Vermin Act, 1918. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 14 of "The Vermin Act, 1918," that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any defined portion of the State a Vermin District for the purposes of this Act and specify the boundaries of any such District, and may alter the boundaries of any such District, and may assign a name to and alter the name of any District: And it is also enceted by Section 45 of the said Ard And it is also enacted by Section 45 of the said Act that the Governor may appoint the Board of any Road District to be the Board of any Vermin District, the boundaries whereof are the same as those of the Road District or which is comprised in the Road District: And whereas by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of May, 1919, the Governor, in exercise of the said powers, constituted that portion of the Mullewa Road District which is situated within the South-West Division of the State a Vermin District, to be known as Mullewa Vermin District, and appointed the Mullewa Road Board to be the Board of the said Vermin District: And whereas it is now deemed expedient to constitute the whole of the said Mullewa Road District as at present constituted under "The Road Districts Act, 1919," to be a Vermin District, by the said name Mullewa Vermin District, and to alter the boundaries of the said Vermin District accordingly, and also to appoint the Mullewa Road Board to be the Board of the Mullewa Vermin District, with the boundaries thereof altered as aforesaid: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the said powers, doth hereby constitute the whole of the Mullewa Road District as at present constituted under "The Road Districts Act, 1919," a Vermin District under and for the purposes of "The Vermin Act, 1918," to be known as Mullewa Vermin District: And doth hereby alter the boundaries of the Mullewa Vermin District as hitherto constituted accordingly. The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Water Supply Improvements—City of Perth:—Proposed 6-inch diameter water main along Spring Street and Mount's Bay Road from Mount Street to Lot No. 74, Mount's Bay Road (length about 52 chains), with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus, and the lifting of about 17 chains of existing 4-inch mains as indicated in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 5229.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 24th day of February, 1933.

THE FINANCIAL EMERGENCY TAX ASSESSMENT ACT, No. 20 of 1932.

HIS Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator in Council has been pleased to make Regulations as follows, under the provisions of "The Financial Emergency Tax Assessment Act, No. 20 of 1932."

REGULATIONS UNDER THE FINANCIAL EMERGENCY TAX ASSESSMENT ACT, 1932.

(No. 20 of 1932.)

Commencement.

1. These Regulations will come into force on publication thereof in the Government Gazette.

Short Title.

2. These Regulations may be cited as "The Financial Emergency Tax Assessment Act Regulations."

Interpretation.

3. These Regulations shall be construed with reference to the terms and interpretations of the Financial Emergency Tax Assessment Act, No. 20 of 1932, which Act is referred to hereunder as "the Act."

Definition.

4. In these Regulations-

"Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Taxation.

- "Contract" means an agreement or mutual promise, written or verbal, upon lawful consideration or cause which binds the parties to a performance.
- "Employer" means a person who employs clerks, workmen, or other persons working for salaries or wages, fees or other remuneration.
- "Old age and invalid pension" means an old age or invalid pension under "The Invalid and Old Age Pension Act, 1908."
- "Payment" includes the value of a thing given other than money in discharge of a debt.
- "Salary" and/or "wages" include all emoluments such as directors' fees, commission, overtime, higher duties allowance, child endowment and district and other allowances, but not including travelling and motor car allowances.
- "Members of a family" meaning wife or husband, father, mother, grandfather, grandmother, step-father, step-mother, son, daughter, legitimate son, legitimate daughter, grandson, grand-daughter, step-son, step-daughter, brother, sister, half-brother, half-sister, and, with respect to an illegitimate person, includes his mother, and his brothers and sisters, whether legitimate or illegitimate by the same father and mother.

"Taxpayer" means a person liable for taxation under the Act.

Exemptions, Section 4.

- 5. Every person—
 - (a) in receipt of old age and invalid pension; or
 - (b) in receipt of salary or wages under twenty-one shillings a week and having no other source of income; or
 - (c) whose income, including salary or wages (if any) is under fifty-two pounds a year; or
 - (d) in receipt of a salary or wage under one pound a week, plus board and lodging;
 - (e) in receipt of salary or wages exceeding twenty-one shillings a week but under two pounds a week, and having no other source of income, or in receipt of income, including salary or wages, exceeding fifty-two pounds a year but under one hundred and four pounds a year, who proves to the satisfaction of the Commissioner that they are regularly maintaining or contributing to the maintenance of one or more members of their family who is or are resident and domiciled in Western Australia; or
- (f) being a racing club, which is not established or carried on for the pecuniary benefit of the individual members thereof,

shall be exempt from liability to pay tax:

Provided also, that in assessing the amounts liable to tax-

(i) pension granted for war service and paid by the Commonwealth Government shall not be taken into account; and

Value of Board and Lodgings, Section 3.

- (i) Board and lodging supplied by an employer to his employee who is receiving wages in cash not less than one pound a week shall be deemed to be equivalent to additional wages at the rate of one pound a week;
- (ii) the board and lodgings also supplied to the employee's wife and dependent children shall be assessed to the employee at the rates assessed under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1931";
- (iii) board and lodging supplied by an employer and valued by him at less than one pound per week shall be taken into consideration at the value assessed by the employer;
- (iv) when board only is supplied by an employer it shall, for the purposes of the Act, be valued at 13s. per week, and, when lodging only is supplied by the employer, it shall be valued at 7s. per week.

Provided also, that a person in receipt of payments from a superannuation fund to which he has contributed, shall be exempt from liability to taxation under this Act in respect of a proportionate part of each payment received by him as aforesaid in ratio to the amount of his contribution to such superannuation fund.

It is further provided that persons claiming exemption from payment of tax under Subclause (d) of this Regulation are required to fill in Form F.E. No. 4 of Schedule 1.

Regulations "Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1931," Section 5. Tax in respect of Income.

6. The provisions of the Regulations under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1931," and any amendment thereof, as in force immediately preceding the date of these Regulations relating to assessment and collection of income tax shall apply to and in respect of the assessment and collection of tax under the Act.

Notice to make Returns, Section 7.

7. Public notice shall be given in the Government Gazette annually of the time and place at which all persons liable to taxation under the Act personally or in any representative capacity shall furnish returns for the purpose of assessment, and returns shall be in the Form F.E. 5 of Schedule 1.

Provided that any person who has furnished an Income Tax return under the Land and Income Tax Assessment Act or a return under "The Hospital Fund Act, 1930," for the year ended 30th June, 1932, or any subsequent year, shall not be required to furnish a return of income under the Act.

