GREETING:

First Assignment.—Know Ye, that We have assigned you and each and every of you, to be Our Justices to keep Our Peace in Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, either alone or with any one or more of Our Justices that hereafter shall be appointed in Our said State and its Dependencies, and to keep and cause to be kept all laws, for the preservation of the Peace, and for the quiet rule and good government of Our people, in Our said State and its Dependencies according to the form and effect of the same, and to punish all persons offending against them, or any of them, in the said State and its Dependencies, as by the said laws is provided, and to cause to come before you all persons within Our said State and its Dependencies who use threats to any of Our People, to find security for keeping the peace or for their good behaviour towards Us and Our People: And if they refuse to find such security, then to cause them to be safely kept until they find such security.

Second Assignment.—We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to inquire the truth concerning all manner of crimes, misdemeanours, and offences, concerning which Our Justices of the Peace may lawfully or ought to inquire by whomsoever and in what manner soever done, perpetrated, or attempted in Our said State and its Dependencies: And upon all complaints before you to issue such process against the persons charged until they are taken or surrender themselves, as may by law be issued

Third Assignment.—We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to have, exercise, and discharge all other the powers, authorities, and duties which under or by virtue of any law of Our Realm or of Our said State belong or appertain to the office of Justice of the Peace in or for Our said State.

And therefore We command you and each and every of you that you diligently apply yourselves to keep and cause to be kept the peace and all laws of Our Realm and of Our said State, and that at certain days and places duly appointed for these purposes, you make inquiries into the premises, and hear and determine all and singular the matters aforesaid, and perform and fulfil the duties aforesaid, doing therein what is just according to the laws of Our Realm and of Our said State: And we command Our Sheriff and other officers of Our said State to aid you by all lawful means in the performance and due execution of the premises

In testimony whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Our said State to be hereunto affixed.

Witness our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir James Mitchell, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Our Lieutenant-Governor in and over Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, at Perth, this 22nd day of March, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

GREETING:

First Assignment.—Know Ye, that We have assigned you, and each and every of you, to be Our Justices to keep Our Peace in Our State of Western Australia in the Magisterial Districts hereinbefore indicated, either alone or with any one or more of Our Justices that hereafter shall be appointed in the said Districts, and to keep and cause to be kept all laws, for the preservation of the Peace, and for the quiet rule and good government of Our people in the said Districts according to the form and effect of the same, and to punish all persons offending against them, or any of them, in the said Districts, as by the said laws is provided, and to cause to come before you all persons within the said Districts who use threats to any of Our People, to find security for keeping the peace or for their good behaviour towards Us and Our People: And if they refuse to find such security, then to cause them to be safely kept until they find such security.

COMMISSION OF THE PEACE--*continued.*

Second Assignment.—We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to inquire the truth concerning all manner of crimes, misdemeanours, and offences, concerning which Our Justices of the Peace may lawfully or ought to inquire by whomsoever and in what manner soever done, perpetrated, or attempted in the said Districts: And upon all complaints before you to issue such process against the person charged until they are taken or surrender themselves as may by law be issued.

Third Assignment.—We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to have, exercise, and discharge all other the powers, authorities, and duties which under or by virtue of any law of Our Realm or of Our said State belong or appertain to the office of Justice of the Peace in or for Our said State.

And therefore We command you and each and every of you that you diligently apply yourselves to keep and cause to be kept the peace and all laws of Our Realm and of Our said State, and that at certain days and places duly appointed for these purposes, you make inquiries into the premises, and hear and determine all and singular the matters aforesaid, and perform and fulfil the duties aforesaid, doing therein what is just according to the laws of Our Realm and of Our said State: And we command Our Sheriff and other officers of Our said State to aid you by all lawful means in the performance and due execution of the premises.

In testimony whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Our said State to be hereunto affixed.

Witness our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir James Mitchell, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Our Lieutenant-Governor in and over Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, at Perth, this 22nd day of March, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1933," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make, alter, or repeal By-laws for all or any of the purposes in the said Acts mentioned, the Bridgetown Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Acts and of every authority enabling it in this behalf, doth hereby repeal the By-laws to provide restrictions as to Hawkers, passed by the said Board on the 8th day of January, 1932, and advertised in the *Government Gazette* of the 18th day of March, 1932, and doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

By-laws to Provide Restrictions as to Hawkers.

