Local Court Rules. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, amends the Local Court Rules published in the Government Gazette on 22nd May, 1923, by inserting in Order X, after paragraph (6) of Rule 9, a paragraph as follows:—

(7) Where money is paid into court without a denial of liability, or under a defence of tender, and the action proceeds, the sum paid into court shall be included for the purpose of calculating the amount on which any costs allowed to the plaintiff are to be charged; but if the plaintiff recovers more than the sum so

paid, judgment shall be obtained and entered only for the additional amount recovered and the fees and costs so allowed; and in any such case the words "in addition to the sum of £..... paid into court by the defendant'' shall be added to the first paragraph of the form of judgment in the Appendix.

Junior Officers Generally.

Candidates whose ages exceed 16 years may be appointed at a salary to be fixed by the Commissioner within the limits of the above scales.

Junior machinists who have not passed the prescribed examination but who produce a certificate of efficiency in machining (adding and calculating) which the Commissioner in writing has accepted, and are appointed to the Service, shall be paid a salary one grade lower than prescribed, but preference will be given to the fully qualified applicant.

After attaining the age of 19, all junior clerks and typistes will be required to pass a promotional examination in English, tabulating, typewriting and writing. In addition, males will be required to pass in either book-keeping or shorthand, at officer's preference, while females will be required to pass in shorthand.

Machinists will be required to pass in tabulating and

Machinists will be required to pass in tabulating and summarising, bookkeeping and typewriting, in addition to a practical test in ledger posting.

Subject to passing such required examination and attaining the age of 21 years, and on appointment to a position carrying a classification higher than the junior range, officers will, subject to Regulation 43, be paid a salary, according to age, at date of appointment to such senior position.

A machinist will not rise beyond £180 until she has passed an advanced examination in book-keeping, calculating, and ledger-posting machines.

A female officer shall not be employed on clerical work classified beyond £190 per annum without the approval of the Commissioner.

A female officer the maximum of whose classified position is in excess of £190 shall rise from £190 by annual increments of £10: provided, where the classification exceeds £230, any further increments shall be subject to the same conditions and be under the same scale as applicable to male officers.

This regulation applies to officers who were appointed as juniors and whose salaries are paid according to age and not to years of service.

D—The lifting of 1¼ miles, more or less, of the existing 6-inch gravitation main and replacing with 12-inch external diameter cement-lined steel main; E—The lifting of 1¼ miles, more or less, of 3-inch

main and replacing with recovered and reconditioned 6-inch main;

F-The duplicating of 25 chains, more or less, of the

existing 3-inch main with recovered pipe; G—The laying of 12 chains, more or less, of recovered and reconditioned 3-inch main;

The laying of 24 chains, more or less, of reconditioned 3-inch main;

J—The laying of 20 chains, more or less, of reconditioned 3-inch main;

K-The provision and installation of 200 service meters.

The whole of these various items to be completed with such fittings as are necessary for efficient working.

It is proposed to raise the necessary Loan by the issue of Debentures in the form of the Ninth Schedule of the Act, which shall be a charge upon the works and revenue of the Board, and shall bear interest, payable half-yearly, at a rate not exceeding Five pounds per centum per annum.

It is proposed that the term of the Loan shall be fifteen years, and interest and principal in respect of the Loan shall be payable at the due dates at the Common-wealth Bank, Wiluna, or such other place as may be appointed.

THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1934.

Meekatharra Road Board .-- By-laws.

P.W. 1401/35. WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934," the Road Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Act mentioned, the Meekatharra Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Interpretation.

1. In these By-laws the interpretations set out in "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934," shall apply, in addition to which the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meaning set against them in "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934," "The Act"—Road Districts Act, 1919-1934, and all

amendments thereto which may hereafter come into

"Board"—Meekatharra Road Board.
"Board Room" shall be the office, hall, or building in which the meeting of the Board is held from time

to time.
"District"—The District under the jurisdiction of

the Meckatharra Road Board.
"'Chairman'' includes vice-Chairman or acting Chair-

man when acting under the provisions of the Act.

"Footpath or Footway" shall be that part of a road set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, whether the same be made or kerbed or otherwise.

"Officer" means any officer of the Meekatharra Road

Board.

"'Person'' shall include a body corporate.
"'Returning Officer'' means the person appointed by
the Meekatharra Road Board to conduct any election of
a member of the Board or for the election of any auditor, or for the taking of any poll which is authorised
under "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934."

