Greeting:*

WE do by this Our Commission under Our Sign Manual  
and Signet appoint you, the said Sir John Alfred North-  
more, to be, during Our pleasure, Our Lieutenant-  
Governor of Our State of Western Australia and its  
Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, with  
all the powers, rights, privileges, and advantages to the  
said Office belonging or appertaining.

II. And further, in case of the death, incapacity, or  
removal of Our Governor of Our said State, or of his  
departure from Our said State, We do hereby authorise  
and require you to administer the Government thereof,  
with all and singular the powers and authorities con-  
tained in certain Letters Patent under the Great Seal,  
bearing date at Westminster the Twenty-ninth day of  
October, 1900, constituting the Office of Governor in  
and over Our State of Western Australia and its De-  
pendencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, or in  
any other Letters Patent adding to, amending or sub-  
stituted for the same, and according to such Instruc-  
tions as Our said Governor for the time being hath  
already received, or may hereafter receive from Us or  
through one of Our Principal Secretaries of State, and  
according to such Laws as are now or shall hereafter  
be in force in Our said State.

III. And We do hereby command all and singular  
Our Officers, Ministers, and loving subjects in Our said  
State and its Dependencies, and all others whom it may  
concern, to take due notice hereof, and to give their  
ready obedience accordingly.

day of June, 1932, in the Twenty-third Year  
of Our Reign.

## THE PARKS AND RESERVES ACT, 1895.

By-laws—Donnybrook Recreation Ground.

Department of Lands and Surveys,  
Corres. No. 5090/12. Perth, 10th August, 1932.

HIS Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator in Executive Council has been pleased to appoint, under the provisions of the above Act, the Preston Road Board as a Board to control and manage Reserve 17521, at Donnybrook, for Recreation purposes, and to approve of the following By-laws for the control and management of same.

## By-laws.

Interpretations.—The term "Board" shall mean the Preston Road Board. The term "Ground" shall mean all land contained in Recreation Reserve 17521, part of Wellington Location 804, the property of the said Board, and a strip of land on East side of said location leased from the Commissioner of Railways, with the exception of the Donnybrook Agricultural Society's Pavilion, the Tennis Courts and the Tennis Club's Pavilion. The term "Permission" shall mean the permission of the Board obtained and expressed in writing.

1. The Board may appoint a sub-committee to facilitate the management of the ground and may include in such sub-committee one Representative elected by the Donnybrook Agricultural Society and one delegate from other local bodies which use the ground.

2. All applications for use of the ground shall be made to the Board in writing.

3. No person or persons shall use the ground without permission of the Board.

4. The Board reserves the right to refuse (without giving reason for such refusal) to grant any application for permission to use the ground.

5. All charges for use of the ground shall be fixed by the Board from time to time.

6. All charges for use of the ground which are based on a percentage of gate receipts and/or collections shall be paid to the Board within seven days after the date on which the ground is used.

7. The Board may, at its discretion, require a cash deposit of a sum not exceeding three pounds before considering any application for use of ground. Such deposit shall be refunded provided the ground is left in clean condition and any damage rectified to the satisfaction of the Board. The Board reserves the right to make good the cost of cleaning and/or repairing ground out of such cash deposit.

8. No person shall deposit or leave any rubbish, refuse, paper, broken glass, china, or litter of any kind whatsoever within the ground. In the event of this By-law being disregarded, the actual cost of thoroughly cleaning the ground by the employees of the Board shall be charged and recovered from the person or persons to whom the use of the ground is granted.

9. Football, hockey, and cricket clubs shall submit to the Board a list of their fixtures before commencement of their respective playing seasons.

10. All obstructions such as goalposts, hurdles, etc., shall be removed by the person or persons responsible when requested by the Board so to do.

11. No improvement or alteration to or in connection with the ground shall be made without the permission of the Board.

12. No sheep, cattle, pigs, horses, or other animals shall be allowed on the ground without the permission of the Board.

13. All persons using or being on the ground shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming manner. Any person creating a disturbance or annoyance to the public, or playing any unlawful game, or playing any game which in the opinion of the Board is dangerous, shall be liable to be expelled from the ground by any police constable, officer of the Board, or person or persons using or occupying the ground.

