WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency John Alfred Northmore, Administrator in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

773/29. WHEREAS it is provided by "The Shipping and Pilotage Consolidation Ordinance, 1855," that the Governor may by Proclamation from time to time frame, alter, amend, or repeal rules and regulations, not repugnant to any of the provisions of the said Ordinance, to be observed by all masters and commanders of all ships or vessels in any of the ports or harbours of Western Australia, and by all persons duly appointed or licensed to act as harbour masters or pilots in such ports or harbours, and may substitute others in their ports or harbours, and may substitute others in their stead but so that all such rules and regulations shall be promulgated by Proclamation in the Government Gazette at least one month before the same shall take effect, at the expiration of which time the same shall be in full force and effect: And whereas the Governor did by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of November, 1917, make regulations in accordance with the said Ordinance: And whereas the Governor did by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 7th day of August, 1931, amend the said regulations in the manner set forth in the Schedule to such last-mentioned Proclamation: And whereas it is now deemed expedient further to amend whereas it is now deemed expedient further to amend the said regulations in the manner hereinafter men-tioned: Now therefore I, the said Administrator, act-ing with the advice and consent of the Executive Couning with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Ordinance, do hereby amend Regulation 25 of the regulations as made under and by the Proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of November, 1917, and as amended by the Proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 7th day of August, 1931, in the manner mentioned in the Schedule to this present Proclamation: And further, I, the said Administrator, do declare that this Proclamation and the amendment of the said regulations made hereunder shall come into force and have effect at the expiration shall come into force and have effect at the expiration of one calendar month from the publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette.

The Schedule.

Regulation 25 is amended by deleting therefrom paragraph (1) and inserting in lice thereof a paragraph as follows:-

(1) All candidates for exemption in respect of Geraldton Inner Harbour must have made three trips as master, or four trips as mate, into and out of such harbour with a pilot or an exempt master in charge of the vessel.

The Factories and Shops Act, 1920. PROCLAMATION

Constitution of Health District at Miling under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-19."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 19 of "The Health Act, 1911-19," that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any portion of the State, not being a Municipal District, to be a Health District, with such boundaries and by such name as may be specified in the order: And whereas it is desired to constitute a Health District with the boundaries and under the name hereinafter specified: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby constitute the area of land embraced in the undermentioned boundaries a Health District under the provisions of the said Act, such District to be styled the Miling Health District.

Boundaries:—All that land contained within a half-mile radius of the Miling Railway Station.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 1272/31.
WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works; and whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, with the advice of the Exceutive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act:—

Description and Location of Reticulation Works Approved and Exempted.—Metropolitan Reticulation Main Improvement, Subiaco Municipality:—Proposed fourinch diameter water main commencing at the existing three-inch diameter water main at the intersection of Fairway and Myers Street and proceeding thence along Fairway in a Southerly direction to connect with the existing three-inch diameter water main at the junction of Everett Street and Fairway (length about sixteen and a half chains).

The above main to be complete with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus, and existing one-and-a-half-inch tube main to be lifted, as indicated in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 5146.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 29th day of January, 1932.

The Weights and Measures Regulations, 1927, published in the Government Gazette on the 3rd day of June, 1927, are hereby further amended by the addition of a Regulation, No. 113b, as follows:

113b:

(a) Every petrol and kerosene drum-filling measuring machine shall-

(1) have its capacity legibly cast, stamped, or engraved on the container;

(2) Have the maker's name and serial number legibly cast, stamped, or engraved on the container;

(3) be so constructed that the overflow, if

(5) be so constructed that the overhow, it any, and the discharge will act quickly and without a prolonged dribble;
(4) have the fittings and delivery hose of a type designed to give free and ready flow to all petrol from time to time delivered therefrom.

(b) Such measuring machine shall not—

(1) show any leakage or seepage at any joint, valve, hose connection, or elsewhere;

(2) be fitted with a hose which shows excessive absorption, or with a hose which is of such construction or so fixed as to cause a prolonge dribble, or which has any tap or cock by which liquid may be

retained. (c) Such measuring machine shall be correct within the tolerance in error specified in Table V. for cylindrical liquid measures.

