W.A. No. 164.

RURAL RELIEF FUND ACT, 1935.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following additional Regulations under the above Act.

W. C. ANGWIN, Chairman of Trustees. Regulations under "The Rural Relief Fund Act, 1935," Relating to the Recording of Notifications of Mortgages or Securities taken under the Act.

- A notification under Section 12 of the Act to the Registrar of Titles and the Registrar of Deeds may be on the one form, and it shall be sufficient to address the notice jointly to these two officials.
- 2. The registration authority shall from time to time-
 - (a) cause a memorandum to be made on each notification received of the date and time of its receipt by the registration authority;

 - (b) cause all such notifications received to be securely attached to a file in order of receipt;
 (c) keep an index in book or card form of all notifications so filed.
- The said index and file of notifications shall be available for inspection by the public during the office hours of the registration authority.
- 4. The fees paid for searching a title in any name or searching a bill of sale under any name in the office of the registration authority shall entitle the searcher also to search the index and the file of notifications kept under these Regulations.
- 5. In these Regulations the term "registration authority" means the Registrar of Titles, the Registrar of Deeds, or the Registrar of the Supreme Court, as the case may require.

WHEREAS by "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934," the Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act, and whereas the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of every authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

- 1. In the construction of these By-laws, subject to the context-
- "Board" shall mean the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board.
- 'Secretary" means the secretary for the time being of the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board.

- "Hall" means and includes any hall, room, lounge, corridor, stairway, stage, entrance, yard, or land situated within the boundaries of the Townsite lot upon which any public hall shall be erected.
 "Caretaker" means the caretaker of the hall duly ap-
- pointed by the Board.
- 2. Application for the hire of the hall or any room shall be made in writing to the secretary or other duly authorised agent not less than twenty-four hours before the time that such hall or room is required, and shall state the time and the purpose for which the hall or room is required.
- 3. The name and place of abode of the actual and responsible person or persons hiring the hall or any room shall be given in the application for the hire of the hall or room.
- 4. The rent of the hall or any room shall be paid with each application, and shall be as set out in Schedule "A"
- 5. The Board at any time may demand that the hirer shall prior to the term of engagement deposit an amount estimated to cover any damage that might occur during the term of
- 6. Any person or persons having hired the hall or any room shall give up possession promptly at the time agreed upon, and shall leave the hall or any room clean and fit for other occupation and the furniture in good condition and in its normal position.
- 7. The Board reserves the right to refuse to hire the hall or any room to any applicant for the hire of same without assigning any reason for such refusal.
- The Board may at any time cancel any agreement made for the hiring of the hall or any room.
- In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of the hall or room for the same date and hour, the Board may without considering priority of application determine to which applicant the hire of the hall or any room shall be granted
- 10. The hirer of the hall or any room shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, Entertainments Tax Act, and any other Act in force for the time being applicable to such hiring and use of any hall or any room. If in the opinion of the Board all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the aforementioned Acts, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of an engagement forbid and prevent the use of the hall or any room.
- 11. In the event of the use of the hall or any room being forbidden or prevented under the last preceding By-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of the ball or any room, as if the hire had been duly fulfilled, and the Board shall not be responsible for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.
- 12. No fermented or spirituous liquors shall be brought into or consumed in the hall or any room, except when permitted by the Board in writing.
- No person shall smoke any tobacco, cigar, cigarette, or objectional substance, nor strike or otherwise ignite any light in the hall or in any room during any ball or public entertainment, or at any gathering of persons in the said hall or in any room, whether such persons have been ad-mitted by the payment of money or otherwise, except at any banquet or smoke social where those present comprise
 - 14. No person shall in any part of the hall or any room-
 - (a) use profane or improper language;
 - (b) enter or be allowed to enter whilst intoxicated; (c) be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever;
 - (c) be guilty of any misbehaviour whatsoever;
 (d) damage, mark, or deface any wall or any part of the hall or any room. (Any person who does, permits, or suffers such damage shall be liable to pay the cost of all such damage, in addition to any penalty imposed by these By-laws.)
 (e) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever. (Any person so doing shall immediately disperse, on being requested to do so by the hirer, the sceretary, the carretaker, or other duly authorised.
 - officer of the Board, or police constable, whether in uniform or otherwise.)
- 15. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons, or anything calculated to produce a disturbance, riot, or breach of the peace shall be permitted in the hall or any room.
- No encouragement shall be given to improper characters to assemble in the hall or any room.
 - 17. Skating will not be permitted under any consideration.
- Children under ten years of age must be under responsible supervision when in the hall or any room.
- 19. The hirer of the hall or any room shall maintain and keep good order and decent behaviour in such hall or room. and shall be solely and entirely responsible for the carrying out of these By-laws, and for any damage done to the build

