Armadale-Kelmscott Road Board—Decrease of Membership.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council declare the number of members to constitute a Road Board, and may determine the number of members for each Ward of the District: And whereas it is desired to declare the number of members to constitute the Armadale-Kelmscott Road Board, and to determine the number of members for each Ward of the District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare that the number of members to constitute the Armadale-Kelmscott Road Board shall be nine in lieu of thirteen, and doth determine that the nine members shall be allocated to the Wards as follows:—Armadale Town Ward—1 member; West Armadale Ward—2 members; Bedfordale Ward—1 member; Byford Ward—2 members; Kelmscott Ward—1 member; Karragullen Ward—1 member; Roleystone Ward—1 member; Total, 9 members.

Westonia Road District—Alteration of Boundaries with the Yilgarn Road District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 2402/23.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council sever any portion of a Road District and annex it to an existing Road District; and whereas it is desirable to—1. Sever portion of the Yilgarn Road District and annex it to the Westonia Road District; 2. sever portion of the Westonia Road District and annex it to the Yilgarn Road District; Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby—1. Sever that portion of the Yilgarn Road District as described in Schedule A hereto and annex it to the Westonia Road District; 2. sever that portion of the Westonia Road District as described in Schedule B hereto and annex it to the Yilgarn Road District.

WESTONIA ROAD DISTRICT.

Transfer of Territory from the Yilgarn District.

All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing at the intersection at the present district boundary with the North boundary of Yilgarn Location 1185 and extending along part of the North and the East boundary of the said location, part of the North, the East, and the South boundary of Location 1187, the Eastern boundary of Location 1188, part of the North and the East boundary of Location 1189, the East boundary of

Location 1190, the North boundary of Location 1197, the Northernmost, an East, and a North boundary of Location 1198, the Northernmost, an East, a North and part of the Easternmost boundary of Location 1053, the North and North-Eastern boundary of Location 1052, part of the North-Western and the West boundary of Location 1050, the North, the East, and the North-Eastern boundary of Location 1066, the Eastern boundaries of Locations 1067 and 1068, and the Southern boundary of the last-mentioned location; thence Southward to a North-West corner of Location 707 and along a West and North boundary of the last-mentioned location, the North boundary of Location 710, part of the East, the North, and the West boundary of Location 1073, the West and part of the Southern boundary of Location 1072, the Eastern boundaries of Locations 1002 and 984 and part of the South boundary of the last-mentioned location, the East boundary of Location 1094, the Easternmost and South boundaries of Location 987, the Southernmost boundary of Location 986, part of the East boundary of Location 993, the South boundary of Location 1025, the East boundary of Location 994, part of the North boundary of Location 997, the North and West boundaries of Location 998, part of the Northern and the West boundary of Location 1000, part of the North-West boundaries of Location 790 and the East and South boundaries of Location 781, the East and part of the South boundary of Location 1310 (Reserve 1432), part of the South-Eastern boundary of Location 787, rejoining the present district boundary; thence North along part of said district boundary to the starting point.

All that portion of Location 103 at present lying in the territory of the Westonia Road District.

Those portions of Locations 264 and 281, bounded by lines commencing at the intersection of the present district boundary with the North boundary of the former location and extending along part of said North boundary and the Easternmost boundary of said Location 264, the Easternmost and part of the South boundary of Location 281 to the present district boundary and North along said present district boundary to the starting point.

Schedule B.

Transfer of Territory from the Westonia Road District to the Yilgarn Road District.

All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing at the intersection of the North boundary of Location 106 with the present district boundary and extending South along said district boundary to the North boundary of Location 103; thence along part of the North boundary of said Location 103, the East boundaries of Locations 154 and 155, part of the East boundary of Location 156 and the North-Western boundary of Location 106 to the starting point.

The Forests Act, 1918.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1217/31.

WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—(a) the Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation; (b) after such proposal has been laid before Parliament, the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication: And whereas His Excellency the Administrator did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the Fourth day of August, 1931, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest: And where as after such proposal had been laid before Parliament, a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, with the advice and consent

of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forests Nos. 22, 29, and 38 by excising those portions of such State Forests as are described in the Schedule hereto:—

The Constitution Act, 1889.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.P.H. 3156/24.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in Section 74 of "The Constitution Act, 1889," by which the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council, does not apply to minor appointments, which by Order in Council are vested in Heads of Departments or other officers or persons within the State: And whereas certain minor appointments in the Medical and Health Department were by Order in Council dated 10th February, 1926, vested in the several officers whose names or offices are set out in the Schedule to the Order: And whereas it is desirable that the said Order in Council be amended: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator in Council, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby cancels the Order in Council of the 10th February, 1926, vesting such appointments in the Permanent Head, the Assistant to the Under Secretary, the Principal Medical Officer, the Commissioner of Public Health, the Secretary, Medical Department (for the Medical Division), and the Secretary, Health Department (for the Health Division), and ordains and declares that the power of appointing matrons, nurses, domestic servants, cooks, orderlies, wardsmen, yardsmen, laundresses, housemaids, wardmaids, working engineers, firemen, groundsmen, storemen, kitchenmen, gardeners, farm hands, labourers, and branders who are exempt from "The Public Service Act, 1904," in the Medical and Health Department, shall be vested, and the same is hereby vested, in each of the officers mentioned in the Schedule hereto, and in the person for the time being acting in the place of any such officer:—

Augusta-Margaret River Road Board District—
Poundage By-laws.

P.W. 715/25.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Road Districts Act, 1919," and "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board has established a Public Pound on the National Park, situated at Margaret River, and has appointed Mr. H. McGlade as Poundkeeper and Ranger.

The following By-laws, poundage, and sustenance fees are made, and shall be charged and enforced on the owners of impounded stock:—

1. Any owner or other person who shall wilfully or negligently allow any horse or other stock to stray or to be at large on lands under the control of the Board shall forfeit and pay upon conviction before one or more Justices of the Peace for every such offence the following fines, in addition to pound fees and damage done by trespass:—

For every entire horse, or bull, not more than £2.

For every other head of cattle, within the meaning of the Act, not exceeding £1.

2. All impounded animals shall be subject to a charge on the following scale of poundage fees, besides trespass fees:—

For every horse, mare, gelding, mule, ass, camel, or pony above 12 months old ..	5	0
For every foal under 12 months old ..	2	6
For every bull, cow, ox, or steer over 12 months old ..	5	0

Such fees to be paid for each day or part of a day during which such animals shall be in the pound.

3. For the proper sustenance of impounded horses, cattle, etc., the poundkeeper and ranger shall be empowered to charge the following rates:—For each horse, mare, gelding, mule, ass, pony, or head of horned cattle above 12 months old, 2s. 6d. per day of 24 hours; feed—hay or chaff, 20 lbs.; for each colt, foal, or head of horned cattle under 12 months old, excepting sucking foals or calves, fed on hay or chaff (15 lbs.), 1s. 6d. per day of 24 hours.

4. Any cow in full milk shall be milked by the Poundkeeper, or other person appointed by the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board, immediately on its being impounded, or at any time necessary, and such milk shall be given or thrown away, unless immediately claimed by the owner.

Adoption of Model By-laws.

M.H.D. 2084/19; Ex. Co. No. 290.

WHEREAS by Section 294 of "The Health Act, 1911-19," it is provided that the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which By-laws may be made by a Local Authority under any of the provisions of the said Act, and that a Local Authority may of its own motion by resolution adopt the whole or any portion of such By-laws; and whereas Model By-laws have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the said section and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 8th day of April, 1927: Now, therefore, it is resolved and determined by the Claremont Road Board, being a Local Health Authority within the meaning of the said Act, that the whole of such Model By-laws be adopted for the Claremont Road District; And whereas, under the provisions of the said Act, a Local Authority may amend any By-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Claremont Road Board, under the powers conferred upon it in that behalf, does hereby amend its By-laws as provided hereunder:—

Part IV.

(a) Add a new By-law to stand as By-law No. 2 (d):

After the coming into force of this By-law, it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to establish or open any dairy or dairies within the following area of the Claremont Road District:—
