WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from-(a) taking fish of any specified species, by any specified means of capture; (b) taking any fish whatsover, by any specified means of capture; (c) taking any fish whatsoever, by any means of capture whatsover, in any specified portion of Western Australian waters during any specified time, in any specified year, or during a specified portion of every year: And whereas the "Crayfish" is a prescribed species of fish within the meaning of the hereinbefore recited provisions: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut. Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:-

That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the taking of "Crayfish" by means of pots or "cribs," hoop nets, or meshing nets, from the 1st day of January, 1933, until the 31st day of December, 1933.

### Locality Schedule.

- (a) The whole of the waters of Rottnest Island within a radius of half-a-mile from the line of foreshore
  - (b) The waters of the Swan River and its tributaries.
  - (c) The waters of Koombana Bay (Bunbury).

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut. Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of January, 1933, until the 31st day of December, 1933, inclusive.

### Schedule.

Carlecatup Creek (near Kojonup):-The whole of the waters of Carlecatup Creek.

Hotham River.—The whole of the waters of the Hotham River.

Salt River (or Pallinup Estuary): - The whole of the waters of the Salt River (or Pallinup Estuary).

Bremer (or Wellstead) Estuary:—The whole of the waters of the Bremer (or Wellstead) Estuary.

Wilson's Inlet (Channel Entrance):—The whole of the waters of the Channel Entrance to Wilson's inlet South of a line drawn from the North-Western corner of Block No. 1828 on the Eastern side of the said Iulet to the North-Eastern corner of Block No. 2014 on the Western side of the Inlet.

Scarborough Beach.—All that area of Western Australian waters at Scarborough Beach commencing at the Western extremity of Pool Street and extending in a Southerly direction to the Western extremity of Manning Street and to a width of one-half mile from high-water

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from (a) taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture; (b) taking any fish whatsoever by any specified means of capture; (c) taking any fish whatsoever, by any means of capture whatsover in any specified portion of Western Australian waters during any specified time, in any specified year, or during a specified portion of any year: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of any other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:-

(1) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the First Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the First day of January, 1933, until the Thirtieth day of April, 1933, and as from the First day of August, 1933, until the Thirty-first day of December, 1933, inclusive.

- (2) That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Second Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the First day of January, 1933, until the Thirty-first day of March, 1933, and from the First day of October, 1933, until the Thirty-first day of December, 1933, inclusive.
- (3) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Third Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the First day of January, 1933, until the Twenty-third day of March, 1933, and from the Sixteenth day of May, 1933, until the Thirty-first day of December, 1933, inclusive.
- (4) That all that portion of Western Australian waters defined in the Fourth Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the taking of English Perch by any method of capture as from the First day of July, 1933, until the Thirty-first day of October, 1933, inclusive.
- (5) That all those waters mentioned in the Fifth Locality Schedule attached hereto shall be closed against the use of sunk or set nets as from the First day of January, 1933, until the Thirty-first day of December, 1933. inclusive.

### First Locality Schedule.

All that portion of the ocean waters of Rottnest Island lying West of the North-Eastern extremity of North Point (on the Northern side of the said Island) and West of the South-Western extremity of Salmon Point (on the Southern side of the said Island) and within the sea limits of half-a-mile from the foreshore.

### Second Locality Schedule.

- (a) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending from the North-Western side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half-a-mile along the Foreshore and a quarter-of-a-mile into the waters of the said bay.
- That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending from the South-Eastern side of the "Fish Rock" to a point half-a-mile along the Foreshore and a quarter-of-a-mile into the waters of the said bay.

### Third Locality Schedule.

That portion of the ocean waters near the entrance to Peel's Inlet bounded by the following lines:—On the West by a line drawn in a Northerly direction for a quarter-of-a-mile from the extremity of Robert Point (on the Western side of the Bar); thence by a line running in an Easterly direction until it meets the Foreshore of the mainland (on the Eastern side of the entrance to Peel's Inlet); thence in a generally Southerly direction along the line of Foreshore to the Bar; thence by a line in a generally Westerly direction to the Western point of entrance to the Bar; and thence in a generally Westerly direction along the line of Foreshore to the point of commencement.

