WHEREAS it is provided by "The Game Act, 1912-13," that the Governor may by Proclamation declare

from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all times strictly preserved, either generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof, and that the Governor may in like manner exempt from the operations of any such declaration under the said Act any defined locality: And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 30th day of July, 1929, and published in the *Government Gazette* on 2nd August, 1929, it is proclaimed and declared that the close season for Finches and Weaver Finches (exclusive of Silver-eyes) in those portions of District "G" (namely, the Kimberley Division, as defined in "The Land Act, 1898"), mentioned and described in the said Proclamation shall be the period commencing on the 1st day of September and ending on the 31st day of December in each year: And whereas it is desirable to exempt from the operations of the said Proclamation a defined locality, namely, that portion of the said District comprised within an area outside a radius of 20 miles from the Wyndham Police Station: Now, therefore I, the said Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that so much of District "G," namely, the Kimberley Division, as defined in "The Land Act, 1898," as is comprised within an area outside a radius of 20 miles from the Wyndham Police Station, shall be and is hereby exempted from the operations of the aforesaid Proclamation for a period commencing on the 1st day of September, 1931, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1931.

Those portions of Boyanup Townsite as set out hereunder:—

(1) Bounded by lines commencing at the South-West corner of Boyanup A.A. Lot 32, and extending East along its South boundary to the left bank of the Preston River and Southward along said bank of the river to the Northern boundary of Wellington Location 281; thence West along part of said Northern boundary of Location 281 and South along its West boundary; thence West along the South boundaries of Boyanup Lots 114, 113, 112, and 111, and continuing to the South-East corner of Boyanup A.A. Lot 83; thence East along the North boundary of Lot 64 (Reserve 6742) and South along the East boundary of the last-mentioned lot; thence North-Eastward to and along the South-Eastern boundaries of Lots 122, 121, 119, and 118 and 57 to 53 inclusive, to the South-Eastern corner of Lot 53; thence Southward along the Western side of Preston Road to the North corner of Lot 24 and along the Western boundaries of Lots 24 to 35 inclusive, and Lots 39 and 38; thence East along the South boundaries of Lots 38 and 37, continuing to the Eastern side of Preston Road and South along said side of Preston Road to the North boundary of Wellington Location 54; thence West along part of the North boundary of said Location 54 and the North boundary of Location 467 to the North-Western side of Junction Street and North-Eastward along said side of Junction Street to the production South of the East boundary of Boyanup A.A. Lot 41; thence North along said production and East boundary to the starting point.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, Perth, on the 17th day of August, 1931, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

The Jetties Act, 1926.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

773/29.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 7 of "The Jetties Act, 1926," that the Minister may grant a license to any person for the use of any jetty, and by Section 4 of the said Act that the Governor may make Regulations for any of the purposes therein mentioned, and by Section 5 of the said Act that any Regulations made by the Governor as aforesaid may be limited to any particular jetty: And whereas it is deemed advisable to prohibit persons attaching or fastening crayfish crates to the jetty in the Fishing Boat Harbour at Fremantle without a license from the Minister so to do, and to prescribe the conditions to be inserted in and the fees to be paid for any such license: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby make the Regulations hereinafter contained in the Schedule hereto, and doth hereby declare that the said Regulations shall be limited to the jetty in the Fishing Boat Harbour at Fremantle.

The Schedule.

1. (1) No crayfish crate shall be attached to, made fast to, or in any other manner connected with the jetty in the Fishing Boat Harbour at Fremantle by any person, except under the authority of and in accordance with a license granted by the Minister under the provisions of "The Jetties Act, 1926."

(2) Any person who shall attach to, make fast to, or in any other manner connect with the said jetty any crayfish crate in contravention of this Regulation shall be guilty of an offence, and on conviction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds for every such offence.

2. (1) Any person desiring to obtain from the Minister a license to attach to, make fast to, or in any other manner connect with the said jetty any crayfish crate shall make application for such license in writing in accordance with Form 1 in the Appendix to these Regulations, and deposit such application with the Chief Harbour Master at Fremantle, together with the prescribed fee payable for the license applied for. If such license is not granted the said fee shall be refunded to the applicant.

(2) Upon receipt of the application the Chief Harbour Master shall submit the same to the Minister, together with such recommendations regarding the same as he may think fit to make.

3. Every license granted by the Minister to any person in pursuance of an application made by such person under these Regulations shall be in the Form 2 in the Appendix to these Regulations, signed by the Minister, and shall be granted to such person upon and subject to the conditions set out in the said form of license.

