WHEREAS by Section 33 of "The Land Act, 1933-1934," it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any Reserve shall vest in and be held by any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of subleasing: And whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserves 2110 and 2111, at Kelmscott, should vest in and be held by the Armadale-Kelmscott Road Board in trust for Recreation and Camping: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned Reserve shall vest in and be held by the Armadale-Kelmscott Road Board in trust for Recreation and Camping, with power to the said Armadale-Kelmscott Road Board to lease the whole or any portion of the said Reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one years from the date of the lease, subject to the Governor's approval.

The Land Act, 1933, and The Forests Act, 1918.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS in certain leases of land heretofore issued by the Crown under the provisions of "The Land Act, 1933," and the Acts thereby repealed, and in certain leases hereafter to be issued by the Crown under the provisions of the said Act and amendments thereof, it is or will be provided that, subject to the express terms of each reservation as contained in the instrument of lease, all marketable timber upon the land comprised in the lease granted by such lease instrument is reserved to the Crown: And whereas it is deemed advisable and expedient to appoint the Conservator of Forests for the time being and from time to time the agent of the Crown with authority for and on behalf of the Crown to do all such acts, matters, and things as may be necessary or convenient for the exercise by and enjoyment of the Crown of all the rights, privileges, benefits, powers, and authorities in relation to the marketable timber upon the land comprised in any lease reserved to the Crown under and in accordance with the express reservation in that behalf contained in the instrument of lease in which such land is comprised. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of all the powers in this behalf enabling him, doth hereby appoint the Conservator of Forests, the body corporate constituted under and for the purposes of "The Forests Act, 1918," to be the agent of the Crown, with authority for and on behalf of the Crown at all times and at any time as and whenever he shall think fit to do or cause or permit to be done all such acts, matters, and things as may be necessary or convenient to be done for the purpose of the exercise by and the enjoyment of the Crown of all or any of the rights, privileges, benefits, powers, and authorities reserved to the Crown in relation to the marketable timber upon the land comprised in any lease now or hereafter issued by the Crown under the

provisions of "The Land Act, 1933," or of any Act provisions or "The Land Act, 1933," or of any Act repealed thereby, or of any amendment of the said Act, under the express reservation to the Crown in relation to such marketable timber as contained in the instrument of lease of the said land, but so that any such acts, matters, and things done or purporting to be done under the authority hereby conferred shall be only those acts, matters, and things which was the land of the said land. those acts, matters, and things which may be done under and in accordance with the terms of the express reservation which is relevant and material to the doing of the particular act, matter, or thing done or proposed to be done; and also Bis Excellency the Lieutenaut-Governor doth hereby declare that for the purpose of enabling the Conservator of Forests more conveniently to exercise the authority as agent of the Crown hereby conferred upon him as aforesaid the Conservator may, instead of acting personally, but subject to the express instead of acting personally, but subject to the express terms of the reservation contained in the relevant and material instrument of lease, grant in accordance with the provisions of "The Forests Act, 1918," to any person or persons a permit or license to do upon any land comprised in any lease aforesaid in relation to marketable timber thereon any act, matter, or thing which the Conservator of Forests is as the agent of the Crayra hereby authorised to do in everying of the which the Conservator of Forests is as the agent of the Crown hereby authorised to do in exercise of the reservation to the Crown contained in the instrument of lease of such land: And, further, that the appoint-ment hereby made and the authority hereby conferred upon the Conservator of Forests shall continue and remain in force until this Order in Council is revoked.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 2065/35.