### Fourth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the waters of the Capel River (near Bunbury) including the creeks flowing into it.

### Fifth Locality Schedule.

The whole of the Canning River situated between a line drawn from the Northernmost extremity of Coffee Point to the North-Western extremity of Cale Street and the Lower Canning Bridge.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proelamation prohibit (inter alia) all persons from-(a) taking fish of any specified species by any specified means of capture, in any specified portion of Western Australian waters, during any specified time, in any specified year, or during a specified portion of any year: And whereas the "Prawn" is a prescribed species of fish within the meaning of this provision: And whereas, by Section 17 of the same Act, the Governor may by Proclamation declare what length and depth of net and size of mesh for the whole or any part of a fishing net shall when used or intended to be used in any specified water or waters, or for catching any specified kind or kinds of fish, be a lawful net: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:-

That those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule shall be closed against the taking of "Prawns" by means of any net other than a hand-scoop net (such net not to exceed a total length of nine feet upon either the cork line or lead line), from the 1st day of January, 1933, until the 31st day of December, 1933, inclusive; and, further, that any net which does not exceed 25 fathoms in length and has a mesh throughout the whole of the net of not less than one-half inch measured from knot to knot on the inside of the mesh, when wetted ready for use and stretched so that the opposite knots on the alternate corners are in contact, shall be a lawful net when used or intended to be used for the capture of "Prawns" in any Western Australian waters, except those portions defined in the

Schedule hereto.

### Schedule.

That portion of the Swan River extending in a Westerly and Southerly direction downwards to its entrance at Fremantle from a line drawn from the Point Walter (Walter Point) to Point Resolution, and the Swan River and its tributaries extending upwards in a Northerly and North-Easterly direction to its head from the Narrows at Mill Point.

That portion of the Canning River and its tributaries upwards to its head from the Lower Canning Bridge.

WHEREAS it is provided by "The Game Act, 1912-13," that the Governor may by Proclamation declare from time to time that any bird or animal indigenous to Western Australia shall be at all time strictly preserved, cither generally throughout the State or in any one or more portions thereof: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut. Governor and Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power aforesaid, do hereby declare that the Opossum shall be at all times strictly preserved generally throughout the State from the 1st day of January, 1933, until the 31st day of December, 1933.

WHEREAS by Section 122, Subsection (1), of "The Health Act, 1911-26," it is provided that no building shall be erected within any Municipal District unless and until plans and specifications thereof have been submitted by the owner or occupier to and have been approved in relation to ventilation, lighting, and sanitary construction, and also as to the area of the open space appurtenant to such building by the local authority: And whereas under Subsection (2) of Section 122, the Governor may from time to time declare by Proclamation that Subsection (1) of the said section shall apply in any other District, or in any portion of any other District, and may at any time revoke any such Proclamation, and, while such declaration remains in force, Subsection (1) of the said section shall apply in any such district or portion of such District as if it were a municipal district: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut. Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby by this Proclamation declare that Subsection (1) of Section 122 shall apply to the Moora Local Board of Health District.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in Section 74 of "The Constitution Act, 1889," whereby the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council does not apply to minor appointments, which by Order in Councit are vested in the Heads of Departments or other officers or persons within the State: And whereas it is desirable that the appointment of foremen and all other persons employed at a daily wage on water supply, Sewerage and drainage works under the control of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Department should be vested in various officers: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby further amends Schedule appended to the Order in Council gazetted on the 28th May, 1920, by the addition of the name of L. T. Kevan, as from 14th November, 1932, and of any person or persons appointed to temporarily act in the place of such officer.

