FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930," and Amendment Act, 1931, which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default or breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement of sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or his estate or effects during the operation of such Stay Order. THE BUSH FIRES ACT, 1902.

Prohibited Periods in certain Districts.

Department of Lands and Surveys,

HIS Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator in Executive Council has been pleased to declare, under Section 5 of "The Bush Fires Act, 1902," that it shall be unlawful to set fire to the bush in the following Road Districts during the periods set out in Schedule hereunder, and to approve, under Section 2 of "The Bush Fires Amendment Act, 1904," of the suspension of the operation of such prohibition, so far as it extends to the Midland Railway Reserve, for the period extending from 1st October, 1932, to 21st December, 1932, inclusive:—

Corrigin—1st October, 1932, to 31st January, 1933, inclusive.

Gascoyne-Minilya—1st August, 1932, to 31st May, 1933, inclusive.

Greenough—1st October, 1932, to 30th January, 1933, inclusive.

Ashburton—1st September, 1932, to 31st March, 1933, inclusive.

Northampton (North Ward)—1st October, 1932, to 15th January, 1933, inclusive.

Balance of District—31st October, 1932, to 15th February, 1933 inclusive.

Mullewa—1st October, 1932, to 31st January, 1933, inclusive.

THE LAND ACT, 1898.

By-laws—Abrolhos Islands.

Department of Lands and Surveys,
Perth, 14th September, 1932.

Corres. 3756/29.

HIS Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws for the control and management of the Abrolhos Islands Reserve A20253:—

1.—Injuring or Destroying Trees, etc.

No person shall injure, cut, break, deface, pull up, remove or destroy any trees, shrub, plant, or flower growing on the said Islands, or cut or remove any dead wood or timber therefrom.

2.—Injuring the Soil or Surface, etc.

No person shall break or interfere with the soil or surface of any part of the said Islands, or with any improvements or works thereon, and, subject as herein-after provided, no person shall interfere with or destroy any birds or animals thereon.

3.—Persons Misconducting themselves.

No person shall commit any riotous or indecent act, or make use of any indecent or improper language, or commit any nuisance on the said Islands.

4.—Remaining on the Islands.

No person shall remain on the said Islands for a longer period than his permit authorises.

5.—Posting Bills.

No person shall write or affix, or be concerned in writing or affixing on the Islands, or to anything thereon, anything written or printed, or any picture placard or advertisement, unless the consent in writing of the Board of Control or of an officer of the Board authorised in that behalf shall have been previously obtained.

6.—Shooting, etc., on the Islands.

No person shall have in his possession any firearm on any portion of the Islands, unless the consent in writing of the Board of Control, or an officer of the Board authorised in that behalf, shall be previously obtained: Provided that this By-law shall not apply to any person who holds a license under "The Game Act, 1912-1913," for the lawful taking of game.

7.—Selling Goods on the Islands.

No person or persons shall sell or expose for sale any thing on any portion of the said Islands, unless the consent in writing of the Board of Control, or an officer of the Board authorised in that behalf, shall be previously obtained.

8.—Waste Litter of Picnics to be Removed.

Every person who shall at any time be on the said Islands shall collect and remove, or cause to be collected and removed, all waste matter, broken glass, or rubbish of any kind which was brought on the ground by him or in the bringing of which on the ground he was in any way concerned.

9.—Dogs or other Animals not to be allowed on Islands.

No person shall cause or suffer any dog or other animal to be upon the Islands without the special approval in writing of the Board of Control, or an officer of the Board authorised in that behalf.

10.—Permits to Land.

No person (not being a person exempted under By-law 13 hereof) shall land and/or remain on the said Islands without having first obtained a permit hereunder. A permit shall authorise the person to whom it is granted to land and/or remain on the said Islands for a period not exceeding the period stated therein from the date of the granting of the permit.

11.—From whom Permits obtainable.

