THUS Agreement, made in pursuance of "The Indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," the sixth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, be-June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four, be-tween The West Australian Shop Assistants and Ware-house Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, Perth (hereinafter called the "Union"), of the one part, and Bou Marche; T. Hayward & Son, Limited; Tippings, Limited; Narrogin Trading & Ageney Co., Ltd.; Caris Bros.; H. H. Sherry; T. P. Chadd; Prosser's Boot Palace; Roy's Hardware Store; Manchester House; R. Forrest & Co.; "Ezywalkin," Limited (hereinater called the "Employers"), of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other, as follows :-

1.—Area.

This Agreement shall be limited in its effect to the area comprised within a radius of fifteen miles from the Post Office at Bunbury.

2.---Term.

This Agreement shall operate as from the day of the date hereof, and shall continue in force for a period of three years, subject to the right of either party to apply to the Court of Arbitration at any time after the expiration of twelve months from such date and at the end of any succeeding twelve months from the date of any such application, to amend this Agreement.

3.-Definitions.

In this Agreement, unless the context otherwise indi-cates:-The term "Shop assistant" includes employees in country order departments, cashiers, and linoleum layers and planners. The term "Packer" means a per-In country order departments, cashers, and indocum layers and planners. The term 'Packer'' means a per-son who packs goods for transport by rail or ship. The term 'Despatch hand'' shall mean an employee who may handle goods or receive goods from departments and passes them over to the packing room, or prepares and hands over packages to carters for delivery, and who shall be responsible for the proper checking off of such packages, and for the proper branding and marking thereof and keeping necessary records such as rail notes thereof and keeping necessary records, such as rail notes and cart notes. The term "Casual hand" shall mean an employee engaged by the hour, who may be put off or leave the employer's service at any moment without notice: Provided, a casual hand shall be employed for not less than four hours in any one day. The term "Weekly hand" shall mean an employee engaged by the week, whose employment shall be terminable by not less than one week's notice on either side; such week's notice cannot be continued from week to week: Provided that any worker employed for a period of not more than four consecutive weeks shall be classed as a casual hand and paid not less than the minimum rate of wages herein prescribed for a casual hand, but this proviso shall not apply in cases where a worker employed as a "Weekly hand" has been dispensed with for incompetence or unsuitableness or any cause referred to in paragraph 11 hereof.

4.-Hours.

(1) Retail establishments:-Excepting as mentioned (1) Retail estiblishments:—Excepting as mentioned in subclauses (a) and (b) hereof, forty-eight hours shall constitute a week's work for males and forty-four for females, and shall be worked between 8.30 a.m. and 6 p.m. on every Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, and 8.30 a.m. to 12 noon on every Wednesday, and 8.30 a.m. to 9 p.m. on every Saturday. Not more than one here and a guardar as begin then one beam shall be allowed hour and a quarter or less than one hour shall be allowed for any meal. The exceptions referred to are:-

- (a) Messengers, cleaners, door porters, lift attend-ants and employees in shops comprised in the Fourth Schedule of "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," whose hours of work shall not exceed forty-eight per week for males and forty-four per week for females, and shall be worked to suit the convenience of the employer.
- (b) On the day mutually agreed upon by the parties to be observed as Christmas Eve, for the pur-pose of a late shopping night, the ordinary hours of work may be extended by agreement between the parties.

5.---Overtime,

(1) In the computation of overtime each day shall stand alone, excepting in the case of workers mentioned in Clause 4, Subsection (a), whose overtime shall commence, in the case of males, after 48 hours have been worked in any one week, and, in the case of females, after 44 hours have been worked in any one week.

(2) Overtime shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first four hours and thereafter at the rate of double time.

(3) Excepting as provided in Clause 4 (b) all work done on Wednesday afternoon, Sundays, and holidays set out in Clause 6 (a) shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

6.-Holidays.

(a) The following days shall be observed as holidays and paid for, namely:—New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzae Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day.

(b) A holiday of one week on full pay shall be granted to each employee on completion of each year of statice in employee on completion of each year of service; an employee not completing one year of service shall be granted pay in lieu of holidays, in proportion to the length of his or her service: Provided that, when an employee is entitled to holidays under this clause, he shall receive at least two weeks' notice from his employer of the date when it will be convenient to the employer that such employee should take his holidays: Provided further, that this clause shall not apply in the case of an employee summarily dismissed for misconduct or dereliction of duty.

(a) The number of junior male assistants shall not exceed the proportion of one to one for the first five male seniors and thereafter one junior to every two male seniors or fraction thereof: Provided that the number of junior packers shall not exceed the proportion of one junior to every four senior packers.

(b) When no female assistant is employed one junior assistant may be employed. Where one senior assistant is employed two junior female assistants may be em-ployed. Where two senior female assistants are em-ployed three junior female assistants may be employed. Where four senior female assistants are employed five junior female assistants may be employed, and thereafter the proportion shall not exceed five junior female assistants to four "senior" female assistants.

(c) In this clause the word "senior" shall mean a person of twenty-one years or over, or a worker who is in receipt of not less than the minimum rate of wage prescribed for an adult. 9.-Casual Hands.

The minimum weekly rate of wages payable to casual hands shall be as follows:----

(a) Adults-Male and female, the rates prescribed herein plus 3d. per hour.

(b) Juniors-The rates prescribed herein plus 11/2d, per hour.

10.—Higher Duties.

A worker required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Agreement than that which she or he usually performs shall be entitled to payment at the higher rate whilst so employed.

11.--Engagement.

One week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss an employee for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct, or if, after receiving one week's notice, he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice.

12.-Time and Wages Book.

Each employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a book containing the names of each of his workers to whom this Agreement applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each such worker, and the time during which he or she has been employed. Such book shall be signed by each worker each week. The time and wages book shall be open to inspection by a representative of the Union one day in each week, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.

13.-Under-rate Workers.

Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum adult wage prescribed by this Agreement may be employed at such lesser wage (if any) as may be agreed upon in writing between the worker and the secretary of the Union. If within twentyfour (24) hours after the worker has notified the secretary of his or her desire to work at a lesser wage than the said minimum the secretary and the worker do not agree as aforesaid, then the worker may apply to the most convenient Resident or Police Magistrate for a permit to work at such lesser wage. The worker shall give to the said secretary at least twenty-four hours' notice in writing of his or her intention to make such application to the Magistrate, and the secretary or his agent shall be entitled to attend before the Magistrate, and, pending the decision thereon in either case, the worker shall be entitled to work and be employed by an employer at the proposed lesser rate. The Magistrate may grant such worker a permit to work for such wage and for such period, not exceeding six calendar months, as he thinks fit, and his decision in the matter shall be final. The permit shall entitle the worker to work at a wage therein mentioned for such period as may be therein stated until the wage shall have again been settled by the Magistrate on the application of the said secretary.