Tax in respect of Income exempt from Taxation, Section 7.

8. If any person, other than a salary or wage earner, is not required to furnish an income tax return to the Commissioner of Taxation for the purpose of assessment under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1931," of his income for the year ended the 30th day of June, 1932, or a return under "The Hospital Fund Act, 1930," or any subsequent year, on the ground that his income is of such amount, or is derived from such a source as to be exempt from income tax or Hospital Fund contribution, or for any other reason, such person shall furnish a return of his income for 30th June, 1932, on Form F.E. No. 5 of Schedule 1, to the Commissioner of Taxation not later than the 31st of March, 1933, or for any subsequent year on or before the 31st day of August.

Return of Income, Section 7.

9. A return of income by any taxpayer, except where the return has been lodged for the purpose of assessment under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1931," or "The Hospital Fund Act, 1930," shall be on the Form F.E. No. 5, in Schedule 1, and shall be furnished at the time and place prescribed in the notice given in accordance with Regulations 7 and 8.

Special Returns.

10. The Commissioner may at any time accept a return or notice in a form substantially similar to the prescribed form.

Taxpayers to take necessary steps for Lodgment of Returns.

11. Whenever a taxpayer is required by the Act, the Regulations, or the Commissioner to furnish a return to the Commissioner, it shall be the duty of that taxpayer to make the required return, and to take all steps necessary to ensure that the return is received by the Commissioner at the place where under these Regulations the return is to be furnished.

Addresses of Taxpayers.

- 12. (a) Every taxpayer shall, upon every return, give an address in Western Australia for service of Notice of Assessment, and shall from time to time give notice to the Commissioner of any change in his address within one calendar month after such change, and, in default, shall not be permitted to avail himself of the fact of such change of address in defence in any proceedings which may be instituted against him for any breach of the Act or Regulations.
- (b) For the purpose of any notice under the Act or these Regulations, where not otherwise provided, the address given by any taxpayer in accordance with the Regulation shall be deemed to be his last known place of business or abode, as the case may be.

Returns to be signed by Taxpayer.

13. Every return shall be signed by the taxpayer or by some person authorised by the taxpayer in that behalf, or, in the case of a company, by the public officer nominated under Section 45 of "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1931." If the taxpayer is unable to write his name, his signature shall be made by a mark attested by a witness.

Instructions may be Endorsed.

14. Such instructions and observations as the Commissioner may think fit may be endorsed or noted on any form of return, and reference to such instructions or observations may be inserted in the form or appended thereto.

Notice of Assessment under Section 5.

15. The notice of assessment of Financial Emergency Tax shall be in the Form F.E. No. 1, Schedule 1.

Tax in respect of Income, Section 5.

- 16. In cases in which an employed person returns income from investments or a business, or any other source except salary or wages, an assessment must be issued on such income separately. For the year ended the thirtieth day of June. 1932, the income liable for tax shall be seven-twelfths (7/12ths) of the net income as assessed under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1931." The net income liable for taxation shall be the income chargeable as assessed under the Land and Income Tax Assessment Act after adding thereto deductions allowed for—(a) general exemption; (b) repairs to dwelling-house; (c) premium of life insurance or fidelity bond; (d) medical expenses; (e) travelling expenses (including members of Parliament allowances); (f) children; (g) dependants; (h) capital expenditure on a mining tenement; or (i) gifts; (k) rates and taxes, except rates and taxes paid on property used in the production of income.
 - (a) Tax under the Act shall be payable in each year of assessment under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1931," and shall be calculated on and payable in respect of the income of the taxpayer for the year next preceding the year of assessment.
 - (b) Any person who has furnished to the Commissioner of Taxation an Income Tax return under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1931," for the year ended 30th June, 1932, or any subsequent year, and has not included in that return income that is exempt from income tax, but which is subject to tax under the Act, shall immediately notify the Commissioner in writing, or furnish a return to him under the Act, of the total amount of such income.

Any person failing to comply with this Regulation is liable to a penalty of not exceeding twenty pounds.

Default Assessments, Section 6.

17. If an assessment is made by the Commissioner of Taxation under Section 43 of "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1931" (assessment in case of default), tax in respect of the income of any person so assessed shall be due to the Department and payable to the Commissioner of Taxation on behalf of the Department, and Section 5 of the Act shall apply.

Minimum Assessments-Method of Issue-Due date of Payment.

18. No assessment of less than one shilling and twopence shall issue, and no assessment under two shillings and threepence shall issue where the person is not assessed for State income tax. All assessments under the Act shall issue at the same time as assessments for income tax under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act. 1907-1931," or dividend duty under "The Dividend Duties Act, 1902." All assessments under the Act shall be due and payable on the date shown on the notice of assessment.

Postage to be Prepaid.

19. Postage on every return, statement, communication, remittance, or other matter sent by post addressed to the Commissioner shall be fully prepaid by the sender.

Copies of Returns.

20. A copy of or extract from a return of any taxpayer may, subject to the approval of the Commissioner, and upon payment of the prescribed fee (1s.), be supplied only to the taxpayer himself, or to some person authorised by the taxpayer in writing in that behalf.

Payment of Tax.

- 21. An employer may pay the tax, where deducted other than by means of adhesive stamps, in any of the following ways:—
 - (a) By delivery of cash, bank notes, or cheques to the Commissioner, at the Taxation Department, G.P.O. Buildings, Forrest Place, Perth.
 - (b) By remitting the tax to the Commissioner by bank draft or cheque, or postal money order or postal note, payable in the city to which the remittance is sent.

(c) By depositing the net amount of the tax to the credit of the State Commissioner of Taxation at any branch of the Commonwealth Bank in Western Australia, or by paying the tax to any State Department.

All tax in respect of salaries and wages paid must be remitted to the Commissioner of Taxation within seven days of such payment, or within seven days of the end of each month, in those cases where the Commissioner has approved of monthly remittances.

Post Office to be Agent of Remitter.

22. When a remittance is posted by a taxpayer addressed to the State Commissioner, the Post Office shall be deemed to be the agent of the remitter, and payment shall not be deemed to have been made until the remittance has been received by the addressee. All remittances must be accompanied by a memorandum signed by the employer or his authorised agent, giving the period of payment of wages, number of taxpayers (employees), and total amount of wages paid, and upon which the tax is levied.

Payment by Cheque.

23. When a cheque has been delivered or remitted to the Commissioner in payment of tax, the tax shall (notwithstanding any receipt given therefor) not be deemed to have been paid until the amount of the cheque has been collected.