4. Every such license shall specify therein the number of crayfish crates which may be attached to, made fast to, or in any other manner connected with the said jetty under the authority of such license.

5. The fee payable for such license shall be payable in advance and shall be calculated at the rate of three pounds for each and every crayfish crate in relation to which the license is granted.

License to attach Crayfish Crates to the Jetty.

Take notice that (a)....., of (b)....., Western Australia, (c)....., is hereby licensed by the Minister charged with the administration of "The Jetties Act, 1926," to attach to, make fast to, or otherwise connect with the jetty in the Fishing Boat Harbour at Fremantle (d).....crayfish crates belonging to the said licensee, for the terms of twelve calendar months commencing on and including the (e).....day of....., 193 .., upon and subject in all respects to the following conditions, namely:—

(1) The crayfish crates shall be attached to, made fast to, or otherwise connected with the jetty in such place or places, in such manner, and by such means as the Chief Harbour Master may from time to time and at any time or times indicate and approve;

(2) The Chief Harbour Master may require the crayfish crates to be removed from any place on the jetty to which they have been attached, made fast, or otherwise connected, to any other place or places on the said jetty as often as the Chief Harbour Master shall think fit, and the licensee shall forthwith carry out any such requisition;

(3) The licensee shall within a reasonable time after demand produce the license for inspection by the Chief Harbour Master, or any officer authorised by him in that behalf;

(4) The license shall not be transferable without the written consent of the Minister;

(5) The license shall be revocable without compensation to the licensee immediately if the licensee shall in any respect refuse or fail to observe, perform, or comply with any of these conditions, or shall cause, permit, or suffer his servants or agents to refuse or fail to observe, perform, and comply with these conditions;

(6) Neither the Crown nor the Minister, nor any servant or officer of the Crown or the Minister, shall in any respect whatever be responsible or liable to the licensee for any loss, injury, or damage to the crayfish crates of the licensee whilst they are attached to, made fast to, or otherwise connected with the jetty, unless such loss, injury, or damage is caused directly by the wilful misconduct of any servant of the Crown or of the Minister.

THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919.

Dundas Road Board By-laws.

P.W. 500/31.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Dundas Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act, and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

PART I.—INTERPRETATION.

1. In these By-laws the interpretations set out in "The Road Districts Act, 1919," shall apply, in addition to which the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them in the Road Districts Act or, respectively, that is to say:—

"The Act"—"The Road Districts Act, 1919," and all amendments thereto.

"Board"—The Dundas Road Board.

"Board Room" shall be the office, hall, or building in which the meeting of the Board is held from time to time.

"District"—The District under the jurisdiction of the Dundas Road Board.

"Secretary"—The Secretary of the Board.

"Chairman"—The member acting for the time being as chairman of the Board.

"Member"—A member of the Board, and includes the chairman of the Board.

"Road or Reserve"—Any road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.

"Person" shall include the plural and also a body corporate.

"Footpath" or "Footway" shall include any part of the roadway set apart for the sole use of the foot passengers, and whether the same be made or kerbed or otherwise.

"Permission of the Board"—The consent of the Board given in writing. All other interpretations to be prescribed in the Road Districts Act or other Acts or regulations thereunder.

Duties of Secretary.

2. The duties of secretary shall be—
- (a) to attend all Board meetings;
 - (b) to attend all committee meetings;
 - (c) to take notes of minutes, and prepare reports of committees;
 - (d) to conduct all correspondence, and to give the other officials instruction, as directed by the minutes, and carry out the resolutions of the Board as contained in such minutes;
 - (e) to answer all questions on the Board's business;
 - (f) to see that the accounts are audited quarterly, and the balance sheets prepared and published in the *Government Gazette* yearly, and any other duties specified under "The Road Districts Act, 1919";
 - (g) To prepare and place before the Board the monthly financial statement at the end of each month of the financial year;
 - (h) to supervise the preparation of the Rate Books and the Board's Electoral Lists, to examine proof of the latter, and to arrange for the distribution of copies prior to the elections, also to attend all Courts of Appeal; to make the necessary arrangements for the elections; to issue instructions to the supervisor in accordance with the Board's resolutions;
 - (i) to summon the members to Board and committee meetings;
 - (j) to keep all books up to date, in accordance with instructions issued by the Minister and additional instructions of the Board;
 - (k) to check all accounts sent into the Board, and see that all accounts for the works have stated in them the authority under which such works have been done, and to check all returns made by the collector or other of the Board's officers, and see that the counterfoils of the Receipt Book accompany all returns; to supervise and attend to the due payment of all moneys coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board;
 - (l) to report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto;