WHEREAS by "The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909," it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct and extend water works, sewerage works, and stormwater drainage works: And whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with and plans, sections and estimates in request of the and plans, sections, and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewer-

hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—
Metropolitan Water Supply Improvement:—Claremont Municipality, Peppermint Grove Road District, and Cottesloe Municipality.—Thirty-inch diameter water main in Stirling highway from Anstey street to Johnston street, with valves and all necessary apparatus (length about, one mile) and the lifting of the existing (length about one mile) and the lifting of the existing 24-inch diameter main, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 5678. This Order in Council shall take effect from the 22nd

day of May, 1936.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by "The Water Boards Act, 1904," and "The Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912," the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to constitute the District of a Local Authority or two to constitute the District of a Local Authority or two or more Local Authorities or any part or parts of such District or Districts a Water Area, under such name as may be directed: And whereas, under the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor may authorise the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to exercise within a Water Area all the functions of a Water Board: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute an area, having the boundaries described in the Schedule hereunder, a Water Area for the purpose of the said Acts, under the name of the Reedy Water Area, and does hereby appoint the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage to exercise all the functions of a Water Board under the Acts in such area. Acts in such area.

This Order in Council shall take effect on the 22nd day of May, 1936.

SCHEDULE.

All the land included in the area bounded by lines commencing at the north-west corner of Lot 1 of Reedy Townsite and proceeding along the Townsite boundary northwards, eastwards, southwards, and westwards to the south-east corner of Lot 1; thence northwards and westwards along the boundary of the said Lot 1 to the point of commencement.

Also a strip of land of a length of approximately 4,000 feet and of a width of 25 links on each side of a pipe line to be constructed from the Triton Gold Mine Tanks to the Townsite boundary on the western end of Vail street; all as shown outlined red on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 28107.

THE TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-1931. Woodanilling Road Board. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following Order under the authority of Section 43 of "The Traffic Act, 1919-1931," namely, that in pursuance of the provisions of Clause (j) of paragraph (i) of Subsection (1) of Section 41 of the said Act, the Woodanilling Road Board is hereby empowered to make Ry-laws to regulate the manner in which horses to make By-laws to regulate the manner in which horses or other animals in teams shall be driven, yoked, or harnessed.

The Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1935. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 35 of "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1935," that the Governor may make Regulations prescribing all matters which by this Act are required or permitted to be prescribed, or which it may be necessary or convenient to prescribe for giving effect to this Act: And whereas by Orders in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of September, 1921, and the 24th day of October, 1930, the Governor made Regulations under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to amend the said Regulations as made and published in the Government Gazette as aforesaid by the addition thereto of a further Regulaand the addition thereto of a further Regulation as set forth in the Schedule hereunder: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act, doth hereby amend the Regulations made and published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of September, 1921 (as amended by Order in Council made and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 24th day of October, 1930), by inserting therein after Regulation 48A a further Regulation, as set out in the Schedule hereunder.

SCHEDULE.

A Regulation, to stand as Regulation 48B, is inserted after Regulation 48A of the Regulations made and published in the Government Gazette on the 16th day of September, 1921 (as amended by Order in Council made and published in the Government Gazette on the 24th day of October, 1930), as follows:—

48B. The occupier of any land on which the tobacco plant has been grown shall, not later than the 30th day of May in every year, gather and effectively destroy by fire all tobacco plants and parts thereof, and the roots and waste products of all such plants then being on or upon such land or in any place under his control. Provided that this Regulation shall not apply to the leaves of tobacco plants which have been gathered and retained for curing, or to the seeds of tobacco plants which have been harvested.

The Agricultural Products Act, 1929. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 9 of "The Agricultural Products Act, 1929," that the Governor may make Regulations, not inconsistent with the said Act, prescribing all such matters as by this Act are required or permitted to be prescribed, or as may be necessary or convenient to be prescribed for giving effect to this Act: And whereas the Governor in exercise of the said power made certain Regulations in relation to eggs under and for the purposes of the said Act, which were published in the Government Gazette on the 3rd day of July, 1931: And whereas it is now deemed expedien to amend Regulation 11 of the said Regulations: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, doth hereby amend Regulation 11 of the said Regulations in the manner set forth in the Schedule herea.

