WHEREAS it is provided by "The Vermin Act, 1918," that "Vermin" means and includes any animal or bird mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act, and such other animals or birds the names of which the Ad-ministrator may by Proclamation add to the said Sche-dule, and it is further provided by such Act that any such Proclamation may be restricted in its operation to any portion of the State to be defined by the Proclamat any portion of the State to be defined by the Proclamaany portion of the State to be defined by the Proclama-tion: And whereas it is desirable to declare "Black-tailed Parakeets" (*Polytelus Anthopeplus*), commonly known as "Smoker Parrots," to be vermin within the portions of the State hereinafter, mentioned: Now, therefore I, the said Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation add "Black-tailed Parakeets" (*Polytelus* (*Polytelus*) and the same the sa Anthopeplus), commonly known as "Smoker Parrots," to the Third Schedule of the said Act: Provided, howover, that this Proclamation shall be restricted in its operation to the Victoria Plains Vermin District.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclama-21,'' it is provided that the Governor may by Proclama-tion prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, there-fore I, the said Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, In exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto for a period of twelve months as from the 15th day of November, 1931.

(1) All that area of Western Australian waters (Cockburn Sound) Eastward of the Fremantle Fish Mar-

ket Jetty and extending to the Western extremity of South Street and to a width of half a mile from highwater mark.

G. Abbott, Edwin Fuge, and Cyril A. Glew: Now, therefore, His Excel-lency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by Dr. A. G. Abbott, Edwin Fuge, and Cyril A. Glew with power to the said Dr. A. G. Abbott, Edwin Fuge, and Cyril A. Glew to lease (subject to the approval of the Governor) the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease, and subject to the By-laws which have been or may be gazetted for the control and management of this reserve.

F.D. 1217/31. WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—(a) the Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a pro-posal for such revocation; (b) after such proposal has been laid before Parliament, the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication: And whereas His Excellency the Administrator did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the Fourth day of August, 1931, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest: And whereas after Grown lands as State Forest: And whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolu-tion was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedi-cation of Crown lands as State Forest No. 29 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the Schedule hereto :-

Vermin Act, 1918.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

ORDER IN COUNCIL. WHEREAS by "The Vermin Act, 1918," the Governor is empowered to make, repeal, and alter Regulations for carrying this Act into effect: And whereas the Gov-ernor, under the said Act, made certain Regulations which were published in the Government Gazette on the 30th day of January, 1931: And whereas by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 1st day of May, 1931, Regulation 91 of the said Regula-tions was repealed and a new Regulation 91 was made in place thereof: And whereas it is now deemed ex-pedient to amend further the said Regulations in the manner hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, acting with the advice and Excellency the Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, which hereby, as from the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the Government Gazette, amend the said Regulations as follows:

(1) Regulation 91 is amended by adding thereto a further proviso as follows:-

"Provided also, that uniform bonus at the rate pre-scribed under the Regulation 91 heretofore in operation as aforesaid shall be payable-

(a) in respect of a claim received prior to the 1st day of May, 1931, but not approved for payment until after that date; and

(b) in any case where the claimant delivering the scalp and tail, or the skin, or the beak and claws, as required by Regulation 92, after the 1st day of May, 1931, proves to the satisfaction of the person to whom they were delivered that the articles so delivered were in fact dispatched or in the course of carriage or transport to such or in the course of carriage or transport to such person for the purpose of such delivery prior to the said date, and the Minister approves of the claim being paid according to such rate.'

(2) Regulation 93A is amended by inserting at the beginning thereof the words "Subject as hereinafter provided"; and by inserting at the end thereof a proviso as follows:-

"Provided that, where a Vermin Board through insufficiency of funds is unable to make payment in satisfaction of a claim, the Board shall forward to the Chief Inspector the articles delivered by the claimant in sup-port of his claim, the Board shall forward to the Chief Inspector the articles delivered by the claimant in sup-port of his claim, together with a written statement in duplicate certified by the chairman and the secretary of the Board giving the name and address of the claimant, and the date when the claim was received, the amount of uniform bonus payable, and any other particulars re-quired by the Chief Inspector. Upon receipt of the articles and statement aforesaid the Chief Inspector shall forward to the secretary of the Board for parameter shall forward to the secretary of the Board for payment shall forward to the secretary of the Board for payment to the claimant the amount of uniform bonus payable to such claimant, and the secretary shall forward a state-ment to the Chief Inspector certified by the chairman and secretary of the Board, giving the name of the claimant, the date when the claim was received, and the date when the claim was paid."

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930. NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7, Sub-section 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930," and Amendment Act, 1931, which reads as follows:-

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default or breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement of sale and purchase of land or other process or proceedand purchase of land or other process or proceed-ing, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or his estate or effects during the operation of such Stay Order. FIREARMS AND GUNS ACT, 1931.

Regulations.

These Regulations may be cited as the Firearms Regulations, 1931.

1. An application to possess a firearm shall be as in Form 1 of the Schedule hereto.

2. An application for a license to manufacture and repair firearms shall be as in Form 2 of the Schedule.

An application to deal in firearms shall be as in Form 3 of the Schedule.
 An application for a license to conduct a shooting gallery shall be as in Form 4 of the Schedule.

5. Forms of applications under Regulations 1, 2, 3, and 4 may be obtained free of charge from the officer in charge of any Police Station.

6. The license to possess a firearm shall be as in Form 5 of the Schedule.

7. The license to manufacture and repair firearms shall be as in Form 6 of the Schedule.

8. The license to deal in firearms shall be as in Form 7 of the Schedule.

9. The license to conduct a shooting gallery shall be as in Form 8 of the Schedule.

10. Every application shall be made to the officer in charge of the Police Station nearest to the place where the applicant usually resides. When the firearm in respect of which a license is required is in the possession of the applicant athe time the application is made it must be produced to such officer, who may insert on the application the required particulars of the firearm. When such part ticulars are inserted by a member of the Police Force, he shall initial such particulars as being correct.

11. When the firearm in respect of which the license is required is not in the possession of the applicant at the time when the application is made, the officer in charge of the Police Station shall issue a permit to obtain possession of the firearm pending the issue of a license. Such permit shall be in Form 9 of the Schedule. The applicant shall, within twenty-four hours of the issue of such permit, produce the firearm in respect of which the license is required, in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 10. Before the applicant obtains a license he shall deliver the permit to the said officer.

12. An application for a license or for renewal made by a person who has previously held a license must be accompanied by the expired license, or satisfactory proof that the same has been lost or destroyed.

13. All expired licenses must, within one month from the date of expiry, be returned to the officer in charge of the Police Station from which they were issued, or satisfactory proof furnished that they have been lost or destroyed.

14. When the age of a person applying for a firearm license appears to be under sixteen years, the issuing officer may require such proof of age as he may deem necessary.

15. When the age of a person applying for a pistol license appears to be under twenty-one years, the issuing officer may require such proof of age as he may deem necessary.

16. Any person wilfully misrepresenting his age or any other material particulars with a view to obtaining a license, shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations.

17. The record of firearm licenses issued at any Police Station shall be as in Form 10 of the Schedule.

18. The record of licenses to manufacture and repair firearms issued at any Police Station shall be as in Form 11 of the Schedule.

19. The record of licenses to deal in-firearms issued at any Police Station shall be as in Form 12 of the Schedule.

20. The record of licenses to conduct a shooting gallery issued at any Police Station shall be as in Form 13 of the Schedule.

