The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 2010/35.

M.W.S. 2010/35. WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sew-erage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas it is further provided that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from cer-tain sections of this Act: Now, therefore, His Excel-lency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction Executive Council, hereby approves of the construction and extension by the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage of the following works under the said Act, and does hereby exempt such works from the operations of Sections 20, 21, 22, and 23 of the said Act.... said Âct :-

Description and Location of Reticulation Works Approved and Exempted:—Proposed eight-inch diameter water main commencing at the existing thirtysix-inch diameter water main at a point in Victoria avenue about two chains south of the south side of Terrace road and proceeding thence in a northerly direction clarge Victoria avenue to it in inclusion with Victoria along Victoria avenue to its junction with Victoria square; thence in a westerly and then northerly direc-tion around Victoria square to a point near the Public Hospital fence on the north side of Victoria square (length about thirty-two chains).

The above main to be complete with valves, hydrants, and all necessary apparatus, and the existing four inch main to be lifted as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 5654.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the seventh day of February, 1936.

RURAL RELIEF FUND ACT, 1935.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations under the above Act.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER THE RURAL RELIEF FUND ACT, 1935.

Meetings of the Trustees.

1. The Trustees shall keep proper minutes of their proceedings in a minute book.

2. The Director shall obtain the minutes of all resolutions of the Trustees relating to applications under the Act and generally follow the directions of the Trustees in regard to all applications and distributions from the Fund.

Applications for Stay Orders.

3. All applications for stay orders shall be addressed to the Trustees, care of the Director, who shall immediately report the same to the Trustees.

4. (a) An application shall be in the form in the First Schedule. In making such application the farmer shall also submit a statement of his affairs, which shall as nearly as practicable follow the form of statement to be furnished on application for an advance (Fifth Schedule).

(b) The Director shall examine each application and furnish a report to the Trustees on the affairs of the farmer, including any information available to the Director from the records of his own office, and from any other source.

5. A stay order shall be in the form specified in the Second Schedule.

Applications for Advances.

6. All applications shall be made to the Trustees, care of the Director, in accordance with the form in the Third Schedule.

The Director shall-

- (a) forward each application immediately on receipt thereof to the Trustees;
- (b) examine and report on the application as soon as possible to the Trustees;
- (c) obtain such further information as the Trustees may desire for the purpose of considering the application.

7. Every farmer to whom an advance has been made shall execute a mortgage in accordance with the form set out in the Sixth Schedule, and containing such other covenants and conditions as the Trustees may think necessary.

8. On the taking of any mortgage to secure any advance the Trustees shall cause notice to be sent to the Registrar of Titles, the Registrar of Deeds, the Under Secretary for Lands, and the Registrar of the Supreme Court. Such notice shall be in accordance with the form in the Fifth Schedule hereto.

Fees.

9. The fee payable under Section 12 of the Act for inspection of a mortgage shall be one shilling.

Part I.-Applications for Licenses.

All words after the word "Regulations" in the

2. Regulations Nos. 2 to 12 inclusive are repealed and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:

2. Every application for a Dairyman's License shall be in the Form No. 1 in the First Schedule. 3. Every application for a Milk Vendor's License shall be in one of the Forms Nos. 2, 3, 4 and 5 in the First Schedule.

and 5 in the First Schedule.
4. Every application for a Treatment License shall be in the Form No. 6 in the First Schedule.
5. In considering the grant or refusal of any license, the Board may require the applicant to attend before it and answer such questions as it desires relative to the application, and may require

an inspection and report on the premises of the applicant.

6. No license shall be granted in respect of pre-mises which do not (or the plant in which does not) conform to these Regulations and to the Regulations or By-laws of any local authority, statutory board, body, or authority.

7. A license to carry on business as a dairyman shall be in the Form No. 7 in the First Schedule. 8. A license to carry on business as a milk vendor shall be in one of the Forms Nos. 8, 9, 10

and 11 in the First Schedule.

