The Factories and Shops Act, 1920.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F. & S. 661/32. WHEREAS it is enacted by Subsection (3) of Section 78A of "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," that the Governor may make Regulations for the matters mentioned in the said subsection: And whereas the Governor, in exercise of the said power, made certain Regulations, to be cited as "The Factories (Poisonous Substances) Regulations, 1924," which were published in the Government Gazette on the 30th day of January, 1925: And

whereas it is now deemed expedient to repeal the said Regulations and to make other Regulations to take the place thereof, as hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of all other powers in this behalf enabling him, doth hereby repeal the whole of 'The Factories (Poisonous Substances) Regulations, 1924,' as published in the Government Gazette on the 30th day of January, 1925, and doth hereby make in lieu thereof other Regulations, as follows:—

# The Factories (Poisonous Substances) Regulations, 1932.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Factories (Poisonous Substances) Regulations, 1932.
- 2. These Regulations are divided into Parts as follows:-
  - Part I.—Regulations 3 and 4—General.
  - Part II.—Regulation 5—Factories in which arsenic or arsenical compounds are used or manufac-
  - Part III.—Regulation 6—Factories in which lead or poisonous compounds of lead are used or manufactured.

Part IV.—Regulations 7 and 8—Miscellaneous.

#### Part I.—General.

- 3. In every factory where lead or arsenic, or any poisonous compound of lead or of arsenic is used or manufactured, the following provisious shall apply and be observed, namely:—
- (1) The occupier shall provide and maintain clean and in good order, repair, and condition for the use of all persons employed or remaining on, in, or about the factory—
  - (a) a lavatory, under cover, with a sufficient supply of clean towels, to be renewed daily, and of soap and nail brushes, and fitted either—
    - (i) with a trough with a smooth impervious surface, fitted with a waste-pipe without plug, and of such length as to allow at least two feet for every five persons employed in the factory at any one time, and having a constant supply of warm water from taps or jets above the trough at intervals of not more than two feet; or
    - (ii) with at least one lavatory basin for every five persons employed in the factory at any one time, fitted with a waste-pipe and plug, and having a constant supply of hot and cold water or warm water laid on to each basin;
  - (b) a suitable and adequate meal room which is-
    - (i) sufficiently ventilated and separated from any workroom adjoining the same by a wall or partition extending from floor to ceiling without having any door, window, or other opening therein; and
    - (ii) furnished with sufficient tables and chairs or benches with back rests, and with adequate means and appliances for warming food and for boiling water;
  - (c) a suitable room for the accommodation and changing of clothing put off by employees during working hours, which shall be adjacent to the place where washing and bathing facilities are provided, and which shall be separated from but may adjoin the meal room, and which shall contain at least six square feet of floor space for each person employed at any one time, and adequate arrangements for drying wet clothes: Provided that—
    - (i) if hooks or pegs are provided for hanging clothes, there shall be at least two hooks or pegs for each employee set at least eighteen inches apart; and
    - (ii) if lockers are provided, there shall be at least one locker for each employee, and such locker shall be at least five feet high, one foot six inches wide and one foot deep, ventilated at top and bottom, and approved of the Chief Inspector of Factories;

(d) adequate and sufficient facilities and appliances, approved by an inspector, to enable persons employed and remaining on, in, or about the factory to wash their mouths.

- (2) The occupier shall allow each person employed or remaining on, in, or about the factory at least ten minutes before each meal and before the end of each day's work, in addition to the time allowed for regular meal times, for the purpose of washing himself.
- (3) Where a meal room, cloak room, baths, and sanifactory, either under the provisions of "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," or these Regulations, the occupier shall, if the Chief Inspector of Factories so requires, cause such rooms, baths, and conveniences, and any furniture, fittings, and appliances contained therein or used in connection therewith to be placed under the charge of a responsible person and to be maintained in a clean condition.
- (4) The occupier shall cause the floors of the factory to be cleansed daily after being thoroughly dampened.
- (5) The occupier shall not permit any person to partake of a meal in, on, or about the factory, except in the meal room provided for that purpose.
- (6) The occupier shall keep or cause to be kept at the factory a book, to be called "The Health Register," in accordance with the Form No. 1 in the Appendix to these Regulations, for the purpose of recording therein particulars concerning every person who becomes poisoned or otherwise affected as the result of his occupation whilst employed in, on, or about the factory, and shall enter in such book the following particulars:—
  - (a) the name and address of every person employed in, on, or about the factory; and
  - (b) particulars of every notification of symptoms of poisoning or other affection by any of such employees; and
  - (c) the date of such notification.
- (7) Every person employed in, on, or about the factory who is suffering from any symptoms which may lead him to believe that he has contracted poisoning of any kind shall forthwith notify the occupier of such symptoms.
- (8) Every person employed in, on, or about the factory shall, whenever required so to do by the occupier, or the Commissioner of Public Health, or by an inspector, submit to an examination by the Commissioner of Public Health or some duly qualified medical practitioner appointed by the said Commissioner. Such examination shall take place at intervals of not longer than one calendar month, and shall be conducted at the expense of the occupier, who shall be liable for and shall pay to the person conducting every such examina-tion the fee or charge payable in respect thereof on demand.
- (9) The Commissioner or medical practitioner who has conducted any such examination as aforesaid may order the suspension from employment of any person examined by him; and no person whose suspension from employmet has been so ordered shall work or be employed in the factory without the approval in writing of the Commissioner of Public Health, or of the medical practitioner who examined such employee.
- 4. The occupier of any factory shall forthwith send written notice, in accordance with Form No. 2 in the Appendix to these Regulations, to the nearest inspector whenever it comes to his knowledge that any employee is suffering from lead or arsenical poisoning.

