WHEREAS by Section 11 of "The Land Act, 1933," the Governor may resume, for any of the purposes specified in Section 29 of the said Act, any portion of land held as a Conditional Purchase Lease: And whereas it is deemed expedient that the portion of Conditional Purchase Lease 10076/68 (Avon Location 10745), as described hereunder, should be resumed for one of the purposes specified in paragraph six of Section 29 of the said Act, that is to say, for School Site: Now, therefore I, Sir James Mitchell, Lieutenant-Governor as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation resume portion of the aforesaid Conditional Purchase Lease for the purpose aforesaid.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 135/34.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Sewerage.—Claremont-Cottesloe System.—Third Section Claremont main sewer—24-inch and 21-inch diameter reinforced concrete pipe sewer, with all manholes and other apparatus connected therewith, as shown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 5334.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 16th day of March, 1934.

All that piece of land bounded by lines commencing on a North boundary of the Tableland Road District at the North-West corner of Pastoral Lease No. 2761/96 and extending East, North, and again East along said District boundary to the West boundary of the Port Hedland Road District; thence South along the latter boundary to the North boundary of Pastoral Lease No. 2033/96; thence West along part of the North boundary of Lease 2033/96 and the South boundary of Lease 2762/96, and North along the West boundary of the last-mentioned lease and the West boundary of Lease 2761/96 to the starting point. Metropolitan Water Supply—Canning Reservoir—Electric Power Depot.

WHEREAS by Section 11 of "The Public Works Act, 1902," it is made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to authorise the Minister to undertake, construct or provide any public work (subject as to Railways to Section 96), and such authorisation shall be deemed an authority to such Minister by and under that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the recited section of "The Public Works Act, 1902," doth hereby authorise the Honourable Minister for Works to construct and provide an Electric Power Depot in connection with the Canning Reservoir, on land shown coloured green on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 27504, which may be inspected at the office of the Minister for Works, Perth.

Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act, 1921.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by Subsection 3 of Section 14 of "The Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act, 1921," the Governor may, upon being satisfied that reciprocal provisions are about to be made by the Legislature or other competent authority of any part of His Majesty's Dominions, for the enforcement within that part of maintenance orders made by Courts within that State, extend the provisions of the said Act to that part of His Majesty's Dominions, and thereupon that part shall become a part of His Majesty's Dominions to which the said Act extends: And whereas the Governor is satisfied that the competent authority of the Territory of the Seat of Government of the Commonwealth of Australia is about to make reciprocal provisions for the enforcement within the Territory of the Seat of Government of maintenance orders made by Courts within this State: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby extend the said Act to the Territory of the Seat of Government of the Commonwealth of Australia.

STATE TRANSPORT CO-ORDINATION ACT, 1933.

Regulations.

THE Western Australian Transport Board hereby makes the following Regulations, pursuant to Section 57 of "The State Transport Co-ordination Act, 1933."

These Regulations may be cited as the Transport Regulations, 1934.

Part I.—Preliminary.

1. In these Regulations the following terms shall have the following meanings respectively, unless inconsistent with the context:—

"Appellant" means any person who has lodged an appeal against the refusal of the Board to grant him a license for a public vehicle pursuant to Subsection (2) of Section 24 of the Act.

"Applicant" means any person who makes application for a license for a public vehicle.

"The Act" means "The State Transport Co-ordination Act, 1933."

Part II.—The Board—Meetings—Business Hours. The Management and Conduct of Business at Meetings of the Board.

2. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business once at least in every week.

3. At every ordinary meeting of the Board, the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting. No discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings. After confirmation, minutes of proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed.

4. After the confirmation and the signing of the minutes of the previous meeting, the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Board at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (a) Business arising from the minutes.
- (b) Secretary's report.
- (c) Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority of the Board.
- (d) Reading letters received and considering and ordering thereon.
- (e) Consideration of applications for licenses.
- (f) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (g) Receiving deputations.
- (h) Presentation of schedule of receipts and disbursements. Passing of accounts.
- (i) Presentation of reports and considering and ordering thereon. The postponed items of former reports shall take precedence of new business brought up.
- (j) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings, and any business the Chairman may think desirable, with the consent of the members of the Board.

5. The order of business at special meetings shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

6. The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

7. Any member of the Board may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Board applying to the question under discussion, and may at any time (during business hours) have access to all the records and documents of the Board.

8. At every meeting of the members of the Board, all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall, if required by the Chairman, be reduced into writing, signed by the mover, and be delivered to the Chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

9. It shall be incumbent on every member of the Board presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board.

Receipts and Disbursements.

10. No fees, premiums, charges or other moneys due to the Board shall be paid to any person or persons whatsoever other than to such of its officers or agents as are authorised to receive such moneys.