No. 1. No person shall hawk any fruit, fish, or vegetables, or any article of merchandise, within any part of the District, without having first obtained a license and badge from the Board.

No. 2. Any person who travels or trades on foot, or with any vehicle or animal, or otherwise carrying to sell, or offering for sale, or exposes within the limits aforesaid, any of the articles or things aforesaid shall be deemed to hawk the same.

No. 3. No person shall keep, manage, or conduct any movable or temporarily fixed stall in or near any street for the sale of any meat, fruit, vegetables, drink, catables, or articles of merchandise, unless such person be licensed.

No. 4. Licenses for Hawkers shall be in the Form of W, X, or Y, as the case may require, of the Schedule, and for Stalls, in the Form of Z in the Schedule.

No. 5. Every person, when applying for a Hawker's License, or renewal of such license, shall obtain from the said Board a numbered badge, on which shall be inscribed the year of issue, and shall pay a fee of 5s. therefor. Such badge shall not be transferable, except with the written consent of the secretary of the Board.

No. 6. Every hawker, whilst employed in hawking, shall produce his license, upon being required by any constable or officer of the Board, and shall at all times have affixed to some conspicuous part of his basket, tray, cart, barrow, or other vehicle a board or plate, bearing his name and the words "Licensed Hawker," legibly printed thereon in letters not less than one inch in length.

No. 7. Every hawker shall at all times, when hawking or offering or exposing goods for sale or hire, display his badge on some conspicuous portion of his clothing.

No. 8. No licensed stalls shall be placed or allowed to stand in any street or position other than that mentioned in the license, or between the hours of 9.0 p.m. and 4.0 a.m.

No. 9. Every licensed hawker or stall-holder shall at all times obey the lawful directions of the secretary or other authorised officer of the Board.

No. 10. No person to whom a Hawker's or Stall-holder's License or badge is granted shall lend, transfer, or assign his license or badge, and no person shall borrow or make use of any such license or badge granted to a person other than himself, unless by written consent of the secretary.

No. 11. The following fees shall be paid for Licenses to Hawkers or Stalls, and shall be paid in advance and, if any payment be not paid when due, the license shall be void.

Fees.

For every hawker with handbasket or tray, five shillings (5s.) per annum.

For every hawker with wheelbarrow or hand cart, thirty shillings (30s.) per annum.

For every hawker engaged in hawking in the Central Ward and/or other portions of the said Bridgetown Road Board District with motor or vehicle drawn by horse or other animal, ten pounds (£10) per annum.

Yilgarn Road Board.

By-laws for the Management and Regulation of the Southern Cross Greater Sports Ground.

P.W. 9/26.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in "The Road Districts Act, 1919-33," Sections 154 and 196 (8), the Yilgarn Road Board hereby adopts and publishes the following By-laws for the Management and Regulation of Reserve "A" 7478, known as the Southern Cross Greater Sports Ground.

In these By-laws—

- (a) The word "Board" shall mean the Yilgarn Road Board.
- (b) The word "Reserve" shall mean Reserve "A" 7478.
- (c) The word "Caretaker" shall mean the person appointed by the Board to take care of the said Reserve.

1. No person shall damage or interfere with any property or thing placed or used in or belonging to the Reserve, or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or any litter, rubbish, or waste matter of any kind.

2. No person shall stand on or climb or jump over the seats, trees, or fences of the Reserve, or cut letters, names, or marks on or otherwise damage the structures, trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences thereon, or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

3. No person, except those in the employ of or authorised by the Board shall bring into the Reserve any horse or other animal or vehicle.

4. No person shall light any fire within the Reserve without the permission of the Board.

5. No person, except the officers or servants of the Board acting in the discharge of their duty, shall enter the Reserve on such days as may be set apart for racing, trotting, games, sports, amusements or entertainments, except through the proper entrance for that purpose, and on payment of the fee chargeable for admission at the time; but on such days as are not set apart as aforesaid the Reserve shall be open to the public free of charge.

6. No person shall enter the Reserve for the purpose of playing any games or sports, or for horse-racing or trotting therein, until he has first obtained a permit so to do from the Board, unless he is a bona fide member of any club or sporting body authorised in that behalf.