21. (a.) The particulars of firearms sold or let on hire, or pledged with any dealer, or redeemed by persons from dealers, shall be kept by the dealer, in accordance with Form 14 of the Schedule.

(b.) All entries of firearms sold or let on hire by licensees or redeemed from pawnbrokers shall be made forthwith on each and every individual transaction.

22. A licensed dealer may dispose of ammunition to any person who represents himself as being the holder of a license to possess a firearm, or who represents

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himself as lawfully possessing a firearm in respect of which he is not obliged to obtain a license and who the dealer believes on reasonable grounds to be entitled to possess such firearm, provided :---

- (i) that the dealer shall forthwith note in a book to be kept by him for that purpose the particulars of the firearm in respect of which such person alleges he holds a license;
- (ii) that the dealer shall not dispose of any ammunition other than that suitable for discharge from such firearm ;
- (iii) that the dealer shall make a note in such book of the name and address of the person to whom such ammunition is supplied;
- (iv) that the person to whom such ammunition is supplied shall sign a statement in such book acknowledging the truth of all such details.

Any dealer who fails or neglects to comply with the conditions of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 20$; and any person who falsely represents himself as being entitled to obtain any ammunition under the preceding regulation shall be liable to a like penalty.

23. A licensed dealer may dispose of ammunition to any person apparently over the age of 21 years who represents himself as, and who the dealer believes to be the agent of any person who holds a license to possess a firearm, or who is lawfully in the possession of a firearm in respect of which he is not obliged to obtain a license.

A licensed dealer shall, *mutatis mutandis*, comply with the provisions of the paragraphs (i), (ii), (iii), and (iv) of the foregoing regulation, and shall also note down in his book the name, address, and occupation of the person for whom the agent states he is obtaining such ammunition.

Any dealer who fails or neglects to comply with the conditions of the foregoing regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 20$, and any person who falsely represents himself as being the agent of any person mentioned in this regulation shall be liable to the like penalty.

24. The record of particulars of firearms sold, let on hire, pledged or redeemed in accordance with Form 14 and the book referred to in the preceding regulations, shall be produced for inspection by any member of the Police Force at his request.

25. A member of the Police Force shall, if he so requests, be permitted to check the stock of firearms on the premises of any person licensed to deal in firearms, or to manufacture or repair firearms, and to compare same with the record book of firearms shown in stock.

26. A record of the firearms in stock at the passing of these regulations, and all purchases since the coming into operation of the regulations, shall be kept by all persons licensed to deal in firearms. Such record shall show the date of purchase, the number of firearms obtained, the maker's name, the number on, and any other marks identifying each individual firearm.

27. All firearms in the possession of any person licensed to deal therein, or to manufacture or repair same, shall be kept by such person in a strongroom or similar receptacle, securely fastened by lock and key during the period such person's promises are not open for trade.

28. Any person in the possession of a firearm curio or trophy shall register same at the nearest Police Station to his usual place of residence, if called upon to do so in writing by the Commissioner of Police.

30. (a.) A bank or financial institution may apply in its corporate or trading name for a license to possess any number of specified firearms.

(b.) Any officer of the prescribed age of the bank or financial institution authorised by the bank or financial institution may possess and lawfully use any such firearm for the protection of his employer's property; provided that the bank or financial institution shall from time to time notify the Commissioner of Police in writing forthwith on authorising any officer to possess a firearm, and provided further, that no officer shall be so authorised if the Commissioner shall be of the opinion that he is not a fit and proper person to be entrusted with the possession of a firearm.

(c.) On payment of a noting fee of 1s. any further firearm not included when the license was originally issued may be specified on the license, and thereupon such license shall apply during the remainder of its currency to such additional firearm.

31. The records prescribed by Forms 10, 11, 12, and 13 shall be kept by the Commissioner of Police at his office at Perth, and shall be available for inspection on payment of a fee of 1s. for each inspection.

32. The Commissioner shall publish in the *Government Gazette* before the 31st March in each year, a list of licenses issued to persons to deal in, manufacture, or repair firearms.

33. The Commissioner of Police may, where he is satisfied that the holder of any license issued in accordance with these regulations is not entitled to hold such license, or that such license was obtained by fraud, or that such person is no longer a fit and proper person to hold such license, or that the particular weapon for which such license was obtained is dangerous or unfit for use, revoke the license.

34. Any person aggrieved by the refusal of the Commissioner or a member of the Police Force acting with his authority to grant a license under Section 10 of the Act, or by the revocation by the Commissioner of a license under the provisions of the preceding regulation, may appeal to a Police or Resident Magistrate. Every such person desirous of appealing shall lodge notice of appeal in the form set out in Form 15 or 16 respectively with a Police or Resident Magistrate in the district in which the license was applied for and refused, or, in the case of revocation, to the Magistrate in the district in which the license was issued.

35. A copy of such notice shall be served on the Commissioner of Police in all cases, and where the license was refused by a member of the Police Force a copy shall also be served on such member.

36. On proof by affidavit to the satisfaction of the Magistrate that the said notice or notices have been duly served, the Magistrate shall cause to be sent written notice to the parties of a date and time for the hearing of such appeal, which date shall not be less than fourteen clear days from the service of the last of such notices.

37. If either party neglect to appear personally or by counsel or solicitor on the date and at the time fixed for hearing, the Magistrate may :---

- (a) where the appellant fails to appear, dismiss the appeal;
- (b) Where the Commissioner of Police or member of the Police Force concerned, as the case may be, fails to appear, hear the appeal or adjourn it to some other date.

38. On the hearing and determination of the appeal, the Magistrate may make such order as to costs to be paid by either party to the appeal to the other party, as he may think fit.

39. On hearing of the appeal the appellant shall open his case, and the appeal shall proceed as nearly as may be according to the procedure and rules of evidence relating to the trial of an action in a Local Court.

40. The Local Court Rules, 1923, shall, insofar as applicable and not inconsistent with these regulations, apply to appeals hereunder.

41. A license that has been revoked shall be delivered to the officer in charge of the Police Station nearest to the usual place of residence of the person in whose name such license was issued, within seven days of the notice of revocation issued by the Commissioner of Police.

42. Every holder of a license for a pistol shall notify the Commissioner of Police in writing of each and every change of abode.

- 43. The proprietor or any person conducting a shooting gallery shall :---
 - (a) Cause the several parts of such shooting gallery to be properly put together and securely fixed to the satisfaction of the Commissioner;
 - (b) Cause every part of such shooting gallery within, along, or toward
 - which it may be intended that any firearm shall be discharged, to be constructed of iron of such strength and thickness as is sufficient to resist any missile or projectile that may be discharged from such firearm ;
 - (c) Cause such shooting gallery to be so constructed that no missile or projectile that may be discharged from such firearms used therein can escape from such shooting gallery, if such firearm at the moment of discharge is pointed towards any target or mark that may be within such shooting gallery;
 - (d) Cause every part of such shooting gallery within, along, or toward which it may be intended that any firearm shall be discharged, to be maintained at all times in good repair and condition to the satisfaction of the Commissioner;
 - (c) Cause such shooting gallery at all times when open for public use to be under the management and control of a sufficient number of competent persons;

(f) Cause the letting to hire and use by any person of any firearm in such shooting gallery to be under the management and control of a competent person directly responsible therefor;

(g) The proprietor or other person for the time being having the management or control of a shooting gallery shall, in the exercise of such management or control, take all reasonable and proper care so as to prevent danger from the use of firearms in such shooting gallery.