9. A treatment license shall be in the Form No. 12 in the First Schedule.

10. Any person desiring to transfer his license shall first apply to the Board in writing for ap-proval of the transfer and shall give to the Board such particulars concerning the transaction as the Board may require.

Every license shall be issued by the Board 11. and held by the licensee and continue in force, subject to the Act and any Regulations from time to time made thereunder.

12. Subject to the provisions of Section 22 of the Act, the license fee payable for any license issued under the Act shall be the sum of two shillings and sixpence. Such fee shall accompany the application for the license, but shall be refunded to the applicant if his application is refused.

Part IV .--- The Board.

Regulation No. 18 is repealed and the following 3. Regulation is substituted therefor :-

18. (a) Subject to the maximum limits prescribed by the preceding Regulation, the Minister scribed by the preceding Regulation, the Minister may, at the request of the Board, sanction the pay-ment of a fee not exceeding £2 2s. to the Chair-man for any day on which he is engaged on the business of the Board, and the payment of a fee not exceeding £1 11s. 6d. to any member of the Board for any day on which he is engaged on the business of the Board.

(b) Members of the Board (including the Chair-man) shall be paid travelling and out of pocket expenses incurred while travelling to meetings, or when engaged on the business of the Board.

Part VI .--- Penalties.

4. Regulation No. 20 is repealed and the following Regulation is substituted therefor:—

20. (a) Every person who by act or omission commits a breach of any of the Regulations for the time being in force under "The Metropolitan Milk Act, 1932-1935," commits an offence and is liable to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds and not less than Two pounds.

(b) Any person convicted of a breach of any of the Regulations for the time being in force under "The Metropolitan Milk Act, 1932-1935," who after conviction continues by act or omission to commit the breach for which he was convicted shall be liable to a daily penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every day on which he continues to commit such breach after such conviction.

Part VII.—Appeals. 5. Regulation No. 22 is repealed and the following Regulation is substituted therefor:—

22. Any person aggrieved by any decision of the Board and desirous of appealing therefrom under the provisions of Section 23, Section 25, or Section 30 of the Act, shall lodge notice of appeal in the form in the Fourth Schedule to these Regulations, together with a statement of the grounds of the appeal, with a Resident or Police Magistrate or the Magistrate of the Local Court sitting within the Metropolitan Area, and serve a copy of such notice, and of the statement of the grounds of the appeal, on the Board, at its office, within one month after the appellant has been informed of the decision against which he desires to appeal.

Part IX.—Sale and Transport of Milk. 6. Regulations Nos. 34 to 41 are repealed and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:— 34. (a) The Board may from time to time of

the minimum prices per gallon to dairymen for milk and cream supplied.

(b) Such minimum prices shall be fixed in accordance with the provisions of Section 36, paragraph 7, of the Act.
(c) As soon as practicable after the minimum

prices have been fixed, the Board shall publish the same in the Government Gazette.

(d) The minimum price to be paid by milk ven-dors to dairymen for milk supplied (other than cream) shall be the price fixed by the Board as aforesaid.

(e) The minimum price to be paid by milk vendors to dairymen for cream shall be the price fixed by the Board as aforesaid.
(f) No dairyman shall sell and no milk vendor shall purchase milk or cream wholesale at prices which are less than the minimum prices fixed by the Board as aforesaid. the Board as aforesaid.

35. Forthwith after receiving any milk or cream, a milk vendor shall give notice in writing to the dairyman or intermediary (if any) from whom he receives it, stating the quantity thereof accepted by him as milk or cream, and also stating whether the remainder of the milk or cream has been rejected by him or accepted as butterfat, or for any and what other purpose. The said notice shall be served at the place of business of the dairyman or intermediary (if any) or posted in time to enable him to receive the same not later than the day on which he receives the empty cans which contained the said milk or cream.

