WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from tak-ing any fish whatsoever, in every or any speci-fied portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or ither of such means of constant or by superbolic either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, there-fore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all those portions of Western Aus-tralian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of October, 1934, until the 30th day of September, 1935 inclusive 1935, inclusive.

Schedule.

(1) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending in an Easterly direction from the Eastern side of the shore end of the Busselton Pier or Jetty to a point on the foreshore half a mile from the said pier or jetty and half a mile into the waters of the said bay.

(2) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending in a Westerly direction from the Western side of the shore end of the Busselton Pier or Jetty to a point on the foreshore one and a half miles from the said pier or jetty and half a mile into the waters of the said bay.

shall be lawful for shops to which the said section applies (except those in certain Districts named in the subsection) to remain open until nine o'clock on one evening in the week subject to the provisions of the said subsection, and that the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation, issued on the petition of a majority of by Prochamation, issued on the petition of a majority of the shopkeepers affected, determine the day on which such shops shall so remain open in each week for any District or specified locality not within a District; and whereas a petition has been presented to the Governor by a majority of the keepers of such shops in the speci-fied locality contained within the circumference of a the radius five miles, praying that the day on which such shops in that locality shall remain open till nine o'clock in the evening shall be Thursday, and it is desirable to accede to the prayer of such petition: Now, therefore I the solid Lioutenant Governor, acting with the advice I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby pro-claim and determine that, subject to the said Act, the day in each week on which all such shops as aforesaid in that specified locality contained within the circumfer-ence of a circle, the centre of which is the Gingin Post Office and the radius five miles, shall remain open till nine o'clock in the evening shall be Thursday.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 26th day of September, 1934, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued :-

The Vermin Act, 1918.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council under Section 14 of the Vermin Act published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of December, 1921, the Governor conon the 10th day of December, 1921, the Governor con-stituted the Port Hedland Road District, as constituted under "The Road Districts Act, 1919," a Vermin Dis-trict, for the purposes of the said Vermin Act, 1918, to be known as the Port Hedland Vermin District, and also appointed a Board, to be known as the Port Hed-land Vermin Board, for the said District: And whereas it is enacted by Section 45 of the said Act that the Governor may appoint the Board of any Road District to be the Board of any Vermin District, the boundaries whereof are the same as those of the Road District, or which is comprised within the Road District, and it is also enacted by Section 50 of the said Act that the Governor may, whenever he shall think fit, abolish the Board of any District and appoint a Board for such Board of any District and appoint a Sourd for such District under the provisions of Section 45 aforesaid: And whereas it is enacted by Section 51 of the said Act that the Governor may on the exercise of the power conferred by Section 50 aforesaid, by Order in Council transfer, vest, or apportion any property, assets, or liabilities affected, in such way as he may deem just: And whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient that the Port Hedland Vermin Board, hitherto appointed as aforesaid for the said Port Hedland Vermin District, shall be abolished, and that in lieu thereof the Port Hedland Road Board shall be appointed as the Vermin Board for the said Port Hedland Vermin Dis-trict and be known as the Port Hedland Vermin Board, and that, as from the date of the last-mentioned appointment, the property, assets, and liabilities of the Port Hedland Vermin Board hitherto appointed as aforesaid, and hereby abolished or expressed so to be, shall be transferred to and vested in the Port Hedland Vermin Board now hereby appointed, or expressed so to be, for the said Port Hedland Vermin District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Vermin Act, 1918, and of all other powers in this behalf enabling him, doth hereby abolish the Port Hedland Vermin Board, hitherto appointed

and acting as the Vermin Board for the said Port Hedland Vermin District, and doth hereby, in lien thereof, appoint the Port Hedland Road Board to be the Vermin Board for the said Port Hedland Vermin District for the purposes of the said Vermin Act, 1918, and to be known as the Port Hedland Vermin Board, and also doth hereby transfer and vest all the property, assets, and liabilities of the Port Hedland Vermin Board hitherto appointed as aforesaid, and now hereby abolished or expressed so to be, in the Port Hedland Vermin Board, now hereby appointed or expressed so to be, in place of the Vermin Board hereby abolished as from the date of the abolition of such Vermin Board.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 828/34.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that the Governor may by Order in Council alter or extend the boundaries of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Area, or of any District: And whereas it is desirable that the boundaries of Metropolitan Stornwater Districts Nos. 2 and 1 as at present defined should be altered: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the boundaries of Metropolitan Stornwater Districts Nos. 2 and 1, and declare that the said boundaries, as shown on Plans M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., Nos. 3449 and 2545, and as deseribed in Order in Council of 18th June, 1919, and subsequent amendments, shall be altered in the following manner, by deleting the area described hereunder from Metropolitan Stornwater District No. 1 and including it in Metropolitan Stornwater District No. 2:—

Schedule.