14. No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, or merchandise on the ground without first having obtained permission of the Board and having paid such fee as may be fixed by the Board for permission.

15. No person shall damage or injure any tree, shrub, plant, building, erection, or other property in or on the ground or do any damage to or cut up the surface or soil thereof.

16. No person shall camp, lodge, or tarry overnight or frequent the ground for the purpose of camping, lodging, or tarrying overnight.

Penalty.—Any person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

## INDUSTRIAL ARBITRATION ACT, 1912-1925.

In the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia.

No. 7 of 1930.

Industrial Board—Printing Trades (Country).

Western Australian Branch of the Printing Industry Employees' Union of Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and The Western Australian Country Press Association and others, Respondents.

Award of Industrial Board.

THE Industrial Board for the Printing Industry (Country Districts), in pursuance of the powers and duties conferred upon it by Section 107 of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," and in pursuance of a remission to it by the Court of Arbitration, doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the above-named parties.

## AWARD.

## 1.—Area.

This Award shall operate over the whole area of the State, except that area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth, and twenty (20) miles from the Kalgoorlie Post Office. It shall come into force and be operative as from the 22nd day of August, 1932, and shall continue in force for three (3) years. Either side shall have the right to apply to alter, amend, or rescind any clause after the expiration of twelve (12) months from the date of the delivery of the Award.

## 2.—Hours.

(a) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work for all workers covered by this Award.

(b) Not less than three-quarters of an hour shall be allowed on each day for mid-day meal between the hours of 12 noon and 2.30 p.m.

(c) Each daily or nightly period shall stand by itself, and all time worked in excess of the usual working hours shall be paid for at overtime rates hereinafter set forth.

(d) Day work shall mean work done between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m.

(e) Night work shall mean work done between 7 p.m. and 8 a.m.

(f) The weekly hours shall be ordinarily worked in six days, divided into five (5) full shifts and one half shift.

(g) In the case of newspaper work only, special arrangements may be made between the worker and any employer for distribution of the weekly working hours, to suit the requirements of any particular office: provided that no shift shall exceed ten (10) hours. The employer shall notify the Union of the arrangements so made. If the Union objects to such arrangements, they may notify this Board of their objection and this Board shall hear the objection and fix the working hours.

(h) If a daily paper is printed, any party to this Award may apply to the Court for an order varying the Award to meet the altered conditions created by the printing of such daily newspaper. The Court may remit such application to this Board for report.

(i) A notice setting out the daily working hours of each office shall be conspicuously displayed in the workroom, and shall continue unchanged until seven (7) days' notice of intention to change same shall have been given by the employer.

## 3.—Wages.

(a) The minimum weekly wage shall be at the rate of:—

Provided that, if, during the currency of this Award, the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration makes an Order reducing the rates of wages now prescribed in the present Award of that Court relating to workers employed

in the same industry to which this Award relates, within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth, then such reduction shall be similarly applied during the currency of such Order to the rates of all wages prescribed by this Award.

(b) Districts shall be classified as under :—

"A" Grade :—Albany, Bunbury, Geraldton, and Northam. Provided, notwithstanding the above grading that, where three issues of a newspaper, or three or more registered publications are printed at the one office, the wages to be paid in such office shall not be less than those prescribed for "A" grade.

"B" Grade :—Beverley, Bridgetown, Collie, Katanning, Narrogin, Wagin, and York. Provided, notwithstanding the above grading that, where two issues of a newspaper, or two or more registered publications are printed at the one office, the wages to be paid in such office shall be not less than those prescribed for "B" grade.

"C" Grade :—All places not previously mentioned, and it is further provided that, in the case of such offices as Beverley, where no motor power is used, they shall be ranged, for the purposes of wages, in "C" grade.

(c) A journeyman in charge of or directing the work of another journeyman shall be paid five shillings (5s.) per week above the minimum rate.

(d) Where the construction of the building is such that the worker is obliged to work in artificial light, he shall be paid five per centum (5%) increase on the rates hereinbefore prescribed during the time he is so engaged. Provided that this provision shall not apply during the time overtime rate applies, nor to occasions upon which dullness of natural light through weather conditions makes artificial light necessary.