7. No person or authorised club having obtained any such permit as aforesaid shall practise, play at, or carry on any game, sport, or amusement except upon such portions of the Reserve as may be specified by the Board for that purpose.

8. The Board may, in its discretion, prohibit any games or sports from being played or carried on upon any portion of the Reserve on any Sunday.

9. No person shall bring or take any horse on to the Reserve for the purpose of training or exercising such horse, without having first obtained from the Board a training or exercising permit.

10. No person shall smoke any pipe, tobacco, cigar, or cigarette in any of the dressing-rooms of the Reserve.

11. No person shall, except with the permission of the Board, bet, gamble, or call the odds or offer to bet or gamble within the Reserve, and any person found betting, gambling, or calling the odds, or offering to bet or gamble within the Reserve without such permission, may forthwith be removed by the caretaker or any other officer or servant or member of the Board, or of the Police Force, and such person shall also be liable to prosecution for a breach of this By-law.

12. No person, other than a member of a sporting body duly authorised in that behalf, shall enter any of the dressing or training rooms on the Reserve, or use any of the lockers, without having first obtained a permit from the Board for that purpose, and every person holding such permit shall produce and exhibit the same when required by due authority.

13. No person shall address an audience or public meeting on the Reserve without having first obtained permission so to do from the Board.

14. No person shall camp, lodge, or tarry overnight, or frequent for the purpose of camping, lodging, or tarrying overnight, on the Reserve.

15. No person shall post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint, or otherwise affix or exhibit, or cause to be posted, stamped, stuck, stencilled, painted, or otherwise affixed

or exhibited, any placard, handbill, notice, advertisement or any document whatsoever upon any tree, post, fence, gate, or building on the Reserve without first having obtained the written consent of the Board.

16. No person shall sell or expose for sale any food, drink, goods, wares, merchandise, or things on any portion of the Reserve, unless the consent of the Board shall have been previously obtained.

17. Any person found in a state of intoxication in the Reserve, or behaving in a disorderly manner, or creating or taking part in any disturbance, or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language, or committing any act of indecency or misconducting himself, or committing any breach of this By-law therein, may be forthwith removed from such Reserve by the caretaker or by any officer or servant, or member of the Board or by any member of the Police Force, without affecting such person's liability to prosecution for an offence against this By-law.

18. No person, club, sporting body or association shall sublet any portion of the Reserve, the use of which may be granted to any such person, club, sporting body or association, nor permit the same to be used by any person or persons whatsoever without the written consent of the Board.

19. The sums to be charged by the Board to the various persons, clubs, sporting bodies, or associations for the use of the Reserve, or any portion thereof, shall be such as shall be fixed by the Board from time to time.

20. The Board may grant the exclusive use of the Reserve, or any portion thereof, to any particular person, club, sporting body, or association for any particular day or days, and the fees to be charged to the public for admission to the Reserve on such occasions shall be such as shall be fixed, with the consent of the Board, by the person, club, sporting body, or association to whom such exclusive use shall be granted.

21. Every person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 on conviction.

THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-33.

Darling Range Road District
Building By-laws.

P.W. 2043/23.

(1) EVERY person intending to erect, alter, or add to any building within the boundaries of Kalamunda Ward shall, before commencing, deposit with the secretary, for approval, drawings showing the plans, elevations, and sections of such building, alteration, or additions, together with full and complete specifications of the works proposed to be done.

(2) Every person intending to erect, alter, or add to any building shall, before commencing, cause to be deposited with the secretary, for approval, drawings showing the plans, elevations, and sections of such buildings, alterations and additions, also tracings and ground plan of same, and the position of proposed buildings and outhouses on the land, for retention by the Board, together with full and complete specifications of the work to be done. The Board reserves the right to object to the whole or any portion of the proposed buildings on the land or situation, without prejudice.

Scale of Fees.

(3) The following fees shall be paid by the owner or builder to the Board in respect of all buildings to be

erected or altered, or any matter required or permitted under these By-laws or the Road Districts Act:—

- (a) The expression "Floor area" applied to a building shall mean the aggregate superficial areas of so many horizontal sections thereof as there are floors in the said buildings;

The horizontal sections of each floor shall be made at the point of its greatest surface dimensions, inclusive of external walls, and of such portions of the party walls as belong to the building, and also of all verandahs, and balcony floors, covered ways, and light courts;

- (b) The expression "square," applied to the measurement of the area of a building, means the area of 100 superficial feet.