THE SCHEDULL

Regulation 11 of the said Regulations is inserted in 11 a the cost, as follows:-

11. Every package containing eggs which are not graded or not clean shall have marked thereon in a plain and conspicuous manner the words "for repacking" or "for cleaning" (as the case may require), and also the date of the packing of such package and the signature in full of the person consigning or delivering the same; and before the eggs contained in such package are sold or offered for sale, the same shall be graded or cleaned (as the case may require) and be repacked by the person selling or offering such eggs for sale.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934," which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer, but not beyond judgment.

GREETING:

First Assignment.—Know Ye, that We have assigned you and each and every of you, to be Our Justices to keep Our Peace in Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, either alone or with any one or more of Our Justices that hereafter shall be appointed in Our said State and its Dependencies, and to keep and cause to be kept all laws, for the preservation of the Peace, and for the quiet rule and good government of Our people, in Our said State and its Dependencies according to the form and effect of the same, and to punish all persons offending against them, or any of them, in the said State and its Dependencies, as by the said laws is provided, and to cause to come before you all persons within Our said State and its Dependencies who use threats to any of Our People, to find security for keeping the peace or for their good behaviour towards Us and Our People: And if they refuse to find such security, then to cause them to be safely kept until they find such security.

Second Assignment.—We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to inquire the truth concerning all manner of crimes, misdemeanours, and offences, concerning which Our Justices of the Peace may lawfully or ought to inquire by whomsoever and in what manner soever done, perpetrated, or attempted in Our said State and its Dependencies: And upon all complaints before you to issue such process against the persons charged until they are taken or surrender themselves, as may by law be issued.

Third Assignment.—We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to have, exercise, and discharge all other the powers, authorities, and duties which under or by virtue of any law of Our Realm or of Our said State belong or appertain to the office of Justice of the Peace in or for Our said State.

And therefore We command you and each and every of you that you diligently apply yourselves to keep and cause to be kept the peace and all laws of Our Realm and of Our said State, and that at certain days and places duly appointed for these purposes, you make inquiries into the premises, and hear and determine all and singular the matters aforesaid, and perform and fulfil the duties aforesaid, doing therein what is just according to the laws of Our Realm and of Our said State: And we command Our Sheriff and other officers of Our said State to aid you by all lawful means in the performance and due execution of the premises.

In testimony whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Our said State to be hereunto affixed.

Witness our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir James Mitchell, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Our Lieutenant-Governor in and over Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, at Perth, this thirteenth day of May, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six.

GREETING:

First Assignment.—Know Ye, that We have assigned you, and each and every of you, to be Our Justices to keep Our Peace in Our State of Western Australia in the Magisterial Districts hereinbefore indicated, either alone or with any one or more of Our Justices that hereafter shall be appointed in the said Districts, and to keep and cause to be kept all laws, for the preservation of the Peace, and for the quiet rule and good government of Our people in the said Districts according to the form and effect of the same, and to punish all persons offending against them, or any of them, in the said Districts, as by the said laws is provided, and to cause to come before you all persons within the said Districts who use threats to any of Our People, to find security for keeping the peace or for their good behaviour towards Us and Our People: And if they refuse to find such security, then to cause them to be safely kept until they find such security.

Second Assignment.—We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to inquire the truth concerning all manner of crimes, misdemeanours, and offences, concerning which Our Justices of the Peace may lawfully or ought to in-

quire by whomsoever and in what manner soever done, perpetrated, or attempted in the said Districts: And upon all complaints before you to issue such process against the person charged until they are taken or surrender themselves as may by law be issued.

Third Assignment.-We have also assigned you, and each and every of you, either alone or with any one or more of such Justices to be appointed as aforesaid, to have, exercise, and discharge all other the powers, authorities, and duties which under or by virtue of any law of Our Realm or of Our said State belong or appertain to the office of Justice of the Peace in or for Our said State.

