HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor has been pleased to make the following Regulations under the Ordinance to Regulate the Police Benefit Fund (30 Victoria, No. 10) and to repeal the Regulations previously in force.

#### POLICE BENEFIT FUND REGULATIONS.

1. These Regulations shall not apply to the Commissioner of Police, but, subject as aforesaid, shall apply to every member of the Police Force who contributes to the Fund, including probationary constables during probationary service, who under these Regulations are included in the term "Police Force."

2. The fund shall be constituted as follows:—

- (a) Such annual grant as may be voted by Parliament;
- (b) Deductions from the pay of all members of the Police Force to whom these Regulations apply, as follows:—
  - (i) In the case of commissioned officers, a deduction calculated at the rate of three per cent. of their annual rate of pay and deductible by equal fortnightly instalments; and
  - (ii) In the case of members of the Police Force other than commissioned officers, a deduction calculated at the rate of three per cent. of their daily rate of pay and deductible fortnightly as and when payments of pay are made to them:

Provided that all such deductions shall be calculated to the nearest penny;

- (c) All fines imposed on the members of the Police Force for misconduct;
- (d) Proceeds of unclaimed stolen goods sold under Section 75 of "The Police Act, 1892."

3. The Board shall consist of five members, to be appointed from time to time by the Governor. One of such members shall be a member of the Executive Council, who shall be the Chairman of the Board; and two of such members shall be appointed, on the nomination of the Police Union, to represent the contributors to the Fund. The Police Union may also nominate one deputy to represent contributors during the absence of either such members. Three members shall constitute a quorum at the meetings of the Board.

4. The members of the Board (except the Chairman) shall hold office during the pleasure of the Governor; provided that a nominated member shall not hold office, without renomination and reappointment, for a longer period than three years.

5. Any member of the Police Force who entered the service prior to the 14th day of December, 1917, and who may have served therein for twelve consecutive years or over, may claim his discharge therefrom and a gratuity of an amount not exceeding one month's pay for each year's service. This provision shall also apply to any member who has drawn his gratuity, upon enlisting for active service abroad, and who, upon returning to the State, rejoins the Force; provided that any member paid a gratuity under this Regulation shall not be entitled to a further payment under Regulation 8 (a).

6. Any member of the Police Force who entered the service on or after the 14th day of December, 1917, and who may have served therein for twelve consecutive years or over, may claim his discharge therefrom and a gratuity, on the following basis:—

Period of Service and Number of Weeks or Months' Salary for each Year of Service.

- Over 12 and under 15 years—two weeks.
- Over 15 and under 20 years—two and two-third weeks.
- Over 20 and under 25 years—three weeks.
- Over 25 years—one calendar month.

Provided that any member paid a gratuity under this Regulation shall not be entitled to a further payment under Regulation 8 (a).

7. The service of any member of the Police Force who resigned upon enlisting for active service abroad, and who, upon returning to the State, rejoins the Force, and pays arrears of contributions, shall, for the purposes of these Regulations, be deemed to be continuous. The period allowed for repayment of such arrears shall be the same as that spent on active service. In the event of a contributor leaving the Force before the whole of the arrears are paid, the amount unpaid shall be deducted from any gratuity to be paid under the Regulations. Provided that, in cases where a gratuity was

paid, the amount of same shall be taken into account, when any further gratuity shall become payable, by deducting from the amount of such further gratuity as computed on the whole period of service, a sum calculated by taking the amount of the gratuity previously paid and adding thereto compound interest from date of payment at 1½ per cent. per annum, with yearly rests.