(e) Workers employed wholly on night work shall be paid twenty shillings (20s.) per week in addition to the above rates.

(f) "Casual workers" shall be paid two shillings (2s.) per day in addition to the proportionate amount of the weekly wage.

(g) No worker (other than a female worker) shall be entitled to be paid by his employer for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for more than one half-day for each completed month of service. Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year.

(h) If a worker be called upon to work in a higher grade for more than one hour in any one day, he shall be entitled to be paid at the higher rate for a minimum of four (4) hours.

#### 4.—Overtime.

(a) Overtime shall be paid at the rate of time and one-third for the first two hours, time and one-half for the next two hours, and double time thereafter.

(b) Work performed on Saturday after 12 noon (except on Saturday evening newspapers, in which case another regular half holiday shall be substituted), or on Sundays shall be paid for at double time rate.

#### 5.—Holidays.

(a) Each worker shall be entitled to fourteen (14) days as holidays on full pay in each year ; six (6) of which days shall be consecutive.

The following shall be holidays which, if any work is done thereon, another day must be added in lieu thereof to the annual leave, namely, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

(b) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such holidays are not equal to the holidays given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on holidays on full pay.

(c) This clause shall also apply to apprentices and female workers.

(d) Any worker who is dismissed from his employment for misconduct or dereliction of duty, or who illegally severs his contract of service, shall forfeit all rights under the holiday clause.

(e) Holiday pay shall not accrue during a worker's absence from his or her employment for any cause whatever.

#### 6.—Minimum of Casual Employment.

In offices where men are employed casually as work arises, no man shall be paid for less than four hours in any one day ; that is to say, for any time worked less than four hours the worker shall be paid as for four hours' work, and if such worker is required to work after the usual hour of closing he shall be paid at overtime rate. Casuals discharged before the usual pay day shall be paid what is due at such time as their services are dispensed with.

#### 7.—Notice of Termination of Employment.

(a) Any journeyman having been employed for three (3) consecutive months in any office shall be entitled to one week's notice that his services are to be dispensed with.

(b) Any such journeyman leaving his employment shall likewise give his employer one week's notice.

(c) Any journeyman, other than a casual worker, employed by an employer for less than three (3) months shall be entitled to receive from his employer (or give to his employer) one day's notice of termination of his service. Such journeyman shall not, however, be paid other than ordinary rates of wages.

(d) Notice may be given at any time.

#### 8.—Lower Rate Workers.

Any worker who is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser rate of pay as may be agreed upon in writing (from time to time) between the Union and the employer, and in default of such agreement within twenty-four hours after such worker shall have applied in writing to the secretary of the Union stating his desire that such wage shall be agreed upon, such wage shall be fixed by the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate, upon the application of such worker after twenty-four hours' notice in writing shall have been given by him to the said secretary, who shall, if he so desires, be heard by such Magistrate and upon such application. After having given notice to the secretary, and after lodging the application mentioned, and pending the Magistrate's decision thereon, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate. The determination of the Magistrate shall have effect for the period of six (6) calendar months from the date thereof, and after the expiration of the said period until the wage shall have been again fixed at the instance of the said secretary in the manner prescribed. The said secretary may by writing under his hand appoint a substitute or agent to represent the Union at the hearing of the application before the Magistrate.

#### 9.—Record Book.

Each employer shall keep at his office, or at each of them, if more than one, a book containing a record of :—

(a) the names of all workers employed by him at such office, and to whom this Award applies ; and

(b) the class of work performed, the hours worked (including overtime), and the wages paid to each such worker.

The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the posting up weekly of such book.

Such book may be inspected at any reasonable time during ordinary business hours by the secretary for the time being of the workers' or employers' Union (if any) and also by any person thereunto authorised by the President of the Court of Arbitration.

#### 10.—Classes of Labour.

(a) Only four (4) classes of labour—journeymen, apprentices, feeders, and females—shall be employed in any branch of the industry.

(b) Feeders shall only be employed where the proportion of apprentices for letterpress machinists allowed by this Award is not availed of by the employer ; provided that this limitation shall not apply to feeders already employed as such at the date of this Award.

