UNIVERSITY OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA. Crawley Site By-laws.

The Senate of the University of Western Australia, in pursuance of "The University of Western Australia Act, 1911," and all amendments thereof, and in exercise of all the powers vested in the Senate by those or any other Statute or Statutes, hereby makes the following By-laws for the purpose of managing preserving, and protecting the lands of the University, hereafter described, and for the purpose of regulating the terms

and conditions on which such lands may be visited or used by any persons whomsoever, and the conduct of such persons when on or upon such lands.

1. These By-laws shall:—
(a) be cited as the "Crawley Site By-laws," and come into force when approved by His Excellency the Governor and published in the Gov-

leney the Governor and published in the Government Gazette; and shall

(b) apply to the lands of the University for the time being forming the University site at Crawley as set out in Section two, Subsection (2), of "The University of Western Australia Act Amendment Act, 1929," or as set out and declared by any order of the Governor now or hereafter duly published in the Gazette as provided in that subsection, together with all buildings, structures, fences, and erections of whatsoever kind or nature, and, whether permanent or temporary, standing or being on any such lands; all which lands and premises, and every part thereof, are in these By-laws referred to as "The Site."

2. Throughout these By-laws:—
"Vehicle" includes any motor car, motor truck, motor
eycle, carriage, cart, bicycle, or other vehicle of whatsoever kind or nature and howsoever ridden, driven, or

impelled.

"Tieket" means (except in Regulation 22) a written authority signed by the Vice-Chancellor of the University, or by some person authorised by him.

"Servant of the University" means a servant of the University authorised in writing by the Vice-Chan-

cellor to act under these By-laws.
3. The Senate may from time to time by resolution declare any part of the Site open to members of the declare any part of the Site open to members of the public, or to any specified portion, section, or class of the public, and may state the times when and the hours between which the site or such parts or parts thereof shall be so open. But every such member of the public shall be subject to all these By-laws.

Any such declaration may be modified or revoked by the Senate without notice.

the Senate without notice.

4. No person shall enter, remain, or be upon the Site, except upon such part thereof as has been declared as aforesaid to be open to the public, and then only during the time and hours when the same is so open.

- This By-law shall not apply:—
 (a) to any member of the Senate or of Convocation, or any professor, lecturer, part-time lecturer, or other member of the teaching staff of the or other member of the teaching stan of the University, or any employee of the University, or of the Guild of Undergraduates, while carrying out his duties as such employee, or any person who holds a ticket issued to such person and authorising such entry, remaining, or being upon the Site; nor shall it apply
- (h) to any person attending lectures or courses at the University during such times and in respect of such portions of the Site as such person is properly present thereon for the purposes of such lectures or courses.

5. The Senate may declare any part of the Site, or any building or erection thereon, closed to all persons whomsoever, for such period or on such day or days or parts of a day or days as the Senate shall think fit.
