WHEREAS by a Proclamation under "The Game Act, 1912-13," dated the 15th day of December, 1931, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 18th December, 1931, it was declared that the Opossum should be at all times strictly preserved throughout the State from the 1st day of January, 1932, until the 31st day of December, 1932: And whereas it is desirable to temporarily suspend the operation of the said Proclama-

tion throughout the State: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that, notwithstanding the provisions of the said Proclamation, the taking or killing of Opossums shall be lawful for a period of from the 1st day of November, 1932, until the 30th day of November, 1932, inclusive, throughout the State of Western Australia.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto for a period of twelve months as from the 15th day of November, 1932.

Schedule.

(1) All that area of Western Australian waters (Cockburn Sound) Eastward of the Fremantle Fish Market Jetty and extending to the Western extremity of South Street and to a width of half a mile from high-water mark.

(2) That area of Western Australian waters (Cockburn Sound) commencing at the Western extremity of Sydney Street and extending Southward to a point a quarter of a mile South of the Jetty fronting Douro Road and to a width of half a mile from high-water mark.

(3) That area of Western Australian waters (Cockburn Sound) commencing at a point on the foreshore a quarter of a mile North of Robb's Jetty and extending to a point on the foreshore a quarter of a mile South of Robb's Jetty, and extending into the waters aforesaid to a distance of a quarter of a mile from high-water mark.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 38 of "The Fire Brigades Act, 1916," that the Governor may make Regulations for any of the purposes therein specifically mentioned, and also by paragraph (cc) of the said section for such other purposes as the Governor may by Proclamation order, and generally for the purposes of carrying into effect the objects of the said Act: And whereas certain Regulations were made for the purposes of the said Act, and were published in the *Government Gazette* on the 7th day of May, 1926, which Regulations included, inter alia, a Regulation prescribing travelling allowances to members of the Board and a Regulation relating to demonstrations and competitions: And whereas it is deemed expedient to make further provision for payment of allowances to members and officers of the Board, and for payment of grants and incurring of expenditure in connection with demonstrations and competitions in the manner and to the extent herein-after mentioned: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the said Act, and of all other powers in this behalf enabling me, do hereby order that the provision of allowances for members and officers of the Board, and the making of grants and incurring of expenditure in connection with demonstrations and competitions, shall be purposes for which Regulations may be made under the said Act: And also, for and in relation to such purposes aforesaid, do hereby amend the Regulations hereinbefore mentioned in the manner set forth in the Schedule hereto.

The Schedule.

FIRE BRIGADES ACT, 1916.

Regulations.

The Regulations made under "The Fire Brigades Act, 1916," and published in the *Government Gazette* on the seventh day of May, 1926, are amended as follows:—

1. Regulation 28 is repealed and a new regulation is inserted in lieu thereof as follows:—

28. (1) Members and officers of the Board, when attending demonstrations, competitions, conferences, or

inspections, or engaged in other Board business, shall be entitled to and shall be paid the special allowances set forth in the following scale, namely:—

(A) For journeys within the State occupying more than one day:—

(i) Members of the Board, per day	30	0
(ii) Chief Officer, per day	30	0
(iii) Deputy Chief Officer, per day	25	0
(iv) Secretary, and Assistant Secretary, per day	21	0
(v) All other Officers, per day	17	6

(B) For journeys within the metropolitan area or occupying less than one day, members and officers of the Board shall be allowed out-of-pocket expenses reasonably incurred by them;

(C) Members of the Board and the Chief Officer, when travelling beyond the limits of the State on the authority of the Board, shall, except when at sea, or on the Commonwealth Railway between Kalgoorlie and Port Augusta, receive an allowance at the rate of 30s. per diem, unless it can be shown to the satisfaction of the Minister that such amount is insufficient to meet their reasonable out-of-pocket expenses;

(D) When members of the Board and the Chief Officer travel by steamer or other vessel, or on the Commonwealth Railway between Kalgoorlie and Port Augusta, in which the fare paid includes subsistence, an allowance equal to 15 per cent. of the passage money, calculated on single fare, shall be paid in lieu of the ordinary travelling allowance.

