ORDER IN COUNCIL.

In the matter of "The Industrial Arbitration Act Amendment Act, 1930," and in the matter of the Basic Wage for the year 1931-1932.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the above Act, and subject to the conditions therein prescribed, the Court of Arbitration hereby adjusts and amends the basic wage declared and now in operation as follows:—

(1.) The basic wage in the Metropolitan Area, which for this purpose shall be taken to be that portion of the State comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth, shall be:—

- (a) Adult Males: The sum of £3 12s. 0d. (three pounds twelve shillings) per week;
- (b) Adult Females: The sum of £1 18s. 11d. (one pounds eighteen shillings and elevenpence) per week.

(2.) When the term of employment is for less than one week payment shall be made pro rata.

(3.) For all other portions of the State, except the part referred to in paragraph 1, the basic wage shall remain as at present declared.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930.

No. 4. Licenses for hawkers shall be in the Form "X" of the Schedule, and for stalls in the Form "Z" in the Schedule.

No. 5. Every hawker, whilst employed in hawking, shall produce his license upon being required by any Constable or officer of the Board, and shall at all times have affixed to some conspicuous part of his coat, basket, tray, or vehicle a board or plate bearing his name, and the words "Licensed Hawker" legibly printed thereon in letters not less than one inch in length.

No. 6. No licensed stall shall be placed or allowed to stand in any street or position other than that mentioned in the license, or between the hours of 9 p.m. or 4 a.m.

No. 7. The following fees shall be paid for licenses to hawkers or stalls and shall be paid in advance, and, if any payment be not paid when due, the license shall be void.

For every hawker with hand basket or tray, 20s. per annum.

For every hawker with wheelbarrow or handcart, 30s. per annum.

For every hawker with motor or vehicle drawn by horse or other animal, 40s. per annum.

Stall License.

For every stall, 10s. per month.

No. 8. Every licensed hawker or stallholder shall at all times obey the lawful directions of the secretary or other authorised officer of the Board.

No. 9. No person to whom a Hawker's or Stallholder's License is granted shall lend, transfer, or assign his license granted, and no person shall borrow or make use of any such license granted to a person other than himself, unless by written consent of the secretary.