All fees shall become part of the ordinary revenue of the Darling Range Road Board.

External Walls.

4. (1) Materials of external walls of buildings within the prescribed area of the Road District must be built of brick or stone, or artificial stone, wood, or iron, or other material approved by the Board, and such materials must be sound and subject to the approval of the surveyor.

Except within the area bounded by lines starting from the North-Eastern corner of Kalamunda Lot 20 and extending in a Southerly direction along Railway Road to the South-Eastern corner of Lot 26; thence along the North boundary of Mead Street to the South-Western corner of Lot 35; thence along the Western boundary of Central Road to the North-Western boundary of Lot 28, and thence along the Northern boundary of Lot 28 to the starting point, where all buildings shall be erected in either brick, stone, or reinforced concrete.

(2) All main walls of brick or stone must have a thickness of not less than as prescribed below, viz.:—

- (a) If the wall does not exceed 25 feet in height, it shall be 8½ inches thick;
- (b) Over 25 feet, but not exceeding 40 feet, 13 inches thick below the topmost storey, and 8½ inches thick for the rest of its height;
- (c) Over 40 feet, 17½ inches thick for the height of one storey, then 13 inches below the topmost storey and then 8½ inches thick.

(3) The party walls of brick buildings must have parapet walls with a dampproof course at level of flashing and a capping of 1 to 1 cement mortar, and finished off with a pure cement wash, to level off flashing.

(4) In the case of a terrace of shops and dwellings, or of dwellings only, the front room and that immediately behind it may be built to the full width of the allotment or tenement. All other rooms must have a clear space on one side of at least 4 ft. 6 in. in the clear between the dividing line of such tenement and the external walls of such rooms for the free admission of air and light. There must be 9 feet in the clear between the external walls of every pair of such constructed terraces, and all windows and ventilators must be open to the light and air space there provided for. No two or more dwellings or business premises will be permitted to have any yard or buildings in common, save and except when in occupation of the same tenant or occupier.

- (d) If any external wall or enclosure be at any time hereafter taken down or otherwise demolished for the height of one storey, or for the space

equal to one-fourth of the whole surface of such external wall, then every part thereof not built in the manner and of the several material by these By-laws directed for external walls, must be taken down, and the same must be rebuilt in such manner and with such materials for and in all respects as by these By-laws directed for external walls, hereafter to be built within the prescribed area of the Road District, and it shall be within the power of the secretary or Building surveyor to enforce the rebuilding of same.

- (e) No building to be used for residential purposes shall be erected nearer than thirty feet on any road boundary, except by permission of the Board.

Party Walls.

5. In reference to the component parts thereof, every part of such party walls must be built of sound bricks or stone, or of such bricks and stone together, laid in with mortar and cement, and in such a manner as to produce solid work; and as to the woodwork which it may be desired to connect with party walls of any building, the bearing ends of wooden beams, breastsummers, girders, trimming joists, and the ends of partition heads and sills, and the bearing ends of the main timbers of any roof, and wood bricks, may be laid into the substances of a party wall, but no such beam, breastsummer, girder, joist, partition, head or sill, nor any part of a roof, being wood, nor any wood bricks, must be laid or placed within two inches of the centre of any party wall, and no other woodwork of any kind must be laid into, placed upon, or driven into any part of the substance of any party wall; but if the ends of the timber be carried in iron shoe or stone corbels, then such iron shoes or corbels must be built into the wall at least one-half of the thickness of such wall; and the top of every such party wall must be finished with one course of sound hard bricks, set on edge in good mortar or cement, or by a coping of any other properly secured and sufficiently waterproof and fireproof covering.

Roofs, etc.

6. With regard to the roof, flat, or gutter of any building, any or every projection therefrom, and also balconies and shop-fronts, must be so arranged and constructed and so supplied with gutters and pipes as to prevent the water from dripping on to or running over the public way, and all such rainpipes, eaves and gutters are to be made of metal.

Rooms.