Receipts to be Issued.

24. Receipts for tax shall be issued by such person as the Commissioner may authorise, and shall be in the form F.E. No. 2, Schedule 1.

Part Payment not to be Accepted.

25. Except with the express consent of the Commissioner, no money shall be accepted on account or in part payment of the tax.

Insufficient Postage.

26. When any sum is received as payment of tax, the Commissioner shall first deduct therefrom the amount of postage and surcharge (if any) paid upon any unstamped or insufficiently stamped matter received through the post from the taxpayer, and shall credit in payment of the tax only the net amount then remaining.

Tax in respect of Salary and Wages.

27. For the purpose of paragraph (e) (i) and (ii) of Section 9 of the Act, any person paying salary or wages may select the method of collection either by means of adhesive stamps of the requisite value attached to the pay-sheet, or by deducting from the salary or wages payable by him contributions to the Fund and paying as prescribed to the Commissioner, and once the method of collection has been selected or adopted, no departure from the saic method can be allowed without the express permission of the Commissioner.

Drawings by Principals and Partners not Liable.

28. Drawings by the principal or partners in any business, either as salary or wages, or in anticipation of profits, shall not be liable for tax under Section 9 of the Act, but will be assessed by the Commissioner under Section 5, in conjunction with the other income of the business.

Adhesiv Stamps.

29. The adhesive stamps to be used in connection with deductions of tax under the Act shall be of the form and size as prescribed in Schedule 3; such stamps shall be printed by the Government Printer only.

State Treasurer to Issue Stamps.

30. The State Under Treasurer for the time being shall be the only person authorised to control and issue on the part of the Commissioner stamps for sale to persons authorised to sell stamps by the State Under Treasurer or the State Commissioner of Taxation.

All advances for stamps shall be properly recorded and shall be balanced monthly. A remittance of the value of the stamps sold shall accompany every application for fresh supply or recoup of the stamps sold.

Collection of Tax fr m Casual Employees.

31. Every employer of a casual employee shall see that payment of tax is made by means of adhesive stamps of the requisite value, to be affixed to a casual employee wages book, where any payment amounts to fifteen shillings or over (inclusiv of any remuneration by way of sustenance), and is either at a daily rate or in the nature of a contract.

Such wages book in the Form F.E. No. 6 of Schedule 1 will be supplied by the Department on the application of any casual employee, and non-production thereof on the demand of an employer renders the employee liable to a penalty of twenty pounds.

Where any payment without board and lodging amounts to less than 21s. per week, no tax is due, but where the payments in any week amount to £1, and, in addition thereto, board and lodging is received, adhesive stamps of the requisite value of the aggregate of any casual labour during any week must be attached at the termination thereof. For example—Where an employee such as a gardener or charwoman is employed by several employers, and where the weekly or periodical payment for wages totals £1 per week or more, and, in addition, board and lodging is received, such employee shall keep the prescribed book in which all payments for wages shall be entered, and the employee shall affix Financial Emergency stamps to the value applicable to the total payments received during the week, and shall cancel such stamps by initialing and dating the face thereof.

Cancellation of adhesive Stamps.

32. All adhesive stamps attached to wages sheets, wages books, receipts, or other documents, and used in payment of tax, shall be cancelled by the employer, employee or paying officer by writing his name or initials and correct date of writing across the face of the stamps. Any person authorised by the Minister or the Commissioner may cancel stamps used in respect to the payment of tax.

Failure to cancel involves a penalty of twenty pounds.

Overlapping of Stamps.

When attaching adhesive stamps to wages sheets, wages books, receipts or other documents, they shall be so attached that one stamp does not overlap another for more than half the length of the stamp.

Fractional Tax.

33. Where the tax payable by a taxpayer amounts to $4\frac{1}{2}$ d., 1s. $1\frac{1}{2}$ d., and so on, the employer or paying officer shall deduct the next highest penny in such cases, viz., 5d., 1s. 2d., and so on, and from the next following payment the employer shall deduct 4d., 1s. 1d., and so on, or, subject to special arrangement, with approval of the Commissioner, the odd halfpennies due in respect to any contribution may be deducted at the end of each month or quarter.

Stamping of Salary and Wages Sheets, Wages Books, etc.

34. Where two or more employees are engaged by an employer, and each employee is subject to a deduction from his salary or wage for tax, it shall not be necessary for the employer to attache to the salary or wages sheet, receipt, or salary or wages book signed by each employee a stamp for the amount of each employee's tax, but stamps to the aggregate value of the total tax of all the employees may be attached to the salary or wages sheets, receipt, or salary or wages book (for example see Schedule 2).

Payments in respect of Contracts, Section 9, Subsection (3).

35. All payments in respect to any contract for work done or labour performed, including clearing, shearing, droving, and carting made by any person shall be deemed to be wages within the meaning of the Act. Every person making such payments shall deduct the amount of the tax due thereon, and shall pay the amount of such tax to the Commissioner of Taxation in the manner prescribed, or he may purchase Financial Emergency Tax stamps to the value of such tax and attach the stamps to the receipts, wages sheets, wages book, or other document in use, and shall cancel the stamps in the manner prescribed. In respect to contracts for shearing, the following deductions shall be allowed from each payment made by the employer or other person making such payments to:—Shearers, 3s. 6d. in the £; shed hands, 2.0d. in the £ (adults); shed hands, 3.0d. in the £ (18 to 21 years); shed hands, 2.6d. in the £ (under 18 years); pressers, 2.0d. in the £; cooks, 2.0d. in the £.

Where a lump sum is paid by a pastoralist, farmer, or any other person to a contractor who employs a number of shearers and other men in the shearing of sheep, and that contractor is unable to produce evidence from the Commissioner that he has furnished an income tax return, a return under this Act or "The Hospital Fund Act, 1931," deductions must be made by the pastoralists, etc., but no deduction for expenses is to be allowed to the contractor beyond the deductions mentioned in the previous paragraph.

In respect to contracts for carting of super., wheat, oats, and other farm produce by a contractor using motor transport, a deduction of 50 per cent. of the contract payment shall be allowed to cover cost of transport, unless the contractor produces evidence from the Commissioner that he has furnished an income tax return, or a return under this Act or the Hospital Fund Act, and in such case no deduction is necessary when payments are made to the contractor.

Financial Emergency Tax must, however, be deducted by the contractor when paying wages, etc., to any of his employees.

