WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-Australian waters, during any specified time in any specified year, or during a specified portion of any specified year. And whereas the "Prawn" is a prescribed species of Sh within the manning of this provision. fish within the meaning of this provision: And whereas by Section 17 of the same Act the Governor may by Proclamation declare what length and depth of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall, when used or intended to be used in any specified water or waters, or for catching any specified kind or kinds of fish, be a lawful net: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent. of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—
That those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule shall be closed against the taking of "Prawns" by means of any net other than a handscoop net (such net not to exceed a total length of nine feet upon either the cork line or lead line) from the 1st day of January, 1931, until the 31st day of December, 1931, inclusive: And, further, that any net which does not exceed 25 fathoms in length, and has a mesh throughout the whole of the net of not less than one-half inch, measured from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh when wetted ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternate corners are in contact, shall be a lawful net when use or intended to be used for the capture of "Prawns" in any Western Australian waters, except those portions defined in the Schedule hereto.

Schedule.

That portion of the Swan River extending in a Westerly and Southerly direction downwards to its entrance at Fremantle from a line drawn from the Point Walter Jetty (Walter Point) to Point Resolution, and the Swan River and its tributaries extending upwards in a Northerly and North-Easterly direction to

its head from the Narrows at Mill Point.

That portion of the Canning River and its tributaries upwards to its head from the Lower Canning

Bridge.

(2) That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Second Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the first day of January, 1931, until the thirty-first day of March, 1931, and from the first day of October, 1931, until the thirty-first day of December, 1931, inclusive;
(3) That all that portion of Western Australian

(3) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Third Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the first day of January, 1931, until the twenty-third day of March, 1931, and from the sixteenth day of May, 1931, until the thirty-first day of December, 1931, inclusive;

(4) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Fourth Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the taking of English Perch by any method of capture as from the first day of July, 1931, until the thirty-first day of October, 1931, inclusive;

(5) That all those waters mentioned in the Fifth Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of sunk or set nets as from the first day of January, 1931, until the thirty-first day of December, 1931, inclusivé.

First Locality Schedule.

All that portion of the ocean waters of Rottnest Island lying West of the North-Eastern extremity of North Point (on the Northern side of the said Island) and West of the South-Western extremity of Salmon Point (on the Southern side of the said Island) and within the sea limits of half-a-mile from the foreshore,

Second Locality Schedule.

(a) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending from the North-Western side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half-a-mile along the foreshore and

a quarter of a mile into the waters of the said bay.

(b) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending from the South-Eastern side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half-a-mile along the foreshore and a quarter of mile into the waters of the said bay.

Third Locality Schedule.

That portion of the ocean waters near the entrance to Peel's Inlet bounded by the following lines:—On the West by a line drawn in a Northerly direction for a quarter of a mile from the extremity of Robert Point (on the Western side of the Bar); thence by a line running in an Easterly direction until it meets the foreshore of the mainland (on the Eastern side of the entrance to Peel's Inlet); thence in a generally Southerly direction along the line of foreshore to the Bar; thence by a line in a generally Westerly direction to the Western point of entrance to the Bar; and thence in a generally Westerly direction along the line of foreshore to the point of commencement.

Fourth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the waters of the Capel River (near Bunbury), including the creeks flowing into it.

Fifth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the Canning River situated between a line drawn from the Northernmost extremity of Coffee Point to the North-Western extremity of Cale Street and the Lower Canning Bridge.

