WHEREAS by "The Factories and Shops Act, 1920," it is enacted that the Governor may by Proclamation temporarily suspend the operations of the said Act, in so far as it applies to the closing time fixed or appointed for any shop or shops: And whereas it is expedient to exercise such power in manner hereinafter appearing: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby by this Proclamation suspend the operations of the said Act between the hour of ten o'clock and eleven o'clock in the morning of of ten o'clock and eleven o'clock in the morning of Monday, the 29th June, 1936, in so far as it applies to the closing time of Hairdressers' Shops situate within a radius of 15 miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

presented to the Governor by a majority of the keepers of such shops in the Lower Blackwood Shop District praying that the day on which such shops in that locality shall remain open till nine o'clock in the evening shall be Thursday, and it is desirable to accede to the prayer of such Petition: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and determine that, subject to the said Act, the day in each week on which all shops as aforesaid in the Lower Blackwood Shop District shall remain open till nine o'clock in the evening shall be Thursday.

The Fisheries Act, 1905-21. PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell, K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and over the State of Western Australia lieutenant-Governor. [L.s.]

C.S.D. 255/34; Ex. Co. No. 1086. WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: And whereas it is deemed desirable to rescind a certain portion of the Proclamation under the said Act dated the 18th day of December, 1935, and published in the Government Gazette of the 20th December, 1935, prohibiting the taking of fish by means of fishing nets in the waters described in the said Proclamation during a specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, rescind the fifth paragraph of the Schedule of the said Proclamation and substitute in its stead the following, namely:—

Wilson's Inlet (Denmark).

(1) All that area of Wilson's Inlet near the Channel Entrance, westward of a line drawn in a generally northerly direction from the north-western corner of Location No. 1992 (on the southern shore of the Inlet) to the south-western corner of Location No. 5433 (on the southern shore of the Inlet), and

(2) All that area of Wilson's Inlet, including the streams flowing into it, eastward of a line drawn in a generally northerly direction from the north-western corner of Location No. 2229 (on the southern shore of the Inlet) to the south-western corner of Location No. 1500 (on the northern shore of the Inlet).

Description and Location of Reticulation Works Approved and Exempted:—Subiaco Severage (Area 20), Wembley District:—A 6-inch diameter reticulation Wembley District:—A 6-inch diameter reticulation sewer, with manholes and all other apparatus connected therewith, commencing at existing Manhole 3737 on Section 5 in the right of way between Daglish and Harbourne streets and proceeding north along the centre of the said right of way to and across Grantham street and along the said right of way for a total distance of 1,098 feet; also a 6-inch diameter reticulation converges companions at Manhole 2727A in the right of sewer commencing at Manhole 3737A in the right of way between Daglish and Harbourne streets and pro-eeding west across the said right of way and Lot 1263, Daglish street, to and across Daglish street to Man-hole 3737D, a distance of 212 feet; thence north along the west side of Daglish street to Manhole 3737E op-posite the centre of the right of way north of Green posite the centre of the right of way north of Grantham street, a distance of 33 feet; thence west along the centre of the said right of way to Manhole 3737F, a distance of 152 feet; thence to inspection opening, a distance of 100 feet.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MOUNT MAGNET DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

Name.

1. The Institution shall be known as the Mount Magnet District Hospital.

Objects.

2. The objects of the Hospital shall be to afford medical and surgical treatment, and to provide medicine and surgical dressings to subscribers and dependants and to paying and indigent patients.

Subscribers' Qualifications and Privileges.

3. Any person who subscribes 1s. 6d. per week or the sum of 19s. 6d. per quarter, or any person under the age of 21 years who subscribes the sum of 1s. per

week, shall be termed a subscriber.

4. In these Rules and Regulations the term "Subscriber" shall mean any subscriber (male or female) who has paid his or her subscription and is financial, and has paid two weeks" subscription prior to seeking and has paid two weeks' subscription prior to seeking any benefit or privileges, and shall include, so far as medical and Hospital treatment, only the wife or hus-band, parents, or female relative occupying the position as head of the household, or children up to the age of sixteen years, provided they are residing with the sub-scriber and dependent upon him or her.

- Every subscriber shall be entitled to surgical and medical treatment at the Hospital as an indoor or outdoor patient, and to medical and surgical dressings and appliances, subject to the conditions and limitations set forth in the Rules and Regulations, and for so long as the Medical Officer deems necessary, free of charge.

 6. Any subscriber being one fortnight in arrears shall become unfinancial and may not be entitled to the
- benefits free.
- 7. No subscriber, not being an indoor patient, shall be supplied with any medicines or dressings, except on the authority of the Medical Officer or matron, who shall record same in a diary, to be kept for the pur-
- Subscribers shall not receive free treatment in the following cases:-
 - (1) Accouchement;

 - (2) Incurable diseases;
 (3) Disorders for the cure of which other establishment lishments are provided;
 - (4) Any person requiring food and not medicine and who is more properly a subject for a benevolent institution;
 - (5) Any person whose admission might endanger other patients;
 - (6) Any person from the gaol or lockup, unless an urgent case and the police provide attendant or custodian, if necessary;
 - (7) Any infant on account of the condition of the
 - mother alone; Venereal diseases;
 - Alcoholism;
 - (10) Dentistry;
 - (11) Insanity;
 - (12) Operations of choice (i.e., surgical operations not necessitated by accident or dangerous illness, these being included in subscriber's benefits, when such operation can be performed locally), and all major operations.
- 9. No subscriber shall be entitled to any of the privileges regarding treatment or Hospital accommodation for any conditions for which he is already covered by insurance under the terms of the Workers' pensation Act.
- 10. The administration of the Hospital shall be the familiaritation of the respiral shall be vested in a Board of Management of six members (hereinafter called the Board), appointed by the Governor, two (2) of whom shall be selected by the subscribers at Reedy.