And therefore We command you and each and every of you that you diligently apply yourselves to keep and cause to be kept the peace and all laws of Our Realm and of Our said State, and that at certain days and places duly appointed for these purposes, you make inquiries into the premises, and hear and determine all and singular the matters aforesaid, and perform and fulfil the duties aforesaid, doing therein what is just according to the laws of Our Realm and of Our said State: And we command Our Sheriff and other officers of Our said State to aid you by all lawful means in the performance and due execution of the premises.

In testimony whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of Our said State to be hereunto affixed.

Witness our Trusty and Well-beloved Sir James Mitchell, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Our Lieutenant-Governor in and over Our State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, at Perth, this thirteenth day of May, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six.

CUE-DAY DAWN PUBLIC CEMETERY—BY-LAWS.

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Cue Road Board as Trustees of the Cue-Day Dawn Public Cemetery, Reserve No. 2528, the said Trustees make the following By-laws and all By-laws previously gazetted are hereby repealed:-

- 1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees as set forth in the Schedule A shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.
- 2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make application to the Trustees. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall

cause to be issued to the person so applying an order for burial as set forth in Schedule D.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at least eight working hours prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for application within such time. No free interment shall be allowed, unless the application, together with the Justice's order therefor, be handed in in such time as to allow of at least eight working hours as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be reopened as and when required

and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the grave-

digger. 6. Every grave shall be at least six feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than four feet six inches from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

7. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

8. No burial shall be permitted to take place in the Cemetery without an order for burial being obtained from the secretary in the form of Schedule C.

- The hours for burial shall be as follows:-On 9. week days, September to April, inclusive, 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.; May to August, inclusive, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.; on Sundays, throughout the year from 9 to 10 a.m. and from 12 noon to 5 p.m.; and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour, except by written permission of the Trustees.

 10. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time
- at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.
- 11. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the Cemetery or proceed except by such roads as directed by the officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions commits an

offence against these By-laws.

12. Children under the age of 14 years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

13. It shall be unlawful for any person to smoke

- within the Cemetery or to discharge any fireworks therein.
- 14. No dogs shall be allowed within the Cemetery, and any person taking a dog into the Cemetery commits an offence against these By-laws.
- an offence against these By-laws.

 15. Any person violating the rules or propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, commits an offence against these By-laws.

 16. No person shall promote or advertise or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever whatsoever.
- 17. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees; and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.
- 18. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein.
- 19. Subject to the By-laws the superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.
- 20. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof: or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form B in the Schedule.
- 21. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid the Trustees may, when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form B in the Schedule.

Every "Grant" shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed, unless upon production of the "Order for Burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the

23. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

24. If application be made for an "Order for Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom grant was issued, or his registered assigns, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assigns shall be produced.

25. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure on any part of the Cemetery, or construct a brick grave or vault, must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of "The Cemeteries

Act, 1897.

- 26. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.
- 27. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection.
- 28. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.
- 29. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing work within the Cemetery, deposit with the secretary to the Trustees the sum of twenty shillings (20s.), which shall be forfeited if either of the two last preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Trustees.
- 30. All materials required in the erection and conpletion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery, and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Trustees shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such material with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.
 - 31. No catacomb shall be allowed.
- 32. Where any person desires to exhume any corpse from any grave in the Cemetery, pursuant to an order obtained from the Governor under Section 41 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897," the following provisions shall apply and be observed, that is to say:-
 - (a) A written application, setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal of such corpse, and verified by a statutory declaration, shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased.
 - (b) If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second air-tight wooden or leaden coffin prior to removal.
 - (c) Grave to be filled in and all rubbish removed.
- 33. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Trustees, and shall obey such directions as they may find it necessary to give, and any workmen permitting any breach of these Regulations and By-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the Trustees, commits an offence against these By-laws.

34. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:-

- (a) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and, if placed on any adjoining ground, shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
- (b) No sand, soil, or learn shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Trustees.
- (c) The dressing of any graves, and the wheeling and carting of all material, shall be subject to the supervision of the Trustees.
- (d) Work in all cases shall be carried on with due despatch and only during regulation hours.

