WHEREAS by "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation temporarily suspend the operations of the said Act, in so far as it applies to the closing time fixed or appointed for any shop or shops: And whereas it is expedient to exercise such power in manner hereinafter expedient to exercise such power in manner hereinafter appearing: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, by this Proclamation, suspend the operations of the said Act between the hours of six o'clock and nine o'clock in the evening of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in every week during the period commencing on the First day of January, 1933, and ending on the Thirty-first day of December, 1933, in so far as it applies to the closing time of shops conducted in open markets. the closing time of shops conducted in open markets which are kept open for the conduct of business therein between the times aforesaid and on the days aforesaid, and in which shops, home-made jams and preserves, honey, butter (other than factory butter), and eggs, hams and bacon, not being factory hams or bacon, are sold or offered for sale; provided that only the said goods shall be sold or offered for sale between the said times by virtue of this Preduction and times by virtue of this Proclamation, and the said shops shall not be kept open for the sale or offering for sale of any other goods which cannot otherwise be lawfully sold or offered for sale between the times aforesaid.

# IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 257 of 1931.

 To the matter of an Application for amendment of Award No. 13 of 1929 made the 20th day of December, 1929, between Westralian Farmers, Ltd., and others, Applicants, and Australian Workers' Union Westralian Branch Pastoral and Agricultural Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Respondent.

The 17th day of November, 1932.

UPON hearing Mr. L. L. Carter, on behalf of the abovenamed applicant, and Mr. A. Watts, on behalf of the abovenamed respondent, and the evidence adduced on behalf of the parties respectively, the Court doth hereby order and declare that Award No. 13 of 1929, delivered on the 20th day of December, 1929, be and the same is hereby amended as follows:—

### 1. Wages:

- (a) Basic wage, South-West Land Division, excepting the Metropolitan Area: Adult males at the rate of £3 12s. 6d. per week.
- (b) The minimum time rate of wages to be paid by any employer bound by the Award to workers employed in carrying or stacking or handling bagged wheat, or in work connected therewith, shall be (with the exceptions hereinafter mentioned):—
  - 15s. per day or for any continuous part of a day exceeding half the ordinary hours of work;

7s. 6d. per day; or for any continuous part of a day not exceeding half the ordinary hours of work.

The exceptions are:

- (a) If employed in roofing stacks or as sampler or tally-clerk, 15s. 6d. per day (or for any part of a day exceeding four hours);
- (b) if employed at or in connection with flour mills and regular workers of the mill this Award shall not apply,
- (c) The minimum piece rate of wages to be paid by any employer bound by the Award to workers employed in carrying wheat bags or in lifting them on to men's shoulders shall be (subject to the condition following) 7s. per 100 bags.

The condition is that if the total wages received for ordinary hours under the piece-work contract and for its term be less than 18s. 9d. per week day, the deficiency shall be paid to the worker but not exceeding 8s. 4d. per 100 bags.

### 2: Appliances:

Any driver, horse, or hoisting whip that the employer bound by the Award wants to be used for the work shall be provided by him.

3. Holidays:

Workers shall be entitled to the following holidays in addition to Sundays:—

New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Eight Hours' Day, King's Birthday, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, or such day as is observed in the locality as a substitute for any of the said days.

#### 4. Hours:

The ordinary hours of work shall not exceed eight hours per day between 7.30 a.m. and 6 p.m. (or on Saturday noon), to be selected by the employer bound by the Award or 44 hours per week.

For any time of duty beyound the ordinary hours, each worker on time rate shall be paid at the rate of time and a half and for any time of duty on any Sunday or holiday at double rate.

For any time of duty beyond the ordinary hours on any Sunday or holiday each worker on piece rate shall be paid at the rate of 8s. 4d. per 100 bags.

Where a worker on time rate has to work on any one day at more than one kind of job, he shall be entitled to be paid for all time of duty on that day as if he performed all that time such kind of job as carries the highest rate of pay under this Award.

5. Inspection of Books:

Any officer authorised by the Union may, on any day for the purpose of investigating any alleged breaches of the Award, and after giving notice in writing to an employer bound by this Award, or his agent or subcontractor, enter any premises on which the employer bound by the Award has operations carried on and inspect the stack workings and speak to workers.

6. Contractors or Sub-agents:

No employer bound by the Award shall permit any of the operations referred to in this Award to be carried on or functions exercised, so far as regards his wheat or on his land by a contractor or other person, except in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Award, as if the contractor or other person were himself an employer bound by the Award.

7. Definitions:

- "Worker" in this Award applies only to an adult worker.
- "His wheat," in reference to an employer bound by this Award, includes not only wheat which he owns but wheat as to which he is bailee or agent.
- "His land," in reference to an employer bound by this Award, includes not only property which he owns but land which he is permitted to occupy or use.

8. Term:

This Award shall continue in force for a period of six months from the date hereof.

