The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 1618/25.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend

water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted—Metropolitan Reticulation main Improvement—Midland Junction Municipality and Greenmount Road Board District.

Proposed four-inch diameter water main, commencing at the existing four-inch diameter main at the intersection of Wellarton Street and Boundary Road, and proceeding thence in an Easterly direction along Boundary Road to Bushby Street; thence in a Northerly direction along Bushby Street to Morrison Road; thence in an Easterly direction along Morrison Road to connect with the existing two-inch diameter main at the junction of Beaconsfield Avenue and Morrison Road (length about twenty-six chains).

The above main to be complete with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus, and the existing inch and a half diameter tube main to be lifted as shown in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A. No. 5089.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the second day of April, 1931.

By-laws made by the State Gardens Board appointed under the provisions of "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," for the Control and Management of Reserve No. A9868 (Yanchep Caves).

Visitors must be accompanied by the Caretaker or Guide.

1. No person or persons shall enter any cave unless accompanied by the authorised guide or caretaker.

Admission Fees.

2. Every person entering a cave shall pay to the caretaker or authorised guide, before entering, such admission fees as may be approved by the State Gardens Board from time to time.

Injuring or destroying Trees.

3. No person shall injure, cut, break, deface, pull up, pick, remove or destroy, or interfere in any way with any tree, shrub, plant or flower growing on the said reserve.

Injuring or disfiguring Caves.

4. No person shall break, remove, injure, or deface by writing, or by marking, or in any way damage any rock, stalactite, or stalagmite, or remove any rock, stalactite, or stalagmite, or in any way injure, damage, or disfigure the stairways, ladders, cave gates, railings, seats, fences, buildings, machinery, lighting appliances, or other structures or improvements, or gardens, or pleasure grounds and appurtenances within any cave or upon the reserve.

Injuring the Soil or Surface, or destroying Birds or Animals.

5. No person shall cut up, damage or disfigure, or interfere with the soil or rocks or turf or surface of the caves, reserves, or gardens, or pleasure grounds and appurtenances, or the roads or footways across, around, or over the same, or pollute or interfere with any water thereon, interfere with or destroy any birds or animals thereon, in any manner whatsoever.

Visitors to act in obedience to instructions of Caretaker or Authorised Guide.

6. Every visitor to the reserve or caves therein shall act in obedience to the instructions of the Caretaker or authorised Guide whilst being shown through or over any cave or caves or part of the reserve.

Persons misconducting themselves.

7. No person or persons shall misconduct themselves in any way by indulging in riotous or indecent conduct, or make use of any indecent or improper language, or commit any nuisance on or within the said reserve or caves.

Posting Bills.

8. No person shall post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint, or otherwise affix, or cause to be posted, stuck, stamped, stencilled, painted, or otherwise affixed, any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, or any document whatsoever upon any tree, fence, post, gate, wall, flagging, road path, building, or any place whatever, upon or within the said reserve and caves.

Shooting, etc., on the Reserve.

9. No person shall shoot, discharge, or carry any firearms, or throw or discharge any stone or missile, upon or within the said reserve and caves.

Selling Goods on the Reserve.

10. No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, merchandise, or things on any portion of the said reserve or caves unless the consent, in writing, of the Board shall be previously obtained, and upon payment of such fees as the Board may direct in each case.

Waste Litter of Picnics to be removed.

11. When any person, party, company, society, club, or organisation of any kind shall play any game, or shall picnic in or upon the reserve, he or they (as the case may be) shall, immediately prior to leaving the grounds, collect and remove, or cause to be collected and removed, all waste material, bottles, broken glass, scraps, paper, litter, or rubbish of any kind brought or made upon the ground by them.

Camping and lighting Fires.

12. No person or persons shall camp or light any fire upon any cave reserve, except in such position and under such conditions as may be approved by the authorised guide or caretaker, or a servant of the Board duly authorised, and upon permission of such authorised guide or caretaker, or a servant of the Board having first been obtained.

Cattle not to be depastured.

13. No person shall cause, suffer, or allow any horse, cattle, sheep, goats, camel, donkey, mule, pig or other animal to stray or depasture upon the reserve without the special approval of the Board having been first obtained in writing, and upon payment of such fees as the Board may direct in each case.

Lights to be used.

14. No person shall use in any cave any artificial light or lights, except those provided by the Board or its servants.

Smoking in Caves.

15. No person shall smoke within any cave.

Taking Photographs.

16. No person shall take photographs in any cave without the permission of the guide or caretaker and upon payment of any or such fees as the Board may direct in each case.

Guide or Caretaker may remove any Person guilty of improper Conduct.

17. Any guide, caretaker, or servant of the Board may exclude or remove from the reserve or caves any person or persons guilty of a breach of these By-laws.

