The Water Boards Act, 1904, and Amendments.

Harvey Water Area.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 38/27.

WHEREAS by "The Water Boards Act, 1904," the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to constitute the District of a Local Authority or two or more Local Authorities, or any part or parts of such District or Districts, a Water Area, under such name as may be directed: And whereas the Governor is empowered to appoint a Local Authority whose District or a part of whose District is within the Water Area to be the Water Board: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby constitute a Water Area, having the boundaries described in the Schedule hereto, for the purposes of the said Act, under the name of the Harvey Water Area, and do hereby appoint the Harvey Road Board to be the Water Board under the name of the Harvey Water Board.

This Order in Council shall take effect on the first day of September, 1932.

Bounded by a line commencing at the junction of Baker Street and Roy Street and proceeding in a Westerly direction along the Northern boundary of Roy Street to the boundary of Lot 4 in Roy Street; thence Northerly along the Eastern boundaries of Lots 4, 5, and 6 and Westerly along the Northern boundary of the said Lot 6, across Young Street and Southerly along the Western boundary of Young Street to and along the Southern boundary of Lot 12; thence along the Southern boundary of Lot 13, across Third Street and Southerly along Third Street to the boundary of Lot 33; thence Westerly along the Northern boundaries of Lots 33, 36, and 37 to Fourth Street; thence Southerly along the Eastern boundary of Fourth Street to and across Uduc Road; thence South-Easterly along the Southern boundary of Uduc Road to and along the Western boundary of Lot 1; thence North-Westerly, Westerly, and Southerly along the boundaries of Lot 12 to the South-West corner of Lot 19; thence along the Southern boundaries of Lot 19 and Peet Street to its junction with Young Street; thence Southerly along the Western boundary of Young Street to a point opposite to the prolongation Westwards of the Southern boundary of Lot 17; thence Easterly crossing Young Street, and continuing along the Southern boundaries of Lots 17 and 16 to Haywood Street and North-Easterly along the Western boundary of Haywood Street to the South-East corner of Lot 32; thence Easterly, crossing Haywood Street, the South-Western Railway and Hacket Road and continuing along the Northern boundary of Buckby Road, across Kidson Street and along the Southern boundaries of Lots 16, 17, and 18 to the South-East corner of Lot 18; thence Northerly along the Eastern boundaries of Lots 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, and 1 to Uduc Road; thence Easterly along the Southern boundary of Uduc Road to the Western boundary of Lot 23; thence Southerly and Easterly along the boundaries of Lot 23 and Northerly along the Western boundary of the Perth-Bunbury Road to its intersection with Uduc Road; thence Easterly across the Perth-Bunbury Road and along Southern boundary of the Uduc Road and along the Pipe Line to the Headworks, a distance of approximately 2½ miles; thence returning along the Pipe Line and the Northern boundary of the Uduc Road to its junction with the Western boundary of Baker Street; thence Northerly along the said Western boundary of Baker Street to the point of commencement; all as shown in green on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 27152.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1732/31.

WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—(a) the Governor shall

cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation; (b) after such proposal has been laid before Parliament, the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication: And whereas His Excellency the Administrator did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the Seventeenth day of November, 1931, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest: And whereas, after such proposal had been laid before Parliament, a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forests Nos. 22 and 25 by excluding those portions of such State Forests as are described in the Schedule hereto.

Fremantle Municipal Tramways and Electric Lighting Act, 1903, and Electric Lighting Act, 1892.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. P.W. 613/32.