11. Any receipt given for any such moneys received by any person or persons other than the authorised officer or agent of the Board shall be null and void, and shall not be binding on the Board in any way whatsoever.

12. All moneys shall be paid to the Board at its office, and only during the ordinary business hours of the Board.

13. All such fees, premiums, or charges received by the Board shall be paid to the credit of the Transport Co-ordination Fund as soon as practicable after the receipt thereof.

14. No withdrawals shall be made from such Fund, other than on account of payments that have been authorised by the Board, and all such authorisations shall be recorded in the Minute Book.

15. All cheques drawn against the Fund shall be signed by the Chairman and the secretary or any other officer of the Board temporarily appointed by the Board to sign in the absence of the secretary; but, in the absence of the Chairman, by any other member of the Board and the secretary or such officer.

Common Seal.

16. The Board shall keep a common seal bearing the name of the Board and containing some appropriate device thereon.

17. The common seal shall be kept in safe custody by the secretary, at the office of the Board, and shall not under any circumstances be affixed to any document or writing—

- (a) except pursuant to a resolution passed at a meeting of the Board; and
- (b) by the secretary, in the presence of at least one member of the Board, and the secretary and member or members present at the affixing of the common seal shall countersign the document or writing to which it is affixed.

Hours of Business.

18. The office of the Board shall be open for business, as follows:—10 a.m. to 4 p.m., from Monday to Friday inclusive, and from 10 a.m. till 12 noon on Saturdays, except on public holidays.

Part III.—Applications for Licenses.

Licenses for Omnibuses.

19. Every person desirous of obtaining a license to operate an omnibus under the Act shall make application in writing in the Form Numbered 1 in the First Schedule.

20. On consideration of the application the Board may call for any further information it may think necessary, in order to determine whether or not the application should be granted.

21. A license for an omnibus shall be in the Form Numbered 2 in the First Schedule.

22. If the Board imposes any conditions on the granting of a license, in addition to any statutory conditions imposed by the Act, such conditions shall be indorsed on or attached to the license.

23. On granting the license, the Board shall fix the percentage fee payable by the grantee of the license, not exceeding six per cent. of the gross earnings, as prescribed by the Act.

24. The method of payment of the license fee shall be determined by the Board in accordance with one of the following two methods:—

A. First Method—Purchase of Tickets—Chit System.

- (a) The Board shall cause to be printed appropriate books of tickets for issue to licensees, who shall purchase stocks of such tickets from the Board every month.
- (b) Each ticket shall have imprinted on it the fare and show the journey or section in respect of which the ticket is issued.
- (c) The applicant shall, from time to time, but not more than once a month, as he requires tickets, purchase them from the Board, at a fee to cover the cost of printing, and such percentage of the value of the tickets as the Board may fix on the issue of the license (not exceeding six per cent.) at the time of the granting of the license.
- (d) The licensee shall be obliged to collect a fare from every person carried as a passenger on the omnibus on that passenger joining the omnibus, in return for which he shall at once issue an appropriate ticket from such book.
- (e) All tickets shall be numbered consecutively.

B. Second Method—Monthly Returns and Assessments.

On the issue of a license by the Board the licensee shall—

- (a) Pay an amount not exceeding six per cent. on one-twelfth of the gross earnings of the vehicle for the last period of twelve months preceding the application. Such gross earnings shall be estimated by the Board on the information furnished by the licensee in his application for the license.
- (b) At the end of the first calendar month of the license, or within seven days thereafter, the licensee shall forward to the Board in the Form Number 3, in the First Schedule, a return of the gross earnings of the vehicle for that month, and shall pay any amount which may be due, after allowing credit for the sum paid on the granting of the license under the preceding paragraph, or be given a rebate of any amount overpaid.
- (c) The same procedure shall be followed from month to month.
- (d) The licensee shall be obliged to collect a fare from every person carried as a passenger on the omnibus, in return for which he shall at once issue an appropriate ticket.

25. It shall be a condition of every license issued for an omnibus that the licensee or his employee shall at all times produce to any inspector appointed under this Act, or to any inspector appointed under "The Traffic Act, 1919-1932," any unused tickets in his possession.

26. The licensee shall not make any alteration in the construction, design, or seating capacity, without first obtaining the written permission of the Board.

27. The licensee shall exhibit in a conspicuous place in the omnibus, and so as to be capable of being easily read, a notice stating the maximum number of passengers the vehicle is licensed to carry.

28. The licensee shall carry children under the age of five years free of charge, unless any child occupies a seat in the vehicle to the exclusion of a paying passenger.

29. The licensee shall carry children over the age of five years and under the age of fourteen years at half the adult fare.

Part IV.—Licenses for Commercial Goods Vehicles.

30. Every person desirous of obtaining a license to operate a commercial goods vehicle under the Act shall make application in writing in Form Number 4, in the First Schedule.

