WHEREAS by Sections 222 and 227 of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906" (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange

WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Main Roads Act, 1930-1932," the Administrator may, on the recommendation of the Commissioner, declare by Proclamation that any road shall be a main road: And whereas the Commissioner has recommended that the road specified in the Schedule hereto be so declared: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby declares that the road specified in the Schedule thereto shall be a main road within the meaning

of "The Main Roads Act, 1930-1932," and that the footpaths, if any, of such road be excluded from the main road.

WHEREAS by Section 13 of "The Main Roads Act, 1930-1932," it is enacted that the Administrator may, on the recommendation of the Commissioner, declare by Proclamation that any road shall be a main road, and may, in like manner and on the like recommendation, declare that any main road shall cease to be a main road: And whereas the Governor by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* on the 21st day of June, 1929, declared *inter alia* that the road described in Schedule 1 hereto shall be a main road: And whereas it is deemed expedient that those portions of the said road described in Schedule 2 hereto shall cease to be a main road: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby declare that those portions of the Midland Junction-Merredin Road described in Schedule 2 hereto, heretofore declared to be a main road as aforesaid, shall cease to be a main road: and that the said Proclamation is hereby varied accordingly:—

Schedule 1.

Midland Junction-Merredin Road (Greenmount Road District).

That portion of York Road No. 28, on Lands Department Lithograph No. 1C/40, commencing at the junction of the Eastern boundary of the Municipality of Midland Junction with Buninyong Road and Road No. 28; thence continuing in a South-Easterly and North-Easterly direction along Road No. 28, passing Bullarra Road and crossing Woolowra Road through Greenmount Location 16 to the North-Western corner of Lot No. 246; thence continuing along Road No. 28 in a South-

Easterly direction, passing Lots Nos. 246, 245, 244, 243, and 242 to the North-Western corner of Lot 241; thence continuing in a North-Easterly direction along Road No. 28, passing Lots Nos. 241, 240, 239, 238, 237 and 236 to the North-Western corner of Lot 235; thence continuing in an Easterly direction along Road No. 28, passing Lots Nos. 235, 234, 233 and 232 to the North-Western corner of Reserve No. 310; thence continuing in a South-Easterly direction along Road No. 28, passing Reserve No. 310 and Lots Nos. 283, 284, 285, 231, 230, 229, 228, 227 and 226 to the North-Eastern corner of Lot No. 222; thence continuing along Road No. 28 in an Easterly direction, past Reserve A6922 to the North-Eastern corner of Lot No. 105; thence continuing along Road No. 28 (York Road) in a South-Easterly direction, passing Lots Nos. 104, 102, 101, 74, 75 and 77 to the North-Western corner of Lot 158; thence continuing along Road No. 28 in a North-Easterly direction, passing Lots Nos. 158, 159, 160 and 161 to the Northern boundary of Lot No. 163; thence continuing in an Easterly and a North-Easterly direction along Road No. 28, passing Lots Nos. 163, 164, 154 and 82 to the North-Eastern corner of Lot 83; thence continuing along Road No. 28 in a North-Easterly and Easterly direction, passing Lots Nos. 90 and 91 to the North-Western corner of Lot No. 92; thence continuing along Road No. 28 in an Easterly and South-Easterly direction, passing Lots Nos. 92, 93 and 314 to the North-Western corner of Lot No. 315; thence continuing along Road No. 28 in a South-Easterly direction, passing Lots Nos. 315 and 316 to the North-Eastern corner of Lot No. 317; thence continuing along Road No. 28 in a North-Easterly and Easterly direction to Location No. 97 to its junction with Road No. 3500; thence continuing along Road No. 28 in an Easterly and South-Easterly direction to the Eastern boundary of Location No. 97; thence crossing Craven Road and continuing along Road No. 28 in a South-Easterly direction to its junction with the Eastern boundary of the Metropolitan Area, as defined in the Traffic Act (viz., at the Western side of Coppin Road at Mahogany Creek in the Greenmount Road District), as shown in blue on Plan M.R.B., W.A., 284.

Midland Junction-Merredin Road (Greenmount Road District).

WHEREAS by "The Aborigines Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be Reserves for Aborigines; and whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Aborigines should be declared in the Dampier District: Now, therefore I, John Alfred Northmore, Lieut.-Governor and Administrator as aforesaid, with

the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare a Reserve of 37,865 acres, in the Dampier District, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Aborigines:—

Schedule.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from a point situate about 398 chains West and about 232 chains South of an Admiralty cairn erected on Skeleton Point, and extending North to the seashore near Cape Leveque; thence generally Easterly and Southerly along said seashore to the mouth of Malligo Creek, and thence Westerly to the starting point; excluding Reserve 14926 (Dampier Location 19), Dampier Locations 10 and 40 (844/152).

Forests Act, 1918.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1113/32.

WHEREAS by "The Forests Act, 1918," it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—(a) the Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation; (b) after such proposal has been laid before Parliament, the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall by Order in Council revoke such dedication: And whereas His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposals dated the Twenty-fourth day of August, 1932, and Thirteenth day of December, 1932, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest: And whereas, after such proposals had been laid before Parliament resolutions were passed by both Houses that such proposals should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forests Nos. 4, 14, 20, 21, 24, 30, 34, and 42 by excising those portions of such State Forests as are described in the Schedule hereto:—

Sandalwood Act, 1929.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1478/29.

