WHEREAS by Section 39 of "The Aborigines Act, 1905," the Governor may by Proclamation whenever in the interests of the aborigines he thinks fit, declare any Municipal District or Town, or any other place, to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for aborigines or half-castes not in lawful employment to be or remain: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the land described in the Schedule hereto to be an area in which it shall be unlawful for aborigines or half-castes not in lawful employment to be or remain:—

## Schedule.

An area situated within a radius of fifteen miles from the centre of Naretha Station on the Trans-Australian Railway.

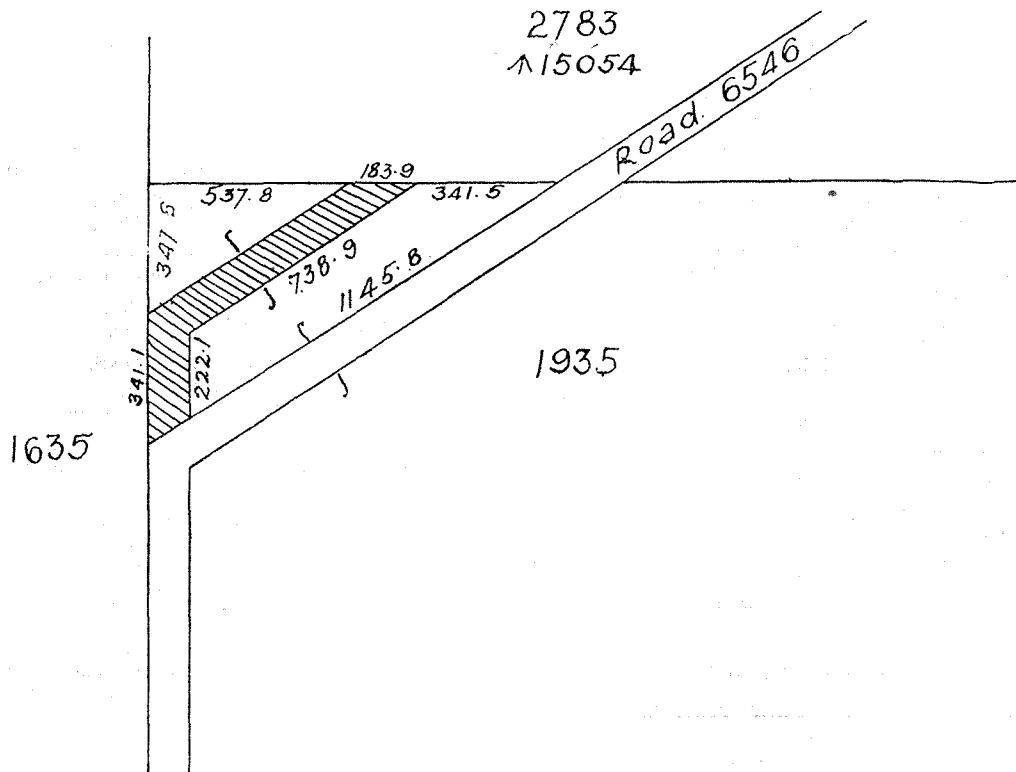

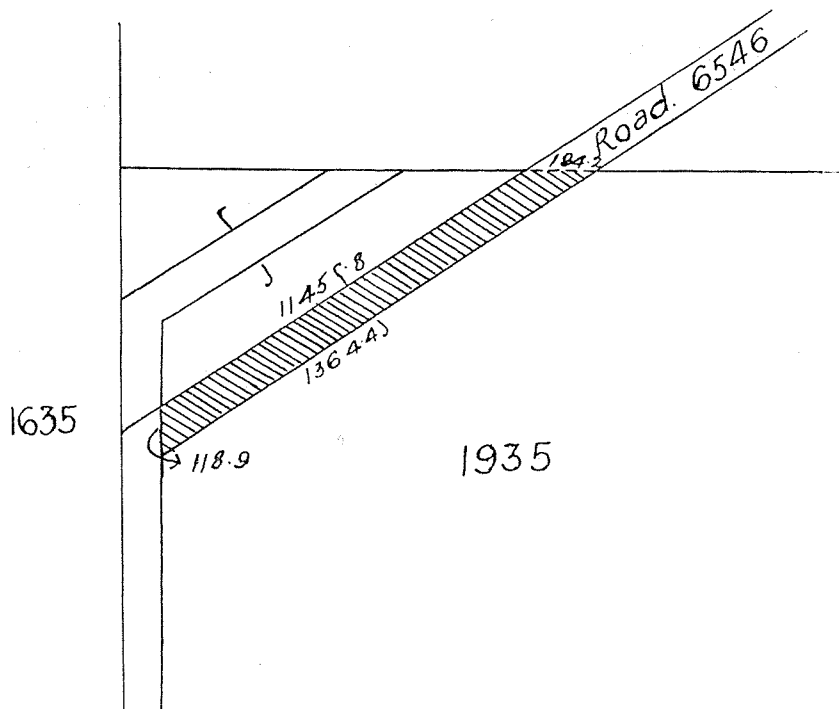
WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 3 of "The Closed Roads Alienation Act, 1932," that, where a road (to which the said Act applies) has hitherto been or hereafter is closed, and the land comprised therein has become Crown land, and land of any person through whose land such closed road passes, or to whose land such closed road adjoins, is resumed for the purpose of a road to take the place of the closed road in exercise of a right of resumption without payment of compensation, the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister, and without any consideration by Order in Council, declare that so much of the land comprised in the closed road as in the opinion of the Minister is equivalent to the land resumed as aforesaid, shall vest in such person for an estate or interest similar to that held by such person in his land immediately contiguous to the land so vested: And whereas a road, being portion of the road to Lake Jandalup, situated in the Wannaru Road District, and which passes through Swan Location No. 1935 (as shown and recorded on Public Plan No. 1A/40, in the Department of Lands and Surveys, at Perth), is a road to which the provisions of the said Act apply: And whereas the said road, as to parts thereof, were lawfully closed on the 9th and 30th days of October, 1925, and July, 1926, respectively, which said portions of road are more particularly delineated and hachured in the First Schedule hereto: And whereas, by notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 3rd day of March, 1922, portion of the said Swan Location No. 1935, more particularly delineated and hachured in the Second Schedule hereto, were resumed