9. The foregoing provisions are intended to be read and construed as the Award applicable to the industry. Any further or other provisions in the original Award (No. 13 of 1929) are hereby rescinded.

  - (b) When the services of the worker are not required on any day or days, the employer shall give the worker one day's notice thereof;

- (a) In the event of the employer employing the worker for a lesser number of hours than forty-four per week, he is hereby authorised and empowered to reduce the wages, as prescribed in Schedule No. 1, pro rata, but the deduction shall not reduce the wages below the amount payable for 29% hours per week on such pro rata basis:
- (b) When the services of the worker are not required on any day or days, the employer shall give the worker one day's notice thereof;
- (e) The reduced hours per week mentioned in (a) shall be worked at the convenience of the em-
- (d) When lesser hours per week are worked, holidays, as prescribed in Clause 6, or pay in lieu thereof, shall be reduced pro rata;
- (e) The provisions as to overtime in Clause 5 shall not be affected hereby, nor shall the worker's right to a day's notice in the event of his being dismissed permanently from his employ-
- (2) The term "worker" herein shall, where the context so permits, include an apprentice, junior worker, and cadet.

(a) Subclause (1), Casual Hands:—Insert the following words at the end hereof:—

Provided, however, that the provisions of this clause shall not apply in the case of a worker whose employment is rationed under or in pursuance of any scheme for the relief of unemployment; such worker shall be paid in accordance with the scale set forth in Clause 1 calculated on an hourly basis.

- (b) Subclause (9), District or Camp Allowance:—
  (i) Omit the words "one shilling (1s.) per day" in the fourth line and insert in lieu thereof "five shillings" and threepence (5s. 3d.) per week."
- (ii) Insert the following words at the end thereof:-When satisfactory accommodation is made available by the Department, such allowance shall not be payable to any worker whose camp location is fixed for a period of six months or longer. Should any dispute or difference arise between the parties under this clause the same shall be referred to a Board of Reference appointed pursuant to Section 87 of the Act.
- Clause 4—Hours:
- (i) Subclause (a): Omit this subclause and insert the following in lieu thereof:-
- (a) Subject and, except where otherwise specifically provided, forty-eight (48) hours shall represent a week's work. On the first five days of the week, eight (8) hours a day may be exceeded by such a period as will make up for a short day on Saturday. A week's work for stablemen shall consist of seven (7) shifts

of eight hours, when required by the engineer: Provided, however, that in the case of the following the weekly hours shall remain as at present, namely:—

- (a) Labourers on construction and reconstruction work, and other workers whose occupations connect them so directly with such labourers as to require them to commence and cease work simultaneously therewith: Provided, however, that construction and reconstruction work shall not include repair work or work incidental thereto or house connections for the Water Supply and Sewerage Department now usually done by maintenance workers and not extending over a period of one week for completion;
- (b) Workers in trenches, the depth of which is five feet or more below the natural surface of the ground;
- (e) Workers in tunnels or shafts.
- (ii) Subclause (c): Omit the words "the monthly special leave applicable to watchmen" and insert in lieu thereof:

"two days special leave on pay at the completion of each calendar month's service. Such leave shall not be allowed to accumulate."

(iii) Subclause (d): Omit the words "two days" in the third line and insert in lieu thereof the words "one day's."

#### 3 Clause 14—Contract of Service:

Subclause (a): Omit the words "per week of forty-four hours" and insert in lieu thereof the following "per week of forty-four or forty-eight hours, as the case may be."

Part 2-Goldfields Water Supply Section.

4. Clause 2-Contract of Service:

Subclause (a): Omit the words and figures "per week of 44 hours" and insert in lieu thereof the following, "per week of 44 or 48 hours, as the case may be."

### 5. Clause 6-Hours:

- (i) Subclause (a): Omit this subclause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—
- (a) Subject to subclauses (b), (c), and (d) forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work. On the first five days of the week eight hours a day may be exceeded by such a period as will make up for a short day on Saturday.

Provided, however, that in the case of the workers undermentioned the weekly hours of work shall remain as at present, namely:—

- (a) Labourers on construction and reconstruction work and other workers whose occupations connect them so directly with such labourers as to require them to commence and cease work simultaneously therewith: Provided, however, that construction and reconstruction work shall not include repair work or work incidental thereto, or house connections now usually done by maintenance workers and not extending over a period of one week for completion;
- (b) Workers in trenches, the depth of which is five feet or more below the natural surface of the ground;
- (c) Workers in tunnels or shafts.
- (ii) Subclause (d): Omit this subclause and insert in lieu thereof the following:
- (d) Firemen and greasers shall be paid as for the total number of hours (equal to an average of eight hours per day) constituting each respective pay period, whether such time shall have been actually worked or not: Provided that, if the worker is absent through sickness or other personal cause, he shall be paid only for the time actually worked.