WHEREAS by "The Fremantle Municipal Tramways and Electric Lighting Act, 1903," it is, amongst other things, enacted that, in connection with the undertakings and works thereby authorised for supplying electricity for motive or lighting purposes to streets, houses, and buildings in the Municipalities of Fremantle and East Fremantle, and the carrying on of the undertaking when completed, the provisions of "The Electric Lighting Act, 1892," shall, so far as they are applicable and not repugnant to the provisions therein contained, apply as if the same had been re-enacted therein and in terms made applicable to "The Fremantle Municipal Tramways and Electric Lighting Act, 1903," and for such purposes the Board mentioned in the last-mentioned Act should be deemed to be "Undertakers" within the meaning of "The Electric Lighting Act, 1892": And whereas, by Section 7 of "The Electric Lighting Act, 1892," it is also enacted that Undertakers as defined thereby should also be subject to such regulations and conditions as might from time to time be prescribed by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette* with regard to the matters therein mentioned: And whereas, pursuant to the provisions of the said Section (7) of "The Electric Lighting Act, 1892," and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Governor in Council made and caused to be published in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia on the 18th day of August, 1905, Regulations and conditions restricted to the Municipalities of Fremantle and East Fremantle; And whereas it is desirable that the said Regulations and conditions so gazetted as aforesaid should be repealed and the Regulations hereinafter contained should be made and prescribed: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Administrator, acting with advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred upon him in that behalf, doth hereby repeal the whole of the before-mentioned Regulations so prescribed and published in the *Government Gazette* of Western Australia on the 18th day of August, 1905, and doth hereby make and prescribe in lieu of the said Regulations now repealed as aforesaid the following Regulations and conditions, to be restricted to the Municipalities of Fremantle and East Fremantle.

THE FREMANTLE MUNICIPAL TRAMWAYS
AND ELECTRIC LIGHTING BOARD.

Electricity Supply Department.

Service Rules and Regulations for the Supply of Electricity.

The word "Board" shall have the same meaning as in "The Fremantle Municipal Tramways and Electric Lighting Act, 1903."

The word "Consumer" shall mean and include every owner or occupier of the premises which are or are about to be supplied with electricity by the Board.

The word "Owner" shall have the same meaning as in "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1900," and any statutory modification thereof.

"Regulations" shall mean and include regulations and conditions.

"Wiring" or "Installation" or "Apparatus" shall mean and include all conductors, wires, or other plant, apparatus, and appliances whatsoever to be used in supplying electricity for the production of light or for motive power or for heating, cooking, or other purposes, and shall also mean and include the supply and fixing in position of all such conductors, wires, apparatus, plant, and appliances.

Words importing the singular number shall be taken to include the plural number. Words importing the plural number shall be taken to include the singular number. Words importing the masculine gender shall be taken to include the feminine gender.

1. Application for Connection.—Application for service connection must be made on the form provided, which must be signed by the applicant, or some person duly authorised by him. The making of the application or the paying of a deposit shall not bind the Board to give supply until the application has been approved by or on behalf of the Board. The Board will make every effort to make early connection and give supply as soon as possible after an application has been approved and the necessary installation has been completed by the consumer to the satisfaction of the Board, but shall not be responsible for any delay occasioned in so doing arising from any cause whatsoever.

2. Security.—The Board may require a security deposit from each consumer, in such an amount as the Board may consider sufficient, with a minimum of 15s. Interest at five per cent. per annum (simple) will be allowed on deposits, provided that the deposit has been held for at least twelve months, and the consumer has not been in arrears in payment of accounts at any time and will be payable when the account is closed.

3. Accounts.—Accounts may be rendered weekly, monthly, or quarterly, at the option of the Board, and at the Board's ruling rates for the district in which the service is rendered, and must be paid on or before the date prescribed or appointed by the Board for payment thereof. If not paid at the Board's office by that date, the Board may cut off and discontinue the supply without further notice, and re-connection will not be made until the account, together with the fee prescribed in Clause 35 is paid.

4. System.—Electric current will be supplied, except where special arrangements may be made, from the Board's alternating current system at a frequency of 40 cycles. All lighting will be supplied at nominally 250 volts, single phase. Small motors up to 2 h.p. may also be supplied at nominally 250 volts, single phase. All motors over 2 h.p., except with the special written permission of the Board, must be connected to the nominal 440 volt 3-phase circuits.

5. Wiring of Installations.—All wiring of installations to be connected shall be in accordance with the Standards Association of Australia and the standard wiring rules of the Fire Underwriters' Association of Western Australia, and the requirements of the Department of Public Health and the Public Works Department for the time being in force, and no connections will be made without a certificate that the installation is in order and on such form as may be from time to time prescribed or required by the Board.

6. Additions to Installation.—When first connected the consumer shall supply the Board with full details of all apparatus connected or intended to be connected to the circuits. No additions of lamps, motors, cookers, radiators, fans, or other electrical apparatus, whether of a like or other description, shall be made until the Board has been notified of such intended addition and its consent has been obtained. The consumer shall be responsible for any damage to meters or other apparatus which may occur through failure to comply with or breach of this regulation, in addition to being liable to disconnection.