(c) Feeders shall be not less than sixteen (16) years of age and shall be paid the following rates :

Thereafter, £3 10s. 0d. per week until they reach the age of twenty-one (21) years, when they shall be paid the minimum wage provided for a journeyman in this Award.

(d) Feeders, upon being engaged, may be required to produce to the employer a certificate containing the particulars specified in Clause 12 (d) of this Award.

#### 11.—Machine Operating.

(a) Compositors may be engaged to learn to operate the linotype machine and shall be paid the hand compositor's rate of wages and serve a probationary period of twelve (12) months. Such compositor must be able at the end of the first three months of probationary period to set and correct at a speed of at least 4,000 cns per hour ; at the end of six

months at least 5,000 ems per hour : at the end of nine months at least 6,000 ems per hour : and at the end of twelve months at least 7,000 ems per hour, which shall be the limit of the probationary period. When a compositor having served the probationary period of twelve months is able to set and correct an average of 7,000 ems per hour based on 7-point matrices, 13 ems measure, he shall be deemed a proficient lino-operator ; the matter to be solid. The test of the operator's proficiency to be his ability to set any of the above numbers at the period stated as tests for a full day on fair copy, and to approximately maintain those averages. Each employer may adopt the usual means of accurately testing the proficiency of a probationer.

(b) An operator temporarily required to go on hand work shall be paid the machine time rate. No operator shall be "permanently" changed from machine to hand work without receiving notice in similar terms to that prescribed by Clause 7 of this Award.

#### 12.—Female Workers.

(a) Female labour shall be restricted to such work as folding, collating, numbering, quarter-binding, perforating, paging, sewing.

(b) Female workers shall not be required to "wash-up," clean, or adjust printing machines.

(c) In no case shall overtime be made a set-off against time lost.

(d) Junior female workers, upon being engaged, shall, if required, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars :—

- (1) Name in full.
- (2) Age and date of birth.
- (3) Name of each previous employer.
- (4) Length of service with each previous employer.
- (5) Class of work performed for each previous employer.

Such of the above particulars as are within the knowledge of an employer shall be endorsed on the certificate and signed by the employer upon request by the worker.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay, in the event of the length of service with a previous employer being incorrectly stated in the certificate.

(e) Absence from employment on account of illness :— No female worker shall be entitled to be paid by her employer for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for more than one day for each month of completed service. Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to twelve days in each calendar year.

#### 13.—Interpretations.

When used in this Award :—

"Permanently employed" shall mean having been fully employed for a period of three (3) months.

"Journeyman" shall mean a man who has served an apprenticeship of not less than five (5) years, or who is capable of earning and is being paid the minimum rate set out herein for his class of work.

"Casual employee" shall mean a worker engaged for less than a full week.

#### 14.—Apprentices.

(a) Apprentices shall be allowed to any one of the following branches of the printing trade :—(1) Composing ; (2) Letter press machining.

(b) Before completing the probationary period provided under the Arbitration Act the probationer shall submit himself to an eyesight test and obtain a certificate of his fitness to be apprenticed to the trade, and a copy of such certificate shall be attached to the notice of registration of apprenticeship.

(c) An apprentice shall not commence work on a type-setting machine until he has completed the third year of his apprenticeship and has reached the age of eighteen (18) years. Should he be put on the machine during his fifth year he shall be given at least four (4) hours' practice a day and shall be paid at least ten shillings (10s.) per week in addition to the wages prescribed for an apprentice. An apprentice shall not be fully employed on a machine to the exclusion of a permanent operator.

(d) The maximum number of apprentices allowed to any employer shall be one (1) to every four (4) or fraction of four (not being less than one) journeymen employed by him in each branch of the printing trade.

(e) The wages payable to apprentices shall be as follows :—

(f) The apprenticeship regulations in the Schedule annexed hereto shall be incorporated in and form part of this Award.

#### SCHEDULE.

##### *Apprenticeship Regulations.*

1. No minor shall (except as a junior worker, under the provisions of this Award) be employed or engaged in the industry except subject to the conditions of apprenticeship or probationership herein contained.

