WHEREAS by Section 11 of "The Land Drainage Act, 1925," the Governor may constitute any defined portion of the State a Drainage District, specify the boundaries of such District, assign a name to such District: And whereas, under Sections 15 and 17 the Governor may direct that there shall be a Drainage Board for any District, and determine the number of members: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute a Drainage District, having the boundaries described in the Schedule hereto, and assign the name of the Wannern Drainage District thereto, and doth direct that there shall be a Drainage Board for the said District consisting of three members:

5. Hawkers' Licenses shall be paid in advance. Monthly licenses commence on the 1st day of each calendar month; quarterly licenses on the 1st July, 1st October, 1st January, and 1st April; half-yearly licenses on 1st July and 1st January; yearly on 1st July in each year.

6. License fees for hawkers shall be :---2s. 6d. per month for each person; 5s. for three months for each person; 7s. 6d. for six months for each person; 10s. for twelve months for each person.

7. Any unlicensed person doing any act or thing for which a license is required, and any licensed person committing any breach of these By-laws shall be guilty of an offence against the Road Districts Act, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