"'Deputy Returning Officer'' means any person
appointed by the Returning Officer to preside at any

appointed by the Returning Officer to preside at any

polling place.

"Secretary" means the secretary of the Board. "All other interpretations to be as prescribed in the Road Districts Act or other Acts or regulations thereunder.

Duties of Secretary.

2. The duties of the secretary shall be:-

(a) to attend all Board meetings;

(b) to attend all Committee meetings;(c) to take notes of minutes and prepare reports of

Committees;

(d) to conduct all correspondence, and to give the other officials instructions, as directed by the minutes, and carry out the resolutions of the Board as contained in such minutes;

(e) to answer all questions on the Board's busi-

ness;
(f) to see that the accounts and the balance sheets are prepared and published yearly, and any other duties specified under "The Road Districts Act, 1919-34";

(g) to prepare and place before the Board the monthly financial statement at the end of each month of the financial year;

(h) to supervise the preparation of the Rate Books and the Board's Electoral Lists, to examine proof of the latter, and to arrange for the distribution of copies prior to the elections; also to attend all Courts of Revision or appeal; to make the necessary arrangements for the elections; to issue instructions to the supervisor, in accordance with the Board's resolutions;

(i) to summon the members to Board and Committee meetings;

(j) to keep all books up to date, in accordance with instructions issued by the Minister and additional instructions of the Board;

tional instructions of the Board;
(k) to check all accounts sent into the Board, and see that all accounts for works have stated in them the authority under which such works have been done, and to check all returns made by the collector or other of the Board's officers, and see that the counterfoils of the receipt book accompany all returns; to supervise and attend to the due payment of all moneys coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board;

(1) to report to the Board at its next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto:

thereto;
(m) to see that no payments to the credit of the
Board shall be made by any officer, except
through the secretary or such other officer as
may be acting temporarily in that capacity;
(n) to readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and to attend

to all other matters affecting the finances and welfare of the Board and not herein specified;

(o) to see that all bonds and other forms of security to be taken from the contractors are prepared,

and that the security required of servants is taken within due time, and report as to such

taken within due time, and report as to such matters to the Board;

(p) to report to the Chairman any servant, who has been duly appointed under By-law No. 5, who has been guilty of any neglect of duty, or who is incapable of performing the duties allotted to him, and, if necessary, to suspend or dispense with the services of any servant, and to duly report with respect to such action to the next ordinary meeting of the Board;

(q) to exercise, subject to any directions given by the Board or Chairman, control over all servants of the Board;

(r) to see that no receipt is on any other than the

(r) to see that no receipt is on any other than the forms prescribed by the Acts and Regulations under which authority is given for the issue

(s) to be responsible for the issue of receipts on the proper prescribed forms, and that all receipts issued are in proper sequence.

Duties of Supervisor.

The duties of the supervisor shall be:-

3. The duties of the supervisor shall be:—

(a) the supervisor shall have control of works, plants, and all property of the Board, and shall issue instructions to the employees, and shall see that same are faithfully carried out. Should any employee be guilty of insubordination or disobedience, or be found incapable of performing the duties allotted to him, the supervisor shall report the matter to the Chairman, who shall inquire into the matter, and, if necessary, shall suspend the employee and report the matter to the next meeting of the Board: Board;

(b) to prepare specifications for all works and improvements, as regards roads and culverts, under the control of the Board, examine all materials to be employed in such works, and to materials to be employed in such works, and to see the same faithfully and properly executed and performed and watch the progress and formation thereof; submit all specifications to the Board before tenders are called; (c) to see that the work of cleaning and repairing all public roads and footways is properly car-

ried out;

(d) to see that no labourers are engaged but those who are able bodied and sober;

who are able bodied and sober;

(e) to see that all servants under his control carry out their duties efficiently and to report any departure therefrom;

(f) to see that all drains, sewers, culverts, and bridges are maintained in a state of efficiency;

(g) to attend to all Board and Committee meetings if required:

if required;

(h) to specially examine all roads throughout the District at least once each six months, or as required by the Board;
(i) to supply monthy, or as required, to the Board, returns of all work completed or in progress, with remarks thereon.

Duties of Collector.

(a) The collector shall collect moneys due to the

Board, issuing receipts for payments, and enter particulars of all in the book for that purpose.

(b) He shall pay all such moneys as are collected from day to day, as required, to the secretary of the Board, who shall check all such entries on receiving the moneys answering thereto, and shall initial such entries.

