WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of West-ern Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut.-Governor and term: Now, therefore 1, the said Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:— That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the date of the publica-tion of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* until the 31st day of December 1934 inclusive until the 31st day of December, 1934, inclusive.

### Schedule.

Port Dongarra (Dongarra): All that area of Western Australian waters at Port Dongarra (Dongarra) commencing at high-water mark at a point 440 yards North of the Dongarra Jetty; thence extending in a North-Westerly direction to a distance of 440 yards; thence in a South-Westerly direction to a distance of one half-mile, and thence in a South-Easterly direction to a point on the foreshore 440 yards South of the said Jetty.

And whereas the news of the said age District: And whereas the name of the said Korijekup Drainage District was by an Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 21st day of February, 1919, altered to Harvey Drainage District: And whereas the name of the Brunswick Road Board was by notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of December, 1909, altered to Harvey Road Board but continued to be the Drainage Board for the said Drainage District: And whereas, from the dates of the said alterations in names, the said Drainage District and the said Drainage Board have continued to be so constituted as the Drainage District and Drainage Board respectively, so that the Drainage District has been known as Harvey Drainage District and the Harvey Road Board has been the Drainage Board for such Drainage District: And whereas, since the commencement of "The Land Drainage Act, 1925," the said Harvey Drainage District has been a Drainage District by the said name, under and for the purposes of that Act, and the Harvey Road Board has been the Drainage Board for such Drainage District under and for the purposes of that Act: And whereas "The Land Drainage Act, 1925," is by virtue whereas "The Land Dramage Act, 1925," is by virtue of Section 8 thereof deemed to be mentioned in Part II. of the Schedule to "The Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912," and that Act and its amend-ments have effect accordingly: And whereas it is enacted by Subsection (1) of Section 3 of "The Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912," that the Governor may in his discretion revoke any Order in Council made hafter or after the comparement of the Council made before or after the commencement of the said Act for the constitution of any Board, and dissolve the Board constituted pursuant to any Order so re-voked, and the Harvey Road Board as the Drainage Board for the said Harvey Drainage District is a Board to which the provisions of Section 3 of "The Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912," apply: And whereas it is now deemed expedient to revoke the Order in Council whereby the Brunswick Road Board, now known as Harvey Road Board as aforesaid, was constituted and appointed the Drainage Board for the said Korijekup Drainage District, now known as Harvey Drainage District as aforesaid, and to dissolve the Drainage Board so constituted and appointed by such Order in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut-Governor, acting with the Council made before or after the commencement of the His Excellency the Lieut. Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of all other powers in this behalf enabling him, doth hereby revoke the Order in Council made and pub-lished in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th day of October, 1906, whereby the Brunswick Road Board (now the Harvey Road Board) was constituted and

appointed as the Drainage Board for the Korijekup Drainage District (now the Harvey Drainage District) under and for the purposes of "The Land Drainage Act, 1900," and doth hereby dissolve the Drainage Board constituted by the said Order in Council hereby revoked as aforesaid and doth hereby declare that this Order in Council here is from a down Order in Council shall have effect as from and com-mencing on the 1st day of July, 1932.

FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930.

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default or breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement of sale and purchase of land, or other process or pro-ceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or his estate or effects during the oper-ation of such Stay Order. Provided that by leave of a judge any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer, but not beyond judgment.

### THE STOCK DISEASES REGULATIONS, 1926.

The Stock Diseases Regulations, 1926, published in the Government Gazette on the 5th day of August, 1927, are amended as follows :-

1. Part IV. of the said Regulations is repealed and a new Part is inserted in lieu thereof as follows:-

Part IV.-Stock in and from the Kimberley.

### Prohibited Area.

As from and after the first day of October, 1932, 34. no cattle shall be kept or depastured on, and no cattle shall be introduced into or removed from that portion of the State comprised within a line starting at the mouth of the Grey River, proceeding thence along the bank of the said river to its junction with the Shaw River; thence due East until it meets the Rabbit-proof Fence; thence along the said fence until it meets the 121st meridian of longitude; thence along the said meri-121st meridian of longitude; thence along the said meri-dian Northwards until it meets the sea coast; thence along the sea coast to the starting point: Provided that cattle within the said area at the commencement of this regulation may, for the purpose of due compliance with this regulation, be removed into or transported or driven through the Kimberley Quarantine Area as hereinafter defined, or may be removed direct into such other part of the State as the Chief Inspector of Stock may in writing pagmit writing permit.