### Forests Act, 1918. ORDER IN COUNCIL. .

WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown Land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner: - (a) the Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation; (b) after such proposal has been laid before Parliament, the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication: And whereas His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the twenty-fourth day of August, 1932, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest: And whereas, after such proposal had been laid before Parliament, a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forests Nos. 20 and 22 by excising those portions of such State Forests as are described in the Schedule hereto.

Public Works Act, 1902. Scarborough School. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 716/32; Ex. Co. No. 2285. WHEREAS by Section 11 of "The Public Works Act, 1902," it is made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to authorise the Minister to undertake, construct, or provide any public work (subject as to Railways to Section 96), and such authorisation shall be deemed an authority to such Minister by and under that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut-Governor and Administrator, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the recited section of "The Public Works Act, 1902," doth hereby authorise the Honourable Minister for Works to provide and construct a School at Scarborough (and right-of-way diversions) on the land shown coloured green and blue on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 27212 (L.T.O. Diagram 9283), which may be inspected at the office of the Minister for Works, Perth.

### Stock Diseases Act, 1895. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 5 of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," that the Governor may by Order in Council, to be published in the Government Gazette, from time to time prohibit the introduction or importation into this State, either by sea or land, of any stock from any country or place: And whereas a disease known as "Pseudo Poultry Plague" has broken out amongst poultry and birds in the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by reason whereof not only poultry and birds but the eggs of roultry and birds exported from the said State of Victoria are or are likely to be infected with the said disease, and, if introduced or imported into this State, will or will be likely to introduce and spread the said disease in this State: And whereas it is deemed expedient to prohibit the introduction or importation into the State of Western Australia, either by sea or land, of any eggs from the said State of Victoria, being the product of poultry and birds in the said State of Victoria: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the said power and of all other powers thereto enabling him, doth hereby prohibit the introduction or importation into the State of Western Australia, either by sea or land, of any eggs from the said State of Victoria, being the product of any poultry and birds in the said State of Victoria until the publication in the Government Gazette of an Order in Council revoking this Order in Council, notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in Regulation 21 or the Second Schedule to the Stock Diseases Regulations, 1926, as published in the Government Gazette on the 5th day of August, 1927, or any amendment thereof.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 476 of 1930.

R. Purser and Others, Applicants, and Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Respondent.

The 3rd day of November, 1932.

HAVING heard the parties, and by consent thereof, the Court hereby orders and declares that Award No. 3 of 1929 is hereby amended so as to read as follows:—

### 1.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to the Industries mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereunder in respect of workers following the vocations mentioned herein: Provided that it shall not apply to workers who are at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia, or in any Industrial Agreement registered in accordance with "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925."

### 2.—Area.

This Award shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

### 3.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be three (3) years from the date hereof.

### 4.—Definitions.

In this Award, unless the context otherwise indi-

The term "Shop assistant" includes employees in Country Order Departments, cashiers, and carpet and linoleum layers and planners, and soda fountain assistants.

The term "Packer" means a person who packs goods for transport by rail or ship.

The term "Head storeman" means a person performing the duties of a storeman and who is in charge of one or more men.

The term "Storeman working singly" shall mean a storeman working where no other storeman is employed in the establishment.

The term "Despatch hand" shall mean an employee who may handle goods or receive goods from departments and passes them over to the packing room, or prepares and hands over packages to carters for delivery, and who shall be responsible for the proper checking off of such packages and for the proper branding and marking thereof and keeping necessary records, such as rail notes and cart notes.

"Female despatch hands," when making up orders or working in or about departments where a higher rate prevails, the rate for that department whilst so employed shall apply.

The term "Casual hand" shall mean an employee engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave the employer's service at any moment without notice: Provided, a casual hand shall be employed for not less than four hours in any one day. A person engaged and not permitted to commence work shall receive two hours' pay at ordinary rate of pay.

The term "Weekly hand" shall mean an employee engaged by the week and whose employment shall be terminable by not less than one week's notice on either side. Such week's notice cannot be continued from week to week: Provided, that any worker employed for a period of four consecutive weeks or less shall be classed as a casual hand and paid not less than the minimum rate of wages herein prescribed for a casual hand, but this proviso shall not apply in cases where a worker employed as a weekly hand has been dispensed with for incompetence or unsuitableness or any cause referred to in paragraph 17 hereof.

