PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 5 of "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934," that for the purposes of the said Act the word "Town" or "Townsite" means and includes *inter alia* any land (including privately owned subdivided land) which the Governor may see fit, as he is hereby empowered to declare by Proclamation, to be a Town or Townsite, for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas all that land situate within the Swan Road District, more particularly described, defined, and delineated in the Schedule hereto, is land which the Governor may by virtue of Section 5 of the said Act declare by Proclamation to be a Town or Townsite for the purposes of the said Act: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the said Act and of all other powers in this behalf enabling me, do hereby declare that all that land situate within the Swan Road District, more particularly described, defined, and delineated in the Schedule hereto, shall be a Townsite, to be known as "Kingsford," within the meaning and for the purposes of "The Road Districts Act, 1919-1934."

Schedule.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting from the south-eastern corner of Swan Location 1467 and extending westerly along the southern boundary of said location 11 chains 11 9/10 links; thence south 32 chains 26 8/10 links to the northernmost boundary of Location 410; thence easterly, southerly, and easterly along boundaries of Location 410 aforesaid and the northern boundary of Location 1906 to the north-eastern corner of the latter location; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of same to a point in prolongation west-north-westerly of the southern side of Brockholes street; thence east-south-easterly to and along said side of street and onwards to the eastern side of Greenhead street; thence northerly along the said east-

ern side of street to the southern side of Bullsbrook road; thence generally easterly along said side of road to the north-eastern corner of Lot 137 of Location 1336; thence southerly to and along the western boundary of Lot 11 of Lot 138 of Location 1336 to the south-western corner of said Lot 11; thence easterly along the southern boundaries of said Lot 11, and Lots 10 and 9 and onwards to and along the southern boundaries of Lots 8, 7, 6, 5, and 4 to the western boundary of Lot 1 of said Lot 138 of the latter location; thence southerly and easterly along boundaries of said Lot 1 to the western side of the Gingin road; thence east-north-easterly across said road to a south-western corner of Lot 1 of Location 1354, situate on the eastern side of said road; thence generally easterly, northerly, and westerly along boundaries of said Lot 1 to its northern corner; thence north-north-westerly along boundaries of Lots 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 of said Location 1354 to the north-eastern corner of the last-mentioned lot; thence westerly to the north-western corner of said Lot 6; thence west-north-westerly across said Gingin road to the junction of the western side of same with the northern side of the said Bullsbrook road; thence 335deg. 42min. 29 chains 19 1/10 links; 332deg. 26min. 10 chains 22 6/10 links; 317deg. 14min. 16 chains 57 4/10 links; and 334deg. 16min. 25 chains 2 links along said side of Gingin road; thence 270deg. 21min. 41 chains 58 5/10 links; 157deg. 23min. 53 chains 32 links; and 180deg. 26min. 21 chains 3 9/10 links to the northern side of the said Bullsbrook road; thence generally westerly along said side of road to the south-eastern corner of Lot 2 of Locations 91 and 1352; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of said Lot 2 and onwards to and along that of Lot 40 of the latter location to its north-eastern corner; thence westerly along its northern boundary and onwards to the eastern boundary of Location 1467 aforesaid, and thence southerly to the starting point.

Bearings are true or thereabouts and measurements more or less. (Plan 28/80.)

WHEREAS it is provided by "The Vermin Act, 1918," that "Vermin" means and includes any animal or bird mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act, and such other animals or birds the names of which the Lieutenant-Governor may by Proclamation add to the said Schedule, and it is further provided by such Act that any such Proclamation may be restricted in its operation to any portion of the State, to be defined by the Proclamation: And whereas it is desirable to declare "Black-tailed Parakeets" (*Polytelus Anthopeplus*), commonly known as "Smoker Parrots," to be vermin within the portions of the State hereinafter mentioned: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation add "Black-tailed Parakeets" (*Polytelus Anthopeplus*), commonly known as "Smoker Parrots," to the Third Schedule of the said Act: Provided, however, that this Proclamation shall be restricted in its operation to the Narrogin Vermin District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of "The Road Districts Act, 1919-34," doth hereby redivide the Mount Marshall Road District into eleven Wards with the names, boundaries, and number of members allotted to each Ward as described in the Schedule hereto.