to take the place of the said road which has been closed as aforesaid, in exercise of the right of resumption without payment of compensation contained in the instrument of title of the said Swan Location No. 1935: And whereas John Paterson Lennox Brown, of West Leederville, in the State of Western Australia, was at the date of the closure of the road as aforesaid, and at the date of the resumption of land aforesaid, and still is the registered proprietor of an estate in leasehold of the said Swan Location No. 1935, as appears by instrument of title namely, Crown Lease No. 2877/1914: And whereas the Minister for Lands has recommended that the land comprised in the said road which has been closed as aforesaid, and which is more particularly set forth, delineated, and hachured in the First Schedule hereto, and which in the opinion of the Minister is equivalent to the land resumed as aforesaid as set forth, delineated, and hachured in the Second Schedule hereto, shall be vested, without any consideration, in the said John Paterson Lennox Brown as the registered proprietor of the said Swan Location No. 1935, for an estate or interest similar to that held by the said John Paterson Lennox Brown in the said location: And whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to give effect to the said recommendation and to vest the said land accordingly: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor (or Lieut.-Governor and Administrator) acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, and in pursuance of the recommendation of the Minister for Lands, doth hereby declare that all that piece of land comprised in the road which has been closed as aforesaid, and which is delineated and hachured in the First Schedule hereto shall, without any consideration, vest in the said John Paterson Lennox Brown as being the registered proprietor of an estate in leasehold of the said Swan Location No. 1935 for an estate or interest similar to that held by the said John Paterson Lennox Brown in such location as aforesaid.