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 2 of "The Sandalwood Act, 1929," the Governor may from time to time by Order in Council limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from

Crown land and alienated land during the period therein stated: And whereas it is desirable to limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during the period from the First day of January, 1933, to the Thirtieth day of June, 1933, to 980 tons: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby limit and restrict the quantity of sandalwood that may be pulled or removed from Crown land and alienated land during the period from the First day of January, 1933, to the Thirtieth day of June, 1933, to 980 tons, exclusive of sandalwood required for oil distillation purposes within the State.

Moora Water Area.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 799/32.

WHEREAS by "The Water Boards Act, 1904," the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to constitute the District of a Local Authority, or two or more Local Authorities, or any part or parts of such District or Districts, a Water Area, under such name as may be directed: And whereas the Governor is empowered to appoint a Local Authority whose District or a part of whose District is within the Water Area to be the Water Board: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute a Water Area, having the boundaries described in the Schedule hereto, for the purposes of the said Act, under the name of the Moora Water Area, and doth hereby appoint the Moora Road Board to be the Water Board, under the name of the Moora Water Board.

This Order in Council shall take effect on the 28th day of April, 1933.

Plant Diseases Act, 1914.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 35 of "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914," that the Governor may make Regulations prescribing all matters which by this Act are required or permitted to be prescribed, or which it may be necessary or convenient to prescribe for giving effect to this Act, and, *inter alia*, prescribing the manner in which plants, fruits, and coverings in which plants and fruits have been contained or packed shall (whether infected or not) be treated in order to eradicate disease or to lessen the risk of the spread of the disease: And whereas certain Regulations were made

under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of September, 1921: And whereas the disease known as Pea Weevil (*Bruchus pisorum*) is existing in Western Australia, and it is now deemed expedient to amend the said Regulations in the manner hereinafter mentioned, in order to prescribe the manner in which field peas produced in or imported into this State shall be treated in order to eradicate the said disease and to lessen the risk of the spread of the said disease: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, doth hereby amend the Regulations made under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of September, 1921, by inserting after Regulation 48A a new Regulation as follows:—

48B. No person shall sell, supply, distribute, deliver, or dispose of any field peas (whether produced within or imported into Western Australia) to any other person unless and until such field peas have been fumigated with carbon-bisulphide in such manner as effectively to render the same free from the disease of Pea Weevil (*Bruchus pisorum*).

Meekatharra-Horseshoe Railway Act, 1920.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Treasury No. 2181/25.

WHEREAS by Section 3 of "The Meekatharra-Horseshoe Railway Act, 1920," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the General Chemical Supply Company, Limited, and its assigns to construct, maintain, and work as in the said Act mentioned a railway from Meekatharra to Horseshoe, near Peak Hill, along the line mentioned in the Schedule to the said Act: And whereas by Section 6 of the said Act it is provided that the Department of Public Works should survey the said line of railway, subject to a stipulation in Section 7 that before such survey was undertaken the said General Chemical Supply Company, Limited, and its assigns should pay a sum sufficient to defray the cost thereof: And whereas by Section 12 of the said Act it is provided that the General Chemical Supply Company, Limited, and its assigns should—(a) construct the Meekatharra-Horseshoe Railway to the satisfaction of the Engineer-in-Chief and complete the same within three years after the work was commenced; (b) duly pay the charges of the Department of Public Works relating to the survey and laying out of the line of railway and the supervision of its construction; (c) on the completion of the railway accept and execute a counterpart of a lease of the said railway to be granted under Section 9 of the said Act: And it was further provided in that section that if the said Company and its assigns should make default in the performance and observance of the provisions of this section or any of them, the Governor might by Order in Council declare the rights of the said Company and its assigns under the said Act to be forfeited, and thereupon the authority conferred by the Act to construct, maintain, and work the railway shall be annulled: And whereas all the rights of the General Chemical Supply Company, Limited, under the said Act were assigned to the West Australian Manganese Company, Limited, of Royal Insurance Buildings, 133 St. George's Terrace, Perth (hereinafter called "the Concessionaire"): And whereas by an agreement bearing date the 24th day of September, 1926, made between the Concessionaire of the one part and the Honourable the Treasurer of Western Australia of the other part, it was provided that, in consideration of the Treasurer rendering certain financial assistance to the Concessionaire for the purchase of certain rails and material in connection with the construction of the said railway, the Concessionaire would pay certain instalments of hire rent for the hire of the said rails and material, which under the terms of the said agreement were to be the property of the Government of Western Australia until all instalments of hire rent under the said agreement had been fully paid: And it was further provided that the amount to be paid for the hire of the rails and material

would be reserved as rent in addition to the ground rent in the lease of the line of railway to be granted under Section 9 of the said Act: And whereas, under a further agreement made the 31st day of October, 1927, between the same parties, in consideration of further financial assistance granted by the Treasurer to the Concessionaire for the purpose of purchasing further material for the construction of the said railway, the Concessionaire agreed that the amount of such further assistance should be added to and be repaid along with the moneys advanced by the Treasurer under the agreement of the 24th day of September, 1926: And whereas the Concessionaire has made default—

(a) in payment of the said survey charges; and (b) in the acceptance and execution of a counterpart of the said lease as provided in the said Act, and there is now due and owing by the Concessionaire to the Crown the sum of Twenty-seven thousand five hundred pounds (£27,500), being instalments of rent reserved under the provisions of the said agreements, and also other moneys for further advances and interest: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, in exercise of the powers reserved to me under the said Act do, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby declare that the rights of the Concessionaire under the said Act are forfeited.
