## The Native Flora Protection Act, 1935.

## PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, } By His Excellency Sir James Mitchell,  
TO WIT. } K.C.M.G., Lieutenant-Governor in and  
JAMES MITCHELL, } over the State of Western Australia  
Lieutenant-Governor. and its Dependencies in the Common-  
[L.S.] wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by Section 5 of "The Native Flora Protection Act, 1935," that the Governor may notify by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* that any wild flower or native plant specified in the Proclamation is protected under this Act in any part or parts of Western Australia specified in the Proclamation, that such protection may be for a limited or unlimited period, as specified in the Proclamation, and that the Governor may revoke or amend any such Proclamation at any time by a like Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas it is deemed desirable and expedient that the wild flowers or native plants hereinafter mentioned shall be protected under and within the meaning of the said Act. Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of all other powers in this behalf enabling me, do by this Proclamation give notice that as from the date of the publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*, those wild flowers or native plants, to wit "Red Bugle" or "Winter Bell" (*Blancoa canescens*), "Black Kangaroo Paw" (*Macropidia fuliginosa*), "Pitcher Plant" (*Cephalotus follicularis*), and "Blue Leschenaultia" (*Leschenaultia biloba*) in all parts of the State of Western Australia, and all species of Orchids (*Orchidaceae*) within a radius of fifty miles from the General Post Office, Perth, in the State of Western Australia shall be and are hereby protected under and within the meaning of "The Native Flora Protection Act, 1935," until this Proclamation is revoked or amended by a Proclamation issued under the said Act and published in the *Government Gazette*.

## The Fisheries Act, 1905-21.

## PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by Section 9 of "The Fisheries Act, 1905-21," it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule here-to shall be closed against the use of fishing nets as from the 1st day of October, 1936, until the 30th day of September, 1937, inclusive.

## Schedule.

(1) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending in an easterly direction from the eastern side of the shore end of the Busselton Pier or Jetty to a point on the foreshore half a mile from the said pier or jetty and half a mile into the waters of the said bay.

(2) That portion of the waters of Geographe Bay extending in a westerly direction from the western side of the shore end of the Busselton Pier or Jetty to a point on the foreshore one and a half miles from the said pier or jetty and half a mile into the waters of the said bay.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Vermin Act, 1918," "Vermin" means and includes any animal or bird mentioned in the Third Schedule to the said Act, and such other animals or birds the names of which the Governor may by Proclamation add to the said Schedule: And whereas the name "Emus" was added to the said Schedule by Proclamation dated the 12th day of May, 1926, but wherein the addition of such name was restricted in its operations to the Districts therein set out: And whereas it is desirable that "Emus" shall be declared vermin within the boundaries of the Esperance Vermin Board District: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of all other powers herein in that behalf enabling, and by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare Emus to be vermin within the boundaries of the aforesaid Esperance Vermin Board District for the purposes of the said Act.

The Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1909.

Metropolitan Sewerage—Maylands Gravitation Sewer—2nd Section:—A 42-inch diameter reinforced concrete pipe sewer, with all manholes and other apparatus connected therewith, as shown in red on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 5772.

## The Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1935.

WHEREAS by "The Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1935," the Governor is empowered by Order in Council, to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to make, vary, alter, or revoke such Regulations under the said Act as may be deemed necessary for any of the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 16th day of September, 1921, certain Regulations were made under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas Regulation 9 of the said Regulations has from time to time been amended by Orders in Council published in the *Government Gazette* respectively on the 2nd day of May, 1924; the 1st day of April, 1926, and the 30th day of October, 1931: And whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient further to amend the said Regulation 9 as amended as aforesaid, in the manner hereinafter set forth: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice

and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth hereby further amend Regulation 9 of the said Regulations (amended as aforesaid) in the manner following, namely:—

Regulation 9 is further amended by inserting after and below the words and figures "cases under 1 bushel . . . 2d. per case" the words and figures as follow:—

Celery and vegetables of every kind whatsoever:—

- (a) when packed in crates . . . 4d. per crate;
- (b) when packed in bags or packages:—
  - (i) for each and every bag or package or part of a bag or package up to 200 bags or packages in one consignment . . . 2d. per bag or package;
  - (ii) for each and every bag or package or part of a bag or package in excess of 200 bags or packages in one consignment . . . 1d. per bag or package.

Provided that the minimum inspection fee under this heading in respect of celery and vegetables, howsoever packed, shall be one shilling.

## FARMERS' DEBTS ADJUSTMENT ACT, 1930-1934.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the following amendment of the Rules and Regulations made by the Westonia Hospital Board under the provisions of "The Hospitals Act, 1927":—

Delete Rules 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11 and substitute in lieu thereof the following:—

## 3.—Subscribers.

Any person may become a subscriber to the Hospital and be entitled to the benefits set forth in Clause 4 hereof provided subscriptions are maintained as follows:—

- (a) In the case of employees of a mining company, by payment through the company of 2s. 6d. per fortnightly pay.
- (b) In the case of employees of any other employer, by payment through such employer of 1s. 2d. per week or 5s. per calendar month.
- (c) In the case of any individual acting on his or her own behalf by payment of 5s. per month.
- (d) Provided that a person in employment shall be registered by the secretary of the Hospital as a subscriber and become entitled to all benefits as from the date authority was given for deduction of subscriptions from wages due: Provided further, that an individual acting on his or her own behalf shall not be entitled to any benefit until fourteen days after becoming a subscriber.

## 4.—Subscribers' Benefits.

Any subscriber who is qualified under the conditions of Clause 3 shall be entitled to the following benefits, subject to the provisions of Clauses 7 and 8:—

- (a) Treatment free of charge for self and/or dependants, for any period not exceeding three months.
- (b) Treatment free of charge as an out-patient between the hours of 10 and 12 noon and/or 3 p.m. to 5 p.m., except in the case of emergency, when treatment may be obtained at any time.
- (c) Provided that, in the event of the matron in charge of the Hospital advising the removal of any patient entitled to subscribers' benefits to the nearest Hospital at which a medical practitioner is in attendance, reasonable cost of transport and/or medical attendance will be met from the Hospital funds, subject to the limitation of three months specified in Sub-clause (a) hereof.

- (d) Provided further, that subscribers shall not be entitled to free treatment in maternity cases, or in cases of accident or illness arising from acts of bravado, the use of intoxicants, or immoral conduct of any kind.

5. The following charges shall be payable in cases where the Rules do not provide for free treatment:—

- (a) General cases—8s. 6d. per day.
- (b) Maternity cases, for a period up to 12 days after confinement—Subscribers, £4 4s.; non-subscribers, £5 5s.  
After 12 days' confinement, 8s. 6d. per day all patients; waiting cases 7s. 6d. per day.
- (c) Maternity cases requiring more than 21 days' confinement shall be brought under the notice of the Hospital Board. Subscribers who desire to receive maternity benefits at the rate of £4 4s. must be financial three months in advance.
- (d) Out-patients, 2s. 6d. per visit to Hospital plus cost of medicines, drugs, and dressings supplied.
- (e) When cases are visited by the matron in charge at residence:—Subscribers within one mile radius of Hospital—free; non-subscribers—9s. for first visit and 5s. for each subsequent visit.
- (f) Outside one mile radius, arrangements must be made with the Board, and the cost of conveyance necessary to and from the patient's residence shall be paid by the patient.

## 6.—Non-Subscribers' Guarantee.

Any non-subscriber entering the Hospital for treatment, or the person responsible for his or her maintenance, shall, if required by the Board, provide a guarantee for the payment of Hospital fees as set out in Rule 5, or any portion of the fees that the Board may deem the person reasonably able to pay.

7. Cases non-admissible (except in cases of emergency):—

- (1) Any insane person or idiot, in respect of such insanity or idiocy;
- (2) Any person suffering from primary syphilis or chronic paralysis;
- (3) Any person suffering from any chronic disease of a serious or critical nature;
- (4) Any person who in the opinion of a medical officer is unsuitable to be admitted.

## 8.—Cases becoming Chronic.

When any person shall have been admitted to the Hospital suffering from an ailment which is not sufficiently advanced for the medical officer to declare it to be of a chronic nature, and which ailment subsequently develops into one of a chronic nature, such person shall be allowed treatment from time to time; provided that, if the medical officer so advise, he or she shall be transferred to another Hospital or Institution suited for the treatment of such patient.

## NORSEMAN HOSPITAL.

## Rules and Regulations.

1. The Rules and By-laws hitherto in force are hereby repealed.

## Name.

2. The Institution shall be known as the "Norseman Hospital."

## Objects.

3. The objects of the Hospital shall be to afford medical and surgical treatment and to provide medicine and surgical dressings to subscribers and dependants and to paying and indigent patients,



## Subscribers' Qualifications and Privileges.

4. Any single person who subscribes 1s. 6d. per week or the sum of 19s. 6d. per quarter, or any married person who subscribes 1s. 9d. per week or the sum of 22s. 9d. per quarter, shall be termed a subscriber, subject to Regulation 5 hereof.

5. In these Rules and Regulations the term "Subscriber" shall mean any subscriber who has paid his or her subscription and is financial, and has paid at least two weeks' subscription prior to seeking any benefit or privileges; and shall include, so far as medical and hospital treatment for married subscribers is concerned, only the wife or husband, or female relative occupying the position of head of the household, or children up to the age of 16 years, provided they are residing with the subscriber and dependent upon him or her. Subscribers whose subscriptions are fourteen days or more in arrears will not be entitled to any benefits. No subscriber whose total income from all sources exceeds at the rate of £550 per annum shall be entitled to medical benefits but to hospital treatment only.