Permits may be granted by any captain of any boat authorised to carry passengers, and holding the special license of the Board to do so, or by any member or officer of the Board authorised in that behalf, on payment of the prescribed fee.

12.—Form of Permit.

Every permit shall state the name of the person to whom it is issued, the date of issue, and the time when such permit expires, and no permit shall be transferable.

13.—Exemptions.

The following persons are exempted from the provisions of By-law 10:—Children under 14 years of age, officials and workmen of the Board, members of the Board, permanent residents, officers of a Government Department (State or Federal), and any person who is the holder of a fisherman's license issued under the provisions of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-1921," or a license issued under the provisions of "The Game Act, 1912-1913," or a license to remove fertiliser deposits from the Reserve issued under the provisions of "The Land Act, 1898."

14.—Trespassers.

Any person (not being a person exempted under By-law 13 hereof) landing at the said Islands without first having obtained a permit, or who having obtained a permit remains on the said Islands after the period for which his permit was issued, shall be deemed a trespasser, and shall be guilty of a breach of these By-laws.

15.—Plying for Hire.

No boat, plane, vehicle, or other craft shall ply for hire within the Board's jurisdiction whatsoever, unless licensed by the Board in writing, and under such terms and conditions as may be imposed.

16.—Removal without Permission.

No person or persons shall remove anything whatsoever from the land or water under the Board's jurisdiction, without special permission in writing and under such terms and conditions as the Board may prescribe:

Provided that nothing herein contained shall prohibit any licensed fisherman under "The Fisheries Act, 1905-1921," from lawfully obtaining fish (including cray fish) or any person licensed under "The Game Act, 1912-1913," from lawfully taking game, pursuant to the terms of their respective licenses, or any person holding a license to remove fertiliser deposits from the Reserve issued under the provisions of "The Land Act, 1898."

17.—Erection of Buildings, Jetties, etc.

No person shall erect, or cause to be erected, any building, jetty, or other structure on the Islands, unless by special permission in writing and under such terms and conditions as the Board may prescribe.

18.—Landing Fees.

The Board may charge a landing fee of 5s. for each person over 18 and 2s. 6d. for each person between the ages of 14 and 18:

Provided that no fees shall be chargeable against any of the classes of persons who come within By-law 13.

19.—Permits, Orders, Licenses, etc.

All orders, licenses, permits, etc., shall bear the signatures of the president and secretary of the Board, or their deputies for the time being.

20.—Penalty.

Any person who is guilty of any contravention (by act or omission) of any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding £20.

MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1906.

By-law of the Municipality of Bunbury, made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and Numbered 13, for regulating the Control and Use of Reserves and Camping Grounds:

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Bunbury order as follows:—

By-law No. 13 of the By-laws of the Municipality of Bunbury in force prior to the date hereof is hereby repealed and the following By-law shall be passed in its place and be known as By-law No. 13:—

1.—Interpretation.

In the construction of this By-law, unless the context otherwise indicates:—

(a) "Reserve" shall mean and include the park lands, recreation grounds, reserves and endowment lands belonging to or under the control of the Council, and shall also include the lands near the Bunbury Jetty known as "the Baths Reserve"; the ocean beach within the limits of or on the boundary of the Municipal District; the lands known as "the Stirling Estate Reserve," and all areas which are now or shall hereafter be set apart by the Council for the purpose of camping grounds.

(b) "Inspector" shall mean and include the Traffic Inspector and any other Inspector in the employ of the Municipality, and shall also include any Honorary Inspector appointed by the Council to assist the Council to maintain a due observance of the By-laws of the Municipality.

2.—Behaviour.

No person shall misconduct himself, or indulge in any riotous, disorderly, or indecent conduct, or use any indecent or improper language, or offend against decency as regards dress on any reserve.

3.—Intoxicating Liquor.

No person shall enter upon or remain on any reserve when visibly under the influence of liquor.

4.—Bill-Sticking.