- (h) Every person having the management and control of the letting to hire or use by any person of any firearm in a shooting gallery shall not at any time cause or suffer to be used in such firearm any greater charge than is consistent with safety, and shall cause every such firearm, when loaded or being loaded, to be pointed towards the target in such shooting gallery, and shall not suffer any loaded firearm to be taken out of such shooting gallery.
- (i) No person hiring or using any firearm in a shooting gallery shall, while such firearm is loaded or being loaded, allow such firearm to be pointed otherwise than towards the target in such shooting gallery, and shall not take any loaded firearm out of such shooting gallery.
- (j) No person shall wilfully and improperly or carelessly or negligently interfere with any person or any firearm let to any person in a shooting gallery or with any shield, fastening, or fitting which secures or contributes to the safe use of firearms therein.
- (k) The maximum calibre of any firearm used at any shooting gallery shall not exceed $\cdot 22$.

44. Any person committing a breach of any of the foregoing regulations, either by act or omission, shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

These By-Jaws shall operate over Reserve No. 19857, set apart for National Park and Recreation, at 19857, set apart for National Park and Recreation, at Pemberton, and comprising Nelson Location 7350, and the area bounded on the North by Nelson Locations 8222, 8221, 7257, and the prolongation Westward of the Southern boundary of Nelson Location 8222 afore-said, on the East by the surveyed road and Location 7257 to the railway crossing, on the South by Nelson Locations 7360 and 972, and on the West by Lefroy Brook Brook.

4. Any person found committing any breach of these By-laws may be removed from the Reserve by a police constable, or any member, officer, or servant of the Board.

5. No person shall sell or expose for sale goods or merchandise on the Reserve without permission.
6. No person shall carry or discharge firearms through or on the Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any birds or animals, except as in the next paragraph mentioned.

7. No person shall cause, allow, or suffer any stock to enter, stray, or feed upon the Reserve without per-mission, and all dogs, goats, and poultry found within the Reserve may be destroyed by any of the persons hereinafter referred to as being authorised to prosecute for the breaches of this By-law, and the owner shall make compensation, to be recovered before any Justice of the Peace, for any damage done by such dogs, goats,

of the Peace, for any damage done by such dogs, goars, or poultry. 8. No person shall pluck any of the wild or culti-vated flowers, plants, shrubs, or trees, or walk on the beds or borders, or pull up or dig or otherwise disturb any grass, or climb upon or get through or over the fences, or remove or injure any of the gates, turnstiles, fences, buildings, or flags, or disturb, damage or destroy any of the property or things within the bounds of the Reserve. Reserve.

9. During the constructing, building, making, re-pairing, or maintaining of any beds, borders or greens, links, or buildings, or other improvements, no person shall interfere with the workmen, gardeners, caretakers, or rangers, or do or cause to be done any act which will or may be likely to interfere with or prevent such con-structing, building, making, repairing, or maintaining. 10. No person shall camp on the Reserve without per-mission mission.

11. All bathers shall wear such costumes as shall preserve all decency and be in accord with the requirements of the Board, as presented by notice posted on the Reserve by the Board.

12. The use of soap in the said swimming pool is prohibited.

13. Dogs shall not be permitted to enter into, nor shall sticks, stones, rubbish, or any matter be thrown into the said swimming pool or other water situated in the Reserve.

P.W. 320/31. THE Traffic Regulations, 1931, are hereby amended as follows:-

Regulation No. 21, published in the Government Gazette on the 13th day of February, 1931, and amended by the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of May, 1931, is hereby further amended by deleting subpara-graph (b) of paragraph (1) thereof, and inserting the following in lieu thereof :--

Regulation-Armadale-Brookton Road Route 15.

side of the York-Narrogin Railway Reserve, crossing the said Railway Reserve to its Eastern side at this point to junction with the Perth Cranbrook Road, as shown on Plan M.R.B., W.A., 1030.

THE FACTORIES AND SHOPS ACT, 1920. Department of Works and Labour, 56 James Street, Perth, 29th October, 1931.

Ex. Co. 1991; F. & S. 1333/30. HIS Excellency the Administrator in Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations under "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920":----

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Electric Accumulator Regulations, 1931," and shall have application to those factories or parts thereof in which electric accumulators are manufactured or repaired.

Provided, that these Regulations shall not apply to the manufacture or repair of electric accumulators or parts thereof not containing lead or any compound ac-cumulator forming part of a stationary battery.

- other material containing lead, casting, pasting, lead burning, or any other work, including trimming, or any other abrading or cutting of pasted plates, involving the use, movement, or manipulation of, or contact with, any oxide of lead
- "Manipulation of raw oxide of lead" means any lead process involving any manipulation or movement of raw oxide of lead other than its conveyance in a receptacle or by means of an implement from one operation to another;

and where any term which is defined in the Act is used in these Regulations, such term shall have the same meaning as that given to it in the Act.

Duties.

3. It shall be the duty of the occupier to observe Part I. of these Regulations.

It shall be the duty of every person employed to observe Part II. of these Regulations.

Part I .- Duties of Occupiers.

4. Each of the following processes shall be carried on in such a manner and under such conditions as to secure effectual separation from one another and from any other process:

(a) Manipulation of raw oxide of lead;

- pasting;
- (c) drying of pasted plates;
 (d) formation with lead burning ("Tacking");
 (e) melting down of pasted plates.

In every room in which a lead process is carried on there shall be at least 500 cubic feet of air space for each person employed therein, and in computing this air space no height over 12 feet shall be taken into account.

6. Every workroom shall be provided with inlets and outlets of adequate size, so placed and used as to secure and maintain efficient ventilation in all parts of the room.

7. In every pasting room the distance between the centre of the working position of any paster and that of the paster working nearest to him shall not be less than five feet.

8. The floor of every room in which a lead process is carried on shall be-

(a) of cement or similar material, so as to be smooth and impervious to water;

- maintained in sound condition; (b)
- kept free from materials, plant, or other obstruc-(c) tion not required for or produced in the process carried on in the room;

and in all such rooms other than grid-castings, shops shall be-

(d) cleansed throughout daily after being thoroughly sprayed with water at a time when no other work is being carried on in the room;

and in grid-casting shops shall be---(e) eleansed throughout daily; and, in addition, where manipulation of raw oxide of

- and, in addition, where maniputation of taw oxide of lead or pasting is carried on, shall be—
 (f) kept constantly moist while work is being done;
 (g) provided with suitable and adequate arrangements for drainage;
 (h) thoroughly washed daily by means of a hose-

pipe. The work benches at which any lead process is 9 carried on shall-

- (a) have a smooth surface and be maintained in sound condition;
- (b) be kept free from all material or plant not required for or produced in the process carried

on thereat; and all such work benches other than those in gridcastings shops shall-

(c) be cleansed daily, either after being thoroughly damped or by means of a suction-cleaning ap-paratus at a time when no other work is being

carried on thereat; and all such work-benches in grid-casting shops shall-(d) be cleansed daily; and every work-bench used for pasting shall-

- (e) be covered throughout with sheet metal or other impervious material;
 (f) be provided with raised edges;
 (g) be kept constantly moist while pasting is being carried on.