ings, fixtures, fittings, furniture, crockery-ware, and shall pay such damages as shall be assessed by the Board. Any article of crockery-ware not accounted for or in a cracked or broken condition shall be paid for at current rates or

20. The secretary, caretaker, or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or police constable when dressed in uniform or otherwise, shall be permitted to have free ingress to the hall or any room at all times during the term of an engagement, and every facility shall be given them by enforcing these By-laws.

Every person who does, permits, or suffers any Act, matter, or thing, contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such conviction.

APPENDIX I.

Secondary School Scholarships and Admission to Perth Modern School and other Government High Schools.

Secondary School Scholarships.

Secondary School Scholarships.

1. Scholarships not exceeding 50 in each year are annually offered for boys or girls attending Government or other efficient schools. The scholarships will entitle the holders to receive a grant to defray the necessary expenses incurred in the provision of books, provided that no such grants shall exceed £3 per annum, and to have their entrance fees paid by the Department on sitting for the "Junior" examination in the third year and for the "Leaving" examination in the fifth year of their scholarships. Scholarship-holders living at home their scholarships. Scholarship-holders living at home may also receive a grant to defray their necessary travelling expenses, provided that their homes are at a greater distance than two miles from the school. The winners of these scholarships must attend Secondary Schools approved by the Department. If the winner of a scholarship resides at such a distance from all the approved schools that it is necessary for him to become a boarder, or to live away from home, an additional a boarder, or to live away from home, an additional allowance of £24 per annum will be given; provided that his parents are in receipt of an income not exceeding £300 per annum, or, alternatively, £50 for each dependent member of the family. (For the purpose of this calculation, the parents will be included in computing the number in the family.) The continuance of this allowance will come up for review at the beginning of each year. Proportionate payments are made at the end of each school term. In necessitous cases a month's payment in advance will be granted, if application in payment in advance will be granted, if application in writing is made to the Hon. the Minister for Education and the parent or guardian enters into a bond, on the prescribed form, to refund such advance should the scholarship-holder not satisfactorily complete the term for which the payment has been advanced.

The Scholarships will be tenable for three years in the first instance, but may be renewed for a further period of two years, if the industry and success of the scholar are considered to warrant such an extension. Scholars are expected to pass the "Junior" examination by the end of their third year.

Those who have passed the "Junior" examination and who wish to take up agricultural pursuits may have their scholarships renewed at the Muresk Agricultural College.