(2) In addition to the above allowances, members and officers of the Board shall be allowed first-class railway and steamer fares, where such expense is incurred by them when travelling on Board business; and, in the case of a member of the Board resident in the country, the Board may provide him with a seasonal railway ticket.

(3) All expenditure incurred by the Board under this regulation shall be charged to the administration costs of the Board.

2. Regulation 124 is amended by adding thereto paragraphs as follows:—

(2) The Board may, by resolution, authorise such expenditure or make such grants as it considers necessary or expedient for the successful conduct of demonstrations and competitions, and, in particular, for all or any of the following purposes, viz.:—

- (a) the transportation of volunteer firemen and their appliances and apparatus;
- (b) the purchase of trophies for competition by volunteer fire brigades and firemen, and the allocation of the cost thereof;
- (c) the entertainment of volunteer firemen, and visiting officials and brigades;
- (d) any other matter incidental to the conducting of demonstrations and competitions;

(3) The Board may by resolution grant a sum not exceeding twenty-five pounds to a brigade, or apportioned between brigades where more than one, attending demonstrations or competitions outside of Western Australia as approved representatives of the State;

(4) All expenditure incurred by the Board under this Regulation shall be charged in the first instance to demonstration costs, and thereafter shall be dealt with in the following manner, namely:—

(a) Expenditure incurred in connection with the conducting of the Annual Volunteer Fire Brigades Demonstration shall be apportioned equally between all registered volunteer fire brigades, and, when so apportioned, shall be charged against the fire districts accordingly;

(b) Expenditure incurred by the Board in connection with fire brigades attending inter-district competitions shall be charged against the fire district of the brigade in relation to which the expenditure was incurred.

(c) Expenditure incurred by the Board by way of grant to a fire brigade or fire brigades attending demonstrations or competitions outside Western Australia shall be charged against the fire district of the brigade to which the grant was made.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 16th day of November, 1932, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

The Fire Brigades Act, 1916.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Fire Brigades Act, 1916," it is provided that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any Municipal or Road District a Fire District, and may include such District in Parts 2, 3, or 4 of the Second Schedule to the said Act. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, constitute the Road District of Goomalling a Fire District, under the name of the Goomalling Fire District, and doth hereby order and direct that the said Fire District be and the same is hereby included in Part 4 of the Second Schedule to the said Act.

The Fire Brigades Act, 1916.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Fire Brigades Act, 1916," the Governor may by Order in Council excise from any Fire District any specified portion thereof, and thereupon such portion shall for the purposes of the said Act, be no longer included in or be part of such District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of all powers him in this behalf enabling, doth hereby excise from the Goomalling Fire District that portion of the said Fire District which is outside the limits defined in the Schedule hereto.

The Schedule.

The Townsite of Goomalling, being that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the Westernmost corner of Avon Location 12936 (late C.P. 49/21) and extending 257 deg. 39 min. 1 chain 3 links to the South-Western side of a surveyed road (Lockyer Street): thence 333 deg. 47 min. about 85 chains 75 links along said side of road; thence 63 deg. 47 min. about 75 chains to the North-West side of road No. 26; thence 153 deg. 48 min. about 86 chains, passing along part of the South-Western boundary of Location 1545; thence 243 deg. 49 min. about 74 chains to the starting point.

The Road Districts Act, 1919.

Upper Gascoyne Road District—Alteration of Boundaries with the Murchison and Meekatharra Road Districts.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 414/27.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," the Governor may by Order in Council sever any portion of a Road District and annex it to an existing Road District, and whereas it is desirable to—1. Sever portion of the Upper Gascoyne Road District and annex it to the Meekatharra Road District; 2. Sever portion of the Upper Gascoyne Road District, and annex it to the Murchison Road District; now therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby—1. Sever that portion of the Upper Gascoyne Road District as described in Schedule "A" hereto and annex it to the Meekatharra Road District; 2. Sever that portion of the Upper Gascoyne Road District as described in Schedule "B" hereto and annex it to the Murchison Road District.

Bayswater Road Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 787/31.

WHEREAS by Section 202 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," it is enacted that the Governor may in his discretion extend the provisions set out in the Second Schedule of the said Act to any District or portion thereof: And whereas it is desirable to extend such provisions to the Bayswater Road District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth by this Order in Council, made under Section 202 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," extend such provisions set out in the Second Schedule of the said Act to the Bayswater Road District.