Commencing at a point on the North-West side of Railway Road opposite the centre of Redfern Street, and proceeding South-Easterly along the centre of Redfern Street to the South-East side of Sadlier Street; thence North-Easterly along Sadlier Street; thence North along Federal Street to the North side of right-of-way between Hamersley Road and Lawler Street; thence East across Federal Street and along the said right-ofway to the South-West corner of Lot 50, Lawler Street; thence North along the West boundary of the said Lot 50 and its prolongation to the North side of Lawler Street; thence East along Lawler Street to the South-West corner of Lot 1, Hensman Road; thence North along the West boundaries of Lots 1 and 2, Hensman Road, to the North-West corner of Lot 2, Hensman Road; thence East along the North boundary of the said Lot 2 and its prolongation to the East side of Hensman Road; thence East along Hensman Road to the South-West corner of Lot 1, Hensman Road to the South side of Hamersley Road; thence East along Hamersley Road to the East side of right-of-way, between Campbell Street and Rokeby Road; thence South along the said right-of-way to the North side of Heistesbury Road; thence East along Heytesbury Road to the West side of Rokeby Road; thence South along the west side of Rokeby Road; thence South along Rokeby Road to the North side of Nieholson Road; thence East along Nieholson Road to the South-East side of Thomas Street; thence South-West boundary of Lot 11, Thomas Street; thence North-West boundary of the said Lot 11 to its South-West corner; thence South-Westerly across Lot 10, Keightley Road, and along the South boundaries of Lots 9 to 5, Keightley Road, to the South-West corner of the said Lot 5, Keightley Road; thence South-Westerly along the East boundaries of Lots 30 to 27, Austin Street, to the South-West boundary of the said Lot 27, Austin Street; thence Westerly along the South boundary of the said Lot 5, To and across Austin Street, and Lot 25, Resalie Street, to and a

dary of Lot 7, Hensman Road, to the East side of the right-of-way between Hensman Road and Cross Street; Ingit-of-way between Heisman Road and Gross Street; thence North along the said right-of-way to a point op-posite the North side of the right-of-way between Keightley Road and Cullen Street; thence West along the said right-of-way to the East side of Cross Street; thence South along Cross Street to a point opposite the South boundary of Lot 108, Cross Street; thence West across Cross Street and along the South boundary of the said Lot 108 to the East side of the right-of-way between Cross Street and Stanmore Street; thence South along the said right-of-way to a point opposite the South boundary of Lot 84, Stanmore Street; thence West across the said right-of-way and along the South boun-dary of the said Lot 84 to and across Stanmore Street and along the South boundary of Lot 69, Stammore Street Street, to the East side of the right-of-way between Stanmore Street and Waverley Street; thence South along the said right-of-way to a point opposite the South boundary of Lot 49, Waverley Street; thence West across the said right-of-way and along the South boun-dary of the said Lot 49 to and across Waverley Street and along the South boundary of Lot 28, Waverley Street, to the East side of the right-of-way between Waverley Street and Derby Road; thence South along the said right-of-way to and across the first right-of-way North of Onslow Road, and along the East side of Lot 19, Onslow Road, to the North side of Onslow Road; Thence West along Onslow Road to the West side of Derby Road; thence South along Derby Road to the North side of the first right-of-way South of Onslow Road; thence Westerly along the North side of the said right-of-way to and across Violet Grove, Hilda Street, and James Street to the West side of James Street; thence South along James Street to the South boundary of Lot 41, James Street; thence West along the South boundary of the said Lot 41 to the East side of the right-of-way between James Street and Herbert Road; thence South along the said right-of-way to a point opposite the South boundary of Lot 48, Herbert Road; thence West across the said right-of-way, along the South boundary of the said Lot 48 to and across Herbert Road, and along the South boundary of Lot 25, Herbert Road, to the Fort side of the wight of way, between Washert to the East side of the right-of-way between Herbert Road and Yilgarn Street; thence South along the said Lot 69, Yilgarn Street; thence West across the said right-of-way and along the South boundary of the said Lot 69 to and across Yilgarn Street, and along the South boundary of Lot 96, Yilgarn Street, to the East side of the right-of-way between Yilgarn Street and Kitchener Street; thence South along the said right-of-way to a point opposite the South boundary of Lot 133, Kitchener Street; thence West across the said right-of-way and along the South boundary of the said Lot 133 to and across Kitchener Street to its West side; thence South along Kitchener Street to the North side of the first right-of-way North of Aberdare Road; thence West Road to the West side of the right-of-way between Commercial Road and Hopetoun Terrace; thence North along the said right-of-way to a point opposite the South boundary of Lot 18, Hopetoun Terrace; thence West across the said right-of-way, along the South boundary of the said Lot 18 to and across Hopetoun Terrace and along the South boundary of Lot 9, Hopetonn Terrace, to the East side of the right-of-way between Hopetoun Terrace and Smyth Road; thence South along the said right-of-way to the North side of the first right-of-way North of Aberdare Road; thence West along the said right-of-way to the East side of Smyth Road; thence South along Smyth Road to the North side of Aberdare South along Smyth Road to the North side of Aberdare Road; thence West along Aberdare Road to a point op-posite the South-West boundary of Lot 673, Harvey Street; thence North-West aeross Harvey Street and along the South-West boundary of the said Lot 673 to its West corner; thence North-East along the North-West boundaries of Lots 673 to 679, Harvey Street, to the South-West side of the right-of-way North of Aber-dare Road; thence North-West along the said right-of-way, to and across Railway Road to its North-West side. way, to and across Railway Road to its North-West side; thence North-Easterly along Railway Road to the point of commencement, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 3449.