7. Position of Service Leads, Fuses, etc.—The Board will decide as to the most suitable positions for fuses, circuit breakers, indicators, meters, and termination of service leads. The position of service fuses will be as near as possible to the point where the mains touch the building but one in which they may be reached by a short ladder for replacing fuses. Service fuses shall be of approved type, and, unless weather proof, must have weather-proof protection. In addition the Board may

disconnect the supply, and same shall not be re-connected until any electrical apparatus connected or installed in breach of this regulation shall have been removed, connected, or installed, as the case may be, to the Board's satisfaction. A fee of 5s. shall be paid prior to reconnection by the consumer.

8. Consumer's Main Switch and Fuses.—The Board will define and fix the position where the meter board and meter shall be affixed, and shall at its own expense provide and fix the necessary meter board and meter, and to the point so fixed the consumer must bring his mains and provide on his side of the meter a main switch and fuses as follows:—

- (a) Double pole-linked shockproof switch and fuses for single-phase supply.
- (b) Three pole-linked switch and fuses for three-phase supply.
- (c) Four pole switch or equivalent and fuses for three-phase four-wire supply.

The Board shall not be bound to affix the meter board and meter or either of them to any building on the premises of or any particular position required by the consumer. The Board may in its discretion from time to time remove and alter the position of the meter board and meter or either of them to such other position or positions on or removed from any building or position on the premises of the consumer as the Board may in its discretion decide upon. The Board shall not be required to assign any reason for such removal or altering of position. Such alteration, unless required by the consumer and agreed to by the Board, shall be effected at the expense of the Board, but in all other cases at the expense of the consumer. In cases where the consumer's main switch and fuses are, with the consent of the Board, fixed on the supply side of the meter, they shall be iron-clad to the approval of the Board and suitable for sealing with the Board's seal.

9. Capacity of Main Switches.—The foregoing switches shall be of ample capacity and of a design approved from time to time by the Board. Sufficient length of wire shall, where the meter board and meter or either of them are affixed to any building on the consumer's premises, be left by the consumer to connect to the Board's meter. In all cases the line wires are at the left and the consumer's wires at the right of the meter.

10. Consumer's Terminals and Leads.—The point of termination of the Board's service leads shall be deemed to be the position of the consumer's terminals, which position, in the case of an overhead supply, shall be on the outside of the building (and is, in the case of connection with a building, hereinafter designated "point of entry") and shall be as high as convenient on the building or other position determined upon, but not higher than two stories of any building to which supply is being given, unless specially approved.

The consumer's leads shall be of sufficient length to allow of their ends being properly connected to the service conductors at the consumer's terminals. Loops shall be left in the leads for the insertion by the Board of its meters, service cutouts, or other apparatus, as the case may be.

At the point of entry to buildings the consumer's leads shall be provided with a suitable bell-mouthed bend or other approved terminal fitting of the water-shed type. No porcelain bushings will be permitted at any point where the mains or leads enter any building or other point of supply, and where the conduit passes through iron roofing or other earthed material it must be provided with rubber bushings of approved type and make.

11. Meters and Meter Boards:—

(a) The meter boards must be fixed in such position as is approved by the Board from time to time, protected from the weather, out-of-doors, or elsewhere accessible to the Board at all reasonable times.

(b) In large buildings all circuits must be brought to one or more central points, as may be arranged with the Board where the Board circuits will enter. The Board will not supply meters promiscuously throughout buildings.

(c) In cases where a building is let in single rooms or groups of offices or flats, the Board will only install one set of meters and supply current to the building as a whole, with the owner, landlord, or chief tenant, as the case may be, as the consumer.

(d) The Board will, if requested in such cases, supply to the owner, landlord, or chief tenant, as the case may be, at a rental to be fixed by the Board from time to time, all such meters as the Board may consider

necessary in its discretion for metering the supply to the various tenants or sub-tenants of any such building, and will if desired, without extra charge, read such meters at the same time as the master meters are read and supply the reading to the owner, landlord, or chief tenant, as the case may be; provided that the sub-meters are suitably grouped at the master meter position and a book is left at the meter for the insertion of readings. The chief tenant or sub-tenants of any such building shall only be charged by their immediate landlord for meter rents and for electricity consumed by them at rates allowing for discounts, not exceeding those respectively charged by the Board to the superior landlord.

