AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, the Second day of March, 1932, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

> Forests Act, 1918. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1217/31 and 1781/30. WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—(a) the Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation; (b), after such proposal has been laid before Parliament, the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such

proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Conneil reproposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication: And whereas proposals dated the Twenty-first day of October, 1930, and Fourth day of August, 1931, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest were laid on the Table of each House of Parliament: And whereas after such proposals had been laid before Parliament resolutions were passed by both Houses that such proposals should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forests Nos. 24, 27, and 29 by excising those portions of such State Forests as are described in the Schedule hereto:—

The Road Districts Act, 1919. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 9/31.  - (a) Adult Males: The sum of £3 12s. 0d. (three pounds twelve shillings) per week;
 - (b) Adult Females: The sum of £1 18s. 11d. (one pounds eighteen shillings and elevenpence) per week.
- (2.) When the term of employment is for less than one week payment shall be made pro rata.
- (3.) For all other portions of the State, except the part referred to in paragraph 1, the basic wage shall remain as at present declared.