2. For the purposes of these Regulations a minor means a person not less than fourteen years of age and not more than eighteen years of age who customarily works under the direction of or in association with an employer, master, or journeyman upon the material and with the tools or implements used in the industry.

3. Every apprentice shall be employed on probation for a period of three months to determine his fitness or otherwise for apprenticeship, and shall work only for such hours per day and for such remuneration as may be prescribed by the Award. In the event of his becoming an apprentice, such probationary period shall be counted as part of the term of apprenticeship.

4. An employer shall be deemed to undertake the duty which he agrees to perform as a duty enforceable under an Award of the Court.

5. A Board, to be called "The Advisory Committee," may be appointed by the Court to advise in regard to any apprenticeship matter. Such committee shall consist of the following :—

(a) Some person appointed by the Court, who shall act as chairman ;

(b) Two representatives appointed by the employers ;

(c) Two representatives appointed by the industrial union or unions of employees in the trade.

The Advisory Committee shall have such powers and duties as the Court in each case may determine.

6. (i.) No employer shall refuse employment to any person, or dismiss any employee from his employment, or injure him in his employment, or alter his position to his prejudice, by reason merely of the fact that the employee is a member of any Advisory Committee, or by reason merely of anything said or done or omitted to be done by any such person or employee in the course of his duty as such member.

(ii.) In any proceeding for any contravention of this Regulation it shall lie upon the employer to show that any person proved to have been refused employment, or any employee proved to have been dismissed or injured in his employment or prejudiced whilst acting as such member, was refused employment or dismissed or injured in his employment or prejudiced for some reason other than that mentioned in this Regulation.



7. (a) Any employer taking an apprentice on probation shall within 14 days thereafter register such probationer by giving notice thereof to the Registrar in the prescribed form. If at the date of the coming into operation of these Regulations an employer is employing any apprentice or probationer who has not been duly registered as such, he shall forthwith apply for the due registration of such apprentice or probationer.

(b) At the end of the period of probation of each apprentice, if mutually agreed upon by the employer and the legal guardian of the boy, but not otherwise, he may become an apprentice under an agreement.

(c) The Court may in any case, where it seems expedient to do so, order that the probationary period of employment be extended for a further period not exceeding three months.

(d) The apprenticeship agreement shall be completed within one month of the termination of the probationary period.

(e) All agreements of apprenticeship shall be drawn up on a form approved by the Court, and signed by the employer, the legal guardian of the apprentice, the apprentice, and the Registrar. No employer, guardian or apprentice shall enter into any agreement or undertaking purporting to add to, vary, alter or amend any such agreement without the approval of the Court.

(f) There shall be three copies of each agreement, of which one copy shall be held by the employer, one shall be held by the legal guardian of the apprentice, and one copy shall be retained by the Registrar.

(g) The Court shall have power to transfer an apprentice from one employer to another, either temporarily or permanently—

(i) if the employer does not provide the necessary facilities for the apprentice to become proficient in his trade; or

(ii) upon the application of the employer or the apprentice, for good cause shown.

(h) The transfer of every agreement shall be on a form approved by the Court, and shall be made out in quadruplicate, and shall, unless the Court otherwise directs, be signed by the late employer or his assigns, the legal guardian of the apprentice, the apprentice, the Registrar, and the new employer. The transfer form shall be completed within two months of the date on which the transfer is effected.

(i) There shall be four copies of the form of transfer, of which one copy shall be held by the late employer, one shall be held by the new employer, one shall be held by the legal guardian of the apprentice, and one shall be retained by the Registrar.

(j) Every agreement of apprenticeship shall be subject to the provisions of the Award in force for the time being applicable to apprenticeship in the industry.

8. The employer of every apprentice shall keep him constantly at work and teach such apprentice or cause him to be taught the industry, craft, occupation, or calling in relation to which he is bound apprentice, by competent instruction in a gradual and complete manner, and shall give such apprentice a reasonable opportunity to learn the same, and receive, during the period of his apprenticeship, such technical, trade, and general instruction and training as may be necessary. And every apprentice shall, during the period of his apprenticeship, faithfully serve his employer for the purpose of being taught the industry, craft, occupation, or calling in relation to which he is bound, and shall also conscientiously and regularly accept such technical, trade, and general instruction and training as aforesaid, in addition to the teaching that may be provided by his employer.