Three (3) of these members shall retire each year, but shall be eligible for reselection.

The three members to retire at the end of the first period shall be selected by ballot, and thereafter retirement shall be in rotation.

The Board shall meet monthly on the third Tuesday of each month.

Selection of Board.

- 11. Nominations must be lodged with the secretary at least fourteen days prior to the date of ballot, and must be signed by a proposer and seconder (who must be subscribers), and have the consent of the candidate, (who shall also be a subscriber) indorsed thereon.

 12. Any subscriber who has paid four weeks' sub-
- scription prior to date of nomination shall be entitled to stand for election to the Board.

In the case of several people covered by one subscription, either one of them, if an adult, may exercise this

13. The ballot shall be held at such place and shall be open for such hours as the Board shall decide.

14. The secretary shall prepare a roll of persons qualified to vote at the election.

15. No proxy voting will be allowed at any elec-

tion.

The Chairman shall act as Returning Officer and may appoint a Deputy Returning Officer.

17. A majority of the members shall form a quorum. Should a quorum not be present 15 minutes after the hour appointed for such meeting, those present may fix a day and hour to which the meeting shall stand adjourned, or the meeting shall stand adjourned until the next day of meeting.

Absence of Board Members.

18. If any member of the Board shall be absent from more than two consecutive meetings without leave of absence, or shall cease to be a subscriber, the Board may recommend to the Governor that his seat be de-clared vacant, and also recommend the appointment of another person in his stead, such appointment to take effect until the next annual election only.

Chairman.

- 19. The Board shall elect a Chairman from their number at the first meeting after the annual general The Chairman shall preside at all meetings. In the absence of the Chairman an acting Chairman for that meeting shall be elected by the members present.
- A vacancy occurring in the office of Chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Board after such vacancy has been declared, previous notice being given in the circulars convening the meeting.

Finance Committee.

- 21. The Board shall elect two of their members to orm a Finance Committee. The Finance Committee form a Finance Committee. shall submit to the Board accounts which it recommends for payment, and present a statement of receipts and expenditure for the past month, and an estimate for the ensuing month.
- 22. No account shall be passed for payment unless it is initialed as correct by the secretary, Medical Officer or matron.
- 23. All payments authorised by the Board shall be paid by cheque, made payable to the order of the creditor, signed by the Chairman and countersigned by the secretary or, alternatively, signed by two members of the Board and countersigned by the secretary.

Bank Account.

24. The funds of the Hospital shall be deposited in a Bank, to be named by the Board of Management.

Order of Business.

- 25. The order of business at meetings of the Board shall be:
 - (1) Minutes of the previous meeting to be read, and, if approved, confirmed;
 (2) Correspondence outward and inward to be read
 - and discussed;
 - Reports;
 - Questions;

 - (5) Finance;(6) Discussion of notices of motion;
 - (7) Receiving notices of motion;(8) General business.
- 26. At all meetings voting shall be by show of hands, unless in any case a ballot be called for by any member present: provided that the election of executive officers be by ballot only.
- 27. All members attending a meeting shall have the right to vote for or against all motions tabled during their attendance at such meeting.
- 28. Special meetings of the Board may be convened at any time, on 24 hours' notice in writing being given to the members, either at the request of the Chairman or any three (3) members.
- 29. Any resolution of the Board may be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, either by the unanimous vote of all the members or by a vote of a majority of the Board, subject in such last-mentioned case to the condition that seven days at least before such subsequent meeting notice in writing thereof and of the proposal to alter or revoke such resolution shall have been given to each member.
- 30. The Board may from time to time appoint a Subcommittee or Subcommittees of any number, with such powers, right, and privileges and subject to such conditions and restrictions as the Board may at such appointment or thereafter determine.
- 31. The Board shall regulate the several departments of the Hospital in accordance with the Regulations or any By-laws, and more particularly in reference to all sanitary matters, and shall take immediate steps to rectify any defects that may require prompt attention.
- 32. No ball, bazaar, sports meeting or other enter-tainment or function shall be held in aid of the Hospital funds without the consent and authority of the Board.

House Committee.

- 33. The Board of Management shall appoint from amongst themselves a House Committee of two (2), to be elected monthly, who shall attend to the internal management of the Hospital and such other matters as may be delegated to them. They shall furnish monthly reports to the Board of Management.
- 34. They shall report to the Board any repairs, etc., which may be necessary, and give attention to same dur-ing the progress of any works. They shall also see that all fittings and appliances are in an efficient state,

Patients' Circumstances.

35. The secretary shall cause full inquiries to be made into the circumstances of indigent patients.

Meeting of Subscribers.

36. The annual meeting of the subscribers shall be held in the month of July in each year.

37. At the annual meeting the annual reports and balance sheet of the Hospital shall be presented by the Chairman, such balance sheet to be published at least seven days before the meeting.

Special Meetings.

38. The secretary shall, whenever required by the Chairman or Board, or upon a requisition in writing by not less than nine subscribers, convene a special meeting of subscribers. The requisition shall express the objects of the meeting, and shall be left with the secretary, who shall forthwith convene a special meeting. In the event of the secretary failing to do so within 10 days from the time of the requisition being received by him, the requisitionists or any number of them may convene a special meeting.

39. At least fourteen days' clear notice of the annual and every special meeting shall be given each subscriber by advertisement in the local paper or other means, as the Board shall direct. Such notice shall specify the place, the day, the hour of meeting and the general nature of the business.