Perth Road Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 259/25. WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a Local Authority to exercise within its District any power of making Regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4 of Part IV. of the said Act: And whereas it is desired to empower the Perth. Act: And whereas it is desired to empower the Perth Road Board to—(a) prohibit the use of specified roads within its district by traffic, except when proceeding in specified directions; (b) regulate the speed of vehicles using such roads; (c) prevent the parking of vehicles on such roads: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Exception Council project the residual consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act, and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby empower the Perth Road Board by the By-law in the Schedule hereto to—(a) prohibit the use of that portion of Scarborough Beach Road (Poole Street) between Lilian Street and Beach Avenue, Beach Avenue between Scarborough Beach Road (Poole Street) and Manning Street, Manning Street between Beach Avenue and Lilian Street, Lilian Street between Manning Street and Scarborough Beach Road Pool Street and Lilian Street, Lilian Street between Manning Street and Scarborough Beach Road (Poole Street) by any vehicle and any person riding or driving any animal except when proceeding in specified directions; (b) regulate the speed of vehicles using such roads; (c) prevent the parking of vehicles on such roads, and to impose a penalty of not exceeding £20 or imprisonment for not exceeding one month for the breach thereof.

THE TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-26.

Perth Road District.

The Perth Road Board, pursuant to an Order in Council made under Section 43 of "The Traffic Act, 1919-26," doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws, to have effect within the Perth Road Dis-

1. No person shall ride or drive any animal, or drive any vehicle on, over, or along the roads, except as prescribed hereunder-

Scarborough Beach Road (Poole Street) between Lilian Street and Beach Avenue in a Westerly direc-

Beach Avenue between Scarborough Beach Road (Poole Street) and Manning Street in a Northerly direction:

Manning Street between Beach Avenue and Lilian

Street in an Easterly direction; Lilian Street between Manning Street and Scarborough Beach Road (Poole Street) in a Southerly

2. No person shall drive, or cause or permit to be driven, any vehicle on the above-mentioned roads at a speed exceeding 15 miles per hour.

3. No person shall park or cause or permit to be parked any vehicle on the above-mentioned roads, ex-

cept on the prescribed stand.

4. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing By-laws shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 or to imprisonment for not exceeding one month.

Closure of the Old Geraldton Cemetery and Burial Grounds.

The Cemeteries Act, 1897 and Amendments.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. No. 6886/03.

WHEREAS by the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," and amendments, it is made lawful (in case it should appear to the Governor that burials in any cemetery under any law relating to public cemeteries or other burial grounds or place of burial whatsoever should be wholly discontinued) for the Governor by order to be published in the Government Gazette, to direct that, after a time mentioned in such order (not being less than three months from the date thereof), burials in such cemetery or burial place, ground, or place of burial shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exception or qualification: And whereas it has been made to appear to the said Governor that it is advisable that all burials should be discontinued in the public cemetery and burial grounds, at Geraldton, being Lots 296, 296‡, 297 to 299, inclusive, and Sublots 70, 71, 72 and 143, except in graves at present owned by private persons: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that from and after the nineteenth day of March, 1931, burials within the limits of the said public cemetery and burial grounds, Geraldton, shall be wholly discontinued, except in cases where the special permission of the said Governor be first obtained.

So far as possible, due consideration being given to the employer's system of management and the nature of his business, the suspension from work hereby authorised shall be so arranged as to be distributed evenly amongst the workers concerned in each department of the business;

(b) Where it suits the convenience of the employer's business, any worker may be employed for the full number of hours per week as laid down in Clause (5) and then stood down for one week at a time;

(c) When the services of a worker are not required owing to the operation of subclauses (a) and (b) hereof, the employer shall give the worker one day's notice thereof;

(d) When the provisions of subclauses (a) and (b) hereof are availed of, holidays, as prescribed in Clause (8) of the Award, or pay in lieu, shall be reduced pro rata;

- (e) The provisions as to overtime in Clause (7) of the Award shall not be affected hereby, nor shall the worker's rights under Clause 17 of the Award be annulled, in the event of a worker being dismissed permanently from his employment. Where a worker is engaged as a casual worker the provisions of Clause 9, subclause (c) shall still apply.
- (2) The foregoing provisions may be continued from month to month after the said 19th May, 1931, by agreement between the parties, a memorandum of which, signed by or on behalf of the parties, shall be filed in the Court. In the event of the parties failing to agree the matter may be referred to the Court.

Traffic Regulations.

REGULATION No. 12, Part II. of the Traffic Regulations, is hereby revoked and the following new regulation inserted :-

Certificates of Registration.