All persons employed in chemists' shops shall be subject to the terms of this Award up to the time he or she becomes indentured to the profession.

#### 5.-Hours.

The hours of work shall be as follows:-

(1) Retail Establishments:

Excepting as mentioned in Subclauses (a), (b), and (c) hereof forty-eight (48) hours shall constitute a week's work for males and forty-four (44) hours for females, and shall be worked between 8.20 a.m. and 6 p.m., from Monday to Friday inclusive, and 8.20 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturday. One hour shall be allowed for any meal.

Males under 16 years of age shall work for a period of eight hours exclusive of meal times, from Monday to Friday inclusive, and four hours on Saturday, subject to Subclauses (a), (b), and (c).

Any spread of hours for females shall not exceed nine (9).

One hour shall be allowed for any meal. Lunch hours to be taken between 12 noon and 2 p.m.

Provided, that the lunch hour for workers in retail establishments shall, during the first two days of each of three sales per annum and during Christmas week, be taken between the hours of 11.30 a.m. and 2.30 p.m.

The exceptions referred to are:-

- (a) Storemen, packers, and despatch hands over 16 years of age shall continue to work the hours usually and customarily worked by them prior to the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight: Provided, that such hours shall not exceed forty-eight per week, and forty-four hours per week in the case of juniors under 16 years of age. One hour shall be allowed for any meal. Lunch hour to be taken between 12 noon and 2 p.m.;
- (b) Messengers, cleaners, door-porters, lift attendants, and/or employees in shops comprised in the Fourth Schedule of "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," whose hours of work shall not exceed forty-eight per week for males over 16 years and forty-four per week for females or junior male employees under 16 years of age, shall be worked to suit the convenience of the employer. Upon engagement the employee shall be notified by the employer of the half day upon which his or her services will not be required in each week. One hour shall be allowed for any meal. Lunch hour shall be taken between 12 noon and 2 p.m.;

- (c) On the day mutually agreed upon by the parties hereto to be observed as Christmas Eve for the purpose of a late shopping night, the ordinary hours of work may be extended by agreement between the parties.
- (2) Wholesale Establishments:
- (a) The number of hours per week usually and customarily worked prior to the first day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-eight, shall be observed during the currency of this Award, but shall not exceed forty-eight hours per week for males over 16 years of age, and forty-four hours per week for junior male employees under 16 years of age: Provided, that the starting time shall not be earlier than 7.30 a.m. One hour shall be allowed for any meal. Lunch hour to be taken between 12 noon and 2 p.m.
- (b) Where any worker is required by his employer to commence work earlier than the other workers of such employer, notification of such worker's finishing time shall be given to him at such time.
- (c) No worker shall work overtime unless requested to do so by his employer.

### 6.-Meal Money.

With the exception of all employees whose duties are usually performed after 6 p.m. from Mondays to Fridays and after 1 p.m. on Saturday, all other employees referred to in Clause 4 hereof shall, if required to work after 6 p.m. from Monday to Friday or after 1 p.m. on Saturday, be paid one shilling and sixpense (1s. 6d.) for meal money.

#### 7.—Overtime.

(i) All time worked on Saturday afternoons, Sundays, and/or holidays prescribed in this Award shall be paid for at the rate of double time. For all other overtime the rate shall be time and a half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.

- (ii) All time worked before the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time shall be deemed to be overtime.
- (iii) In the computation of overtime each day's work shall stand by itself, but this proviso shall not apply to workers mentioned in Clause 5, Subsection (b), whose overtime shall commence, in the case of males, after forty-eight hours have been worked in any one week, and, in the case of females, after forty-four hours have been worked in any one week.