40. At an annual or special meeting fifteen sub-40. At an annual or special meeting fifteen subscribers shall form a quorum. If within fifteen minutes from the time appointed for the meeting a quorum of subscribers is not present, the meeting, if convened upon the requisition of subscribers, shall be dissolved. In any other case it shall stand adjourned to a time and place to be fixed.

Scale of Fees.

Indoor Patients.

The fees for non-subscribers shall be 12s. 6d. per day for maintenance and nursing, but not includ-ing medical attendance. Drugs and dressings shall be charged for in addition.

Maternity Cases.

42. Maternity cases shall be admitted to the Hospital on payment of the following fees (exclusive of doctor's fees and special nursing charges):—(a) Non-subscribers, 12s. 6d. per day; (b) subscribers, 5s. 3d. per day.

Theatre and X-Ray Fees.

43. The theatre fee shall be £1 1s. for non-subscribers and workers' compensation cases. X-ray fees shall be as follows:-

For non-subscribers and compensation cases only: (a) portion of upper or lower jaw, 3s. 6d.; (b) complete jaw, 10s. 6d.; (c) screenings, 7s. 6d.; (d) filming, 12s. 6d.

Complaints.

44. Any subscriber or member of the staff having any complaints or other business to bring before the Board shall submit the same in writing to the Board, and, if required, shall attend personally the meeting of the Board.

Outdoor Patients.

- All outpatients requiring treatment and who in the Medical Officer's opinion are in need of treatment shall be attended to, and the Medical Officer shall enter such patient's name in the book provided for outpatients, under the heading to which they belong. All fees collected or paid to be handed to the secretary.

 46. Any outdoor patients receiving bottles must leave
- a deposit of sixpence (6d.) on each bottle, to be re funded on return of bottle.
- 47. All patients who in the Medical Officer's opinion require treatment shall attend at the Hospital or private surgery whenever required to do so by him. But the Medical Officer shall also in case of necessity gratuitously attend subscribers at their own homes, provided they reside within a four-mile radius of the Hospital, always excepting cases of venereal disease, alcoholic poisoning, midwifery, and such other cases as are mentioned in Rule 8.

Indoor Patients.

- 48. Accidents or urgent cases shall be received at all hours of the day and night.
 49. Persons shall be admitted to the Hospital as
- inpatients, on production of a certificate from a Medical

- Practitioner that they require treatment. Non-sub-scribers shall be examined by the secretary or matron as to their means to pay the Hospital for such treatment.
- 50. Applicants for admission to the Hospital shall, when required by the secretary, make a statutory declaration that they are unable to pay for treatment and are not entitled to benefits from any Friendly Society.
- 51. Patients having money or valuables in their possession on admission shall deliver up same to the nurse or attendant who shall immediately hand them with written particulars to the secretary for safe custody, a receipt for which will be given by him and countersigned by the matron. The Hospital will not be responsible for money or other effects, the property of the patients, unless this Rule is observed.
- 52. On the admission of any patient to the Hospital his address and that of his immediate relatives, his professed religion, age, and other particulars shall be given to the Medical Officer, secretary, or matron.
- 53. The patients shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner and strictly observe all the directions of the Medical Officer, matron or nurse, and such Regulations as may be made by the Medical Officer or the Board of Management.
- 54. Patients are not allowed to leave the Hospital precincts without the special permission of the Medical Officer.
- 55. No reward or gratuity whatever is to be given by the patients or their friends to the Medical Officer, nurse, wardsman, or other servant on account of services performed or to be performed by them in the Hospital, without the consent of the Board.
- 56. Patients quitting the Hospital of their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving, or such declaration shall be signed by the friend remov ing such patient.
- 57. Patients, on being discharged, may report in a book kept for that purpose on the treatment received by them.
- 58. No patient shall be discharged from the Hospital without the consent of the Medical Officer in charge of the case, except when ordered by the Board or in case of misconduct.

The Medical Officer.

- 59. The Medical Officer shall be a legally qualified practitioner under the Medical Practitioners Act of Western Australia, and he shall be appointed by the Board of Management, and his salary shall be fixed by He shall enter into an agreement approved by the Board.
- 60. On taking office he will check and have charge of all surgical instruments, implements, and apparatus and shall sign an inventory in correctness thereof, and on the termination of his engagement he shall hand them over to his successor, or to the Board, and receive an acknowledgment thereof. All new instruments, implements, and apparatus purchased or procured shall be added to the inventory, which shall be a correct record of all such articles.
- 61. No instrument, implement, or apparatus shall be loaned, destroyed, or disposed of without the consent of the Board. The Medical Officer may report to the Board from time to time that any instrument, implement, or apparatus is worn out, obsolete, or otherwise uscless, and such instrument, implement, or apparatus may be written off the inventory, on the Board's approval being given.
- 62. No new instruments shall be ordered and no addition to any instruments or apparatus made without the approval of the Board.
- 63. He shall be in attendance at the Hospital daily during the hours defined by the Board, and, in addition, shall attend, in case of emergency, whenever summoned by the matron.
- 64. The hours of attendance defined shall be posted in a conspicuous position at the Hospital and in any other place the Board may direct.
- He may, if he wish, appoint hours at which he
- will see the subscribers at his private surgery.
 66. Subscribers shall have first call on the Medical Officer's services
- 67. He shall be responsible for a daily report of all cases under his charge and see that a diet card is placed for each patient, such daily report to be recorded in a book for that purpose.
- 68. He shall afford the Board every information and furnish them with reports on all matters within his control as may seem to him necessary or they may require.

