WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters by means of fishing nets and fishing lines or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets for a period of twelve months as from the 23rd day of September,

All that portion of the Avon River (near the townsite of York) lying between Gwambygine and the road which crosses the said river near Burges' Siding.

- (c) alter the name of Metropolitan Stormwater District No. 5 as at present constituted from such name to Metropolitan Stormwater District No. 4.

Corres, 12832/97. HIS Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under the provisions of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897."

Public Cemetery, Wiluna.—By-laws.

By virtue of all powers on that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Public Cemetery, Wiluna, the said Trustees make the

of the Public Cemetery, Wiluna, the said Trustees make the following By-laws:—

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in Schedule "A," are to be paid at the time when the applications are made or orders given.

2. Any person desiring ground in the cemetery for any grave, private grave, vault, or tombstone, monument or enclosure, or for any other purpose, shall make application therefore on prescribed form. Upon such application being approved of, the Trustees shall cause to be issued to such person so applying a Certificate of Right of Burial in the

person so applying a Certificate of Right of Burial in the form specified in the Act (see Schedule "B").

3. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Trustees in time to allow of at least five (5) working hours' notice being given to the Secretary at the Cemetery prior to the time fixed for burial, otherwise an extra

charge shall be made.

4. The name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of deceased, and other particulars mentioned in Schedule "F" shall be furnished at the time of giving the

order.
5. The Trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but any person requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same under the supervision of the Secretary, after submitting a plan of same and obtaining a written approval of the Trustees thereon and on payment of the necessary fees; and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked-in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, or iron, unless special exemption be obtained from the Trustees in

writing.
6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate, bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon.

- 7. Every grave shall be at least 6ft. deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with less depth than 4ft. 6in. from the top of coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground after such interment.
- 8. No interment shall be allowed in any private grave or vault without the production of the Certificate of Right of Burial, as in Schedule "B," or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except in such cases as are provided for in the following By-law.
- 9. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written consent of the owner shall be handed in with the application.
- 10. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery without a certificate from the District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial. Such certificate or order shall be, at the latest, handed to the Secretary upon the funeral entering the Cemetery.
- 11. The hours for burial shall be as follows: -Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.; and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.
- The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery.
- At funerals no vehicles other than hearses shall be allowed to enter the Cemetery gates.
- 14. All hearses shall proceed by such roads as directed, and the drivers shall at all times observe such directions as may be issued to the Secretary by the Trustees from time to time for the regulation of the traffic.

15. No headstones, footstone, kerbing, monument or other erection of any kind shall be permitted, nor shall any inscription be allowed until the plans and particulars of the same have been approved by the Trustees.

16. Every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, and, if required by the Trustees or their

officers, such foundations shall extend to the bottom of the

17. The materials used in every erection shall be subject to the approval of the Secretary or other officer appointed by the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor or person responsible for the erection.

18. All material, refuse, and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person responsible therefor.

19. In the event of the refuse, rubbish, or material referred to in previous By-law not being so removed, the Trustees shall have power to cause the same to be removed, and to recover the costs of such removal from the person or persons responsible therefor.

20. All materials required in the erection and completion of any stone or other work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before taking to the Cemetery and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance to the Cemetery and conveyed along such roads or tracks as the Secretary shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery

21. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of ten shillings, which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws is not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.

22. The Trustees will not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment in this or any other Cemetery.

Before any such exceptional case, as referred to in the last By-law, be dealt with by the Trustees, a written application, setting forth the reason for the proposed removal, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of such application being granted, the approval of the Governor, in addition to the permission of the Trustees, shall be obtained. If in the opinion of the Trustees it is necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.

24. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already

deceased person whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.

25. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof; or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

26. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in Schedule

27. The shape and height of all graves, etc., shall be subject to the approval and supervision of the Secretary.

No catacomb shall be allowed.

No trees or shrubs shall be planted in any enclosure,

except such as are approved by the Secretary.

30. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Secretary, and shall obey such directions as that officer may Secretary, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find necessary to give, and any workman committing any breach of these regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Secretary, shall be removed from the Cemetery.

31. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:

(a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or any other materials removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any

moved in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other graves, and if placed on any other adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.

(b) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing graves,

of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing graves, except with the permission of the Secretary.

(c) The dressing of all graves, and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Secretary.

(d) Work in all classes to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

2. Any person who dresses or attends a grave, for which the prescribed and the subject of the properties of the propert

dressing or attention a charge is made, shall pay the prescribed annual license fee for grave dressing.

Children under the age of ten years shall not be admitted to the Cemetery unless in charge of some responsible

person.

34. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke within the Cemetery or to discharge any fireworks therein.

35. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery, and any

found there shall be liable to be destroyed.

36. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any trees, shrubs, flower, border, or any erection, or in any way infringing "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," or any rule, regulation, or by-law made for protecting the Cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the Cemetery.

38. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery or its approaches, any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars or cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement

39. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever whilst in dis-charge of his duty, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than that for which he re-ceives payment from the Trustees, and any person so employed accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work shall be liable to summary dismissal.

40. Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Trustees in the form set out in Schedule "G"; such licenses to be renewed annually.

Subject to the directions of the Trustees the Secretary shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals within the Cemetery.

42. The Trustees shall have power to cancel the annual license of an undertaker for a breach of any By-law, and prohibit any unlicensed undertaker from undertaking or conducting any funeral in the Cemetery.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees held at their office at Wiluna on the 21st day of July, 1932.

THE DOG ACT, 1903-28.

P.W. 290/30.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Dog Act, 1903," and the various amendments thereto, it is provided that By-laws may be made for the keeping of dogs under restraint after sunset in towns, also for authorising the destruction of any dogs not so kept under control and found wandering at large; it is hereby decreed by the various Boards as stipulated in the Schedule hereunder, that they have made, under the powers permitting them so to do, the following By-laws:-

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-19.

Amendment of By-laws.

M.H.D. 2565/18; Ex. Co. No. 1585. WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-19," a Local Health Authority may make Bylaws, and may amend, repeal, or alter any By-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Perth City Council, being the Local Health Authority for Municipal District of Perth, doth hereby amend its By-laws as follows:-

- 1. Clause 30 of Part VI. of the Health By-laws is hereby repealed.
- 2. Section N of Part VIII. of the Health By-laws is hereby repealed.
- A new Section, to be numbered N', is inserted in Part VIII. of the Health By-laws, as follows:-

Section N-Fish Shops.

(1) In these By-laws "Fish" shall mean fresh fish, frozen fish, chilled fish, and cooked fish, whether cleaned, uncleaned or part-cleaned, but does not include fish which has been cured, preserved, hermetically canned or treated

has been cured, preserved, nermeticary canned or treated to prevent putrefaction.

"Fish shop" shall mean any building or place where fish is kept or exposed for sale, or where fish is cleaned, scaled, cut up, or cooked for the purposes of sale for consumption otherwise than on the premises.

(2) Fish shops shall be classifed as A, B, or C class,

and shall be registered accordingly.

The occupier of an A class fish shop shall be permitted to clean, part-clean, scale and cut up fish and expose fish for sale and cook fish for the purpose of sale for consumption otherwise than on the premises.

The occupier of a B class fish shop shall be permitted only to expose fish for sale and to cook fish for the purpose of sale for consumption otherwise than on the premises.

The occupier of a C class fish shop shall be permitted

only to expose fish for sale.

No occupier of a fish shop shall do or permit to be done any of the things set out in this clause which are not permitted to be done in the class of fish shop occupied by him.

(3) In every A class fish shop there shall be a room constructed in accordance with the provisions of Clause 14 of Section A of this Part, and all cleaning, scaling, and cutting up of fish shall be done in such room and not elsewhere.

(4) The occupier of every fish shop shall have an impervious receptacle, which shall be provided with an airtight covering. Such covering shall at all times be kept closed, except when it is necessary to place something in or remove something from the receptacle.

The occupier of every A class fish shop shall cause all offal and wastes to be immediately picked up and placed

in such receptacle.

The occupier of every fish shop shall cause all rejected and unsaleable fish to be immediately placed in such re-

ceptacle. The contents of such receptacle shall be removed from the premises once in each working day, or at such times as an Inspector may direct. Such receptacle shall, after being emptied, be immediately cleaned with an efficient

disinfectant. (5) The occupier of any B class or C class fish shop shall not allow any box, basket, or other container used for the transport of fish to remain in such fish shop longer than is necessary for the emptying of such box, basket or container.

(6) In every A class and B class fish shop where the cooking of fish is carried on there shall be provided-

(a) a fireplace so constructed that all the vapours and effluvia of such cooking are carried direct into

a chimney flue of approved proportion; or
(b) a hood provided with a ventilating pipe of at least 7 inches in diameter and discharging direct into the open air or into a chimney flue of approved proportions.

The chimney or ventilating pipe referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) hereof shall be carried up at least 10 feet above the roof of the building containing the fish shop, or above the roof of the highest adjoining building, whichever shall be the higher.

No cooking of fish shall be carried on except in a fire-

place or under a hood of the above description.

(7) The occupier of every fish shop where fish is exposed for sale shall keep all such fish on metal trays or on approved shelves or counters, and all fittings and fixtures of such trays, shelves, and counters shall be of impervious material or covered with impervious material.

(8) (a) The occupier of every A class and B class fish shop shall cover and keep covered all doors, windowopenings, and other apertures on the premises with screens of fine mesh wire gauze, and shall cause all doors to be self-closing.

(b) The occupier of every C class fish shop shall comply with the provisions of Sub-clause (a) of this clause, or shall keep all fish in enclosures covered by glass or

fine mesh wire gauze.

(9) No occupier of a fish shop shall allow any decom-

posing fish to remain in any part of his shop.

(10) Every occupier of a fish shop shall keep all fish

in containers separate from every other kind of food, except in hermetically sealed cans or bottles.

(11) After having handled fish every person shall wash his hands before handling any other kind of food intended for sale in a fish shop.