(c) He shall be particularly diligent in the collection

of license fees, and shall take particulars of all cases which come under his observation of the evasion of the payment of such fees, with a view to the Board taking action for the recovery thereof from the person from whom such fees are due.

Appointment of Officers.

5. No permanent appointment shall be made to any office under the Board until after an advertisement has been published in one or more newspapers circulating in the District calling for applications from persons competent to fill such an appointment. All appointments petent to fill such an appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board. In the event of there being more than one application for such appointment, the election thereto shall be conducted by a show of hands, unless a ballot be demanded.

6. The salary or allowance attached to the office under consideration of the Board shall be fixed in all

cases preceding the election, and the salary of any officer when fixed shall not at any time be considered with a view to its increase or reduction, unless specially authorised by a meeting of the Board, at which at least five of the members are present.

All complaints against servants of the Board must be in writing, and must in every case be signed by the person or persons complaining, and no notice whatso-ever shall be taken of any complaint not made in accordance with this By-law. All such complaints as are receivable may be addressed to the Chairman, who, upon receipt of such complaint, shall have power to investigate same, and he shall report thereon to the Board at their next meeting.

Meetings and Proceedings.

8. Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds—"Ordinary" and "Special." Ordinary meetings are the regular meetings held in pursuance of these By-laws for the transaction of the general business of the Board, including meetings adjourned for the purpose of any incomplete business, but an adjourned meeting would not exclude any business which was considered necessary to transact. Special meetings are those called under Section 131 of the Act, and shall include those called by the Chairman in response to a requisition signed by three members, and the notices for such meetings shall have such special business notified thereon for which the meeting was called, and for which each member shall receive seven days' notice. No business shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that shall be transacted at a special meeting other than that for which the special meeting was called: Provided that any matter of urgency can be discussed, with the ruling of the Chairman, and the consent of those present. The ratepayers' meeting shall consist of one called under Section 144 of the Act, and the Standing Orders shall, so far as the Act allows, apply to the proceedings, but the provisions of the Act shall be first complied with.

9. Ordinary meetings shall be held at the Office of the Board once each month, on the day and the hour appointed from time to time by resolution of the Board. 10. No business will be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting of the Board unless a quorum is

11. At any meeting of the Board it shall rest with the majority of the members of the Board present to

exclude the public from such meeting, when in their opinion it is expedient to do so.

12. The first business of all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be the reading of the minutes of the the Board shall be the reading of the infinites of the preceding meeting aloud, with a view to their confirmation: Provided it shall be competent to facilitate the business of the Board to have the minutes typed or printed and a copy of such sent to each member before the meeting shall be equivalent to the reading of such minutes at the subsequent meeting, and which reading may then be dispensed with.

13. The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and in his absence, or after being present, if he shall retire, the Vice-Chairman shall preside.

Minutes of Meeting.

14. The Minute Book prescribed by the Act shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be entered by the secretary Minutes of special meetings or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary meeting. No discussion shall take place upon the minutes of proceedings, except as to their accuracy or for the rectification of a clerical error.

Standing Orders.

15. The order of business of all ordinary meetings of the Board shall be as follows, that is to say:—

(a) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last

ordinary meeting, also special meetings (if any).

- (b) Consideration of business arising out of such minutes.
- Questions of which due notice has been given by members or officers of the Board.
- (d) The Chairman shall have the right of directing attention at any meeting to any matter or subject within the jurisdiction or official coghisance of the Board, by a minute signed by himself, and such minute shall, when introduced, take precedence of all business before or to come before the Board, and the adoption thereof may be put by him from the Chair as a motion without being seconded, but he shall confine himself to the questions contained
- (e) Reports of subcommittees and officers.
- (f) Presentation of monthly statement and passing of accounts for payment.
- (g) Reading of correspondence received, and, at the option of the Board, despatched, and taking action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
- (h) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.
- (i) Deputations and presentation of petitions or memorials, and consideration thereof.
- (j) Motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (k) Motions without notice (by leave of the Board, under By-law 20).
- (1) General business.
- (m) Notice of motions.

16. In the event of any member having urgent business to place before the meeting, he may move the suspension of the Standing Orders, and, if agreed to by the Board, such business shall take precedence of all

Petitions.

17. Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only, and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures, and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature or prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

Tenders.

18. Tenders for works shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matter of the tenders comes on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a committee appointed for the purpose. The Board may require a deposit of five per cent. of the amount of the tender to accompany such tender, or two satisfactory surcties.

Deputations.