Any contractor claiming deduction for expenses beyond those covered by these Regulations, and allowable as a deduction from payments made, must make application for same to the Commissioner of Taxation at the time of furnishing his income tax return or a return of income under the Act.

In the case of contractors receiving progress and final payments on account of contracts who are also returners for income tax purposes, under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1931," or for tax under this Act, no deduction by means of adhesive stamps or otherwise shall be made therefrom on account of tax, conditionally that a certificate is given by the Commissioner to the effect that the contractor is a returner under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1931," or "The Financial Emergency Tax Assessment Act, 1932."

(a.) Where any employer (person, firm, or company) paying commission regularly to a number of agents or other persons, desires exemption from collecting the tax at the time of payment of the commission, such employer may furnish to the Commissioner a list of the names, occupations, and addresses of the persons to whom commission is payable, and the Commissioner, on being satisfied that the persons receiving commission have furnished an income return under this Act or "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1931," may, in his discretion, grant to such employer exemption from liability to deduct tax under Section 9 of the Act. (Form F.E. No. 3, Schedule 1.)

Each certificate of exemption granted under Section 9 or this Regulation shall be numbered, and such number shall be quoted against every payment made for commission to the persons mentioned in such certificate.

Use of Adhesive Stamps for payment of Emergency Tax and Hospital Contributions.

(b.) Care must be exercised in seeing that only Financial Emergency Tax Stamps are used for payment of tax where tax is payable under Section 9 of the Act. Hospital Fund Stamps must not on any account be used for this purpose, nor must Financial Emergency Tax Stamps be used in connection with payment of Hospital Fund contributions.

Payment of Tax by Cash or Cheque.

(c.) Where an employer elects to pay Financial Emergency Tax and Hospital Fund contributions by each or cheque to the Commissioner of Taxation, or to any officer authorised by him to collect tax, he shall forward with each remittance a correct statement of the amount of Emergency Tax and the amount of Hospital Contribution.

Tax payable by Companies, Section 8.

36. Every company subject to "The Dividend Duties Act, 1902," and amendments thereto, shall, as and when every payment of duty under "The Dividend Duties Act, 1902," and amendments thereto, is payable to the Commissioner of Taxation, in addition to the duty payable under that Act, make a payment of tax at the rate in the pound fixed by Parliament in respect to every pound of its profits as assessed under the Act.

In the case of a life assurance company, it shall be assessed at the rate in the pound fixed by Parliament on the amount of interest received from its investments.

Other insurance companies shall be assessed at the rate fixed by Parliament in respect of every three pounds two shillings and sixpence of the premiums received by the company after any allowance for reinsurances paid away.

Provided that the first payment of tax shall be payable in respect of a proportionate part of the amount of the first assessment under "The Dividend Duties Act, 1902," and amendments thereto, after the commencement of the Act of the profits or income of every such taxpayer as shall bear the same ratio to the whole as the length of the period between the commencement of the Act and the first day of July, 1933, bears to a year:

Provided also, that income (in the nature of dividends) received by any person in respect of shares in any company that has duly paid tax shall be exempt from tax, but this exemption shall not apply to persons resident in Western Australia and receiving dividends from companies incorporated and carrying on business in the other States of the Commonwealth or from ex-Australian companies. All such dividends are liable to tax under the Act.

Exemptions under "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act, 1907-1931."

- 37. The following incomes, revenues, and funds exempt under the Land and Income Tax Assessment Act shall be exempt from tax under the Act:—
 - (1) The revenue of municipal corporations, road boards, or other statutory public bodies;
 - (2) The incomes of life assurance companies and of companies or societies not carrying on business for purposes of profit or gain; but this exemption shall not apply to incomes derived from interest on investments;
 - (3) The dividends and profits of the Government Savings Bank and the Agricultural Bank;
 - (4) The funds and incomes of any registered friendly society or trade or industrial union;
 - (5) The incomes and revenues of all ecclesiastical, charitable, and educational institutions of a public character, whether supported wholly or partly, or not at all, by grants from the Consolidated Revenue Fund;
 - (6) The income derived or received by or on behalf of the Governor in respect of the salary and emoluments of his office;

- (7) Any pension received by a person for injuries while on active service in the naval or military forces during the present war; or any pension paid to the widow, relatives, or dependants of a deceased soldier or sailor killed during the war, or who had died from injuries received, or sickness contracted, during the war, or any pensioner under "The Invalid and Old Age Pensions Act, 1908";
- (8) The income of any society or association not carried on for the purposes of profit or gain to the individual members thereof established for the purpose of promoting the development of the agricultural, pastoral, horticultural, viticultural, stock-raising, manufacturing, or industrial resources of Western Australia.
- (9) The income of any society or association of a public character established for the promotion of scientific research;
- (10.) The cash allowances paid and the bonus shares allotted to shareholders of any co-operative company or society as a rebate or discount on their trading with such companies or societies.

Service of Notices.

- 38. Any notice or other document, the service of which is not elsewhere provided for, shall be deemed to be served on the taxpayer by or on behalf of the Commissioner when service is effected:—
 - (a) by delivering it to him personally;
 - (b) by leaving it at his address in accordance with Regulation 12 (a) and (b);
 - (c) by posting it in a letter addressed to him in accordance with the said Regulation 12 (a) and (b).

Any notice to be given by the Commissioner may be given by any officer of the Commissioner duly authorised in that behalf, and any notice purporting to be signed by the authority of the Commissioner shall be valid and effectual for all purposes as if signed by the Commissioner in person.

Appointment of Prescribed Deputy.

39. The Governor may by notice published in the Government Gazette appoint any person to be a prescribed deputy of the Commissioner for the purposes of the Financial Emergency Tax Assessment

Onus of Proof.

40. In any proceedings against the taxpayer for failing or neglecting to duly furnish a return, a certificate in writing signed by the Commissioner, or the prescribed deputy of the Commissioner, certifying that no return has been received from the taxpayer by any officer authorised by the Commissioner to receive returns at the place where under the Regulations the return should have been furnished, shall be *prima facie* evidence that the defendant failed or neglected to duly furnish a return.

Spoiled Stamps.

41. If any stamp after having been issued in the manner prescribed in the Regulations shall have become damaged, spoiled, or unfit for use other than in the ordinary course of affixing to wages and salary sheets, the State Under Treasurer shall, upon application being made to him and upon delivery to him of the stamps damaged, spoiled or rendered unfit for use, cause a similar stamp or stamps of equal value to be delivered to the owner of such stamps so damaged or spoiled or rendered unfit for use, or to his representative.