- (m) to see that no payments to the credit of the Board shall be made by any officer except through the secretary, or such other officer as may be acting temporarily in that capacity;
- (n) to readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and to attend to all other matters affecting the finances and welfare of the Board and not herein specified;
- (o) to see that all other bonds and other forms of security to be taken from the contractors are prepared and that the security required of servants is taken within due time, and report as to such matters to the Board;
- (p) to report to the chairman any servant of the Board who has been guilty of any neglect of duty, or who is incapable of performing the duties allotted to him;
- (q) to exercise, subject to any directions given by the Board or chairman, control over all servants of the Board;
- (r) to see that no receipt is on any other than the forms prescribed by the Act and Regulations under which authority is given for the issue of such receipts;
- (s) to be responsible for the issue of receipts on the proper prescribed forms and see that all receipts issued are in proper sequence.

Appointment of Officers.

3. No permanent appointment shall be made to any office under the Board until after an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such an appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

4. The election of all officers shall be conducted by a show of hands, unless a ballot be demanded.

5. The salary or allowance attached to the office under consideration of the Board shall be fixed in all cases preceding the appointment, and the salary of any officer when fixed shall not at any time be considered with a view to its increase or reduction unless specially authorised by a meeting of the Board, at which at least a quorum is present.

6. All complaints against servants of the Board must be in writing, and must in every case be signed by the person or persons complaining, and no notice whatever shall be taken of any complaint not made in accordance with this By-law. All such complaints as are receivable shall be addressed to the chairman, who, upon the receipt of such complaints, shall have power to investigate the same, and he shall report thereon to the Board at their next meeting.

Meetings and Proceedings.

7. Notice shall be given in writing by the chairman or secretary of ordinary or regular meeting adjourned.

8. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds—"ordinary" and "special." Ordinary meetings are the regular meetings held in pursuance of these By-laws for the transaction of the general business of the Board, including meetings adjourned for the purpose of any incomplete business, but an adjourned meeting would not exclude any business which was considered necessary to transact. Special meetings are those called under Section 130 of the Act, and shall include those called by the chairman in response to a requisition signed by three members, and the notices for such special meetings shall have such special business notified therein for which the meeting was called, and for which each member shall receive seven days' notice. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called for: Provided that any matter of emergency can be discussed with the ruling of the chairman and the consent of those present. The ratepayers' meeting shall consist of one called under Section 143 of the Act, and the Standing Orders shall, so far as the Act allows, apply to the proceedings, but the provision of the Act shall be first complied with.

9. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the office of the Board on the day and at the hour appointed from time to time by resolution of the Board.

10. A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed by the Act, but the chairman may call a special meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business will be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless a quorum is present.

11. At any meeting of the Board it shall rest with the majority of the members of the Board present to exclude the public from such meeting when, in their opinion, it is expedient to do so.

12. At all meetings of the Board, when there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present, or within 30 minutes after such time for which the meeting is called), such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

13. The first business of all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting aloud, with a view to their confirmation.

Voting.

14. Each member (including the chairman) shall have one vote, and such chairman shall, in case of equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meetings shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present. All motions and amendments shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a division is demanded, before the next business is proceeded with.

Minutes of Meetings.

15. The Minute Book prescribed by the Act shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be entered by the secretary. Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting. No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of proceedings, except as to their accuracy, or for the rectification of a clerical error.

Standing Orders.

16. The order of business at all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be as follows, that is to say:—

- (a) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary, also special meetings (if any);
- (b) Consideration of business arising out of minutes;
- (c) Questions of which due notice has been given by members or officers of the Board;
- (d) The chairman shall have the right of directing attention at any meeting to any matter or subject within the jurisdiction or official cognisance of the Board, by a minute signed by himself, and such minute shall, when introduced, take precedence of all business before or to come before the Board, and the adoption thereof may be put by him from the chair as a motion without being seconded, but he shall confine himself to the questions contained therein;
- (e) Reports of sub-committees and officers;
- (f) Deputations and presentation of petitions or memorials, and consideration thereof;
- (g) Reading of correspondence received and, at the option of the Board, despatched, and taking action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto;
- (h) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts;
- (i) Presentation of monthly statement and passing of accounts for payment;
- (j) Motions of which previous notice has been given;
- (k) Motions without notice (by leave of the Board under By-law 19);
- (l) General business;
- (m) Notice of motions.