The Order in Council whereby the provisions of the Second Schedule to "The Road Districts Act, 1919," were extended to portion of the Bayswater Road District, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of September, 1932, page 1426, is hereby revoked.

The Public Works Act, 1902.

Bridgetown-Jarnadup Railway Extension.

Additions and Improvements (Ballast Pit).

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 1068/28; Ex. Co. No. 2097.

WHEREAS by Section 11 of "The Public Works Act, 1902," it is made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to authorise the Minister to undertake, construct, or provide any public work (subject as to railways to Section 96), and such authorisation shall be deemed an authority to such Minister by and under that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the recited section of "The Public Works Act, 1902," doth hereby authorise the Honourable Minister for Works to provide and construct additions and improvements to the Bridgetown-Jarnadup Railway Extension (Ballast Pit) on the land coloured green on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 27138 (L.T.O. Diagram 9258), which may be inspected at the office of the Minister for Works, Perth.

Stock Diseases Act, 1895.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 5 of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," that the Governor may by Order in Council to be published in the *Government Gazette* from time to time prohibit the introduction or importation into this State, either by sea or land, of any stock from any country or place: And whereas a disease known as "Pseudo Poultry Plague" has broken out amongst poultry and birds in the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, and it is deemed expedient therefore to prohibit the introduction or importation into the State of Western Australia, either by sea or land, of any poultry and birds from the said State of Victoria: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of

the Executive Council, and in exercise of the said power and of all other powers thereto enabling him, doth hereby prohibit the introduction or importation into the State of Western Australia, either by sea or land, of any poultry and birds from the said State of Victoria until the publication in the *Government Gazette* of an Order in Council revoking this Order in Council, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in Regulation 21 of the Second Schedule to "The Stock Diseases Regulations, 1926," published in the *Government Gazette* on the 5th day of August, 1927, or any amendment thereof.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

The Regulations made by the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners and dated the ninth day of November, 1923, are hereby amended by repealing paragraph (c) of Regulation No. 62A, "Navigation of Inner Harbour Basin, Fremantle Harbour—Passing Dredges in the Fairway," and enacting in lieu thereof the following new regulations:—

Regulation No. 194A.

Dredger Signals.

The master of a dredger moored within any part of the Harbour, whether such dredger is working or not, shall, in the undermentioned circumstances, exhibit or make, as the case may be, the following signals:—

(a) When requiring any vessel approaching from seaward, to keep the dredger on the starboard hand of such vessel, and any vessel proceeding seaward to keep the dredger on the port hand of such vessel in passing—

- (1) By day, a red cone on the yardarm on the side to be passed;
- (2) By night, a red light over a green light on the yardarm on the side to be passed;
- (3) In fog, mist or heavy rain, the Morse sound signal letter "A" at intervals of not more than two minutes, on the dredger's bell.

(b) When requiring any vessel approaching from seaward to keep the dredger on the port hand of such vessel, and any vessel proceeding seaward to keep the dredger on the starboard hand of such vessel in passing—

- (1) By day, a black cylinder on the yardarm on the side to be passed;
- (2) By night, a green light over a red light on the yardarm on the side to be passed;
- (3) In fog, mist, or heavy rain, the Morse sound signal letter "N" at intervals of not more than two minutes on the dredger's bell.
- (c) When the dredger is blocking the channel—
- (1) By day, a green cone between two red balls, vertical at the masthead;
- (2) By night, a green light between two red lights, vertical at the masthead;
- (3) In fog, mist, or heavy rain, the Morse sound signal letter "S" at intervals of not more than two minutes on the dredger's bell.

(d) When a vessel may pass on either side of the dredger—

- (1) by day, a white flag on the masthead;
- (2) by night, a green light on both yardarms.

(e) When the dredger is unable to move, or is out of control—

- (1) By day, a red flag on the masthead;
- (2) By night, a red light on both yardarms.

Self-propelling Dredgers—Not Anchored.