### Removal of Stock from Kimberley Quarantine Area.

35. For the purposes of this Part of these Regula-35. For the purposes of this Part of these Regula-tions, the Kimberley Quarantine Area means the quaran-tine area constituted and declared under these Regula-tions by notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 9th day of September, 1932, and being all that por-tion of the State North of a line commencing at the point where the sea coast meets the 20th parallel of latitude, proceeding thence along the said parallel East-wards until it meets the 127th meridian of longitude; thence Northward along the said meridian until it meets thence Northward along the said meridian until it meets the Southern boundary of the Kimberley Division as constituted under the provisions of "The Land Act, 1898"; thence along such Southern boundary Eastwards until it meets the boundary of the Northern Territory.

36. Cattle shall not be removed from the Kimberley Quarantine Area to any other part of the State save and except upon and subject to the following conditions, namely:

- (i) A permit in writing signed by an inspector of stock shall first be obtained by the person about to remove the cattle;

- to remove the call.
  (ii) The cattle shall be removed only by sea from a port within the said area;
  (iii) The cattle, after shipment, shall not be landed in any other part of the State, except directly into the Owen's Anchorage Area hereinafter mentioned;
  (iv) The cattle shall, immediately before shipment, be sprayed by or under the supervision of an inspector of stock with an approved solution rebellant to the Buffalo Fly (Lyperosia) exigua)
- (v) If the Chief Inspector of Stock shall so direct, (v) If the cattle, after shipment, shall be sprayed again by or under the supervision of an inspector of stock before being landed;
  (vi) Whenever cattle are sprayed in accordance with this regulation, the owner thereof shall pay to the impression of facek by whom or under whose
- the inspector of stock by whom or under whose supervision such cattle are sprayed the charges for the same prescribed in the Fourth Schedule to these Regulations.

37. Horses, camels and donkeys shall not be removed from the Kimberley Quarantine Area save and except upon and subject to the following conditions, namely:—

(i) At least fourteen days prior to removal a permit in writing signed by an inspector of stock shall be obtained by the person about to remove the horses, camels, or donkeys;

- (ii) Within seven days prior to removal the horses, camels, or donkeys about to be removed shall be dipped or sprayed by or under the supervision of an inspector of stock;
- Whenever horses, camels, or donkeys are dipped or sprayed in accordance with this regulation, (iii) the owner thereof shall pay to the inspector of stock by whom or under whose supervision the same are dipped or sprayed the charges for the same prescribed in the Fourth Schedule to these Regulations.

### Stock from Intermediate Ports.

38. (1.) Vessels conveying cattle from the Kimberley Quarantine Area may call at all intermediate ports, and stock from parts of the State other than the Kimberley Quarantine Area may be shipped on such vessels for carriage to any other part of the State: Provided that, where such stock consists of cattle, horses, camels, and donkeys, such cattle, horses, camels and donkeys shall not be landed elsewhere than at Owen's Anchorage Quarantine Area without the permit in writing of the Chief Inspector of Stock, and such stock, horses, camels, and donkeys shall, before being landed anywhere, be treated by or under the supervision of an inspector of stock in such manner as the Chief Inspector of Stock may direct.

(2) If any treatment aforesaid shall include dipping shall pay to the inspector of stock dipped or sprayed whose supervision the same are dipped or sprayed the charges for the same prescribed in the Fourth Schedule to these Regulations.

### Owen's Anchorage Quarantine Area.

39. For the purposes of this Part of these Regulations, the Owen's Anchorage Quarantine Area means the quarantine area constituted and declared under these quarantine area constituted and declared under these Regulations by notice published in the *Government Gaz-*ette on the 9th day of September, 1932, and being all that portion of the State adjacent to Owen's Anchorage in the Port of Fremantle bounded on the North by Island Road, on the East by the road known as the Old Rockingham Road, on the South by the Northern fence of the Explosives Reserve, and on the West by the ocean, and shall include all other portions of the State which may hereafter from time to time be constituted and de-clared to be added to and form nart of the soil Ovaran. clared to be added to and form part of the said Quarantine Area under these Regulations.