17. In the event of any member having urgent business to place before the meeting, he may move the suspension of the Standing Orders, and, if agreed to by the Board, such business shall take precedence of all others.

18. Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject-matter of the tenders comes on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a committee appointed for the purpose. The Board may require a deposit of 5 per cent. of the amount of the tender to accompany such tender, or two satisfactory sureties.

Order of Debate—Speakers must not Digress.

19. A member, when speaking, shall not digress from the subject of debate.

Consideration of Reports.

20. (a) Any report of a committee or any portion thereof may be amended by the Board in any matter if it may think fit, or may be referred back to the committee for further consideration.

(b) The recommendations of any committee, when adopted by the Board, shall be the resolutions of the Board.

Precedence of Chairman.

21. When the chairman rises in his place during the progress of a debate, any member when speaking or offering to speak, shall immediately resume his seat, and every member shall preserve strict silence, so that the chairman may be heard without interruption, but the member who was speaking may resume when the chairman takes his seat.

Notice of Motion—Absence of Mover.

22. In the absence of a member who has placed a notice of motion on the business paper for any meeting, any other member may at such meeting move the same, or such motion may be deferred until next ordinary meeting of the Board.

Withdrawal of Motions.

23. Except as elsewhere provided, no motion, after being placed on the business paper, shall be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

Motions to be Seconded.

24. No motion shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

Motions not to be Withdrawn without Consent.

25. When a motion has been proposed and seconded it shall become subject to the control of the Board, and shall not be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

Amendment may be Moved.

26. When a motion has been proposed and seconded, any member shall be at liberty to move an amendment thereon, but no such amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

Motions and Amendments to be in Writing.

27. No motion or amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been reduced to writing, if the chairman so directs.

28. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the chairman.

29. In submitting a motion or amendment, the chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

Further Amendment may be Moved on Amended Question.

30. If an amendment has been carried, the question as amended thereby shall become itself the question before the Board, whereupon any further amendment upon such question may be moved.

How subsequent Amendments may be Moved.

31. If an amendment, whether upon an original question or amended as aforesaid, has been negatived, then a further amendment may be moved to the question to which such first-mentioned amendment was moved, and so on until there are no further amendments and the question is decided by the final vote in the affirmative or negative: Provided that not more than one question and one proposed amendment thereof shall be before the Board at any one time.

Motions for Adjournment.

32. No discussion shall be permitted upon any motion for adjournment of the Board. If, upon the question being put on any such motion the same is negatived, and the subject then under consideration or next on the business paper shall be discussed, it shall not be competent for any member to again move a motion for adjournment until half an hour has elapsed from the time of moving the one that has been negatived.

Mover of Adjournment—When entitled to Priority.

33. On resuming any discussion which has been adjourned, the mover of such adjournment shall be entitled, if he has not already spoken on the subject under discussion, to speak first.

Notice of Question to be given.

34. Sufficient notice of every question shall be given to the chairman or member expected to reply, and, if necessary, reference to other persons or to documents.

Questions to be put without Argument.

35. Every question shall be put categorically and without argument.

Replies and Objections.

36. No discussion shall ensue upon any reply or refusal to reply to any questions, except by permission of the Board.

Mode of Addressing Board.

37. Members shall, on all occasions when at a meeting, address the chairman and speak to each other by their official designation, as chairman, or secretary, etc., as the case may be, and, with the exception of the chairman, shall rise in their place and stand while speaking (except when prevented from doing so by bodily infirmity).

Speaker not to be interrupted if in Order.

38. No member shall be interrupted while speaking, except for the purpose of calling him to order, as hereinafter provided for in pursuance of By-law.

Limitation as to Number of Speeches.

39. The mover of an original motion shall have the right of general reply to all observations which have been made in reference to such motion, and to any amendment thereon, as well as the right to speak upon every such amendment. Every member, other than the mover of an original motion, shall have the right to speak once upon such motion and once upon every amendment moved thereon. No member shall, without the consent of the Board, speak more than once upon any one question, or for longer than ten minutes at any one time, unless when misrepresented or misunderstood, in which case he may be permitted to explain without adding further observation than may be necessary for the purpose of such explanation.

Determination of Questions.

40. (a) All questions shall, if not otherwise decided by law, be determined thus: Upon a question being put the chairman shall call for a show of hands for and against the question, and shall declare whether the question has been affirmed by the majority of members present or otherwise. The decision of the chairman shall be final unless such decision be immediately challenged and any member rise and demand a division.

