## FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

## Traffic By-laws.

P.W. 149/24.

THE Albany Road Board, pursuant to an Order in Council under Section 43 of "The Traffic Act, 1919-31," and in exercise of the power therein conferred, doth hereby make the following By-law, to have effect within the Albany Road District:—

The passage of any vehicle engaged in heavy traffic over the following road, namely, the Robinson Group road, from its intersection with the Cape Riche road to Plantagenet Locations 2485 and 2486, is prohibited.

For the purpose of this By-law "Heavy traffic" means the traffic of all vehicles engaged in the carriage or conveyance of sleepers (sawn or hewn), split and other timber, firewood, bricks, stone, gravel, lime, cement, farm produce, or other material in bulk, and the traffic of any vehicle the weight thereof including load exceeds 12 cwt. per wheel or maximum of 48 cwt.

For any cart or carriage intended to be used for the carriage of passengers or goods for hire or reward licensed outside the Metropolitan Area—blue letters and numbers on a yellow ground. When numerals are capable of being reversed, plates shall have a line or stripe at the foot one-eighth or one-quarter of an inch wide in the same colour as the numerals.

(e) For any cart or carriage for private use licensed inside the Metropolitan Area—red numbers on a green ground. When numerals are capable of being reversed, plates shall have a line or stripe at the foot one-eighth or one-quarter of an inch wide in the same colour as the numerals.

For any cart or carriage intended to be used for the carriage of passengers or goods for hire or reward licensed inside the Metropolitan Area—red numbers on a white ground. When numerals are capable of being reversed, plates shall have a line or stripe at the foot one-eighth or one-quarter of an inch wide in the same colour as the numerals.

REGULATIONS relating to disputes between Local Authorities concerning the question as to the District in which a License has been wholly, mainly, or substantially exercised under the provisions of Subsection (2) of Section 12 of "The Traffic Act, 1919-1931," or of Subsection (2) of Section 12 of "The Traffic Act, 1919-1935."

1. Any Local Authority (hereinafter called "the applicant") desirous of having any dispute between the applicant and any other Local Authority (hereinafter called "the respondent") tried and determined by a Police or Resident Magistrate under the provisions of Section 12 of the Act may lodge an application in the office of the Police or Resident Magistrate nearest to the office of the applicant.

The application shall be in the form in the Schedule.

2. A copy of the application shall be served on the respondent within seven days of the lodgment of the application with the Magistrate, or such further time as the Magistrate may allow.

3. On proof by affidavit to the satisfaction of the Magistrate that the application has been duly served, the Magistrate shall cause written notice to be sent to the parties of the date and time for hearing of the application.

Such date shall not be less than 14 clear days from the service of the application on the respondent.

4. If either party neglects to appear by its Town Clerk, Secretary, or Traffic Inspector, or by Counsel or Solicitor, on the date and at the time fixed for the hearing, the Magistrate may hear and determine the matter in the absence of such party, or adjourn the application to some other date.

5. On the determination of the matter the Magistrate may make any order for payment of the license fee, the subject of the dispute, by one party to the other which necessarily follows as the result of his determination of the matter, and may also make such order as to costs as he thinks fit.

6. On the hearing of the matter the applicant shall open its case and the matter shall proceed as nearly as may be according to the procedure and rules of evidence relating to the trial of an action in a Local Court.

7. The Rules of the Local Court shall, in so far as they are applicable and not inconsistent with these Regulations, apply to applications hereunder.



REGULATIONS made under "The Dog Act, 1903-1928," and published in the Government Gazette on the 22nd March, 1935, page 710, are hereby amended by deleting therefrom Regulations 1, 3, and 5 and inserting in lieu thereof the following:—

Regulations.

1. These Regulations shall come into operation and have the force of law in every District throughout the State on and from the 1st day of July, 1936.

3. The registration label for the financial year ending the 30th June, 1937, required by Section 9 of "The Dog Act, 1903-1928," is hereby prescribed to be a flat piece of nickel-plated brass, of the size and shape depicted hereunder, inscribed on the one side with the name of the District, the year of registration, and the registration number, and on the other side with the emblem of the State Flag.



5. Registration shall be effected on or within 21 days from the 1st day of July, 1936.

Peppermint Grove Road Board—Building By-laws.

P.W. 1152/35.

THE Peppermint Grove Road Board, under the powers conferred by Section 204 of “The Road Districts Act, 1919-34,” as amended by Section 29, Subsection (3), of “The Town Planning and Development Act, 1928,” and under all other powers by law vested in the Board, doth hereby:—(i) Repeal By-laws 66 to 72 inclusive, as published in the *Government Gazette* on 2nd day of September, 1932, page 1356; (ii) amend the Building By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* on the 14th day of February, 1919, by omitting paragraph 66 thereof and adding the following paragraphs:—

66. All that portion of Peppermint Grove Road District save and except the district which is composed of all the subdivisional lots having a frontage upon Stirling highway is hereby classified as a district for the purpose of private schools and residences only, and is hereinafter referred to as “the residential district”: And that portion of Peppermint Grove Road District which is composed of all subdivisional lots having a frontage upon Stirling highway is classified as a district for retail shops, places of amusement, halls, churches, schools, offices, or other commercial or business purpose (not being a noxious trade or a manufacturing one or a wood-yard), which may from time to time be approved by the Peppermint Grove Road Board, and is hereinafter referred to as “the business district.”

67. No land situated within the residential district, other than Crown land or land vested in or under the control of the Peppermint Grove Road Board shall, unless with the consent in writing of the Board, be used for any purpose whatsoever other than for detached single family residences or schools, in either case of not more than three floors, including the ground floor.

68. No residence or school in the residential district shall be closer to the road or street frontage than 30 feet, and no structure or building whatsoever appertaining thereto shall be erected between the front of such residence or school and the building line of the road or street.

No part of a residence or of any other structure shall, without the express permission in writing of the Board and subject to such conditions as the Board may impose, be erected within three feet of any boundary alignment of the lot on which it is to be erected, if that boundary alignment is either the whole or part of a boundary alignment of another lot.

69. Within the residential district no residence or school (including other structures appertaining thereto) shall occupy more than two-thirds of the area of any lot.

70. All residences shall be detached.

71. No hoarding, placard, advertising matter, advertising device, or notice of any kind (other than of the character hereunder mentioned in the proviso) shall be erected, pasted, exhibited, or put up, on, or over or attached to any land, building, fence, wall, or other erection, or on or over any public thoroughfare, or on or over any vacant land within the Road District without the written con-

sent of the Board being first obtained: Provided always, that nothing in this paragraph shall be deemed to prohibit:—

- (i) a notice that the land or building on which it appears is for sale or to let;
- (ii) the exhibition by the occupant (or occupants) of an approved sign (or signs) setting out the name (or names) and the trade (or trades), profession (or professions) or calling (or callings) of the occupant (or occupants).

#### Penalties.

72. These By-laws as well as the By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* of the 2nd day of September, 1932, pages 1355 and 1356, and the By-laws published in the *Government Gazette* of the 14th day of February, 1919, pages 197 to 211, shall be read as one, and (except where expressly otherwise provided in these By-laws) all the By-laws shall apply to every part of the District of the Peppermint Grove Road Board District, and any person who contravenes or does not comply with any one of the provisions of any of the mentioned By-laws shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the By-laws, and for every such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