9. Every agreement entered into by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice shall be for a period of five years, but this period may be reduced in special circumstances with the approval of the court.

10. Every agreement of apprenticeship entered into shall contain—

(a) the names and addresses of the parties to the agreement;

(b) the date of birth of the apprentice;

(c) a description of the industry, craft, occupation, or calling or combination thereof to which the apprentice is to be bound;

(d) the date at which the apprenticeship is to commence and the period of apprenticeship;

(e) a condition requiring the apprentice to obey all reasonable directions of the employer and requiring the employer and apprentice to comply with the terms of the Industrial Award so far as they concern the apprentice;

(f) a condition that technical instruction of the apprentice, when available, shall be at the employer's expense, and shall be in the employer's time, except in places where such instruction is given after the ordinary working hours;

(g) a condition that, in the event of any apprentice, in the opinion of the examiners, not progressing satisfactorily, increased time for technical instruction shall be allowed at the employer's expense to enable such apprentice to reach the necessary standard;

(h) the general conditions of apprenticeship.

11. Where in any case it is reported to the Court that any employer or group of employers has not in his or their employ the number of apprentices in proportion to the journeymen employed equal to the proportion allowed or required by the Award, the Court may make such investigation and order as it may deem necessary to ensure that each employer or group of employers shall employ and train a specified minimum number of apprentices.

12. Should an employer at any time before the determination of the period of apprenticeship desire to dispense with the service of the apprentice he may, with the consent of the apprentice and guardian, transfer him to another employer carrying on business within a reasonable distance of the original employer's place of business, willing to continue to teach the apprentice and pay the rate of wages prescribed by the Court in its Award or otherwise according to the total length of time served, and generally to perform the obligations of the original employer.

13. (a) Every agreement shall include a provision that it may be cancelled, by mutual consent, by the employer and the legal guardian of the apprentice giving one month's notice in writing to the Court and to the parties concerned that such apprenticeship shall be terminated.

(b) If the apprentice shall at any time during the said term be wilfully disobedient to the lawful orders of the employer, his managers, foremen, or other servants having authority over the apprentice, or be slothful, or negligent, or dishonest, or shall otherwise grossly misbehave himself, or shall not conduct himself as a good and faithful apprentice should do, or shall not faithfully observe and keep his part of his agreement, then it shall be lawful for the employer, with the consent of the Court, to discharge the apprentice from his service.

(c) The Court may in its discretion for any cause which it may deem sufficient, on the application of any party to an apprenticeship agreement, vary or cancel the agreement, either unconditionally or subject to such terms and conditions as it may deem advisable.

14. On the transfer or termination of any apprenticeship, from whatever cause, the employer shall give the apprentice a certificate stating what time he has served, full particulars of the branches of the trade or industry in which he has received instruction, the proficiency attained, and shall also notify the clerk of the Court, and the cause thereof.

15. No apprentice employed under a registered agreement shall be discharged by the employer for alleged misconduct until the registration of the agreement of apprenticeship has been cancelled by order of the Court on the application of the employer.

Provided, however, that an apprentice may be suspended for misconduct by the employer, but in any such case the employer shall forthwith make an application for cancellation of the agreement of apprenticeship, and, in the event of the Court refusing same, the wages of the apprentice, or such portion thereof (if any) as the Court may order shall be paid as from the date of such suspension, and, in the event of the application for cancellation being granted, such order may take effect from the date when the apprentice was suspended.

16. When an apprentice cannot be usefully employed because of a strike the employer shall be relieved of his obligations under the apprenticeship agreement during the period of the strike.

17. Subject to Regulation 23, time lost by the apprentice through sickness or any other cause whatso-

ever may, with the consent of the Court on the application of any party, be added to the original term in the apprenticeship agreement.

18. In the event of an employer being unable to provide work for the apprentice or to mutually agree with the legal guardian of the apprentice to cancel the agreement or to arrange a transfer, application may be made to the Court to arrange for such transfer or to have such agreement cancelled.