6. All employees subscribing through any mining company shall be deemed to be financial as from the date of their employment: Provided that the mine management undertakes the collection of their subscriptions from wages due.

7. Subscribers may nominate to have their names placed on the list of any medical officer approved by the Board; but having done so may not change to another medical officer's list except as from the first days of January, April, July, or October, respectively, in which cases the secretary shall be given seven days' notice of the desired changes.

8. Every subscriber shall be entitled to surgical and medical treatment at the Hospital as an indoor or outdoor patient, and to medical and surgical dressings, subject to the conditions and limitations set forth in the Rules and Regulations, and for so long as the medical officer, on whose list the subscriber's name appears, deems necessary, free of charge.

9. Surgical treatment to which subscribers are entitled is as follows:—

- (a) Any surgical procedure not usually requiring general anaesthesia;
- (b) Cleaning and dressing of wounds;
- (c) Suturing superficial wounds;
- (d) Simple reduction of fractures and dislocations not requiring general anaesthesia;
- (e) Opening carbuncles, boils and abscesses of a superficial nature;
- (f) Hypodermic injections, subcutaneous and intramuscular injections but not injections for piles or varicose veins;
- (g) Passing catheters;
- (h) Douching and syringing and applications of medications and dressings;
- (i) Diagnostic procedures such as X-raying, taking blood pressure, urine testing (where the doctor thinks fit).

Special treatments such as massage, electrical treatment (diathermy and Bristo coil), and cystoscopy, are charged at 75 per cent. of usual rates. Where operation fees are charged they will be at the rates usually adopted for Compensation Act cases, and for cases not in that Schedule at 75 per cent. of the ordinary chargeable fees.

Certain appliances, *e.g.*, crutches, splints, etc., will be available for the use of subscribers on payment of a deposit which will be refunded on the return of such appliances in good order.

10. No subscriber, not being an indoor patient, shall be supplied with any medicines or dressings except on the authority of the medical officer on whose list the subscriber's name appears, or the matron, who shall record same in a diary to be kept for the purpose.

11. Subscribers shall not receive free treatment in any of the following cases:—

- (a) Incurable diseases;
- (b) Disorders, for the cure of which other establishments are provided;
- (c) Any person requiring food and not medicine, and who is more properly a subject for a benevolent institution;
- (d) Any person whose admission might endanger other patients;

- (e) Any person from the gaol or lockup unless an urgent case and the police provide attendant or custodian;
- (f) Any infant on account of the condition of the mother alone;
- (g) Venereal diseases;
- (h) Alcoholism;
- (i) Dentistry;
- (j) Insanity;
- (k) Premature labour brought on by other than natural causes;
- (l) Maternity;
- (m) All major operations.

12. No subscriber shall be entitled to any of the privileges regarding treatment or Hospital accommodation for any conditions for which he is already covered by insurance under the terms of the Workers' Compensation Act.

## Administration.

13. The administration of the Hospital shall be vested in a Board of Management of twelve members, appointed by the Governor, and who shall hold office for one year.

## Selection of Board of Management.

14. Nominations must be lodged with the secretary at least fourteen days prior to the date of ballot, and must be signed by a proposer and seconder (who must be subscribers) and have the consent of the candidate (who shall also be a subscriber) indorsed thereon.

15. The ballot for selection of members shall be held on the second Saturday of July in each year. After members have been selected their names shall be submitted to the Governor through the Department of Public Health with a recommendation for appointment.

16. The members of the Board shall elect one of their number to be Chairman at the first meeting after the appointment of the Board. The Chairman shall, when present, preside at all meetings. In the absence of the Chairman from any meeting, the members present may elect one of their number to be Chairman for that meeting. The Chairman shall be a member of all sub-committees.

17. If any member of the Board shall be absent from more than two consecutive meetings without leave of absence, or shall cease to be a subscriber, the Board may declare his seat vacant and appoint another member in his stead for the unexpired portion of the year.

## Finance Committee.

18. The Board shall elect two of their members to form a Finance Committee. The Finance Committee shall submit to the Board accounts which it recommends for payment, and present a statement of receipts and expenditure for the past month, and an estimate for the ensuing month.

19. No account shall be passed for payment unless it is initialed as correct by the secretary or matron.

20. All payments authorised by the Board shall be paid by cheque, made payable to the order of the creditor, signed by the Chairman and one member of the Finance Committee and countersigned by the secretary.

## Auditor.

21. One auditor may be appointed by the Board of Management, who shall receive such remuneration as the Board may think fit.

## Order of Business.

22. The order of business at meetings of the Board shall be:—

- (a) Minutes of the previous meeting to be read, and, if correct, confirmed;
- (b) Correspondence, outward and inward, to be read and discussed;
- (c) Reports;
- (d) Questions;
- (e) Finance;
- (f) Discussion of notices of motion;
- (g) Receiving notice of motion;
- (h) General business.

23. At all meetings of the Board all the members present shall vote on any question submitted, and the question shall be decided by the majority. Each member, including the Chairman, shall have one vote, and, in the case of equality of votes, the question shall be declared carried in the negative. The election of executive officers shall be by ballot.

24. Special meetings of the Board may be convened at any time, on 24 hours' notice in writing being given to the members, either at the request of the Chairman or of any four (4) members.

25. Any resolution of the Board may be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, either by the unanimous vote of all members or by a vote of a majority of the Board, subject in such last-mentioned case to the condition that seven days at least before such subsequent meeting, notice in writing thereof, and of the proposal to alter or revoke such resolution, shall have been given to each member.

26. The Board may, from time to time, appoint a Subcommittee of any number with such powers, rights, and privileges, and subject to such conditions and restrictions as the Board may at such appointment or thereafter determine.

27. The Board shall regulate the several departments of the Hospital in accordance with the Regulations or any By-laws, and more particularly in reference to all sanitary matters, and shall take immediate steps to rectify any defects that may require prompt attention.

28. No ball, bazaar, sports meeting, or other entertainment or function shall be held in aid of the Hospital funds without the consent and authority of the Board.

#### House Committee.

29. The Board of Management shall appoint from among themselves a House Committee of two (2), to be elected bi-monthly, who shall attend to the internal management of the Hospital and such other matters as may be delegated to them. They shall furnish monthly reports to the Board of Management.

30. The House Committee shall report to the Board any repairs, etc., which may be necessary, and give attention to same during the progress of any works. They shall also see that all fittings and appliances are in an efficient state.

#### Annual General Meeting.

31. The annual general meeting of subscribers shall be held on the first Sunday after the ballot for the selection of Board members, the financial year terminating on the 30th June. Subscribers to be notified by advertisement at least two weeks before the date of such meeting, and five per cent. of the number of subscribers at the date of meeting to form a quorum.

32. At the annual meeting the annual reports and balance sheet of the Hospital shall be presented by the Chairman; such balance sheet to be published at least seven days before the meeting, and to be signed by the Chairman and secretary.

#### Special General Meetings.

33. The secretary shall, whenever required by the Chairman, Board, or upon a requisition in writing signed by not less than twenty (20) subscribers, convene a special general meeting of subscribers. The requisition shall express the objects of the meeting, and shall be left with the secretary, who shall forthwith convene a special meeting. In the event of the secretary failing to do so within ten days from the time of the requisition being received by him, the requisitionists, or any number of them, may convene a special meeting.

34. At least fourteen clear days' notice of the annual and every special meeting shall be given each subscriber by advertisement in the local paper, or other means, as the Board shall direct. Such notice shall specify the place, the day, and the hour of meeting, and the general nature of the business.

35. At an annual or special meeting five per cent. of the number of subscribers shall form a quorum. If within fifteen minutes from the time appointed for the meeting a quorum of subscribers is not present, the meeting, if convened upon the requisition of subscribers, shall be dissolved. In another case it shall stand adjourned to a time and place to be fixed.

#### Scale of Fees.

36. Indoor Patients.—The fees for non-subscribers shall be 10s. 6d. per day for maintenance and nursing, but not including medical attendance. Drugs and dressings shall be charged for in addition.

37. Maternity Cases.—The fees for maternity cases shall be:—Non-subscribers—10s. 6d. per day; subscribers—7s. per day; but not including special nursing, medical fees, or fees for operative midwifery.

38. Special Rooms.—Fees for special rooms for both subscribers and private patients will be 2s. extra daily.

#### Complaints.

39. Any subscriber or member of the staff having any complaints or other business to bring before the Board should submit the same in writing to the Board, and, if required, shall attend personally the meeting of the Board.

#### Outdoor Patients.

40. All out-patients requiring treatment, and who in the medical officer's opinion are in need of treatment, shall be attended to, and the medical officer shall enter such patients' names in the book provided for out-patients under the heading to which they belong. All fees collected or paid to be handed to the secretary.

41. All patients who, in the medical officer's opinion require treatment shall attend at the Hospital whenever required to do so by him. But the medical officer on whose list the subscriber's name is shall also, in case of necessity, gratuitously attend subscribers at their own homes, provided they reside within a five-mile radius of the Hospital, always excepting cases of venereal disease, alcoholic poisoning, midwifery, and such other cases as are mentioned in Rule 11.

#### Indoor Patients.

42. Accidents or urgent cases shall be received at all hours of the day and night.

43. Persons shall be admitted to the hospital as in-patients on production of a certificate from a medical practitioner that they require treatment. Non-subscribers shall be examined by the secretary or matron as to their means to pay the Hospital for such treatment.