Penalty.

18. Every person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

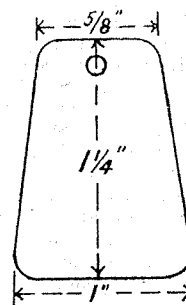
IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has approved of the following Regulations, numbered 1 to 9, under the provisions of "The Dog Act, 1903-28," to come into operation in every Municipal and Road District throughout the State on and from the 1st day of July, 1931:—

The Dog Act, 1903-28.

1. All regulations previously made under the Act shall be and are hereby repealed as from the 30th day of June, 1931.

2. The Regulations shall come into operation and have the force of law in every district throughout the State on and from the 1st day of July, 1931.

3. The registration label for the financial year ended 30th June, 1932, required by Section 9 of "The Dog Act, 1903-28," is hereby prescribed to be a flat piece of brass, of the size and shape depicted hereunder, inscribed with the name of the district, the year of registration, and the registration number on the obverse side and the emblem of the State flag on the reverse side.



4. The registration label, as prescribed to these Regulations, shall be securely affixed to a collar and continually worn round the dog's neck.

5. Registration shall be effected on or within 21 days from the 1st day of July, 1931.

6. The registration fees for dogs shall be as set forth in the Third Schedule to the principal Act, as amended by Sections 5 and 16 of the amending Act, 1923, namely:—

(a) Dog, 7s. 6d.; bitches, 10s. (except those used for tending cattle and sheep);

(b) When any person makes use of any dog or dogs in or about the droving or tending of not less than five head of "Great cattle," or twenty head of "Small cattle," he shall, on making application in the prescribed form, be entitled to register such dog at half the prescribed rate, namely—Dogs, 3s. 9d.; bitches, 5s.

7. The description of cattle shall be as set out in the Second Schedule of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing and Impounding Act, 1882," namely:—Horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, mule, bull, ox, cow, heifer, calf, camel, deer and foal—"Great cattle." Ram, ewe, sheep, wether and lamb, goat, kid and pig—"Small cattle."

8. The form for application is hereby prescribed as Form "A" in the Fourth Schedule to "The Dog Act, 1903," as issued by the Department of Works and Labour. It must be stated definitely in the last column of the form the number of cattle or sheep for which the dog is used for tending.

9. Any person or persons who contravene any provisions of these Regulations, whether by act of omission shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

HOSPITAL EMPLOYEES' (COASTAL).

(Registered 11th March, 1931.

No. 2 of 1931.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this first day of March, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, between the Board of Management of the Perth Hospital; The Board of Management of the Fremantle Public Hospital; Children's Hospital, Incorporated; Home of Peace, Incorporated; and the Minister for Public Health for the State of Western Australia as the Minister controlling the King Edward Memorial Hospital and the Old Women's Home, Fremantle (the said Minister for Public Health entering into these presents in respect of the said King Edward Memorial Hospital and Old Women's Home, Fremantle only) (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the one part, and the Hospital Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. (Coastal Branch), (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the other part: Witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of twenty miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

2.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of one year from the First day of December, One thousand nine hundred and thirty.

3.—Definition.

"Head Orderly."—The term "Head Orderly" shall mean a person performing the duties of an orderly and who is responsible for directing the activities of other orderlies.

4.—Hours of Duty.

(a) Laundry workers.—Forty-four hours shall constitute a week's work and, except where other hours are mutually agreed upon between the Union and any Institution, shall be worked between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, and between 8 a.m. and noon on Saturdays.

(b) In the event of altered hours being required by any Institution and the Union not agreeing to such alteration, the matter may be referred to a Reference Board for decision.

(c) All other workers.—Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work and shall be worked on any six days of the week.

5.—Overtime.

(a) Laundry Staff.—All time worked in excess of eight hours on Mondays to Fridays, inclusive, and four hours on Saturdays shall be regarded as overtime, and be paid for at the rate of time and a-half.

(b) All other workers.—All time worked on any day in excess of the time for which the worker is rostered shall be regarded as overtime and paid for at the rate of time and a-half: Provided that, if the overtime is occasioned through the failure of another worker to report for duty, equivalent time off duty may be granted in lieu of paying for overtime.

(c) Workers required to work on the day in which they are rostered off duty shall, at the option of the worker, be paid at the rate of double time for time worked or be paid at ordinary rates and allowed equivalent time off.

(d) Workers called upon to work in addition to ordinary duties in the venereal clinic at night shall, for time so worked during the night, be paid at the rate of time and a-half.

6.—Rosters.