Suction dredgers under way when dredging, and unable to manoeuvre as required by Regulations in order to keep out of the way of other vessels, shall show lights and shapes required by the International Regulations, Article (4) (a), for vessels not under command, viz.:—

- Two (2) black balls by day or two (2) Red lights by night from where best seen.

Morse Sound Signals.

The Morse sound signals hereinbefore referred to shall be made by the dredger's bell for the respective signals, viz.:—

- (1) Short ring—1½ seconds duration.
- (2) Long ring—4 seconds duration.
- (3) Interval between rings—1½ seconds duration.

Anchor Lights on Dredgers.

In addition to the coloured lights shown above, moored dredgers may carry the anchor light or lights required to be carried by other vessels, according to their lengths.

A white light shall be shown on the outer rail of the silt barge, if moored to the dredger, on the passing side. No light need be shown on the barge if moored to the side of the dredger that is not clear.

Size of Shapes.

The diameter of the shapes shall be not less than 2 feet 9 inches. The vertical height of the cone and cylinder shapes shall be 1½ times the diameter of their own base. The vertical distance between shapes or lights shall be between 4 and 6 feet.

Vessels to Observe Dredger Signals.

(1) Any vessel approaching a dredger from whatsoever direction shall pass such dredger on the side upon which the signal is exhibited, as hereinbefore mentioned.

(2) Any vessel approaching from whatsoever direction shall not pass any dredger exhibiting the "Channel Blocked" signals as mentioned in paragraph (c), but must wait until one of the passing signals mentioned in paragraphs (a), (b), or (d) is exhibited or made.

(3) Every vessel approaching a dredger from whatsoever direction, when such dredger is exhibiting the signal mentioned in paragraph (d), may pass on either side of the dredger.

(4) Every vessel approaching a dredger from whatsoever direction, when such dredger is exhibiting the signal mentioned in paragraph (c), must be navigated with all due precaution when passing such dredger.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," this seventeenth day of October, 1932, between the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia, Western Australian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, of the one part, and the Minister of Public Health, of the other part: Whereby it is mutually agreed as follows:—

1.—Area and Scope of Agreement.

This Agreement shall apply to all members of the staff engaged on clerical work, including telephonists of the Perth Hospital, with the exception of the secretary and assistant secretary.

2.—Definitions.

"Officer" shall mean any clerical worker engaged on the staff of the Perth Hospital, male or female, covered by this Agreement.

"Board" shall mean the Board of Management of the Perth Hospital.

"Minister" shall mean the Minister of Public Health for the time being.

"Union" shall mean the Western Australian Branch of the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia Industrial Union of Workers.

"Secretary," except where otherwise stated, shall mean the secretary for the time being of the Union.

"Casual clerk" shall mean a clerk employed from day to day at a daily or weekly rate of pay.

3.—Hours of Duty.

The ordinary hours of duty shall be from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, with an interval of one hour for lunch, and between 9 a.m. and 12 noon on Saturdays.

Provided that the hours of the storekeeper shall be 45 hours per week, to be worked between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., from Mondays to Fridays inclusive and 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturdays.

4.—Overtime.

Any work which on account of its character or special circumstances cannot be performed during the prescribed hours of duty shall be regarded as overtime work, for which extra payment may be made. Payment for such overtime, when approved by the Board, shall be on the scale and under the conditions set out in Public Service Regulation 31, and also subject to the provisions of Regulations 28 and 29.

5.—Meal Money.

Officers who may be required by the Board to attend after ordinary office hours to bring up arrears of work may be allowed 2/-d. for tea money, provided they work up to 6.30 p.m., and on Saturdays a luncheon allowance of 2/-d. may be paid, provided the officers work up to 1.30 p.m.; provided further, that the Board may supply a suitable meal in lieu of the allowance.

Meal money shall not be paid in addition to overtime payment.

6.—Classification and Rates of Pay.

Basic wage—males—£3 12s. 0d. per week; females—£1 18s. 11d. per week.

If during the currency of this Agreement any variation of the basic wage is made by the Court of Arbitration affecting the Metropolitan Area, it is agreed that such variation shall not affect the rates of salary provided for in this Agreement.

