WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," that the expression "Public Holiday" shall mean certain days therein specified, and any other day declared by Proclamation to be a public holiday for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that Monday, the 4th day of May, 1936, shall be a public holiday throughout the State for the purposes of the said Act, and shall be observed as a public holiday under every part of the said Act in which the expression occurs.

AT at meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, at Perth, this Eighth day of April, 1936, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 194/36.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and storm-

water drainage works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Water Supply, City of Fremantle—Improvements to Supply—Victoria Quay:—Proposed 14-inch diameter water main (length about 22 chains) and 10-inch diameter water mains (total length about 43 chains), complete with valves and all necessary apparatus in Queen Victoria Street, and the lifting of approximately 29 chains of 10-inch and 21½ chains of 4-inch water main, as indicated in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 5677.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the Twenty-fourth day of April, 1936.

## FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934," which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer, but not beyond judgment.

#### THE TOWN PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACT, 1928.

By-law under the Second Schedule of "The Town Planning and Development Act, 1928," Clauses 4 and 11.

1. Wherever the District or part of the District under the control of a Local Authority has been or hereafter shall be zoned or districted or classified under the provisions of the Town Planning and Development Act, no building shall be used or erected for any purpose contrary to the provisions of any Town Planning Scheme, or By-law under the Town Planning Act, or any By-law under the Road Districts Act, Section 196, Subsection 50.

2. The authority or authorities responsible for carrying the Town Planning By-law into effect and enforcing its observance shall be the Executive Officer of any Local Authority and/or the Town Planning Commissioner.

If any person shall, either by act or omission, contravene this By-law, he shall be guilty of an offence under this By-law, and on conviction for such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and, also, if such offence is in its nature a continuing offence, to a daily penalty not exceeding £2 during the continuance of the offence.