40. No cattle, other than cattle brought from the Kimberley Quarantine Area, and cattle carried from other parts of the State im a vessel also carrying cattle from the said quarantine area, and cattle intended to be slaughtered immediately, shall be brought into the Owen's Anchorage Quarantine Area without the permis-sion in writing of the Chief Inspector of Stock.

41. No cattle brought into the Owen's Anchorage Quarantine Area or found therein shall be removed therefrom without the permission in writing of an inspector of stock.

42. All cattle brought into or found within the Owen's Anchorage Quarantine Area may be dipped therein by or under the supervision of an inspector of stock, and shall be quarantined or kept in such area until slaughtered or until an inspector of stock permits the removal of the same therefrom.

43. Permits as in Form No. 7 in the Third Schedule to these Regulations may be issued by an inspector of stock for the removal of cattle from the Owen's Anchorage Quarantine Area upon and subject to the following conditions:

(1) As regards cattle other than cattle brought from the Kimberley Quarantine Area-

(a) after such cattle have been dipped or otherwise treated by or under the supervision of the in-spector of stock issuing the permit if and in such manner as the inspector may deem necessary.

(2) As regards cattle brought from the Kimberley Quarantine Area-

- (a) the locality into which the cattle are to be re-moved must be specified;
- (b) the cattle, before leaving the said quarantine area, must be dipped in a prescribed dip by or under the supervision of the inspector of stock issuing the permit;
- (c) cattle intended for slaughter shall be removed only to such abattoirs as may be approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock;

- (d) store cattle shall be removed only to such quarantine areas as may be approved by the Chief Inspector of Stock, and then subject to such conditions as may be imposed by him;
  (e) cattle shall be removed from the Owen's Anchor-
- age Quarantine Area by means only of the railway, and shall be conveyed direct to the destination specified and approved under this regulation;
- (i) all trucks containing cattle is course of removal from the said quarantine area shall be sealed forthwith upon the cattle being loaded thereon, and such seals shall not be broken until the cattle arrive at their destination, and then only in the presence of an inspector of stock, inspec-
- in the presence of an inspector of stock, inspector of public health, or police officer.
  (2) If any cattle brought into or found straying in the Owen's Anchorage Quarantine Area shall come into contact with any cattle brought from the Kimberley Quarantine Area, then such cattle shall, for the purposes of this regulation, be deemed to be cattle brought from the Kimberley (Duarantine Area) ley Quarantine Area.

44. All stock brought into or found straying in the Owen's Anchorage Quarantine Area and found to be in-fested with cattle tick shall be dipped immediately in a prescribed dip by or under the supervision of an inspecfor of stock.

45. Whenever stock is dipped at Owen's Anchorage Quarantine Area, the owner thereof shall pay to the inspector of stock by whom or under whose supervision the stock is dipped the charges for the same prescribed in the Fourth Schedule to these Regulations.

### Skins and Hides to be treated as prescribed in Regulation 62.

45A. All skins and hides from cattle slaughtered within the Kimberley Quarantine Area and within the Owen's Anchorage Quarantine Area shall be treated as prescribed in paragraphs (2) and (3) of Regulation 62 hereof.

### Penalty for Breach of Regulations.

Any person who is guilty by act or omission of 45B. a breach of any of the Regulations in this Part shall be liable to a penalty of not less than fifty and not exceeding five hundred pounds.2. The Fourth Schedule to the said Regulations is

- amended as follows :-
  - (a) by inserting in the subheading "Scale of charges (a) by inserting in the subheading "Scale of energies for dipping stock as hereinafter specified," after the word "charges," the words "spraying or";
    (b) by deleting the words "Cattle (Kimberley) intended for overlanding, per head—2s. 6d.," and
  - tended for overlanding, per head—2s. 6d.,' and inserting in lieu thereof the words ''Cattle (Kimberley) after shipment and before being landed, per head—1s. 0d.''