Weekly rosters shall be kept posted in a convenient place, setting out the hours of starting and finishing, and the duties of each worker thereon, together with the day each worker is booked off duty. Such roster must be posted not less than twenty-four hours preceding the day on which the roster commences.

7.—Time Book.

(a) A time book, to be open for inspection by the Union Secretary at reasonable time, shall be provided. Each worker must record in such book the exact time he or she starts and finishes duty on each day, and also the time booked off for meals or breaks in shift: Provided that, if the "clocking system" be introduced it will, for the purpose of this clause, be considered as a time book.

(b) The wages sheets shall, upon reasonable notice being given, be open for inspection by the Secretary at the Head Office of the Institution.

8.—Holidays.

(a) The following days shall be observed as holidays, namely:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Foundation Day, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Anzac Day. Any worker required to work on the foregoing days shall be paid at the rate of time and a-half or be allowed time off in lieu thereof.

(b) A holiday of two weeks' on full pay, together with a board and lodging allowance of £1 5s. 9d. per week in the case of those workers who are paid on a living-in basis, shall be granted to each worker on completion of each year of service. A worker not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holiday in proportion to the length of his or her service: Provided always, that if the worker be dismissed for misconduct or any offence, no payment for annual leave or holidays will be granted for any period subsequent to the date of the offence.

9.—Sick Leave.

(a) In the case of illness, provided a satisfactory medical certificate is furnished, full pay shall be allowed as follows:—

Workers with less than six months' service—nil.
Workers with six months and less than one year's service—14 days.

Workers with one year and less than two years' service—28 days.

Workers with two years' service and over—42 days.

Such sick leave shall be granted in one or more periods, but the aggregate amount of leave on pay shall be as provided.

(b) The total sick leave in any one triennial period shall not exceed 42 days; the triennial period to be the three years preceding the date of illness for which leave is claimed.

(c) No payment for sick leave shall be made when the illness is due to the worker's own misconduct or to an accident met with off duty.

(e) (1) Orderlies performing special duties, such as night calls, shaving for surgical purposes, bath orderly, V.D. orderly, and laundry boiler attendant shall be paid at the rate of 5s. per week extra. Mortuary orderly, 5s. per week extra, but will not be entitled to payment for overtime incurred through mortuary duties.

(2) When an orderly relieves a worker of duties carrying a special allowance, such relieving orderly to be paid the special allowance at the rate of 10d. per day.

(3) (a) When workers who are not entitled to board and lodging "live-in" a charge of £1 5s. 9d. per week will be made for board and lodging.

(b) Workers whose wages are computed on a "living-in" basis, and are required to "live out," shall receive £1 5s. 9d. per week in addition to the rate specified. If required to lodge out only, they shall be paid 8s. 7d. per week in addition to the rate specified.

(c) Where employees who are paid on a "living-out" basis are provided with meals by the Institution, a deduction shall be made from the wages at the rate of 9d. for each meal provided.

11.—Payment of Wages.

Wages, including overtime if any, shall be paid fortnightly, and such payment shall be made in cash.

12.—Dressing Room.

Reasonable facilities for rest rooms for those boarding-in and dressing rooms for laundry staff living out shall be provided.

13.—Uniforms.

(a) All uniforms, i.e., uniformity in dress, shall be supplied free of cost to all workers required to wear them. Aprons shall be provided for all female workers on the kitchen and general staff.

(b) Suitable clothing shall be available for men on dirty work.

(c) Boots shall be available for kitchenmen, laundrymen, and washhouse-woman.

14.—Casual Workers.

All persons engaged for a period of less than six days in any one week shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent. in addition to the rates hereinbefore prescribed, with a minimum engagement of one day; provided, that this shall not apply in the case of a worker summarily dismissed for misconduct.

15.—General Clauses.

(a) No female worker shall be called upon to clean men's lavatories in or about any Institution.

(b) A worker required to take a day off duty not already shown on the roster for such day must be so informed before booking off on the day previous.

(c) All washing to be provided as at present.

(d) Space shall be provided at the workers' quarters for the purpose of posting Union notices.

(e) A worker who is required to do work which carries a higher rate in this Agreement than that which such worker usually performs shall be entitled to the higher rate while so employed.

(f) When a worker is entitled to annual leave under this Agreement, such worker shall be given at least two weeks' notice of the date when such leave is to commence.

(g) Copy of this Agreement shall be posted in a conspicuous position by the Secretary or Chief Resident Medical Officer of every Institution.

(h) Overtime rates shall be calculated and based on the aggregate wage, i.e., the amount paid in cash plus the deduction for board and/or lodging.

(i) If a worker's day off falls on a day prescribed by this Agreement as a holiday, such worker shall be allowed another day in lieu thereof.

(j) Letter racks shall be provided in the dining rooms for male and female workers.