19. Due notice of at least three days shall be given to the secretary of all deputations intended to wait on the Board, and no deputation shall be received unless such notice has been given and the nature of the business proposed to be discussed.

Orders of Debate-Speakers must not Digress.

20. A member, when speaking, shall not digress from the subject of debate.

Correspondence.

21. All correspondence with the Board shall be addressed to the secretary and shall be respectful in its language, and submitted to the Board.

Unopposed Notices of Motion.

22. The Chairman may call over the notices motion on the business paper in the order in which they appear thereon; and, if objections are not taken to a motion being taken as a formal motion, may call upon the mover to move the same, and upon the motion being seconded may then, without discussion, put the motion to the vote.

Consideration of Reports.

23. (a) If, in a report of a Committee, distinct recommendations are made, the decision of the Board may be taken separately on each recommendation.

(b) Any report of a Committee, or any portion thereof, may be amended by the Board in any manner, if it may think fit, or may be referred back to the Committee for further consideration.
(c) The recommendation of any Committee, when adopted by the Board, shall be resolutions of the Board.

Precedence of Chairman.

24. When the Chairman rises in his place during the progress of a debate, any member then speaking or offering to speak, shall immediately resume his seat, and every member present shall preserve strict silence, so that the Chairman shall be heard without interruption, but the member who was speaking may resume when the Chairman takes his seat.

Notice of Motion-Absence of Mover.

25. In the absence of a member who has placed a notice of motion on the business paper for any meeting, any other member may at such meeting move the same, or such motion may be deferred until the next ordinary meeting of the Board.

Withdrawal of Motions.

26. Except as elsewhere provided, no motion, after being placed on the business paper, shall be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

Motions to be Seconded.

27. No motion shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded.

Motion not to be withdrawn without Consent.

28. When a motion has been proposed and seconded, it shall become subject to the control of the Board, and shall not be withdrawn without the consent of the Board.

Amendment may be Moved.

29. When a motion has been proposed and seconded, any member shall be at liberty to move an amendment thereon, but no such amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been seconded. An amendment shall not be a direct negative.

Motions and Amendments to be in Writing.

30. No motion or amendment shall be debated unless or until it has been reduced to writing, if the Chairman so directs.

Further Amendment may be moved on amended Question.

If an amendment has been carried, the question as amended thereby shall become itself the question before the Board, whereupon any further amendment upon such question may be moved.

Motion for Adjournment.

32. No discussion shall be permitted upon any motion for adjournment of the Board. If, upon the question being put on any such motion, the same is negatived, the subject then under consideration or next on the business paper shall be discussed, and it shall not be competent for any member to again move a motion of adjournment until half an hour has elapsed from the time of moving the one that has been negatived.

Mover of Adjournment-When entitled to Priority.

33. On resuming any discussion which has been adjourned, the mover of such adjournment shall be entitled, if he has not already spoken on the subject under discussion, to speak first.

Notice of Question to be given.

34. Sufficient notice of every question shall be given to the Chairman or member expected to reply thereto, to permit of consideration of such reply, and, if necessary, reference to other persons or documents.

Questions to be put without Argument.

35. Every such question shall be put categorically and without any argument.

Replies and objections and subsequent motions Received.

36. No discussion shall be permitted respecting any reply or refusal to reply to any question.

Mode of addressing Board, etc.

37. Members shall on all occasions, when at a meeting, address and speak to each other by their official designations, as Chairman or secretary, as the case may be, and, with the exception of the Chairman, shall rise in their places and stand while speaking (except when prevented from so doing by bodily infirmity).

Speaker not to be interrupted if in Order.

- 38. No member shall be interrupted while speaking, except for the purpose of calling him to order, as here inafter provided.
- 39. One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall be first put on the last amendment; then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they were moved.
- 40. A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.
- 41. In submitting a motion or amendment, the Chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.
- 42. When an amendment is carried, the motion amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which further amendments may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

Limitation as to number of Speeches.

43. The mover of an original motion shall have the right of general reply to all observations which have been made in reference to such motion, and to any amendment thereon, as well as the right to speak upon every such amendment. Every member, other than the mover of an original motion, shall have the right to speak once upon such motion and once upon every amendment moved thereon. No member shall, without the consent of the Board, speak more than once upon any one question, or for longer than ten minutes at any one time, unless misrepresented or misunderstood, in which case he may be permitted to explain, without adding further observations than may be necessary for the purpose of such explanation.

All Members to Vote.