- 3. A candidate for these scholarships must-
 - (a) sit for the examination held in the year in which he or she attains his or her twelfth birthday. (This clause of the Regulations will take effect as from the first day of January, 1938.)
 (b) produce a certificate of industry and good con-
 - b) produce a certificate of industry and good conduct from the head teacher of the school now being attended.
- 4. The scholarships are awarded upon a competitive examination conducted by the Education Department.
- 5. A number of scholarships, not exceeding one-fifth of the total number offered, will be reserved for pupils from country schools, provided that candidates of sufficient merit present themselves. A school with more than four teachers shall be deemed a country school for the purposes of this section.
- 6. The conditions upon which the scholarships are tenable are:—
 - (a) that the successful scholar shall, at the commencement of the first term following the award of the scholarships, become a pupil at a Secondary School approved by the Minister. The Minister may require that the school be inspected.
 - (b) that he shall continue to attend such school, and at the end of each term obtain from the authorities of the school and forward to the Education Department, a certificate stating that his conduct, progress, and attendance have been satisfactory. Full particulars of attendance, of success in study, and of promotion, if any, must be given. If an unfavourable report is received, or, if at any time his conduct be disorderly or immoral, the scholarship may at the discretion of the Minister, be forthwith cancelled.
 - (c) payment will be made to the parent or guardian. The cost of the necessary books, up to £3, may be deducted and paid to the Principal of the School.
- 7. The examination will be on the following subjects:—
 - 1. English (300 marks).—The papers will be designed to test the candidate's powers of understanding the language and of using it freely and correctly.
 - 2. Arithmetic (200 marks).—The ordinary course of Arithmetic as prescribed for classes not higher than the sixth in State schools.

Candidates will be admitted only from schools which satisfy the Minister that they have provided a sufficiently full course of instruction in English, Arithmetic, History, Geography, Elementary Science, Drawing, and Physical Training. Schools which are not under the Department must submit in April of each year the curriculum and time-table for the class in which the candidates are included.

- 8. The examination will be held in such centres as shall be fixed annually by the Department.
- 9. Schools desiring to be included on the list of approved Secondary Schools at which these scholarships are tenable must apply to the Department for inclusion. The Minister must be satisfied that the school possesses suitable premises and equipment, and is adequately staffed, and that it provides a five years' course of instruction beyond the primary stage, leading up to a standard not lower than that of the Leaving Certificate in such a number and range of subjects as the Minister may deem adequate.

Admission to Perth Modern School and other Government High Schools.

The examination for admission to the Perth Modern School and other Government High Schools will be identical with that for Secondary School scholarships. Candidates must sit for the examination held in the year in which they attain their twelfth birthday. (This clause of the Regulations will take effect as from the first day of January 1938)

of January, 1938.)

The full course at these schools is for five years. Admission is for three years in the first instance, and may be renewed for a further period of two years, if the industry and success of the scholar are considered to warrant such an extension. Students are expected to pass the "Junior" examination by the end of their third year.

"Entrance" holders who have passed the "Junior" examination and who wish to take up Agricultural pursuits may have their "Entrances" renewed at the Muresk Agricultural College.

A candidate who succeeds in gaining admission by this examination may, if he resides at such a distance from an approved school that it is necessary for him to become a boarder, or live away from home, receive an allowance of £24 per annum; provided that his parents are in receipt of an income not exceeding £300 per annum, or, alternatively £50 for each dependent member of the family. (For the purpose of this calculation, the parents will be included in computing the number in the family.) The continuance of this allowance will come up for review at the beginning of each year.

Proportionate payments are made at the end of each school term. In necessitous cases a month's payment in advance will be granted if application in writing is made to the Hon. the Minister for Education, and the parent or guardian enters into a bond, on the prescribed form, to refund such advance should the scholar not satisfactorily complete the term for which the payment has been advanced.

APPENDIX II.

Scholarships tenable at District High Schools and at Narrogin School of Agriculture, or at any Government Technical School.

A number of scholarships, not less than 50, will be offered each year to enable children from country schools to attend at District High Schools, or at the Narrogin School of Agriculture, or any Government Technical School. The scholarships will each be of the value of £24 per annum, and are intended to assist in defraying the cost of boarding, and only those children are eligible whose homes are at such a distance from a High School or any Government Technical School that it is necessary for them to live away from home in order to attend and whose parents are in receipt of an income not exceeding £300 per annum, or alternatively, £50 for each dependent member of the family. (For the purpose of this calculation the parents will be included in computing the number in the family.) The continuance of this allowance will come up for review at the beginning of each year. Proportionate payments are made at the end of each school term. In necessitous cases a month's payment in advance will be granted if application in writing is made to the Hon. the Minister for Education and the parent or guardian enters into a bond, on the prescribed form, to refund such advance should the scholarship-holder not satisfactorily complete the term for which the payment has been advanced.