No person shall, without the consent of the Town Clerk, post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint, or otherwise affix any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, or any document whatsoever upon any tree, board, fence, post, gate, building, road, path, or any place whatever on any reserve, nor distribute or give out any such placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, or document on any reserve, and no person shall cause to be done any of the acts herein prohibited.

5.—Expectoration.

No person shall spit or expectorate in or upon any building, structure, or erection on any reserve.

6.—Meetings.

No person shall organise, arrange, advertise, or take part in any fete, picnic, or concert, or any meeting of like character, or engage in public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind on any reserve without permission in writing of the Town Clerk.

7.—Betting.

No person shall bet or offer to bet publicly on any reserve.

8.—Damaging Growth.

No person shall injure, break, deface, pull up, pick remove, or destroy any tree, shrub, or grass growing on any reserve.

9.—Fires and Shooting.

No person or persons shall carry or discharge any firearm, or throw or discharge any stone or other missile or set off any fire balloon, or throw or set fire to any fireworks or kindle or make any fire on any reserve without permission in writing from the Town Clerk.

10.—Rubbish.

No person shall deposit or leave any rubbish, refuse, paper, broken glass, china, or litter of any kind whatsoever upon any reserve, except in the receptacle provided for the purpose.

11.—Broken Glass.

No person shall place or break, or permit or suffer to be placed or broken, any glass, metal, or earthenware, bottles, or utensils on any reserve, without first having obtained the written consent of the Town Clerk so to do.

12.—Horses or Motor Vehicles.

No person shall ride, drive, lead, or swim a horse, or drive any motor cycle or motor car on the beach within the area extending from Clifton Street Southwards to Beach Road, Bunbury.

13.—Sunday Sport.

The Council may at its discretion prohibit any games or sport from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any reserve on any Sunday.

14.—Trading.

No person shall, without permission in writing from the Town Clerk, sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, refreshments, fruits, nuts, confectionery, fish or other merchandise or things, or solicit or offer to purchase bottles on any reserve.

15.—Damage to Property.

No person shall cut up, damage, destroy, disfigure, or interfere with any road, fence, building, electrical equipment, waterpipe, or fittings upon any reserve.

16.—Games and Animals.

No person shall, without the permission in writing from the Town Clerk, play, practise, or indulge in any game, sport, gymnastic exercise, on any reserve, or exercise on any reserve any horse, dog, or other animal for racing.

17.—Straying Stock.

No person shall, without the written consent of the Town Clerk, cause, allow, or suffer any horse, cattle, sheep, dog, goat, camel, donkey, mule, pig or other animal, or fowl or other bird, to enter, stray, or feed upon any reserve, nor cause, allow, or suffer any dog to enter any swimming area within any reserve, nor throw sticks or other missiles therein.

18.—Use of Reserves.

The Council shall have the power to grant the exclusive rights to use and occupy any reserve or portion thereof for holding sports or amusements to any responsible person or persons, subject to such condition as may be decided on by the Council, and any person or persons obtaining such rights shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, erections, trees or other improvements upon such reserve or portion thereof, and shall pay to the Council for the use of the land such fees as the Council shall decide.

19.—Camping.

No person shall, except as hereinafter provided, camp, lodge, or tarry over night on any reserve, nor frequent any reserve for the purpose of camping, lodging, or tarrying over night thereon.

20.—Permits for Camping.

Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 19 camping may be permitted in areas set apart for the purpose by the Council, but not elsewhere, upon the issue of a permit by an Inspector, and subject to the following conditions:—

The Council may at any time make and declare a schedule of charges and issue permits to persons desirous of camping on any such area.

(a) No person shall sublet any camp, or sell, give, or otherwise dispose of any permit to any person.

(b) Except by permission of the Inspector no person shall bring into or keep within the camping area any animals or birds whatever.

(c) No person shall bring into or keep or consume in the camping area any intoxicating liquor.