#### 8.—Holidays.

- (a) The following days shall be observed as holidays and paid for, namely:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.
- (b) A holiday of one week on full pay shall be granted to each employee on completion of each year of service. An employee not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holidays in proportion to the length of his or her service.

Provided, that when an employee is entitled to holidays under this clause, he shall receive at least two weeks' notice from his employer of the date when it will be convenient to the employer that such employee should take his holidays. Provided further, that this clause shall not apply in the case of any employee summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

### 9.—Wages.

(a) The minimum rate of wage payable to any male worker employed as a shop assistant who is of the age of twenty-one years or upwards, or to any female worker employed as a shop assistant who is of the age of twenty-one years or upwards, shall be as follows:—

10.

No person under the age of twenty-one years shall be engaged to work a lift.

Any person, whether a junior or adult, employed as a canvasser and/or collector shall be paid the full adult minimum wage.

### 12.

Where an employer usually has more than six employees engaged under the terms of this Award, he shall provide his employees with a suitable room for keeping their hats and clothing and to use as a room for taking their meals. Such room to be situated within a reasonable distance of his place of business and to be kept in a proper state of cleanliness.

13.

Provided always, and it is here expressly agreed and declared, that nothing in this Award shall apply to workers in any wholesale business (excepting wholesale workers in any wholesale business (excepting wholesale hardware) other than the following:—Head storeman, storeman, storeman working singly, packers, junior packers, junior storeman, junior despatch hands, casual packers, despatch hands, casual storemen, casual despatch hands (junior and adult), lift attendants, junior and adult messengers.

### 14.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Award was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his or her class of work.

### 15.—Higher Duties.

A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Award than that which he or she usually performs shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate whilst so employed.

### 16.—Proportion of Juniors.

(a) The number of male juniors, with the exception of junior packers, shall not exceed the proportion of one to one for the first five male seniors, and thereafter one junior to every two male seniors or fraction thereof.

Provided, that the number of junior packers shall not exceed the proportion of one junior to every four senior packers.

(b) Where no female assistant in receipt of the full adult wage is employed one junior female assistant may be employed.

Where one senior female assistant is employed two junior female assistants may be employed.

Where two senior female assistants are employed three junior female assistants may be employed.

Where three senior female assistants are employed four junior assistants may be employed.

Where four senior female assistants are employed five junior female assistants may be employed.

And thereafter the proportion shall not exceed five junior female assistants to four senior female assistants.

(e) In this clause the word "senior" shall mean a person of twenty-one years of age or over.

### 17.—Engagement.

One week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement: Provided, that an employer at any time may dismiss an employee for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct, or if, after receiving one week's notice, such employee does not carry out his or her duties in the same manner as he or she did prior to such notice.

### 18.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record containing the names of each of his workers to whom this Award applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each worker, the age of each junior worker and the time during which each worker has been employed. Such record shall be open to inspection by a representative of the Union between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on any working day from Monday to Friday inclusive.

### 19.—Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum adult wage prescribed by this Award may be employed at such lesser wage (if any) as may be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the applicant Union. within twenty-four hours after the worker has notified the secretary of his or her desire to work at a lesser wage than the said minimum the secretary and the worker do not agree as aforesaid, then the worker may apply to the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate for a permit to work at such lesser wage. The worker shall give to the said secretary at least twentyfour hours' notice in writing of his or her intention to make such application to the Magistrate, and the secretary or his agent shall be entitled to attend before the Magistrate and, pending the decision thereon in either ease, the worker shall be entitled to work and be employed by an employer at the proposed lesser rate. The Magistrate may grant such worker a permit to work for such wage and for such period not exceeding six calendar mouths, as he thinks fit, and his decision in the matter shall be final. The permit shall entitle the worker to work at the wage therein mentioned for such period as may be therein stated, until the wage shall have again been settled by the Magistrate on the application of the said secretary.

### 20.—Board of Reference.

The Court appoints for the purposes of the Award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of:—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
  (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates and con-
- (ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time;
- (iv) an appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Regulations to "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.