- Prior to the conducting of any interment within the Cemetery, or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall apply to the Trustees for an annual permit, and shall at the time of making application give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem it fit to impose. Upon such assent being given, he shall receive a "Permit," to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of July following, and, unless in the possession of such a "Permit," no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.
- 36. Any person committing any breach of these Bylaws and Regulations, or of any other Rules, Regulations or By-laws lawfully made under authority of any Act relating to Cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and in the case of a continuing breach, a further sum not exceeding £1 for every day during which such breach continues, and shall forthwith be removed from the Cemetery by the Trustees, and shall be treated as a trespasser, and may be proceeded against accordingly.
- 37. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation, and number of grave, and a Register of all Certificates of Right of Burial, shall be kept at the office.
- Any person who commits a breach of or an offence against any By-law may be expelled from the Cemetery.

THE ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1934.

By-laws to control Camping in Black Range Road District.

P.W. 5195/21.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934," the Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the said Act, the Black Range Road Board doth, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every power enabling it in this behalf, hereby make the following By-laws:-

(1)—Camping.

No person shall, except as hereinafter provided, camp, lodge, or tarry overnight on any Crown lands or reserves, nor frequent any Crown lands or reserve for the purpose of camping, lodging, or tarrying overnight

(2)—Permits for Camping.

Notwithstanding the provisions of Clause (1), camping may be permitted in areas set apart for the purpose by the Road Board, but not elsewhere, upon the issue of a permission by an inspector or ranger appointed by the Road Board, and subject to the follow-

ing conditions:—

The Board may at any time make and declare a schedule of charges and issue permits to persons desir-

ous of camping on any such area;

(a) No person shall sublet any camp, or sell, give or otherwise dispose of any permit to any person;
(b) No person shall cut or otherwise destroy any

- trees or shrubs within the camping area, excepting only by permission of the inspector or ranger for clearing those areas actually required for erecting camps thereon;
- (c) Campers must keep the area covered by their permit in a clean and sanitary condition at all times. All rubbish capable of destruction by fire shall be burned by the occupier in the approved fireplace, and all other rubbish shall be placed in the receptacles provided for that purpose;

(d) All campers must use the sanitary conveniences provided, and in no circumstances will improvised conveniences on individual camping sites be permitted;

(e) Camping permits may at any time be withdrawn by the Inspector if in his opinion a breach of these By-

by the Inspector if in his opinion a breach of these By-laws has been committed, or if in his opinion it is desirable that the permit shall be terminated. In the event of termination hereunder the rental paid shall be forfeited to the Road Board, and no compensa-tion shall be paid for loss. damage, or inconvenience suffered through the withdrawal of the permit; (f) Subject to the right of the inspector and the officers and employees of the Road Board, or any per-son acting under their instructions, or any police offi-cer, to enter any camping site at any time, no persons cer, to enter any camping site at any time, no persons shall enter into or remain within such camping site, ex-

cept with the permission of the holder of the permit.

(g) No fires shall be lighted on any camping area, except in places approved by the Inspector.

(3)—Penalty.

For every offence against the provisions of these Bylaws, the offender shall upon conviction before any one or more Justices of the Peace forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

Schedule of Fees.

For each private camping site (33ft. x 69ft.), one shilling per week or portion of a week, for every two adults accommodated.

APPENDIX I.

Secondary School Scholarships and Admission to Perth Modern School and other Government High Schools.

Secondary School Scholarships.