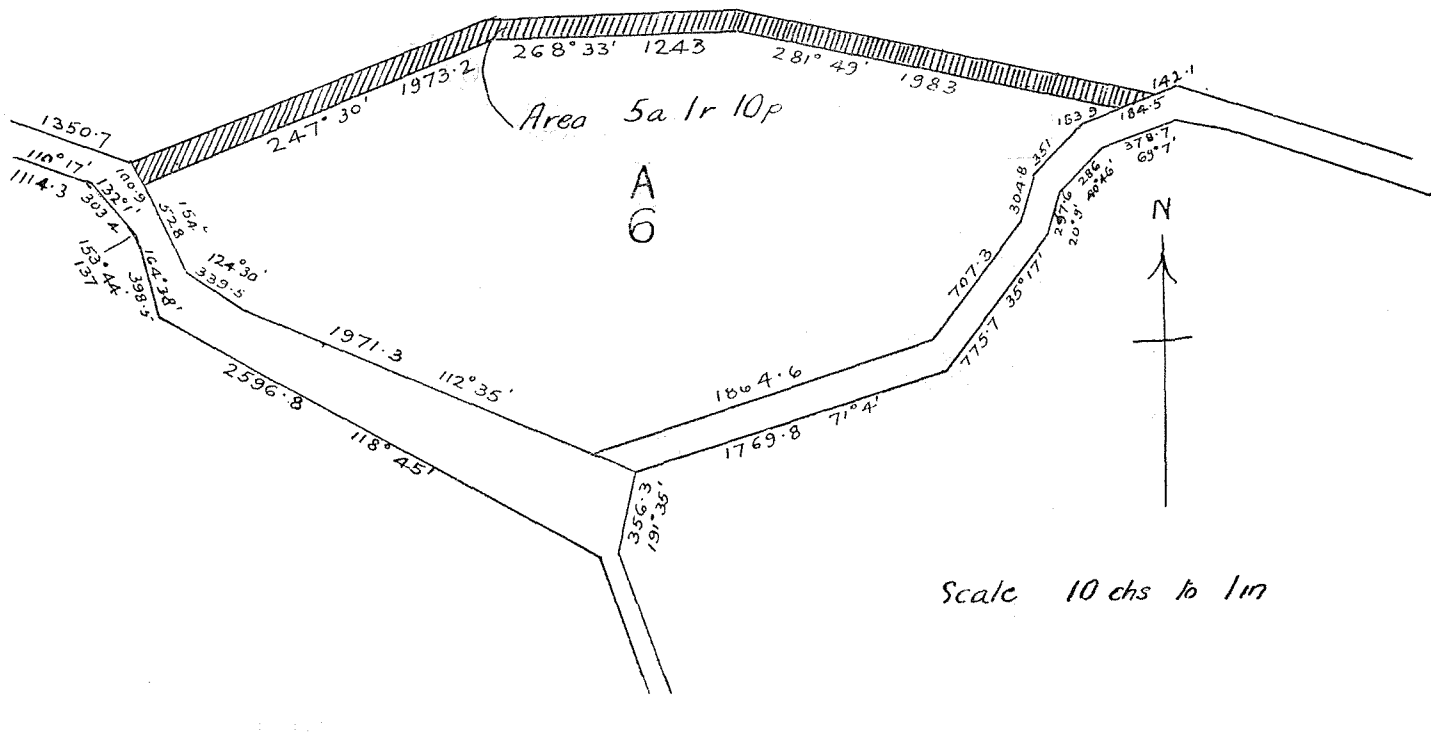

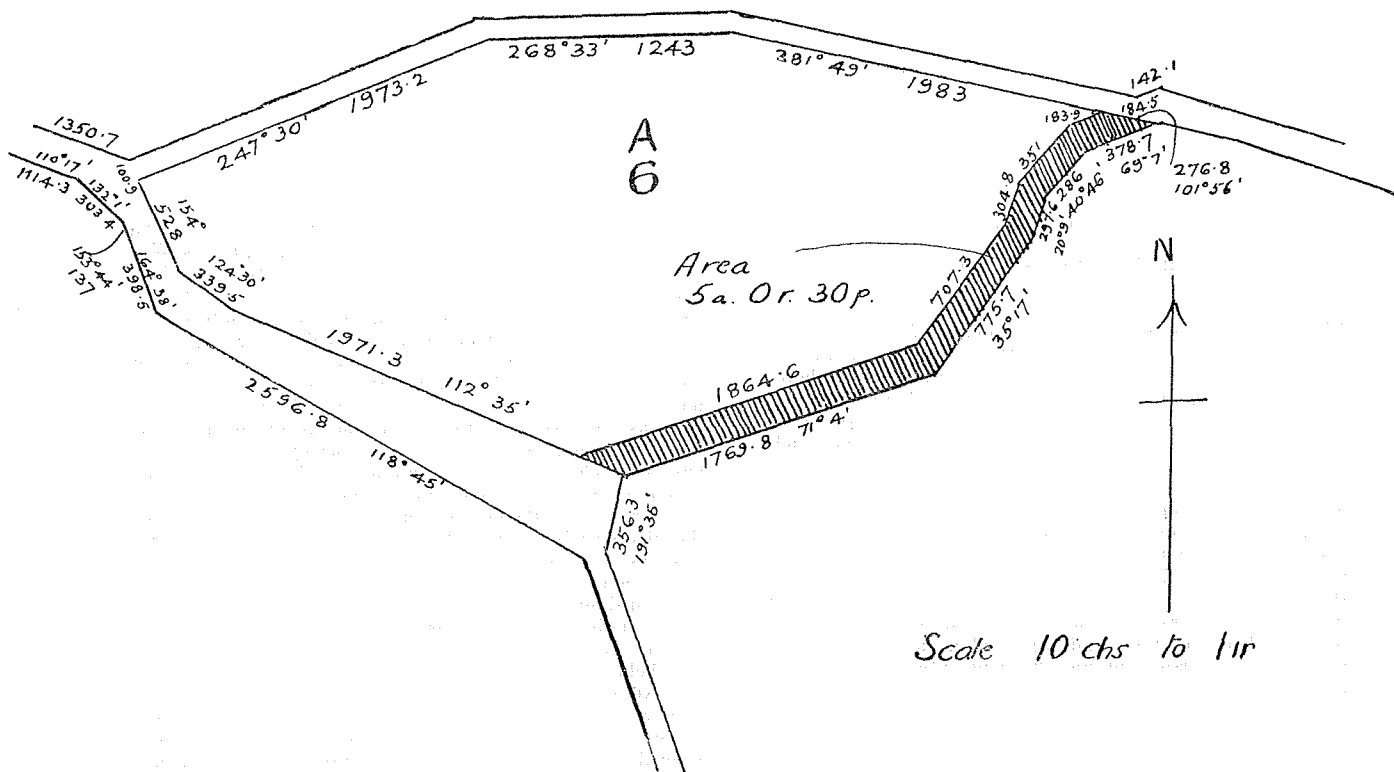
WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 3 of "The Closed Roads Alienation Act, 1932," that, where a road (to which the said Act applies) has hitherto been or hereafter is closed, and the land comprised therein has become Crown land, and land of any person through whose land such closed road passes, or to whose land such closed road adjoins, is resumed for the purpose of a road to take the place of the closed road in exercise of a right of resumption without payment of compensation, the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister, and without any consideration by Order in Council, declare that so much of the land comprised in the closed road which passes through or adjoins the land of such person as in the opinion of the Minister is equivalent to the land resumed as aforesaid, shall vest in such person for an estate or interest similar to that held by such person in his land immediately contiguous to the land so vested: And whereas a surveyed road, situated in the Albany Road District, and also within the boundaries of Lot A6 in the subdivision of Plantagenet Location 401 (as shown and recorded on Public Plans 451/80, B & C4, and 457A/40, B1, in the Department of Lands and Surveys, at Perth), is a road to which the provisions of the said Act apply: And whereas the said road, as to part thereof, was lawfully closed on the 8th day of May, 1931, which said part of road is more particularly delineated and hachured black in the First Schedule hereto: And whereas by notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 26th day of September, 1930, portions of the said Lot A6 of Plantagenet Location 401, more particularly delineated and hachured black in the Second Schedule hereto, were resumed to take the place of the said road which has been closed as aforesaid, in exercise of the right of resumption without payment of compensation