36. A milk vendor shall pay the price of milk and cream purchased by him (less permitted de-ductions for rail freight and road transport as provided in Regulation 38) at the following times:-

- (a) as to milk and cream purchased between the first and fifteenth days inclusive of any month, payment shall be made on or within four days after the fifteenth day of that month;

of, or to the intermediary (if any) from whom he received it. 38. (1) In this Regulation the words "Siding of origin" mean the railway siding in a Dairy Area from which milk is consigned to a railway station in the Metropolitan Area, and the word "destination" means the railway station in the Metropolitan Area to which the milk is consigned. (2) A milk vendor shall be entitled to deduct from the amount chargeable against him by a dairyman for any quantity of milk or crean sold to

dairyman for any quantity of milk or cream sold to him by the dairyman, such a sum as shall be equiva-lent to the actual rail freight paid on the said milk or cream from the siding of origin to the destina-tion, and such road transport charges as are per-mitted by these Regulations to be charged.

(6) As soon as practicable after fixing maximum charges as aforesaid the Board shall publish the same in the Government Gazette.

 (b) a licensed dairyman provided that it is
 - milk produced by himself.
 - (c) a licensed milk vendor provided that it is milk purchased by himself,
 - (d) any person who has obtained a certifi-cate from the Board that the vehicles and other facilities provided by him are suitable for the transport of milk.

(8) No person other than the person mentioned in paragraph (7) of this Regulation shall transport milk.

(9) (a) Unless otherwise provided in these Regulations, no milk vendor shall make charges against any dairyman, excepting for the services aforesaid, nor make charges in excess of the maxi-mum charges fixed by the Board as aforesaid.

(b) No other person shall make charges against any dairyman for the road transport of milk or cream in excess of the maximum charges fixed by the Board as aforesaid.

39. Regulations Nos. 34 to 38 inclusive shall not apply to a transaction if the dairyman or milk vendor concerned proves to the satisfaction of milk board or of any Court that the milk or cream sold or purchased by him was neither intended for re-sale nor resold for consumption or use in the Metropolitan Area.

(4) No milk vendor shall sell milk or cream at prices which are in excess of the maximum prices fixed by the Board as aforesaid.

Part X .--- Treatment of Milk.

41. The occupier or holder of a milk store at which milk is treated shall:---

- (a) cool milk by means of a "flush-over" or similar type of cooler capable of reducing the temperature of the milk to a temperature

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 1 of 1936.

(Registered 11-1-1936.)

Nurses' Association-Long Service Leave. THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of 'The Indus-trial Arbitration Act, 1912-1935,' this Thirteenth day of December, 1935, between the Minister of Public Health, the Minister for Employment, and the Chief Secretary, on behalf of the Government of the State of Wastern Australia (baraine flow nof-word) to each Secretary, on behalf of the Government of the State of Western Australia (hereinafter referred to as the "Ministers"), of the one part, and the Western Aus-tralian Nurses' Association Industrial Union of Work-ers, Perth (hereinafter referred to as the "Union"), of the other part: Whereby it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:—

1. All full time workers after serving the Ministers continuously for ten or more years after attaining the age of eighteen years will be entitled, subject to the following conditions, to three months' long service leave on full pay, to be granted at the convenience of the Minister.

In regard to workers engaged at the date of this Agreement at the Perth (Public) Hospital and the Fre-mantle Public Hospital, their continuous service as from the 17th day of February, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, shall be deemed "service" for the pur-2. Workers will be similarly entitled to a further

period of three months' long service leave for the sub-sequent ten years' continuous service, and to a further period of three months for seven years' subsequent continuous service, and thereafter to a further period of three months' long service leave in respect of each seven years' subsequent continuous service. The words ''con-tinuous service'' do not include the period during which a worker is on long service leave or any period exceeding two weeks a worker is absent without pay.

