WHEREAS it is enacted by "The Explosives Act, 1895," amongst other things that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, or repeal By-laws and Regulations under and for any of the purposes in the said Act mentioned and provided for: And whereas by an Order in Council made the 20th day of July, 1904, the Governor made Regulations under and for the purposes of the said Act inter alia relating to the carriage of explosives: And whereas it is also enacted by Section 30 of the said Act that the Minister may from time to time make, alter, and repeal By-laws for regulating the conveyance, loading, and unloading of gunpowder, and the Minister, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said section, has recently made Bylaws relating to the conveyance, loading, and unloading of gunpowder, which were published in the Government Gazette on the 6th day of March, 1936: And whereas, in view of the last-mentioned By-laws, the said By-laws relating to the carriage of explosives heretofore made by the Governor as aforesaid are no longer necessary: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the said Act, doth hereby repeal those By-laws, being By-laws 12 to 18, both inclusive, relating to the carriage of explosives as contained in Part 2 of the Bylaws heretofore made by the Governor in Council by Order in Council dated the 20th day of July, 1904, as aforesaid.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1911-35.

Resolution. P.H. 2373/21; Ex. Co. No. 987.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-35," a Local Health Authority may make By-laws, and may amend, repeal, or alter any By-laws so made: Now, therefore, the Bunbury Municipal Council, being a Local Health Authority, doth hereby repeal the Bylaws published in the Government Gazette on the 12th day of March, 1920: And whereas by Section 295 of "The Health Act, 1911-35," it is provided that the Governor may cause to be prepared Model By-laws for all or any of the purposes for which By-laws may be made by a Local Authority under any of the provisions of the said Act, and that a Local Authority may, of its own motion, by resolution, adopt the whole or any por-tion of such By-laws: And whereas Model By-laws have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of the said section and published in the Government Gazette on the 8th day of April, 1927: Now, therefore, it is re-solved and determined by the Bunbury Municipal Council, being a Local Health Authority within the meaning of the said Act, that the whole of such Model By-laws be adopted for the Health District of Bunbury, with the following additions and substitutions :-

BY-LAW 29 of PART 1.

Keeping of Poultry or Pigeons.

(a) The occupier of any premises shall not keep any poultry or pigeons, except for the purpose of immediace sale, expect under the following conditions :-

(b) The occupier of any premises shall not keep any pigeons or poultry within 20 feet of any dwelling-house or within 30 feet of any roadway, and, where pigeons and poultry are kept, they shall be continually confined in the enclosure or other place set apart for them.

(c) All enclosures or cages within which birds of any description are kept shall be maintained at all times in a clean condition, and shall at any time be cleansed, disinfected, or otherwise dealt with as an Inspector may direct.

(d) The occupier of any premises whereon any other animals are kept shall at all times maintain all enclosures or structures of any description, wherein such animals are confined, in a clean condition, and at any time when so directed by an inspector shall immediately cleanse and disinfect any such enclosure or structure.

BY-LAW 5 OF PART V.

(a) The Local Authority shall issue to every keeper of a lodging-house a certificate in respect of each separthe maximum number of lodgers which shall be permitted to occupy each such room or balcony respectively

(b) The Local Authority may from time to time vary the number of lodgers to be received into any such room or balcony, and a notice shall be served on the keeper of such lodging-house specifying such varied number of lodgers, and such keeper shall not allow a greater number of lodgers into such room or balcony than is specified on such notice, after the time stated thereon.

(c) The certificates and notices to be given under the provisions of this By-law shall be in the form of Sche-dules "D" and "E" respectively. (d) Where beds are required on balconies there shall

be a clear space on each side of the beds of at least two feet.

(e) Where beds are used for sleeping out on balconies, a proper and sufficient dressing room shall be provided to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector.

BY-LAW 16 OF PART VII.

(a) No person shall apply arsenic or lead, either as a spray or powder, or in any other form whatsoever to cabbage, cauliflower, or any other plant of the Brassica family, within four weeks of cutting for sale.

No person shall sell or attempt to sell or receive for sale, or have in possession for sale, expose, send, forward, or deliver for sale any cabbage, cauliflower, or any other plant of the Brassica family which has adhering to it or upon any part of it any arsenic or lead or any other poisonous or deleterious substance of any kind whatsoever.

No person shall sell or attempt to sell, or receive for sale, or have in possession for sale, expose, send, forward, or deliver for sale any fruit of any kind whatsoever which has adhering to it or upon it any arsenic or lead.

No person shall send any fruit or any vegetable to market for sale unless and until it is clean and free from any spray residue or any other foreign substance which is deleterious, objectionable, or injurious to health.

BY-LAW 20 OF PART VII.

Transport.