If during the currency of this Agreement the Arbitration Court of Western Australia should prescribe a basic wage for the Metropolitan Area differing in amount from that now prescribed, then the marginal differences between the present basic wage and the minimum rates herein prescribed shall be deemed to be increased or decreased, as the case may be, to the same extent as the present basic wage may be decreased or increased by the said Arbitration Court as aforesaid, to the intent that the rates herein prescribed shall remain constant, subject to the provisions of Subclause (h) of this clause.

Subject to the provisions of "The Financial Emergency Act, 1931," and any amendments thereto, the rates of pay to officers on the age basis shall be as follows:—

(f) Casual clerks shall not be paid less than the minimum rate paid to officers doing similar work.

(g) Senior positions: The classification and range of salaries of position with maxima above the range set out in Subclause (e) shall be as shown in the First Schedule attached hereto.

(h) If the provisions of the Financial Emergency Act or its amendments, if any, cease to operate during the currency of this Agreement, then the scales and rates of salary specified in this Agreement shall be subject to such fluctuations as may occur from time to time in the basis of salaries under the Public Service Act compared with the basis in operation on the 1st May, 1932.

7.—Annual Increments.

Subject to the certification of the secretary of the Hospital as to efficiency, ability, and conduct, the progression of officers from minimum to maximum salaries shall be by yearly increments to be approved by the Board.

Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to limit the power of the Board to pay any officer at a higher rate within his or her grade or classification than is being paid, where the Board may consider the same to be merited or warranted by the service of the officer.

8.—Higher Duties.

An officer performing the work of another officer may be granted by the Board increased remuneration on the following basis:—

- When acting in a position for a period of one month or longer, the minimum value of which exceeds his own salary, the minimum value of such position for the whole time he is acting;
- When acting in a position for a period of one month or longer, the minimum value of which does not exceed his own salary, at the rate of half the difference between the respective salaries for the whole time he is acting.

9.—Holidays.

(a) The days to be observed as public holidays shall be those set out in Public Service Regulation 54; provided that, if any officer is required to work on any of the holidays referred to, he shall be allowed time off on some other day to be mutually arranged between the secretary of the Board and himself.

"Time off" shall mean the granting of a half-day off duty for all time less than a half-day worked on a public holiday, and a full day off duty for all time worked in excess of a half a day.

(b) Annual holidays:—All officers shall receive leave of absence for recreation for two weeks in each calendar year; provided that officers dismissed for gross misconduct shall lose all rights to leave.

(c) Sick leave:—Sick leave shall be granted by the Board to all officers, in accordance with and subject to the provisions set forth in Public Service Regulation 61.

(d) Casual clerks may be granted by the Board one day's leave for each complete month served.

10.—Long Service Leave.

Officers may be granted by the Board three months' long service leave on full pay after seven years' continuous service dating from the date of this Agreement. The conditions relating to such leave, when granted, shall be similar to those set out in Regulation 60 and to the practice and procedure followed in the Public Service in relation thereto.

11.—Engagement.

(a) One month's notice of termination of engagement shall be given by either side.

(b) The services of a casual clerk may be dispensed with at any time by the Board.

Provided that an officer may be summarily dismissed for gross misconduct, in which case he shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

12.—Preservation of Accrued Right.

Nothing herein contained shall affect any rights or privileges accrued to any officer prior to this Agreement.

13.—Recognition of Union.

All officers shall be members of the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia, provided that any officer appointed who at the time of engagement is not a member of the Union shall become a member of the Union within fourteen days.

14.—Record Book.

A record book shall be kept showing the name of each officer under the Agreement, and the nature of the work performed, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received each pay. The said record shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the Union during working hours.

15.—General.

Should any question or matter arise, apart from the specific terms of this Agreement or the interpretation of its terms, such question or matter may be considered and decided by the Board in accordance with the provisions and conditions of the Public Service Regulation, as amended, where such Regulations apply to such a question or matter; failing which the question or matter may be decided by the Board.

16.—References.

A reference shall be given to any officer of not less than three months' service containing all necessary information in regard to length of services and duties performed.

17.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three years from 1st January, 1932; provided that, at any time after the expiration of twelve months from the commencement of this Agreement, any term or terms thereof may be revised by either party giving one month's notice of their desire to do so.