IN accordance with the provisions of Section 30 of "The Mining Development Act, 1902-1924," His Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council has been pleased to cancel Regulations 7 and 11 of the Regulations under which ore will be crushed and tailings purchased at the State Batteries by substituting the following:—

- 7. (a) The tailing produced from each parcel may be purchased at such plants as may be approved and will be paid for by the Government at the rate of not more than seventy-five per cent. of the gold contents after deducting two pennyweights eight grains to cover loss and cost of cyanide treatment. Gold to be paid for at the rate of eighty shillings per ounce;
- (b) In addition, the Minister shall be at liberty to pay to the vendor of tailing purchased under the authority of this regulation such amount as he shall think fit, as a premium upon the fine gold recovered from such tailing for which payment is made to such vendor; provided that such amount shall not exceed the amount of the premium upon such fine gold which the Minister may have received either directly or indirectly from the Commonwealth Bank, or to the receipt whereof the Minister is entitled or which he may reasonably anticipate he will so receive.

Upper Chapman Road Board .- Building By-laws. P.W. 2149/21.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make Bylaws for all or any purposes under the above-mentioned Act, the Upper Chapman Road Board, in pursuance of powers vested under the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the following, which shall be known and cited as "The Building By-laws":—

1. Interpretation.—Unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms shall hear the meanings

dicates, the following terms shall hear the meanings set against them:—

'Board''—The Upper Chapman Road Board.
'District''—The Upper Chapman District.
'Building''—Any house, store, shop, stoble, shed, verandah, lean-to, bough shed, or tent.

'Owner''—The owner of any land as interpreted under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919."

'Builder''—Any builder, contractor, or painter, or parson engaged in the erection of any building

person engaged in the erection of any building

within the meaning of these By-laws, "Townsite"—Any townsite situated within the

Road District

"Footpath" shall include any part of a street set apart for the sole use of pedestrians and whether the footpath be made or kerbed or otherwise. "Chairman"—The chairman of the Upper Chap-

man Road Board.
"Secretary"—The secretary of the Upper Chapman Road Board.

No owner or builder within the meaning of these By-laws shall erect any building upon any land in any townsite within the District, unless he first submits to the Board a copy of the plans and specifications of the building to be erected, and setting out clearly the number of buildings proposed to be built on each particular townsite lot or parcel of land, the measurements, materials of construction, and use for which the building is intended. ing is intended.
3. No buildi

No building shall be commenced unless a copy of the plans and specifications shall have been laid before and approved by the Board, and such copy of the plans and specifications shall receive approval by endorsement set thereto by the hands of the chairman and secretary.

4. The Board may reject any plans or specifications which have not, by reason of inflammable material proposed to be used or other reason, proper regard for the safety of persons or other buildings in the event of fire.

5. The Board may reject any plans or specifications which, in the opinion of the Board, do not bear proper consideration of size or design of construction or architecture to the adjacent buildings.

6. No builder or owner shall open up any road or footpath which by reason of building operations is footpath which by reason of building operations is found necessary, unless he first obtains a permit from the Board, and such openings shall be covered or railed and provided with lights to ensure safety to the general public using the road or footpath.

7. Every builder or owner shall, within reasonable time, from the completion of any building, fill in and repair to the satisfaction of the Board's authorised inspecting officer all openings on any road or footpath

inspecting officer all openings on any road or footpath which, by reason of building operations, it has been

found necessary to open.
8. No verandah shall be erected over any footpath unless it is eight feet in height from the footpath, and, if supporting posts be used, these shall be placed eleven feet from the building line to the outside of the posts, and as close to the kerbing as the Board may direct, to conform with the footpath width of eleven feet.

9. Any person who does any act contrary to, neglects or omits to do any act required to be done within the meaning of these By-laws, shall incur a penalty not exceeding twenty-five pounds, and a further penalty of not more than twenty shillings for each day the offence continues.