THE CHILD WELFARE ACT, 1907-27.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER "THE CHILD WELFARE ACT, 1907-27."

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Child Welfare Regulations, 1934," and shall come into force on the expiration of one month after the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. All previous Regulations made under "The Child Welfare Act, 1907-27," are repealed as from the date when these Regulations come into operation.

3. Except as otherwise expressly provided, any person who, in any particular, makes default in compliance with any provision of these Regulations shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

4. All documents shall be in the forms similar to the forms in the Appendix, but may be used with such variation as the circumstances require. Where no forms are prescribed, forms reasonably adapted to the circumstances of the case may be used. Any of the forms under "The Justices Act, 1902-26," with variations as aforesaid, may be used in the Children's Court.

5. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires-

"Act" or "the Act" means "The Child Welfare Act, 1907-27."

"Minister" means the Minister for the time being charged with the administration of the Act.

"Secretary" means the Secretary of the Child Welfare Department.

"Committee" means Boarding-out Committee appointed under Section 9 of the Act.

"Visitor" includes a member of the Boarding-out Committee.

"Manager" includes Matron.

"Ward" means a child who, under the provisions of the Act, is received into an institution, or apprenticed, boarded-out, or placed out.

"On parole" is the term used to differentiate between a ward released on probation from a foster-parent or an institution and a child released on probation from a Children's Court.

Institutions.

6. Subject to the control and direction of the Secretary, the Officer-in-charge of a Government institution shall be responsible for the custody of all children admitted therein, and shall see that all the officers carry out their duties in a proper manner.

7. The manager of a subsidised institution shall be responsible for the custody of all children admitted therein, and shall see that all officers carry out their duties in a proper manner.

S. The manager of an institution shall promptly report to the Secretary the serious illness or death of a child, and any other special event which may occur.

9. The inmates shall be supplied with ample plain, wholesome food.

10. Each child over the age of six years shall be supplied with-

(a) a china cup, plate, etc., together with necessary knife, fork, spoon, etc.,(b) a separate towel, hair-brush, and tooth-brush.

11. Each inmate shall have a separate bed, complete with sheets, blankets pillow and quilt.

12. All inmates of school age must attend an efficient school.

13. An inspector of the Education Department shall at least once yearly test the attainments of all inmates who are wards of the Department, and submit a report to the Secretary.

14. Teachers are required to do all in their power to secure the good behaviour of their pupils. Habits of cleanliness should be enforced, and pupils should be taught to be honest, truthful, obedient, and considerate of the property and feelings of others.

15. (a) Industrial training shall be carried on for not more than six nor less than four hours daily, with at least one hour for mid-day meal, and shall cease at noon on Saturdays. (b) Industrial training for boys shall be in farm and garden work and any other handicraft that can be conveniently practised, special attention being paid to milking, the handling of horses and farm machinery, and the elements of carpentry and blacksmithing.

(c) Industrial training for girls shall be in needlework, washing, ironing housework, cooking, garden work, and, where cows are kept, dairying.

16. For the purpose of giving religious instruction to the inmates of any particular religious denomination to which the inmates belong, ministers of that denomination may have admission to institutions every Sunday, at such hours and on such days and hours as may be fixed by the Secretary; or, in the case of subsidised institutions, by the governing authority.

17. Each day shall be begun and ended with simple family worship, conducted by the manager, schoolmaster, or some other authorised officer.

18. No child shall be taught the tenets of any religion to which the parents or guardians object, or, in the case of wards, other than that to which they are stated in the order of detention to belong.

19. The discipline enforced shall be mild and firm. All degrading and injurious punishments shall be avoided. The "boxing" of children's ears is strictly forbidden, as is also the corporal punishment of girls of twelve years old and over. Corporal punishment shall not be inflicted upon girls below the age of twelve years, except under very extreme circumstances.

20. (a) Corporal punishment may, as a last resort, be inflicted in the presence of a witness by the manager or by the schoolmaster, under the direction and on the responsibility of the manager.

(b) Corporal punishment may be administered for offences against morality, gross impertinence, or for persistent disobedience, but not for trivial breaches of discipline or dullness in learning.

(c) For the purpose of this Regulation "corporal punishment" means punishment by means of strokes with a cane inflicted on the hands.

21. Every case of corporal punishment must be recorded in the punishment book immediately after the infliction thereof, giving date, details of the offence, number of strokes administered, and signature of witness.

22. (a) Discipline may be generally maintained by the granting of privileges and the following light punishments:—

(1) Forfeiture of privileges;

(2) Extra school tasks or drill;

(3) Confinement in a room with reasonable access of light and air.

As to (3), no immate of any subsidised institution shall be confined for a longer period than four hours.