12. Fixing of Leads in Fuses, Meters, etc.—Only an employee of the Board may insert the ends of the consumer's leads into any service fuse, meter, indicator, current limiter, or other device the property of the Board.

13. Board's Property.—The service mains and fuses, meters, and other apparatus supplied by the Board to any consumer shall remain the property of the Board.

14. Nature and Protection of Consumer's Leads.—The consumer's main switchboard shall be placed in a position approved by the Board. The conductors between the point of entry to any building and the consumer's main switch shall be of the best quality V.I.R. insulation, and without joints, shall be stranded cable of adequate sectional area, which in no case shall be less than that of a 7/0.36 inch cable. The cable must be enclosed in steel conduit, "Screwed if exposed to weather."

15. Board's Service Fuses.—The service fuses fixed by the Board, on the mains side of the meter, may or may not be sealed by the Board, but they shall not in any case be interfered with by the consumer, who must provide suitable fuses on the load side of the consumer's main switch.

16. Testing Insulation.—Before any installation is connected to the supply mains and before any alterations or additions to an installation are connected, they may be tested by the Board once free of charge. If defective, connection will not be made until the defect is remedied, and a minimum charge of 5s. will be made for the second test and 10s. each for any subsequent tests.

17. Service Connection.—The Board will run the overhead service wires to insulators attached to the outside of the consumer's premises at the point of entry, when the distance from the street in which the mains are located does not exceed 66 feet. Above that distance, or if special or underground cables are required, the cost will be charged to the consumer.

18. Conductors not to be Earthed.—No conductor in a consumer's installation shall be connected to earth, and all conductors shall be equally insulated, as provided in the wiring rules of the Standards Association of Australia.

No supply will be given to premises wired on the concentric system using an uninsulated "outer" conductor.

19. Separate Supplies for Lighting and Power.—Where it is required to provide for the separate metering of current supplied at different rates, the installation shall be divided into separate and distinct circuits, which must not be bunched, and all wall plugs, connectors, and the like shall be of such different types that it shall not be possible to connect apparatus chargeable at a certain rate to any part of the installation conveying current chargeable at a lower rate.

Frigidaire, etc.—Frigidaire and other similar apparatus operated by motors must not be connected to any circuit supplied at domestic heating and cooking rate, without the sanction of the Board in writing; all such apparatus must be inspected by the Board's officers, and a certificate of approval issued for each of such apparatus.

No lampholder shall be connected to any circuit, the supply to which is given at power or heating rates, except (as provided in the wiring rules of the Standards Association of Australia) in the case of pilot lamps, which, however, shall be fitted with miniature screw base sockets, and shall be so installed as to render it impossible to use them for general illuminating purposes.

20. Current used indirectly for Lighting.—Current used indirectly for lighting purposes by the interposition of motor generators, batteries and such like apparatus shall be chargeable at lighting rates.

21. Switches to be on non-earthed Conductors.—The ends of the non-earthed conductors to which all single pole switches must be connected in accordance with the Wiring Rules of the Standards Association of Australia shall be labelled "switchwire," in order that the Board may correctly connect the consumer's leads to the service leads.

22. Balancing Circuits.—Circuits must be arranged as follows:—

Circuits taking less than 15 amps may be taken off one phase (two wires);

Circuits taking more than 15 amps must be divided into two approximately equal circuits and taken off two phases (three wires);

Circuits taking more than 30 amps must be divided into three approximately equal parts and taken off three phases (four wires);

In all cases a separate linked switch must be provided on each supply;

Lighting load on one phase must not be balanced against the power load on another, unless lighting and power load are each less than 15 amps.

The Board must be consulted as the number of phases to be used.

All applications must state clearly the nature and number of the consuming devices and the current taken by each, such as:—

1. Number of amps and wattage of each;

2. Number of motors and horsepower of each;

3. Number of other current-consuming devices, radiators, toasters, kettles, ovens, cooking-ranges, vacuum cleaners, etc., and current rating of each.