44. Upon a vote being taken, all members present within the Board Room, unless disqualified from voting, shall record their respective votes in the affirmative or negative, as each shall deem desirable; but if a member neglects or refuses to vote, his vote shall be counted for the negative.

Determination of Questions.

- 45. (a) All questions shall, if not otherwise decided by law, be determined thus:—Upon a question being put, those in favour shall say "Aye" and those against "No"; and the Chairman shall declare whether the "Ayes" or "Noes" have determined the question; or, if the Chairman prefer, he may call for a show of hands for and against the question. The decision of the Chairman shall be final and conclusive, unless such decision be immediately challenged.
- (b) Where there is only one dissentient, he may request that his name be recorded in the minutes as opposed to the motion, and it shall be so recorded.

Divisions.

Upon a division being called for, the question shall be put in the affirmative and then in the negative, and the Chairman and all members present shall vote, and the names and votes of the Chairman and members present shall be recorded in the minutes by the secretary. Any member of the Board present, when a division is called for, who does not in the manner above indicated vote on such motion, not being disabled by law from so voting, his vote shall be counted for the negative.

Chairman may repeat Question.

47. The Chairman shall be at liberty to put any question as often as may be necessary to enable him to form his opinion as to the result of the voting and declare the same.

Act of Disorder.

48. Any member who at any meeting of the Board or any Committee commits a breach of any By-law, or moves or attempts to move any motion or amendment embodying any matter beyond the legal jurisdiction of the Board or Committee, or who in any other way raises or attempts to raise any question, or addresses or attempts to address the Board or Committee upon any subject which the Board or Committee have no legal right to entertain or discuss, or who uses any language which, according to common usage of gentlemen, would be held disorderly, or makes use of any expression inconsistent with good order or decorum, or says or does anything calculated to bring the Board or Committee into contempt, shall be guilty of an act of disorder.

Ruling of Chairman.

- 49. (a) The Chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedence applicable to the case, without argument or comment, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.
- (b) If the ruling of the Chairman be disagreed with by resolution, then the usual Parliamentary procedure may be adopted.

Members called to Order more than once.

50. Any member, who having been called to order by the Chairman for any infringement of any of the provisions of a By-law, or for any breach of decorum, shall, upon the request of the Chairman, withdraw from the Board Room for the remainder of the meeting.

Removal from Board Room—Penalty for continued breach of Order, etc.

51. In the event of a member declining to withdraw from the Board Room on being required so to do by the Chairman, he may order his removal until the determination of the sitting, and such member shall be deemed guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

Disorder.

52. If disorder arise at any meeting, the Chairman may adjourn the meeting for a period of fifteen minutes, and quit the Chair. The Board, on resuming, shall, on question put from the Chair, decide without debate whether the business shall be proceeded with or not.

Appointment of Committee.

53. The Board may at any time appoint three or more members as a Committee to inquire into any matter and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no Committee shall incur any financial liability, or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever, without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or a resolution of the Board.

Finance and Accounts.

- 54. All accounts, bills, vouchers shall be submitted to the ordinary meeting, and, after having been certified as correct, shall be paid by cheque.
- 55. An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may from time to time direct, and all moneys received from whatever source, with the exception of moneys granted by the Government, shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board, and no accounts shall be paid except by cheque signed by the Chairman and one or more members of the Board, and countersigned by the secretary. All moneys belonging to the Board shall, within twenty-four hours after they come into the hands of any officer, servant, or clerk, be paid to the secretary or to any other responsible officer, if directed by the Board.

Discount.

56. The Board is hereby empowered to allow discount on general rates for prompt payment of such general rates, and the Board may allow to any person who pays the general rates for which he is liable within ninety days of such rates becoming due, provided that such general rates shall be paid on or before the thirtieth day of September of the year in which the rates have been imposed, a percentage by way of discount of five per centum on the amount of such rates.

Unauthorised Expenditure.

57. Every item of expenditure, and every liability incurred by any Committee or member of the Board otherwise than under the authority of the Act or these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure and a breach of this By-law by such persons.

Common Seal.

58. The common seal of the Board shall be kept in the Board's safe. The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument, except by order of the Board.

Collecting and enforcing payment of Rates.

- 59. (a) All rates levied under the Act or any Act empowering the Board to make such levies shall be payable yearly in advance, and, after the expiration of one calendar month of the date of the making of such rate, the same shall thereupon become payable, and the Board may recover any rate not then paid in the manner provided by the Act.
- (b) For the purpose of these By-laws, notwithstanding that a collector may be employed by the Board, all rates, license fees, and other charges shall be payable at the Office of the Board.