7. (1) With regard to rooms in any part of any building, in reference to height thereof, every room used, or intended to be used, for the purpose of habitation, must be at least the height of 10 feet from floor to ceiling, with the exception of skillions, which must be nine feet high in respect to new buildings, and 8 feet high in respect to buildings already erected.

(2) Every room used for the purpose of habitation, or for the assemblage of people for any purpose whatever, shall be well and properly ventilated to the satisfaction of the surveyor or the Board, by the insertion of air bricks below the floor, and by openings in the sleeper walls, also by ventilators in the ceiling or at the top of the walls thereof, according to the size of such walls. No room shall contain less than 600 feet of air space when finished.

Breastsummers.

8. All breastsummers shall be either of iron or approved wood and to be loaded to one-third of their breaking weights.

Fireplaces.

9. Every fireplace constructed of iron shall be lined with brick or stone built to a height of three feet from the level of the fire rest, and not less than 4½ inches thick, and the hearth of every such fireplace or chimney must be laid and bedded wholly on brick or stone or other incombustible substance; such hearth must consist of a slab or slabs of brick, tile, stone, or slate, iron, or other proper and sufficient substance, at least 12 inches longer than the opening of the chimney when finished, and at least 18 inches in front of the arch over the same.

Wood and Iron Buildings.

10. The external walls of all wood and iron buildings must be built at least 4 ft. 6 ins. from the dividing boundary of the property upon which the building is being erected and the adjoining property. The inside walls shall be of lath and plaster, metal, T and G jarrah, or other material approved by the Board.

Temporary Buildings.

11. With regard to the granting of permission for the erection of temporary buildings, special permission may be granted by the Board, for a period to be stated, for the erection of temporary buildings; all the walls may be of wood or iron.

Verandahs and Balconies.

12. (1) Awnings or verandahs to be erected over the footpaths are to be in accordance with the drawings and specifications approved of by the surveyor and adopted by the Board. The minimum height is to be 8 ft. 6 ins. clear from the footpath, and the posts must not be less than 5 ins. x 5 ins. if in jarrah. The verandah must be painted and kept in repair to the satisfaction of the secretary or surveyor, who shall have the power to order such repairs to the verandahs generally as he may deem necessary. In the event of neglect, or of the surveyor observing the necessity of removal or repair, such must be commenced within seven days of the receipt of notice from the secretary or surveyor, and must be completed within 14 days of such notice, or otherwise the verandahs will be removed at the expense of the owner or occupier, to be recoverable from him in a summary manner before Justices.

(2) Balconies.—Verandah posts must be not less than 6 in. x 6 in. jarrah, 2 feet in ground, with a sole plate, to be in one length equal to the extreme length of the balcony of 9 ins. x 2 in. jarrah; a top plate not less than 6 in. x 3 in. oregon, not more than 4 ft. 6 in. apart; joists not less than 4 in. x 2 in., with 1 ft. 6 in. centres; floors T. and G. 1½ inches thick; verandah posts not less than 4 in. x 4 in.; rafters not less than 4 in. x 2 in.; top plate not less than 6 in. x 2 in. All plates to be bolted to the posts. The floor of balconies shall not be less than 10 feet from surface of footpath.

(3) No balcony supported wholly from cantilevers or corbelled out from the wall will be permitted, unless specially authorised in writing by the Board.

Contractors' Sheds.

13. Nothing in these By-laws shall prevent any contractor or builder erecting a temporary office, sheds or workshops of wood or iron on any building site during the building operations, provided that special application must be made to and permission granted by the secretary or surveyor.

Chimneys—Domestic and Factory.

14. Every chimney shaft or flue hereafter built, raised, or repaired, must be carried up in brick or stonework all round at least 4 inches thick to a height of at least three feet above the highest of such portion of roof, flat, or gutter adjoining thereto, measured at the point of junction. As to any chimney shaft (except that of a steam engine, brewery, distillery, or manufactory), the brick or stone of such shaft or flue must not be built higher than eight feet above the slope or flat or gutter which it adjoins, measured from the highest point of junction, unless such chimney shaft shall be built of increased thickness, or be built with and bonded with another chimney shaft, or be otherwise rendered secure. As to the chimney shaft for the boiler furnace of any steam engine, or for any brewer, distillery, or manufactory, such shaft may be erected of any height so that it be built in such a manner and of such strength and dimensions as shall be satisfactory to the secretary or surveyor, upon special application made and approved in each case.