10. The following processes shall not be carried on without the use of an efficient exhaust draught:

(a) melting of lead or materials containing lead; (b) manipulation of raw oxide of lead, unless done

- in an enclosed apparatus so as to prevent the escape of dust into the workroom;
- (c) pasting;
 (d) trimming, brushing, filing, or any other abrading or cutting of pasted plates giving rise to dust; (e) lead burning, other than-
- "tacking" in the formation room; chemical burning for the making of lead (ìí) -linings for cell cases necessarily carried on in such a manner that the application of
- efficient exhaust is impracticable. Such exhaust draught shall be effected by appliances

approved by the Chief Inspector of Factories, and shall operate on the dust or fume given off as nearly as may be at its point of origin, so as to prevent it entering the air of any room in which persons work. Provided that, at pots containing molten lead, the ex-haust draught may be effected by natural means, but,

if so effected, shall not be deemed to be efficient unless if so effected, shall not be deemed to be encent unless it produces through the working opening over the pot an average air velocity measured across the plane of the opening of at least 120 linear feet per minute. 11. The products of combustion produced in the heating of any melting pot shall not be allowed to es-cape into a room in which persons work. 12. A suitable receptable with tightly-fitting cover shall be provided and used for dross as it is removed from every melting pot

from every melting pot. Such receptacle shall be kept covered while in the workroom, except when dross is being deposited therein. 13. In every workroom there shall be provided a suit-

able covered receptacle, in which shall be deposited old

able covered receptacies, in which shall be depended out plates and waste material. 14. The racks or shelves provided in any drying room shall not be more than eight feet from the floor nor more than two feet in width. Provided that, as regards racks or shelves set or drawn from both sides, the total width shall not exceed

four feet.

Such racks or shelves shall be cleansed only after

being thoroughly damped, unless an efficient suction-cleaning apparatus is used for this purpose. 15. A Health Register, containing the names of all persons employed in a lead process, shall be kept in a form approved by the Chief Inspector of Factories, and where any employee is absent from work for three and, where any employee is absent from work for three days owing to supposed lead poisoning, the name, ad-thress, age, date of cessation from work, duration of ab-sence shall be entered by the employer in the Health.

Register. The Health Register kept in pursuance of this Regu-lation shall, upon demand being made by an Inspector amination.

16. The occupier shall, within 24 hours of any entry being made in the Health Register, notify in writing to the Chief Inspector of Factories that such entry has been made,

17. Protective clothing shall be provided and maintained in good repair for all persons employed in—

(a) manipulating of raw oxide of lead;

(b) pasting;(c) the formation room.

Such protective clothing shall consist of an overall, an apron made of material impervious to water, and clogs or other suitable footwear; and, also, as regards persons employed in the manipulation of raw oxide of lead or in pasting, head covering.

The overalls and head coverings provided for the persons employed in the manipulation of raw oxide of lead or in pasting shall be washed or renewed weekly.

18. There shall be provided and mannament to use of all persons employed in a lead process—

(a) a cloakroom for clothing put off during working hours.

mess room.

(b) Separate and suitable arrangements for the storage of protective clothing provided under Regulation 17.

19. There shall be provided and maintained in a cleanly state and in good repair for the use of all persons employed in a lead process—

(a) Lavatory, under cover, with either-

- (i) a trough with a smooth impervious surface trough with a smooth impervious surface fitted with a waste pipe, without plug, and of sufficient length to allow of at least two feet for every five such persons employed at any one time, and having a constant supply of warm water, from taps or jets above the trough at intervals of not more then the forther. than two feet; or
- (ii) at least one lavatory basin for every five such persons employed at any one time, fitted with a waste pipe and plug, and having either a constant supply of hot and cold water or warm water laid on, or (if a constant supply of heated water be not reasonably practicable), a constant supply of cold water laid on, and a supply of hot water always at hand when required by such persons for use; and

a sufficient supply of clean towels made of suitable material renewed daily; which supply in the case of pasters and persons employed in the manipulation of raw oxide lead, shall include a separate marked

towel for each such worker; and a sufficient supply of soap or oth cleansing material and of nail brushes. or other

(b) There shall, in addition, be provided means of washing in close proximity to the rooms in which manipulation of raw oxide of lead or pasting is carried on, if required by notice in writing from the Chief Inspector of Factories.

20. Sufficient bath or shower-bath accommodation shall be provided for all persons engaged in the man-ipulation of raw oxide of lead, or in pasting, with hot and cold water laid on, and a sufficient supply of soap and clean towels.

Part II .- Duties of Persons Employed.

21. (a) Every person employed in a lead process shall deposit in the cloakroom provided in pursuance of Regulation 18 (a) all clothing put off during working hours.

(b) Every person employed in the manipulation of raw oxide of lead, in pasting, or in the formation room, shall wear the protective clothing provided under Regu-lation 17. The protective clothing, when not being worn, shall be deposited in the place provided under Regulation 18 (b).

22. No person shall introduce, keep, prepare, or par-take of any food or drink, nor make use of tobacco in any place in which a lead process is carried on.

23. Every person employed in a lead process shall, before partaking of food or drink, or making use of tobacco, or leaving the premises, wash the hands, and every such person employed in the manipulation of raw oxide of lead or in pasting shall, in addition, wash the face.

24. Every person, when drossing, shall immediately deposit the dross in the receptacle provided under Regulation 12.

25. Every person employed in a lead process shall make full and proper use of the appliances provided for any of the purposes of these Regulations,

26. Every person employed in a factory in which a lead process is carried on shall, whenever required so to do, submit to an examination by the Commissioner of Public Health or some duly qualified medical practitioner appointed by him.

27. Every person employed in a factory in which a lead process is carried on, and who suffers from any symptoms which lead him to believe that he has contracted poisoning of any kind, shall forthwith notify the occupier as to such symptoms, and the occupier shall record such notification in the Health Register.

28 No person shall misuse, or, without the concurrence of the occupier or manager, in any way interfere with any appliance provided in pursuance of these Regulations.

Posting of Regulations.

29. A copy of these Regulations shall be exhibited in a conspicuous place in every factory in which electric accumulators are manufactured or repaired. Such copy of Regulations shall be maintained in a legible condition.

Penalty.

30. The penalty for a breach of the terms of any of these Regulations shall be a sum not exceeding £5.

THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919.

York Road Board.

P.W. 722/28.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Administrator in Council has approved of the attached By-laws of the York Road Board, in ac-cordance with the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919."

General By-laws.

Whereas by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make Bylaws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the York Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act, and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:-

Interpretations.

1. In these By-laws the interpretations set out in "The Road Districts Act, 1919," shall apply, in addition to which the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them in the Road Districts Act, or respectively, that is

all amendments thereto which may hereafter

- "Board."—The York Road Board. "Board room"—shall be the office, hall, or buildings of the Board on York Town Lot 101.
- of the Board on York Town Lot 101.
 "District."--The District under the jurisdiction of the York Road Board.
 "Secretary."--The Secretary of the Board.
 All other interpretations to be as prescribed in the

Road Districts Acts or Regulations thereunder.

Duties of Secretary.

