WHEREAS by "The Aborigines Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be Reserves for Aborigines: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Aborigines should be declared at La Grange Bay: Now, therefore I, John Alfred Northmore, Administrator as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare a Reserve of 450 acres at La Grange Bay, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Aborigines.

Bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the Eastern side of Reserve 9697 (Stock Route) with the Southern boundary of Pastoral Lease 1383/98 and extending Eastward along the latter boundary about 80 chains; thence North 86 chains to the said side of Stock Route Reserve, and thence South-Westward along the same to the starting point (about 450 acres); Plan 127/300.

Forests Act, 1918.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1821/30.

WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—(a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation; (b) after such proposal has been laid before Parliament, the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication: And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the Ninth day of December, 1930, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest: And whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament, a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest No. 33, by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the Schedule hereto:—

WHEREAS by Section 42 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 39 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 20026 should vest in and be held by Reginald William Fremlin, Charles Herbert Simpson, Frederick Thomas Brand, Charles David Meadowcroft, and Joseph James O'Brien in trust for the purpose of Agricultural Show Ground: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by Reginald William Fremlin, Charles Herbert Simpson, Frederick Thomas Brand, Charles David Meadowcroft, and Joseph James O'Brien in trust for the purpose aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by Section 41 of the said Act.

Stock Diseases Act, 1895.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 5 of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," that the Governor may by Order in Council, to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time prohibit the introduction or importation into this State either by sea or land of any stock from any country or place: And whereas, prior to the 9th day of January, 1931, a disease known as "Pseudo Poultry Plague" had broken out amongst poultry and birds in the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, and by reason thereof, the Governor, in exercise of his powers aforesaid by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 9th day of January, 1931, thereby prohibited the introduction or importation into the State of Western Australia, either by sea or land, of any poultry and birds from the said State of Victoria for a period of six calendar months after the date of the publication of the said Order in Council in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is now deemed expedient to continue the said prohibition until after the 6th day of September, 1931: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers thereto enabling him, doth hereby prohibit the introduction or importation into the State of Western Australia, either by sea or land, of any poultry and birds from the said State of Victoria until after the 6th day of September, 1931, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in Regulation 21 or the Second Schedule to the Stock Diseases Regulations, 1926, published in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th day of August, 1927, or any amendment thereof.

LEONORA ROAD BOARD.

By-law to provide Restrictions as to Hawkers.

P.W. 534/21.

1. No person shall hawk any fruit, fish, or vegetables, or any article of merchandise within any part of the district without having first obtained a license from the Board.

2. No person shall hawk any fruit, fish, or vegetables, or any article of merchandise within five miles of Leonora Townsite boundary.

3. Any person who travels or trades on foot, or with any vehicle or animal, or otherwise carrying to sell, or expose within the limits aforesaid any of the articles or things aforesaid shall be deemed to hawk the same.

4. No person shall keep, manage, or conduct any movable or temporarily fixed stall in or near any street for the sale of any meat, fruit, vegetables, drink, eatables, or articles of merchandise unless such person be licensed.

5. Licenses for hawkers shall be in the Form "X" of the Schedule, and for stalls in the Form "Z" in the Schedule.

6. Every hawker, whilst employed in hawking, shall produce his license, upon being required by any constable or officer of the Board, and shall at all times have affixed to some conspicuous part of his coat, barrow, basket, vehicle, or dray a board or plate bearing his name and the words "Licensed Hawker" legibly printed thereon in letters not less than one inch in length.

7. No licensed stall shall be placed or allowed to stand in any street or position other than that mentioned in the license, or between the hours of 9 p.m. or 4 a.m.

8. The following fees shall be paid for licenses to hawkers or stalls, and shall be paid in advance, and if any payment be not paid when due, the license shall be void:—

Hawkers' Licenses.

For every hawker with hand basket or tray—20s. per annum.

For every hawker with wheelbarrow or handcart—30s. per annum.

For every other hawker with motor or vehicle drawn by horse or other animal—40s. per annum.

Stall Licenses.

For every stall—10s. per month.

9. Every licensed hawker and stall-holder shall at all times obey the lawful directions of the secretary or other authorised officer of the Board.

10. No person to whom a Hawker's or Stall-holder's License is granted shall lend, transfer, or assign his license granted, and no person shall borrow or make use of any such license granted to a person other than himself, unless by written consent of the secretary.