8. The Board may make recommendations for the payment of gratuity, as follows:—

- (a) to any member of the Police Force who may have served therein for seven consecutive years, and who may be retired from the Force on medical grounds as unfit for further service, a gratuity not exceeding one month's pay for each year's service: provided that any member paid a gratuity under this Regulation shall not be entitled to a further payment under Regulation 5 or 6;
- (b) to the widow, or, if there be no widow, then the children; or, if there be neither widow nor children, then the next of kin of any member of the Police Force who may have served therein—
  - (i) for a period of more than one year and less than seven years, a gratuity of not more than £50;
  - (ii) for a period of seven years or over, a gratuity not exceeding one month's pay for each year's service;
- (c) to any member of the Police Force compelled to leave the Service from injuries received, or ill-health contracted in the execution of his duty, a gratuity of such amount as to the Board may seem reasonable, but in any event not exceeding one year's pay (in addition to any other gratuity payable under these Regulations);

(Provided that no recommendation shall be made under this paragraph unless and until notice of such injuries or ill-health has been given by or on behalf of such member to the Commissioner of Police, as soon as practicable after such injuries were received or such ill-health contracted, and that such notice is recorded on the personal file of such member.)

- (d) to the widow, or, if there be no widow, then the children; or, if there be neither widow nor children, then the next of kin of any member of the Police Force who shall have lost his life in the discharge of his duty, a gratuity of such amount as the Board may deem reasonable, but in any event not exceeding one year's pay of the deceased (in addition to any other gratuity payable under these Regulations).

9. For the purpose of these Regulations, gratuities shall be calculated on the basis of the average monthly rate of pay received for the last three years of service; and, in calculating the total gratuity to be paid in any case, there shall be included the relative proportion in respect of any uncompleted year's service over and above the prescribed period of service necessary to ground a claim for the gratuity.

Provided that, when assessing the average monthly rate of pay aforesaid, only the pay received by a member in respect of the office or position to which he was permanently appointed shall be taken into account, and any increase of pay which such member may have received whilst temporarily acting in a higher or other office or position than the office or position to which he was appointed permanently shall not be taken into account.

10. The character and pecuniary position of the widow, and the number and pecuniary positions of the children or next of kin, as the case may be, of the deceased member of the Police Force, shall be taken into consideration by the Board when recommending gratuities from this Fund, and it shall be lawful for the Board to apply the gratuity granted to such widow or children or next of kin for their benefit in such manner as the Board may deem fit.

11. Where as the result of any informality, or of any circumstances not provided for in the foregoing Regulations, any member of the Police Force, or the widow or the children of a deceased member of the Police Force may be deprived of the right to claim a gratuity under any of the said foregoing Regulations, and the Board is of the opinion that such member, or his widow or his children, as the case may be, are deserving of some gratuity, and will suffer an unjust hardship by being deprived of any gratuity, the Board may recommend the payment to such member of the Police Force,

or to his widow and the children, or to the widow or the children of a deceased member of the Police Force, of a gratuity of such amount as the Board may deem reasonable, but in any event not exceeding one year's pay of such member or deceased member, and where such gratuity is recommended for payment to more than one person, the Board may also recommend the proportions in which the amount of the gratuity shall be apportioned between such persons.

12. All claims for gratuities must be supported by such certificates, vouchers, or testimonials as may be reasonably required by the Board.

13. In calculating the amount of gratuity awarded in any case, the period of service shall count from the date at which a member of the Police Force commenced to contribute to the Fund; except in respect of members who were contributors prior to 20th May, 1908. In such cases the period of service shall count from the date of appointment to the Force.

14. The moneys described in Regulation 2 shall be paid to the credit of an account in the Treasury, to be called "Western Australian Police Benefit Fund Account," and moneys shall be drawn therefrom only on the approval of the Governor in Council.

15. The Board shall cause to be kept a proper record of receipts and disbursements made under these Regulations, and such shall be audited every twelve months by the Auditor General, who shall affix his signature to the yearly statement, and every four years the conditions of the Fund shall be examined by the Government Actuary, who shall report on such to the Board.

16. Of the amount to the credit of the Fund, such sums as may be recommended by the Board shall be invested in Government Inscribed Stock or other approved security, and the balance, with all other moneys paid into the Treasury from time to time on account of the Fund, shall be payable to an account in the Commonwealth Savings Bank.