- He shall not absent himself from the town for more than 24 hours without the consent of the Chairman, and, in the event of the appointment of a locumtenens being necessary, the Medical Officer shall make all necessary arrangements, and submit the name of the proposed locum-tenens for the approval of the Board before his appointment. The Board shall have the right to withhold their approval if in their opinion the locumtenens is not a suitable person, and need not give any reason for the withholding of this approval.
- 70. In the event of the Medical Officer neglecting his duties, or being absent for more than 24 hours without the consent of the Chairman and the appointment of a duly qualified locum-tenens approved by the Board, he shall, after receipt of notice under the hand of the secretary, immediately cease to hold office, and shall have no claim on the Board for salary after receipt of such notice, and he shall be liable to the Hospital for any expense which the Board may incur caused by his absence or neglect.
- 71. The agreement between the Board and the Medical Officer to be mutually terminated upon either party giving to the other three months' notice in writing of such termination.
- 72. Subscribers may nominate their medical attendant, and may change to another at the end of any month.

Secretary.

- 73. The secretary shall be appointed by the Board and shall hold office during the pleasure of the Board.
- 74. He may hold office in an honorary or paid capacity.
- 75. If holding office in an honorary capacity, he may be paid an annual bonus, should the Board consider it advisable.
- 76. If a paid officer, his salary shall be fixed by the Board from time to time.
- 77. He shall conduct the correspondence and have charge of all documents relating to the Hospital and shall file and record them in a methodical manner to the satisfaction of the Board.
- He shall summon and attend all meetings, and shall keep minute books, in which all the proceedings of the meetings shall be recorded; and shall see as far as practicable that all resolutions or orders passed at such meetings are forthwith carried into effect.
- 79. He shall, under the direction of the Board, keep the books, forms and accounts of the Hospital, and shall submit his account books to the Board and Finance Committee whenever required.
- 80. He shall see that the Medical Officer takes over and signs for all surgical instruments, etc., as provided in Rule 60.
- 81. He shall receive from the Medical Officer on behalf of the Board the report required by Rule 68, and be responsible for the rendering of accounts of all amounts due and unpaid.
- 82. He shall see that the matron on her appointment complies with Rule 94, and shall submit such inventory, certified to as correct by the matron, to the Board at the end of the financial year.
- 83. He shall receive all tradesmen's bills for provisions and other articles from the matron and make out accounts for presentation to the Financial Committee at the next monthly meeting.
- 84. He shall receive all moneys paid to the Hospital and enter same in the Cash Book and pay same into the Bauk on the first available occasion.
- 85. He shall present a copy of the Rules to every employee who may be appointed immediately after his or her appointment, and obtain his or her signature to a duplicate copy, which he shall keep in his office for that purpose. He shall keep an interleaved book con-taining the Rules, and shall insert any new rule or order as soon as it shall have been passed by the Board, and shall at once communicate it to the person or persons to whom it may relate.
- 86. He shall, on the day following each Board or sub-committee meeting, transcribe in the Minute Book fair copies of the minutes taken during each meeting.
- 87. He shall balance the Cash Book at the end of each month, noting whether such balance agrees with that shown by the Bank Book, and, if not agreeing, explain the cause of the difference.
- 88. He shall keep the Contributors' Book, and enter therein and in the Cash Book all subscriptions and donations, and shall report the same at the next monthly meeting of the Board.

- 89. He shall keep a duplicate or true copy of all letters written on the business of the Hospital, and shall execute all orders he may receive from the Board or the Chairman.
- 90. He shall be in attendance at his office at such times as the Committee may from time to time appoint, and such hours shall be posted outside his office and at the Hospital.
- 91. He shall see that the Medical Officer in taking possession of the residence shall sign an inventory of all furniture, etc., and shall check same on the Medical Officer's vacating the premises.
- 92. He shall be guaranteed for £100 by some recognised guarantee society; the premium for such guarantee to be paid out of the funds of the Hospital.

Matron.

- 93. The matron, who shall be a certified nurse and registered maternity nurse, shall be appointed by the Board of Management, and shall hold office upon such terms as they may direct. She shall reside in the quarters provided for her, and devote her time and attention to the superintendence and general management of the nursing staff or the Hospital. She shall also take entire charge of the domestic affairs of the nurses' quarters and of the Hospital generally, and have control over all the nurses and employees (excepting the secretary) attached to the Hospital and, in case of disobedience of the orders, misconduct, or neglect of duty on the part of any nurse or employee, she shall fully report thereon forthwith to the House Committee through the secretary. The matron shall also do the ordinary nursing duties of the Hospital.
- 94. On taking office she will check and have charge of all surgical instruments, implements, and apparatus, and shall sign an inventory in correctness thereof, and, on the termination of her engagement, she shall hand them over to her successor or to the Board and receive an acknowledgment thereof. All new instruments, implements, and apparatus purchased or procured shall be added to the inventory, which shall be a correct record of all such articles.
- 95. No instrument, implement, or apparatus shall be loaned, destroyed, or disposed of without the consent of the Board. The matron shall report to the Board from time to time that any instrument, implement, or apparatus is worn out, obsolete, or otherwise useless, and such instrument, implement, or apparatus may then be written off the inventory, on the Board's approval being given.
- 96. No new instruments shall be ordered, and no addition to any instruments or apparatus made, without the approval of the Board.
- 97. She shall have charge of and be accountable for the medical stores, and, whenever necessary, prepare and submit to the Board a list of all medicines that may be required, and shall from time to time report to the Board such medicine stores as she may deem to be in excess of requirements, or useless, and, with the approval of the Board, have same destroyed or otherwise disposed of.
- 98. She shall have the immediate superintendence of the professional staff in connection with the professional work of the Hospital, and shall preserve order and sobriety, and, in case of any insubordination or gross default of duty on the part of any of those employees, she shall suspend the same and report fully on each case to the Board immediately, through the secretary.
- 99. She shall report monthly to the Board particulars of numbers of patients treated in Hospital during past month, number admitted, number discharged, nature of complaints and number of out-patients treated at the Hospital, together with an estimate of the cost of all medicine and dressings supplied to them.
- 100. She shall see that while on duty the staff appear in uniforms as follows:—Matron, white; nurses, blue; probationers, pink; housemaids, black with white apron.
- 101. She shall, on taking charge, check and sign a stock book containing a list of all furniture, bedding, linen, clothing, glass, crockery, cutlery, cookery, and kitchen utensils, etc., and shall be responsible for same, and on relinquishing her duties shall hand same to the secretary or her successor, as directed by the Board, fair wear and tear being allowed.