The scholarships held at District High Schools or at any Government Technical School will be tenable for three years in the first instance, but may be renewed for a further period of two years, if the industry and success of the scholar are considered to warrant such an extension. Scholars are expected to pass the "Junior" examination by the end of their third year. Scholarship-holders who have passed the "Junior" examination and who wish to take up Agricultural pursuits may have their scholarships renewed at the Muresk Agricultural College.

The candidates will be selected on the recommendations of the District Inspectors from children who will be over 12 years of age at the end of the year in which the scholarships are awarded, and who have satisfactorily completed the work of Class VI. If a boy thus selected is of good physique and is over 13½ years of age, he may elect to go to the Narrogin School of Agriculture instead of to a District High School.

Five scholarships at the Narrogin School of Agriculture will be offered annually for boys attending schools of classes not higher than Class VI. The boys must be of good physique and over 13½ years of age at the end of the year, and must have satisfactorily completed the work of Class VI.

The scholarships held at the Narrogin School of Agriculture will be of the years of £24 per annual.

The scholarships held at the Narrogin School of Agriculture will be of the value of £24 per annum; provided that the candidate's parents are in receipt of an income not exceeding £300 per annum, or, alternatively, £50 per annum for each dependent member of the family. (For the purpose of this calculation the parents will be included in computing the number in the family.) The continuance of this allowance will come up for review at the beginning of each year. The scholarships will be tenable in the first instance for two years. They may be renewed subsequently for those who take the course for the Diploma in Agriculture at the Muresk Agricultural College.

The awards will be made on the recommendations of the District Inspectors.

If an unfavourable report is received upon the work and progress of a scholarship-holder, or if at any time his conduct is disorderly or immoral, the scholarship may, at the discretion of the Minister, be forthwith cancelled.

APPENDIX III.

Scholarships for Children of Fallen or Disabled Soldiers.

- 1. Six places will be reserved annually in the Perth Modern School for children of fallen or disabled soldiers, provided that candidates of sufficient merit present themselves.
- 2. Four places will be reserved annually in the Eastern Goldfields High School for such children, provided that candidates of sufficient merit present themselves.
- 3. Ten scholarships will be given annually, tenable at any of the District High Schools, the Narrogin School of Agriculture, or at any Secondary School approved by the Department.

The children selected for any of these positions will, if they are obliged to live away from home in order to attend an approved school, receive an allowance of £24 per annum; provided that their parents are in receipt of an income not exceeding £300 per annum, or, alternatively, £50 per annum for each dependent member of the family. (For the purpose of this calculation, the parents will be included in computing the number in the family.) The continuance of this allowance will come up for review at the beginning of each year. Proportionate payments are made at the end of each school term. In necessitous cases a month's payment in advance will be granted if application in writing is made to the Hon. the Minister for Education and the parent or guardian enters into a bond, on the prescribed form, to refund such advance should the scholarship-holder not satisfactorily complete the term for which the payment has been advanced. If scholarship-holders are not obliged to live away from home they will receive an allowance to cover the cost of books (not exceeding £3 per annum), and any necessary travelling expenses, if their homes are more than two miles from the school.

The scholarships, excepting those held at the Narrogin School of Agriculture, will be tenable for three years in the first instance, but may be renewed for a further period of two years if the industry and success of the scholar are considered to warrant such an extension. Scholars are expected to pass the ''Junior'' examination by the end of their third year. Their entrance fees on sitting for the ''Junior'' examination in their third year and for the ''Leaving'' examination in their fifth year, will be paid by the Department. Scholarship-holders who have passed the ''Junior'' examination and who wish to take up Agricultural pursuits may have their scholarships renewed at the Muresk Agricultural College.