23. Motors.—Motors up to 2 h.p. may be single phase, and, with special permission from the Board, larger single phase motors of approved type may be installed, but the Board reserves the right not to connect any single phase motor larger than 2 h.p.

All motors over 2 h.p. unless approved as above, must be three-phase.

24. Starting Current of A.C. Motors.—Motors shall be of such a type and provided with suitable starting gear, so that the maximum starting currents, as measured with locked rotor, shall not exceed the following:—

(a) Single phase 250 volts, motors up to and including 2 b.h.p.—18 amps.

(b) Three phase motors 440 volts, motors not exceeding 2 b.h.p.—13 amps.

(c) Motors exceeding 2 b.h.p. but not exceeding 8 b.h.p.—6 amps per b.h.p.

(d) Motors exceeding 8 b.h.p.—2.4 amps per b.h.p., plus 33 amps.

In all cases the matter must first be referred to the Board in order to ascertain whether there is a suitable supply for the motor load and the Board's consent to the use of any such motors obtained.

25. Power Factor of Motors.—The power factor of A.C. motors shall at full rated load be not less than the following:—

	3-phase. Single Phase.	
	Per cent.	Per cent.
Motors not exceeding 2 b.h.p. . .	75	70
Motors 2 b.h.p. to 8 b.h.p. . .	80	—
Motors 8 b.h.p. to 25 b.h.p. . .	84	—
Motors exceeding 25 b.h.p. . .	86	—

26. Motors with Pulsating Loads.—Motors for driving reciprocating pumps, refrigerators, air compressors, or other pulsating or irregular loads, may be required to be fitted with a fly-wheel or other device, so that, when driving is normal, the load current taken by the motor does not fluctuate other than plus or minus 10 per cent. of the mean load current.

27. Other Electrical Apparatus.—Proposed installations and apparatus for use in heating and cooking, including water heating, must be approved by the Board before installation, and will not be permitted to be connected unless so approved, and, if connected without such approval, the installation may be disconnected by the Board at the consumer's expense. Before same or any like apparatus in place thereof may, with the approval of the Board, be reconnected, the consumer shall pay a fee of 5s. to the Board.

Water heaters, in which heating element is in direct contact with the water, will not be connected except through a double wound transformer, if the resistance between the heating element and earth is less than 10,000 ohms with the water running. The water shall not leave the heater at above earth potential.

Water heaters will not be connected if the current required is greater than for the connections to:—

The 250 volt service—15 amperes.

Three three-phase 440 volt service—12 amperes per phase.

The heater must be arranged so the current can be metered by one watt meter if required, and three-phase heaters must have the three-phases balanced as nearly as possible, and in any case so that the current in any phase shall not exceed the current in any other phase by more than two (2) amperes.

The maximum current taken by any electric cooker, heater, or radiator, shall not exceed:—

When connected to a single phase (2-wire service)—15 amps.

When connected to two phases (3-wire service)—30 amps.

If the maximum current can exceed 30 amps, it must be connected to a 3-phase (4 wire) circuit, and balanced as nearly as possible.

Such apparatus will only be connected where the mains are large enough to carry the current required without adversely affecting the supply to other consumers, and inquiry should be made as to whether apparatus will be connected before it is purchased or installed to avoid disappointment.

For continuous operating water heaters, special rates and conditions apply, which will be supplied on application.

28. Interference with the Supply to other Consumers—Welders, Furnaces, etc.—Before a consumer purchases any special apparatus with a view to having it connected to the Board's mains, such as welding apparatus, furnaces, X-ray outfits, rapidly fluctuating motor or other loads, he is strongly recommended to submit full particulars to and ascertain from the Board whether such apparatus will be connected and under what particular conditions, otherwise the Board may refuse to connect.

In every case where such apparatus is approved, its connection will only be permitted where the mains are, in the opinion of the Board, large enough to carry the current required without adversely affecting the supply to other consumers.

In the event of a consumer operating any such apparatus aforesaid, or any lift or motor in such a manner as shall, in the opinion of the Board, interfere with or be likely to interfere at any time with the supply of current to other consumers, the Board may call upon him to make such necessary adjustments, connections, or alterations, and to so operate the apparatus as shall, in the opinion of the Board, ensure that the supply to other consumers be not or is not likely to be interfered with, and in the event of his failing to do so forthwith, the Board may cut off the supply of electricity to him. The fact that the Board shall have connected and approved of the apparatus aforesaid shall not be taken to exempt the consumer from the operation of this clause.

