PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency John Alfred North-TO WIT. 5 more, Administrator in and over the J.A. NORTHMORE, State of Western Australia and its Administrator. Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation declare, inter alia, that any Western Australian waters shall be closed against the taking of any prescribed species of fish by any means whatever, or against fishing gener-ally by any method of capture, during any specified time in any year: And whereas it is desirable that the waters of the Collie River should be declared closed against the taking of English Perch: Now, therefore I, the said Administrator, with the advice and concent of the said Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:— That the waters of the Collie River shall be closed against whatever from the 1st day of June, 1932, until the 30th day of September, 1932.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency John Alfred North-TO WIT. A More, Administrator in and over the J. A. NORTHMORE, State of Western Australia and its Administrator. Dependencies in the Commonwealth of [L.S.] Australia. 1411/21.

WHEREAS by "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proelamation declare, inter alia, that any Western Australian waters shall be closed against the taking of any prescribed species of

fish by any means whatever, or against fishing generhash by any means whatever, or against fishing gener-ally by any method of capture, during any specified time in any year: And whereas it is desirable that the waters of the Capel River should be declared closed against the taking of English Perch: Now, therefore J, the said Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:— That the waters of the Capel River shall be closed against the taking of English Perch by any method of capture whatever from the 1st day of June, 1932, until the 30th day of September, 1932.

Prorogation of Parliament. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency John Alfred North-TO WIT. By His Excellency John Alfred North-more, Administrator in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia. [L.S.]

WHEREAS by "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly from time to time by Proclamation or other-wise, whenever he shall think fit: Now, therefore I, the Administrator, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do hereby prorogue the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly until Thursday, the 30th day of June, 1932.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this 25th day of May, 1932, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Road Districts Act, 1919. Nungarin Road Board. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1799/25.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 20 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," that in every District there shall be a Board consisting of not less than five or more than thirteen members, as the Governor from time to time declares by Order in Council, and that if the District is divided into Wards the Governor shall from time to time determine the number of members for each Ward: And whereas it is enacted by Section 14 of the said Act, inter alia, that on a change being made under this Act in the number of members of a Local Authority, the Governor may by Order in Council declare and direct whether a new election of members shall be held for any District affected, and, if so, when such election shall be held: And whereas it is enacted by Section 13 of the said Act that on a District being divided or redivided Wards all the members of the Board shall go out into of office on the day appointed by the Minister: And whereas until recently the Nungarin Road District was divided into five (5) Wards, and the Board thereof con-sisted of eleven members: And whereas by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 22nd day of April, 1932, the said Road District was, pursuant (7) Wards instead of five (5) Wards as previously, and in accordance with the provisions of Section 13 of the said Act the Minister has appointed the 18th day of November, 1932, as the day upon which the members of the Nungarin Road Board shall go out of office as such members: And whereas upon the redivision of the Nungarin Road District into seven Wards as aforesaid, it is deemed expedient to reduce the number of members of the Nungarin Road Board from eleven to seven, and determine that there shall be one member for each of the said seven Wards, and also to direct that there shall be an election for the purpose of electing the said seven members and that such election shall be held on the 3rd day of December, 1932: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Exceutive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and all other powers thereto enabling him, doth hereby declare that as from the 3rd day of December, 1932, the Nungarin Road Board shall consist of seven (7) members, instead of eleven (11) members as formerly, and that each Ward into which the Nungarin Road District is now redivided shall have one of such seven members; and also, that an election shall be held for the purpose of electing the said seven members of the said Nungarin Road Board and that such election shall be held on the 3rd day of December, 1932.

The Road Districts Act, 1919. Rockingham Road Board. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 990/31.

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WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 13 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919,' that on a District being divided or redivided into Wards all the members of the Board shall go out of office on the day appointed by the Minister: And whereas by an Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 22nd day of April, 1932, the Rockingham Road District was, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, divided into three Wards, and in accordance with the provisions of Section 13 of the said Act the Minister has appointed the 3rd day of June, 1932, as the day upon which the members of the Rockingham Road Board shall go out of office: And whereas upon the division of the Rockingham Road District into three Wards as aforesaid it is deemed expedient to direct that there shall be an election for the purpose of electing the members and that such election shall be held on the 18th day of June, 1932: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, acting on the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exer-cise of the powers conferred by the said Act and all other powers thereto enabling him, doth hereby declare that an election shall be held for the purpose of electing the members of the said Rockingham Road Board and that such election shall be held on the 18th day of June, 1932.