- 1. Scholarships not exceeding 50 in each year are annually offered for boys or girls attending Government or other efficient schools. The scholarships will entitle the holders to receive a grant to defray the necessary expenses incurred in the provision of books, provided that no such grants shall exceed £3 per annum, and to have their entrance fees paid by the Department on sitting for the "Junior" examination in the third year and for the "Leaving" examination in the fifth year of their scholarships. Scholarship-holders living at home may also receive a grant to defray their necessary travelling expenses, provided that their homes are at a greater distance than two miles from the school. The winners of these scholarships must attend Secondary Schools approved by the Department. If the winner of a scholarship resides at such a distance from all the approved schools that it is necessary for him to become a boarder, or to live away from home, an additional allowance of £24 per annum will be given; provided that his parents are in receipt of an income not exceeding £300 per annum, or, alternatively, £50 for each dependent member of the family. (For the purpose of this calculation, the parents will be included in computing the number in the family.) The continuance of this allowance will come up for review at the beginning of each year. Proportionate payments are made at the end of each school term. In necessitous cases a menth's payment in advance will be granted, if application in writing is made to the Hon. the Minister for Education and the parent or guardian enters into a bond, on the prescribed form, to refund such advance should the scholarship-holder not satisfactorily complete the term for which the payment has been advanced.
- 2. The Scholarships will be tenable for three years in the first instance, but may be renewed for a further period of two years, if the industry and success of the scholar are considered to warrant such an extension. Scholars are expected to pass the "Junior" examination by the end of their third year.

Those who have passed the "Junior" examination and who wish to take up agricultural pursuits may have their scholarships renewed at the Muresk Agricultural College.

- 3. A candidate for these scholarships must-
 - (a) sit for the examination held in the year in which he or she attains his or her twelfth birthday. (This clause of the Regulations will take effect as from the first day of January, 1938.)
 - (b) produce a certificate of industry and good conduct from the head teacher of the school now being attended.
- 4. The scholarships are awarded upon a competitive examination conducted by the Education Department.
- 5. A number of scholarships, not exceeding one-fifth of the total number offered, will be reserved for pupils from country schools, provided that candidates of sufficient merit present themselves. A school with not more than four teachers and not within two miles of a school with more than four teachers shall be deemed a country school for the purposes of this section.
- 6. The conditions upon which the scholarships are tenable are:—
 - (a) that the successful scholar shall, at the commencement of the first term following the award of the scholarships, become a pupil

- at a Secondary School approved by the Minister. The Minister may require that the school be inspected.
- (b) that he shall continue to attend such school, and at the end of each term obtain from the authorities of the school and forward to the Education Department, a certificate stating that his conduct, progress, and attendance have been satisfactory. Full particulars of attendance, of success in study, and of promotion, if any, must be given. If an unfavourable report is received, or, if at any time his conduct be disorderly or immoral, the scholarship may at the discretion of the Minister, be forthwith cancelled.
- (c) payment will be made to the parent or guardian. The cost of the necessary books, up to £3, may be deducted and paid to the Principal of the School.
- 7. The examination will be on the following subjects:—
 - 1. English (300 marks).—The papers will be designed to test the candidate's powers of understanding the language and of using it freely and correctly.
 - 2. Arithmetic (200 marks).—The ordinary course of Arithmetic as prescribed for classes not higher than the sixth in State schools.

Candidates will be admitted only from schools which satisfy the Minister that they have provided a sufficiently full course of instruction in English, Arithmetic, History, Geography, Elementary Science, Drawing, and Physical Training. Schools which are not under the Department must submit in April of each year the curriculum and time-table for the class in which the candidates are included.

- 8. The examination will be held in such centres as shall be fixed annually by the Department.
- 9. Schools desiring to be included on the list of approved Secondary Schools at which these scholarships are tenable must apply to the Department for inclusion. The Minister must be satisfed that the school possesses suitable premises and equipment and is adequately staffed, and that it provides a five years' course of instruction beyond the primary stage, leading up to a standard not lower than that of the Leaving Certificate in such a number and range of subjects as the Minister may deem adequate.

Admission to Perth Modern School and other Government High Schools.

The examination for admission to the Perth Modern School and other Government High Schools will be identical with that for Secondary School scholarships. Candidates must sit for the examination held in the year in which they attain their twelfth birthday. (This clause of the Regulations will take effect as from the first day of January, 1938.)