29. Special Lighting and Power for Temporary or Special Services.—Special lighting or power, such as ovens, wet premises, outdoor display illuminations, lighting or power, of a temporary nature, or where the conditions are unusual, must be discussed with the Board before the installation is made and approval obtained before the work will be connected.

30. Minimum Charge.—A minimum charge of 3s. per month for lighting and power supply, and 2s. 6d. per month for domestic heating, in addition to any sub-meter rental, will be made, whether electricity to that amount is used or not.

31. Meter Readings.—The registration of the meter or other measuring device provided by the Board shall be taken as *prima facie* evidence of the quantity of electricity consumed. If the meter or other measuring device fails to register, or is found to be inaccurate, the account for the period during which the meter has failed to register or has registered inaccurately, may, subject as hereinafter mentioned, be adjusted by the Board upon one of the following bases, to be selected by the Board:—

- (a) The account rendered to the consumer on the basis of the current consumed during the corresponding month of the preceding year; or
- (b) The account rendered to the consumer on the basis of the current consumed during the preceding months during which the supply has been accurately measured; or

(c) An adjustment shall be made in accordance with the meter test certificate; or

(d) In the event of the consumer being supplied for a period of less than one month, or when there is no previous registration upon which to base an adjustment, then the account rendered shall be adjusted on the basis of the first succeeding month or portion of a month during which the supply has been accurately measured.

Provided that no adjustment or allowance shall be claimable or made by a consumer under this regulation after the expiration of fifteen days from the date of the last account rendered to the consumer for current supplied.

32. Testing of Meters.—The Board shall have the right to test meters at any time and adjust the consumption for the current period on such test. The cost of testing any meter shall be borne by the Board, where the test is required by the Board, but where the meter is tested on the complaint or at the request of the consumer, a testing fee of 10s. for each meter required to be tested shall be paid by the consumer before the meter is tested.

If it is found on testing that the meter is more than two and a half per cent. fast, a refund of the testing fee paid will be made to the consumer, and the account for the period in dispute shall be adjusted in accordance with the error shown by the test certificate of the meter. Meters will be considered correct if, on testing, they are found to register within $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. of the Board's standards, and no adjustments of accounts will be made. All outstanding accounts must be paid before any test is made at the request of the consumer.

33. Board's Apparatus, Interruptions, Responsibility.—The Board—

- (a) shall have the right at all reasonable times to enter the premises of the consumer for the purposes of inspecting and to inspect and examine any electrical installation and any meter or other property of the Board thereon, and to read any meter, and may remove any such meter or property therefrom;
- (b) may at any time cut off or interrupt the supply of current for the purpose of making tests, alterations, or repairs to the Board's system, or for any other purpose;
- (c) shall not be responsible or liable for any injury, damage, or loss of any kind to the person, property, or business of the consumer, or to the consumer's lamps or apparatus resulting from fire or otherwise, through the supply of electricity, or through cutting off, interruptions or defects of supply due to storm, accident, or breakdown of plant or mains, or *force majeure*.

34. Disconnection.—The Board shall have the right to disconnect the consumer without notice and for that purpose to enter upon the consumer's premises, if—

- the consumer is in arrears in payment of account;
- the consumer's installation is faulty;
- the consumer uses the service in a way that interferes with the general supply to other consumers;
- the consumer uses apparatus not authorised by the Board;
- the consumer connects increased load without first obtaining the consent of the Board;
- the consumer interferes with the seals, fuses, meters, or other apparatus the property of the Board;
- the consumer becomes bankrupt or assigns his estate for the benefit of his creditors;
- the consumer fails to conform to the Board's regulations in any way;
- the consumer in any way obstructs, hinders, or interferes with any inspection or examination by the Board or its servants of any electrical installation or apparatus.

35. Charge for Reconnection.—If the supply is disconnected for any of the above reasons, or for any other reason for which the Board is authorised to disconnect the same, a charge of 5s. will be made and must be paid before reconnection.

36. Termination of Connection.—The consumer shall give the Board at least three days' notice in writing of his desire to cease taking supply and shall be responsible for all current used until the expiration of such notice.