3. The qualifying period for the second grant of long service leave to wages workers having more than years' continuous service on the first January, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, will, without regard to the grant of the first period of such leave, commence as follows:---

- To workers of twenty-eight years' service or over
- on 1st January, 1927—1st January, 1927. workers of twenty-two years' service and of less than twenty-eight years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st July, 1927. workers of sixteen years' service and of less than twenty-two years' service and of less To
- To than twenty-two years 'service on 1st January, 1927—1st July, 1928.
- To workers of thirteen years' service and of less than sixteen years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st July, 1929.
 To workers of ten years' service and of less than thirteen years' service on 1st January, 1927—1st January, 1929.
- 1st January, 1930.
- To workers of less than ten years' service on 1st January, 1927, but who have completed ten years' service by 1st July, 1930-1st July, ž930

4. Public holidays 'occurring during the period in which a worker is on long service leave will be calcu-lated as portion of the long service leave, and extra days in lieu thereof will not be granted.

5. Long service leave is granted solely for recupera-tive purposes. During long service leave no worker shall undertake, without the written consent of the Minister, any form of employment for hire or reward. Contravention of this condition will be followed by dismissal.

6. A worker dismissed from the Service shall not be entitle to payment in respect of long service leave, un-less three months' leave was actually due at the date of the offence for which she was dismissed. Payment in such cases shall not exceed the equivalent of three months' leave.

7. Workers may be paid their salary in advance, at their permanent classified rate of pay, for a period equivalent to the leave taken.

8. Any worker who is eligible for three months' long service leave and who resigns, or is retired from the service, shall be paid for such long service leave due.

9. A worker who retires at or over the age of 60, or who is retired on account of incapacity due to old age, or through ill-health, and who has served continuously for at least twelve months next before such retirement, shall be paid for long service leave *pro rata* to date of retirement.

10. If a deceased worker who had served continuously for at least twelve months next before her death leaves dependant children, dependant mother, dependant invalid sister, dependant invalid husband, dependant invalid father, or dependant invalid brother, payment *pro rata* of long service leave accrued in respect of service up to date of such worker's death shall be granted to such dependants, in such manner as the Minister shall decide.

11. District allowances will not be paid during the period of long service leave, except when the worker or above-mentioned dependants of the worker remain in the District.

12. Whenever possible, not less than one month's notice will be given each worker prior to the date on which her long service leave is to commence.

13. This Agreement shall apply to workers employed by the Ministers in Government Hospitals and Institutions, and shall operate over the whole of the State of Western Australia.

14. The term of this Agreement shall be three years from date hereof.

Clause (10)-Hours: Strike out the clause and insert the following in lieu thereof:--

"The hours of labour for all workers engaged in or about or in connection with the business of a butcher's shop or cutting cart, smallgoods shop, or in the handling of fresh killed or frozen meat, shall not exceed 48 hours per week, worked as follows:—Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, from 6 a.m. to 4 p.m.; Saturday, 6 a.m. to 6 p.m.; Wednesday, 6 a.m. to 1 p.m.

The hours of labour for all workers engaged in or about or in connection with the business of a smallgoods factory shall not exceed 48 hours per week, worked as follows:—Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, from 6 a.m. to 4 p.m.; Saturday, 6 a.m. to 1 p.m.; Wednesday, 6 a.m. to 6 p.m.

The hours of labour to be continuous, except for a break of one hour for each meal, but an additional day of ten (10) hours in any week may be worked in any week in which a holiday occurs, except when such holiday occurs on a Monday.''

Add the following new clause—(14) (a)—Managers: This Award shall not apply to managers.

For the purpose of this clause a manager shall mean:—

- (i) a person who attends to managerial duties, who is in charge of the establishment, and/or who directs and supervises operations in connection with that shop, and who may do butchering work; and
- (ii) who works under a written contract of service with his employer under which, in addition to any other provisions, he is entitled to a salary of seven pounds ten shillings (£7 10s. 0d.) per week and is also entitled to receive a month's notice before his services may be dispensed with, except in the case of misconduct.