Offences, Omissions, or Neglects.

- 60. Any person guilty of the following offences shall on conviction thereof pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds:—
 - (a) Damaging or destroying any building, dam, well, tank, pump, windmill, windlass, bucket, rope, piping, troughing, fence, gate, or other property under the control of the Board.
 (b) Placing any placard or other document, writing,
 - (b) Placing any placard or other document, writing, printing on or otherwise defacing any house or building abutting or contiguous to a public road, or any wall, fence, gate or lamp-post without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.
 - (c) Firing any explosive or performing any blasting operations on any land within the Town of Meekatharra without first having obtained permission of the Board and not attending to such directions in regard thereto given by the Board.

Preservation of Trees.

61. Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree or shrub or plant standing in any of the roads, enclosures, public places or reserves, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any of the tree-guards, fences, or other protection to such trees, shrubs, or plants aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds, and in addition thereto shall also pay the Board a sum equal to the damage done.

Water Supply.

- 62. Any person who shall injure or destroy any well, bore, pipe, tank, or place of storage for water, or any machinery, appliances, or property used in connection therewith, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and also pay to the Board the sum of such damage.
- 63. Any person who shall waste or allow water to escape, foul, pollute, or taint any water contained in any bore, pipe, tank, or place of storage shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

 64. No person shall pollute or cause to be polluted

64. No person shall pollute or cause to be polluted any watercourse, pool, well, tank, reservoir, or other water within the District.

65. Any person or persons leaving open the lid of any well in the District shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws and, notwithstanding any civil remedy for damages so caused, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

66. Any person who shall remove any water from any well, bore, tank, or other place of storage under the control of the Board, except in the direct watering of stock thereat, or for bona fide camping use, or except with the written consent of the Board and payment thereon of such reasonable fee as may be demanded, shall forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

For Regulating the flow of Poisonous Water from Mines.

67. (a) Any person who, while conducting or being in charge of any mining operations or treatment works for the extraction of metals from their ores or residues, shall suffer or permit any poisonous water to flow or be conveyed from such operations or treatment works into any creek, watercourse, water-channel, or drain without immediately taking precaution to properly and efficiently protect every such creek, watercourse, water channel, or drain from being reached by any animals or human beings, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall on conviction be liable a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds for each offence, and to a further penalty not exceeding five pounds for every day which such creek, watercourse, water-channel, or drain be allowed to remain unprotected in the manner aforesaid.

(b) Every person while conducting any mining operations or treatment works as aforesaid shall take due precautions against the leakage from any vats, tanks, vessels, pits, conduits, or open channels of any poisonous water therefrom, and shall sufficiently fence off and protect from the public or from stray stock all such vats, tanks, vessels, pits, conduits, or open channels containing any poisonous water; and every person who shall fail or neglect to so take precautions, or who shall neglect to so fence off and protect any such vat, tank, vessel, pit, conduit, or open channel, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall on convic-

tion be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

(c) Every person while conducting any mining operations or treatment works as aforesaid shall make due provision for the conveyance away from all such mining operations or treatment works of all offensive or waste waters, other than poisonous water, derived from such mining operations or treatment works in properly constructed channels or watercourses or conduits, and shall make provision by means of culverts or bridges for the crossing over by the public of all such channels, watercourses, or conduits. Such culverts or bridges or crossing places shall be constructed in such a manner as the Board directs, and shall at all times be kept and maintained in an efficient manner to the satisfaction of the Board. Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

Prescribing and Regulating the manner of keeping Goats.

68. (a) Every person who shall keep any goat within the limits of the Town of Meekatharra shall register such goat at the Office of the Board, and shall pay a registration fee of sixpence for each goat so registered.

(b) Any goat found at large in any public place may be seized and impounded or destroyed; and any officer of the Board or other person duly authorised by the Board may so seize or destroy any goat so found at

(c) The owner of any goat so found straying at large on any public place shall be liable for all expenses attendant on the seizure, impounding, or destruction

and removal of any such goat.

(d) Every person who shall keep any goat outside the limits of the Town of Meekatharra shall keep such goat under proper control, so as not to be a nuisance to any under proper control, so as not to be a nuisance to any person, or commit any depredation or damage to other persons' property. Any goat found so out of control and (or) committing any such depredation or damage, or being a nuisance to any person may, on the authority being first had and obtained from the Board, be destroyed by the person on whose property such depredation shall have been committed or whose property such depredation shall have been committed or whose property such tion shall have been committed or whose property shall have been damaged by such goat.