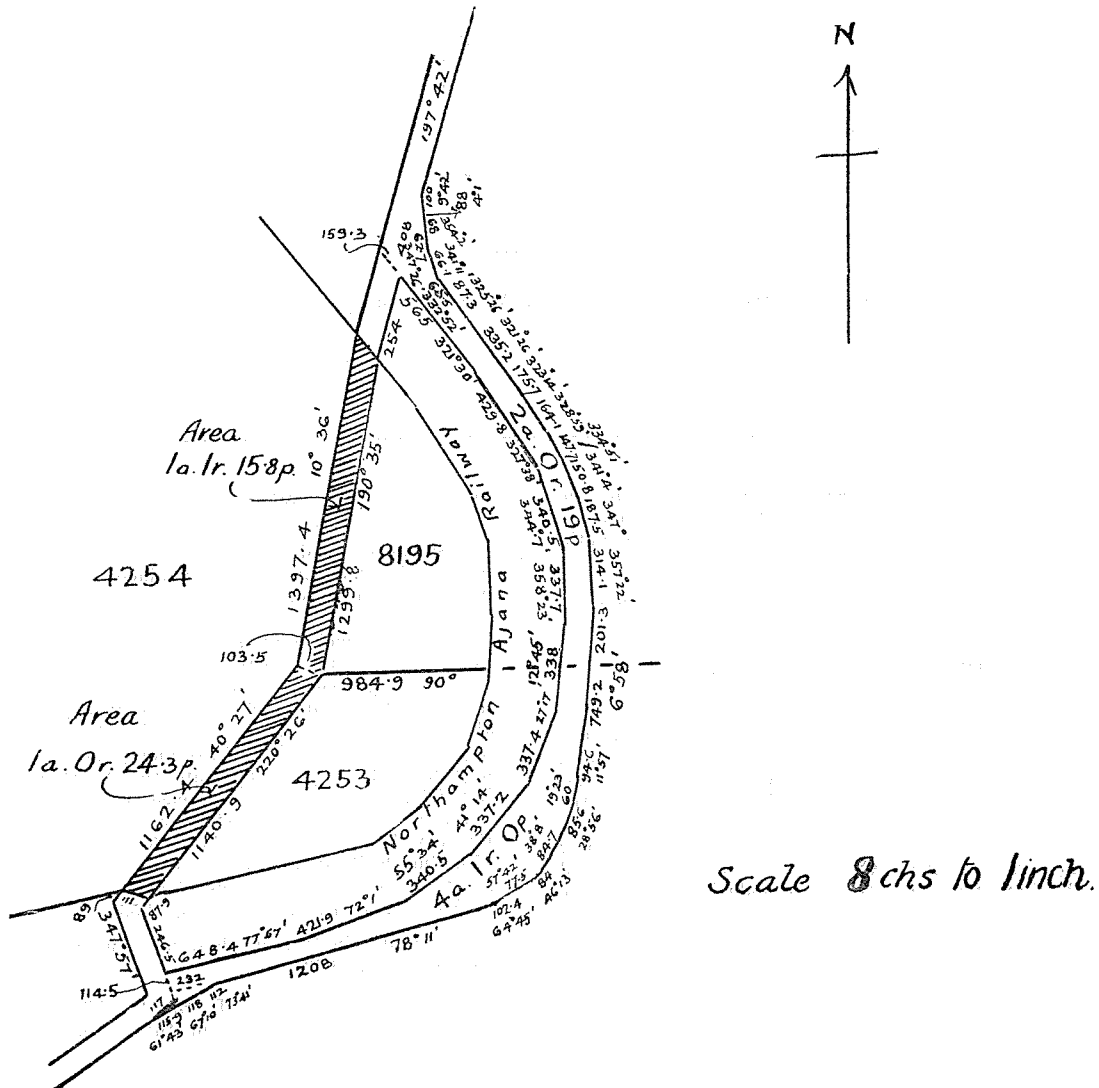
WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 3 of "The Closed Roads Alienation Act, 1932," that, where a road (to which the said Act applies) has hitherto been or here-