(b) Every case of light punishment shall be recorded in the punishment book with date, particulars of offence, and the mode of punishment.

23. (1) The manager of each institution shall fix the days and hours during which the public will be allowed to visit the inmates of such institution, and shall publish the same on a notice board affixed in a conspicuous place near the main entrance of the institution.

(2) Except with the special permission of the manager, no member of the public shall be allowed to visit any inmate of an institution at any times other than those fixed as aforesaid.

(3) The manager of an institution may refuse admission to any person, who desires to visit an inmate, at any time whatsoever if, in his opinion, the interests of the inmate sought to be visited or of any other inmate, or the discipline of the institution, may be injuriously affected if such person is admitted to the institution. Provided that, where a person is refused admission during ordinary visiting hours, such refusal shall be reported to the secretary by the manager responsible for such refusal.

24. All letters to and from inmates who are wards shall be sent through the manager, who shall peruse them; and, if the contents of any letter be of such a nature as to justify it being withheld, the manager shall forward the same to the Secretary.

25. No ward shall be permitted to leave an institution on holidays, week-ends, or other days, with friends or relatives, without the approval in writing of the Secretary.

26. (1) Should any ward abscond, the manager shall immediately give notice thereof—

(a) to the Central Police Station, Perth; and

(b) to the Secretary.

(2) It shall be the duty of the police to arrest any such ward and convey him to the place from which he absconded, or to the Government Receiving Home, Mount Lawley.

27. Wherever possible, arrangements shall be made for medical and dental practitioners to visit institutions when necessary. Each visit shall be recorded in a book specially kept for the purpose, and a report shall be forwarded to the Secretary, giving names and particulars of wards needing treatment, and the treatment required.

28. A room shall be set aside as a bospital room, and a complete first-aid outfit shall be kept, together with necessary medicines, lotions, etc., for the treatment of superficial wounds, which shall be given constant attention until healed. Should any wound prove stubborn or not respond to treatment the advice of a medical practitioner shall be sought.

29. Any child who is considered to be suffering from any infectious disease shall be isolated and a doctor called in immediately. If the case is contagious, the institution shall be immediately placed under quarantine, and such quarantine shall not be lifted until advice is received from the doctor, the Secretary, or the Health Department.

30. (1) Institutions shall be kept thoroughly clean and hygienic in every way, and generally shall be maintained in such condition as to be approved by the Secretary.

(2) The dormitories and dining-rooms shall be made as bright and homelike as possible by the provision of pictures, flowers, small furnishings, etc.

31. The Secretary, or an officer of the Department authorised by him, may inspect any institution established or subsidised under the Act as often as occasion may require, and shall do so at least once in every six months. All matters connected with the industrial training of the inmates, the general management, discipline, admissions, discharges, etc., shall be dealt with by him; and all books and journals shall be open for his inspection.

32. All the officials engaged in an institution shall do their utmost to train the immates to habits of truthfulness, honesty, cleanliness, perseverance, modesty, courtesy, and temperance, and so fit them to live honourable and useful lives after leaving the institution.

33. (1) The subsidy (if any) to be paid by the Department for the maintenance of a ward in an institution shall be subject to the approval of the Minister.

(2) The payment of any such subsidy may be continued until the ward leaves the institution, or attains the age of 14 years.

(3) Payments shall not be made with respect to wards over 14 years of age, except in special cases, and then only with the approval of the Minister.

(4) When a ward leaves an institution for service or apprenticeship, the sum of three pounds may be paid as an outfit allowance, subject to the approval of the Secretary; but where a ward leaves an industrial or backward children's school the sum of four pounds may be paid.

34. The Manager shall keep all books and records required by the Department, including the following:---

- (a) A journal, in which all important occurrences in connection with the institution shall be carefully recorded;
- (b) An admission register, with particulars of the inmates and their previous history, as far as known, together with date of discharge;
- (c) A punishment register;
- (d) A medical report book;
- (e) A register of wages accounts.

35. The manager shall send to the Secretary as soon after the end of each month as possible—

- (a) a monthly return, showing admissions, discharges, abscondings, and other particulars for the month; and
- (b) a monthly maintenance return, in which the charges shall be for the period each ward has been resident in the institution, and shall not include those days on which any ward has been absent through absending or detention in a hospital on account of sickness, accident, etc.

Wards Apprenticed or placed out at Service.

36. Any person desiring to take charge of a ward over 14 years of age as servant or apprentice shall make application to the Secretary on Form No. 1, accompanied by a certificate signed by a Justice of the Peace, Medical Practitioner, or Minister of Religion, of the fitness and respectability of the applicant.

37. No ward shall be placed out as servant or apprentice until the home of the applicant has been inspected and satisfactorily reported upon.

38. When a ward is placed out at service, an agreement according to Form No. 2 shall be signed by the Secretary and the employer, in duplicate, and one copy delivered to the employer.

39. When a ward is placed out as apprentice, an indenture of apprenticeship shall be signed by the Secretary, the ward, and the employer, and the two last-mentioned parties shall be furnished with a copy.