- The duties of the secretary shall be-(a) to attend all Board meetings;
- (b) to attend all committee meetings;
- (c) to take notes of minutes and prepare reports of committees:
- (d) conduct all correspondence, and to give the other officers instructions as directed by the minutes, and carry out the resolutions of the Board as contained in such minutes;
- (e) answer all questions on the Board's business; (f) see that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance-sheets prepared and published in the Government Gazette yearly, and any other duties specified under "The Road Distriets Act, 1919";
- (g) prepare and place before the Board the monthly financial statement at the end of each month of the financial year, and enter the same on the minutes as required by the Act;

- (h) supervise the preparation of the Rate Books and the Board's Electoral Lists; to examine proof of the latter, and to arrange for the distribution of copies prior to an election; also to at-tend all courts of revision or appeal; to make the necessary arrangements for the elections; to issue instructions to the supervisor in accordance with the Board's resolution;
- (i) summon the members to Board and committee meetings;
- (j) keep all books entered up to date, in accordance with instructions issued by the Minister and additional instructions of the Board;
- (k) check all accounts sent into the Board, and see all accounts for works have stated in them the authority under which such works have been done, and to check all returns made by the collector or other officers of the Board, and see that the counterfoils of the receipt book accompany all returns; to supervise and attend to the due payment of all moneys coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board;
- (1) report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with necessary vouchers attached thereto.
- (m) to pay into the bank, after receipt, to the credit of the Board, all moneys received by him on behalf of the Board, when such moneys shall amount in the aggregate to the sum of Five pounds or over with the exception of moneys granted by the Government, which are paid into the Treasury book;
- (n) no money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board, by any officer of the Board, ex-cept by or through the secretary, as directed by the Board, and the secretary shall give all receipts on printed forms;
- (o) readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and to attend to all other matters affecting the finances and welfare of the Board and not herein specified;
- (p) see that all bonds and other forms of security to be taken from the contractors are prepared, and that the security required of servants is taken within due time, and to report as to such
- (q) report to the chairman any servant of the Board
 (who has been guilty of any neglect of duty, or who is incapable of doing the duties allotted to him:
- (r) exercise, subject to any directions given by the Board or chairman, control over all servants of the Board.

Duties of Supervisor.

- 3. The duties of the supervisor shall be-
- (a) the supervisor shall have the control of works, plant, and all property of the board, and shall issue instructions to the employees and shall see that same are faithfully carried out. Should any employee be guilty of insubordination or disobedience, or be found incapable of perform-ing the duries callotted to him, the supervisor ing the duties allotted to him, the supervisor shall report the matter to the chairman, who shall inquire into the matter and, if necessary,
- (b) to prepare proper plans and specifications for all works and improvements, as regards roads and culverts under the control of the Board; examine all works are proper plans and specifications for all works and improvements as regards roads and culverts under the control of the Board; examine all works are been planed in guilt works. ine all materials to be employed in such works, and to see the same properly and faithfully executed and performed, and watch the progress and formation thereof; submit all specifications and plans to the Board before tenders are called ;
- (c) to see that the work of cleaning and repairing all public roads and footways is properly carried out:
- (d) to see that no labourers are engaged but those who are able-bodied and sober;
- (e) to see that all drains, culverts, and bridges are maintained in a state of efficiency;
- (f) to see that all servants under his control carry out their duties efficiently and to report any departure therefrom;
- (g) to attend all Board and committee meetings, if required;

- (h) to specially examine, all roads throughout the district at least once each six months, or as required by the Board;
 (i) to supply monthly, or as required by the Board, returns of all work completed or in progress, mitt mercula thereas
- with remarks thereon.

Duties of Collector.

4. (a) The collector shall collect moneys that may be due to the Board, issuing receipts for payment, and en-tering particulars of all payments in the book for that purpose

(b) he shall pay all such moneys as are collected from day to day to the secretary of the Board, who shall check all such entries on receiving the moneys answering thereto, and shall initial such entries.

Appointment of Officers.

5. No permanent appointment shall be made to any office under the Board until after an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such an appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board. In the event of there being one or more applicant for such appointment, the election thereto shall be conducted by ballot so as to

obtain an absolute majority of the members present. 6. The election of all other officers shall be con-ducted by a show of hands, unless a ballet be demanded, in which case the procedure in the foregoing By-law shall be followed.

7. The salary or allowance attached to the office under consideration of the Board shall be fixed in all under consideration of the Board shall be fixed in all cases preceding the election, and the salary of any officer when fixed shall not at any time be considered with a view to its increase or reduction unless specially authorised by a meeting of the Board, at which at least five of the members are present. 8. All complaints against servants of the Board must be in writing, and must in every case be by the person or person complaining and no notice whether shall

or persons complaining, and no notice whatever shall be taken of any complaint not made in accordance with this By-law. All such complaints as are receivable may be addressed to the chairman, who, upon receipt of such complaint, shall have power to investigate same, and he shall report thereon to the Board at their next meeting.

Meetings and Proceedings.

9. Notice shall be given in writing by the chairman or secretary of ordinary or regular meetings, and also of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding six days.

10. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds— "Ordinary" and "Special." Ordinary meetings are the regular meetings held in pursuance of these By-laws for the transaction of the general business of the laws for the transaction of the general business of the Board, including meetings adjourned for the purpose of any incomplete business, but an adjourned meeting would not exclude any business which was considered necessary to transact. Special meetings are those called under Section 130 of the Act, and shall include those called by the chairman in response to a requisi-tion scienced by three numbers can bis own healf and tion signed by three members on his own behalf, and the notices for such special meetings shall have such special business notified thereon for which the meeting was called and for which each member shall receive seven days' notice. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the meeting was called; provided that any matter of emergency can be discussed, with the ruling of the chairman and the consent of those present. The ratepayers' meeting shall consist of one called under Sec-tion 143 of the Road Districts Act, and the standing tion 143 of the Koad Districts Act, and the standing orders shall, so far as the Act allows, apply to the pro-ceedings, but the provisions of the Act shall be first dealt with. The chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and, in his absence, or, after being present he shall retire, one of the members of the Board chosen by the ratepayers commembers of the Board es the case may be shall or members of the Board, as the case may be, shall preside.

11. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the office of the Board, York, on the second Monday in the month, unless otherwise arranged by resolution carried to that effect at the preceding ordinary meeting of the Boa d of which each member has received due notice of the proposed alteration.

12. A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in manner prescribed by the Act, but the chairman may

call a special meeting as often as he may think proper. No business will be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting, unless at least three members of the Board, inclusive of the chairman or the member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present.

13. Any three members may require the Board room to be cleared of strangers, and the chairman, or other presiding chairman, shall immediately give directions to have the order executed.

14. At all meetings of the Board, when there is not a quorum, or when the Board is counted out (which counting-out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present), or within 30 minutes after time for which meeting is called, such circum-stances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

15. The first business of all meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the Minutes of the preceding meeting aloud with a view of their confirmation.

Voting.

16. Each member (including the chairman) shall have one vote, and such chairman shall, in case of equality in votes, have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meetings shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present. All motions and amendments shall be decided by a show of hands, unless a division is made before the next business is proceeded with.

Minutes of Meetings.

17. The minutes prescribed by the Act shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there entered by the Secretary. Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting. No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of pro-ceedings, except as to their accuracy or for the rectification of a clerical error.

Standing Orders.