37. Consumer's Liability for Loss.—The consumer will be held responsible for loss by fire, damage, or theft of the meters and all other property or apparatus hired from or loaned by him from the Board in connection with the supply of current to the consumer.

38. Complaints.—All complaints as to defective service or accounts must be made direct to the Board's office.

39. Extension of Mains.—If the supply to a consumer necessitates extending the street mains, the right is reserved by the Board to refuse such extension, and such mains may at the option of the Board be extended to meet the convenience of a consumer on payment by him of the whole of such portion of the cost thereof as the Board may consider fair and reasonable.

40. Altering System.—The Board shall not be liable for any expense that the consumer may have to incur in altering any electrical installation, or repairing, altering, or replacing lamps, motors, or other apparatus to suit any change of voltage, frequency, or system, which may at any time hereafter be introduced by the Board. Such expense, or such portion thereof as the Board shall consider reasonable, shall be borne and paid by the consumer.

41. Penalties, etc.—Any person or persons offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds (£20).

Any penalties imposed for breach of these Regulations are as provided in "The Electric Lighting Act, 1892," and its amendments, and nothing contained in these Regulations shall prejudice the rights and powers of the Board under such Acts.

THE STATE MANUFACTURES DESCRIPTION ACT, 1931.

Regulations.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the State Manufactures Description Regulations, 1932.

2. State marks shall be in the form of the diagrams numbered one and two respectively in the First Appendix to these Regulations, and may be affixed to the goods or the containers thereof, either by means of adhesive stamps, impress stamps, stencils or dies.

3. Every application for a State mark shall be in writing in accordance with Form No. 1 in the Second Appendix to these Regulations, addressed to the Chief Inspector of Factories, signed by the applicant, and delivered at the office of the Council of Industrial Development at Perth.

4. Every application for a State mark shall state therein—

- (a) the nature of the goods to which or to the containers whereof it is intended to affix the State mark; and
- (b) the form of State mark applied for.

5. Upon receipt of the application, and upon being satisfied that such application is made in accordance with these Regulations, the Chief Inspector shall issue to the applicant an authority in accordance with the form No. 2 in the second appendix aforesaid, which shall be deemed to be the issue of the State mark to the applicant by the Chief Inspector of Factories.

6. Upon receipt of such authority signed by the Chief Inspector of Factories, the person authorised thereby may make or cause to be made at his expense a State mark in the prescribed form of the kind mentioned in such authority.

7. Every State mark issued under the Act and these Regulations shall be affixed only to the class of goods, or to the containers thereof, which are stated in the application for such State mark.

State Mark, indicating goods produced in Western Australia.

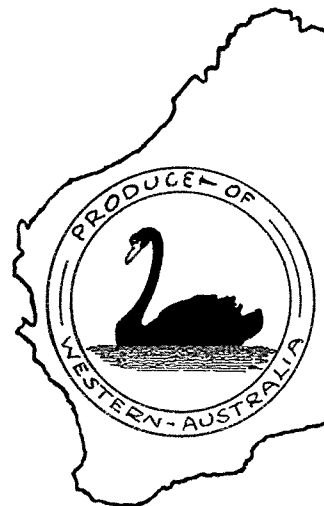
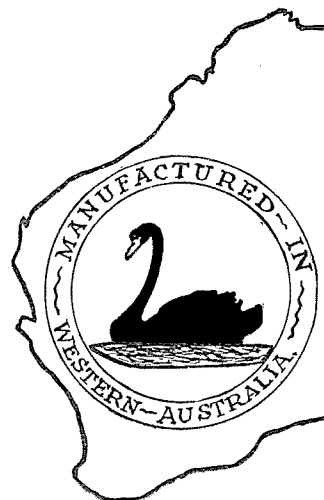


Diagram No. 2.

Section 30 (1).

Second Schedule—Paragraph 10.

By-laws for Limiting the Height of Obstructions at corners of Streets, Roads, or Rights-of-way.

1. No person shall erect or have or permit or suffer to be erected or had or to exist on any land belonging to him any wall, fence, hedge, tree, shrub or other obstruction within twenty feet of the corner of any street, road or right-of-way (not being an authorised building) of a greater height than four feet measured from the level of the footpath or roadway immediately adjoining the same.