40. Any agreement for service or indenture of apprenticeship may, with the consent of the Secretary, be cancelled at any time during its currency, when the ward shall be returned to the institution from which he was placed out or apprenticed, or be otherwise dealt with, as directed by the Secretary.

41. Each ward placed out at service shall be supplied with a complete outfit of clothes, working and otherwise, sufficient to last at least six months, with travelling case, hair-brush, comb, and tooth-brush.

42. (1) Every ward placed out or apprenticed shall be visited once at least in every six months by a visitor or some person authorised in that behalf by the Secretary, and such visitor or person shall be allowed every facility for an inspection of the home and condition of the ward's employment.

(2) Reports of such visits by a visitor shall be sent to the Secretary on Form No. 3.

(3) The Secretary may, in special circumstances, exempt any ward from such visits.

(4) The Secretary may pay up to the sum of 10s. out-of-pocket expenses where inspection is made of children placed out in the country by subsidised institutions.

43. Every child placed out for service or apprenticed shall have the right to a private interview with the Inspector or other visitor, and any employer who prevents or attempts to influence a child from making a correct statement shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations.

44. When it is necessary to remove promptly any ward from the residence of an employer, an officer of the Department or any person authorised by the Secretary may do so, and may place the ward in another home, but shall immediately report all the circumstances to the Secretary.

45. (1) Should any ward, whilst under the care of an employer. meet with an accident or become ill, medical aid shall be obtained from the Medical Officer of the district, or at a public hospital, but where such a course is impracticable, the services of the nearest doctor may be obtained.

(2) Whenever medical aid is obtained under this Regulation, notice thereof shall be given to the Secretary.

(3) The employer shall immediately notify the Secretary, in the event of a ward in his employ—

(a) becoming ill, suffering an injury, or meeting with an accident occasioned either through his employment or otherwise; or

(b) dying; or

(c) leaving his employment.

(4) Should any ward abscond, the employer shall immediately give notice thereof--

(a) to the nearest Police Station; and

(b) to the Secretary.

46. (1) The wages to be paid to wards placed out or apprenticed shall be as follows:—

Boys--a minimum weekly wage of 7s. 6d.,

Girls-a minimum weekly wage of 5s.,

with an increase of 2s. 6d. per week on completion of every six months of service until 18 years of age, or to date of cessation of service.

(2) Not less than one half of the weekly wages due to be paid to a ward shall be remitted quarterly to the Secretary for deposit in the Commonwealth Savings Bank, with the Secretary as Trustee for such ward, the balance to be paid to the ward as agreed upon; a receipt signed by the ward being taken in a book supplied for the purpose.

(3) Provided always—

- (a) That the Secretary may agree with the employer for special rates of wages, and make such exemptions, in special circumstances, as he may deem advisable;
- (b) That where a ward is placed in a position covered by an Industrial Award, an agreement shall be made for such ward to be paid the rate of wage covered by the Award.

47. Employers shall give two weeks' notice to the Secretary of their intention to change their places of residence, and specify the addresses to which they intend to remove.

48. Relatives shall not have access to wards placed at service, except under special circumstances, with the sanction of the Secretary, but they can be informed as to the health and general well-being of such children by applying to the Secretary.

49. No ward shall be placed out or apprenticed with any person in receipt of Government relief, or to or with any person holding a license to sell intoxicating liquor.

50. Each ward proceeding to or from employment shall be supplied with a free rail pass, except when travelling on any private railway line, when the Secretary's approval for the purchase of the necessary rail ticket shall be obtained.

51. If it is desired that any ward be retained in an institution for the purpose of being employed therein, the manager shall be regarded as the employer and the rate of wage shall be in accordance with these Regulations.

52. Wards shall be boarded at institutions during periods of unemployment, without cost to the Department or the ward, unless under special circumstances approved by the Secretary.

53. (1) All institutions from which wards are placed at service shall keep a register of wages accounts, as approved by the Secretary, which shall be posted up regularly.

(2) All agreements shall be numbered consecutively and filed. Such numbering shall harmonise with the accounts in the Register.

(3) Claims for wages due shall be rendered to employers at least quarterly, *i.e.*, September, December, March, and June.

(4) Receipts for moneys received shall be acknowledged on the official receipt form, and moneys brought into account in the Commonwealth Savings Bank as soon as possible. Receipt books shall be issued by the Child Welfare Department.

(5) Money due to the ward by the employer shall not be allowed to remain outstanding beyond one month after each quarter. Failing payment within that period, each individual case shall be reported in writing to the Secretary.

(6) Accounts shall be subject for audit by the Auditor General at least once in each year.

(7) In the months of January and June of each year, a return shall be furnished to the Secretary disclosing on each individual account the balance due by the employer to the ward.

(8) Official receipts of acknowledgment on the approved form shall be obtained from any ward who has received moneys from the management of the institution.