Payment of Wages or Salaries in Lump Sums at various periods, Section 9.

- 42. Where an employer (such as a pastoralist or farmer) makes payments of salaries or wages to his employees in lump sums at different periods the following provision shall apply:—
 - (a) where a lump sum is paid to an employee after the 1st December, 1932, but covering a period prior to such date, no tax is due on such payment:
 - (b) where a salary or wage is paid in a lump sum, or in instalments, and covers a period subsequent to the 1st December, 1932, a deduction shall be made by the employer of the amount of tax due on such payment; and
 - (c) where an employee is also entitled to receive his board and lodging, a sum shall be added to such payment calculated at the rate of one pound per week, dating from the first day of December, 1932, up to the date of such payment.

Payment of Allowances.

43. Retiring allowances, furlough, or any allowance for past services, when paid in a lump sum after the 1st December, 1932, shall be assessed for tax to the extent of 5 per cent. of the amount of the total allowance paid, but where such allowances, furlough, etc., are paid fortnightly or monthly after the 1st December, 1932, such periodical payments shall be subject to tax and must be deducted by the employer at the time of payment.

Note.—Travelling allowances or any allowance granted to cover any special expenditure, except for living and maintenance, shall not be subject to tax under the Act.

Treatment of Salary and Wages as Income, Section 10.

- 44. Where any salary or wages consists of fees paid to directors of a company, members of boards, or trusts or commissions, or commissions paid to agents, and the taxpayer satisfies the Commissioner that—
 - (1) he has incurred expenses in earning such salary or wages, and
 - (2) he has furnished a return under the Act or "The Land and Income Tax Assessment Act 1907-1931."

the Commissioner may issue a certificate of exemption from tax under Section 9, and such salary and/or wage shall be assessed as income under Section 5 of this Act.

Refund of Tax under Section 9, Subsection (6).

45. If, during the period between the 1st December, 1932, and the 30th June, 1933, or during any subsequent year ended 30th June, any person shall pay tax in respect of his salary and wage, and at the expiration of such period he proves to the satisfaction of the Commissioner that the amount of his salary or wage, together with any other income received by him during such period, and did not amount to an average of one pound per week for such period, was exempt from tax under the Act, he may apply for, and the Commissioner shall make, a refund of the amount of tax over-paid.

THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ACT, 1906. Municipality of Cottesloe.

P.W. 1352/21.

A By-law of the Municipality of Cottesloe, made under Section 179 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and Numbered 23, for the General Control and Management of Reserves 16189, 13719, 16188, 6896, 13718, and 16187 (Cottesloe), and the Cottesloe Jetty.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Cottesloe order as follows:-

By-law No. 23, made and passed by the Municipality of Cottesloe on the 25th day of June, 1930, and pub lished in the Government Gazette on the 29th day of August, 1930, and its amendments, are hereby revoked and the following inserted in lieu thereof:-

Interpretation.—In the construction of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires-

- "Beach" means the sea beach on, and/or adjacent to Reserves 16189, 13719, 16188, 6896, 13718, and 16187, Cottesloe;
- "Council" means the Council of the Municipality of Cottesloe;
- "Jetty" means the Jetty at Cottesloe on and extending into the sea from Reserve No. 13718, and shall include the Shelter Shed erected thereon;

"Proper bathing costume" means a costume covering the body from the shoulders to the thighs, with an overpiece or skirt extending from the hips to a point half way between the hips and the knees, and which shall be composed of wool or wool and cotton mixture;

cotton mixture;
"Reserve" means any portion of the Reserves abovementioned, including all buildings, erections, and

structures thereon.

1. No person shall create or commit any nuisance or behave in a disorderly manner, or use indecent or improper language on the Reserve, or upon the Beach or the Jetty.

2. No person shall climb on or over any building, shelter shed, or lavatory, or climb on or over any fence or fixture erected on the Reserve or the Beach, or upon or over the shelter shed erected on the Jetty.

3. No person shall pry into or over or enter any lavatory, bathing shed, or building, or portion of a building erected upon the Reserve or the Beach expressly reserved for the use of the opposite sex

for the use of the opposite sex.
4. No person shall enter any portion of the Reserve or the Beach which has been fenced off or otherwise

closed to the public.

- 5. No person shall break, injure, pull up or destroy any tree, shrub, or grass growing on the Reserve or the Beach.
- 6. No person shall cut, mutilate, deface or disfigure the Jetty, or any buildings, erections, fixtures, or structures upon the Beach or the Reserve, or, without the written consent of the Council, write, paste, or affix any notice or advertisement thereon.
- 7. No person shall expectorate or throw lighted matches upon any portion of the Jetty, or upon any building, erection, or structure on the Reserve or the
- 8. No person shall place or break, or permit to be placed or broken, any glass, metal, bottle or utensils on the Reserve or the Beach, and no person shall deposit or leave any rubbish, refuse, paper, broken glass, china, or litter of any kind thereon except in receptacles provided for that purpose.
- 9. No person shall, without the written consent of the Council, remove any sand, soil, or stone from the Reserve or the Beach.
- 10. No person shall, without the permission of the Council, allow any horse, cattle, sheep, donkey, mule, pig, or other animal, or any fowl or other bird, to enter or stray upon the Reserve or the Beach.
- 11. No person shall, either on the Reserve or the Beach, or upon the Jetty, without the written consent of the Council—
 - (a) in any way damage, alter, or interfere with the electric light fittings, or electrical equipment;
 - (b) sell or offer or expose for sale any goods or merchandise;
 - (c) engage in any public speaking or in any musical, dramatic, or athletic performance;
 - (d) alter, deface, or remove from its position any notice board or other sign erected by the Council:
 - (e) take any intoxicating liquor into any bathing pavilion, dressing shed, or other building;
 - (f) carry or discharge any firearm, or throw or discharge any stone or other missile.
- 12. No person shall cause or permit any dog of which he is the owner, as defined by Section 4 of "The Dog Act, 1903-1928," or of which for the time being he has control, to be on that portion of the Beach or Reserve situated between Mooderup Rocks on the South and the projection of Grant Street West of Swanbourne Terrace on the North. Any dog found on the Beach or Reserve in contravention of this By-law may be destroyed.
- 13. Every person on the Beach shall, when not attired in ordinary apparel, wear a proper bathing costume, and every person on any portion of the Reserve (other than the Beach), when not attired in ordinary apparel, shall wear, in addition to a proper bathing costume, a dressing gown or other garment of a similar nature, which shall completely cover the body.
- 14. No person shall use any surf board on the following portions of the Beach, that is to say—
 - (a) between the Mooderup rocks on the South and the Northern boundary of John Street on the North;
 - (b) between the point opposite the Southern boundary of Eric Street and a point opposite the Southern boundary of Reserve No. 1203.
- 15. No person, without the written consent of the Council first had and obtained, shall camp or lodge at

night in or occupy as sleeping quarters any stall, building, or structure of any kind erected on the Reserve or the Beach.

