Sandalwood Act, 1929.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Sewerage, Maylands-Inglewood System, Reticulation Area No. 43—Proposed Pumping Station and Rising Main:—Concrete tanks, with brick and tile superstructure, electric pumps, rising main, and all apparatus connected therewith, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 5632.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Executive Council has made the following new Public Service Regulations—Nos. 95 (a) and (b), to date from 1st January, 1936:—

Regulation 95 (a):

The salary rates under Regulation 95 are based on an adult male basic wage of £3 10s. 6d. for the whole of the State, and they shall be subject to variation with the adult male basic wage for the Metropolitan Area as declared by the State Arbitration Court, in the following manner:—

The male salary rate of £185 per annum and male salary rates above £185 per annum, but not including salary rates in respect of positions with a maximum classification in excess of £699 per annum, shall be subject to adjustment at the rate of £5 per annum for every variation of 1s. 11d. per week from the basic wage rate of £3 10s. 6d. per week.

The female salary rate of £140 per annum and female salary rates above £140 per annum, but not exceeding £210 per annum, shall be subject to an adjustment of 75 per cent. (to the nearest £1) of any adjustment applicable to the male salary rate of £185 per annum. Female salary rates in excess of £210 per annum shall be subject to an adjustment of 80 per cent. of any adjustment applicable to the male salary rate of £185 per annum.

The salary rates of junior male and junior female officers shall be varied *pro rata* with the male salary rate of £185 per annum.

The salary rates of officers whose classification maximum exceeds £699 per annum shall be subject to adjustment at the rate of £20 per annum for every variation of 7s. 8d. per week from the basic wage rate of £3 10s. 6d. per week, but not otherwise.

Regulation 95 (b):

Officers who are located in areas where the male basic wage, as declared by the State Arbitration Court is higher than the male basic wage for the Metropolitan Area shall be entitled to receive the difference by way of a basic wage allowance. Such basic wage allowance shall be equal to the adjustment which would be made to the salary scale if the higher basic wage rate had application to the Metropolitan Area.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE BULK HANDLING ACT, 1935.

Form of Warrant.

1. The form in the First Schedule hereto shall be the form of warrant to be used for the purpose of Section 22 of the Act.

Provided that, in regard to the receipt, handling, and delivery of all wheat of the 1935-1936 wheat season the form of weighbridge ticket, warehouse receipt, and delivery warrant at present in use by the company, together with any special contract made by the company with the holder or holders of any such documents, shall constitute the warrant for the purpose of the Act.

Fees.

2. The following fees are prescribed as being the only fees which the company is entitled to charge in respect of its services under the Act:—

Handling charge ..	1.125d. per bushel.
Sheet hire (after the 15th 3d. per ton.	
March following the date of the receipt of the wheat)	
Shipping charge ..	9½d. per ton.
Overtime, engine hire, and demurrage	Subject to the provisions of the Act relating to liability for payment of these charges, the charges shall be made at actual cost.
Railage (from siding of receipt)	Actual amount incurred by the company calculated to the nearest one-thousandth part of one penny per bushel.
Truck equipment charge	.125d. per bushel.
For any special services incurred by arrangement with the company before or after the issue of the delivery warrant	Such rate as shall be mutually agreed upon between the company and the holder of the warrant.
For storage (after the 15th day of March)	One-tenth of one penny per bushel per month or part of a month until the date of delivery of the wheat.

For storage after the 30th day of September (but this charge is in respect of wheat of the 1935-1936 wheat season only) One halfpenny per bushel per week or part of a week until the company shall have removed the wheat from its storage bins or railway trucks.

Regulations relating to the nomination or election of Members of the Shippers' Board.

3. (a) Every person appointed or elected a member of the Shippers' Board shall cease to hold office at the expiration of 12 months from the 15th day of March preceding the date of his appointment or election.

(b) The chairman of the Board shall go out of office on the date on which members retire.

(c) Any member, including the chairman, shall be eligible for re-appointment or re-election.