44. Applicants for admission to the Hospital shall, when required by the secretary, make a statutory declaration that they are unable to pay for treatment and are not entitled to benefits from any friendly society.

45. The Hospital will not be responsible for money or other effects the property of a patient, unless specifically entrusted to the care of the matron or secretary.

46. On the admission of any patient to the Hospital, his address and that of his immediate relatives, his professed religion, age, and other particulars shall be given to the secretary or matron.

47. The patients shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner and strictly observe all the directions of the matron, or nurse, and such regulations as may be made by the Board of Management.

48. Patients are not allowed to leave the Hospital precincts without the special permission of the medical officer.

49. No reward or gratuity whatever is to be given by the patients or their friends to the nurse, wardman, or other servants on account of services performed, or to be performed by them in the Hospital, without the consent of the Board.

50. Patients quitting the Hospital of their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving, or such declaration shall be signed by the friend removing such patient.

51. No patient shall be discharged from the Hospital without the consent of the medical officer in charge of the case, except when ordered by the Board in case of misconduct.

#### Medical Officers.

52. The medical officers shall be legally qualified practitioners under the Medical Practitioners Act of Western Australia, and they shall be appointed and their salary or rate of remuneration shall be fixed by the Board of Management.

53. They shall be in attendance at the Hospital daily during the hours defined by the Board, and in addition shall attend, in cases of emergency, whenever summoned by the matron.

54. The hours of attendance defined shall be posted in a conspicuous position at the Hospital, and in any other place the Board may direct.

55. They may, if they wish, appoint hours at which they will see the subscribers at their private surgeries.

56. Subscribers shall have first call on the medical officers' services, all things being equal.

57. They shall be responsible for a daily report of all cases under their charge, and see that a diet card is placed for each patient; such daily report to be recorded in a book for that purpose. All necessary dispensing to be performed by the medical officer in charge of the case.

58. They shall afford the Board every information and furnish them with reports on all matters within their control, as may seem to them necessary or the Board may require.

59. They shall not absent themselves from the town without the consent of the Chairman of the Board and, in the event of the appointment of a *locum-tenens* being necessary, the medical officer shall make all necessary arrangements and submit the name of the proposed *locum-tenens* for the approval of the Board before his appointment. The Board shall have the right to withhold their approval if, in their opinion, the proposed *locum-tenens* is not a suitable person.

60. In the event of any medical officer neglecting his duties, or being absent for more than 24 hours without the consent of the Chairman and the appointment of a duly qualified *locum-tenens* approved by the Board, he shall be liable to dismissal.

61. Any medical officer appointed under Rule No. 52 shall give the Board three months' notice in writing to terminate his engagement. The Board shall have the right to terminate the services of any medical officer by giving him three months' notice in writing to that effect if a special meeting of subscribers approves of such action.

62. A doctor holding any interest whatever in a local Hospital—other than the Norseman Hospital—shall be disqualified from holding a position of medical officer.

#### Secretary.

63. The secretary shall be appointed by the Board and shall hold office during the pleasure of the Board.

64. His salary shall be fixed by the Board from time to time.

65. He shall conduct the correspondence and have charge of all documents relating to the Hospital and shall file and record them in a methodical manner, to the satisfaction of the Chairman.

66. He shall summon and attend all meetings, and shall keep minute books, in which all the proceedings of the meetings shall be recorded; and shall see as far as practicable that all resolutions or orders passed at such meetings are forthwith carried into effect.

67. He shall, under the direction of the Board, keep the books, forms, and accounts of the Hospital, and shall submit his account books to the Board and Finance Committee whenever required.

68. He shall receive from the medical officers an accurate record of the surgical operations performed by them, and names of all patients treated, with results, and be responsible for the rendering of accounts for all amounts due and unpaid.

69. He shall see that the matron on her appointment complies with Rule No. 87, and shall submit such inventory, certified to as correct by the matron, to the Board at the end of the financial year.

70. He shall receive all tradesmen's bills for provisions and other articles from the matron and make out accounts for presentation to the Finance Committee at the next monthly meeting.

71. He shall receive all moneys paid to the Hospital and enter same in the Cash Book and pay same into the Bank. No moneys shall be held for a period longer than seven days.

72. He shall present a copy of the Rules to every employee who may be appointed immediately after his or her appointment, and obtain his or her signature to a duplicate copy, which he shall keep in his office for that purpose. He shall keep an interleaved book containing the Rules, and shall insert any new rule or order as soon as it shall have been passed by the Board, and shall at once communicate it to any person or persons to whom it may relate.

73. He shall, on the day following each Board or Subcommittee meeting, transcribe in the Minute Book fair copies of the minutes taken during each meeting.

74. He shall balance the Cash Book at the end of each month, noting whether such balance agrees with that shown by the Bank Book, and, if not agreeing, explain the cause of the difference.

75. He shall keep the Contributors' Book, and enter therein and in the Cash Book all subscriptions and donations, and shall report the same at the next monthly meeting of the Board.

76. He shall keep a duplicate or true copy of all letters written on the business of the Hospital, and shall execute all orders he may receive from the Board or the Chairman.

77. He shall be in attendance at his office at such times as the Board may from time to time appoint, and such hours shall be posted outside his office at the Hospital.

78. He shall be guaranteed for £100 by some recognised guarantee society, or by some responsible person; the premium for such guarantee to be paid out of the funds of the Hospital.

#### Matron.

79. The matron, who shall be a certificated nurse and registered maternity nurse, shall be appointed by the Board of Management, and shall hold office upon such terms as they may direct. She shall reside in the quarters provided for her and devote her time and attention to the superintendence and general management of the nursing staff or the Hospital. She shall also take entire charge of the domestic affairs of the nurses' quarters and of the hospital generally, and have control over all the nurses and employees (excepting the secretary) attached to the Hospital; and in case of disobedience of the orders, misconduct, or neglect of duty on the part of any nurse or employee, she shall fully report thereon forthwith to the House Committee through the secretary. The matron shall also do the ordinary nursing duties of the Hospital.

80. On taking office, she will check and have charge of all surgical instruments, implements, and apparatus, and shall sign an inventory in correctness thereof, and on the termination of her engagement she shall hand them over to her successor or to the Board, and receive an acknowledgment thereof. All new instruments, implements, and apparatus purchased or procured shall be added to the inventory which shall be a correct record of all such articles.

81. No instrument, implement, or apparatus shall be loaned, destroyed, or disposed of without the consent of the Board. The matron shall report to the Board from time to time that any instrument, implement, or apparatus is worn out, obsolete, or otherwise useless; and such instrument, implement, or apparatus may then be written off the inventory, on the Board's approval being given.

82. No new instruments shall be ordered, and no addition of any instruments or apparatus made, without the approval of the Board.

83. She shall have charge of and be accountable for the medical stores and, whenever necessary, prepare and submit to the Board a list of all medicines that may be required, and shall from time to time report to the Board such medicine stores as she may deem to be in excess of requirements, or useless, and, with the approval of the Board, have same destroyed or otherwise disposed of.

84. She shall have the immediate superintendence of the professional staff in connection with the professional work of the Hospital and shall preserve order and sobriety and, in case of any insubordination or gross default of duty on the part of any of those employees, she shall suspend the same and report fully on each case to the Board immediately, through the secretary.

85. She shall report monthly to the Board particulars of numbers of patients treated in Hospital during past month, number admitted, number discharged, nature of complaints, and number of out-patients, and give the secretary weekly a list of all outdoor paying patients treated at the Hospital, together with an estimate of the cost of all medicine and dressings supplied to them.

86. She shall see that, while on duty, the staff appear in uniforms as follows:—Matron, white; nurses, blue; probationers, grey; housemaids, black with white apron.

87. She shall, on taking charge, check and sign a stock book containing a list of all furniture, bedding, linen, clothing, glass, crockery, cutlery, cookery and kitchen utensils, etc., and be responsible for same, and on relinquishing her duties shall hand same to the secretary or her successor, as directed by the Board, fair wear and tear being allowed.

88. She shall not be absent from the Hospital without the consent of the Chairman.

89. She shall requisition the Board for clothing, bedding, linen, glass, cutlery, crockery, utensils, and appliances of every kind required for the use of the Hospital. She shall enter them in the Stock Book and be responsible for them.

90. She shall be careful to see that all articles of clothing, bedding, etc., are kept in thorough repair and marked, and that all articles of bedding (including mattresses) in use in the wards are frequently changed and aired in the airing grounds provided for such purposes; and that no bedding that has been in use, be stowed away without previous airing; and that no article of the Hospital under her control be lent without the consent of the House Committee.

91. She shall inculcate strict economy in the use of fuel, etc., and see that all unnecessary lights are dispensed with during the night, and that order, cleanliness and punctuality prevail throughout the establishment.

92. She shall be responsible for the internal economy and general management of the Institution, the quality, quantity and preparation of food, the state of the dormitories, and the comfort generally of the patients.

93. In the event of any patient requiring the presence of any minister of religion, she shall take measures to have the request complied with.

94. She shall not permit any of the patients to receive unauthorised foods or liquors, and see that all Rules respecting visitors be observed, and not permit provisions or other property to be conveyed away from the Hospital.

95. She shall take charge of the private clothes of each patient, and store them up for examination, and, if necessary, cause them to be cleaned and disinfected.