after is closed, and the land comprised therein has become Crown land, and land of any person through whose land such closed road passes, or to whose land such closed road adjoins, is resumed for the purpose of a road to take the place of the closed road in exercise of a right of resumption without payment of compensation, the Governor may, on the recommendation of the Minister, and without any consideration by Order in Coun-

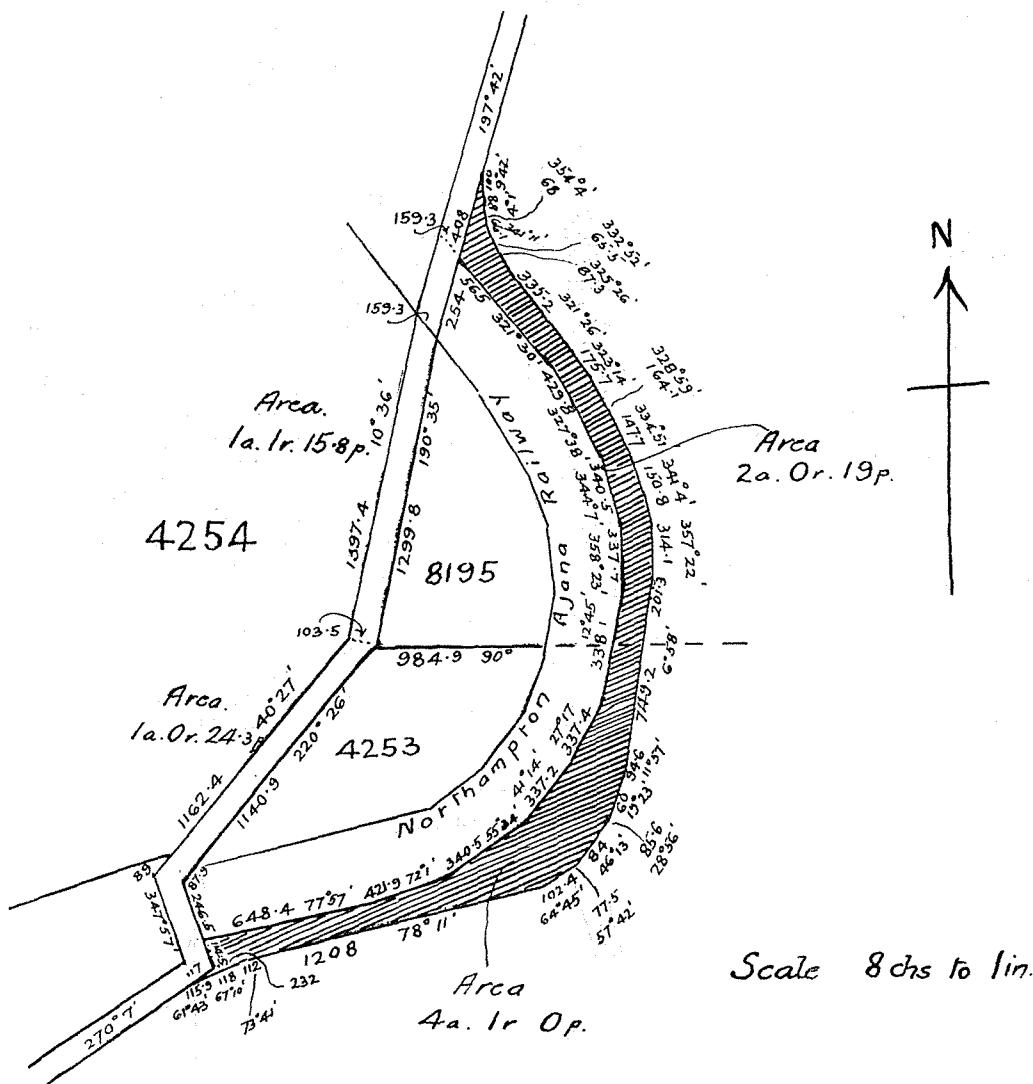
cil, declare that so much of the land comprised in the closed road which passes through or adjoins the land of such person as in the opinion of the Minister is equivalent to the land resumed as aforesaid, shall vest in such person for an estate or interest similar to that held by such person in his land immediately contiguous to the land so vested: And whereas a surveyed road, situated in the Northampton Road District, and which adjoins the boundaries of Victoria Locations 4253 and 8195 (as shown and recorded on Public Plan 160/80 BI, near Hutt Townsite, in the Department of Lands and Surveys, at Perth), is a road to which the provisions of the said Act apply: And whereas the said road, as to the whole thereof, was lawfully closed on the 19th day of August, 1932, which said road is more particularly delineated and hachured black in the First Schedule hereto: And whereas, by notice published in the *Government Gazette* on the 29th day of May, 1931, portions of the said Victoria Locations 4253 and 8195, more particularly delineated and hachured black in the Second Schedule hereto, were resumed to take the place of the said road which has been closed as aforesaid, in exercise of the right of resumption without payment of compensation contained in the respective instruments of title of the said Victoria Locations 4253 and 8195: And whereas Henry Carson, of Geraldton, in the State of Western Australia, draper, was at the date of the closure of the road as aforesaid and still is the registered proprietor of an estate in leasehold in Victoria Location 4253, and of an estate in fee simple in Victoria Location 8195 aforesaid, as appears by the respective instruments of title, namely, Crown Lease No. 4220/1912, in respect of Victoria Location 4253, and Volume 905 Folio 184, in respect of Victoria Location 8195: And whereas the Minister for Lands has recommended that the land comprised in the said surveyed road, which has been closed as aforesaid, and which is more particularly set forth,

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 34/33.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such

works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act:—

Description and Location of Reticulation Works Approved and Exempted.—Subiaco Municipality:—4-inch and 6-inch Reticulation Sewers, with all manholes, inspection shafts, and other apparatus connected therewith:—Commencing at a point in the centre of Smyth Road opposite the North boundary of Lot 456, Smyth Road, and proceeding South along the centre of Smyth Road to the centre of Aberdare Road; thence West along the centre of Aberdare Road to the centre of Railway Road; thence North-East along the centre of Railway Road to a point opposite the North boundary of Lot 660, Railway Road; thence East across Railway Road and along the North boundaries of Lots 660, Railway Road, 659, 658, 657, 656, Harvey Street, and 456, Smyth Road, and the prolongation of same to the point of commencement, as shown in pink on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 5255.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from certain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act:—

Description and Location of Reticulation Works Approved and Exempted.—Metropolitan Reticulation Main Extension:—City of Perth—City Beach Estate, Leederville Ward:—(1) Proposed six-inch diameter water main commencing at the existing six-inch diameter water main in Hesperia Avenue, at the intersection of Hesperia Avenue and Hovea Crescent, and proceeding thence in a North-Westerly and Northerly direction along Hovea Crescent to Dampier Avenue; thence in a Westerly direction along Dampier Avenue to Dodonia Gardens (length about twelve and a half chains); (2) proposed four-inch diameter water main commencing at the end of the above-mentioned proposed six-inch diameter main at the junction of Dampier Avenue and Dodonia Gardens and proceeding thence in a Southerly direction along Dodonia Gardens to a point opposite Lot 247 (length about two and a quarter chains).