- 12. (a) Every Licensing Authority shall keep a register of all licenses issued for motor vehicles and trailers drawn thereby, also locomotives and traction engines, in Form No. 37 prescribed in the Second Schedule of these Regulations and shall enter therein the particulars of such, and then issue a certificate of registration, which shall be for the term of such license.
- (b) The certificate of registration to be issued to the owner of a licensed vehicle shall be in accordance with Forms numbered 38 and 39, prescribed in the Second Schedule to these Regulations, and shall be issued free of charge.
- (c) Every certificate of registration shall be placed in, and kept in a holder issued by the Licensing Authority which issues such certificate, and such holder, with the certificate of registration placed therein, shall be affixed and kept affixed to the vehicle in respect of which the certificate is issued, in the manner prescribed by and in accordance with these regulations.
- (d) Every Licensing Authority, if so required by the owner of a vehicle in respect of which a certificate of registration is issued by such authority, shall supply to such owner on payment of the fee of one shilling and sixpence a holder which has been supplied for such purpose by the Minister to such Licensing Authority.
- (e) No person to whom a certificate of registration has been issued shall place or keep such certificate in any holder other than that supplied to him in accordance with paragraph (d) hereof by the Licensing Authority which issued such certificate. Provided that, if any person already possesses a holder properly supplied to him under paragraph (d) hereof by any Licensing Authority, it shall not be necessary for him to obtain another holder from another Licensing Authority subsequently issuing a certificate of registration when in respect of the same vehicle upon which such holder is affixed as required by these regulations.
- (f) The certificate of registration for the six months ending 30th June, 1931, for motor vehicles and trailers drawn thereby (other than motor cycles), locomotives, and traction engines, shall be printed in black on a blue ground, and for motor cycles they shall be printed in red on a yellow ground.
- (g) The Licensing Authority shall, at each subsequent issue of a license for any vehicle, issue a new registration certificate as prescribed under these Regulations.
- (h) The certificate of registration, and the holder containing it (hereinafter together referred to as the "holder and certificate"), shall be affixed to and carried on the vehicle, for which the certificate of registration is issued, as hereinafter prescribed:—
 - (i.) On a "motor cycle" the holder and certificate shall be affixed on the off-side of the handle bar or on the off-side front fork, and the front of the certificate shall face towards the front of the motor cycle:
 - (ii.) On a "trailer" the holder and certificate shall be affixed on the off-side of the tray not more than twelve inches from the front of the tray and the front of the certificate shall face outwards from the trailer towards the off-side of the road:
 - (iii.) On a motor car or motor omnibus the holder and certificate shall be affixed in such a position that the centre of the certificate is not more than six inches from the bottom off-side corner of the windscreen, and the front of the certificate shall face towards the front of the vehicle.

- (iv.) On motor wagons, locomotives, or traction engines or any other motor vehicle not already specified, the holder and certificate shall be affixed by the bracket attached to the holder, on the off-side of the vehicle, not less than two feet six inches and not more than five feet above the level of the ground, and not more than eight and not less than four feet from the most forward part of the vehicle and the front of the certificate shall face towards the front of the vehicle.
- (i) In all cases the holder and certificate shall be carried on the particular vehicle for which it is issued so as to be clearly visible to a person directly facing the certificate within six feet thereof.
- (j) The Licensing Authority shall, upon the issuing of the certificate of registration under this regulation, write upon such certificate the particulars of the motor vehicle, trailer, locomotive or traction engine so registered as indicated in Form No. 28, and for a motor cycle as set out in Form No. 39 of the Second Schedule.
- (k) Any person who on any road drives any vehicle registerable under this regulation which does not carry the holder and certificate issued for that vehicle under this regulation, or which carries the said holder and certificate otherwise than in conformity with all the requirements of this regulation, shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty for a first offence not exceeding Ten pounds and for a second or any subsequent offence not exceeding Twenty pounds.
 - (l) The fee for a duplicate of a license shall be five shillings.