(9) Within a period of three months after a ward who has been placed out at service from an institution has attained the age of eighteen years, or has reached the expiration of the term of supervision or detention, if beyond the age of eighteen years, the Savings Bank Account shall be transferred to the Secretary, as Trustee, and the Savings Bank Pass Book handed to him. The governing authority during the before-mentioned period of three months shall collect and pay to the child's Bank Account any wages due on the date the child has attained the age of eighteen years, or such later period as abovementioned.

54. Regulations 36 to 53, relating to the placing out or apprenticing of children, shall be observed generally by the subsidised institutions, and in such cases, subject to the context, the words "governing authority" shall be read in place of the word "Secretary" or "Department," in Regulations 36, 38, 39, 40, 42 (1), 44, 45, 46, and 47.

Children Performing in Public.

55. (1) Application for a license made by or on behalf of a child or children to perform at a place of entertainment for gain or reward to the child or children, or to any other person, shall be made on Form No. 4, setting out therein applicant's name and address in full, the name of the hall or theatre and locality, together with the names and addresses, sex and ages of any such children.

(2) The application must be made at least seven days prior to the date of the proposed performance, otherwise a license to perform may be withheld.

(3) The Minister may refuse a license without giving any reason for so doing.

(4) Every license granted pursuant to an application made under this Regulation shall be on the Form No. 5.

56. When a license is granted, notice in writing shall be given to the person or persons concerned, and to the Commissioner of Police.

57. The usual hour up to which children may be permitted to perform shall be 9.0 p.m., but this time may be extended, with the approval of the Secretary.

58. Children performing under license in places of entertainment shall be accompanied to and from the hall or theatre by parents or guardians, and such parents or guardians must accept full responsibility.

59. In the case of an occasional entertainment for the benefit of any school charitable, or patriotic object, a license to perform shall not be necessary.

60. A license shall not be granted for children of school age to appear in any place of amusement or business house during school hours, unless written permission is first obtained from the Education Department.

Street Trading by Children.

61. (1) Application for a license to engage in street trading shall be made to the Department on Form No. 6, setting forth the applicant's name in full, residence, age, description of the proposed street trading, and locality, also name of school (if any) attended by applicant.

(2) The application shall be accompanied by a certificate of birth, and, where the applicant is under 14 years of age, a certificate of regular and punctual attendance at school.

62. The hours during which street trading may be carried on by licensees are the following:—

When over 12 and under 14 years of age-between 5 a.m. and 8 p.m.;

When over 14 and under 16 years of age—between 5 a.m. and 9 p.m.

Provided that the Minister may vary the above hours in specific cases. Provided also, that children liable to attend school shall not trade during any time that the school is open, and that no child shall trade after 10 a.m. on Sundays.

63. Every license granted in pursuance of an application made under Regulation 61 shall be on the Form No. 7, and—

- (a) Shall set forth the particulars contained in the application, together with any special conditions which, in the opinion of the Secretary, are desirable in the interests and for the welfare of the child;
- (b) Shall specify the hours during which the license shall have effect;
- (c) Shall be in force until the 30th June or 31st December (as the case may be) next ensuing after the granting of the license;
- (d) May be cancelled on the breach of any of the conditions or of any provision in the Act or these Regulations;
- (e) Shall not be transferable, but may be renewed with the approval of the Secretary.

64. No licensee shall be allowed—

- (a) to visit any premises licensed for the sale of intoxicating liquor; or
- (b) to trade in the streets, unless decently and sufficiently clothed.

65. (1) Every license shall, on the expiration or cancellation thereof, be surrendered immediately at the office from which it was issued.

(2) Application for a renewal of a license shall be made at least 14 days prior to the date of expiry.

Probation: Children Released on Probation by a Children's Court.

66. Whenever a child, in pursuance of Sections 30, 32, and 34 of the Act is ordered to be released on probation, the Court shall forthwith transmit to the Secretary a copy of the order according to Form No. 8.

- 67. Every person to whose care a child is released shall-
 - (a) supply him with adequate and suitable food, wearing apparel and sleeping accommodation;
 - (b) afford him reasonable opportunities for amusement and healthy recreation;
 - (c) provide him with proper medical attendance, nursing, and medicines in the case of illness;
 - (d) if of school age, arrange for his punctual and regular attendance at a day school, in accordance with the requirements of the Education Act for the time being in force;
 - (e) be held responsible for faithfully performing all the conditions imposed by the Court in respect of the child released.

68. (1) Every child released on probation shall be visited once at least in every three months by an officer of the Department, or a visitor.

(2) Such officer or visitor shall ascertain whether the conditions of the child's release are being complied with or not.

(3) Reports of such visits shall be sent to the Secretary.

69. It shall be the duty of every person in charge of a child released on probation to notify the Secretary—

(a) of any change of such person's residence; and

(b) of any absence without leave or serious misconduct of such child.

70. No child, during the period of probation, shall be transferred, except by an order of the Court.

Maternity Homes for Unmarried Mothers.

71. Unmarried mothers or unmarried expectant mothers requiring assistance in a maternity home after confinement, or partly before and partly after confinement, shall comply with the following requirements:—

- (a) fill in and complete Form No. 9;
- (b) take any necessary maintenance action in a Children's Court against the putative father, either through a solicitor or as advised by the Department;
- (c) supply such further information to the Department as may be deemed necessary.