16. No person shall-

- (a) enter upon or remain on the Jetty in bathing costume;
- (b) enter or remain upon the Reserve or the Beach or upon the Jetty whilst visibly under the influence of liquor;
- (c) fish from the Jetty on the Eastern side of the shelter shed thereon;
- (d) fish from any portion of the Jetty on any day when a notice is affixed thereon by order of the Council prohibiting fishing therefrom;
- Council prohibiting fishing therefrom;
 (e) clean fish or cut bait on the rails or seats or deposit fish refuse on any portion of the Jetty;
- (f) bring any bicycle or other vehicle upon the Jetty or the promenade or ramps leading thereto.
- 17. The Council may at any time, and from time to time, charge a fee of not more than 6d. per head for admission to the Jetty. At such times as such fee is payable, notice thereof shall be exhibited at the shore end of the Jetty, and no person shall enter thereon unless in possession of a ticket, which must be produced on demand by any member or official of the Council or by any person authorised by the Council.

18. No person shall dress or undress on either the Reserve or the Beach or in any building thereon save only in those buildings specifically set apart for that

purpose by the Council.

19. No person shall bring into or consume on the Reserve or Beach any intoxicating liquor, nor enter thereon when visibly under the influence of liquor.

20. No person shall remove, damage, deface, or otherwise interfere with any life-saving apparatus, and no person other than an official of a recognised Surf Life Saving Club shall utilise same, except for the express purpose of the saving of human life.

21. (a) The Council may appoint any servant of the

Council an Inspector under this By-law.

- (b) The Council may appoint any member of a volunteer life saving Club an Inspector under this By-law; provided that a member so appointed shall not prosecute any person for a breach of any provision of this By-law, but shall report such breach to the Council for action by it.
- (c) Every constable or officer of police shall have the powers of an Inspector under this By-law.
- (d) Every Inspector may demand the name and address of any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law, and such person shall comply with such demand.

(e) No person shall obstruct or hinder any Inspector in the performance of his duties, or in the exercise of

his powers.

- (f) The Council shall supply each Inspector with a written appointment, under the seal of the Council, and with an appropriate badge. Every Inspector, when on duty, shall wear such badge on the front of his dress or bathing costume, or, if not wearing the badge, shall produce his written appointment, if demanded of him when exercising authority under this By-law. The production of such badge or writing shall be prima facie evidence of the appointment of the person producing same.
- 22. Any person attempting to do any of the things expressly or impliedly forbidden in this By-law, shall be liable to a punishment as if he had committed the offence.
- 23. Every person offending against any provision of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £10.

DENMARK ROAD BOARD.

P.W. 3449/22.

By-laws governing Reserves and Camping Areas within the Denmark Road Board District, made under Section 196 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919," for regulating the control and use of Reserves and Camping Areas.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the chairman and members of the Denmark Road Board order as follows:—

1.—Interpretation.

In the construction of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise indicates—

- (a) "Reserve" shall mean and include park lands, recreation grounds, camping areas, and all lands under the control of the Denmark Road Board, and shall include Reserve "A" 14376, Denmark Townsite, Reserve 20578, Ocean Beach, 12664 William Bay, 20928 Parry Inlet, Reserve 17735, Irwin Inlet, Reserve 17937, Nornalup Camping, Reserve 19912, Townsite, and all areas which are now or shall hereafter be set apart by the Road Board for the purpose of camping grounds.
- (b) "Inspector" shall mean and include the Traffic Inspector and any other Inspector or Ranger in the employ of the Road Board, and shall include any Honorary Inspector appointed by the Road Board to assist the Road Board to maintain a due observance of these Bylaws of the Road Board District.

2.-Behaviour.

No person shall misconduct himself, or indulge in any riotous, disorderly, or indecent conduct, or use any indecent or improper language, or offend against decency as regards dress on any reserve.

3.—Intoxicating Liquor.

No person shall enter upon or remain on any reserve when visibly under the influence of liquor.

4.—Bill Sticking.

No person shall, without the consent of the secretary, post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint, or otherwise affix any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement, or any document whatsoever upon any tree, board, fence, post, gate, building, road, path, or any place whatever on any reserve, nor distribute or give out any such placard, handbill, notice, advertisement or document on any reserve, and no person shall cause to be done any of the acts herein prohibited.

5.—Expectoration.

No person shall spit or expectorate in or upon any building, structure, or erection on any reserve.

6.-Meetings.

No person shall organise, arrange, advertise or take part in any fete, picnic or concert, or any meeting of like character, or engage in public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind on any reserve without permission of the Secretary.

7.—Betting.

No person shall bet or offer to bet publicly on any reserve.

8.—Damaging Growth.

No person shall injure, break, deface, pull up, pick, remove, or destroy any tree, shrub or grass growing on any reserve.

9.—Fires and Shooting.

No person or persons shall carry or discharge any firearm, or throw or discharge any stone or other missile, or set fire, or set off any fire balloon, or throw or set fire to any fireworks, or kindle or make any fire on any reserve without permission.

10.—Rubbish.

No person shall deposit or leave any rubbish, refuse, paper, broken glass, china, or litter of any kind whatsoever upon any reserve, except in the receptacle provided for the purpose.

11.-Broken Glass.

No person shall place, or break, or permit or suffer to be placed or broken, any glass, metal, or earthenware, bottles or utensils, on any reserve without first having obtained the consent of the secretary so to do,

12.—Sunday Sport.

The Road Board may, at its discretion, prohibit any games or sport from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any reserve on any Sunday.

13.—Trading.

No person shall, without permission in writing from the secretary, sell or expose for sale, any goods, wares, refreshments, fruits, nuts, confectionery, fish or other merchandise or things, or solicit or offer to purchase bottles on any reserve.

14.—Damage to Property.

No person shall cut up, damage, destroy, disfigure, or interfere with any road, fence, building, electrical equipment, waterpipe, or fittings upon any reserve.