19. Where in any case an employer is temporarily unable to provide work to employ an apprentice for his full time, application may be made by the employer to the Court for permission to employ the apprentice for such lesser time per week or per month, and at such remuneration as the Court may determine, being not less than the proportionate amount of the rate of wages prescribed by the industrial Award for the trade, calling, or industry. If the Court grants the application, holidays will be reduced pro rata.

20. Where in any case the Court is of opinion that the number of apprentices being trained is insufficient to meet the requirements of the industry in the matter of skilled artisans, the Court may make such investigation and order as it may be deemed necessary to permit or require any employer to employ such further number of apprentices as may be directed. Notice of such order shall be given to the parties to this Award.

21. (a) Every apprentice shall attend a Government or other approved technical school, vocational classes, or classes of instruction, for instruction in such subjects as are provided for his trade. This clause shall be deemed to have been complied with if the apprentice takes a course in an approved Correspondence School. Provided, however, that attendances shall not be compulsory when the apprentice is resident outside a radius of 12 miles from the place where instruction is given. Provided also, that if technical instruction is not available in the locality in which the apprentice is employed and is available by correspondence, at reasonable cost to be approved by the Court, the Court may prescribe such correspondence course as the technical instruction to be taken by the apprentice and paid for by the employer.

(b) The fees for the classes attended by the apprentice shall be paid by the employer.

(c) The period during which apprentices are to attend such technical school or classes, if any, shall be four hours per week.

(d) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination at the places and times which may be prescribed by the Court.

(e) Every apprentice shall, prior to submitting himself to examination, produce to the examiners a certificate that he has made at least 70 per centum of attendances at the technical school or other place of instruction, unless he is exempted from such attendance for good cause.

(f) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the examiners of the names and addresses of the apprentices required to submit themselves to examination.

(g) The employer shall place at the disposal of the examiners such material and machinery on his premises as may be required by them and shall in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examination.

(h) The Board of Examiners shall consist of persons skilled in the industry. It shall comprise equal numbers of representatives nominated by the employers and workers in the particular trade. Failing such nomination or nominations the Court may appoint such person or persons as it may deem fit. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners, the matter in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them or nominated by the Court or the President, at the request of any of the examiners, and the decision of such person shall be final and conclusive.

(i) It shall be the duty of the examiners to examine the work, require the production of the certificate of attendance, inquire into the diligence of each apprentice, and as to the opportunities provided by the employer for each apprentice to learn, and to submit a report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination within one month from the date of holding the examination, but this period may be extended by the Court.

(j) Such examination shall, where possible, include theory and practice as applied to the trade, industry,

craft, occupation, or calling to which the apprentice is indentured.

(k) The Registrar shall, after each examination, issue a certificate to each apprentice, indicating his degree of proficiency, taking into consideration the term of apprenticeship served. A duplicate of such certificate shall be lodged by each apprentice with his employer and the Secretary of the Union, each of whom shall keep the same in safe custody, and produce the same for inspection by the Industrial Inspector whenever demanded by the latter to do so. When the final examination has been passed the certificate shall also be signed by the examiners.

(l) Where in any case it is shown to the satisfaction of the Court that any apprentice, by reason of his engagement on country work or other good cause, cannot conveniently attend a technical school or other prescribed classes, such of these Regulations as relate to attendance at a technical school or other prescribed classes, and to examinations, shall not apply to such apprentice, but he shall be subject to such conditions as the Court may direct.

(m) The examiners shall each be entitled to the following fees, namely:—

For every five, or fraction of five, apprentices examined—One guinea, with a minimum fee of two guineas.

In addition to the foregoing fees, where examiners, in the performance of their duties as such, are required to travel, they will be entitled to reimbursement of all fares and necessary expenses actually incurred.

(n) Whenever it is possible so to do, the examiners, before entering upon the examination following the issue of these Regulations, shall draw up a syllabus showing what, in their opinion, is the stage of proficiency which an apprentice should attain at each of the examinations prescribed. The syllabus shall be subject to review by the Court at any time, and shall be kept as a record by the Clerk of the Court and a copy handed to the examiners before each examination. The said syllabus may be subject to alteration from time to time by the examiners, who shall forthwith notify the Clerk of the Court thereof.