96. She shall always have in readiness a proper assortment of bandages, lint, strappings, and other dressings.

97. She shall preserve order and decorum in the wards, prohibit conduct and conversation improper, and see that the patients adhere to the rules.

98. She shall not permit strangers or visitors to remain after the usual visiting hours, nor to crowd around any bed, but shall quietly request such visitors to retire.

99. She shall afford the Board every information and furnish them with reports on all matters within her control as may seem to her necessary, or they may require.

#### Nurses.

100. Every nurse shall be responsible to the matron for the efficient nursing of the patients, the charge of all linen, furniture, and other articles, and the cleanliness and management of her ward. She shall strictly obey the orders of the matron and take such day or night duties as the matron shall direct. Her conduct shall be quiet and orderly, and she shall not receive any visitors without the permission of the matron. All nurses shall reside on the premises if required.

101. Holiday pay shall be payable in terms of the conditions of the Nurses' Award.

#### Domestic Staff.

102. The wardman or yardman shall be appointed by the Board of Management. He shall perform such duties as the matron may direct, and shall at all times make himself generally useful. His hours of duty shall be arranged by the matron, and he shall be relieved of duty at such times as are convenient to the efficient working of the institution.

103. Domestic employees shall be appointed by the Board of Management. They will perform their duties entirely under the direction of the matron, and will endeavour, by strict obedience, to promote the economic and harmonious working of the domestic portion of the hospital. The hours of leave shall be at regular intervals, to be determined by the matron; provided always that the efficient working of the institution is not thereby interfered with. The matron shall have power to dismiss any domestic employee, and may obtain temporary domestic assistance when such is required, and enter same in her report to the Board of Management.

#### Minister of Religion.

104. The hospital must be considered to be strictly unsectarian.

105. Ministers of religion shall have free access at all times to patients of their respective denominations, but prior to entering the ward must obtain the matron's consent. It is expected that ministers will not remain in any ward when requested to retire during the visit of the medical officer or matron. Any minister may attend any patient when requested by such patient.

106. It is also to be insisted upon that ministers of religion, and such other persons as aforesaid, visiting the hospital for the purpose of administering religious instruction to the patients shall so conduct their services as not to interfere with the repose and quiet of other patients in near vicinity.

#### Visitors.

107. Not more than two visitors shall be allowed to visit any patient on the same day without special permission from the matron. Visitors will be admitted to see patients daily between the hours of 2 p.m. and 4 p.m. and between 7 p.m. and 8 p.m., or at other times by special permission of the matron.

108. All visitors must leave the hospital as soon as they have seen their friends. Not more than one child out of arms shall accompany visitors to see a patient. Visitors must retire when requested to do so. The matron has power to close any ward she may think fit, or to refuse visitors access to any patient.

109. Visitors must respectfully and quietly obey the sister or nurse in charge of the ward; be quiet in their movements and conversation, and be careful not to disturb the ward in any way.

110. Loitering about the premises and smoking are strictly prohibited.

111. Male visitors shall not be admitted to the ward for females without the consent of the nurse in charge.

112. Visitors must remain at the bedside of the patient they are visiting. Children in arms shall not be admitted to the hospital wards.

113. No person shall read aloud nor conduct public or religious services in the wards of the hospital.

114. No visitor shall be permitted to remain more than half-an-hour with a patient without special leave of the matron.

115. Persons wishing to visit the hospital regularly, or at other times than those assigned to ordinary visitors, may obtain a special general permission or make application to the matron.

116. Such special visitors must avoid all religious teachings, except with members of their own denomination, and be generally subject to the rules under the head of "Minister of Religion."

117. The matron, on complaint being made to her, may prohibit any special visitor from entering the wards, pending an investigation by the House Committee, who shall have power to cancel any permission.

#### Common Seal.

118. The Common Seal of the Board shall be kept in the Board's safe. The Common Seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument, except by order of the Board.

#### New Rules.

119. The Board shall have power to alter, amend, cancel or add to these Rules and make new Rules, but no such alteration or addition or new Rule shall be made unless approved by the Board after the notice of motion to make such alteration, addition, or new rule has been given at the previous meeting of the Board, and due notice has been given to every member of the Board; and such alteration, addition or amendment shall only remain in force until the next general or special meeting of subscribers, unless it is adopted and approved at such meeting.

### RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE YOUANMI DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

#### Name.

1. The Institution shall be known as the Youanmi District Hospital.

#### Objects.

2. The objects of the Hospital shall be to afford medical and surgical treatment, and to provide medicine and surgical dressings to subscribers and dependants and to paying and indigent patients.

#### Subscribers' Qualifications and Privileges.

3. Any person who subscribes 1s. 6d. per week, or the sum of 19s. 6d. per quarter, or any person under the age of 18 years who subscribes the sum of 1s. per week, shall be termed a subscriber.

4. In these Rules and Regulations the term "Subscriber" shall mean any subscriber (male or female) who has paid his or her subscription and is financial, and has paid two weeks' subscription prior to seeking any benefit or privileges, and shall include, so far as medical and Hospital treatment, only the wife or husband, parents, or female relative occupying the position as head of the household, or children up to the age of sixteen years, provided they are residing with the subscriber and dependent upon him or her.

5. Every subscriber shall be entitled to surgical and medical treatment at the Hospital as an indoor or outdoor patient, and to medical and surgical dressings and appliances, subject to the conditions and limitations set forth in the Rules and Regulations and for so long as the Medical Officer deems necessary, free of charge. Subscribers shall be entitled to only two consecutive months' free treatment as an in-patient or a total of three months in any one year.

6. Any subscriber being one fortnight in arrears shall become unfinancial and may not be entitled to the benefits free.

7. No subscriber, not being an indoor patient, shall be supplied with any medicines or dressings, except on the authority of the medical officer or matron, who shall record same in a diary, to be kept for the purpose.

8. Subscribers shall not receive free treatment in the following cases:—

- (1) Accouchement or miscarriage;
- (2) Incurable diseases;
- (3) Disorders for the cure of which other establishments are provided;
- (4) Any person requiring food and not medicine and who is more properly a subject for a benevolent institution;
- (5) Any person whose admission might endanger other patients;
- (6) Any person from the gaol or lock-up, unless an urgent case and the Police provide attendant or custodian, if necessary;
- (7) Any infant on account of the condition of the mother alone;
- (8) Venereal diseases;
- (9) Alcoholism;
- (10) Dentistry;
- (11) Insanity;
- (12) Operations of choice (i.e., surgical operations not necessitated by accident or dangerous illness, these being included in subscriber's benefits, when such operation can be performed locally), and all major operations.

9. No subscriber shall be entitled to any of the privileges regarding treatment or Hospital accommodation for any conditions for which he is already covered by insurance under the terms of the Workers' Compensation Act.

10. The administration of the Hospital shall be vested in a Board of Management of six members (hereinafter called the Board) appointed by the Governor.

Three (3) of these members shall retire each year, but shall be eligible for re-selection.

The three members to retire at the end of the first period shall be selected by ballot, and thereafter the retirement shall be in rotation.

The Board shall meet monthly on the second Tuesday of each month.

#### Selection of Board.

11. Nominations must be lodged with the secretary at least fourteen days prior to the date of ballot, and must be signed by a proposer and seconder (who must be subscribers), and have the consent of the candidate (who shall also be a subscriber) indorsed thereon.

12. Any subscriber who has paid four weeks' subscription prior to date of nomination shall be entitled to stand for election to the Board.

In the case of several people covered by one subscription, either one of them, if an adult, may exercise this right.

13. The ballot shall be held at such place and shall be open for such hours as the Board shall decide.

14. The secretary shall prepare a roll of persons qualified to vote at the election.

15. No proxy voting will be allowed at any election.

16. The Chairman shall act as Returning Officer and may appoint a Deputy Returning Officer.

17. A majority of the members shall form a quorum. Should a quorum not be present 15 minutes after the hour appointed for such meeting, those present may fix a day and hour to which the meeting shall stand adjourned, or the meeting shall stand adjourned until the next day of meeting.

#### Absence of Board Members.

18. If any member of the Board shall be absent from more than two consecutive meetings without leave of absence, or shall cease to be a subscriber, the Board may recommend to the Governor that his seat be declared vacant, and also recommend the appointment of another person in his stead, such appointment to take effect until the next annual election only.

#### Chairman.

19. The Board shall elect a Chairman from their number at the first meeting after the annual general meeting. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings. In the absence of the Chairman an acting Chairman for that meeting shall be elected by the members present.

20. A vacancy occurring in the office of Chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Board after such vacancy has been declared, previous notice being given in the circulars convening the meeting.

#### Payments by Board.

21. No account shall be passed for payment unless it is initialed as correct by the secretary, medical officer or matron.

22. All payments authorised by the Board shall be paid by cheque, made payable to the order of the creditor, signed by the Chairman and countersigned by the secretary, or, alternatively, signed by one member of the Board and countersigned by the secretary.

#### Bank Account.

23. The funds of the Hospital shall be deposited in a Bank, to be named by the Board of Management.

#### Order of Business.

24. The order of business at meetings of the Board shall be:—

- (1) Minutes of the previous meeting to be read, and, if approved, confirmed.
- (2) Correspondence outward and inward to be read and discussed;
- (3) Reports;
- (4) Questions;
- (5) Finance;
- (6) Discussion of notices of motion;
- (7) Receiving notices of motion;
- (8) General business.

25. At all meetings voting shall be by show of hands, unless in any case a ballot be called for by any member present; provided that the election of executive officers be by ballot only.