To come into force on the 1st day of July, 1936.

SCHEDULE.

Gabbins Ward.

Bounded on the westward and the southward by parts of the District boundary from its junction with the prolongation west of the north boundary of Avon Location 20272 to the north-west corner of Location 14267; on the northward by lines commencing at the said junction extending eastward to and along the north bound-

dary of said Location 20272, the north boundaries of Locations 20273 and 23240, part of the west and the northernmost boundary of Location 15144, the west and north boundaries of Location 2291, through Location 1123 to the north boundary of Location 2292; thence by the north and the east boundaries of Location 2292 aforesaid to the northern side of the Wyalkatchem-Mount Marshall railway reserve, and along said northern side of railway reserve to a point opposite the north-east corner of Location 15141; on the eastward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned point and extending southward to and along the west boundary of Location 15137, east along the south boundaries of Locations 15137 (aforesaid) and 23149, south along the west boundary of Location 16575, and south and east along the west and part of the south boundary of Location 15135, south along east boundaries of Locations 20295, 20296, 20297, 14293, the east and part of the south boundary of 14294, a west boundary of Location 15652, the west and south boundaries of Location 23223, and the southernmost boundary of Location 15652, the south boundary of Location 15655, and part of the west boundary of Location 14268 to the District boundary. (1 member.)

Mulji Ward.

Bounded on the westward by part of the District boundary from the prolongation west of the north boundary of Ninghan Location 1474 to its junction with the north boundary of the Gabbins Ward; on the northward by lines extending eastward along said prolongation and north boundary of Location 1474 and the north boundaries of Locations 1473, 1472, and 1471 and the prolongation of the latter boundary to junction with the west boundary of Location 2523; on the eastward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned junction and extending southward along part of said west boundary of Location 2523 and west boundaries of Locations 1166, 2746, 2602, 2298, 2163, 638, 637, 2093, 636, and 635, part of the north and the west boundary of Location 1576 and the west boundaries of Locations 2804, 2293 and 632 to the north boundary of the Gabbins Ward; on the southward by the north boundary of the Gabbins Ward from the last-mentioned point to the western boundary of the District. (1 member.)

Cleary Ward.

Bounded on the westward by part of the District boundary from the north boundary of the Mulji Ward to a north-west corner of Location 280; on the northward by the north boundaries of said Location 280 and Location 277; on the eastward by lines commencing at the north-east corner of Location 277 and extending southward along its east boundary, the east and part of the south boundary of Location 278, an east, a north, and the easternmost boundary of Pastoral Lease 392/454 to the prolongation east of the north boundary of Location 3259; thence by said prolongation and north boundary, and the north boundary of Location 3258, the east boundary of Location 3256, and east boundaries of Locations 3257, 3818, 3261, 3262, 2951, 2957, 2971, through Location 2974 to and along east boundaries of Locations 3390, 2973, 1458, 1457, 1452, 1451, 1346, 1345, 2827, 1342, 1341, 1340, 1339, and 1470 to the south-west corner of the last-mentioned location; on the southward by the north boundary of the Mulji Ward, from the last-mentioned point to the starting point. (1 member.)

Mandiga Ward.

