WHEREAS by Section 33 of "The Land Act, 1933," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in Section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of subleasing: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve 21203 (near Cranbrook) should vest in and be held by the Cranbrook Road Board in trust for Recreation (Golf Links): Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Cranbrook Road Board in trust for Recreation (Golf Links), with power to the said Cranbrook Road Board to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease, subject to the approval of the Governor first obtained.

Moora Road Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 389/23.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919-31," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a Local Authority to exercise within its District any power of making Regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4 of Part IV. of the said Act: And whereas it is desired to empower the Moora Road Board to prohibit the standing of vehicles in specified streets, within the Townsite of Moora, in its District, at the discretion of the Board: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and every other authority enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby empower the Moora Road Board to make By-laws to regulate the standing of vehicles in specified streets, within the Townsite of Moora, in the Moora Road District, at the discretion of the Board, and to impose a penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for the breach thereof.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Traffic Act, 1919-31," the Governor may by Order in Council empower a Local Authority to exercise within its District any power of making Regulations which the Governor can exercise under Division 4 of Part IV. of the said Act: And whereas it is desired to empower the Mukinbudin Road Board to make By-laws to:—(1) Appoint parking places for the use of vehicles in the Townsite of Mukinbudin; (2) regulate the standing of vehicles in the Townsite of Mukinbudin: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and every other authority enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby empower the Mukinbudin Road Board to make By-laws to:—(1) Appoint parking places for the use of vehicles in the Townsite of Mukinbudin; (2) regulate the standing of vehicles in the Townsite of Mukinbudin; and to impose a penalty of not exceeding £20 per the breach thereof.

Murray Road Districts—Alterations to Ward Boundaries.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W. 521/31.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919-33," the Governor may by Order in Council sever any portion of a Ward of a Road District and annex it to another Ward: And whereas it is desirable to sever—(1) Those portions of the North-West Ward of the Murray Road District described in Schedule A hereto and annex them to the North-East Ward; (2) that portion of the South-West Ward of the Murray Road District described in Schedule B hereto and annex it to the South-East Ward: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in this behalf, doth hereby sever—(1) Those portions of the North-West Ward of the Murray Road District described in Schedule A hereto and annex them to the North-East Ward of the Murray Road District; (2) that portion of the South-West Ward of the Murray Road District described in Schedule B hereto and annex it to the South-East Ward of the Murray Road District.

Schedule A.

MURRAY ROAD BOARD DISTRICT.

Transfer of Territory from the North-West Ward to the North-East Ward.

(a) That portion of Cockburn Sound Location 16 bounded by lines commencing at the North-West corner of Lot 62 on L.T.O. Plan No. 739B and extending East along part of the Northern boundary of the District to the Western side of the South-Western railway reserve; thence South-Westerly along said side of railway reserve to the South-East corner of Lot "a28," on L.T.O. Plan No. 738; thence Westward along the Southern boundaries of Lots "a28" and "a29" to the South-West corner of the latter lot; thence North along the West boundaries of Lots "a29," "a38," and "b38," on L.T.O. Plan No. 738, and Lots 61 and 62 on L.T.O. Plan No. 739B to the starting point.

(b) That portion of Cockburn Sound Location 16 bounded by lines commencing on the right bank of the Murray River at a point in prolongation East of the North boundary of Pinjarra Townsite and extending Eastward to the Western side of the South-Western Railway Reserve (passing along the Southern boundary of Lot 8 on L.T.O. Plan No. 4496); thence Southward along said side of railway reserve to its intersection with the North-Western side of the Perth-Pinjarra Road; thence South-Westward along said side of road to the right bank of the Murray River; thence in a Northerly direction along said bank of river to the starting point.

Schedule B.

Transfer from the South-West Ward to the South-East Ward.

Those portions of Cockburn Sound Location 16 and Murray Location 1 bounded by lines commencing on the right bank of the Murray River at its intersection with the North boundary of the land as shown on L.T.O. Diagram 3497, and extending East along said boundary to the Eastern side of the South-Western Railway Reserve; thence Southwards along said side of railway reserve to the right bank of the Murray River; thence in a general Northerly direction along said bank of river to the starting point. (Plans 380A/40, 380B/40, 380D/40.)

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 61/34.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater

drainage works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Sewerage—Claremont-Cottesloe System:—Effluent main, Claremont main sewer, First and Second Sections, water main and road, as shown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 5318.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

Hills Water Scheme—Canning Dam.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 957/33.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

The construction of:—(a) An arched concrete gravity dam, approximately 1,600 feet long and 218 feet high above the bed of the Canning River, including the foundations, drainage and inspection systems, overflow weir with reinforced concrete bridge, bywash channel and guide walls, wet well, outlet pipes, valve and meter houses, together with all necessary control gates, valves, and other apparatus; (b) An earth embankment with concrete core at North end of dam, approximately 440 feet long; (c) The opening up of quarries, provision of cofferdams and roads, and the supply and erection of all necessary plant required for the construction and satisfactory completion of the dam, etc.

At a site on the Canning River, about the centre of Canning Location 348, within Canning River Catchment Area Reserve.