(e) Any person who offends against any of the pro-

visions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and in addition shall be liable to pay the cost of any damage done by any goat owned by him.

Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds.

69. (a) All recreation grounds shall be open to the for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise

provided by these By-laws.

(b) The Board shall have power to grant the exclusive right to use and occupy any recreation ground or reserve within the Town of Meekatharra, for the holding of public sports or amusements, to responsible persons for any time not exceeding two consecutive days, and upon such terms and conditions as the Board may require, and upon the payment by the persons to whom such exclusive right shall have been granted of a fee or percentage of gate-moneys to the Board, as may be required. Any person or persons obtaining such exclusive right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, and trees upon or enclosing such reserve or recreation ground.

(c) All persons using or being upon any reserve or recreation ground shall at all times conduct themselves in an orderly and becoming manner, and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public shall be liable to be expelled from such reserve or recreation ground by any police officer or officer of the Board, and shall in addition be guilty of a breach of this By-law and be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

(d) No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, fruit, or merchandise or liquid refreshment in any reserve or recreation ground without first having

obtained the written consent of the Board thereto, and shall pay a fee in an amount, as may be fixed by the

Board, not exceeding two pounds.

(e) No person shall damage or injure any buildings, fence, tree, shrub, plant, or other property in any reserve or recreation ground.

Lamp-Posts, etc.

70. No lamp-post, bridle-post, water-trough, telegraph, telephone or electric lighting pole or flagstaff shall be erected by any person in any street or road without the written consent of the Board, and upon consent being obtained shall be placed in such position, and shall be painted at least once in every three years, as may be directed by the Board, and the Board may order the removal by the owners of all bent, dangerous, or unsightly posts or poles. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay on conviction a penalty not exceeding two pounds for every such offence.

Erection of Hessian or Calico Structures.

71. (a) No person shall erect or construct any tent or other structure the exterior walls of which are wholly or in part composed of hessian, calico, canvas, or other inflammable material within the Town of Meekatharra.

(b) Temporary licenses permitting any person or persons to erect or construct a tent or other structure the walls of which are composed either wholly or in part of calico or canvas, for any period not exceeding one week, may be granted by the Board, and upon such conditions as the Board may impose, and on payment of

a registration fee of one pound.

(c) All tents or calico structures for which a temporary permit or license shall have been granted shall be removed by the owner on the expiration of the date for which such permit or license shall have been granted.

(d) Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

Regulating the Hawking of Goods, etc.

- 72. (a) It shall not be lawful for any person, other than a ratepayer or shopkeeper of the Road District of Meekatharra, not being licensed to hawk for the purpose of trading and carrying about for sale within the Meckatharra Road District any articles of merchandise, fruit, meat, fish, game, poultry, vegetables, or other eatables in any cart, dray, motor car or motor vehicle, wagon, barrow, truck, or on any beast of burden, or in any vehicle, whether drawn or pushed, or in any pack, tray, or basket.
- (b) Any person who travels and trades on foot, or with any vehicle or animal, or otherwise carrying to sell or expose or offer for sale within the limits aforesaid, any of the articles or things aforesaid shall be deemed to hawk the same.
- (c) No person shall keep, manage, or conduct a movable or temporarily fixed stall in or near any street for the sale of any meat, fruit, vegetables, fish, game, poultry, or other eatables or any articles of merchandise, unless such person shall first have obtained a license under these By-laws.
- (d) Every hawker, while employed in hawking, shall produce his license upon being required by any constable or any officer of the Board, and shall at all times have affixed to some conspicuous part of his barrow, basket, vehicle, cart, or dray a board or plate bearing his name and the words "Licensed Hawker" legibly printed thereon, in letters not less than one inch in length and of proportionate width.

- (e) No licensed stand shall be placed or allowed to stand in any street or position other than that mentioned in the License or between the hours of 8 p.m. and 8 a.m.
- (f) Licenses for hawkers shall be in the Form X of the Schedule and for stalls in the Form Z of the Schedule.
- (g) The following fees shall be paid for license to hawk or for stalls, and shall be paid in advance as from the first day of any month, and if any fees be not so paid when due the License shall be void.

Fees for Hawker's License.

73. For every hawker with hand basket, tray, barrow, eart, vehicle drawn by horse or other animal or any motor vehicle—six pounds per year.

(a) Every licensed hawker and stall-holder shall at all

times obey the lawful directions of the secretary or any

authorised officer of the Board.

