Forests Act, 1918.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

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F.D. 1217/31; 1732/31. WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is pro-vided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner: (a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parlia proposal has been laid before Parliament, the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication: And whereas His Excellency the Administrator did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposals dated the Fourth day of August, 1931, and Seventeenth day of November 1931, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest: And whereas, after such proposals had been laid before Parliament, resolutions were passed by both Houses that such proposals should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forests Nos. 6, 21, 25, 28, 33, and 36 by excising those portions of such State Forests as are described in the Schedule hereto:—

The Vesting Order dated 10th February, 1926, with reference to the above Reserve is hereby superseded.

The Land Act, 1898. ORDER IN COUNCIL.