#### Part II. - Factories to which Arsenic or Arsenical Compounds are used or Manufactured.

- 5. In every factory where arsenic or any arsenical compounds are used or manufactured, the provisions of Part 1. of these Reculations, and, in addition therete, the following provisions, shall apply and be observed.
- (1) The occupier shall provide and maintain clean and in good order, repair, and condition for the use of persons employed in, on, or about the factory-
  - (a) sufficient and suitable shower-bath accommodation, with hot water laid on; and
  - (b) sufficient and suitable overalls, under clothing. head coverings, and clean respirators, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, and shall cause the employees to wear the same during working hours:
  - (c) sufficient and suitable change rooms, to the satis faction of an Inspector, so arranged that clothing worm by employees during working hours in, on, or about the factory shall not be changed or stored in the same room as clothing worn by such employees outside the factory.

- (2) The occupier shall cause all clothing worn by employees during working hours to be collected and thoroughly washed daily.
  - (3) Every person engaged in—
    (a) condensation chambers; or

    - (b) flues; or
    - (c) setting or drawing furnaces; or
    - (d) feeding screw conveyors; or

(e) handling or packing arsenic or any poisonous compound of arsenic,
or in any other work involving exposure to dust of any arsenic or poisonous compound of arsenic shall, while so engaged, wear an overall suit, suitable underclothing, head covering, and respirator.

- Part III.—Factories in which Lead or any Poisonous Compound of Lead is used or Manufactured.
- 6. In every factory in which lead, or any white lead, red lead, litharge, or any other compound of lead is used or manufactured, the provisions of Part I. of these Regulations, and, in addition thereto, the following provisions, save and except as otherwise hereinafter provided, shall apply and be observed:—
- (1) The occupier shall provide and maintain clean and in good order, repair, and condition for the use of persons employed in, on, or about the factory-
  - (a) sufficient and suitable bath accommodation (douche or other) with hot water laid on unless the water supply and appliances for washing provided in accordance with subparagraph (a) of paragraph (1) of regulation three of these Regulations are so arranged that a warm douche for the face, neck and arms can be taken;

(b) sufficient and suitable overalls, head coverings, and respirators, to the satisfaction of an Inspector; and shall cause the employees to wear the same during working hours;
(c) a suitable place set apart for the purpose outside

the factory building and approved by an Inspector for the storage of overalls, head coverings and respirators when not being used.

- (2) The occupier shall cause all overalls, head coverings, and respirators to be collected at the end of each day's work and stored in the place set apart for that
- (3) The occupier shall cause all overalls, head coverings, and respirators which have been used by employees engaged in setting or drawing stoves to be thoroughly washed daily, and all overalls, head coverings, and respirators used by other employees to be thoroughly washed at least once in every week.
  - (4) Every person engaged in-
    - (a) white beds; or
    - (b) emptying chambers; or
    - (c) rollers, washbeeks, or grinding; or (d) setting or drawing stoves; or
  - - packing; or
  - paint mixing; or
- (g) handling dry lead compounds, or in any other work involving exposure to dust of any lead compounds shall, whilst so engaged, wear an overall suit and head covering.
  - (5) Every person engaged in-(a) emptying white beds; or
    - (b) emptying chambers; or

    - (c) dry grinding; or
      (d) packing dry lead compounds; or
      (e) handling dry lead compounds; or
      (f) entering a chamber used for the condensation

or recovery of lead compounds, shall, whilst so engaged, wear a respirator in addition to an overall suit and head covering: Provided that

- the provisions of this Regulation shall not apply to factories used in or in connection with the following classes of business, namely:—
  - (a) Printing and type-setting;
  - (b) Paint shops;
  - Plumbing and sheet metal works;
  - (d) Potteries;
  - Tile works;
  - (f) Engineering and electrical appliance factories;
  - (g) Brass and other metal foundries.