The full course at these schools is for five years. Admission is for three years in the first instance, and may be renewed for a further period of two years, if the industry and success of the scholar are considered to warrant such an extension. Students are expected to pass the "Junior" examination by the end of their third year.

"Entrance" holders who have passed the "Junior" examination and who wish to take up Agricultural pursuits may have their "Entrances" renewed at the Muresk Agricultural College.

A candidate who succeeds in gaining admission by this examination may, if he resides at such a distance from an approved school that it is necessary for him to become a boarder, or live away from home, receive an allowance of £24 per annum; provided that his parents are in receipt of an income not exceeding £300 per annum, or, alternatively £50 for each dependent member of the family. (For the purpose of this calculation, the parents will be included in computing the number in the family.) The continuance of this allowance will come up for review at the beginning of each year.

Proportionate payments are made at the end of each school term. In necessitous cases a month's payment in

advance will be granted if application in writing is made to the Hon. the Minister for Education, and the parent or guardian enters into a bond, on the prescribed form, to refund such advance should the scholar not satisfactorily complete the term for which the payment has been advanced.

APPENDIX II.

Scholarships tenable at District High Schools and at Narrogin School of Agriculture, or at any Govcrnment Technical School.

A number of scholarships, not less than 50, will be offered each year to enable children from country schools to attend at District High Schools, or at the Narrogin School of Agriculture, or any Government Technical School. The scholarships will each be off the value of £24 per annum, and are intended to assist in defraying the cost of boarding, and only those children are eligible whose homes are at such a distance from a High School or any Government Technical School that it is necessary for them to live away from home in order to attend and whose parents are in receipt of an income not exceeding £300 per annum, or alternatively, £50 for each dependent member of the family. (For the purpose of this calculation the parents will be included in computing the number in the family.) The continuance of this allowance will come up for review at the beginning of each year. Proportionate payments are made at the end of each school term. In necessitous cases a month's payment in advance will be granted if application in writing is made to the Hon. the Minister for Education and the parent or guardian enters into a bond, on the prescribed form, to refund such advance should the scholarship-holder not satisfactorily complete the term for which the payment has been advanced.

The scholarships held at District High Schools or at any Government Technical School will be tenable for three years in the first instance, but may be renewed for a further period of two years, if the industry and success of the scholar are considered to warrant such an extension. Scholars are expected to pass the "Junior" examination by the end of their third year. Scholarship-holders who have passed the "Junior" examination and who wish to take up Agricultural pursuits may have their scholarships renewed at the Muresk Agricultural College.

The candidates will be selected on the recommendations of the District Inspectors from children who will be over 12 years of age at the end of the year in which the scholarships are awarded, and who have satisfactorily completed the work of Class VI. If a boy thus selected is of good physique and is over 13½ years of age, he may elect to go to the Narrogin School of Agriculture instead of to a District High School.

Five scholarships at the Narrogin School of Agriculture will be offered annually for boys attending schools of classes not higher than Class VI. The boys must be of good physique and over 13½ years of age at the end of the year, and must have satisfactorily completed the work of Class VI.

The scholarships held at the Narrogin School of Agriculture will be of the value of £24 per annum; provided that the candidate's parents are in receipt of an income not exceeding £300 per annum, or, alternatively, £50 per annum for each dependent member of the family. (For the purpose of this calculation the parents will be included in computing the number in the family.) The continuance of this allowance will come up for review at the beginning of each year. The scholarships will be tenable in the first instance for two years. They may be renewed subsequently for those who take the course for the Diploma in Agriculture at the Muresk Agricultural College.

The awards will be made on the recommendations of the District Inspectors.

If an unfavourable report is received upon the work and progress of a scholarship-holder, or if at any time his conduct is disorderly or immoral, the scholarship may, at the discretion of the Minister, be forthwith cancelled.

APPENDIX III.

Scholarships for Children of Fallen or Disabled Soldiers.