Dairy Industry Act, 1922.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 25 of "The Dairy Industry Act, 1922," that the Governor may make Regulations for any of the purposes therein mentioned: And whereas on the 6th day of June, 1923, the Governor made Regulations under and for the purposes of the said Act, and it is now deemed expedient to amend the said Act, and it is now deemed expedient to amend the said Regulations by inserting therein a new Regulation, as hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby amend the said Regulations by inserting therein a new Regulation, to stand as Regulation 45A, as follows:—

45A. (1) No person shall manufacture for sale, or have in any factory or store or other place for sale, butter which does not conform to the standard prescribed by the next preceding Regulation.

(2) For the purposes of this Regulation butter shall be deemed to be manufactured or held for sale until the contrary is proved by the person in whose possession such butter is found.

ORDER LXIII.

The following new Rule shall be inserted in Order LX111., after Rule 2, and stand as Rule 2A :-

2A. As from and after the 30th day of June, 1932, the Criminal Sittings of the Supreme Court to be held at Perth monthly under and in accordance with Section two of "The Supreme Court Criminal Sittings Act, 1899," shall commence in each month on the first Tuesday thereof:

All fuses to be used for firing charges of explosive shall be prepared in daylight, under cover, by being cut into required lengths with a sharp instrument, and detonators shall be placed on the fuse and crimped thereto by an approved tool. The distribution of capped fuses shall be undertaken in accordance with the pro-visions under Section 32, paragraph (g), of General Rule (3).

IN accordance with the provisions of Section 63 of "The Mines Regulation Act, 1906," His Excellency the Administrator in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following additional General Rules under Regulation 4 of the said Act:-

Transport of Carbide.

46. No person shall carry or cause or permit to be 46. No person shall carry or cause or permit to be carried any calcium carbide underground, except in lamps provided or approved by the manager, or in a watertight receptacle of a type approved by the District Inspector of Mines and to be approved by the manager. No person shall store or leave calcium carbide under-ground on coming off shift. Spent carbide shall be placed in properly covered receptacles and taken to the surface as often as may be necessary.

Time for Blasting.

47. The manager shall cause the times of working shifts and of blasting operations in every section of the mine to be so arranged that workmen shall not be exposed to fumes and dust from blasting. Blasting shall posed to rimes and dust from blasting. Blasting shall be allowed only at noon, 4 p.m., 8 p.m., and midnight, except for removing obstructions in ore-passes, or box holes or for the purpose of making the hanging safe or for blasting misfired holes in development faces, and then only with the permission in each case of the mana-ger or underground manager. Blasting during crib time shall be permitted only after workmen have been re-moved to the intake side of all places where blasting is to be done and where the resultant smoke and dust is to be done and where the resultant smoke and dust do not affect them in the section where they congregate during crib time. When sinking shafts, and in other special work, blasting may be done at other times than those prescribed, provided written permission has been obtained to do so from the District Inspector of Mines.

Dust and Ventilation.

48. (1) All development ends and winzes, where machine drills are used, shall not be advanced more than machine drills are used, shall not be advanced more than 20 feet from the through air current unless a blower approved by the District Inspector of Mines, delivering induced air through pipes to within a few feet from the face, and with sufficient velocity and volume to remove the dust, is installed. Any working place where dust is formed shall be provided with a blower if, in the opinion of the District Inspector of Mines, it is considered neces-sary. Any person who wilfully damages or misuses a blower or pipes shall be liable to a penalty as for a breach of this Regulation.

(2) The manager of a mine shall appoint dust and ventilation officers when required to do so by the District Inspector of Mines, whose duty it shall be to examine and report on :-

(a) all matters relating to the mine's water supply, its quality, distribution, and use;

- (b) the condition of the necessary appliances for using water at each working place elsewhere;
 - (c) the dust sampling of the mine, more particularly as regards development ends;
 - (d) the conditions of the mine relating to ventilation and health, more particularly as regards the amount of air supplied during the interval after blasting and before entry and during the work-ing shift, in all development ends and working places in which there is no through ventilation current.

The manager shall notify the District Inspector of Mines in writing of the name of the person or persons so appointed from time to time. The condition of the mine as found by such person shall, at the completion of each day, be entered by him in the Record Book. Such entries shall be examined and countersigned by the menore of underword persons of least enter the manager or underground manager at least once a week.