# Part IV.—Miscellaneous.

A copy of these Regulations shall be exhibited in a conspicuous place in every factory, in which lead or arsenic or any poisonous compound of lead or arsenic is used or manufactured, and shall at all times be maintained in a clean and legible condition.

Any person who is by act or omission guilty of or party or privy to any breach of these Regulations shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

or delivery of goods therefrom.

4. A Hawker's License shall be in the Form No. 3

in Schedule A attached hereto.

5. The fees to be paid for licenses issued to hawkers shall be as set forth in Schedule B attached hereto.
6. Every application for a Hawker's License shall

be made during the currency of the financial year in which the license is to have effect, and every such license shall have effect for and during that year, or the unexpired portion thereof, and no longer.

7. Every hawker, while employed in hawking, must produce his license upon being required to do so by any Police Officer or Officer of the Board.

8. Every hawker, shall visibly effer to gone con

Every hawker shall rigidly affix to some conspicuous part of his eart, barrow, or other vehicle or basket, and at all times maintain thereon, a board or plate bearing his name and the words "Licensed Hawker" legibly written thereon, in letters not less than one inch in height and of corresponding width.

9. No person to whom a Hawker's License shall have been granted shall lend, transfer, or assign his license, and no person shall borrow or make use of such license granted to a person other than himself.

#### The Schedule.

#### Part I.

### Transport of Carbide.

46. No person shall carry, or cause or permit to be carried, any calcium carbide underground, except in lamps provided or approved by the manager, or in a watertight receptacle of a type approved by the District Inspector of Mines and to be approved by the manager. No person shall store or leave calcium carbide underground on coming off shift. Spent carbide shall be placed in properly covered receptacle and taken to the surface as often as may be necessary.

#### Time for Blasting.

47. The manager shall cause the times of working 47. The manager shall cause the times of working shifts and of blasting operations in every section of the mine to be so arranged that workmen shall not be exposed to fumes and dust from blasting, subject as hereinafter provided. Blasting shall be allowed only at noon, 4 p.m., 8 p.m., and midnight, except for removing obstructions in ore passes or box holes, or for the purpose of making the hanging safe, or for blasting misfired holes in development faces, and then only with the permission in each case of the manager or underground permission in each case of the manager or underground manager.

Blasting during crib time shall be permitted only after workmen have been removed to the intake side of all places where blasting is to be done and where the resultant smoke and dust do not affect them in the section where they congregate during crib time. When sinking shafts, and in other special work, blasting may be done at other times than those prescribed; provided written permission has been obtained to do so from the District Inspector of Mines. Provided that, in any mine where ordinary mining operations are not undertaken during night shift, blasting may be done between the hours of midnight and 6 a.m.

#### Dust and Ventilation.

48. (1.) All development ends and winzes, where machine drills are used, shall not be advanced more than 20 feet from the through air current unless a blower, approved by the District Inspector of Mines, delivering induced air through pipes to within a few feet from the face, and with sufficient velocity and volume to remove the dust, is installed. Any working place where dust is formed shall be provided with a blower if, in the opinion of the District Inspector of Mines, it is con-

Any person who wilfully damages or misuses a blower or pipes shall be liable to a penalty as for a breach of this Regulation.

(2.) The manager of a mine shall appoint dust and

ventilation officers, when required to do so by the District Inspector of Mines, whose duty it shall be to examine and report on-

(a) all matters relating to the mine's water supply, its quality, distribution, and use;

(b) the condition of the necessary appliances for using water at each working place elsewhere;
(c) the dust sampling of the mine, more particularly as regards development ends;

(d) the condition of the mine relating to ventilation and health, more particularly as regards the amount of air supplied during the interval after blasting and before entry and during the working shift, in all development ends and working places in which there is no through ventilation current.

The manager shall notify the District Inspector of Mines in writing of the name of the person or persons so appointed from time to time. The condition of the mine as found by such person shall, at the completion of each day, be entered by him in the Record Book. Such entries shall be examined and countersigned by the manager or underground manager at least once a week.

(g) (i) No explosives shall be taken into any working face in quantity exceeding what would be required for use during one shift in such face. No explosives shall be taken into such face, except in securely covered cases or canisters of size and construction approved by the inspector;

(ii) Fuses which have detonators attached to them shall not be carried into such face, except in a securely covered receptacle of size and construction approved by the inspector separate from the case or canister used for other explosives;

(iii) No workman or party of workmen shall have in use at any one time in any places more than one such receptacle for capped fuses and one such case or canister for other explosives.

(h) Detonators shall not be sent below ground in the workings of a mine unless attached to fuse in the form of "rods." All fuses to be used for firing charges of explosives shall be prepared in daylight under cover by being cut into required lengths with a sharp instrument, and detonators shall be placed on the fuse and crimped thereto by an approved tool. The distribution of capped fuses shall be undertakn in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (g) of general rule (3) of Section 32 of "The Mines Regulation Act, 1906."