2. Where any such obstruction is found upon any land in contravention of By-law one hereof, the executive officer of the local authority concerned, or the Town Planning Commissioner, may serve upon the owner of the land notice in writing requiring him within thirty days from the receipt of the notice to alter or amend such obstruction so as to bring the same into conformity with the said By-law, and upon receipt of such notice the owner of the land shall within the time aforesaid duly comply with the requisitions thereof.

3. Any person found guilty of a breach of these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds for each such breach, and, where the breach is of a continuing nature, to an additional daily penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

4. These By-laws shall have the force of law in the district of every local authority in the State of Western Australia.

Peppermint Grove Road Board.—Building By-laws.

P.W. 2083/23.

THE Peppermint Grove Road Board, under the powers conferred by Section 196 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," as amended by Section 29, Subsection (3) of "The Town Planning and Development Act, 1928," doth hereby:—

- (i) repeal By-law No. 67 as published in the *Government Gazette* of the 27th day of February, 1931, page 775;
- (ii) amend the Building By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th day of February, 1919, by deleting paragraph 66 thereof and adding the following paragraphs:—

District for Residences.

66. All that portion of Peppermint Grove Road District, save and except the land comprised in subdivisional lots fronting upon the Perth-Fremantle Road (Stirling Highway), is classified as a district for residences; and that portion of the said Road District which consists of land comprised in subdivisional lots fronting upon the said Perth-Fremantle Road (Stirling Highway) and lots fronting Rose Street is classified as a district for business, or for any other approved commercial or industrial purpose.

67. No land situate within the district classified for residence as aforesaid, other than Crown land or land vested in or under the control of the Peppermint Grove Road Board, shall be used for any purpose whatsoever other than for detached single family residences of not more than three floors; including the ground floor, save and except with the consent in writing of the Board.

68. Each residence in a residential area shall not be closer to the road or street frontage than 30 feet, and no structure or building whatsoever shall be erected between the front of such residence and the building line of the road or street.

No residence or other structure shall be erected closer than three feet to any other boundary.

69. Within a residential area not more than two-thirds of the area of any lot shall be occupied by a residence inclusive of other structures.

70. All residences shall be detached.

71. No hoarding, notice, placard, or advertising device shall be erected or pasted or put up on any land or public thoroughfare within the residential area defined in this By-law, or on any vacant land within the Road Board area, except to exhibit the name and trade or calling of an existing business or institution, and excepting any notice of sale or lease of land upon which such notice is erected.

Penalties.

72. This By-law shall apply to every part of the District of the Peppermint Grove Road Board District, and any person who contravenes or does not comply with any one of the provisions of this By-law shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the By-law, and for every such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

RIGHTS IN WATER AND IRRIGATION ACT, 1914.

Waroona Irrigation District.—Additional By-laws.

Water Supply Department,
P.W.W.S. 865/31. Perth, 26th August, 1932.

HIS Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator in Executive Council has approved of the following additional By-laws, which have been duly made by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage under the powers conferred by "The Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914," to come into operation on the 1st day of September, 1932.

C. A. MUNT,
Under Secretary for Water Supply.

By-law 21 (A).—Sale of Water for Stock.

The Minister, at his discretion, may make available from time to time water for sale for the purpose of watering stock on any one holding within the district. Such water will be receivable by the owner or occupier of only non-irrigable land in the district, and will be available at an irrigation channel only.

The times and periods when water will be available will be at the discretion of the Minister's representative.

The minimum charge for supply of water for stock to each holding shall be £4 for each rating year, and shall be payable in advance of supply.

By-law 21 (B).—Sale of Surplus Water.

The Minister, at his discretion, may make available from time to time any surplus water for sale for use for irrigation purposes by owners or occupiers of land outside the district. Such water will be available at an irrigation channel only.

The charge for such water shall be 15s. per acre watered for the first watering, and 2s. 6d. per acre for each subsequent watering, all charges to be payable in advance of supply. In each watering payment must be made for water for not less than five acres, the minimum charges therefor being £3 15s. and 12s. 6d. respectively.

Where not inconsistent herewith the By-laws relating to the irrigation of land within the district shall have effect in the sale of surplus water, namely—11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, and 17.
