Greeting:

KNOW Ye that I the said Administrator, acting with
the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do
hereby appoint you Alfred Yeates, Percival Dicey For-
rest, and Edmund Vernon Brockman to be Commis-
sioners:—

1. Generally to inquire into and report on the dis-
abilities relating to the working and development of
holdings of group settlers and other settlers engaged in
dairy farming and under mortgage to the Agricultural
Bank of Western Australia in the South-West District
of this State.

2. In particular, and without in any way limiting
the generality of the powers hereby conferred, to in-
quire into and report on—

- (a) Whether the settlers have made the best use of
their holdings and opportunities for dairying in
respect to—
 - (i) management and fertilising of pastures;
 - (ii) management of stock and conservation of
sufficient fodder;
 - (iii) growing of seasonal fodder crops;
 - (iv) raising of produce (other than butter fat)
for sale;
 - (v) production of all commodities possible on
the farm in order to keep down house-
hold expenses;

(vi) investment of surplus farm receipts and
earnings in stock, plant, improvements,
or development.

(b) General or particular farm problems such as re-
late to the soil comprised in holdings and the
effect of certain types of soil on the health, fer-
tility, and productivity of stock, and any difficul-
ties pertaining to, the farm itself.

(c) Methods and costs of producing, processing, and
distributing dairy farm produce.

3. To make such recommendations in regard to the
matters inquired into as may be deemed effective to
ensure improved methods of working and progressive
development, the payment of interest and loan moneys,
and to improve the economic position and outlook of
dairy farmers.

And I declare that you shall, by virtue of this Com-
mission constitute and be a Royal Commission within
the meaning of "The Royal Commissioners' Powers
Act, 1902," as reprinted in the Appendix to the Ses-
sional Volume of the Statutes for the year 1928, and
that the said Alfred Yeates shall be Chairman of the
said Royal Commission and shall have and may exercise
all the powers which under the said Act are exercisable
by a Royal Commission or the Chairman thereof.

And I do hereby desire and request you as soon as
reasonably may be to report to me in writing the result
of your inquiries and recommendations upon the matters
entrusted to you by this Commission.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7, Sub-section 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930," and Amendment Act, 1931, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default or breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement of sale and purchase of land or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or his estate or effects during the operation of such Stay Order. By-laws re Overhanging Hedges and re Clearing Vacant Lots.

P.W. 376/23.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in "The Road Districts Act, 1919," and the Acts amending the same, and in "The Town Planning and Development Act, 1928," and of all other powers thereto them enabling, the South Perth Road Board doth make and publish the following By-laws:—

Interpretation.—In the construction of these by-laws:—

- (a) The word "Board" shall mean the South Perth Road Board;
- (b) The word "hedge" shall mean any tree, plant, shrub or grass, or any part thereof;
- (c) The words "road or public place" shall mean any roadway, footway, reserve, park, land, or property under the control of the South Perth Road Board.

Re Overhanging Hedges.

1. No person shall cause or permit any hedge to overhang, project, or encroach on any road or public place within the South Perth Road District, except in such manner and to such extent as the Board may from time to time approve in writing.

2. Where there is any hedge overhanging or projecting more than six inches on any road or public place, the Board may from time to time order that such hedge shall be removed or cut back to such extent as the Board may prescribe. Such order shall be served on the owner or the occupier of the land on which such hedge exists or is rooted or planted.

3. The owner of the said land, after service on him or upon the occupier of the land, of such order, shall, in such time as shall be expressed therein, at his own cost, remove or cut back such hedge to the satisfaction of the Board.

4. If any owner neglects to observe such order in the time expressed therein the Board may remove or cut back such hedge, and such owner shall on demand pay the cost thereof to the Board. In default of payment on demand, such cost shall be recoverable in any court of competent jurisdiction.

5. No wall, fence, hedge, or other obstruction within fifteen feet of the corner of any street, road, or right-of-way not being an authorised building shall be or continue of a greater height than four feet.

6. For the purpose of the last preceding clause the height of four feet shall be measured from the level of the footpath immediately adjoining such wall, fence, hedge or other obstruction at the point where the height thereof is to be measured, or if there be no footpath at such point, then from the level of the roadway at such point.

Re Clearing Vacant Lots.

7. The Board may order that any land adjoining or abutting on any road or public place within the South Perth Road District shall be cleared of trees (other than those cultivated), scrub, and undergrowth.

8. The owner of land so ordered to be cleared, after service on him or upon the occupier of the land, of such order, shall, in such time as shall be expressed therein, at his own cost, clear such land of trees, scrub, and undergrowth to the satisfaction of the Board.

9. If any owner neglects to observe such order in the time expressed therein, the Board may clear such land of trees, scrub, and undergrowth and such owner shall on demand pay the cost thereof to the Board. In default of payment on demand, such costs shall be recoverable in any court of competent jurisdiction.

Penalties.

10. Any person who shall commit any breach of, or who fails, refuses, or neglects to comply with all or any of the provisions or stipulations of these By-laws, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).
