WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Land Act, 1898," the Governor may resume, for any of the purposes specified in Section 39 of the said Act, any portion of land held as a Conditional Purchase Lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of Conditional Purchase Leases 20/1885 (Peel Estate Lot 66) and 20/1883 (Peel Estate Lot 67), as described hereunder, should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph 3 of Section 39 of the said Act, that is to say, for Drainage: Now, therefore I, the Honourable John Alfred Northmore, Administrator as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation resume portion of the aforesaid Conditional Purchase Leases for the purpose aforesaid.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 12th day of May, 1932, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 447/32.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act:—

Description and Location of Reticulation Works approved and exempted.—Metropolitan Reticulation Main Improvement—City of Perth (North, East, Central, South, and Leederville Wards) and City of Fremantle (City, Central, and South Wards).

The proposed work consists of the lifting, reconditioning, cement-lining and relaying of three-inch and four-inch water mains within the areas bordered red on Drawings Nos. 3 and 4 of Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 5126.

The above-mentioned water mains shall, when relaid, be complete with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 20th day of May, 1932.

The Road Districts Act, 1919.

Gascoyne-Minilya Road District—Alteration of Boundaries with Upper Gascoyne Road District.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 731/28.

#### FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Order has been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930," and Amendment Act, 1931, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default or breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement of sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or his estate or effects during the operation of such Stay Order. N.B.—The minimum wharfage due shall be 6d. and the minimum handling charge shall be 3d. per consignment.

## Notes.

1. Cargo landed on wharves or jetties from a vessel in distress or for convenience of a vessel and reshipped by same vessel, 1s. per ton wharfage. Handling charges will be made according as said cargo is dealt with, on the same scale as other cargo.

2. Transhipment cargo is cargo appearing as such upon a vessel's manifest, or declared in writing to the Board before being transhipped direct ship to ship or being landed as being intended for transhipment into a vessel.

3. No wharfage dues will be charged in respect of ballast in the shape of stone, sand, shingle, or such like material transhipped overside vessel to vessel.

4. The Board will not supply labour to handle cargo transhipped overside vessel to vessel.

5. Cargo is allowed 48 hours' free storage in sheds, except transhipment cargo, which is allowed 72 hours.

6. Grain (as defined above), flour, agricultural and horticultural produce (including fruit), and coal, any of which being the product of the State of Western Australia, when brought into the Port of Bunbury for the purpose of transhipment for export beyond the State, shall be free of transhipping dues, but must pay handling charges incurred.

7. Cargo discharged (under Regulation 107) direct into trucks for consignment off the wharf, will be charged at half handling rates provided the Board receive only into trucks.

8. Goods from foreign ports landed at Bunbury without transhipment in the Commonwealth (excepting rails, railway accessories, coal, coke, and all petroleum products) shall be charged wharfage at a reduced rate of 25 per cent.

9. Wool landed for reclassing, scouring, marking, dumping, etc., and reshipped, will be regarded as transhipped cargo on a certificate from the shipper that it was the same wool as originally landed.

10. Wharfage dues on bulk petroleum products and other oils will be per ton of 250 gallons. Handling charges will be subject to arrangement, according as the oils are dealt with.

11. For extra handling and other charges on goods, see Regulations Nos. 109, 122, 123, 124, 125, 133, 134.

12. Wharf haulage is not included in the wharfage rate on materials in crude form for the manufacture of artificial manures and acids, rock phosphate, phosphatic guano, sulphur, etc.

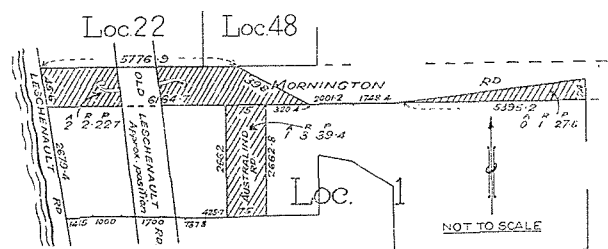