(b) Where any member dissents he may request that his name be recorded in the minutes as opposed to the motion, and it shall be so recorded.

Divisions.

41. Upon a division being so called for, the question shall first be put in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the chairman and all members present shall vote by a show of hands, and the names and the votes of the chairman and members present shall be recorded in the minutes by the secretary.

Chairman may repeat Question.

42. The chairman shall be at liberty to put any question as often as it may be necessary to enable him to form his opinion as to the result of the voting and declare same.

Acts of Disorder.

43. Any member who at any meeting of the Board or any committee commits a breach of any By-law, or who moves or attempts to move any motion or amendment embodying any matter beyond the legal jurisdiction of the Board or committee, or who in any other way raises or attempts to raise any question, or addresses or attempts to address the Board or committee upon any subject which the Board or committee shall have no legal right to entertain or discuss, or uses any language which, according to the common usage of gentlemen, would be disorderly, or makes use of any expression inconsistent with good order and decorum, or who says or does anything calculated to bring the Board or committee into contempt, shall be guilty of an act of disorder.

Ruling of Chairman.

44. (a) The chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case, without further argument or comment, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.

(b) If the ruling of the chairman be disagreed with, then the usual Parliamentary procedure may be adopted.

Members called to Order more than once.

45. Any member who, having been called to order by the chairman for any infringement of any of the provisions of this By-law, or for any breach of decorum shall, upon the request of the chairman, withdraw from the Board Room for the remainder of the meeting.

Removal from Board Room—Penalty for continued Breach of Order, etc.

46. In the event of a member declining to withdraw from the Board Room on being requested so to do by the chairman, the chairman may order his retirement until the termination of the sitting, and should such member disobey such order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one pound.

Disorder.

47. If disorder arises at any meeting, the chairman may adjourn the meeting for a period of fifteen minutes and quit the Chair. The Board, on resuming shall, on question put from the Chair, decide without debate whether the business be proceeded with or not.

Appointment of Committee.

48. The Board may at any time appoint one or more members as a committee to inquire into any matter, and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability, or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever, without the express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or a resolution of the Board.

Finance and Accounts.

49. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Finance Committee meeting and the ordinary general meeting, and, after being certified as correct, shall be paid by cheque. An account shall be opened with such Bank as the Board may from time to time direct, and all moneys received from whatever source, with the exception of moneys paid to the credit of the Board at the Treasury, shall be paid to the credit of the Board's account at such Bank. All cheques and orders drawn against the Board's Bank or Treasury accounts must be signed by the chairman and any one member of the Board, and in all cases countersigned by the secretary of the Board.

50. All moneys belonging to the Board shall, within 24 hours after they come into the hands of any officer, servant or clerk, be paid to the secretary or responsible officer directed by the Board to receive same. The regulations numbered 21 to 41 inclusive, made by His Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council under Section 197 of the Act on the 2nd August, 1922, are deemed to be incorporated in these By-laws.

Unauthorised Expenditure.

51. Every item of expenditure, and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure and a breach of this By-law by such person.

Common Seal.

52. The common seal of the Board shall be kept in the Board's safe. The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument, except by order of the Board.

Discount on Rates.

53. The Board may, by resolution, allow a discount of 5 per cent. for prompt payment of rates.

Offences, Omissions, or Neglects.

54. The following acts, omissions, or neglects are forbidden, and any person guilty of any of the following offences shall on conviction pay a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds:—

(a) Riding or driving cattle or horses or other animals, or wheeling any barrow, or driving any motor car, carriage, or cart upon or along any footpath;

(b) Placing any timber, bricks, or other material upon any footpath, channel, surface drain, or road without the permission of the Board having been first obtained;

- (c) Burning any shavings or other material or matter in any road or open or public place;
 - (d) Leaving any inflammable matter or material in any public place, or shed, or on any open space or near any building, without having first obtained the permission of the Board;
 - (e) Damaging or destroying any well, dam, tank, pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, or gate, or other property belonging to, in charge of, or under the control of the Board;
 - (f) Placing any placard or other document, writing, painting on, or otherwise defacing any house or building abutting on or contiguous to any public road, or on any wall, fence, gate, finger or lamp post, without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof;
 - (g) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footpath or road without the permission of the Board first having been obtained;
 - (h) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bow and arrow, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place, or allowing any cart or animal to remain upon any footpath, placing goods upon any footpath or otherwise obstructing any footpath or road;
 - (i) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile in any road or public place to the damage or danger of any person;
 - (j) Having an awning upon or over any footpath in any road, not being eight feet clear above the footway, by hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway, without the permission of the Board;
 - (k) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any road, without the permission of the Board, and not attending to such directions in regard thereto as shall be given by the Board;
 - (l) Furiously or negligently riding or driving along any road;
 - (m) Making any cellar door or other opening from the footway of any road without the consent of the Board.
55. No person shall poison, kill, or maim any horse, cow, camel, pig, bullock, dog, or other animal and leave the same in any part of the District without making proper provision for the burial or burning of the carcase thereof, and any person so doing shall commit an offence against these By-laws, and upon conviction shall pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and shall pay all expenses attending on the proper burial or burning of any such animal.