26. All members attending a meeting shall have the right to vote for or against all motions tabled during their attendance at such meeting.

27. Special meetings of the Board may be convened at any time, on 24 hours' notice in writing being given to the members, either at the request of the Chairman or any three (3) members.

28. Any resolution of the Board may be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, either by the unanimous vote of all the members or by a vote of a majority of the Board, subject in such last-mentioned case to the condition that seven days at least before such subsequent meeting notice in writing thereof and of the proposal to alter or revoke such resolution shall have been given to each member.

29. The Board may from time to time appoint a Subcommittee or Subcommittees of any number, with such powers, right, and privileges and subject to such conditions and restrictions as the Board may at such appointment or thereafter determine.

30. The Board shall regulate the several Departments of the Hospital in accordance with the Regulations or any By-laws, and more particularly in reference to all sanitary matters, and shall take immediate steps to rectify any defects that may require prompt attention.

31. No ball, bazaar, sports meeting or other entertainment or function shall be held in aid of the Hospital funds without the consent and authority of the Board.

#### Patients' Circumstances.

32. The secretary shall cause full inquiries to be made into the circumstances of indigent patients.

#### Meeting of Subscribers.

33. The annual meeting of the subscribers shall be held in the month of July in each year.

34. At the annual meeting the annual reports and balance sheet of the Hospital shall be presented by the Chairman, such balance sheet to be published at least seven days before the meeting.

#### Special Meetings.

35. The secretary shall, whenever required by the Chairman or Board, or upon a requisition in writing by not less than nine subscribers, convene a special meeting of subscribers. The requisition shall express the objects of the meeting, and shall be left with the secretary, who shall forthwith convene a special meeting. In the event of the secretary failing to do so within 10 days from the time of the requisition being received by him, the requisitionists or any number of them may convene a special meeting.

36. At least fourteen days' clear notice of the annual and every special meeting shall be given each subscriber by advertisement in the local paper or other means, as the Board shall direct. Such notice shall specify the place, the day, the hour of meeting and the general nature of the business.

37. At an annual or special meeting fifteen subscribers shall form a quorum. If within fifteen minutes from the time appointed for the meeting a quorum of subscribers is not present, the meeting, if convened upon the requisition of subscribers, shall be dissolved. In any other case it shall stand adjourned to a time and place to be fixed.

#### Scale of Fees.

##### Indoor Patients.

38. The fees for non-subscribers shall be 12s. 0d. per day for maintenance and nursing, but not including medical attendance. Drugs and dressings shall be charged for in addition.

##### Maternity Cases.

39. Maternity cases shall be admitted to the Hospital on payment of the following fees (exclusive of doctor's fees and special nursing charges):—(a) Non-subscribers, 13s. 6d. per day; (b) subscribers, 10s. 6d. per day.

39a. That a fee of £2 2s. per week or 6s. per day be charged as a waiting fee.

##### Theatre and X-Ray Fees.

40. The theatre fee shall be £1 1s. for non-subscribers and workers' compensation cases. X-ray fees shall be as follows:—

For non-subscribers and compensation cases only:

- (a) portion of upper or lower jaw, 3s. 6d.;
- (b) complete jaw, 10s. 6d.; (c) screenings, 7s. 6d.; (d) filming, 12s. 6d.

#### Complaints.

41. Any subscriber or member of the staff having any complaints or other business to bring before the Board shall submit the same in writing to the Board, and, if required, shall attend personally the meeting of the Board.

#### Outdoor Patients.

42. All outpatients requiring treatment and who in the medical officer's opinion are in need of treatment shall be attended to, and the medical officer shall enter such patient's name in the book provided for outpatients, under the heading to which they belong. All fees collected or paid to be handed to the secretary.

43. Any outdoor patients receiving bottles must leave a deposit of sixpence (6d.) on each bottle, to be refunded on return of bottle.

44. All patients who in the medical officer's opinion require treatment shall attend at the Hospital or private surgery whenever required to do so by him. But the medical officer shall also in case of necessity gratuitously attend subscribers at their own homes; provided they reside within a four-mile radius of the Hospital,

always excepting cases of venereal disease, alcoholic poisoning, midwifery, and such other cases as are mentioned in Rule 8.

#### Indoor Patients.

45. Accidents or urgent cases shall be received at all hours of the day and night.

46. Persons shall be admitted to the Hospital as in-patients, on production of a certificate from a medical practitioner that they require treatment. Non-subscribers shall be examined by the secretary or matron as to their means to pay the Hospital for such treatment.

47. Applicants for admission to the Hospital shall, when required by the secretary, make a statutory declaration that they are unable to pay for treatment and are not entitled to benefits from any Friendly Society.

48. Patients having money or valuables in their possession on admission shall deliver up same to the nurse or attendant who shall immediately hand them with written particulars to the secretary for safe custody, a receipt for which will be given by him and countersigned by the matron. The Hospital will not be responsible for money or other effects, the property of the patients, unless this Rule is observed.

49. On the admission of any patient to the Hospital his address and that of his immediate relatives, his professed religion, age, and other particulars, shall be given to the medical officer, secretary, or matron.

50. The patients shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner and strictly observe all the directions of the medical officer, matron or nurse, and such Regulations as may be made by the medical officer or the Board of Management.

51. Patients are not allowed to leave the Hospital precincts without the special permission of the medical officer.

52. No reward or gratuity whatever is to be given by the patients or their friends to the medical officer, nurse, wardman, or other servant on account of services performed or to be performed by them in the Hospital, without the consent of the Board.

53. Patients quitting the Hospital of their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving, or such declaration shall be signed by the friend removing such patient.

54. Patients on being discharged may report in a book kept for that purpose on the treatment received by them.

55. No patient shall be discharged from the Hospital without the consent of the medical officer in charge of the case, except when ordered by the Board or in case of misconduct.

55a. No subscriber shall, when ordered by the medical officer, refuse to enter Hospital. If a patient refuses to carry out this order he will lose all rights and privileges as a subscriber.

#### The Medical Officer.

56. The medical officer shall be a legally qualified practitioner under the Medical Practitioners Act of Western Australia, and he shall be appointed by the Board of Management and his salary shall be fixed by them. He shall enter into an agreement approved by the Board.

57. On taking office, he will check and have charge of all surgical instruments, implements, and apparatus and shall sign an inventory in correctness thereof, and on the termination of his engagement he shall hand them over to his successor, or to the Board, and receive an acknowledgment thereof. All new instruments, implements, and apparatus purchased or procured shall be added to the inventory, which shall be a correct record of all such articles.

58. No instrument, implement, or apparatus shall be loaned, destroyed, or disposed of without the consent of the Board. The medical officer may report to the Board from time to time that any instrument, implement, or apparatus is worn out, obsolete, or otherwise useless, and such instrument, implement, or apparatus may be written off the inventory, on the Board's approval being given.

59. No new instruments shall be ordered and no addition to any instruments or apparatus made without the approval of the Board.

60. He shall be in attendance at the Hospital daily during the hours defined by the Board, and, in addition, shall attend, in case of emergency, whenever summoned by the matron.



61. The hours of attendance defined shall be posted in a conspicuous position at the Hospital and in any other place the Board may direct.

62. He may, if he wish, appoint hours at which he will see the subscribers at his private surgery.

63. Subscribers shall have first call on the medical officer's services.

64. He shall be responsible for a daily report of all cases under his charge and see that a diet card is placed for each patient, such daily report to be recorded in a book for that purpose.

65. He shall afford the Board every information and furnish them with reports on all matters within his control as may seem to him necessary or they may require.

66. He shall not absent himself from the town for more than 24 hours without the consent of the Chairman, and, in the event of the appointment of a *locum-tenens* being necessary, the medical officer shall make all necessary arrangements, and submit the name of the proposed *locum-tenens* for the approval of the Board before his appointment. The Board shall have the right to withhold their approval if in their opinion the *locum-tenens* is not a suitable person.

67. In the event of the medical officer neglecting his duties, or being absent for more than 24 hours without the consent of the Chairman and the appointment of a duly qualified *locum-tenens* approved by the Board, he shall, after receipt of notice under the hand of the secretary, immediately cease to hold office, and shall have no claim on the Board for salary after receipt of such notice, and he shall be liable to the Hospital for any expense which the Board may incur caused by his absence or neglect.

68. The agreement between the Board and the medical officer to be mutually terminated upon either party giving to the other three months' notice in writing of such termination.

69. Subscribers may nominate their medical attendant, and may change to another at the end of any month.

#### Secretary.

70. The secretary shall be appointed by the Board and shall hold office during the pleasure of the Board.

71. He may hold office in an honorary or paid capacity.

72. If holding office in an honorary capacity, he may be paid an annual bonus, should the Board consider it advisable.

73. If a paid officer, his salary shall be fixed by the Board from time to time.

74. He shall conduct the correspondence and have charge of all documents relating to the Hospital and shall file and record them in a methodical manner to the satisfaction of the Board.

75. He shall summon and attend all meetings, and shall keep minute books, in which all the proceedings of the meetings shall be recorded; and shall see as far as practicable that all resolutions or orders passed at such meetings are forthwith carried into effect.

76. He shall, under the direction of the Board, keep the books, forms and accounts of the Hospital, and shall submit his account books to the Board whenever required.

77. He shall see that the medical officer takes over and signs for all surgical instruments, etc., as provided in Rule 57.