The whole of the above works are as indicated on Plan P.W.D., W.A. No. 27501.

Amendment of By-laws.

M.H.D. 165/33; Ex. Co. No. 616.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-32," a Local Health Authority may make By-laws, and may amend, repeal, or alter any By-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Perth Road Board, being the Local Health Authority for the Perth Road District Health District, doth hereby amend its By-laws as follows—

Part I.

By the insertion of the following, to stand as 1(k)—

1(k) Where premises abut on a public right-of-way, the earth closet shall be so placed and constructed as to admit of the removal of the pan from the right-of-way. On all premises the earth closet shall be so placed and constructed that the pan can be removed without being taken through any part of any dwelling house or other building.

Part III.

By the insertion of the following, to stand as 3 (a)—

By the insertion of the following, to stand as 3(a)—the Nurses' Registration Board under the provisions of "The Nurses' Registration Act, 1921," shall be granted registration as a keeper of a private hospital of either Class "A" or "B": Provided that this By-law shall not apply to any person not so registered who at the time of the gazettal of the said By-law was the holder of a certificate of registration in respect of a private hospital kept by her.

Part VII.

By the insertion of the following, to stand as 72(a)—

72(a). The keeper of every public house, public bar, refreshment room, tearoom, eating house, or other public place of refreshment shall not permit the use of any drinking vessel, unless such vessel is sound and free from cracks, and unchipped.

Part IX.


THE DOG ACT, 1903-28.

Regulations.

1. These Regulations shall come into operation and have the force of law in every District throughout the State on and from the 1st day of July, 1934.

2. All Regulations previously made under the Act shall be and are hereby repealed as from the 30th day of June, 1934.

3. The registration label for the financial year ending 30th June, 1935, required by Section 9 of "The Dog Act, 1903-28," is hereby prescribed to be a flat piece of nickel-plated brass, of the size and shape depicted hereunder, inscribed on the one side with the name of the District, the year of registration, and the registration number, and on the other side with the emblem of the State flag.



4. Such registration label shall be securely fixed to a collar, which shall be continually worn round the dog's neck.

5. Registration shall be effected on or within 21 days from the 1st day of July, 1934.

6. (a) The registration fees for dogs other than those used for tending cattle and sheep shall be:—

(c) In respect of any registration made after the 31st day of December in any year, only one-half of the registration fee shall be payable.

7. The definition of "Cattle," referred to in these Regulations, shall be as set out in the Second Schedule of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882," namely:—

"Great cattle"—horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, mule, bull, ox, cow, heifer, calf, camel, deer, and foal.

"Small cattle"—ram, ewe, sheep, wether and lamb, goat, kid, and pig.

8. Application for the issue of a license for a dog shall be made on the prescribed form, namely, Form "A," in the Second Schedule to "The Dog Act, 1903-28" (as printed and issued by the Department of Works and Labour).

9. Where a license is required under the proviso to Section 11 of the said Act, the number of cattle or sheep for which the dog is used for tending must be stated in the last column of the prescribed form.

10. Any person contravening any of these Regulations, whether by act or omission, shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

By-law No. 121 for "Star Thistle."

Section 26—No owner or occupier of land within the Northampton Road Board District shall—

- (a) introduce any stock or farm produce from any place infested with Star Thistle; or
- (b) remove stock or farm produce from any place infested with Star Thistle within the District to any other place within or without the District, unless such person obtains and produces to the Board an Inspector's certificate, certifying that such stock or produce is free from seeds of Star Thistle.

Any owner or occupier of land who commits a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5), unless he proves to the satisfaction of the Court—

- (a) that a certificate of an Inspector was immediately previously obtained in respect of such stock or produce to the effect that such stock or produce was free from seeds of Star Thistle; or
- (b) that the said stock or produce was removed or went or was taken beyond the limits of the holding without his knowledge, and that he had taken all reasonable means to prevent the same from being removed or going or being taken beyond such limits.

Regulations.

Margarine not to resemble Butter in Colour—Composition of Margarine, etc.

48A. (1.) Margarine shall not contain any vegetable or animal oils or fats containing colouring matter which alone or in combination will produce a colour resembling that of butter. It shall not contain more than 16 parts per centum of water and shall not contain any preservative other than salt. The fat content shall have a maximum Kirschner value of 4.5.

(2.) Margarine shall not contain or have added to it before or during or subsequent to being processed, treated, manufactured, or otherwise dealt with any chemical fluid or substance which may give it an appearance or colour resembling that of Australian butter.

(3.) Pure biological cultures, lactic acid, starters or lactic acid in any form shall not be used in the manufacture of margarine.

(4.) Margarine shall be mixed with not less than one part potato starch or Queensland arrowroot (*Cannaedulis*) per 1,000 parts of margarine or, alternatively, not less than five parts per centum by weight of Sesame oil. The Sesame oil added shall give the chemical reaction as laid down under the Regulations made under "The Health Act, 1911-1933."

48B. No person shall have in his possession for sale margarine in portions of 2 lb. weight or under, unless the same be made up in cube form.