- 102. She shall not be absent from the Hospital without the consent of the Chairman.
- 103. She shall requisition the Board for clothing, bedding, linen, glass, cutlery, crockery, utensils, and appliances of every kind required for the use of the Hospital. She shall enter them in the Stock Book and be responsible for them.
- 104. She shall be careful to see that all articles of clothing, bedding, etc., are kept in thorough repair and marked, and that all articles of bedding (including mattresses) in use in the wards are frequently changed and aired in the airing grounds provided for such purposes; and that no bedding that has been in use be stowed away without previous airing; and that no article of the Hospital under her control be lent without the consent of the House Committee.
- 105. She shall inculcate strict economy in the use of fuel, etc., and see that all unnecessary lights are dispensed with during the night, and that order, cleanliness, and punctuality prevail throughout the establishment.
- 106. She shall be responsible for the internal economy and general management of the institution, the quality, quantity, and preparation of food, the state of the wards, and the comfort generally of the patients.
- 107. In the event of any patient requiring the presence of any minister of religion, she shall take measures to have the request complied with.
- 108. She shall not permit any of the patients to receive unauthorised foods or liquors, and see that all rules respecting visitors be observed, and not permit provisions or other property to be conveyed away from the Hospital.
- 109. She shall take charge of the private clothes of each patient and store them up for examination, and, if necessary, cause them to be cleaned and disinfected.
- 110. She shall always have in readiness a proper assortment of bandages, lint, strappings, and other dressings.
- 111. She shall preserve order and decorum in the wards, prohibit conduct and conversation improper and see that the patients adhere to the Rules.
- 112. She shall not permit strangers or visitors to remain after the usual visiting hours, nor to crowd around any bed, but shall quietly request such visitors to retire, and, if such request is not at once complied with, shall report the same to the Medical Officer.

Domestic Staff.

- 113. The wardsman or yardman shall be appointed by the Board of Management. He shall perform such duties as the Medical Officer or Officer in Charge shall direct, and shall at all times make himself generally useful. His hours of duty shall be arranged by the Medical Officer, and he shall be relieved of duty at such times as are convenient to the efficient working of the Institution.
- 114. Domestic employees shall be appointed by the Board of Management. They will perform their duties entirely under the direction of the matron, and will endeavour by strict obedience, to promote the economic and harmonious working of the domestic portion of the Hospital. The hours of leave shall be at regular intervals, to be determined by the matron; provided always, that the efficient working of the Institution is not thereby interfered with. The matron shall have power to dismiss any domestic employee, and may obtain temporary domestic assistance, when such is required, and enter same in her report to the Board of Management.
- 115. All employees shall be entitled to three weeks' annual leave on full pay for each completed year of service. Such annual leave must be taken out each year and at a time approved by the Board of Management.

Minister of Religion—Character.

- 116. The Hospital must be considered to be strictly non-sectarian.
- 117. Ministers of religion may have free access at all times to patients of their respective denominations, but prior to entering the ward must obtain the matron's consent. It is expected that ministers will not remain in any ward when requested to retire during the visit of the Medical Officer or matron. Any minister may attend any patient when requested by such patient.

118. It is also to be insisted upon that ministers of religion and such other persons as aforesaid visiting the Hospital for the purpose of administering religious instruction to the patients shall so conduct their services as not to interfere with the repose and quiet of other patients in the near vicinity.

119. Not more than two (2) visitors shall be allowed to visit any patient on the same day without special permission from the Medical Officer or matron. Visitors shall be admitted to see patients daily, between the hours of 2.30 p.m. and 4 p.m. or at other times by special permission of the Medical Officer or matron.

120. All visitors must leave the Hospital as soon as they have seen their friends. Not more than one (1) child out of arms shall accompany visitors to see a patient. Visitors must retire when requested to do so. The Medical Officer has power to close any ward he may think fit, or to refuse visitors access to any patient.

121. Visitors must respectfully and quietly obey the nurse or sister in charge of a ward, be quiet in their movements and conversation, and be careful not to disturb the ward in any way.

122. Loitering about the premises and smoking are

strictly prohibited.
123. Male visitors shall not be admitted to the ward for females without the consent of the nurse in charge.

Visitors must remain at the bedside of the patient they are visiting. Children in arms shall not be admitted to the Hospital wards.

125. No person shall read aloud nor conduct public or religious services in the wards of the Hospital.

126. No visitor will be permitted to remain more than half an hour with a patient without special leave of the Medical Officer.

127. Persons wishing to visit the Hospital regularly, or at other times than those assigned to ordinary visitors, may obtain a special general permission, or make application to the Medical Officer.

Such special visitors must avoid all religious teachings, except with members of their own communion, and be generally subject to the rules under the head of "Ministers of Religion."

129. The Medical Officer, on complaint being made to him, may prohibit any special visitor from entering the wards pending an investigaton by the House Committee, who shall have power to cancel any permission.

