#### PROCLAMATION

JAMES MITCHELL, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia over the State of Western Australia its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever in every or any specified portion of Western Australian

waters by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: And whereas it is desirable to vary Proclamations under the said section of the said Act dated the 17th day of November, 1931, and published in the Government Gazette on 20th November, 1931, and dated the 20th day of April, 1932, and published in the Government Gazette or 22nd April, 1932, respectively, in regard to certain Western Australian waters described therein being closed against the use of fishing nets: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby vary the said Proclamations by declaring that it shall be lawful to use fishing nets of legal length and size of mesh in the waters described in the Schedule hereto from the date of the publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette until the 31st day of October, 1933, inclusive.

#### Schedule.

(a) Princess Royal Harbour (Albany): All that area of Western Australian waters on the Northern side of Princess Royal Harbour, Albany, North of a line drawn from Residency Point to the Southern extremity of the Town Jetty; thence to the Southern extremity of the Deep Water Jetty, and thence North-Easterly to Point King.

(b) (12): All that area of the Southern portion of the waters of Oyster Harbour (Albany) and the waters of the Channel Entrance to Oyster Harbour from King George's Sound, bounded by the following lines:—On the South by a line drawn in an Easterly direction from a point on the foreshore ten (10) chains South of Emu Point to the opposite foreshore; on the North by a line drawn in a North-Easterly direction from a peg on the foreshore marked 14 (about 440 yards Westward of Emu Point) to the Southern extremity of Green Island, and thence by a line drawn in an East-South-Easterly direction from the Southern extremity of the said Green Island, to a point on the Southern foreshore of Oyster Harbour 115 chains Eastward of the Eastern point of entrance to Oyster Harbour.

WHEREAS by "The Aborigines Act, 1905," it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown lands to be Reserves for Aborigines: And whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Aborigines should be declared at East Perth: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare a Reserve of about twenty perches at Bennett Street, East Perth, more particularly described in the Schedule hereto, to be a Reserve for Aborigines.

#### Schedule.

That portion of Perth Town Lot X44 ("B" Reserve 1146) comprised within the old School Quarters situate at its North-East corner and having a frontage of about 53ft. 6in. to Royal Street and a frontage of about 102ft. to Bennett Street.

THE METROPOLITAN WHOLE MILK ACT, 1932, REGULATIONS.

Amendment of Regulations.

#### Part VI.

- 1. Regulations 20 and 21 are hereby repealed and the following Regulations are made in place thereof:-
- 20. Every person who by act or omission commits a breach of any of the Regulations for the time being in force under "The Metropolitan Whole Milk Act, 1932," commits an offence and is liable to a penalty not exceeding £50.
- 21. Every person who obstructs or interferes with any Inspector in the execution of his duties under any of the Regulations for the time being in force under "The Metropolitan Whole Milk Act, 1932," commits an offence and is liable to a penalty not exceeding £50.
- 2. The following new Regulations shall be added to the said Regulations after Regulation 33:-

Part IX.—Sale and Transport of Milk.

34. (1) The minimum price to be paid by milk vendors to dairymen for milk (other than fresh cream) shall be computed at the rate of 1s. 1d. per gallon.

The minimum price to be paid by milk vendors to dairymen for fresh cream shall be computed at the

rate of 8s. 6d. per gallon.

- (3) No dairyman shall sell and no milk vendor shall purchase milk or fresh cream wholesale at prices which are less than the said minimum prices.
- 35. Forthwith after receiving any milk or cream, a milk vendor shall give notice in writing to the dairyman or intermediary (if any) from whom he received it, stating the quantity thereof accepted by him as milk or fresh cream, and also stating whether the remainder cf the milk or cream has been rejected by him or accepted as butter-fat, or for any and what other purpose. The said notice shall be served at the place of business of the dairyman or intermediary (if any), or posted in time to enable him to receive the same not later than the day on which he received the empty cans which contained the said milk or cream.