72. Where assistance is necessary, the subsidy to be paid by the Department to the maternity home shall be as prescribed by the Minister. In cases where it is necessary, payment may be made up to a period of three months prior to confinement and nine months after confinement. Where, in the interests of the woman or girl, it is necessary to pay beyond this period, but not exceeding twelve months, special approval of the Minister is to be obtained.

Boarding-out Committees.

73. Each Committee shall consist of not less than three members, and shall confine its operations to the district specified in the appointment.

74. It shall be the duty of the Committee to render assistance generally to the Department, when required, and to see that the Act and Regulations are faithfully obeyed—

(a) in connection with wards released on parole; and

- (b) by foster-mothers and foster-parents;
- (c) to assist Department in procuring and supervising boarding-out homes and the care of wards sent to such homes.

75. Each Committee shall elect one of its members to act as correspondent, whose duty it shall be to keep the minutes of its proceedings and to carry on the correspondence with the Department.

Wards Boarded-out with Foster-parents.

76. (1.) Any person desiring to take charge of a ward of the Department as a boarded-out child shall make application to the Secretary on Form No. 10.

(2.) Every application shall be accompanied by the certificate of a Justice of the Peace, medical practitioner, minister of religion, or police officer, as to the fitness of the applicant to be entrusted with the care and training of a child. Should the applicant be married, a satisfactory certificate in regard to both husband and wife is necessary.

77. A foster-parent shall not at any time take charge of more than four wards, unless under special circumstances approved by the Secretary.

78. A ward boarded-out with a foster-parent shall be fed, lodged, and clothed to the satisfaction of the Secretary, and shall, as far as possible, be sent regularly to a place of worship or a Sunday school, unless exempted by the Secretary. A ward shall be allowed to play at reasonable times when not attending school, and, if employed in any way, must only be placed at such work as will afford easy healthful exercise. It must be distinctly understood that the ward is not to be made a drudge of the household.

79. (1.) Every ward boarded-out with a foster-parent shall, if possible, be visited at least once in every three months by an officer of the Department or a visitor.

(2.) Reports of such visits by a visitor shall be sent to the Secretary on Form No. 3.

(3.) The Secretary may exempt any ward from such visits, if considered advisable.

80. (1.) Every ward over the age of six years boarded-out with a fosterparent shall be sent regularly to school until fourteen years old, or until he has passed the compulsory standard required by the Education Act for the time being in force.

(2.) School teachers are required to furnish a report every three months, on Form No. 11, as to such ward's attendance, progress, behaviour, and appearance.

81. The Secretary, or any person authorised in writing by him, may visit and converse with wards of the Department wherever they may be, and, if necessary, question them as to whether they are properly treated, fed, and clothed.

82. All letters to and from a ward boarded-out with a foster-parent must be sent through the Secretary, who will peruse them, and, if he considers it undesirable to forward any letter, he may return it to the writer, or otherwise deal with it. S3. If a ward absconds, the foster-parent shall give immediate notice thereof to the Secretary and to the Officer-in-Charge of the nearest Police Station.

84. No person who has the care of a ward of the State shall remove such ward, or suffer such ward to be removed from the State of Western Australia, without the permission of the Minister.

85. Separate sleeping accommodation shall be provided by a foster-parent for boys and girls over seven years of age.

86. A ward boarded-out with a foster-parent must be trained to be honest, truthful, and obedient.

87. (1.) Should any ward whilst under the care of a foster-parent meet with an accident or become ill, medical aid shall be obtained from the Government Medical Officer of the district, or at a public hospital, but, where such a course is impracticable, the services of the nearest doctor may be obtained.

(2.) Whenever medical aid is obtained under this Regulation, notice thereot shall be given to the Secretary at once.

(3.) In the event of the death of a ward, the Secretary shall be notified immediately.

(4.) A foster-parent shall at once notify the Secretary of any change of address.

88. The outfit for a ward boarded-out with a foster-parent shall be as prescribed by the Secretary.

89. (1) The outfit supplied with a ward shall be maintained in a state of efficiency by the foster-parent, and, when a ward is returned by or removed from a foster-parent the outfit shall be returned complete.

(2) The cost of any deficiency may be deducted from any moneys due by the Department to the foster-parent.

90. The subsidy to be paid to a foster-parent for the care and maintenance of a ward shall be as prescribed by the Minister.

91. Where a ward is boarded-out, an agreement as per Form No. 12 shall be signed by the Secretary and the foster-parent, in duplicate, and one copy delivered to the foster-parent.

92. No ward shall be boarded-out with any person in receipt of Government relief, except under very special circumstances, approved by the Secretary, or with any person holding a license to sell intoxicating liquor.

Children Released on Parole.