New Rules.

130. The Board shall have power to alter, amend, or add to these rules, and to make new rules, but no such alteration or addition of new rules shall be made unless approved by the Board after the notice of action to make such alteration, addition, or new rule has been given at the previous meeting of the Board and due notice has been given to every member of the Board; and such alteration, addition, or amendment shall only remain in force until the next general or special meeting unless it is adopted and approved at such meeting.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 3 of 1935.

Between the Federated Engine-drivers and Firemen's Association of Australasia, West Australian Branch Association of Workers, Applicant, and the Colonial Sugar Refining Company, Limited, Respondent.

THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:—

AWARD.

1.—Term.

The Award shall be for a term of three (3) years, subject to the provisions of the Arbitration Act relating to a review after the expiration of twelve (12) months.

2.—Area.

The Award shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the Genera. Post Office, Perth.

3.—Definition.

"Casual worker" means a worker employed for less than six (6) consecutive working days. He shall I paid at the rate of ten per cent. (10 per cent.), in addition to the rates prescribed in this Award, upon an hourly basis.

4.—Hours of Work.

- (a) Forty-four (44) hours shall constitute a week's work for all workers.
- (b) Workers employed on shift work shall work five (5) shifts of eight (8) hours, including crib time, and one shift of four (4) hours. All shifts shall rotate weekly: Provided that the foregoing hours may be altered at any time by agreement in writing between the parties.
- (e) Single shift workers shall work eight (8) hours per day, exclusive of crib time, on the first five (5) days of the week and four (4) hours on Saturday.
- (d) Shift workers may commence work at 11 p.m., in which case the hours worked from 11 p.m. to midnight on any Sunday or public holiday shall be paid for at ordinary rates and included as part of their ordinary shift-work hours.
- (e) In all cases of reckoning time of duty all time necessarily occupied in raising steam, in starting up or closing down engines, or in banking fires, shall be included.

5.—Holidays.

- (a) Twelve (12) paid holidays per annum shall be granted to each worker after twelve (12) months' continuous service: Provided always, that New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, or the days observed as such, shall be taken as they come as portion of the holidays. The balance of six (6) days, of which a fortnight's notice shall be given, shall be granted as annual leave, at the convenience of the employer, but shall not be allowed to accumulate.
- (b) In the event of a worker being employed for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period, and, if such holidays are not equal to the holidays given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on holidays on full pay.
- (c) Except when employed, subject to the conditions of Clause 6 (c) (Overtime), no worker shall be required to present himself for duty on any of the specially named holidays in Subclause (a) hereof. On any other public holiday the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty, but if kept open or work done, ordinary rates shall apply.
- (d) Where a worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct, he will not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.
- (e) The foregoing provisions shall not apply to casual workers.

6.—Overtime.

Except as otherwise provided:-

- (a) For all work done outside the hours of duty on any day, payment shall be made at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) When any worker is required to work overtime by reason of a relieving man not coming on duty at the proper time and failing to give at least three (3) hours' notice of his inability to attend, he shall be paid at ordinary rates for the first two (2) hours after which his overtime rate shall begin to accrue. The employer shall be entitled to make a pro rata deduction for the time not worked in the case of the worker so failing to attend and give notice as aforesaid from any moneys due or becoming due to him.
- (c) All time worked on Sundays and holidays prescribed in Clause 5 hereof shall be paid for at double time.
- (d) Time necessarily occupied in raising steam, in starting up or closing down engines, or in banking fires, exceeding forty-four (44) hours per week shall be paid for at ordinary rates for one hour per shift, and after that at the rates set forth in Subclause (a) hereof.
- (e) Where a worker is called on to work a quick shift he shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter. A "quick shift" shall mean a shift where a worker is brought on to work a full shift before having had at least eight (8) hours off.

7.—Sick Pay.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one half day for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to six (6) days in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a grater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
- (b) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to benefit under the Workers' Compensation Λ at
- (c) Personal ill-health does not include ill-health which is the result of an accident sustained away from the place of employment or ill-health the result of the worker's own misconduct, but the onus of proof in such case shall rest with the employer.

8.—Wages.

Basic wage, £3 10s. 6d. per week.

(a) Engine-drivers:-

(i) If the engine or engines have a single cylinder with a bore of 12 inches in diameter or over, or have singly or together two or more cylinders the sum of the area of whose bores equals or exceeds the area of a circle 12 inches in diameter, or if turbine—

- (b) Firemen-

(c) This Award shall not of itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker who is at present being paid in excess of the amounts prescribed for his class of work.

9.—Special Allowances.

- (a) If an engine-driver also attends to an electric generator or dynamo exceeding ten (10) kilowatt capacity, he shall be paid an additional sum of one shilling (1s.) per shift.
- (b) Cleaners of boilers, enclosed hot water tanks, and other confined spaces.—Any person engaged inside the gas or water space of a boiler, flue, or economiser or an enclosed hot-water tank which when working is under pressure, in cleaning or scraping work, shall be paid ninepence (9d.) per hour in addition to his ordinary or overtime rate of pay, as the case may be, whilst so employed.
- (c) Shift workers.—Shift workers when employed on afternoon or night shift shall be paid five per cent. (5 per cent.) in addition to their ordinary rates for such

10.-Mixed Functions.

Where a worker is employed for four (4) hours or less on any day on work in a higher grade than his ordinary occupation, he shall be paid for the time so occupied at the higher rate. If employed for more than four (4) hours he shall be paid at the higher rate for the whole of the shift.

11.—Contract of Service.