(a) Every person engaged in selling or carrying food shall cause all tood in course of delivery or transport not otherwise packed to be protected as far as prac-ticable from contamination: Provided that nothing but new clean white or brown paper shall be used as a wrapping for meat, fish, or bread.

(b) No such person shall permit any vehicle used in the transport or carriage of food to be used also for the transport of offensive material.

(c) Every such person shall cause all such vehicles when not in use for the carriage or transport of food to be so placed as not to be liable to contamination.

(d) No person engaged in transporting or carrying food shall sit upon such food.

(e) Every person engaged in selling or carrying bread shall cause all bread in course of transport to be carried in weatherproof covered vehicles or containers constructed in such a manner as to thoroughly protect such bread from flies and dust.

Amendment of Health By-laws.

P.H. 2565/18; Ex. Co. No. 984.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Health Act, 1911-1933,'' a Local Authority may make, repeal, and amend By-laws: Now, therefore, the Council of the City of Perth, being the Local Authority for the Municipal District of Perth, doth order that the Health By-laws be amended as follows:

1. Paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), and (e) of Sub-clause (ii) of Clause 29 of Part VI. are deleted. 2. The following new paragraphs are substituted in

lieu thereof :-

- (a) Every vehicle used in the transport of meat (excepting butchers' delivery vehicles used for delivery of cut joints to householders, and vehicles used by the producer for the conveyance of carcase meat to the Metropolitan Markets, West Perth) shall conform with the following :-
 - The vehicle shall be completely enclosed so as to protect the meat from the weather, and from flies and dust;
 - The vehicle shall be constructed of wood or approved metal, and all internal surfaces shall be finished to a smooth surface;

- The vehicle shall be properly ventilated; The vehicle shall be provided with rails and hooks secured to the upper portion thereof, and shall be of ample proportions so that meat hung on such hooks shall be clear of the floor;
- No meat (except edible offal) shall be placed on the floor of the vehicle;
- Edible offal when carried on the floor shall be contained in impervious containers;
- The vehicle, edible offal containers, hooks, and rails shall at all times be kept in a thoroughly clean condition.

(b) No vehicle used for the transport of meat shall be used at any time for the transport of any offensive matter.

(c) No meat shall be carried on any railway, except in trucks provided for that purpose, or unless such meat is hung on hooks and is clear of the floor. (d) Any person engaged or employed in the trans-

port or delivery of carcase meat shall at all times when so engaged wear a cap with a detachable covering made of durable washing material and an overall coat of durable washable material, which shall completely cover his clothes. He shall cause such cap covering and overall to be kept at all times in a thoroughly clean condition.

(e) Butchers' delivery vehicles shall be completely enclosed to protect the meat from the weather, flies, and The vehicle shall be constructed of wood or apdust. proved metal, and all internal portions finished to a smooth surface. They shall be properly ventilated. The floor of such vehicles shall be constructed of or completely covered with a smooth impervious material. (f) Butchers' cutting carts shall be constructed in a

similar manner as specified for butchers' delivery carts, but shall be of ample dimensions, to permit all carcase meat to be hung on hooks affixed to the roof of such vehicle. All carcase meat shall be hung on such hooks in such manner that the meat is clear of the floor. Carcase meat in this clause shall mean any quarter or more of any carcase.

"5. Hours.

Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work. Such hours shall be worked as follows, namely:—On the first five (5) days of the working week between the hours of 7.30 a.m. and 5 p.m., with an interval of not more than sixty (60) minutes for lunch, and on Saturday between 7 o'clock a.m. and 12 noon."

Clause 6-Overtime:

Omit this clause and insert the following in lieu thereof:—

"6. Overtime:---

(a) All work performed after the usual time for ceasing duty shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter. Any worker who is called upon to work overtime for more than two (2) hours without receiving notice of such overtime on the previous day shall be paid an allowance of two shillings (2s.) for a meal, or shall be supplied by the employer with a reasonable meal in lieu of such payment. Any worker who has left the premises in which he is employed and is recalled to work after the usual ceasing time for less than one hour shall receive payment for one hour at overtime rates. If an employer requires a worker to work during the usual meal time, he shall allow to such worker a period equal to the usual meal time for the purpose of having his meal. For all work done at the request of the employer after 12.30 p.m. by a worker who has not had the usual time allowed for a meal, and for all work done at the request of the employer before the expiration of the usual meal time, the employer shall pay double time.

has not had the usual time allowed for a meal, and for all work done at the request of the employer before the expiration of the usual meal time, the employer shall pay double time.
(b) Double time shall be paid for work done on the following days:—Sunday, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day.''

The following new clauses are added :-

"20. Payment for Sickness:----

A worker shall be entitled to payment for nonattendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one half day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the Worker's Compensation Act. Provided always, that an employer shall be entitled to demand a medical certificate from any worker claiming such payment before he can be required to make any payment for sickness.

21. No Discrimination :---