15.—Games and Animals.

No person shall, without the permission in writing from the Secretary, play, practise, or indulge in any game, sport, gymnastic exercise on any reserve, or exercise on any reserve any horse, dog, or other animal for racing.

16.—Use of Reserves.

The Road Board shall have the power to grant the exclusive right to use and occupy any reserve or portion thereof for holding sports or amusements to any responsible person or persons, subject to such conditions as may be decided on by the Road Board, and any person or persons obtaining such rights shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, erectures, trees, or other improvements upon such reserve or portion thereof, and shall pay to the Road Board for the use of the land such fees as the Road Board shall decide.

17.—Camping .

No person shall, except as hereinafter provided, camp, lodge, or tarry overnight on any reserve, nor frequent any reserve for the purpose of camping, lodging, or tarrying overnight thereon.

18.—Permits for Camping.

Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause 17, camping may be permitted in areas set apart for the purpose by the Road Board, but not elsewhere, upon the issue of a permission by an Inspector or Ranger appointed by the Road Board, and subject to the following conditions:—

The Road Board may at any time make and declare a schedule of charges and issue permits to persons desirous of camping on any such area:

- (a) No person shall sublet any camp, or sell, give or otherwise dispose of any permit to any person;
- (b) Except by permission of the Inspector or Ranger, no person shall bring into or keep within the camping area any animals or birds whatever;
- (c) No person shall bring into or keep or consume in the camping area any intoxicating liquor;
- (d) Campers must keep the area covered by their permit in a clean and sanitary condition at all times. All rubbish capable of destruction by fire shall be burned by the occupier in the approved fireplace;
- (e) All campers must use the sanitary conveniences provided, and in no circumstances will improvised conveniences or individual camping sites be permitted;
- (f) Camping permits may at any time be withdrawn by the Inspector, if in his opinion a breach of these Bylaws has been committed, or if, in his opinion, it is desirable that the permit shall be terminated.

In the event of termination hereunder, the rental paid shall be forfeited to the Road Board, and no compensation shall be claimed or paid for loss, damage, or inconvenience suffered through the withdrawal of the permit.

- (g) Subject to the right of the Inspector, and the officers and employees of the Road Board, or any person acting under their instructions, or any police constable, to enter any camping site at any time, no persons shall enter into or remain within such camping site, except with the permission of the holder of the permit.
- (h) No fires shall be lighted on any camping area, except in places approved by the Inspector.

19.—Penalty.

For every offence against the provisions of these Bylaws, the offender shall upon conviction before any one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

- (1) appoint The Honourable John Scaddan, Minister for Police, as the responsible Minister in charge of the administration of "The Lotteries (Control) Act, 1932," and
- (2) approve of the annexed Regulations under the said Act.

LOTTERIES (CONTROL) ACT, 1932.

Regulations.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Lotteries Regulations, 1933.
- 2. These Regulations are divided into parts as follows:—

Part I .- Applications for permits.

Part II.—Rules governing the conduct of lotteries. Part III.—Method of drawing lotteries conducted by the Commission.

Part IV.—Advertisement of winning numbers.

Part V.—Rules relating to procedure of the Lotteries Commission.

Part VI.-Offences.

Part I.—Applications for Permits.

- 3. Every application by the Commission under paragraph (a) of Section 5 of the Act shall be in the Form No. 1 in the Schedule.
- 4. Every application under paragraph (b) of Section 5 of the Act shall be in the Form No. 2 in the Schedule hereto, and shall, in addition to the details prescribed in paragraph (c) of that section, give details of—
 - (a) the name, address, and occupation of every person who is a member of the executive of any body proposing to conduct a lottery, and every person who is in any manner associated or intended to be associated as a principal with the person making application to conduct the lottery;
 - (b) the method proposed to be adopted for the sale and distribution of tickets, or the receipt of subscriptions, and also, if the Commission requires, the name, address, and occupation of every person whom it is proposed will be associated in assisting in the conduct of the lottery, including agents and vendors of tickets and receivers of money;
 - (c) prizes proposed to be distributed.
- 5. The Minister may require any person or persons proposing to conduct a lottery, as a condition of his granting a permit, to furnish him with an approved bond, in such a sum as the Minister may think sufficient for the faithful performance by such person or persons of their obligations and duties under the Act and Regulations, and to ensure compliance with the conditions of the permit. Such bond may be in the Form No. 3 in the Schedule.

Part II.—Conduct of Lotteries.

- 6. Every person conducting a lottery shall forthwith, on the receipt of any money or subscription, give each person entering the lottery or subscribing money therein, a ticket voucher or coupon showing the name of the lottery in which the ticket is taken or subscription received, the amount of subscription which has been received, the name of the person who or body which is conducting the lottery, the closing date for the receipt of subscriptions, the date of drawing and the particulars of the prizes proposed to be offered. Every ticket voucher or coupon offered for sale shall have legibly impressed thereon a separate distinguishing number. The numbers shall commence at any given number and advance consecutively in units.
- 7. Every person who receives any money or valuable thing in connection with a lottery shall on the day of receipt thereof, or within such time as is approved in writing by the permit-holder, remit or deliver the same to the permit-holder, and the permit-holder shall, on receiving such money or valuable thing, give a receipt therefor to the person remitting. Moneys received by the permit-holder shall not be held for any longer period than two banking days, and shall be paid into the bank account to be kept by him under the provisions of Section 11 of the Act.
- 8. The Minister may require any person having the handling or receipt of any money pertaining to a lottery to furnish a bond in the Form No. 4 in the Schedule.
- 9. A permit may be in the Form No. 5 in the Schedule.

Part III.—Method of Drawing Lotteries conducted by the Commission.