- (a) Except in the case of a casual worker whose engagement shall be by the hour, the contract of hiring of every worker shall be a weekly contract, terminable on either side by one week's notice given on any day.
- (b) Any worker not attending for duty shall lose his pay for the actual time of such non-attendance, subject to the provisions of Clause 7 hereof as to payment for absence on account of illness. Where any absence extends for more than six (6) days, the employment shall be deemed to have terminated upon the expiration of the said six (6) days.
- (c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, in which case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.
- (d) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed through any breakdown of the employer's machinery.

Leading hand 1s. per day over the rate paid for the class of work on which he is employed, if four or more men are under him.

3.-Hours of Labour.

(a) The hours of labour for all employees (except tablemen) shall not exceed forty (40) hours per week, divided as follows:—On Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays work shall commence at 7.30 a.m., and continue with three-quarters of an hour intermission for dinner, and finish at 4.15 p.m.
(b) Provided always, and it is hereby mutually

agreed, that in the event of any essential services having to be attended to on a Saturday, employees to be called in rotation to perform such services, and the time so worked shall be taken off by the employee during the

Should more than four (4) hours be worked on a Saturday all the time over the four (4) hours to be paid for at overtime rates.

In the event of a dispute arising as to what constitutes essential services having to be attended to, the matter to be referred to the Conciliation Committee provided for in this Agreement, who shall have power to decide same, and the decision arrived at shall be binding on both parties.

4.—Overtime.

All time worked in excess of the hours herein stated, each day's work to stand by itself, shall be considered as overtime, and shall be paid for at the following rates:—For the first two (2) hours after the ordinary time for ceasing work, time and a quarter, after the first two (2) hours and up to four (4) hours, time and a half, after the first four (4) hours and until the ordinary time for recommencing work, double time.

Any employee called back to work after leaving the job, at the completion of the hours set out in this Agreement, shall be paid at double time rates for all time worked until the ordinary time for recommencing work.

All work performed on Sundays shall be paid for at

double time rates.
Sunday, for the purpose of this Agreement, shall be from midnight Saturday to midnight Sunday.

5.—Camping-out Allowance.

When an employee is working outside a radius of seven (7) miles from the registered office of the Coolgardie Roads Board, he shall be paid two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per day in addition to his ordinary wages as a camping-out allowance.

Casual hands, when employed outside the 7-miles radius, to be paid 1s. 6d. per day camping-out allowance, until such time as they have been employed by the Board for three (3) months, when they shall receive the

2s. 6d. per day as set out.

This clause shall not apply to men who are engaged on a job under 7 miles from their usual place of living.

6.—Drinking Water.

The employer shall provide, free, sufficient drinking water for all employees working away from home.

7.—Tent Accommodation.

The employer shall supply housing or tent accommodation of the following dimensions, for its employees when working outside a radius of seven miles from the registered office of the Coolgardie Roads Board, or seven miles from the usual place of living, in the case of men being picked up outside Coolgardie:—For one man, a tent 6ft. by 8ft.; for two men, 8ft. by 10ft., with suitable flys; employees to pay 1s. per week for the use of same.

8.—Shifting Camp.

All shifting and erection of camps to be done in the employer's time.

9.—Travelling Time.

In the case of employment at a distance of about seven (7) miles from the registered office of the Coolgardie Roads Board, all the time during which the employee is travelling to and from the place of employment shall be treated as time of duty and paid for in addition to the actual time of work.

This clause to mean starting work on a new job and returning to the Board's office on completion of such work.

When going to a job in the bush all reasonable goods and camping outfit to be collected at their homes and delivered at their homes at the completion of the job.

10.—Employees to visit Homes at Week Ends.

When men are working over a radius of seven (7) miles from the Board's office, a truck to be provided for the purpose of obtaining stores at Coolgardie at week ends. Employees to have the right of returning to their homes in same, in rotation, to the capacity of the said truck.

11.- Employees to be conveyed to and from Work.

When working five (5) miles or more, but under 7 miles from the Board's office, men to be conveyed both ways by the Board, and in the Board's time, or be allowed travelling time.

12.—Attendance on Horses.

Any employee having to feed and attend their own horse shall be paid 1s. per day extra. When an employee is temporarily driving two or more horses in a team, no extra payment above the amount stated will be paid while feeding and attending such horses comprising the team.

13.

Any employee who has to feed and attend horses on Sundays or holidays within a radius of 7 miles of the registered office of the Coolgardie Roads Board shall be paid double time rates at his ordinary pay for all time worked.

14.

Horsedrivers when out of the district (outside a radius of 7 miles from the registered office of the Coolgardie Roads Board), having to remain in charge of their horses on a Sunday, shall receive the rate set out in this Agreement for stablemen for that day's work, one man only being necessary to remain in charge of a number of horses.

15

Where six (6) or more horses are engaged, a stableman to be employed on full time.

16.—Holidays (Public).

Every employee shall be allowed the following holidays on full pay:—Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Labour Day, and Kalgoorlie Cup Day. Employees compelled to work on such days shall be paid double time rates.

Casual hands in the employ of the Board for three (3) months continuously shall be entitled to these five (5) public holidays, should those days fall due during the period of their engagement. When a public holiday included in this Agreement falls on a Sunday, the following Monday to be observed as a holiday.

17.—Holidays (Annual Leave).

Every employee shall, in addition to Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Labour Day, and Kalgoorlie Cun Pay be allowed a fortnight's holiday, including twelve working days, on full pay once in each year.

Employees working for less than twelve months shall be allowed one day's holiday on full pay for each month employed: provided that the employment be terminated before the end of a month, he shall be paid a proportionate amount as holiday for such portion of month worked. For the purpose of this clause, 26 working days to be calculated a month. No holiday pay will be granted unless employee is one month in the Board's employment.