31. On consideration of the application, the Board may call for any further information it may think necessary, in order to determine whether or not the application should be granted.

32. A license for a commercial goods vehicle shall be in the Form Number 5, in the First Schedule hereto.

33. If the Board imposes any conditions on the granting of a license, in addition to any statutory conditions imposed by the Act, such conditions shall be indorsed on or attached to the license.

34. If the license is granted, the applicant shall obtain from the Board a distinguishing number plate in duplicate, bearing a number to be allotted by the Board, and such number shall be in white on a green background. The owner shall keep the plates fixed to the vehicle as long as the license is operative. The plates shall be fixed as follows:—

- (a) One shall be fixed in a conspicuous place on the front of the vehicle;
- (b) The other shall be fixed in a conspicuous place on the back of the vehicle.

35. Both number plates shall be fixed in an upright position and capable of being easily read.

36. The licensee shall pay the fees prescribed in the Second Schedule for the use of the plates.

37. If at any time the license ceases to be operative, the licensee shall forthwith deliver back the license and the plates to the Board.

38. No license shall be issued until the fees prescribed under the Act and fixed by the Board for the issue of the license have been paid by the applicant.

Part V.—Aircraft Licenses.

39. Save as expressly modified in this Part, the Regulations under Part III, dealing with omnibuses, shall apply to applications for and the granting of licenses for aircraft, and any obligations imposed on licensees of omnibuses shall be equally binding, with the necessary modifications, in the case of aircraft.

40. Every owner of a licensed aircraft shall make out a ticket in duplicate in respect of every passenger carried or contracted to be carried on the aircraft. Such ticket shall be made out before or on the passenger commencing the journey, and shall show particulars of the journey, the passenger's name and address, and the fare for the journey. The duplicates of all such tickets shall be retained by the owner and produced at all times for inspection and audit by an officer authorised by the Board.

41. A form of application for an aircraft license is prescribed in Form Number 6, in the First Schedule.

42. A form of license for an aircraft is prescribed in Form Number 7, in the First Schedule.

Part VI.—Permits.

43. Every applicant for a permit under the Act shall make application in Form Number 8, in the First Schedule.

44. The application shall be signed by the applicant, and shall specify with sufficient clearness—

- (a) the name, address, and occupation of the applicant;
- (b) the vehicle in respect of which the application is made, and the name, address, and occupation of the owner;
- (c) the occasion on which the permit is required.

45. Every such application shall be lodged with the Board on a day on which the office of the Board is open for business, and at least twenty-four hours before the time on which the permit is required.

46. No permit shall issue until the applicant has paid the fee prescribed in the Second Schedule.

47. A permit may be in Form Number 9, in the First Schedule.

Part VII.—Appeals.

48. Any person who has been refused a license by the Board, and who is entitled to appeal against the refusal of the Board to grant such license under the provisions of Subsection (2) of Section 24 of the Act may, within seven days after the date of such refusal, appeal to the Stipendiary Magistrate of the Police Court, Perth, against such refusal.

- (a) The appellant shall serve on the Board a notice of appeal within such period of seven days, stating concisely the grounds on which the appellant intends to appeal, and at the hearing of such appeal the appellant shall be limited to the grounds stated in his notice of appeal.
- (b) The appellant shall within the like time institute his appeal by lodging a copy of the notice of appeal with the Clerk of Petty Sessions, Perth, and shall pay the statutory deposit of Ten pounds into Court as security for costs.

49. The notice of appeal may be in the Form Number 10, in the First Schedule hereto.

50. The appellant shall, on the lodging of the notice with the Clerk of Petty Sessions, pay the fee prescribed in the Second Schedule to these Regulations.

Part VIII.—Miscellaneous.

51. Notwithstanding the conviction of the licensee for any offence under the Act or these Regulations, the Board may revoke or suspend his license.

52. The licensee shall comply with all the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919-1932," and the Regulations made thereunder, or any statutory re-enactment or modification thereof from time to time in force, so far as those provisions apply to the vehicle and/or its operation, and, in the event of any breach thereof by act or omission, the Board may revoke or suspend the license.

53. It shall be a term of every license or permit that any statements of intention of the applicant in his application for the license or permit in relation to or incidental to the operation of the public vehicle in respect of which such application is made, shall at all times be carried out and observed by the applicant, subject only to any modifications or conditions imposed on the granting of the license.

54. No alteration shall be made in the design or construction of any public vehicle without the consent in writing of the Board, and then only in accordance with any conditions approved by the Board.

55. The licensee shall at all times permit an authorised officer of the Board to travel free of charge on the public vehicle, for the purpose of inquiring and ascertaining whether the licensee is carrying out the provisions of the Act, or these Regulations, or the conditions of his license.