93. (1) Every person to whose care a ward is released on parole shall-

- (a) supply him with wholesome and adequate food, suitable wearing apparel, and sleeping accommodation;
- (b) afford him reasonable opportunities for amusement and healthy recreation;
- (c) provide him with proper medical attendance, nursing, and medicines, in case of illness;
- (d) if of school age, arrange for his punctual and regular attendance at a day-school, in accordance with the requirements of the Education Act for the time being in force; and
- (e) send him regularly to a place of worship or a Sunday school, unless exempted by the Secretary.

(2) Such person shall be held responsible for faithfully performing all the conditions imposed in respect of the ward released.

94. (1) Every ward released on parole shall be visited once at least every three months by an officer of the Department or a visitor.

(2) Such officer or visitor shall ascertain whether the conditions of the ward's release are being complied with or not.

95. No ward, during the period of parole, shall be transferred, except with the approval of the Secretary.

96. It shall be the duty of every person in charge of a ward released on parole to notify the Secretary within seven days-

(a) of any change of such person's residence, and

(b) of any absence without leave, or serious misconduct of such ward.

97. In the event of a ward dying, notice shall be sent immediately to the Secretary.

98. No person who has the care of a ward of the State shall remove or suffer such ward to be removed from the State of Western Australia, without the permission of the Minister.

99. Should a ward on parole desire to marry, the permission of the Secretary shall first be obtained.

Foster-mothers, and Children under Six Years of Age.

100. In Regulations 101 to 115 "child" means a child, not being a ward, under the age of six years in the care of a licensed foster-mother.

101. Not more than two children shall be placed in the care of a licensed foster-mother in any one home, except under special circumstances, and with the approval of the Secretary.

102. Every application for a license to act as foster-mother to children under the age of six years for gain or reward shall be in Form No. 13, setting forth the full name and address of the applicant, and accompanied by a certificate signed by a Justice of the Peace, Medical Practitioner, Minister of Religion, or Police Officer as to the fitness and respectability of the applicant, her husband, and family.

103. No child shall be placed under the care of a foster-mother until the home of the applicant has been inspected and satisfactorily reported upon by a visitor or some person deputed by the Secretary.

104. The license fee for a foster-mother shall be 1s. for each year, or part of a year, ending 31st December.

105. Every license shall be according to Form No. 14, and-

(a) shall not be transferable;

(b) shall be for the year ending 31st December, but may be renewed by application in Form No. 13, subject to the approval of the Secretary;

(c) shall only be effective for the number of children fixed by the license.106. The license may be revoked on a breach of any provision of the Act or

these Regulations-

(a) if a child is not cared for to the satisfaction of the Secretary;

(b) if the home is not kept to the standard required by the Department.

107. Every licensed foster-mother shall, within three days after receiving a child, forward to the Secretary a return on Form No. 15.

108. Every licensed foster-mother shall give two weeks' notice to the Secretary of her intention to change her place of residence and specify the address to which she intends to remove.

109. Every licensed foster-mother shall, within three days after changing her residence, give notice thereof to the Secretary.

110. Every licensed foster-mother shall, within three days after the removal of any child in her care, give notice thereof to the Secretary on Form No. 16.

111. When it is deemed necessary for the Department to remove any infant from the residence of a foster-mother, the approval of the Secretary shall first be obtained.

112. Should any child whilst in the care of a foster-mother-

(a) meet with an accident; or

(b) become ill

medical aid shall be sought and the Secretary promptly advised.

113. In the event of a child dying, the Secretary shall be advised immediately.

114. Every licensed foster-mother shall keep a Register (Form No. 17), and also all books and records required by the Department.

115. The Department may board out wards under six years of age with licensed foster-mothers.

Places for Reception of Children under Six Years of Age.

116. Any house, room or place licensed under Section 114 of the Act shall be under the supervision of the Child Welfare Department, and may be visited and inspected at any time by the Secretary or any officer of the Child Welfare Department authorised by the Minister.

117. The licensee of any house, room, or place shall be responsible for the custody of all children admitted therein, and shall see that all officers carry out their duties satisfactorily.

118. The licensee shall keep all books and records, and furnish any returns or information required by the Secretary, and promptly report to him the absconding, serious illness, or death of a child, or any other special event which may occur.

119. Each inmate shall have a separate bed and shall be supplied with a sufficiency of serviceable bedding and clothing.

120. The inmates shall be supplied with good, wholesome food of sufficient quantity.

121. All structures and buildings shall be subject to the approval of the Secretary and shall be maintained to his satisfaction.

122. Fittings, equipment and requisites shall be suitable and ample and subject to the approval of the Secretary.

123. The Secretary may refuse a license to-

(a) any person who in his opinion is unsuitable; or

(b) when the structure, buildings, or equipment do not conform with his requirements under these Regulations.

124. (1) Application for licerse under Section 114 of the Act shall be made on Form No. 18.

(2) A license granted pursuant to such application shall be in Form No. 19.

Miscellaneous.

125. Whenever a child is placed in the dwelling of a Police Officer, pursuant to Section 23 of the Act, such Police Officer shall be allowed 1s. per meal for the care and maintenance of such child until his removal.

120. The inmates shall be supplied with good wholesome food of sufficient quantity.