18. The order of business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say:-

- (a) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary, also special meetings (if any);
- (b) Consideration of business arising out of
- (b) consideration of business arising out of minutes;
 (c) Questions of which due notice has been given by members or officers of the Board;
 (d) The chairman shall have the right of directing attention at any meeting to any matter or subject within the jurisdiction or official cognisance of the Board of a minute signed by higher for any mater of a minute signed by higher for a minute signed. by himself, and such minute shall, when infore or to come before the Board, and the adoption thereof may be put by him from the chair as a motion without being seconded, but he shall confine himself to the questions contained therein;
- (e) Reports of sub-committees;(f) Presentation of petitions or memorials, and con-(g) Reading of correspondence (received) and tak-
- ing action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto;
- (h) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts;
- (i) Passing of accounts for payment;(j) Motions of which previous notice has been given;
- Motions without notice (by leave of the Board under By-law 19); (k)
- General business;
- (m) Notice of motions.

19. In the event of any member having urgent business to place before the meeting, he may move the suspension of the Standing Orders, and, if agreed to by the Board, such business shall take precedence to all others.

20. Any member wishing to rescind any motion shall act in direct compliance with Section 135 of the Road Districts Act, by giving seven days' notice to each member or submitting to the secretary of the Board notice of his intention in time to enable him to give the secretary enable him to give the necessary notice prescribed by the Act to each member.

Petitions.

21. Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only, and any member present-ing a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name at the beginning thereof with the number of sig-natures, and any member presenting a petition or mem-orial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and ascertain that it does not contain language disre-spectful to the Board. The nature or prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

Tenders.

22. Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject-matter of the tenders comes on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a committee appointed for the purpose.

Orders of Debate-Speakers must not Digress. A member having audience shall not digress from 23. the subject of debate.

Unopposed Notices of Motion.

24. The chairman may call over the Notices of Motion on the business paper in the order in which they appear thereon, and, if objection is not taken to a motion being taken as a formal motion, may call on the mover to move the same, and, upon the motion being seconded, may then, without discussion, put the motion to the vote.

Consideration of Reports.

25. (a) If in a report of a committee distinct recommendations are made, the decision of the Board may

(b) Any report of a committee, or any portion there-of, may be amended by the Board in any matter if it may think fit or may be referred back to the committee for further consideration.

(c) The recommendations of any committee when adopted by the Board shall be resolutions of the Board.

Precedence of Chairman.

26. When the chairman rises in his place during the progress of a debate, any member then speaking or offering to speak shall immediately resume his seat, and every member present shall observe strict silence so that the chairman shall be heard without interruption, but the member who was speaking may resume when the chairman takes his seat.

Notices of Motion; Absence of Mover.

27. In the absence of a member who had placed a notice of motion on the business paper for any meet ing, any other member may at such meeting move the same, or such motion may be deferred until the next or-dinary monthly meeting of the Board.

Withdrawals of Motions.

28. Except, as elsewhere provided, no motion, after being placed on the business paper, shall be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

Motions to be Seconded.

29. No motion shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

Motions not to be Withdrawn without Consent. 30. When a motion has been proposed and seconded it shall become subject to the control of the Board, and shall not be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

Amendment may be Moved.

31. When a motion has been proposed and seconded, any member shall be at liberty to move an amendment thereon, but no such amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

Motions and Amendments to be in Writing.

32. No motion or amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been reduced to writing if the chairman so directs.

Further Amendment may be moved on amended Question.

33. If an amendment has been carried, the question as amended thereby shall become itself the question before the Board, whereupon any further amendment upon such question may be moved.

How subsequent Amendments may be noved. 34. If an amendment, whether upon an original question or upon any question as amended as aforesaid, has been negatived, then a further amendment may be moved to the question to which such first-mentioned amendment was moved, and so on; provided that not more than one question and one proposed amendment thereof shall be before the Board at any one time.

Motions for Adjournment.

35. No discussion shall be permitted upon any motion for adjournment of the Board. If, upon the question being put on any such motion the same is negatived, the subject then under consideration or next on the business paper shall be discussed, and it shall not be competent for any member to again move a motion for adjourn-ment until half an hour has elapsed from the time of moving the one that has been negatived.

Mover of Adjournment when entitled to Priority.

36. On resuming any discussion which has been ad-journed, the mover of such adjournment shall be en-titled, if he has not already spoken on the subject under discussion, to speak first. notable m

an an a Notice of Questions to be given.

37. Sufficient notice of every question shall be given to the chairman or member expected to reply thereto, to permit of consideration of such reply and, if necessary, reference to other persons or documents.

Questions to be put without Argument.

38. Every such question shall be put categorically and without any argument.

Replies and Objections and subsequent Motions received.

39. No discussion shall be permitted respecting any

reply or refusal to reply to any question.

Mode of addressing Board, etc.

40. Members shall, on all occasions when at a meeting, address and speak to each other by their official designations, as chairman or secretary, as the case may be, and, with the exception of the chairman, shall rise in their place and stand while speaking (except when pre-vented from so doing by bodily infirmity).

Speaker not to be interrupted if in Order.

41. No member shall be interrupted while speaking, except for the purpose of calling him to order, as here-inafter provided or in pursuance of By-law.

42. One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall be first put on the last amendment; then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they were moved.

43. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the chairman.

44. In submitting a motion or amendment the chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative.

When an amendment is carried, the motion 45.amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which further amendments may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

Limitation as to number of Speeches.

46. The mover of an original motion shall have the right of general reply to all observations which have high of general repry to an observations which have been made in reference to such motion and to any amendment, thereon, as well as the right to speak on any such amendment. Every member other than the mover of an original motion shall have the right to speak once upon such motion and once upon every amend-ment woved thereon. No member shall without the ment moved thereon. No member shall, without the consent of the Board, speak more than once upon any one question or for longer than ten minutes at any one adding further observations than may be necessary for the purpose of such explanation.

47. Upon a vote being taken all members present within the Board room, unless disqualified from voting, and the chairman unless so disqualified may, upon the question being put, record their respective votes in the affirmative or negative, as each shall deem desirable, but if a member other than the chairman neglects or refuses to vote, his vote shall be counted for the negative.

Determination of Questions.

48. (a) All questions shall, if not otherwise decided by law, be determined thus: "Upon a question being put, those in favour shall say 'Aye'' and those against 'No''; and the chairman shall declare whether the 'Ayes'' or the ''Noes'' have determined the question; ary if the chairman prefer, he may call for a show of hands for and against the question. The decision of the chairman shall be final and conclusive, unless such de-cision be immediately challenged and two members rise and demand a division.

(b) Where there is only one dissentient, he may re-quire that his name be recorded in the minutes as opposed to the motion, and it shall be so recorded.

Divisions.

Upon a division being so called for, the question shall first be put in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the chairman and all members present shall vote by show of hands, and the names and votes of the chairman and members present shall be recorded in the minutes by the secretary. Any member of the Board present when a division is called for who does not, in the manner above indicated, vote on such motion, not being disabled by law from so voting, his vote shall be counted for the negative.

Chairman may repeat Questions.

50. The chairman shall be at liberty to put any ques-tion as often as may be necessary to enable him to form his opinion as to the result of the voting and declare the same.

Acts of Disorder.

51. Any member who at any meeting of the Board or any committee commits a breach of any By-law, or or any committee commits a breach of any By-law, or who moves or attempts to move any motion or amend-ment embodying any matter beyond the jurisdiction of the Board or committee, or who in any other way raises or attempts to raise any question, or addresses or attempts to address the Board or committee upon any subject which the Board or committee have no legal right to entertain or discuss, or who uses any language which, according to the common usage of gentlemen, would be held disorderly, or makes use of any expression inconsistent with good order and decorum, or who says or does anything calculated to bring the Board or com-mittee into contempt, shall be guilty of an act of dis-order. order.