(d) Campers must keep the area, covered by their permit, in a clean and sanitary condition at all times. All rubbish capable of destruction by fire shall be burned by the occupier in the approved fire-place.

(e) All campers must use the sanitary conveniences provided, and in no circumstances will improvised conveniences on individual camping sites be permitted.

(f) Camping permits may at any time be withdrawn by the Inspector if in his opinion a breach of these By-laws has been committed, or if, in his opinion, it is desirable that the permit shall be terminated. In the event of termination hereunder, the rental paid shall be forfeited to the Council, and no compensation shall be claimed or paid for loss, damage, or inconvenience suffered through the withdrawal of the permit.

(g) Subject to the right of the Inspector and the officers and employees of the Council, or any person acting under their instructions, or any police constable, to enter any camping site at any time, no persons shall enter into or remain within such camping site, except with the permission of the holder of the permit.

(h) No fires shall be lighted on any camping area, except in places approved by the Inspector.

21. For every offence against the provisions of these By-laws, the offender shall upon conviction before any one or more Justices of the Peace forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1906.

P.W. 719/31.

By-laws of the Municipality of Bunbury, made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and Numbered 56, for regulating Bathing and the Conduct and Clothing of Bathers:

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Bunbury order as follows:—

Interpretation.

In the construction of this By-law, unless the context otherwise indicates, "Inspector" shall mean and include any Traffic or other Inspector in the employ of the Municipality, and shall also include any Honorary Inspector appointed by the Council to assist the Council to maintain a due observance of the By-laws of the Municipality.

1.—Bathing Costumes.

Every person on any beach within the limits of or on the boundary of the Municipality, or bathing in any portion of the sea within the limits of or on the bound-

ary of the Municipality, exposed to public view, shall at all times, when not dressed in ordinary apparel, wear either a two-piece costume, or a one-piece costume with a V-piece loin cloth or skirt. No person shall appear on any road, footpath, or public place within the Municipality, except within the immediate precincts of the recognised bathing places, unless covered by a dressing gown or outer robe which in the opinion of the Inspector is an adequate cover.

2.—Indecent or Inadequate Costume.

In any cases where an Inspector is of the opinion that any person's bathing costume is indecent or inadequate, or that the material is too thin, or is not in a proper state of repair, or is for any reason unsuitable, he may direct such person to resume at once his ordinary dress.

3.—Failure to Resume Dress.

If any person shall fail to resume his ordinary dress when directed to do so by an Inspector, he shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

4.—Dressing in Public View.

No person shall dress or undress or remove or disarrange any part of his bathing costume in any place within the limits of or on the boundary of the Municipality, open to public view; provided that this shall not prevent any person already clad in proper bathing dress from doffing or donning, on the beach, any dressing gown or outer robe.

5.—Bathing in Dangerous Places.

No person shall bathe at any place after being warned by an Inspector that such place is dangerous, or if such place be indicated as dangerous by a "Danger" signal or notice.

6.—Conduct of Bathers.

No person bathing in any open public water shall molest or in any way interfere with any other person bathing, or approach in such manner as may reasonably cause annoyance to such bather.

7.—Use of Dressing Sheds.

(a) A dressing shed shall be used for dressing and undressing only. No person shall play games or, without reasonable cause, loiter in or in the vicinity of any shed.

(b) No person shall bring or deposit any filth or rubbish in any such shed.

(c) No person shall, under any pretext whatsoever, enter any dressing shed set apart for the use of the opposite sex.

8.—Damaging or Defacing Buildings.

No person shall damage, deface, disfigure, or write in or upon, or paste or affix any advertisements on to any dressing shed or public convenience, or to or on any notice board or other erection, except with the written consent of the Town Clerk first had and obtained.

9. For every offence against the provisions of these By-laws the offender shall upon conviction before any one or more Justices of the Peace forfeit and pay a penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).