18.—Annual Leave (Mixed Functions).

Any employee who is engaged on mixed functions during the year, when their annual leave falls due shall be paid for such leave at a rate computed on the average weekly earnings of such employee for the twelve months preceding such leave.

19.—Sick Pay.

After six (6) months' service, twelve days sick pay at half rates on account of sickness shall be granted to all employees; a doctor's certificate to be produced on each occasion a man is off sick if the employer so desires. Such sick pay shall not be granted for more than twelve days in the aggregate in each year.

20.—Oilers.

Oilers to be provided for men having to work in the

21.—Aprons.

Two aprons each per year to be provided for use of the drivers and stagemen in the Sanitary Department.

22.—Mixed Functions.

Any employee using tradesman's tools and doing the work of tradesmen shall be paid the ruling rate in the district for the class of work on which he is employed, and, in the case of an employee taking the place of a higher paid employee, or doing work classed at a higher rate of pay, such employee shall be paid the higher rate of wages.

If employed at the higher rate for two or more hours, he shall be paid the higher rate for the whole of that shift.

23.—First Aid Outfit.

The Board shall, at depots and stables, provide full and complete First Aid Outfits for the use of the employees, and shall from time to time keep same renewed and in proper order. When men are working in the bush, such out't to comply with St. John's Ambulance Association; on other small jobs, a small emergency outfit to be provided.

24.—Full Payment for Shift.

After beginning a shift, employees shall not be paid for less than a full shift, unless they leave of their own accord, or dismissed for misconduct.

25.—Inspection of Time and Pay Sheets.

A duly accredited official of the Union shall be allowed to collect Union dues outside the office, and shall be allowed to inspect the time and pay sheets relative to any employee affected by this Agreement, and make extracts therefrom, at the convenience of the Stall Officers.

26.—Order of Employment.

In the event of the full complement of men not being required, men shall be employed in rotation.

27.—Services not required.

Any employee turning up to work at the usual starting time, if his services are not required and unless previously notified, he shall be paid for two (2) hours at the ruling rate.

28.—Preference to Unionists.

All employees must become members of the Eastern Goldfields Municipal and Roads Board Labourers' Union of Workers within three (3) weeks of being engaged, the Union agreeing to accept as members any employee of the Board. This clause to mean only those employees who are provided for in the schedule of wages herein and not to tradesmen or engine-drivers.

29.—Contracts let by the Board.

In all contracts let by the Board for work to be performed, the rates of pay and conditions of work as set out in this Agreement shall be embodied in the conditions of contract.

Secretary.

30.-Rights and Privileges.

Any employee who at the date of the signing of this Agreement be in receipt of a higher rate of pay for his particular class of work than is herein prescribed, or in receipt of any privilege or allowance other than is herein provided, shall not suffer by reason of this Agreement any reduction in the amount which such employee was receiving or loss of any privilege or allowance.

31.—Seniority.

All things being equal, seniority to be given for all positions for promotion or positions carrying a higher rate of pay.

32.—Conciliation Committee.

In the event of any new class of work being introduced not provided for in this Agreement, a Conciliation Committee consisting of two (2) members of the Board and two (2) members of the Union, with an independent Chairman, shall meet and decide the rates of pay and conditions appertaining to such work.

33.—Interpretation Clauses.

For the purpose of this Agreement, the terms used herein shall be interpreted or defined as follows:— Motor truck driver in Sanitary Department means one who is engaged driving the truck and collecting pans containing nightsoil from house to house, also collecting liquid waste from hotels, laundries, and other premises, also urine in pans and tanks.

Men cleaning septic tanks means men engaged cleaning out septic tanks and soak wells, but not merely pumping the liquid from the septic tanks and soak wells.

Vanmen and slopmen means one who is engaged collecting pans containing nightsoil from house to house, also liquid waste from hotels, laundries, and other premises, also urine in pans and tanks, but does not drive the motor truck.

Stagemen means one who is engaged cleaning pans at the cleansing stage and loading nightsoil in trucks or tanks to be carted to the trenches

Trenchmen means one who is engaged, after the trenches have been ploughed, covers with earth nightsoil deposited in same, also engaged digging and cleaning in the trenches.

Ploughmen at Sanitary Department means one who ploughs trenches for the reception of nightsoil and any other land required.

Rubbishmen driving motor truck means one who performs the double duty of driving the truck and picking up rubbish.

Rubbishmen means one who is engaged collecting rubbish which has been deposited by householders in boxes and other utensils, also rubbish thrown in the street and right-of-ways, but does not drive the truck.

Tipmen means one who works on the tip, spreads the rubbish when tipped, and burns same.

Men tarring pans means those engaged tarring pans in use, after being cleansed, or new pans before being used.

Concreters means men who do any concrete work under the direction of the foreman.

Spreaders is those engaged spreading metal or other material on new works, or works being reconstructed, or men engaged forming, levelling, or spreading after the scarifier, but shall not include horsedrivers or motor drivers spreading his own load or doing patching work.

Casual hand means one who is occasionally employed by the Board.

Labourer not scheduled means one who is engaged on any class of work as a labourer not otherwise specified in this Agreement.

Minimum Wage.

The minimum wage shall be ninety-nine shillings per week of forty (40) hours.

Week's Work.

On Mondays to Fridays inclusive eight (8) hours, excluding lunch time, shall comprise the week's work.

Notwithstanding that the rate is expressed in a weekly amount, it is hereby declared that the contract of service is a daily contract.

Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall come into force on the day of the date herein, and shall remain in force for the period of 3 years thence next ensuing and thereafter, subject to the provisions of "The Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1925," and shall apply to all works and undertakings carried out by the said employer in the Eastern Goldfields District.