78. He shall receive from the medical officer on behalf of the Board the report required by Rule 65, and be responsible for the rendering of all amounts due and unpaid.

79. He shall see that the matron on her appointment complies with Rule 91, and shall submit such inventory, certified to as correct, by the matron, to the Board at the end of the financial year.

80. He shall receive all tradesmen's bills for provisions and other articles from the matron and make out accounts for presentation to the Board at the next monthly meeting.

81. He shall receive all moneys paid to the Hospital and enter same in the Cash Book and pay same into the Bank on the first available occasion.

82. He shall present a copy of the Rules to every employee who may be appointed immediately after his or her appointment, and obtain his or her signature to a duplicate copy, which he shall keep in his office for that purpose. He shall keep an inter-leaved book

containing the Rules, and shall insert any new rule or order as soon as it shall have been passed by the Board, and shall at once communicate it to the person or persons to whom it may relate.

83. He shall, on the day following each Board or Subcommittee meeting, transcribe in the Minute Book fair copies of the minutes taken during each meeting.

84. He shall balance the Cash Book at the end of each month, noting whether such balance agrees with that shown by the Bank book, and, if not agreeing, explain the cause of the difference.

85. He shall keep the Contributors' Book, and enter therein and in the Cash Book all subscriptions and donations, and shall report the same at the next monthly meeting of the Board.

86. He shall keep a duplicate or true copy of all letters written on the business of the Hospital, and shall execute all orders he may receive from the Board or the Chairman.

87. He shall be in attendance at his office at such times as the Committee may from time to time appoint, and such hours shall be posted outside his office and at the Hospital.

88. He shall see that the medical officer in taking possession of the residence shall sign an inventory of all furniture, etc., and shall check same on the medical officer's vacating the premises.

89. He shall be guaranteed for £100 by some recognised guarantee society; the premium for such guarantee to be paid out of the funds of the Hospital.

#### Matron.

90. The matron, who shall be a certified nurse and registered maternity nurse, shall be appointed by the Board of Management, and shall hold office upon such terms as they may direct. She shall reside in the quarters provided for her, and devote her time and attention to the superintendence and general management of the nursing staff of the Hospital. She shall also take entire charge of the domestic affairs of the nurses' quarters and of the Hospital generally, and have control over all the nurses and employees (excepting the secretary) attached to the Hospital, and, in case of disobedience of the orders, misconduct, or neglect of duty on the part of any nurse or employee, she shall fully report thereon forthwith to the Board through the secretary. The matron shall also do the ordinary nursing duties of the Hospital.

91. On taking office she will check and have charge of all surgical instruments, implements, and apparatus, and shall sign an inventory in correctness thereof, and, on the termination of her engagement, she shall hand them over to her successor or to the Board and receive an acknowledgment thereof. All new instruments, implements, and apparatus purchased or procured shall be added to the inventory, which shall be a correct record of all such articles.

92. No instrument, implement, or apparatus shall be loaned, destroyed, or disposed of without the consent of the Board. The matron shall report to the Board from time to time that any instrument, implement, or apparatus is worn out, obsolete, or otherwise useless, and such instrument, implement, or apparatus may then be written off the inventory, on the Board's approval being given.

93. No new instruments shall be ordered, and no addition to any instruments or apparatus made, without the approval of the Board.

94. She shall have charge of and be accountable for the medical stores, and, whenever necessary, prepare and submit to the Board a list of all medicines that may be required, and, shall from time to time report to the Board such medicine stores as she may deem to be in excess of requirements, or useless, and, with the approval of the Board, have same destroyed or otherwise disposed of.

95. She shall have the immediate superintendence of the professional staff in connection with the professional work of the Hospital, and shall preserve order and sobriety, and, in case of any insubordination or gross default of duty on the part of any of those employees, she shall suspend the same and report fully on each case to the Board immediately, through the secretary.

96. She shall report monthly to the Board particulars of numbers of patients treated in Hospital during past month, number admitted, number discharged, nature of complaints and number of out-patients treated at the Hospital, together with an estimate of the cost of all medicine and dressings supplied to them.



97. She shall see that while on duty the staff appear in uniforms as follows:—Matron, white; nurses, blue; probationers, pink; housemaids, black with white apron.

98. She shall, on taking charge, check and sign a stock book containing a list of all furniture, bedding, linen, clothing, glass, crockery, cutlery, cookery, and kitchen utensils, etc., and shall be responsible for same, and on relinquishing her duties shall hand same to the secretary or her successor, as directed by the Board, fair wear and tear being allowed.

99. She shall not be absent from the Hospital without the consent of the medical officer or the Chairman, and under no circumstances shall she be absent at the same time as the medical officer is absent.

100. She shall requisition the Board for clothing, bedding, linen, glass, crockery, cutlery, utensils, and appliances of every kind required for the use of the Hospital. She shall enter them in the Stock Book and be responsible for them.

101. She shall be careful to see that all articles of clothing, bedding, etc., are kept in thorough repair and marked, and that all articles of bedding (including mattresses) in use in the wards are frequently changed and aired in the airing grounds provided for such purposes; and that no bedding that has been in use be stowed away without previous airing; and that no article of the Hospital under her control be lent without the consent of the Board.

102. She shall inculcate strict economy in the use of fuel, etc., and see that all unnecessary lights are dispensed with during the night, and that order, cleanliness, and punctuality prevail throughout the establishment.

103. She shall be responsible for the internal economy and general management of the Institution, the quality, quantity, and preparation of food, the state of the wards, and the comfort generally of the patients.

104. In the event of any patient requiring the presence of any minister of religion, she shall take measures to have the request complied with.

105. She shall not permit any of the patients to receive unauthorised foods or liquors, and see that all rules respecting visitors be observed, and not permit provisions or other property to be conveyed away from the Hospital.

106. She shall take charge of the private clothes of each patient and store them up for examination, and, if necessary, cause them to be cleaned and disinfected.

107. She shall always have in readiness a proper assortment of bandages, lint, strappings, and other dressings.

108. She shall preserve order and decorum in the wards, prohibit conduct and conversation improper and see that the patients adhere to the Rules.

109. She shall not permit strangers or visitors to remain after the usual visiting hours, nor to crowd around any bed, but shall quietly request such visitors to retire, and, if such request is not at once complied with, shall report the same to the medical officer.

109a. Any complaints against the matron or any of the staff shall be submitted in writing to the medical officer who shall investigate such complaint and if considered necessary he shall submit such complaint to the Hospital Board.

#### Domestic Staff.

110. The wardman or yardman shall be appointed by the Board of Management. He shall perform such duties as the matron shall direct, and shall at all times make himself generally useful. His hours of duty shall be arranged by the matron, and he shall be relieved of duty at such times as are convenient to the efficient working of the Institution.

111. Domestic employees shall be appointed by the Board of Management. They will perform their duties entirely under the direction of the matron, and will endeavour, by strict obedience, to promote the economic and harmonious working of the domestic portion of the Hospital. The hours of leave shall be at regular intervals, to be determined by the matron: Provided always, that the efficient working of the Institution is not thereby interfered with. The matron shall have power to dismiss any domestic employee, and may obtain temporary domestic assistance, when such is required, and enter same in her report to the Board of Management.

112. All employees shall be entitled to such annual leave as the Board may decide. Such annual leave must be taken out each year and at a time approved by the Board of Management.

#### Minister of Religion—Character.

113. The Hospital must be considered to be strictly non-sectarian.

114. Ministers of religion may have free access at all times to patients of their respective denominations, but prior to entering the ward, must obtain the matron's consent. It is expected that ministers will not remain in any ward when requested to retire during the visit of the medical officer or matron. Any minister may attend any patient when requested by such patient.

115. It is also to be insisted upon that ministers of religion and such other persons as aforesaid visiting the Hospital for the purpose of administering religious instruction to the patients shall so conduct their services as not to interfere with the repose and quiet of other patients in the near vicinity.

#### Visitors.

116. Not more than two (2) visitors shall be allowed to visit any patient on the same day without special permission from the medical officer or matron. Visitors shall be admitted to see patients daily between the hours of 6.45 p.m. and 7.45 p.m. and on Wednesdays and Sundays between the hours of 2 p.m. and 4 p.m., or at other times by special permission of the medical officer or matron.

117. All visitors must leave the Hospital as soon as they have seen their friends. Not more than one (1) child out of arms shall accompany visitors to see a patient. Visitors must retire when requested to do so. The medical officer has power to close any ward he may think fit, or to refuse visitors access to any patient.

118. Visitors must respectfully and quietly obey the nurse or sister in charge of a ward, be quiet in their movements and conversation, and be careful not to disturb the ward in any way.

119. Loitering about the premises and smoking are strictly prohibited.

120. Male visitors shall not be admitted to the ward for females without the consent of the nurse in charge.

121. Visitors must remain at the bedside of the patient they are visiting. Children in arms shall not be admitted to the Hospital wards.

122. No person shall read aloud nor conduct public or religious services in the wards of the Hospital.

123. Persons wishing to visit the Hospital regularly, or at other times than those assigned to ordinary visitors, may obtain a special general permission or make application to the medical officer.

124. Such special visitors must avoid all religious teachings, except with members of their own communion, and be generally subject to the rules under the head of "Ministers of Religion."

125. The medical officer, on complaint being made to him, may prohibit any special visitor from entering the wards pending an investigation by the Board, who shall have power to cancel any permission.