Bounded on the southward by part of the District boundary from the north-west corner of Location 14267 to the north-west corner of Location 14248; on the westward by the east boundary of the Gabbins Ward and part of the east boundary of the Mulji Ward; on the northward by lines commencing at the north-west corner of Ninghan Location 1166 and extending eastward along its north boundary, a north, a west, and the northernmost boundary of Location 2602, and the north boundaries of Locations 1157, 1150, and 2459 to the north-east corner of the last-mentioned location; on the eastward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned corner and extending southward along the east boundaries of Locations 2459, 2826, and 2136, through Locations 2567 and 2345 (along the eastern side of Road No. 7070), along the west boundaries of Locations 2566, 721, 720, 717, the west and part of the south-west boundary of Location 2267, the west boundary of Location 1940, part of the north

and the west boundary of Avon Location 22764 and the prolongation of the latter boundary of the last-mentioned location to the northern boundary of Location 22222; thence by part of said northern, the west and part of the south boundary of the last-mentioned location; the east and part of the south boundary of Location 15147, the east and part of the south boundary of Location 20303, the eastern boundary of Location 14263, the west and part of the south boundary of Location 14256 and west boundaries of Locations 14287, 22117, 26206, and 14279 to the District boundary. (1 member.)

Marindo Ward.

Bounded on the southward by the north boundary of the Mandiga Ward; on the westward by part of the east boundary of the Mulji Ward and an east boundary of the Cleary Ward; on the northward by the north boundaries of Locations 3258 and 3259 and their prolongation eastward to junction with an east side of Road No. 9559; on the eastward by lines commencing at the last-mentioned junction and extending southward along said east side of road, part of the north, the east, and the south-east boundaries of Location 3240, the west boundary of Location 3239, the north boundary of Location 2947, the east and part of the south boundary of Location 2948, the east boundary of Location 2961, part of the north and the west boundary of Location 2937, part of the north and the west boundary of Location 2977, part of the north, the east, and part of the south boundary of Location 2979, the east and part of the south boundary of Location 2986, the east and part of the south boundary of Location 2990, the east boundary of Location 3001, part of the north and the easternmost boundary of Location 3716, an east, a north, and the easternmost boundary of Location 2632, the north and west boundaries of Location 2464, part of the north and the west boundary of Location 1156, part of the northernmost boundary of Location 3736, the northernmost, an east, and a north boundary of Location 2199, the north and east boundaries of Location 924, and east boundaries of Locations 2375, 2776, and 2558 to the north-east corner of Location 2459. (1 member.)

Mount Marshall Ward.

Bounded on the southward by part of the District boundary, from the south-west corner of Location 14279 to the south-east corner of Location 11777; on the westward by part of the east boundary of the Mandiga Ward; on the northward by lines commencing at the north-west corner of Location 22222 and extending east along said northern boundary of Location 22222, the northernmost, an east, and a north boundary of Location 22199, the north and part of the east boundary of Location 15146, the north boundary of Location 24616, the westernmost and the north boundaries of Location 14258, the north and part of the east boundary of Location 14259, the northern boundaries of Locations 14815, 14809, and 15118 to the north-east corner of the last-mentioned location; on the eastward by lines commencing at said north-east corner of Location 15118 and extending southward along east boundaries of said Location 15118 and Locations 14807, 19605, 14392, 22512, 14391, 14388, and 14407 and part of the north and the east boundary of Location 11777 to the District boundary. (1 member.)

Bencubbin Ward.

Bounded on the southward by part of the north boundary of the Mount Marshall Ward; on the westward by part of the east boundary of the Mandiga Ward; on the northward by lines commencing at the junction of the prolongation west of the south boundary of Location 2371 with the east boundary of Location 2136, and extending eastward along said prolongation and south boundary of Location 2371, the south boundary of Location 485, part of the south boundary of Location 484, the west, the southernmost, an east and a south boundary of Location 2072, and the southernmost boundary of Location 465 to the south-east corner of the last-mentioned location; on the eastward by lines commencing at said south-east corner of Location 465 and extending southward to and along the east boundary of Location 742 and east boundaries of Locations 314, 741, 737, 703, 732, 603, 598, 596, 593, 577, and 14818 and onward to the north boundary of the Mount Marshall Ward. (1 member.)

East Ward.

