WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Vermin Act, 1918," "Vermin" means and includes any animal or means and includes any animal or bird mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act, and such other animals or birds the names of which the Governor may by Proclamation add to the said Sche-dule; and whereas the name "Emus" was added to the said Schedule by Proclamation dated the 12th day of May, 1926, but wherein the addition of such name was restricted in its operation to the Districts therein set out; and whereas it is desirable that Emus shall be declared vermin within the boundaries of the Nungarin Vermin District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of all other owers herein in that behalf enabling, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare Emus to be vermin within the boundaries of the aforesaid Nungarin Vermin District for the purposes of the said Act.

WHEREAS by Section 39 of "The Aborigines Act, 1905," the Governor may by Proclamation, whenever in the interests of the aborigines he thinks fit, declare any Municipal District or Town or any other place to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for aborigines or half-castes not in lawful employment to be or re-main: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the land sur-rounding Reserve 16833 (Aborigines), more particu-larly described in the Schedule hereto, to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for aborigines or halfcastes not in lawful employment to be or remain.

Schedule.

Starting from a point on the Western side of the Midland Railway Reserve near the 80-mile Peg situate East of the North-East corner of Melbourne Location 1292 and extending Westward to and along the North boundary of said location and onward to and along the South boundary of Melbourne Location 940 to a point situate North of the North-West corner of Mel-bourne Location 3103; thence Southward to and along the West boundary of the latter location and onward to a point situate West of the South-West corner of Swan Location 2464; thence Eastward to and along the South boundary of the latter location and onward, passing along the North boundary of Swan Location 701 (Kurra Spring) to the Western side of the Midland Railway Reserve aforesaid; and thence Northward along same to the starting point.

defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets for a term of twelve months as from the 1st day of September, 1932.

Vermin Act, 1918.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Vermin Act, 1918," the Governor is empowered to make, repeal, and alter Regulations for carrying this Act into effect: And whereas the Governor, acting under the said Act, made certain Regulations which were duly published in the Government Gazette on the 30th day of January, 1931: And whereas it is now deemed expedient to repeal Regulation 91 of the said Regulations and to make a new Regulation 91 in lieu thereof, as hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby repeal Regulation 91 of the said Regulations made and published in the Government Gazette on the 30th day of January, 1931, and doth hereby, in lieu thereof, make a new Regulation 91, to operate as from the date of the publication of this Order in Council in the *Government Gazette* as follows:-

91. Subject as hereinafter provided, the uniform bonuses payable throughout the State for the destruction of wild dogs, foxes, and wedge-tailed eagles pursuant to Subsection (3) of Section 100 of "The Vermin Act, 1918," shall be as follows :-

- (a) For every adult wild dog destroyed-Thirty shillings.
- (b) For every wild dog pup destroyed-Ten shillings.
- (c) For every adult fox destroyed-Seven shillings and sixpence.
- (d) For every fox cub destroyed-Two shillings.
- (e) For every wedge-tailed eagle destroyed-Two shillings and sixpence.

Provided that, where any claim for any uniform bonus has been made to a Vermin Board and such Vermin Board prior to this Regulation coming into operation shall pursuant to Regulation 93A of these Regulations

have paid to the claimant uniform bonus at the rate prescribed under the Regulation 91 heretofore in operation, then, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Regulation contained, but subject otherwise to these Regulations, such Vermin Board shall be entitled under the suid Regulation 93A to receive a refund from the Chief Inspector of the actual amount of the said uniform bonus so paid by the board as aforesaid.

Keeping of Horses, Cows, Sheep, and Goats.(a) The occupier of any premises shall not allow any horse, cow, sheep, or goat to be loose in any paddock, yard, or other place forming portion of such premises. and the owner of any yard, paddock, or other place shall not allow any horse, cow, sheep, or goat to be loose in any such yard, paddock, or place unless and until due provision is made to prevent such horse, cow, sheep, or goat from approaching to within twenty feet of any dwelling or within twenty-five feet of any shop, factory, bakery, or other place where food is manufactured, stored, or exposed for sale.

(b) The occupier of any premises to which any such yard, paddock, or other place is appurtenant, and in which yard, paddock, or other place any horse, cow, sheep, or goat is kept, and where such yard, paddock, or other place is not appurtenant to any premises, then the owner thereof shall at all times maintain the same in a clean state and condition and shall provide a re-ceptacle of brick, iron, or other impervious material with a close fitting cover in such yard, paddock, or place, and shall once at least in each day cause all droppings from such horse, cow, sheep, or goat to be cleaned up from such yard, paddock, or place and deposited in such receptacle, and shall at all times, save when in actual use, cause the said receptacle to be covered with such tight-fitting cover, and shall cause such receptacle to be emptied once in each week or oftener if required by the inspector, and shall, after each emptying, cause such receptacle to be cleaned out, and shall take such precautions against allowing the breeding of flies as the inspector shall from time to time direct.