To prevent Obstructions on Footpaths and Roads.

56. No person shall permit any box, case, coal, fire-wood, sand, goods, wares, merchandise, or other articles or effects to remain on any part of a road or footpath within the District after sunset, nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing and removing same.

57. No person shall place, lay, deposit, shoot, or discharge any rubbish or material whatsoever on the surface of any road, footway, or public reserve within the District without having first obtained the permission of the Board.

58. Every person shall, after having received from the Board as in the last preceding section provided, a permit to deposit rubbish or material on the surface of any road, footway, or public reserve, have and keep sufficient and continuous light burning thereon from sunset to the following sunrise, during the time such rubbish or material shall remain or continue so deposited.

Preservation of Trees.

59. Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree or shrub or plant standing in any of the roads, enclosures, public places or reserves, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any of the tree-guards, fences, or other protection to such trees, shrubs, or plants aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than ten pounds (£10), and in addition thereto shall also pay the Board a sum equal to the damage so done.

Prescribing Removal of Verandahs.

60. Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footway or roadway, or is dangerous, and all other obstructions on the footways or roadways or over the same, shall be removed, when ordered, within such time as shall be notified by the Board, and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah or balcony or other obstruction, whether removed by the Board or otherwise; and any person whatsoever interfering or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Encroachment, etc.—Removal of.

61. On the order of the Board the secretary or other appointed officer may direct the removal within fourteen days of any building, fence, or obstruction or encroachment in or upon any street, lane, or public place under the control of the Board.

In any case where, after service of notice for such removal, any such obstruction or encroachment has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove same at the cost and charge of the person so offending, and to proceed against the offender for the breach of this By-law, the penalty for which shall not exceed £20 for every day or part of a day during which such offence shall be committed or continued after the expiry of the notice prescribed therein.

Lighting.

62. Any unauthorised person who shall light, put out when lighted, or in any other way interfere with any lamp belonging to the Board, or shall damage or destroy such lamp shall pay, in addition to the value of such damage, if any, on conviction, a sum not exceeding £5.

63. Within the Townsite of Dundas all vehicles shall, when parking, run front on to the footpath or kerb at an angle of approximately 45 degrees.

Damaging Roads.

64. No person shall either wilfully or negligently damage or destroy by means of horse team or any other means any road under construction or repair; any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20. Any person who—

- (a) cuts or removes, without the consent of the Board, timber, earth, stone, or other material from a road or reserve; or
- (b) erects, without the consent of the Board, upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or
- (c) draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the waterside of a road or across a drain, except over a properly constructed approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle; or
- (d) draws upon any road timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material, when carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle, to drag or trail upon a road, or draws upon a road a whim or timber carriage, any portion of which or any portion of chains attached thereto, or any portion of other attachment trails or drags upon a road,

shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

65. Any person taking any plough, cultivator, or other implement over or along any road, and thereby damaging or marking such road in such a manner, which in the opinion of the Board may indirectly cause ultimate damage to the road, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

66. Any person who draws upon any road any vehicle the wheel or wheels of which are locked, unless there is placed at the bottom of such wheels some sufficient protection to prevent damage to such road, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

To protect Bridges from Fire.

67. Any person who shall light a fire (except by the order of the Board), or who shall place any rushes or other inflammable substance under, near, or against any bridge in the District, for the purpose of making a camp or sleeping place, or for any other purpose, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £1 and not exceeding £20.

Prevention of Trees falling across Road.

68. No person shall make or leave a fire near any road or reserve without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading.

68a. No person shall ringbark or set fire to any standing tree upon or near to any road or track. Penalty—Five pounds.

Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds.

69. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in these By-laws. The Board shall have power to grant exclusive right to use and occupy all park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves placed under its control within the District, for holding public sports or amusements, to any responsible person or persons or club, and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, or trees, or other improvements upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, and shall pay to the Board the fees as set out hereunder, and comply with the provisions of these By-laws and any other Regulations passed by resolution of the Board under which such exclusive rights are granted.

Hawking.

70. No person shall be permitted to hawk fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetable or any article of merchandise without having first obtained a license from the Board and payment of fees as per Schedule A hereto annexed:—

Schedule A.

Fees for a Hawker's License.

For a license to hawk fish, meat, poultry, game, fruit, or vegetables—10s.

For a license to hawk merchandise—£5.

A Hawker's License shall be issued for a term of twelve months from date of issue.

Penalties.

71. Where any person by these By-laws or any of them is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done and remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

72. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

73. All penalties or other sums recovered under provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Board, except so much as may be paid to any informer.

Throwing Dangerous Substances on Footways or Roads.

74. Any person who shall throw vegetable or other offensive, noxious, or dangerous substances upon any footway within the District shall forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence. Any person or persons placing or causing to be placed or broken in or upon any road, footway, reserve, park lands, under the control of the Board, any glass, metal, or earthenware bottles or utensils, without first having obtained the consent of the Board so to do, shall be liable, beyond the costs and charges incidental to the removal of any such glass, metal, or earthenware, to a fine upon conviction not exceeding Two pounds in addition to the amount of damages caused.

Signboards, etc.

75. Any person who shall erect or place any signboard, swing, awning, blinds, overhanging lamps, or other things over or near any footway or roadway, without obtaining the consent of the Board, shall forfeit and pay upon conviction a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every such offence.

Barb Wire Fences.

76. No person shall erect or cause to be erected, without the Board's permission, with the use of barbed wire any fence, barricade, or obstruction on the boundary, or abutting thereon, of any street, footpath, right-of-way, park, or reserve, unless the height of the barbed wire shall be 6 feet 6 inches or more from the level of the aforesaid street, footpath, road, right-of-way, or

reserve in the Townsite of Salmon Gums. Any person offending against this By-law shall upon conviction pay a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every such offence.

Heavy Traffic.

77. The owner of every vehicle or engine which together with its load shall weigh more than five tons shall travel the roads, bridges, and culverts at his own risk, and shall be liable to pay for the damage done.

78. The Board may by notice affixed to any bridge or culvert declare the maximum weight of any engine, agricultural or other machine, or vehicle of any kind, and of any load of material which shall be permitted to cross such bridge or culvert, and also the pace and speed at which such engine, machine, vehicle, or load shall be driven, led, or taken over any such bridge or culvert; and any person who shall cross such bridge or culvert in contravention of this By-law shall, in addition to any liability for damage he may have caused, be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Careless Use of Fire.

79. No person shall make or leave a fire on or near any road, track, or reserve under the jurisdiction of the Board without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading, and any person offending against this By-law shall upon conviction pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Lamp Posts, etc.

80. No lamp post, bridle post, telegraph, telephone, or electric light pole, or flagstaff shall be erected by any person upon any road without the written consent of the Board, and upon such consent being obtained such post, pole, or flagstaff shall be placed in such position, and shall be painted at least once in every three years, or as may be directed by the Board, and the Board may order the removal by the owners of all bent, dangerous, or unsightly posts or poles. Any person offending against this By-law shall upon conviction pay a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every such offence.

Vacant Lots in Townsite.

81. The owner of any vacant lot in any townsite shall, upon notice served on him by the Board, clear such vacant lot of trees, scrub, and undergrowth to the satisfaction of the Board. Penalty: Two pounds.

PART II.—HALL BY-LAWS.

By-laws for the Management and the use of the Dundas Road Board Halls.

1. Applications for the hire of the hall or any room or furniture shall be made in writing to the secretary of the Dundas Road Board, not less than twenty-four hours before the time that such hall, room, or furniture is required.

2. The name and place of abode of the actual and responsible person or persons hiring any hall, room, or furniture shall be given in the application for the use of any hall, room, or furniture.

3. The rent of the hall, room, or furniture (inclusive of the use of crockeryware) shall be paid with each application and shall be as the Board may decide from time to time.

Skating will not be permitted under any consideration.

4. The hours for which any hall, room, or furniture shall be hired shall be:—Day—from 9 o'clock a.m. to 6 o'clock p.m.; night—from 7 o'clock p.m. to 12 o'clock midnight, after which the prescribed fee shall be paid in addition to ordinary payment.