(b) No person to whom a Hawker's License or Stallholder's License shall have been granted shall lend, transfer, or assign his license, and no person shall borrow or make use of any such license granted to a person, other than himself, unless by written consent of the secretary.

(c) No person to whom a Hawker's License shall

have been granted shall hawk or offer for sale any goods or merchandise within a radius of five miles of any

Townsite or any general store.

(d) Penaltics:—Any person who does, suffers, or permits any act, matter, or thing contrary to these By-laws, commits or permits any breach or negligence thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, where not otherwise provided, shall be deemed liable to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds for every such offence. for every such offence.

Regulating and providing for use, etc., of Roads and Public places, and prohibiting any mis-use of any Road and Public Places.

74. (a) No person shall place, drop, lay any poison or any substance containing any poison or deleterious matter upon or along any street, road, footpath, reserve, nor upon any vacant or occupied land within the Townsite of Meekatharra.

Any person who offends against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable upon conviction to a penalty

not exceeding twenty pounds.

The Board may offer a reward not exceeding ten pounds for information which will lead to the convic-

tion of any person or persons offending against the provisions of this By-law.

(b) The track and parts of track leading from Meekatharra to Wiluna, and known as the Wiluna road, commencing at the turn-off near the State Battery, Meekatharra, and following the cleared line to the Rabbit-proof Fence, is for the sole use of motor vehicular traffic. Any person using such track or portions cular traffic. Any person using such track or portions of track otherwise than for motor traffic will be liable on a conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

Reservation and Protection of Motor Tracks.

75. The Board may set apart any track or portions of any track for the sole use of motor vehicular traffic, and may clear and improve any track for the sole use of motor vehicular traffic. The Board shall give public notice, defining the track or portions of track thereby reserved for motor vehicular traffic, and may in addition provide and erect upon or along any track or portions of track so reserved, suitable notices indicating that such track or portions of track have been set apart for motor traffic, and prohibiting the use of such track or portions of track otherwise than for motor traffic.

No person shall drive any cart or carriage upon or along any such motor track.

Any person who shall drive any cart or carriage upon or along such motor track shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this By-law, and shall be liable upon con-

riction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds.

The terms "cart," "carriage," shall have the meanings assigned to them as in the Second Schedule of "The Traffic Act, 1919."

Further Offences.

76. Any person guilty of the following offences shall on conviction thereof pay a penalty not exceeding ten pounds .:-

(a) Sweeping or throwing any rubbish, garbage, sweepings, or litter or refuse of any descrip-tion on to any footpath or street or into any gutter or channel thereof.

- (b) Emptying, throwing, or discharging or permitting to be emptied, thrown, or discharged, any foul or offensive water or other offensive liquid into or upon any footpath or street or way, gutter, or channel.
- (c) Driving through or along any street or public place or way within the Town of Meckatharra any sheep, unyoked cattle, or horses between the hours of six o'clock in the morning and cleven o'clock at night.
- (d) Permitting any goods, wares, or merchandise, or any articles or effects to remain on any part of any street or footpath for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing or removing the same, or in any event after sunset.
- (e) Packing or causing to be packed or unpacked any goods, wares, or merchandise or any articles or effects on any part of any street or foot-

Drainage under Footways.

- 77. The owner of every house or premises from which any water is discharged or permitted to flow upon or into any street or public place shall construct and maintain a sufficient drain under the footway in such street or way for the conveyance of such water to the water-channel.
- 78. The owner and the occupier of any house or premises who shall suffer or permit any water to flow from such house or premises over any footway shall be guilty of an offence and on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Verandahs to have Down Pipes.

79. The owner of every house or premises the verandahs whereof have been erected over or projecting upon any footway shall provide proper spouting to the eaves of such verandah and down-spouting discharging at the level of the kerb of such footpath.

Every person who does not comply with this By-law shall be deemed guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

For the Preservation of Public Decency.

- 80. (a) No person shall let any premises or any part thereof with the knowledge that the same are or is to be used as a brothel, or for the purposes of habitual prostitution, or shall wilfully continue as a tenant of his premises any person who shall keep such premises as a brothel or for the purpose of habitual prostitution.
- (b) No person shall keep, manage, or assist in the management of a brothel, house of assignation, house of ill-fame, or place used for the purpose of habitual
- (c) No person shall knowlingly permit any premises or part thereof to be used as a brothel, house of assignation, house of ill-fame, or for the purpose of habitual prostitution.