#### New Rules.

126. The Board shall have power to alter, amend, or add to these Rules, and to make new Rules, but no such alteration or addition of new Rules shall be made unless approved by the Board after the notice of action to make such alteration, addition, or new Rule has been given at the previous meeting of the Board, and due notice has been given to every member of the Board; and such alteration, addition, or amendment shall only remain in force until the next general or special meeting, unless it is adopted and approved at such meeting.

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE WYALKATCHEM DISTRICT HOSPITAL.

##### Name.

1. The name of the Institution shall be the Wyalkatchem District Hospital.

## Board of Management.

2. There shall be a Board of Management, consisting of twelve members nominated as hereinafter provided, and appointed by the Governor. The Board shall have entire control of the Institution.

The members of the Board shall be nominated at the annual public meeting held in July of each year, as follows:—

One member to be nominated by the Benjaberring District; one member to be nominated by the Korrelocking District; one member to be nominated by the Nalkain District; one member to be nominated by the Cowcowing District; one member to be nominated by the Nembudinding District; one member to be nominated by the York-rakine District, and the remaining six members may represent any District served by the Wyalkatchem District Hospital.

Six of the members appointed in July, 1936, shall remain in office for two years, and the remainder for one year from the 1st August, 1936; thereafter these groups of members shall retire in alternate years; members to retire on 31st July, 1937, shall be selected by ballot; retiring members shall be eligible for renomination.

Persons eligible for Election to Board of Management.

3. Any resident of the District shall be qualified to stand for election as a member of the Board of Management, but must be nominated and seconded by residents of the District.

## Annual General Meeting.

4. There shall be an annual general public meeting held in the month of July each year. Notice of such meeting shall be given by the Chairman and secretary at least fourteen days before the date of such meeting, and such notice shall be advertised in one or more newspapers published at Wyalkatchem or circulating in the District.

## Order of Business at Annual General Meeting.

5. The order of business at the annual meeting shall be:—Confirmation of the minutes of the previous annual meeting; report of the Board for the previous year; secretary's report and financial statement; business of which notice has been given; selection of the Board of Management; any other general business.

## Chairman.

6. The Board shall at their first meeting after their selection elect one of their number to be Chairman. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Board and at the annual general meeting, and shall be *ex officio* a member of all Committees. In the absence of the Chairman, the members present shall appoint an acting Chairman. The Chairman shall not have a casting vote, but shall have a deliberative vote. In the event of equal voting, the motion shall be declared carried in the negative.

## Vacancies.

7. The Board shall fill all vacancies in their own numbers caused by illness or other inability to act.

## Board Meetings.

8. The Board shall meet regularly on the second Tuesday in each month.

9. A majority of the Board shall form a Quorum.

## Order of Business at Board Meetings.

10. The order of business at Board meetings shall be:—Minutes; correspondence; secretary's report and financial statement; accounts; House Committee's report; Chairman's report; matron's report; motions; general business.

## Seats declared Vacant.

11. In case of any member of the Board of Management being absent from three consecutive monthly meetings without leave of absence, the Board may recommend to the Governor that his or her seat be declared vacant, and nominate another person to fill the vacancy.

## Special Board Meetings.

12. Special meetings must be called at the request of the Chairman or any four members of the Board.

## Notice of Meeting.

13. The secretary shall give at least three days' notice of every Board meeting to each member of the Board, stating the business to be transacted thereat.

## Visiting Committee.

14. At each ordinary meeting of the Board two members shall be appointed as a Visiting Committee for one month. This Committee shall visit the Hospital at least once before the next ordinary meeting and report to the Board.

## Finance Committee.

15. At its first meeting the Board shall appoint three of its members as a Finance Committee for the year.

Before each meeting this Committee shall examine all accounts that are to be presented, and shall satisfy themselves that they are in order before recommending them for payment. At the end of each quarter the Committee shall examine the debtors' ledger, and shall direct the secretary thereon, as may be necessary.

In cases where it is impossible for accounts to be brought before a Board meeting, the Finance Committee shall have authority to pay ordinary maintenance accounts.

## Appointments.

16. All appointments shall be made by the Board. The secretary shall be appointed by the Board and shall retain office at the Board's discretion.

## Secretary.

17. The duties of the secretary shall be:—

To summon and attend all meetings of the Board and of the Committees. To take notes of minutes and prepare reports.

To conduct all correspondence and carry out all resolutions of the Board as contained in the minutes.

To keep proper books of accounts, issue receipts, and to attend to all due payments of money.

To give all the information in his power (when desired) to the members then present and prepare all reports and statements required.

To carefully examine all the tradesmen's accounts for provisions and other articles, and make up the accounts for presentation to the Board at the monthly meeting. Accounts to be checked by the Finance Committee.

To receive all moneys paid to the Hospital and pay them into the Bank within seven days of collection.

To make all payments by cheque, which shall be signed by the Chairman or one member of the Finance Committee and countersigned by the secretary.

Upon receipt of a report from the matron of any derangement in sanitary or domestic appliances, or of breakage or want of repair of any of the furniture, immediately examine the same and deal with it as may be required.

To examine the financial position of patients and take such steps toward assuring payment as may be directed by the Finance Committee, the Board, or the Medical Department.

To carry out all lawful demands of the Board which are not herein enumerated.

The secretary shall be insured in an approved insurance company for an amount to be fixed by the Board. Such fidelity bond premiums shall be paid by the Board.

## Matron.

18. The Matron shall, subject to the direction of the Board, have full control of the internal administration of the Hospital and all things appertaining thereto.

The matron shall be responsible for the good order and cleanliness of the Institution and the clothing of the patients; the preparation and service of meals and the proper and efficient nursing of patients. She shall see that the Hospital is at all times left in the charge of a competent nurse; that the report books are entered up regularly daily. She shall be responsible for the stores; see that the directions of doctors to the nursing staff for the medical and surgical needs of patients are carried out; take charge of all moneys and valuables of patients, and, in case of insanity or death, hold same to the order of the Board. A report shall be drawn up at the end of each month showing the record of the Hospital for that period. The report shall be prepared by the matron and handed to the secretary for presentation to the Board. All accounts shall be checked by the matron, and the same shall, after being checked, be certified as to their correctness or otherwise.

The matron shall, on taking charge, check and sign a stock book containing a list of all surgical instruments, furniture, bedding, linen, clothing, cutlery, glass, crockery, cooking, and kitchen utensils, etc., and be responsible for same. She shall at all times keep the stock book written up to date.

The matron shall requisition the Board for clothing, bedding, linen, glass, cutlery, crockery, utensils, and appliances of every kind required for the use of the Hospital, and, when received, shall enter them in the stock book and be responsible for them.

The matron shall not permit strangers or visitors to remain after the usual visiting hours, nor to crowd round any bed, but shall quietly request such visitors to retire, and, if such request is not at once complied with, shall report same to the Board.

#### Nurses.

19. Each nurse shall be responsible to the matron for the efficient nursing of the patients, the charge of all linen, furniture, and other articles, and the cleanliness and management of her ward or wards. She shall strictly obey orders of the matron, and take such day or night duty as the matron may direct. The matron may grant leave to any nurse not to exceed one half day in any week and one alternate Sunday. All nurses shall reside on the premises.

#### Servants.

20. All members of the domestic staff shall be ready to carry out orders at any time. They shall faithfully execute all orders of the matron and be respectful and orderly in conduct. They shall not be absent without leave from the matron who shall, if possible, grant leave of absence for one half day per week and each Sunday afternoon.

No persons other than patients or those employed by the Board shall reside on the premises, or have any meals at the Institution. No visitor to employees shall, under any circumstances, be permitted to remain at the Institution after 11 p.m. without the matron's consent.

#### Patients.

21. No patient shall be admitted unless ordered by a medical practitioner; in cases of emergency, the matron may admit patients, but such cases must be referred to a medical practitioner as early as possible after admission. Maternity patients shall give the matron reasonable notice of their intention to use the Hospital.

No person shall be admitted who is suffering from ultra-contagious disease, venereal disease, disease contracted wilfully or by reason of intemperance or self-indulgence, or whose admission is likely to endanger other patients, or treated, except in cases of emergency.

The fees for patients shall be—

General Ward patients—9s. per day.

Maternity patients (fees may be remitted on application to the Board)—10s. per day.

Children under 14 years of age—5s. per day.

Theatre fees, major operations—£1 1s.

Theatre fees, minor, with general anaesthetic—10s. 6d.

Theatre fees, general anaesthetic, children—5s.

Theatre fees, local anaesthetic—2s. 6d. to 5s.

Theatre fees, dental anaesthetic—10s. 6d.

Theatre fees, dental anaesthetic, children—5s.

X-Ray fees—£2 2s. first photograph, and subsequent photographs, at doctor's discretion, to be not less than £1 1s. per photograph.

Out-patients—1s. per attendance, plus drugs and dressings.

#### Complaints.

22. Complaints of all kinds affecting the internal management of the Hospital, whether made by the patients, staff, or others, shall be made directly to the secretary in writing within seven days of the occurrence, and such complaints shall be dealt with by the Board, after receiving the matron's report thereon. The decision of the Board shall be final. The Board may refuse to consider any complaints that are not lodged as herein provided.

#### Notification to Patients' Friends, etc.

23. Should a patient be dangerously ill the matron shall at once notify some of the relatives of such patient, and, should the patient desire that a clergyman be sent for, his or her wishes in this respect are to be immediately attended to.