Ruling of Chairman.

52. (a) The chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case, without argument or comment, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.

(b) If the ruling of the chairman is disagreed with, then the usual parliamentary procedure may be adopted.

Members called to Order more than once.

53. Any member who, having been called to order by the chairman for any infringement of any of the provisions of By-law or for any breach of decorum, shall, upon the request of the chairman, withdraw from the Board room for the remainder of the meeting.

Removal from Board Room: Penalty for continued Breach of Order, etc.

54. In the event of a member declining to with-draw from the Board room on being required to do so by the chairman, the chairman may order his removal until the determination of the sitting, and such member shall be deemed guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

Disorder.

55. If disorder arise at any meeting, the chairman may adjourn the meeting for a period of fifteen min-utes and quit the chair. The Board on resuming shall, on question put from the chair, decide without debate whether the business shall be proceeded with or not.

Appointment of Committee.

56. The Board may at any time appoint one or more members as a committee to inquire into any matter and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever, without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws, or a resolution of the Board.

Finance and Accounts.

57. All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be sub-mitted to the ordinary meeting, and, after being certi-fied as being correct, shall be paid by cheque. 58. An account shall be opened with such bank as

the Board may from time to time direct, and all moneys received from whatever source, with the exception of money granted by the Government, shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board, and no account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the chairman and one or more members of the Board, and counter-signed by the secretary. All moneys belonging to the signed by the secretary. All moneys belonging to the Beard shall, within 24 hours after they come into the hands of any officer, servant, or clerk, be paid to the secretary, or to any other responsible person or officer as directed by the Board.

Urgent Works.

59. The chairman, with one member, or, in the absence of the chairman, any two members may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not execeding Ten pounds.

60. Any one member is empowered in cases of very urgent necessity to authorise the expenditure upon de-clared roads of a sum not exceeding Two pounds ten shillings. In both these cases such action should be confirmed at the next meeting.

Unauthorised Expenditure.

61. Every item of expenditure, and every liability otherwise than under the authority of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure and a breach of this By-law by such person.

Common Seal.

62. The common seal of the Board shall be kept in the Board's safe. The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument except by order of the Board.

Prevention of Nuisances.

- 63. Any person who—
 (a) shall keep, or cause to be kept, any abattoirs or slaughter house, pigsty, manure works, works for boiling meat, bones, blood, or offal, bone mill, bone manure depot, fellmongery, tannery, wool-scouring establishment, glue factory, soap, or candle works, fish-curing establishment, place for ctoring draining to mesonying bones, bidee for storing, drying, or preserving bones, hides, hoofs, or skins, dairy, or other work or establishment; or
- (b) shall keep or cause to be kept any house, passage,
- (v) shall keep of eader to be kept any notes, passage, yard, way, cellar, drain, stable, cow-shed, earth, or other closet or cess-pool; or
 (e) shall permit any accumulation of stagnant water, manure, dung, offal, or other filth upon any premises owned or occupied by him, so as to be likely to become a nuisance or injurious to public health,

shall be deemed to have committed an offence against these By-laws, and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Abatement of Nuisances.

64. If any person shall permit or suffer any of the nuisances contained in the foregoing By-law to continue after notice from the Board requiring such person to remedy or abate the same, he shall be liable to a penalty of Five shillings for every day during which such nuisance shall remain unremedied or unabated to the satis-faction of the Board. Such penalty shall not exceed in the aggregate Twenty pounds.

Offences, Omissions, or Neglects.

65. Any person committing any of the following offences shall, on conviction thereof, pay a penalty not committing any of the following exceeding Ten pounds-

(a) damaging or destroying any building, dam, well, tank, pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, gate, or other pro-perty under the control of the Board;

- (b) placing any placard or other document, writing, or printing on, or otherwise defacing, any house or building abutting or contiguous to a public road, or on any wall, fence, gate, or lamp-post without the consent of the occupier or owner thereas. thereof.
- (c) blasting any road or stone or timber in or near any road without the permission of the Board, and not attending to such directions in regard thereto given by such Board;
- (d) placing, stacking, or storing within the limits of any township in the open air, any cases, paper, shavings, crates packed with straw or dangerous or inflammable substances, so as to be or likely to become a source of danger through fire.

Preservation of Trees.

Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree or shrub or plant standing in any of the roads, enclosures, public places, or reserves, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any of the tree-guards, fences, or other protection to such trees, shrubs, or plants aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds, and in addition therete shell also pay the Board a sum acred to the dam. thereto shall also pay the Board a sum equal to the damage so done.

Prescribed Removal of Verandah or other Encroachments.

67. Any verandah, balcony, or other encroachment which obstructs the footway or roadway, or is dangerous, and all other obstructions on the footways or roadways or overhanging the same, shall be removed, when ordered, within such time as shall be notified by the Board, and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah, balcony, or other construction, whether removed by the Beard or otherwise, and any person whatsoever interfering or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Lighting.

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68. Any unauthorised person who shall light, put out when lighted, or in any other way interfere with any lamp belonging to the Board, or any person who shall damage or destroy such lamp; shall pay in addition to the value of such damage, if any, on conviction, a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

Water Supply.

69. Any person who shall destroy any well, bore, pipe, tank, or place of storage of water or any machinery, appliances, or property used in connection there-with, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and also shall pay to the Board the sum of such damages.

Any person who shall waste or allow water to 70. of an offence against this By-law, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

No person shall pollute, or cause to be polluted, any water course, pool, well, tank, reservoir, or other water within the district.

72. Any person or persons leaving open the lid of any well in the District shall be guilty of offence against these By-laws, and, notwithstanding any civil remedy for damages so caused, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Any p rson who shall remove any water from any well, hore, tank, or other place of storage under the cou-trol of the Board, except in the direct watering of stock thereat, or for bona fide camping use, or except with the written consent of the Board and payment thereon of such reasonable fee as may be demanded, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Sand and Timber. 74. Any person who shall remove any sand or other materials from any lands under the control of the Board without a license, shall forfeit and pay on conviction

a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

Barbed Wire.

75. Barbed wire shall not be allowed on the outer or road side of any fence along any road. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Fencing.

76. The owner of any land abutting on any road in any Townsite shall fence all such boundaries so abutting with such description of fence as may be directed by the Board, and shall maintain every such boundary fence erected or to be erected in good order. In the event of such fence not being erected or repaired after due notice has been given so to do, the Board may fence or repair and recover the cost of so doing from the owner or owners of the land.

Schedule.

Picket fence on the boundaries of streets or road, consisting of 6in. straight jam posts or sawn timber $5 \ge 4$ at least 1Sin. in the ground, and four (4) feet out of the ground, with rails of $\pm \ge 2$ and pickets of $3 \ge 34$ not more than 3in. apart. R.O.W. and division fences to consist of the same type of posts with 3ft. netting, 2in. mesh, with three plain wires and one barb, placed as follows:—One plain flush with the ground, one plain three feet from the ground, one plain 6in. higher and one barb on top. All posts to be 10ft. apart. The Board will consider the crection of any other more substantial or ornamental fence.

Bathing.

77. No person shall bathe in any open public water within the limits or abutting on the boundary of the Road District, within the jurisdiction of the Board, without suitable bathing costume or clothing. Every person offending against this By-law shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Depasturing of Cattle, etc.