The above mains to be laid complete with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 5252.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 980/22.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that the Governor may by Order in Council alter or extend the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Area, or of any District: And whereas it is desirable that the boundaries of Metropolitan Stormwater Districts Nos. 3 and 1 as at present defined should be altered: Now, therefore I, the said Lieut.-Governor and Administrator, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the boundaries of Metropolitan Stormwater Districts Nos.

3 and 1, and declare that the said boundaries, as shown on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D. No. 5192, and as described in Order in Council of 16th September, 1932, shall be altered in the following manner, by deleting the area described hereunder from Metropolitan Stormwater District No. 1 and including it in Metropolitan Stormwater District No. 3:—

Schedule.

Commencing at a point at the North-East corner of Lot 783, Swanbourne Street, and proceeding Southerly along the West alignment of Swanbourne Street to the South alignment of Samson Street; thence East along the South alignment of Samson Street to the North-East corner of Lot 7 of Sublot 27, Samson Street; thence South along the East boundary of the said Lot 7, Samson Street, to and across Lot 9, Edmund Street, and along the West boundaries of Lots 10, 11, 12, and 13, Edmund Street, to the South-West corner of Lot 13, Edmund Street; thence West across Sublot 27 to its West boundary; thence Southerly along the West boundary of the said Sublot 27 to the North alignment of South Street, a distance of about two chains; thence West along the North alignment of South Street to the West alignment of Mary Street; thence Northerly along the West alignment of Mary Street to the North-East alignment of Wray Avenue; thence North-Westerly along the North-East alignment of Wray Avenue to the West alignment of Ashburton Terrace; thence North-Easterly across Ashburton Terrace, Lots 41, 40, 39, and 38, Ashburton Terrace, and Lots 56, 57, 58, and 59, Mary Street, to and across Mary Street to the South-West corner of Lot 1 of Lot 782, Mary Street; thence Easterly along the South boundary of the said Lot 1 to its South-East corner; thence Northerly along the East boundaries of Lots 1 and 2 of Lot 782, Mary Street, to and across Lots 783, Swanbourne Street, to its North boundary; thence Easterly along the North boundary of the said Lot 783, Swanbourne Street, to the point of commencement, as shown in green on Plan M.W.S., S., & D.D., W.A., No. 5192.

## State Income Tax.

NOTICE is hereby given that every person liable under the abovenamed Act to make any return of income is required to make and furnish to me an Income Tax Return, in the prescribed form, of his or her income for the year ended 30th June, 1933. HIS Excellency the Lieut. Governor and Administrator has been pleased to amend the Regulations made under "The Metropolitan Whole Milk Act, 1932," and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th day of March, 1933, in the manner set forth hereunder.

THE METROPOLITAN WHOLE MILK ACT, 1932,  
REGULATIONS.

Amendment of Regulations.

1. Regulations 11 and 12 are repealed and new regulations are inserted in lieu thereof as follows:—

11 (1) Every license under the Act shall be issued by the Board and held by the licensee, and shall continue in force upon and subject to the conditions contained in the Second Schedule to these Regulations, and such conditions shall be indorsed upon the back of every such license and shall be deemed to be incorporated with and to form part thereof.

(2) In the event of the licensee refusing, failing, or neglecting duly to observe or comply with any one or more of the said conditions as indorsed upon the license as aforesaid, the Board may by notice in writing addressed to the licensee at his premises cancel the license.

12. The license fee payable for any license issued under the Act shall be the sum of five shillings. Such fee shall accompany the application for the license, but shall be refunded to the applicant if his application is refused.

2. Form 1 in the First Schedule is amended—

(a) by deleting the words "The application fee of 5s. is forwarded herewith;"

(b) by inserting after paragraph 10 the words "In the event of a license being issued to me I agree to accept and hold the same upon and subject to the conditions relating thereto as contained in the Second Schedule to "The Metropolitan Whole Milk Act, 1932," Regulations, and in all respects duly to observe and comply with such conditions;"

(c) by adding at the end of the said form the words:—"Note:—the license fee of 5s. must accompany this application."

3. Form 2 in the First Schedule is amended—

(a) by deleting the words "The application fee of 5s. is forwarded herewith;"

(b) by inserting after paragraph 13 the words "In the event of a license being issued to me I agree to accept and hold the same upon and subject to the conditions relating thereto as contained in the Second Schedule to "The Metropolitan Whole Milk Act, 1932, Regulations, and in all respects duly to observe and comply with such conditions;"

(c) by adding at the end of the said form the words:—"Note:—the license fee of 5s. must accompany this application."