5. The Board may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of engagement, deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of such engagement.

6. The Board reserves the right to refuse to let any hall, room, or furniture to any applicant for the hiring of same without assigning any reason for such refusal.

7. The Board may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of any hall, room, or furniture.

8. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of any hall, room, or furniture for the same date and hour, the Board may, without considering priority of application, determine to which applicant the hire of such hall, room, or furniture shall be granted.

9. The hirer of any hall, room, or furniture shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, the Entertainments Tax Act, and any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such hiring and using of any hall or room. If in the opinion of the Board all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts mentioned above, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of engagement forbid and prevent the use of such hall or room.

10. In the event of the use of any hall or room being stopped under the last preceding By-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of such hall or room as if the hire had been duly fulfilled, and the Board shall not be responsible to the hirer by reason of such stoppage.

11. No spirituous liquors, wine, ale, beer, porter, cider or sherry, or any other intoxicating liquor, shall be brought into or consumed in any hall or room, except when expressly permitted by the Board.

12. No person shall smoke any tobacco, cigar, cigarette, or objectionable mixture, nor strike or otherwise ignite any light in any hall or room during any ball or public entertainment, or at any gathering of persons in the said hall or rooms, whether such persons have been admitted by payment of money or otherwise, except at a banquet or smoke social where those present comprise men only.

13. No person shall in any part of the building—
(a) enter or be allowed to enter whilst intoxicated;

(b) use profane or improper language;

(c) be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever;

(d) damage, mark, or deface any wall or other part of the building. Any person who does, permits, or suffers any such damage shall be liable to pay the cost of all such damage in addition to any penalty imposed by these By-laws;

(e) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever in the passageway or any part of the building. Any person so doing shall immediately disperse on being requested to do so by the secretary or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable, whether in uniform or otherwise.

14. No offensive personalities or representations of living persons, nor anything calculated to produce riot or a breach of the peace shall be permitted in any hall or any part thereof, or in any room.

15. No encouragement shall be given to improper characters to assemble in any hall or room.

16. The secretary of the Board, or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable when dressed in uniform or otherwise, if known as such to the hirer or his servant, shall be permitted to have free ingress to the hall or any part thereof at all times during the term of engagement, and shall be given every facility for seeing that these By-laws are duly carried out.

17. The hirer of any hall or room shall maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour in such hall or room, and shall be solely and entirely responsible for the carrying out of these By-laws and for any damage done to the building, fixtures, fittings, furniture, or crockeryware, and shall pay such damages as shall be assessed by the Board. Any article of crockeryware not accounted for or in a cracked or broken condition shall be paid for at current rates or prices.

18. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect hereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

19. Children under 10 years of age must be under responsible supervision when in the building or any part thereof.

20. Rooms shall be open on week days from 9 o'clock a.m. to 9 o'clock p.m. and on Sundays by an arrangement with the secretary.

By the insertion of the following additional clause:—

14.—Temporary Provisions as to Hours, etc.

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the abovementioned Agreement the following special provisions shall apply for a period of six months commencing 29th June, 1931, and ending 29th December, 1931:—

- The employer is empowered to suspend the employment of the worker for any two days or lesser period of time in each week, and may deduct from the weekly wages a sum proportionate to the time of such suspension. So far as possible, due consideration being given to the employer's system of management and the nature of his business, the suspension from work hereby authorised shall be so arranged as to be distributed evenly amongst the workers concerned in each department of the business;
- Where it suits the convenience of the employer's business, any worker may be employed for full number of hours per week as laid down in Clause 4 and then stood down for one week at a time;
- When the services of a worker are not required owing to the operation of Subclauses (a) and (b) hereof, the employer shall give the worker one day's notice thereof;
- When the provisions of Subclauses (a) and (b) hereof are availed of, holidays as prescribed in Clause 6 of the Agreement or pay in lieu shall be reduced pro rata;
- The provisions as to overtime in Clause 5 of the Agreement shall not be affected hereby, nor shall the worker's rights under Clause 11 of the Agreement be annulled in the event of the worker being dismissed permanently from his employment. Where a worker is engaged as a casual worker the provisions of Clause 7 (Casual hands) shall still apply.

2. The foregoing provisions may be continued from month to month after the said 29th December, 1931, by agreement between the parties, a memorandum of which, signed by or on behalf of the parties, shall be filed in the Court. In the event of the parties failing to agree the matter may be referred to the Court.

3. The term "worker" herein shall, where the context so permits, include junior workers.