Bounded on the southward and eastward by parts of the District boundary, from the east boundary of the Mount Marshall Ward at a south-east corner of Avon Location 11777 to the south-east corner of Location 2467; on the westward by the east boundaries of the Bencubbin and Mount Marshall Wards; on the northward by lines commencing at the south-east corner of Ninghan Location 465 and extending eastward to and along the south boundary of Location 2310, the west boundaries of Locations 461 and 462, and the south boundaries of Locations 461, 610, 3381, 3030, 3031, and 2467 to the District boundary. (1 member.)

Wialki Ward.

Bounded on the eastward by part of the District boundary, from the south-east corner of Location 2467 to an east and west line passing through the 82-Mile Post on the Rabbit-proof Fence; on the northward by said east and west line from the last-mentioned point west to the prolongation north of the west boundary of Location 3051; on the westward by a line commencing at the last-mentioned point and extending southward to the north side of a surveyed road along the north boundary of Location 3048 and along such side of said road and the westernmost boundary of Location 3048, the north boundary of Location 3049, east boundaries of said Locations 3049 and 3050, part of the south boundary of Location 3049, the east boundary of Location 3053, part of the north, the west, and part of the south boundary of Location 3055, the east and part of the south boundary of Location 3056 to the prolongation north of the east boundary of Location 3144, and along said prolongation and east boundary, part of the north and east boundaries of Location 3722, the east boundary of Location 3021; thence south-eastward to the north-west corner of Location 2721, and along the west and part of the south-western boundary of the last-mentioned location and east boundaries of Locations 3025, 3028, and 3030 to the south-east corner of the last-mentioned location; on the southward by part of the north boundary of the East Ward. (1 member.)

Dalgouring Ward.

Bounded on the eastward by the western boundary of the Wialki Ward; on the southward by parts of the north boundaries of the east and Bencubbin Wards, and on the westward and northward by lines commencing at a south-east corner of Location 2072 and extending northward along the easternmost and part of the northernmost boundary of said location, the east boundaries of Locations 484 and 476, the east and parts of the north boundaries of Locations 505 and 1909, the east boundary of Location 2824, the east, a south, and the north-east boundary of Location 2718, the north-west boundaries of Locations 2719 and 2720, the east and part of the north boundary of Location 3151, to and along west boundaries of Locations 3142 and 3140, part of the south boundary of Location 3150, the east boundaries of Locations 3146 and 3145 and the prolongation north of the east boundary of the last-mentioned location to junction the prolongation west of the north boundary of the Wialki Ward; thence by the latter prolongation to the west boundary of the Wialki Ward. (1 member.)

Beacon Ward.

Bounded on the westward by part of the eastern boundary of the Mandiga Ward, the eastern boundary of the Marindo Ward and part of the eastern boundary of the Cleary Ward to the western boundary of the District; thence by part of the western boundary of the District to its junction with the South-West Division of the State; on the northward by the northern boundary of the District from said junction to the easternmost boundary of the District; on the easternmost, a south, and an east boundary by a line extending from the last-mentioned point south along the easternmost boundary of the District, west along the north boundary of the Mukinbudin District, and the north boundaries of the Wialki and Dalgouring Wards and southward along the western boundary of the latter ward to the north boundary of the Bencubbin Ward at a south-east corner of Location 2072; on the southernmost boundary by part of the north boundary of the Bencubbin Ward. FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following Stay Orders have been issued in accordance with Section 7, Subsection 1, of "The Farmers' Debts Adjustment Act, 1930-1934," which reads as follows:—

A Stay Order shall direct that no action, execution, distress for rent, proceedings on default for breach of covenant under any mortgage or other security for money, or under an agreement for sale and purchase of land, or other process or proceeding, shall be commenced or proceeded with or put in force against the farmer or any of the farmer's assets, whether utilised in connection with or forming portion of the assets comprised in his farming business or not, during the operation of such Stay Order: Provided that, by leave of a Judge, any action may, notwithstanding the Stay Order, be instituted and/or carried on against the farmer, but not beyond judgment.