- 10. The procedure and method of drawing lotteries conducted by the Commission shall be as follows:—
- (a) At least three days' previous notice shall be given by the Commission by advertisement in a daily newspaper circulating in Perth of the date, time, and place of drawing;

- (b) The drawing shall be conducted in the presence of such members of the public who desire to be present subject, however, to the capacity of the building where the drawing takes place;
- (c) The Commission shall cause to be made a number of cabinets of a design to be approved by the Minister for the purpose of containing marbles, and shall cause to be made a sufficient number of marbles from time to time to correspond with every ticket which may be sold or received in connection with the lottery. The marbles shall be numbered consecutively from one to the total number of marbles. For the purpose of convenient reference in the handling and checking of the marbles they shall be placed in batches in numerical order in separate cabinets;
- (d) All marbles corresponding to the numbers of any ansold tickets shall be taken from the cabinets prior to the remaining marbles participating in the lottery being put into sealed containers as hereinafter provided, and the butts of tickets sold shall be arranged and kept in numerical order for the purpose of easy reference;
- (e) After the closing hour, and within reasonable time before the drawing of the lottery, all the marbles remaining in the cabinets shall be checked with the butts of the tickets sold by a person or persons appointed by the Minister, and shall be placed by such person or persons in some receptacle or receptacles which they shall personally seal and hand over to a member or members of the Commission in person, who shall take charge of and keep the receptacles and their contents in custody under lock and key until the time of drawing. The members of the Commission shall be responsible for seeing that no person has access to or is allowed to handle or touch the receptacles or their contents;
- (f) When the time of drawing arrives the receptacles and their contents shall be removed to the place of drawing, under the supervision of a member or members of the Commission and the person or persons appointed by the Minister, and they shall be examined and unfastened and the marbles tipped into a barrel under such supervision. The barrel shall be closed and locked and then rotated a sufficient number of times to mix the marbles thoroughly;
- (g) After the barrel has been rotated as provided in paragraph (f) it shall be opened by a member of the Commission, and some well-known person of good repute who may be appointed by the Commission, or some other person approved by the Minister, shall insert a long spoon of material and design to be approved of by the Minister. In approving such design the Minister shall see that the spoon shall be of such construction as to take out one marble only at a time.
- (h) The person so inserting the spoon shall withdraw it with a marble in it and shall not touch the marble with his hands. He shall direct the marble by means of the spoon and deposit it in a glass container, which shall be provided for the purpose. The marble shall then be taken out by a member of the Commission, who shall read and call out the number inscribed on it clearly and audibly to the persons present. Such member shall then hand the marble to another member of the Commission, who shall follow the same procedure. The marble shall then be handed by the latter member to a recording clerk, who shall make a written record of the number in a book to be kept for that purpose.
- (i) The procedure outlined in paragraphs (g) and (h) shall be followed until the whole of the prizes are allotted, and at the conclusion of the drawing the record shall be certified by at least three persons taking part in the drawing.
- (j) Where any of the prizes in a lottery are to be determined by the result of any horse race, in addition to the procedure specified above, the following procedure shall be observed in order to determine the particular ticket or subscription in respect of which a horse is drawn—
 - (i) A number of large marbles made of some durable substance, to be approved by the Minister, and to be at least 114 inches in diameter, shall be provided in accordance with the number of horses entitled to participate in the drawing;
 - (ii) Each marble shall have the name of one of such horses written on it;

- (iii) These marbles shall be checked by a member of the Commission and the person or persons appointed by the Minister;
- (iv) A separate and smaller barrel shall be provided, having an opening through which the marbles may be put into the barrel and a fastening for such opening;
 - Further provision shall be made for an opening and fastening sufficient to admit the passage of one marble at a time when the drawing takes place.
- (v) After the marbles have been checked the member of the Commission shall place them in the barrel, which he shall close and rotate;
- (vi) In order to ascertain the number of the ticket entitled to a horse a small marble shall be first drawn out in the manner hereinbefore specified, and then a large marble with the horse's name on it shall be allowed to pass through the opening in the barrel provided for the marbles with the horses' names by some person appointed by the Commission for that purpose. The ticket corresponding to the number of the small marble drawn shall be the ticket entitled to the horse named on the large marble drawn from the other barrel. This procedure shall be followed until the specified number of horses according to the terms of the lottery is drawn;
- (vii) In each case the same process of checking and recording shall be followed as in paragraph (h).
- 11. The following shall be the order to be observed at all drawings:—
- First:—Where any of the prizes are distributed according to horses, horses shall be drawn first in accordance with paragraph (vi) of the preceding regulation. When all the horses have been drawn according to the terms of the lottery, the numbered marbles shall be checked and restored to the appropriate barrel by a member of the Commission; or, where there are no horses, first, second, and third prizes shall be drawn, and then the marbles so restored to the barrel.
- Second:—Then all prizes of the next lower denomination, after which the marbles for these prizes shall be similarly restored to the barrel.
- Third:—The same process shall be repeated until the lottery is fully drawn.

Part IV.—Advertisement of Result of Lottery.

12. A permit-holder conducting any lottery shall advertise the result of the lottery in some newspaper circulating in the district in which the lottery is conducted for such number of issues of that newspaper as the Minister may at the time of giving the permit direct, and, in the event of no such direction being given, in the first available issue of such newspaper following the drawing of the lottery.

The advertisement shall state the particulars of all prizes won, the names of all persons who have won the first, second, and third prizes respectively in the lottery, and the numbers of all tickets the holders of which have won prizes.

13. In the event of any prize moneys or prizes not having been claimed by the persons entitled thereto within twelve calendar months after the publication of such advertisement, or the last of such advertisements, the permit-holder shall apply any such moneys for any charitable purposes the Minister may direct in writing.

Part V.—Lotteries Commission.

- 14. The Lotteries Commission shall meet at least once in every week.
- 15. The Minister shall cause to be made a common seal bearing the name of the Commission. The common seal of the Commission shall at all times be kept locked up in some secure place, and the only persons who shall have access thereto shall be the Chairman and the members of the Commission. The common seal shall not be affixed to any document, except in pursuance of a resolution duly passed at a meeting of the Commission, and every such affixation shall be attested by the signatures of at least two of the members.

16. At meetings of the Commission the following shall be the order of procedure, or as near thereto as practicable:-

(a) The minutes of the previous meeting shall be considered:

(b) Copies of correspondence sent by order of the Commission shall be read;

(c) Reading of letters received and considering thereon:

(d) Consideration of applications; (e) Presentation of schedule of receipts and disbursements and consideration of accounts;

Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings and any business the members may think desirable;

(g) Motions of which previous notice has been given.

17. The Chairman shall preside at each meeting. In the absence of the Chairman the chair shall be taken by some member nominated by the Minister to act as vice-Chairman in his absence.

Part VI .- Offences.

18. Any person who makes any false statement in any application under these Regulations commits an offence. If the false statement is made wilfully the offender shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds and, in any other case, to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

19. Any permit-holder conducting a lottery in which any person other than the person specified in the application for a permit is associated as principal, servant, or agent commits an offence. Penalty: One hundred pounds.

20. Any person who by act or omission commits any breach of these Regulations for which no specific penalty is provided, commits an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.