#### Visitors.

24. The public will be admitted to the Hospital daily between the hours of 2 p.m. and 4 p.m., and at any time by permission first obtained from the matron. All visitors must obey the directions of the matron or nurse

on duty. No visitors shall enter any ward without first obtaining permission from the matron or nurse in charge.

No intoxicating liquors of any kind shall be brought into the Hospital, except by the direction of a medical practitioner, nor shall any fruit or food be brought into the wards or be received by patients without the sanction of the matron.

#### Residential Rules.

25. No patient shall be absent from the Hospital without leave from a medical practitioner or the matron.

Any person gambling, swearing, or using abusive language or in any other way behaving indecently in any part of the Hospital or grounds, or who shall fail to comply with any of these Rules, shall be liable to be discharged.

#### Removal of Patients.

26. Patients leaving the Hospital of their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving, or such declaration shall be signed by the friend removing such patient.

#### Payment of Fees.

27. Before a patient leaves the Hospital, all fees must be handed to the matron or secretary, or a satisfactory guarantee for payment left in the hands of the matron or secretary, except in *bona fide* or indigent cases.

#### Ministers of Religion.

28. Ministers of religion visiting the Hospital for the purpose of ministering to the patients shall visit only those patients who desire their ministrations, and shall not interfere with the repose and quiet of the other patients.

They shall be immediately notified by the matron whenever any patient dangerously ill desires their ministrations.

They may attend special or urgent cases at any time by arrangement with the matron, but in other cases they must arrange their visits so as to suit the convenience of the Hospital staff.

#### Alterations of Rules and Regulations.

29. These Rules and Regulations shall not be altered, amended, varied, or added to, except upon notice in writing given to the secretary, stating the proposed alterations, additions, cancellations, and the secretary shall give each member of the Board fourteen days' notice in writing thereof prior to the matter being discussed.

### THE HOSPITALS ACT, 1927.

### RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE GNOWANGERUP AND DISTRICTS HOSPITAL.

#### Name.

1. The name of the Institution shall be the Gnowangerup and Districts Hospital.

#### Board of Management.

2. There shall be a Board of eight members, nominated as hereinafter provided, and appointed by the Governor. The Board shall be responsible for the control of the Hospital.

The members selected shall be appointed for a period of two years, with the exception that of the members selected at the annual general meeting held in July, 1936, four shall retire at the end of one year. The four members to retire at the end of one year after appointment in July, 1936, shall be decided by the Board.

3. The Board shall, at its first meeting after appointment, elect one of its members to be Chairman.

4. The Chairman shall, when present, preside at all meetings of the Board, and, in the absence of the Chairman from any meeting, or if after being present, he retires, the members present at any meeting may elect one of their members acting Chairman for that meeting.

Persons Eligible for Election to the Board of Management.

5. Any resident of the District shall be qualified to stand for election as a member of the Board of Management, and must be nominated and seconded by a resident of the District and the candidate must signify his willingness to take a seat on the Board if elected.

Vacancies.

6. In the case of any member of the Board who is absent from three consecutive monthly meetings of the Board without having obtained leave of absence, the Board shall recommend to the Governor that the seat of such member shall be declared vacant as from the date such vacancy is gazetted.

7. The Board shall fill all vacancies in their own numbers during the year, and shall recommend to the Governor a suitable person for appointment; provided that such vacancy does not occur by the resignation of a member, such resignation being in the nature of a protest, in which case a public meeting shall be called for the purpose of electing a member to fill the vacancy.

Quorum.

8. A majority of members of the Board shall form a quorum.

Order of Business at Board Meetings.

9. The Board shall hold a regular meeting at least once in each calendar month. A special meeting may be called by the Chairman or secretary, or by the secretary when requested to do so by three members of the Board. In each case all members of the Board are to be notified.

The order of business at Board meetings shall be:—

- Minutes of the last meeting;
- Business arising from the minutes;
- Reports;
- Correspondence;
- Accounts;
- Notice of Motion;
- General.

Notice of Meeting.

10. Every member of the Board of Management shall receive at least twenty-four hours' notice in writing of an ordinary or special meeting.

Annual Meeting.

11. The annual general meeting of the residents of the District shall be held in the month of July each year, and not less than seven days' notice of such meeting shall be given by the secretary. Notice of the meeting shall be advertised in a paper circulating in the Gnawangerup District.

Order of Business at Annual General Meeting.

- 12. Confirmation of minutes of the previous general meeting;
- Report of Board for the previous year;
- Financial Statement;
- Auditor's Report;
- Business of which due notice has been given;
- Selection of the Board of Management.

Appointment of Staff.

13. The Board may appoint from time to time, secretary, matron, nurses, orderlies, cook and other servants, and may delegate the appointment of members of the Staff to the Matron.

Duties of the Staff.

14.

Secretary.—The secretary shall conduct the correspondence and have charge of all documents relating to the Hospital; attend all meetings of the Board and Committees, and keep the minutes thereof, and see that, as far as practicable, all resolutions or orders passed at such meetings are forthwith carried into effect under the direction of the Board; keep the books, forms and accounts of the Hospital; attend at the Hospital when required; receive all moneys paid to the Hospital; give receipts for and pay all moneys into the Hospital Bank account, and shall report to the Board any matter, which in his opinion requires attention. He shall be the authorised person to procure drugs and appliances from the Medical Department on the requisition forms provided for that purpose.

Matron.—The matron shall have full control of the Hospital and all things appertaining thereto; she shall be responsible for the good order and cleanliness of the

Institution and the clothing of the patients, the preparation and service of meals, and the proper and efficient nursing of the patients. She shall see that the report books are entered up daily, and shall be responsible for the stores, take charge of all valuables and moneys belonging to the patients; and in the case of death or insanity, hold same to the order of the Board. She shall be entitled to such vacation each year as is prescribed by the Award. She shall in all matters of nursing and patients' requirements, act under the instructions of the medical officer and see that his requirements are carried out. She shall present a monthly report to the Board, and in all urgent matters shall report promptly to the secretary, and failing him, the Chairman. She shall prepare a list from time to time of all drugs and other appliances required and hand same to the secretary to procure.

Nurses.—Each nurse shall be responsible to the matron for the efficient nursing of the patients, the change of all linen, furniture and other articles and the cleanliness and management of her ward. She shall strictly obey the orders of the matron and take such day or night duties as the matron shall direct. The hours of leave granted to nurses shall be in accordance with the terms of the Award and as the matron directs. All nurses shall reside on the premises and shall be entitled to the annual holidays as set out in the Award.

Servants.—The cook, laundress, orderly, and other servants shall be ready to carry out orders at any time. They shall faithfully carry out the orders of the matron, and be respectful and orderly in conduct. They shall not be absent without leave from the matron, and shall be entitled to such annual holidays as set out in the Award, or as the Board may decide.

Patients.

15. All patients, except those maternity patients who elect to dispense with his services, shall be examined by the medical officer before or upon admission, except in cases of emergency or in the absence of the medical officer, when the matron may admit, but must notify the medical officer as soon as practicable. No person shall be admitted who is suffering ultra contagious disease, venereal disease, or any other notifiable disease, or from alcoholism, or whose admission is likely to endanger other patients, except with the express sanction of the medical officer. Maternity patients shall give the matron reasonable notice of their intention to use the Hospital and shall state whether or not the services of the medical officer are engaged.

Patients leaving the Hospital of their own desire shall sign a declaration to that effect before leaving, or such declaration shall be signed by the friend removing such patient.

Complaints.

16. Complaints of all kinds affecting the internal management of the Hospital, whether made by patients, staff, or others shall be made directly to the secretary in writing, within seven days of the occurrence, and such complaint shall be dealt with by the Board, after receiving the matron's report thereon. The decision of the Board shall be final. The Board may refuse to consider any complaints that are not lodged as herein provided.

Residential Rule.

17. No person, other than patients or those employed by the Board, shall reside on the premises, or have any meals at the Hospital. No visitor to employees shall, under any circumstances, be permitted to remain at the Institution after ten o'clock p.m. without the matron's consent.

Visiting Hours.

18. The visiting hours at the Hospital shall be as prescribed from time to time by the Board.

Ministers of Religion.

19. Ministers of religion shall have access at all time to the patients of their respective denominations, but prior to entering the ward must have the matron's consent.

Notification of Patients' Friends.

20. Should a patient be dangerously ill, the matron shall at once endeavour to notify some of the relatives or friends of the patient, and, should the patient desire that a minister of religion be sent for, his or her wishes must be complied with.

## Notification of Termination of Services.

21. The secretary, matron, nursing staff, or other employee shall be entitled to fourteen days' notice, or such time as the Award shall set out, of the intended termination of their services. Such notice must also be tendered by the above-mentioned.

## Scale of Charges.

22. The scale of charges shall be such as may be decided from time to time by the Board of Management, and shall be available on application to the matron or secretary.

## Payment of Fees.

23. Before a patient leaves the Hospital, all fees must be paid to the matron or secretary, or a satisfactory guarantee for payment left in the hands of the matron or secretary.

## Authorities on behalf of the Board.

24. All authorities relating to the control of the Board's banking accounts or other matters on behalf of the Board shall be signed by the Chairman and countersigned by the secretary, or in the absence of the Chairman by any one member and countersigned by the secretary.

## Amendment of Rules and Regulations.

25. These Rules and Regulations shall not be altered, amended, varied, or added to except upon advice in writing given to the secretary, stating the proposed alterations, additions, or cancellations, and the secretary shall give each member of the Board seven days' notice in writing thereof prior to the matter being discussed.