Chimney-pots.

15. As to earthen or metal chimney pots, tubes, funnels, or cowls of any description whatever: If such pot, tube, funnel, or cowl be higher than four feet above the brick or stonework of the flue upon which the same shall be erected, then it must be fixed 12 inches at the least into the brick or stonework of the flue on which it shall be placed or otherwise fixed to the satisfaction of the surveyor.

Power to Surveyor to Enter and Remove.

16. When anything shall have been done or omitted to be done in contravention of these By-laws, it shall be lawful for the surveyor or secretary, at his discretion, to enter on the premises and remove or cause to be removed any buildings or other things which have been erected in contravention thereof, or to do or cause to be done any act or things which should have been done in pursuance thereof, and the cost of such doing shall be borne and paid by such owner or other person, in addition to any penalties to which he may be liable in respect thereof under these By-laws or Regulations.

Bench-marks, etc.

17. All survey levels, bench-marks, or other marks denoting the same shall be carefully preserved, and any person removing, altering, or obliterating, or causing or permitting same to be removed, altered, or obliterated shall be liable to a penalty of £10, and to pay all costs incurred in replacing or restoring same.

Mutual and Parapet Walls.

18. All walls erected within two feet of the boundary of allotment must have parapet walls with copings, the walls in every case being carried up as per By-law No. 88.

Cornices, etc.

19. No cornice or other ornament shall project beyond the alignment of the street more than 18 inches, and must not be lower than 15 feet above the level of the footpath.

Cellars and Lights.

20. No cellar will be allowed under the pavement of the street, and authority for fixing prismatic or other lights on the pavement must be obtained in writing from the Board before being fixed.

Earth Closets.

21. Under no circumstances must any earth closet be built nearer to any dwelling or shop than 20 feet. In cases where the back line of allotment abuts on a right-of-way which runs alongside other premises, the closets must not be placed nearer to the side of the right-of-way that forms the side line of another property than 34 feet for a distance of 75 feet from the street line off which the right-of-way runs.

Plans.

22. All plans of buildings and alterations must be examined and approved by the Board, and such approval certified to on the original drawings.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1906," and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Municipality of Albany doth hereby make and pass the following By-laws.

Repeal:—By-law No. 20, made for regulating hawking and movable or temporarily fixed stalls, and the issue of

licenses therefor, as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th December, 1923, is hereby repealed, and the following By-law is substituted therefor:—

1. In the construction of this By-law:—
 - (a) The word "stall" shall mean a movable or fixed stall or cart for the sale of any fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables, or any article of merchandise;
 - (b) The word "fish" shall include fish, whether fresh, salt, smoked, or dried; oysters, crayfish, crabs, prawns and shrimps;
 - (c) Any person who travels or trades on foot, and with or without any cart, horse, animal, or vehicle, who shall carry or sell, or expose for sale, within the District of the Municipality of Albany, any of the articles of merchandise in this By-law mentioned, shall be deemed to hawk the same.
2. No person shall:—
 - (a) hawk any fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables, or any article of merchandise, within the District of the Albany Municipality, unless and until he shall have applied for and obtained a license so to do from the said Council;
 - (b) keep or conduct a stall for the sale of any fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables, or any article of merchandise, within the District of the Albany Municipality, unless and until he shall have applied for and obtained a license so to do from the said Council.
3. No holder of any such license shall hawk or keep or conduct a stall, except within that part of the District of the said Council as shall be indorsed on the back of such license.
4. Every person who wishes to obtain a Hawker's or Stallkeeper's License shall apply to the Town Clerk of the said Council, stating the term, part of the District, and kind of merchandise for which he desires to be licensed. The granting or refusing of a license shall be in the absolute discretion of the Council, and, when granted, shall not be transferable. Licenses shall be in such one of the forms set out in Schedule A hereto as shall be applicable, and shall be issued on payment of such fees as are set forth in Schedule B hereto.
5. If any person does any act contrary to, or neglects or omits to do any act required to be done by, or commits a breach of or offends against this By-law, he shall be deemed to be guilty of a breach of this By-law, and shall be liable for every such breach to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