78. Any person who shall turn loose or suffer any kind of animals belonging to him or under his control to stray or go about, or to be tethered or depastured in or upon any road, recreation ground, or reserve, shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

79. No animal shall be allowed to stray on any roads or places, and no animal suffering from an infectious or contagious disease shall be ridden or driven on any road within the District. Any animal suffering may be slaughtered and destroyed at the owner's expense.

Copulation of Stock.

80. Any person who as owner or otherwise, while in charge of an entire horse, bull, or ass, shall cause, allow, permit, or suffer any such entire horse, bull, or ass to try to cover any mare or cow within the township within the District, or shall cause, permit, allow, or suffer any such entire horse, bull, or ass to be turned loose in any yard or other place with any mare or cow within any township for the purpose of allowing such mare or cow to be tried or covered, except in some yard, building, or other premises as shall be entirely and sufficiently sercened from public view, shall forfeit and pay on conviction a sum not exceeding Ten pounds.

Goats.

81. (1) No person shall keep any goat within the boundaries of the York Road District, unless such goat shall have been registered and the registration fee of sixpence paid to the secretary of the Board.

(2) Every registration shall be renewed in the month of July in each year.

(3) The Board may refuse to register any goat if, in the opinion of the Board, suitable accommodation has not been provided for keeping such goat.

(4) No person shall allow or cause any goat to be depastured upon or tethered upon or to loiter or to stray upon any roads, streets, or reserves or any vacant land adjacent thereto.

(5) Any goat found wandering upon any street, road, or reserve as above may be seized and impounded or destroyed.

(6) The penalty for breach of any of the preceding clauses shall be a sum not exceeding Five pounds for each breach, in addition to such sums as the Judge or Justices may direct as compensation for damages done by such goats.

Crossing Places.

82. It shall be lawful for any owner or occupier of any land fronting or adjoining any road or public way, requiring access thereto with horse-drawn or motordrawn vehicles from such street or road to such land across any existing made footpath, kerbing, channel, or gutter having first obtained the consent of the Board to construct a crossing of such dimensions and materials, and in such form and manner as the regulations of the Board for the time being require, or as may be directed by the secretary, and shall thereafter keep and maintain the same in good repair. Any person not complying with this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Heavy Traffic.

83. No person shall drive, take, or cause to be driven, any engine, agricultural, or other machine or vehicle of any kind across any bridge or culvert so specified from time to time whose weight, including any load thereon, shall exceed ten tons, and any person committing any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Damaging Roads.

84. No person shall either wilfully or negligently, damage or destroy by means of horse, team, or any other means any road under construction or repair, and any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Any person who-

- (a) cuts or removes without consent in writing of the Board, timber, earth, stone, or other material from a road or reserve; or
- (b) erects, without the consent aforesaid, any obstruction upon a road so as to encroach thereon; or
- (c) draws, without the consent aforesaid, across the waterside of a road, or across a drain, except over a properly constructed approach or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle,

shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these Bylaws and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

To protect Bridges from Fire.

85. Any person who shall light a fire (except by the order of the Board) or shall place any rushes, bushes, or other inflammable substances under, near, or against any bridge in the District for the purpose of making a camp or sleeping place, or for any other purpose, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One pound and not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Prevention of Trees falling across Roads.

86. No person shall, without the written consent of the Board, ringbark or set fire to any standing tree upon or near any road or track, or make or leave a fire near any road or track or reserve without taking proper precautions against such fire spreading.

Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds.

87. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting or otherwise provided for in these By-laws. The Board shall have the power to grant exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves placed under its control within the District for holding public sports or anusements to any responsible person or persons; and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, and trees or other improvements upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds, and reserves, and shall pay the Board a fee, to be fixed, for admission on such occasions.

88. No horses, cattle, or vehicles shall be allowed on any park lands or recreation grounds without the written permission of the Board.

89. All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming manner, and any properties and ereating any disturbance or annoyance to the public shall be liable to be expelled from such lands by any police constable or officer of the Board.

90. The Board may in its discretion prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday. 91. No person shall offer for sale on any reserve any provisions, refreshments, or other goods of any kind, nor carry on any games or boxing or other simi-lar shows, nor use any firearms, except with the ex-press sanction of the Board and payment of such fee as may be demanded.

92. The Board, or any person duly authorised, may make charges for any admission to any reserve or de-fined portion thereof, but such charges shall not exceed 2s. for adults and 1s. for children under 15 years, with free entry for children (accompanied) under five years, and for horses and vehicles 1s. each.

93. Such person to whom the use of any reserve is given for picnic, sports, races, or other use shall be held responsible for the immediate removal of all rubbish brought thereon on the occasion of such use, and a deposit not exceeding Five pounds shall be paid as a guarantee for the due removal of such rubbish to the satisfaction of the Board. On the removal of such shall be returned.

94. No person shall damage or injure any tree, shrub, or plant in any park Hands, recreation grounds, or reserves. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty not ex-ceeding Ten pounds for every offence.

Penalties.

95. Where any person by these By-laws or any of them is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done or remains undone or performed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

96. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where otherwise not provided, shall be deemed liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for every such offence.

97. All penalties or other sums recovered under provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the District, except so much as may be paid to any informer.

Tents, Etc.

98. (1) No tent or other structure of calico, canvas, or wood or other inflammable material shall be erected or be allowed to remain by any person or persons within the limits of the Board's area, without obtaining the consent thereto of the Board for such times and upon such terms as the Board may decide; and any person or persons offending against this By-law shall, upon con-viction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

(2) All persons having obtained permission to erect tents or other structures as aforesaid on the reserves set apart by the Board must conform to the following conditions:-

(a) Pay a sum of 3s. 6d. per month in advance as a lincense fee and rates for sanitary service;

(b) To erect in such position as the officer of the Board may direct;

(c) Generally to conform to the Regulations of the Board respecting sanitary matters, as from time to time may be made by the Board in respect to such reserve.

Provided that the Board retains to itself the right to cancel any such license granted, and to require the owner of such tent or structure erected on such reserves to remove the same, and the same must be removed within forty-eight hours after receipt of notice to remove, and in default of such removal the Board shall have power to remove the same and charge the expense thereof to the owner.

IN THE MATTER OF THE INDUSTRIAL ARBI-TRATION ACT AMENDMENT ACT, 1930, and in the matter of the Basic Wage for the year 1931-1932.

The 5th day of November, 1931. IN pursuance of the provisions of the above Act, and subject to the conditions therein prescribed, the Court of Arbitration hereby adjusts and amends the basic wage declared and now in operation as follows:—

1. The basic wage in the Metropolitan Area, which for this purpose shall be taken to be that portion of the State comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth, shall be:--

- (a) Adult Males: The sum of £3 13s. 6d. (three pounds thirteen shillings and sixpence) per week;
- (b) Adult Females: The sum of £1 19s. 8d. (one pound nineteen shillings and eightpence) per week.

2. The basic wage for the South-West Land Division of the State, excluding that portion thereof comprised within the Metropoltian Area as defined above, shall be:—

- (a) Adult Males: The sum of £3 14s. 6d. (three pounds fourteen shillings and sixpence) per week.
- (b) Adult Females: The sum of £2 0s. 3d. (two pounds and threepence) per week:

3. When the term of employment is for less than one week payment shall be made *pro rata*.

4. For all other portions of the State, except the parts referred to in paragraphs 1 and 2 hereof, the basic wage shall remain as at present declared.