4. Form 3 in the First Schedule is amended—

(a) by deleting the words "The application fee of £1 is forwarded herewith;"

(b) by inserting after paragraph 10 the words—"In the event of a license being issued to me I agree to accept and hold the same upon and subject to the conditions relating thereto as contained in the Second Schedule to "The Metropolitan Whole Milk Act, 1932," Regulations, and in all respects duly to observe and comply with such conditions;"

(c) by adding at the end of the said form the words:—"Note:—the license fee of 5s. must accompany this application."

5. Form 4 in the First Schedule is amended—
- (a) by deleting the words "This license is issued subject to the said Act and any regulations from time to time made thereunder," and inserting in lieu thereof the words "This license is issued by the Board, and is accepted and held by the licensee upon and subject to the said Act and the regulations made from time to time thereunder, and also to the conditions contained in the Second Schedule, to "The Metropolitan Whole Milk Act, 1932," Regulations as indorsed on the back of this license;"
  - (b) by deleting the words "Application fee paid";
  - (c) by adding at the end of the said form and to be indorsed on the back of the license conditions as follows:—

Conditions of License.

Every license under the Act shall be issued subject to the following conditions, namely:—

1. The licensee shall and will in each and every week during the currency of the license contribute towards the expenditure to be incurred by the Board in the administration of the Act, and in carrying out its duties and functions, a weekly sum calculated in accordance with the appropriate rate prescribed in condition 2 of these conditions.
2. For the purpose of assessing the amount of the weekly contribution to be paid by the licensee in accordance with condition 1 hereof, the following rates shall apply:—
  - (a) where the license is a Dairyman's License, the rate of contribution shall be 2/10ths of a penny per gallon of milk and 1d. per gallon of cream produced by the licensee for sale in the metropolitan area during each and every week ending at midnight on Saturday;
  - (b) where the license is a Milk Vendor's License, the rate of contribution shall be 2/10ths of a penny per gallon of milk and 1d. per gallon of cream sold by the licensee in the metropolitan area during each and every week ending at midnight on Saturday;
  - (c) where the license is a License to Treat Milk the rate of contribution shall be 2/10ths of a penny per gallon of milk and 1d. per gallon of cream treated by the licensee for sale in the metropolitan area during each and every week ending at midnight on Saturday.
3. The amount of weekly contribution payable by the licensee in accordance with these conditions shall be payable on the Monday next following each week ending at midnight on the next preceding Saturday.
4. On the Monday next following each week ending at midnight on Saturday the licensee shall and will deliver to the Board at its office a return in writing in a form approved by the Board and signed by the licensee, showing separately the quantity of milk and the quantity of cream produced, sold, or treated by the licensee, as the case may require, during the week which ended at midnight on the next preceding Saturday, and, simultaneously with such return, shall pay to the Board the amount of the weekly contribution then shown in accordance with such return to be payable at the appropriate rate provided for in condition 2 hereof.
5. If the licensee fails or neglects to pay the amount of any weekly contribution payable by him at the time provided herein for payment of the same, the amount of such contribution may be recovered as a debt due to the Board by action in any Court of competent jurisdiction.
6. If the licensee fails or neglects to furnish any weekly return as required by these conditions, the Board may authorise any officer of the Board to enter the premises of the licensee and inspect his books and other records, and from the particulars then obtained the Board may assess the amount of the weekly contribution payable by the licensee, and may recover the same from him as a debt due to the Board by action in any Court of competent jurisdiction.
7. If the licensee fails or neglects to furnish any weekly return, or to pay the amount of any weekly contribution payable by him under these conditions, or if he shall furnish a return which is false in any material particular with a view to evading payment of contribu-

tion under these conditions, the Board may by notice in writing sent to the licensee at his premises revoke the license.

6. Form 5 in the First Schedule is amended—
- (a) by deleting the words "This license is issued subject to the said Act and any regulations from time to time made thereunder," and inserting in lieu thereof the words "This license is issued by the Board and is accepted and held by the licensee upon and subject to the said Act and the regulations made from time to time thereunder, and also to the conditions contained in the Second Schedule to "The Metropolitan Whole Milk Act, 1932," Regulations as indorsed on the back of this license;
  - (b) by deleting the words "Application fee paid";
  - (c) by adding at the end of the said form and to be indorsed on the back of the license conditions as follows:—

Conditions of License.

Every license under the Act shall be issued subject to the following conditions, namely:—

1. The licensee shall and will in each and every week during the currency of the license contribute towards the expenditure to be incurred by the Board in the administration of the Act, and in carrying out its duties and functions, a weekly sum calculated in accordance with the appropriate rate prescribed in condition 2 of these conditions.
2. For the purpose of assessing the amount of the weekly contribution to be paid by the licensee in accordance with condition 1 hereof the following rates shall apply:—

4.
