WHEREAS it is enacted by Subsection (4) of Section 19 of "The Financial Emergency Act, 1931-1933" (Commonwealth), that the Governor General of the Commonwealth may arrange with the Governor of any State that the taxation, under the law of that State, of the salaries and allowances of persons employed by the Commonwealth shall, subject to the said section, be deducted from the periodical payments of the salary and allowances of those persons, and shall be paid to the State in such manner and at such times as are provided by the arrangement: And whereas it is enacted by Subsection (5) of Section 9 of "The Financial Emergency Tax Assessment Act, 1932" (Western Australia), that the Governor may arrange with the Governor General of the Commonwealth that the financial emergency tax payable under the said Act in respect of salary or wages received by any persons in the service of the Government of the Commonwealth shall be deducted out of the periodical payments of salary or

wages of those persons by the officer of the Commonwealth paying the same, and shall be paid to the Commissioner in such manner and at such times as are provided by the arrangement: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, do hereby declare and give notice that a memorandum of arrangement, bearing date the 9th day of March, 1934, has been entered into by the Governor General of the Commonwealth and the Lieutenant-Governor of Western Australia for the deduction of financial emergency taxation payable under the law of this State from the periodical payments of salaries and wages of persons employed in Western Australia in the service of the Commonwealth, and the payment of the same to the Commissioner of Taxation in the manner and at the times provided for in the said memorandum of arrangement.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore,

His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Nedlands Stormwater Drainage, Part Area A:—Main Drain, Stirling Highway from Archdeacon Street to Broadway.—30-inch diameter cast-iron, 27-inch and 12-inch diameter reinforced concrete pipes, including man-holes and all apparatus (length about 1,250 feet), as indicated in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 5337.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 11th day of May, 1934.

CHILD WELFARE ACT, 1907-27.

(Section 114.)
Regulations.

1. Any house, room, or place licensed under the above-mentioned section of "The Child Welfare Act, 1907-27," shall be under the supervision of the Child Welfare Department, and may be visited and inspected at any time by the Secretary or any officer of the Child Welfare Department authorised by the Minister.

2. The licensee of any house, room, or place shall be responsible for the custody of all children admitted therein, and shall see that all officers carry out their duties satisfactorily.

3. The licensee shall keep all books and records and furnish any returns or information required by the Secretary, and promptly report to him the absconding, serious illness, or death of a child, or any other special event which may occur.

4. Each inmate shall have a separate bed and shall be supplied with a sufficiency of serviceable bedding and clothing.

5. The inmates shall be supplied with good wholesome food of sufficient quantity.

6. All structures and buildings shall be subject to the approval of the Secretary and shall be maintained to his satisfaction.

7. Fittings, equipment, and requisites shall be suitable and ample and subject to the approval of the Secretary.

8. The secretary may refuse a license to—

- (a) any person who in his opinion is unsuitable;
- (b) when the structure, buildings, or equipment do not conform with his requirements under these Regulations.

9. The penalty prescribed for the breach of any of these Regulations is £10.

ENGINE-DRIVERS AND FIREMEN.

(Dairying—South-West Land Division.)

No. 2 of 1934.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-25," this 24th day of April, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, between the South-West Co-operative Dairy Farmers, Ltd., and The Capel Dairy Company, Ltd. (hereinafter called "the Employers"), of the one part, and The Federated Engine-drivers and Firemen's Association of Australasia (West Australian Branch Association), (hereinafter called "the Association"), of the other part, witnesseth, that for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be three years from the date hereof.

2.—Wages.

(a) This Agreement is based on a basic wage of £3 9s. 3d. for males in the Metropolitan Area and £3 9s. 6d. for males in the South-West Land Division excluding the Metropolitan Area.

(b) The minimum rate of wages payable shall be as follows:—

Per Week of 48 Hours.
Margin over Base.

All classes of engine-drivers 24/-
Where a fireman is employed in addition
to the engine-driver on the same shift .. 6/-

3.

Engine-drivers and/or firemen shall, if necessary, perform such additional work as required; providing such additional work shall not prevent them having continual supervision over their engine and/or boiler.

4.—Hours.

Forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked in six shifts of eight hours each.

5.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of eight hours in any one day shall be deemed overtime, and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half. All time worked on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(b) Work done on Christmas Day or Boxing Day or New Year's Day or Labour Day shall be paid for at double time rates.

6.—Holidays.

Each worker, other than a casual worker, shall be entitled to two weeks' annual leave each year on full pay; or, should the period of continuous employment be less than one year, the worker shall be paid holiday pay in proportion as his length of service is to the full year's employment.

If Christmas Day or New Year's Day falls on a Sunday, the following Monday shall be kept.

7.—Rotation of Shifts.

Where an employee works afternoon or night shift only, or afternoon and night shifts in rotation, but does not work day shift one week out of three, he shall receive one shilling per shift in addition to the rates set out above.

8.—Casual Workers.

A casual worker shall mean and include an employee competent to do the work he is engaged to do who is, without any fault of his own, dismissed or refused work (as it is hereby agreed he may be), before the expiration of six days from and including the date he starts work.

Casual workers shall be paid ten per cent. in addition to the rates set out above.

9.—Weekly Engagement.

Except as provided by Clause 8 all employment shall be by the week.

10.—Definitions.

Engine-driver means any person who starts, stops, takes charge of, or drives any engine or engines or machinery of which the motive power is steam, gas, suction gas, oil, air, electricity, or any other motive power other than manual or animal power.

11.—Area.

This Agreement shall have effect over the area comprised within the South-West Land Division in the State of Western Australia.

12.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all engine-drivers and/or firemen engaged in the Dairying Industry and other industries carried on by the South-West Co-operative Dairy Farmers, Limited, and the Capel Dairy Company, Limited.