22. The employer shall pay the apprentice for all time lost through sickness or the holidays prescribed by this Award: Provided—

(a) payment for such sickness shall not exceed a total of one month in each year;

(b) where the time lost through sickness exceeds four consecutive working days, the employer may demand from the apprentice the production of a medical certificate, and a further certificate or certificates may be required if any time is lost through sickness within seven days from the date of resumption of duty, the cost, if any, of such certificate or certificates, not exceeding 5s., to be borne by the employer;

(c) an apprentice shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident or sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

23. The employer shall pay the apprentice, in respect of time lost through compulsory military or naval training, the amount by which the wages prescribed by the industrial Award for the trade, calling, craft, occupation, or industry exceeds the amount received by the apprentice from the Department of Defence: Provided, however, that this clause shall not apply to military or naval training imposed through failure to attend compulsory parades.

All time lost by reason of compulsory military or naval training, other than the additional training mentioned in the above proviso, shall count as part of the apprenticeship.

24. When an apprentice attends a technical school, vocational classes, or other class or classes of instruction during his ordinary working hours, where such is prescribed, the time so occupied shall be regarded as part of the term of his apprenticeship, and the employer shall not be entitled to make any deduction from the wages of the apprentice for such time.

25. If the examiners or the industrial Union or employer concerned make representations to the Court that the facilities provided by the Technical School or other place of vocational training for the teaching of apprentices are inadequate, the Court may make such investigations and such report to the Minister controlling such Technical School or such other place as it deems necessary.

26. (1.) The term of apprenticeship may be extended by the Court on the failure of an apprentice to pass any of the examinations, and for such purpose it shall be the duty of the examiners to make any necessary recommendation to the Court. Any extension of the term of apprenticeship shall be subject to all the conditions and stipulations in the original agreement, except as to rates of wages, which shall be such amount as the Court may determine.

(2.) Upon the failure of an apprentice to pass two consecutive examinations, it shall be the duty of the examiners to report same to the Court, with a recommendation as to the cancellation of the apprenticeship agreement, or such other remedial measures (*i.e.*, increased time for technical instruction) as they may deem advisable. The Court, after notice to all parties concerned, may cancel the agreement or make such other order in the circumstances as it may deem necessary.

27. When an apprentice is absent from work for any cause other than sickness, or in pursuance of the provisions of these Regulations, the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wages of the apprentice an amount proportionate to the time so lost.

28. Upon the completion of the period of training prescribed for apprenticeship, each apprentice shall be required to pass the final examination test to the satisfaction of the examiners, and upon passing this test shall be provided with a certificate to that effect by the Registrar.

29. The Registrar shall prepare and keep a roll of apprentices containing—

- (a) a record of all apprentices and probationers placed with employers;
- (b) a record of all employers with whom apprentices are placed;
- (c) a record of the progress of each apprentice, recording the result of the examiners' reports;
- (d) any other particulars the Court may direct.

These records shall be open for inspection by the employers and the Union upon request.

30. For the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices allowed to be taken at any time, the average number of journeymen employed on all working days of the twelve months immediately preceding such time shall be deemed to be the number of journeymen employed. Where the employer is himself a journeyman regularly and usually working at the trade, he shall be counted as a journeyman for the purpose of computing the number of apprentices allowed: Provided that this clause shall not apply to any business which has been established for less than twelve months, in which case the method of calculation of the proportion of apprentices to be permitted shall be determined by the Court.

31. Every industrial inspector appointed in pursuance of the provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," shall have the power to enter any premises, make such inspection of the premises, plant, machinery, or work upon which any apprentice is employed or could be employed, interview any apprentice or employee, examine any books or documents of the business relating to the wages and conditions of apprentices, interrogate the employer in regard to any of the above-mentioned matters.

32. With a view to determining whether the number of apprentices being trained is sufficient to meet the future requirements of the industry in the matter of skilled artisans, the Registrar may require any employer to furnish him with any specified information relating to the said industry, or relating to the employees engaged therein.

33. "Apprentice" means any male person of any age who is apprenticed to learn or to be taught any industry, trade, craft, or calling to which these Regulations apply, and includes an apprentice on probation.