- 1. Six places will be reserved annually in the Perth Modern School for children of fallen or disabled soldiers, provided that candidates of sufficient merit present themselves.
- 2. Four places will be reserved annually in the Eastern Goldfields High School for such children, provided that candidates of sufficient merit present themselves.
- 3. Ten scholarships will be given annually, tenable at any of the District High Schools, the Narrogin School of Agriculture, or at any Secondary School approved by the Department.

The children selected for any of these positions will, if they are obliged to live away from home in order to attend an approved school, receive an allowance of £24 per annum; provided that their parents are in receipt of an income not exceeding £300 per annum, or, alternatively, £50 per annum for each dependent member of the family. (For the purpose of this calculation, the parents will be included in computing the number in the family.) The continuance of this allowance will come up for review at the beginning of each year. Proportionate payments are made at the end of each school term. In necessitous cases a month's payment in advance will be granted if application in writing is made to the Hon. the Minister for Education and the parent or guardian enters into a bond, on the prescribed form, to refund such advance should the scholarship-holder not satisfactorily complete the term for which the payment has been advanced. If scholarship-holders are not obliged to live away from home they will receive an allowance to cover the cost of books (not exceeding £3 per annum), and any necessary travelling expenses, if their homes are more than two miles from the school.

The scholarships, excepting those held at the Narrogin School of Agriculture, will be tenable for three years in the first instance, but may be renewed for a further period of two years if the industry and success of the scholar are considered to warrant such an extension. Scholars are expected to pass the "Junior" examination by the end of their third year. Their entrance fees on sitting for the "Junior" examination in their third year and for the "Leaving" examination in their fifth year, will be paid by the Department. Scholarship-holders who have passed the "Junior" examination and who wish to take up Agricultural pursuits may have their scholarships renewed at the Muresk Agricultural College.

Candidates for any of these scholarships must have passed the sixth class in a State school or an equivalent standard in any other efficient school. High Schools, candidates should sit for the examination held in the year in which they attain their twelfth birthday. (This clause of the Regulation will take birthday. effect as from the first day of January, 1938.) candidates for the Narrogin School of Agriculture should not be less than 131/2 nor more than 15 years of Scholarships at the Narrogin School of Agriculture will be of the value of £24 per annum, and only those candidates are eligible whose parents are in receipt of an income not exceeding £300 per annum, or, alternatively, £50 per annum for each dependent member of the family. (For the purpose of this calculation the parents will be included in computing the number in the family.) The scholarships at the Narrogin School of Agriculture are tenable in the first instance for two years. They may be renewed subsequently for those who take the course for the Diploma in Agriculture at the Muresk Agricultural College.

Candidates for the scholarships mentioned in sections one and two should sit for the examination for Secondary School Scholarships. Candidates for the scholarships mentioned in section three, if they are at a school in a town, should also sit for this examination. If they are in small country schools they should apply to the Department as early as possible, so that arangements may be made for a special report upon them when an inspector visits the district.

University, Technical College, and School of Mines, and Teachers' College.

In necessitous cases a month's payment in advance will be granted if application in writing is made to the Hon. the Minister for Education and the parent or guardian enters into a bond, on the prescribed form, to refund such advance should the scholarship-holder not satisfactorily complete the term for which the payment has been advanced.

Applications should be made before the end of October through the Soldiers' Children's Scholarship Trust.

Technical College and School of Mines.

Candidates should be over 14 years and under 17 years of age on the 1st February of the year in which the winners will enter the schools.

The scholarships are each of the value of £24 per anrine senotarsings are each of the value of £24 per annum and are tenable for three years. Payment of the scholarships will only be made where the income of the parents is less than £300 per annum, or, alternatively, £50 per annum for each dependent member of the family. Teachers' College.

The scholarships at the Teachers' College are each of the value of £24 per annum, and are tenable for six months or twelve months, according to the course being taken by the scholarship-holder. Payment of the scholarship will only be made where the income of the parents is less than £300 per annum, or, alternatively, £50 per annum for each dependent member of the family.