36. A milk vendor shall pay the price of milk and fresh cream purchased by him (less permitted deductions for rail freight and road transport as provided in Regulation 39) at the following times:-

- (a) as to milk and fresh cream purchased between the first and fifteenth days inclusive of any month, payment shall be made on or within four days after the fifteenth day of that month;
- (b) as to milk and fresh cream purchased between the sixteenth and last days inclusive of any month, payment shall be made on or within four days after the last day of that month.

  37. (1) Every milk-can shall be labelled to the satisfaction of the Board with the name and address of

the dairyman to whom it belongs.

(2) Upon receiving milk in a milk-can belonging to a dairyman, a milk vendor in the Metropolitan Area shall promptly empty and thoroughly cleanse the can and forthwith return it to the owner thereof, or to the intermediary (if any) from whom he received it.

38. (1) In this Regulation the words "Siding of origin" mean the railway siding in a Dairy Area from

which milk is consigned to a railway station in the Metropolitan Area, and the word "destination" means the railway station in the Metropolitan Area to which the

milk is consigned.

(2) A milk vendor shall be entitled to deduct from the amount chargeable against him by a dairyman for any quantity of milk or fresh cream sold to him by the dairyman, such a sum as shall be equivalent to the actual rail freight paid on the said milk or fresh cream from the siding of origin to the destination and such road transport charges as are permitted by these Regulations to be charged.

(3) The maximum charge to be made against dairymen by milk vendors for road transport of milk and fresh cream from milk store in the country to the siding of origin shall be—¾d. per gallon or any part of a gallon (inclusive of the charge for returning the empty can from siding of origin to milk store).

(4) The maximum charge to be made against dairymen by milk vendors for road transport of milk and fresh cream from destination to milk store in the Metropolitan Area shall be—¾d. per gallon or any part of a gallon (inclusive of the charge for cleaning and returning the empty can to the destination).

(5) No milk vendor shall, without the consent in

writing of the Board first had and obtained, make charges against any dairyman excepting for the services aforesaid, and no charges shall be made in excess of the said maximum charges or of the charges fixed in any consent given by the Board.

(6) No person other than the Commissioner of Railways, or a licensed milk vendor, or a licensed dairyman, shall transport milk without the consent of the Board

in writing first had and obtained.

- 39. Regulations 34-38 inclusive shall not apply to a transaction if the dairyman or milk vendor concerned proves to the satisfaction of the Board or of any Court that the milk or fresh cream sold or purchased by him was neither intended for resale nor resold for consumption in the Metropolitan Area.
- 40. (1) The maximum price at which milk (other than fresh cream) may be sold by retail in the Metropolitan Area shall be computed at the rate of 2s. Sd. per gallon, if the milk is delivered in bottles or other containers provided by the milk vendor, and shall be computed at the rate of 2s. 4d. per gallon in all other
- The maximum price at which fresh cream may be sold by retail in the Metropolitan Area shall be computed at the rate of 2s. per pint, if the cream is delivered in bottles or other containers provided by the milk vendor, and shall be computed at the rate of 1s. 10d. per pint in all other cases.

(3) No milk vendor shall sell milk or fresh cream at prices which are in excess of the said maximum prices.

#### Part X.—Treatment of milk.

41. The occupier or holder of a milk store at which milk is treated shall:-

(a) cool milk by means of a "flush-over" or similar type of cooler capable of reducing the temperature of the milk to a temperature below 40deg. Fah.;

(b) provide and maintain facilities to the satisfaction of the Board for the storing of milk cooled as aforesaid so that the temperature thereof shall never rise above 40deg. Fah.;

(c) provide and maintain facilities to the satisfaction of the Board for the cleansing of all plant, utensils, and containers used in his milk store in connection with the treatment or storage of milk;

(d) so keep and maintain his buildings, plant, machinery, and equipment that they shall in every respect conform to the requirements of every local authority and statutory board or authority having jurisdiction in regard thereto;

(e) keep his plant and machinery in operation during the whole of any year in respect of which he holds a license to carry on business as a milk vendor.