Candidates for any of these scholarships must have passed the sixth class in a State school or an equivalent standard in any other efficient school. For the High Schools, candidates should sit for the examination held in the year in which they attain their twelfth birthday. (This clause of the Regulation will take effect as from the first day of January, 1938.) The candidates for the Narrogin School of Agriculture should not be less than 13½ nor more than 15 years of age. Scholarships at the Narrogin School of Agriculture will be of the value of £24 per annum, and only those candidates are eligible whose parents are in receipt of an income not exceeding £300 per annum, or, alternatively, £50 per annum for each dependent member of the family. (For the purpose of this calculation the parents will be included in computing the number in the family.) The scholarships at the Narrogin School of Agriculture are tenable in the first instance for two years. They may be renewed subsequently for those who take the course for the Diploma in Agriculture at the Muresk Agricultural College.

Candidates for the scholarships mentioned in sections one and two should sit for the examination for Secondary School Scholarships. Candidates for the scholarships mentioned in section three, if they are at a school in a town, should also sit for this examination. If they are in small country schools they should apply to the Department as early as possible, so that arangements may be made for a special report upon them when an inspector visits the district.

University, Technical College, and School of Mines, and Teachers' College.

4. Six scholarships are offered to children of fallen or disabled soldiers, tenable at the University of Western Australia, or at the Technical College, Perth, or at the School of Mines, Kalgoorlie, or at the Teachers' College, Claremont. The conditions governing these scholarships are as follows:—

University.

The scholarships at the University are offered on the result of the "Leaving" certificate examination.

The scholarships are each of the value of £24 per annum and are tenable for three years. Payment of the scholarship will only be made where the income of the parents is less than £300 per annum, or, alternatively, £50 per annum for each dependent member of the family. (For the purpose of this calculation the parents will be included in computing the number in the family.) The continuance of this allowance will come up for review at the beginning of each year; proportionate payments are made at the end of each term. In necessitous cases a month's payment in advance will be granted if application in writing is made to the Hon. the Minister for Education and the parent or guardian enters into a bond, on the prescribed form, to refund such advance should the scholarship-holder not satisfactorily complete the term for which the payment has been advanced.

Applications should be made before the end of October through the Soldiers' Children's Scholarship Trust.

Technical College and School of Mines.

Candidates should be over 14 years and under 17 years of age on the 1st February of the year in which the winners will enter the schools.

The scholarships are each of the value of £24 per annum and are tenable for three years. Payment of the scholarships will only be made where the income of the parents is less than £300 per annum, or, alternatively, £50 per annum for each dependent member of the family. (For the purpose of this calculation the parents will be included in computing the number in the family.) The continuance of the allowance will come up for review at the beginning of each year. Proportionate payments are made at the end of each school term. In necessitous cases a month's payment in advance will be granted, if application in writing is made to the Hon. the Minister for Education and the parent or guardian enters into a bond, on the prescribed form, to refund such advance should the scholarship-holder not satisfactorily complete the term for which the payment has been advanced.

An examination will be held in English, Mathematics, History and Geography as prescribed for Class III. in Central schools. Candidates will also be required to submit evidence from their schools showing that they have satisfactorily completed a course in Science and in Drawing.

Holders of scholarships at the Perth Technical College will have the option of taking a course in Engineering or a course in Industrial Chemistry.

Applications should be made, before the end of October, through the Soldiers' Children's Scholarship Trust.

Teachers' College.

The scholarships at the Teachers' College are each of the value of £24 per annum, and are tenable for six months or twelve months, according to the course being taken by the scholarship-holder. Payment of the scholarship will only be made where the income of the parents is less than £300 per annum, or, alternatively, £50 per annum for each dependent member of the family. (For the purpose of this calculation the parents will be included in computing the number in the family.) Only candidates who have been selected in the usual way for admission to the College are eligible for these scholarships. Proportionate payments are made at the end of each term. In necessitous cases a month's payment in advance will be granted if applieation in writing is made to the Hon, the Minister for Education and the parent or guardian enters into a bond, on the prescribed form, to refund such advance should the scholarship-holder not satisfactorily complete the term for which the payment has been advanced.

Applications should be made, before the end of October, through the Soldiers' Children's Scholarship Trust.
