels throughout the State.

16. The term of Agreement is three years from the 12th day of October, 1930.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 28 of 1930.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this 20th day of October, One thousand nine hundred and thirty, between the Honourable John Lindsay, M.L.A., Minister for Works and Labour, on behalf of the Government of Western Australia, of the one part, and The Western Australian Barmaids' and Barmen's Union of Workers, Perth, of the other part, whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:—

1. All full time wages workers in the Department who have served continuously for ten or more years after attaining the age of eighteen years will be entitled, subject to the following regulations, to three months' long service leave, to be granted at the convenience of the Department.

2. They will be similarly entitled to a further period of three months' long service leave for ten years' continuous service, in accordance with paragraph 3 hereof; and to a further period of three months for seven years' subsequent continuous service; and thereafter to a further period of three months' long service leave in respect of each seven years' subsequent continuous service. The words "continuous service" do not include the period during which a worker is on long service leave or any period exceeding two weeks a worker is absent without pay.

3. The qualifying period for the second grant of long service leave to wages workers having more than ten years' continuous service on the first January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, will, without regard to the grant of the first period of such leave, commence as follows:—

To workers of twenty-eight years' service or over on 1st January, 1927—1st January, 1927;

To workers of twenty-two years' service and of less than twenty-eight years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st July, 1927;

To workers of sixteen years' service and of less than twenty-two years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st July, 1928;

To workers of thirteen years' service and of less than sixteen years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st July, 1929;

To workers of ten years' service and of less than thirteen years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st January, 1930;

To workers of less than ten years' service on 1st January, 1927, but who have completed ten years' service by 1st July, 1930—1st July, 1930.

4. Any public holidays occurring during the period in which a worker is on long service leave will be calculated as portion of the long service leave, and extra days in lieu thereof shall not be granted.

5. Long service leave is granted solely for recuperative purposes. No worker in the Department is to undertake during long service leave, without the consent of the Under Secretary for Works and Labour, any form of employment for hire or reward. Contravention of this regulation will be followed by dismissal.

6. A worker dismissed from the service shall not be entitled to payment in respect of long service leave other than for leave that had accrued due to him prior to the date of the offence for which he was dismissed.

14. A worker with less than ten years' service who is retired after the 11th October, 1930, shall be paid for long service leave pro rata up to the 11th October, 1930, provided he would have been entitled to such payment under the provisions of the Agreement dated 19th September, 1927.

15. This Agreement shall apply to full time workers employed by the Government and shall operate over all State-owned hotels throughout the State.

16. The term of Agreement is three years from the 12th day of October, 1930.