(d) If any casual vacancy shall occur in the Board by reason of death, resignation, or incapacity of a member, the same may be filled in the same manner as is provided for the appointment or election of members of the Board, but the person so appointed or elected to fill the casual vacancy shall hold office only until the expiration of the time when the office of his predecessor would have become vacant in the ordinary course.

4. Nominations for the positions of members of the Board shall be called for during the month of February in each year by advertisement in two consecutive issues of a daily newspaper published in Perth.

5. Candidates for one position shall be nominated by those merchants operating in the State who are shippers of wheat not later than the 15th day of the following March.

6. The Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners and the company shall within the like time and manner nominate their respective member on the Board.

7. Nominations shall be in writing in the form in the Second Schedule and must be signed by the nominator or his duly authorised agent, and also by the person nominated as evidence of his consent to act or to stand for election.

8. If only one candidate is nominated by the said merchants, he shall be declared elected by the returning officer hereinafter mentioned on the date appointed for the holding of the election.

9. If more candidates than one are nominated by the said merchants, the returning officer shall cause ballot papers to be prepared, on which the names of candidates nominated by the shippers shall be printed in alphabetical order.

10. The ballot papers so prepared shall be posted or delivered by the returning officer at least four days before the date appointed for the holding of the election to every merchant who is entitled to vote for the election of a member of the Board.

11. The Minister, in the case of the first Board, and the retiring Board, in the case of every subsequent Board, shall fix the date for the election. Such date shall not be less than six nor more than ten days after the 15th day of March.

12. Every elector shall vote by means of a ballot paper forwarded to him by writing the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes, and if there are more than two candidates, he shall place the numeral 1 opposite the name of the candidate for whom he votes as his first preference, and he shall give contingent votes for all the remaining candidates by placing the numerals 2, 3 and so on (as the case requires) opposite their names so as to indicate by such numerical sequence the order of his preference.

13. After recording his votes every elector shall place his ballot paper in a plain envelope, which shall be sealed by the elector and enclosed unmarked in another envelope addressed to the returning officer.

The name of the elector verified by the execution or signature of the elector or his agent shall be written inside the last-mentioned envelope in spaces which shall be provided for the purpose.

14. All envelopes containing ballot papers shall be delivered or posted to the returning officer not later than noon on the day appointed for the holding of the election.

Every envelope posted shall be properly stamped, and, if it is not so stamped, the returning officer may refuse to accept it and the ballot paper therein contained.

15. The Minister, in the case of an election for the first Board, and the Board, in the case of all subsequent elections, shall appoint the returning officer and two scrutineers for the purpose of the election.

16. As soon as possible after noon on the day of the election the returning officer shall open all envelopes (except the sealed envelopes containing ballot papers) in the presence of the scrutineers and shall check the names of the electors.

After the returning officer is satisfied that an elector is duly qualified to vote, and that his execution or signature or the signature of his agent is genuine, he shall hand the sealed envelope containing the ballot paper to the scrutineers, who shall place it unopened with all other similar envelopes containing ballot papers in a ballot box provided for the purpose.

17. When the preceding provisions have been complied with the scrutineers shall remove all the sealed envelopes from the ballot box, and count the votes appearing on the ballot papers therein contained, using the preferential system of counting in the same manner as is for the time being adopted and used in connection with the election of members of the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia.

18. If it appears to the scrutineers or either of them that any ballot paper is informal, they shall submit the ballot paper to the returning officer, who may accept or reject it, and his decision shall be final.

19. A ballot paper shall be informal—

- (a) if the elector has not in casting his votes complied in every respect with the preceding regulations;
- (b) if the ballot paper has upon it any mark or writing which in the opinion of the returning officer would enable any person to identify the elector;
- (c) if it does not indicate the elector's vote.

20. The returning officer shall keep a record of the number of informal votes.

21. As soon as the counting is completed, the returning officer shall declare the candidate who obtained the greatest number of votes (counted in manner specified in the preceding regulations) to be elected, and shall report the result in writing to the Minister, and shall, as soon as possible after the making of the declaration, cause the name of the successful candidate to be advertised in the *Government Gazette*.
